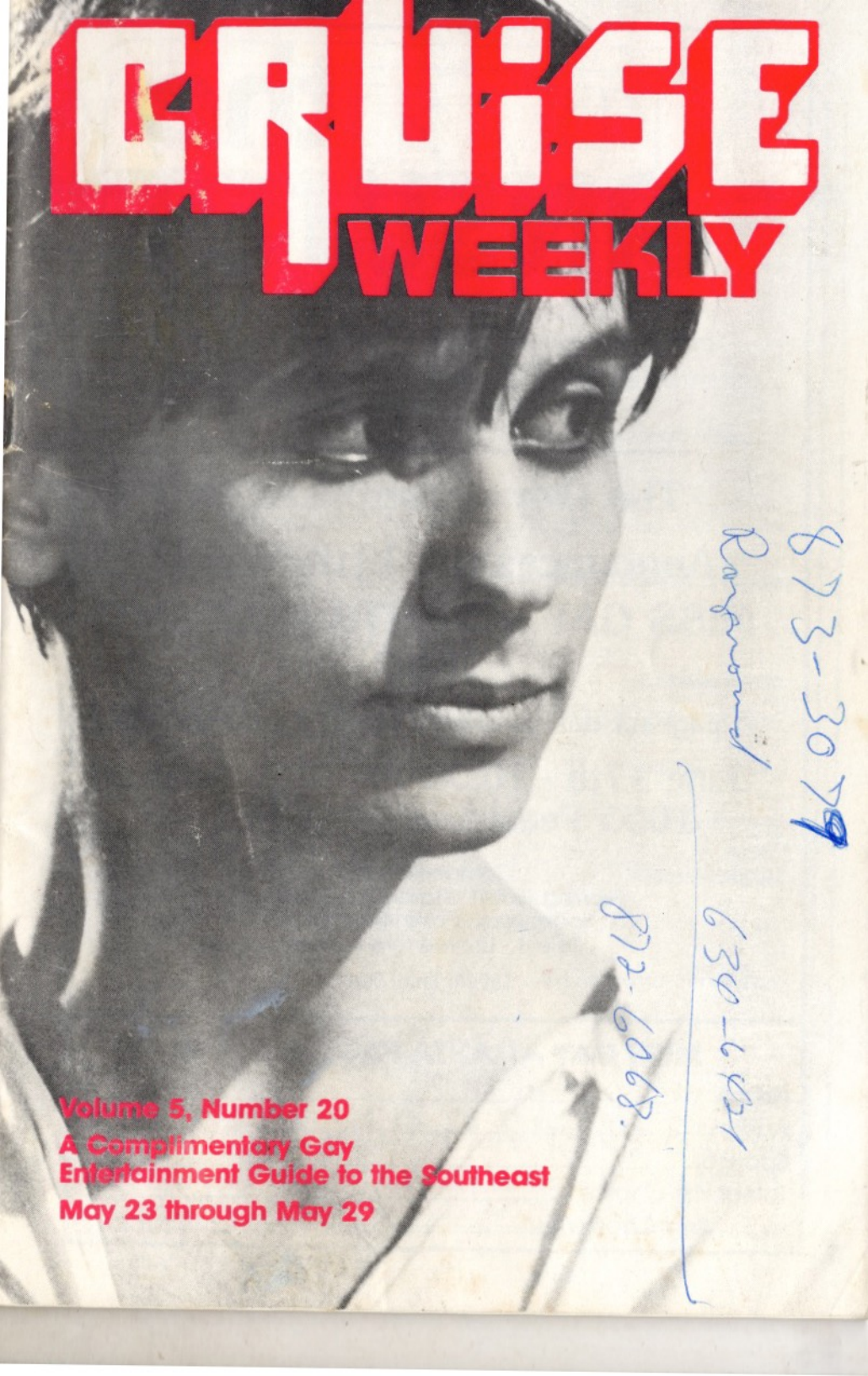

THE FIRST WORD

CRUISE WEEKLY has always been popular with Atlanta's bargoers. Just last week we were told by one bar that they had to save back a few copies for their regulars who didn't come in over the weekend because usually by Monday they were all gone. Well this week many places were out of them before Saturday night.

No doubt our series "Uncertain Peace" by James Moody created extra demand but we didn't expect all those copies to disappear so fast. But we are delighted they did and just to show our appreciation, this week we are increasing our print run to 7,000 copies, up another five hundred from recent weeks and up one thousand from what we were printing in February. If our advertising sales pick up in the next few weeks we will raise this again to 7,500. One reason CRUISE WEEKLY is so popular is that it is available in more places than any other gay publication. At present it is distributed in every gay bar in town. In some of the larger ones you may have to look around for a copy (at Limelight they are on top of the cigarette machines and at Numbers you'll find them at Guido's Grill in back of the 'till Dawn bar) but they are there until they run out. And they are distributed in a lot of places other than bars. We recently installed a box at the Flea Market and 150 are distributed there each weekend. And you can also pick them up at Midtown Maytag, the Majic Market on Cheshire Bridge or the Purple Martin on Piedmont as well as several other retail locations.

Another reason copies of our magazine disappear so quickly is that it is usually available on Thursday evening, in time for you to see what's happening during the weekend coming up. As we increase our print run we may have to start making a supplemental distribution on Saturday, Sunday or Monday so you can find CRUISE WEEKLY whenever you go out.

We're doing everything we can to make our magazine available to you, our readers, when and where you want it. So do us a favor and tell your favorite bartender or the owner of your favorite club that you enjoy CRUISE WEEKLY and appreciate them having it available. It's their advertising dollars that pay for it and if they know that it is read and appreciated, they'll be more willing to spend those advertising dollars with us, enabling us to give you an even better publication.

COMMUNITY NEWS

VOTER REGISTRATION

If you were at any of several bars last weekend, you probably saw the voter registration tables. **GAY POWER IS GAY VOTES**. We are attempting to register all gays living in Fulton County. In some districts, Gays (if registered) could equal 30 to 40 percent of the votes. This could elect gay candidates or swing elections to pro-gay candidates. If you reside in Fulton County and have not voted in the last three years, you need to register. If you have moved, we can help you with the change of address forms. (If it's more convenient, you can register to vote at any bank.) There is no time requirement.

If you want to help register other gays, call Gil Robison at 885-1382. All that's required is a thirty minute class in filling out the forms.

ZONING VARIANCE APPROVED FOR THE ANSWER

On Friday, May 16 the zoning board approved the request by the owners of The Answer, to grant them a variance from certain parking requirements thus paving the way for an early opening of Atlanta's newest show bar. The Answer is located at 1055 Peachtree Street (the location previously occupied by Animals) and baring further complications they plan to open to the public on Thursday, May 29th. A press conference is scheduled this week and next week's CRUISE WEEKLY will have full details about the bar and its cast. At the same zoning hearing a similar

request by the owners of the Club Atlanta and Bulldog for the property at the corner of Crescent and 11th Streets was denied. The Midtown Neighborhood Association and the Midtown Businessmen's Association had opposed both requests on grounds that lack of adequate parking facilities would create problems in the neighborhood. The owners of the Crescent Street property can reapply and indicated they planned to do so.

BOOKSTORE ORDER CHANGED

Last week we reported that five adult bookstores including After Dark had been granted a temporary injunction against an order from Fulton County Court Judge Charles Weltner to "clean up their acts." On Thursday, May 15 this order was modified and the stores were required to increase the light to the point that any officers who were in the place could tell if there was any illegal sexual activity going on. They were also required to remove the doors to the booths for the same reason. Most of the affected stores are planning to install half doors with the door at the top.

MCC CELEBRATION PLANNED

The Universal Fellowship of Metropolitan Community Churches has announced a multi-media presentation of the history and ministry of MCC with an address by Reverend Troy D. Perry who is the founder and moderator of UFMCC. The event will include cocktails and dinner and will take place at the Peachtree Plaza Hotel on June 25th. 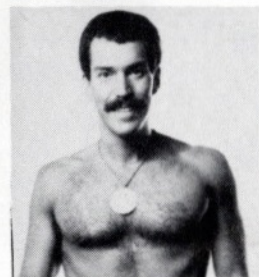

EDITOR'S NOTE: In this gay world there are many problems, some related to our love lives, some related to our friends and family, and others related to our jobs and those we meet there. In the past, several of our readers have written to CRUISE or to members of our staff to ask for answers to some of these questions. The need seems to be great enough and a lot of the questions seem to reoccur often enough to warrant a regular column featuring these questions and their answers. Since Dear Abby was not well versed in the problems of gays we have called on that friend of all sissies, Rose (get over yourself, Rose), to answer your questions. We're starting with a few letters that have accumulated here in the CRUISE office but in order to continue this as a regular feature we will need some more input from you, our readers. DEAR ROSE: I am a young attractive man living in a medium size city in Alabama. My lover and I have been together for over a year and are very happy. We go out and party with our friends at the bars and in their homes but we always go home together. My lover is the only man I ever want but none of my friends seem to understand this. They keep trying to get one or the other of us to go to bed with them and keep telling each of us that the other is being unfaithful. Why do they keep doing this? Why can't gays be satisfied with one partner instead of trying to make it with every swinging dick?

CONFUSED IN ALABAMA

DEAR CONFUSED IN ALABAMA: If you and your lover are happy together you should tell your so-called friends to fuck off when they come around trying to get you in bed. But keep in mind that what's good for you may not be good for everyone. A lot of gay men are over-sexed (maybe super-sexed is a better word for it) and just can't be satisfied with one partner. But that's them and you're you. Follow whatever rules you feel are right for you and your lover and let your friends do the same.

DEAR ROSE: I'm gay and 16 years old and I'm really lonely. All my friends are straight and I need some advice. In my state you've got to be 21 to get in bars and what I need is a gay friend or lover. Almost everyone in my town is straight except me. I found your magazine on a newsstand and am writing to you for some help.

LONELY IN ILLINOIS

DEAR LONELY: No matter how small the town, I'm sure that if you look hard enough you will find other gay people. And once you have met one or two you'll meet a lot more. In the meantime I'm sending you the names of a couple of gay organizations in Chicago and St. Louis that can help you meet other gays without going to bars. You'll have plenty of time for that when you get older.

DEAR ROSE: Why are the police constantly harrassing gays in After Dark and other adult bookstores? We're consenting adults doing whatever we do in private and it's none of their business.

BITTER IN ATLANTA

DEAR BITTER: Homosexual acts whether or not they are committed in public or private by consenting or non-consenting adults are still against the law in Georgia. And the police say they are just upholding the law. What we need to do is organize enough voters to pressure our legislators at the capitol to change this archaic law.

DEAR ROSE: I have a new boyfriend and we are really in love. But I have one problem. When we have sex he wants to screw me and my asshole is so tight I just can't get screwed. Now don't get me wrong, I've got no mental hangups about it, it's just that physically I can't take a dick up my hole. Is there anything I can do?

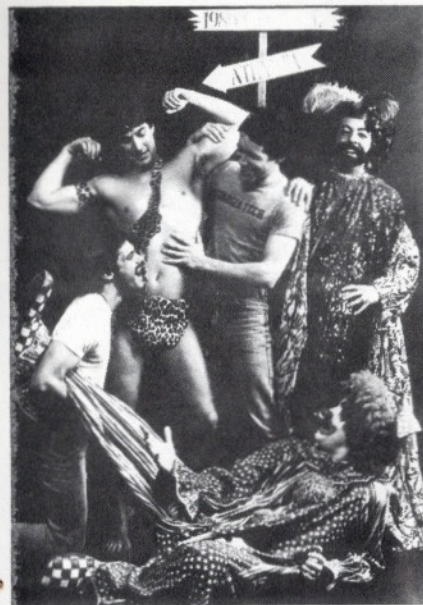

PART II

AN UNCERTAIN PEACE: Atlanta's Gay Community and Police Abuses

There were 1,145 people arrested on various sex-related charges by officers of the Atlanta Police Department during 1979. Included in those figures were an unknown number of gay men arrested for Sodomy. It's impossible to tell for sure how many; police department records contain no break-down of statistics. The man who forces a woman to perform fellatio on him is included in the same category as the two men who have the misfortune of being discovered by police while willingly engaged in sex with one another.

Gil Robison, a legal worker with the Georgia Law Project, thinks that a substantial number of those 1,145 arrests involved gay men.

"We've tried to get those figures in the past," he said, "but they just weren't available to us. We were told that the only way we could get such a break-down was to go through arrest records on a case-by-case basis and, of course, that isn't permitted."

Robison said that the only way one could know when a Sodomy arrest involved a gay man is if he reported it to one of the

city's gay organizations. First Tuesday Association for Lesbian and Gay Rights, an organization which Robison helped to found and with which he remains active, has attempted to document such cases. The Atlanta Gay Center has also asked gay Atlantans to report such arrests to their staff.

"The biggest problem we have is the unwillingness of people to assert their rights when they are unjustly arrested," Robison added. "They won't fight, so they are taken advantage of."

He also cites a lack of support from the gay community of people arrested for Sodomy.

"A man who is arrested on Sodomy charges finds himself in very much the same position as a woman who has been raped. The emotional support that should be coming from family and friends just isn't there. Sometimes people even express the opinion that the person has received only what they deserve. People would say of the raped woman that she must have done something to have provoked the attack. When a gay man is arrested in a bookstore or at the park for Sodomy, some people — gay as well as straight — say that if one is going to engage in public sex

acts he has to face the consequences. If we're going to deal with these laws, we are going to have to do it knowing that the majority of those arrested under them are arrested as a result of sexual activity in public places, as the law defines public."

It isn't just the State's Sodomy law under which gay men are arrested for their sexual activity. In 1979 the City of Atlanta enacted an ordinance which is known as "I and L." Properly, the ordinance is Section 17-2004 of the City Code, which prohibits "Transportation or inducing others to transport others with the intent to solicit for the purpose of prostitution or sodomy."

According to Robison, the ordinance was enacted after pressure was put on members of Atlanta City Council to attempt to curtail the activities of prostitutes on the area of Peachtree Street commonly referred to as "the strip." The pressure was greatest, perhaps, from the Midtown Neighborhood and Business Associations.

One of the prime movers of the bill through the council was 5th District Councilperson Mary Davis.

Sources who asked not to be identified indicated that some members of the Midtown Associations felt the neighborhood was in danger of becoming "too gay," and it was for that reason that Sodomy was included in the ordinance which originally intended to be directed against prostitutes.

"I never heard any comments to that effect at all," Davis said. "Their only concern was the attendant crime that was going along with the street prostitution in the area."

"Most of the members of the City Council weren't aware that the ordinance included Sodomy until after it was already passed. We thought it involved Sodomy for hire."

Davis says she has wanted to strike Sodomy from the ordinance or at least amend it to deal with Sodomy for hire.

"But of course that question is now moot, since the ordinance has been stricken," Davis said. "The inclusion of Sodomy within the ordinance is a clear concern and one I share."

Likewise, Bruce Morris, who was President of the Midtown Neighborhood Association at the time of the ordinance's adoption in 1978, denies that the group intended that the ordinance be directed against gays.

"The sole purpose of the ordinance was to attempt to curtail the activities of female prostitutes in the Midtown area," he said.

Morris admits that the ordinance is worded in such a way that it could be used against gay men attempting to pick up one another for consensual sex acts that do not involve the exchange of money. He said the ordinance only tends to compound the problems already faced by gay men under Georgia's existing Sodomy law.

It is unclear just who the author of the I and L ordinance was. Paul Howard, currently connected with the Fulton County District Attorney's Office, said that it is his understanding that the ordinance was worded after similar ordinances in other cities, specifically that of New York City. He further expressed the opinion that the law, since it deals with "loitering," would not affect gay men who happened to meet on the street and agreed to consensual sex acts in private.

But the fact remains that gays have been arrested under I and L although one source estimates that perhaps 95% of the arrests made under it involve female prostitutes.

Section 17-2004 of the Atlanta City Code has had a confused past and faces an uncertain future. It has twice been declared unconstitutional.

In 1978, shortly after its passage, it was declared unconstitutional by the Georgia Supreme Court because it conflicted with the state's Sodomy law. In 1979, the Georgia General Assembly passed what is known as an enabling law, which allows I and L to coexist with the state law. Shortly thereafter, the City Council reestablished the law, with its wording almost exactly as it had been originally.

Once again the ordinance was declared unconstitutional in November of last year, by Judge Frank Eldridge of Fulton Superior Court. The court found section paragraphs (c), (d), and (e) vague and indefinite.

The city appealed that decision and, just days ago, the State Supreme Court allowed the lower court ruling to stand.

The city council is expected to pass still another version of the ordinance soon. All indications are that Sodomy will still be included in its wording.

"I don't think that any group of people should be harassed or be subjected to increased surveillance," Councilperson

Davis said. "It's the job of the police department to enforce laws and provide protection, not to harass. They have to maintain some presence around businesses, especially those which serve alcohol; most businesses appreciate their coming around from time to time."

Various gay rights organizations have made attempts to smooth relations between the gay community and the police. The gay rights Alliance at one time sent representatives to speak with new police recruits in an attempt to sensitize them to the needs of the gay community.

The practice, however, was discontinued about a year ago after the police department stopped inviting them to come.

In checking with the Police Department's Community Relations Department, in fact, no one knew of any on-going program at all that would assist officers in meeting the needs of lesbians and gay men.

"We've been negotiating with the police department and have been for some time about the way laws are selectively enforced against gays and their exclusion from the force," said Gil Robison, speaking of efforts that have been made by First Tuesday Association for Lesbian and Gay Rights. "There will never be a fair shake for gays until there are gay cops."

"What is most important to the cop on the beat is peer pressure from fellow officers. Until there is openly gay police officers, what we can do is limited."

Robison said that sensitivity training for officers would certainly be helpful, but that its effectiveness is limited.

"The very first hurdle we must get over is the removal of the question (involving previous homosexual experiences by recruits) from the entrance polygraph exam."

Again he emphasized that any attempts at improving the plight of gays by gay organizations would be greatly helped by letting elected officials know that the groups are backed by a "very concerned and knowledgeable gay constituency."

What happens when gays are the victims of crimes. Do they get a fair shake - or do the police officers assigned to investigate their cases purposely drag their feet? Part Three of AN UNCERTAIN PEACE: Atlanta's Gay Community and Police Abuses will deal with these and other questions next week.

Shortly before press time, CRUISE Magazine learned that 5th District City Councilperson Mary Davis had added an amendment to a new version of the city's I & L Ordinance which would include the words "For Hire" to the ordinance's language after each reference to sodomy. The amended version of the bill passed the council and now goes to Mayor Jackson's office for his signature. Atlanta's gay political leaders see this as a major development, one they have been seeking for some time.
