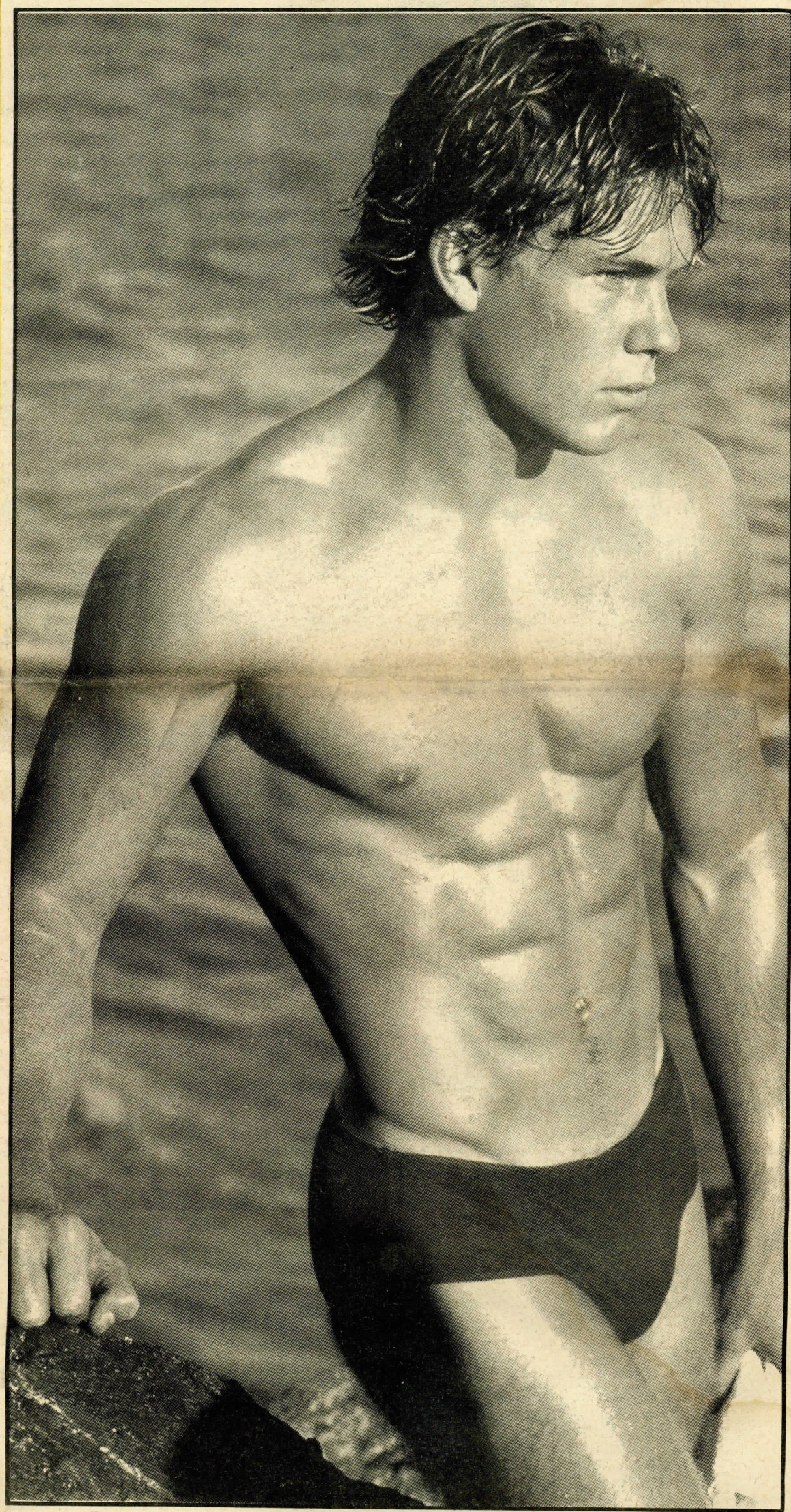

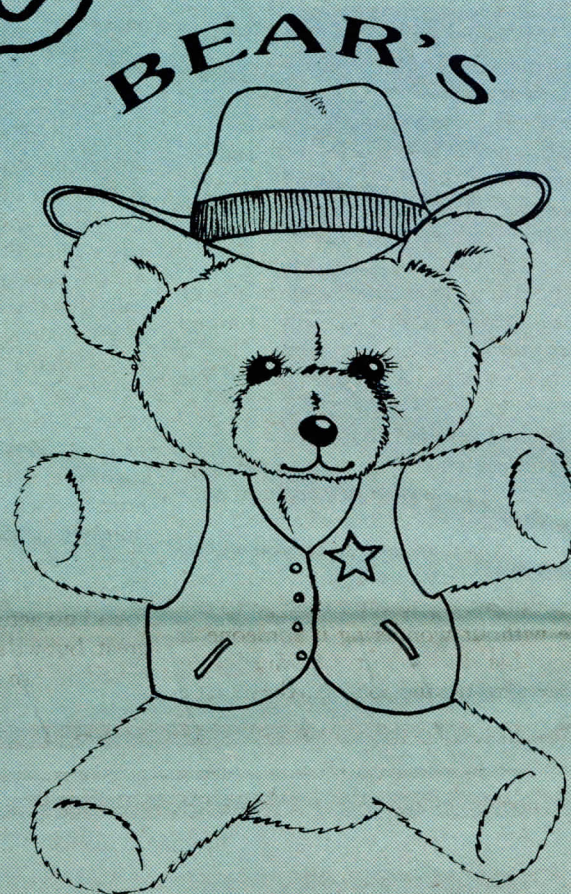

Some people have no sense at all.

It takes a real idiot to go around calling up the authorities and telling them that this or that product has been tampered with, laced with cyanide or otherwise contaminated. I guess these people get their kicks by watching the TV news and seeing the effects of their calls: every night a new product taken off the shelves in the glare of the remote camera.

One phone call. There goes Accent. One phone call. There goes Jello. One phone call. There goes Slice Soda. Boy, that must be the most fun that stupid people can have.

Since the Tylenol and Excedrin horror stories -products that no one warned about, unfortunately -it seems that a bunch of sickos have come out of the woodwork.

It's bad enough living in an urban environment where you can't walk around after dark without worrying and you can't leave your car doors unlocked and you know that the chances are that you will be burglarized at least once in the next four years. But, now you can't even go to the store without wondering if someone is getting his kicks out of murdering strangers by sticking poison in the food or

drugs you buy.

Right now these calls are getting a lot of attention because the idea is new. But place bets on the fact that now the idea is out more and more people will be calling up with anonymous threats, and the media will stop reporting it as a way to discourage the practice. Of course, that does not include cases where the public has to be warned of possible danger from products already sold.

But what can the authorities do? Unless they have a trace on the call or the person makes enough calls to set a pattern that can lead to an identification, there isn't much they can do. One thing is certain, though: they have to take the product off the shelves. Because if they don't and someone has tampered with the product, the results are too drastic to ignore.

It's like false alarms for the Fire Department. Even though quite a number of calls the Houston Fire Department gets per year are false alarms, they have to follow up on every call. Thankfully, the institution of the 911 system has helped the HFD to cut down on obvious malicious false alarms, but still, even if there are only about 5% of the total number of calls that the firemen go out on that stem from maliciousness, that costs the taxpayer quite a chunk of change.

Bomb threats are another case in point, and they have to be treated with respect for that one time that the threat turns out to be real. The Houston Bomb Squad does not like to publicize the number of bomb threats they get, but the fact is, they deal with very few actual bombs. In the past two years, they have found no actual bombs -not one. This is great, but we still have to pay for a bomb squad, just in case. And many times when

the HPD has to check out a threat, it takes manpower away from other areas, inconveniences or frighten people who have to be evacuated from buildings and costs money for all of us.

So, why do people do it? Don't they realize that they are playing for their stupidity as well as every one else? Don't they realize that they could be mugged while the police are off chasing their empty bomb threat? Or their house or apartment could burn down while the Fire Department is off on a wild goose chase they sent them on?

No way. These people have such little, warped brains that they can't even grasp the idea of cause and effect. They only see what they want to see: the uproar they cause. Soon, of course, the media will stop giving coverage to product tampering threats (as they have stopped giving coverage to bomb threats, for the most part), and then merchants will quietly remove products from the shelves for testing.

And the perpetrators of the nonsense will set around, paying more for all products from major companies, paying more for supermarket services, paying more for public servants -and thinking that they've done something clever.

Tamper-proof containers will have to be researched, designed and tested, while products themselves will have to be redesigned. Better security measures will have to be implemented both in the manufacturing plants and in the stores. More man-hours and equipment will have to be used in testing for poisons and improving quality control.

That all adds up to increased costs and decreased availability.

These imbecilic tamperers need to get another past-time -or just get lost.

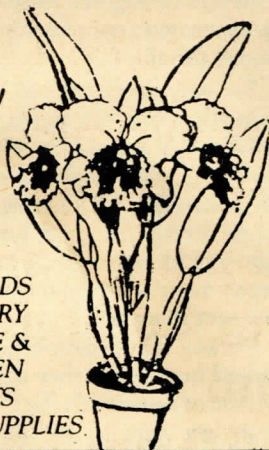

# Network

From a distance, Houston looks like something flung up from the crystals of the earth -green, gold, silver shards soaring into the heavens in striking angles and shapes. It's a very stunning scene, especially for the first time visitor. Those towers shock all who see them for the first time. They scream of prosperous growth and wealth. They jog the mind with technology and the security of a superior civilization that defies gravity and the limitations of earthly materials. That's what Houston represents to those who look upon it for the first time.

But for those of us who have lived here for years, there seems to be something else happening to that once-glorious view. Downtown seems like an exclusive club for those who are out of work. Those thousands of prism-like windows are no longer teaming with activity. Many of those buildings are mostly empty, victims of a faltering economy. The towers represent, to some empty cylinders that used to flow with life, but are now desolate and sad. Downtown itself is really very quiet these days, even during the day, and many faces have disappeared -- moved to other cities where work is more abundant and news from OPEC doesn't cause companies to panic and undermine the security of their workers.

To those who look at Houston in this light, I can only say that every city, no matter how great, has experienced bad times. Fifteen years ago, New York was faltering, sliding down a seemingly endless shaft into the depths of bankruptcy and decay. Its streets were littered and lifeless, its buildings were growing old and falling apart. Now, New York is once

again recognized as the world's greatest city. New buildings and projects soar into the air, once again changing the whole look of the skyline with striking post modern facades and shapes. Old buildings are being refurbished and new buildings are being built to accommodate the streets that were for so long ignored.

A lesson needs to be learned from New York, you know. Houston is the nation's fourth largest city. Its millions team around one of the world's most incredible skylines. Its streets accommodate an unprecedented number of automobiles, carrying people back and forth across hundreds of square miles of urban expanse. The trouble with Houston is that it has always hung its laurels on a few good things, instead of everything.

NASA is a wonderful place. But, unfortunately, it's a very specialized place for very specialized people. As we've seen, the Shuttle disaster has negatively affected the entire space industry for years. The Astrodome is also wonderful, but it is no longer the world's only enclosed stadium, and it is no longer the world's largest. It's just the first. The oil boom was truly wonderful. Houston built upon it and expanded on it, but unfortunately, we overdeveloped the industry so completely that it now runs too efficiently and too cheaply, and the entire city shudders with each new lowering of oil prices. The Ship Channel is also wonderful, but shipping is down worldwide, and without support our Ship Channel will continue to decline.

Houston is in the doldrums for those who look just at these very visible and well publicized aspects of the city. But these are times to look away from these things and start viewing the city as a real city -not just some alien growth that feeds off a few tourist attractions. Watch the shoppers in the River Oaks Shopping Center or the Galleria. See the families coming from church on Navigation or Bissonnet. Sit at a cafe on Alabama or Augusta and watch the cars go by. Visit an art gallery, see a movie, ride your bike under the dense oak trees. Enjoy a dip in the pool, or the spray from a fountain. Read a book in a flower garden or go to the zoo.

Just live a Houston lifestyle, and realize that you are living a far better life than is found practically anywhere. Sure, it's hot in the summer, but there's always lemonade. Sure, there's pollution and a slow economy, but look up in the Midwest where there's nothing for the young people to do but move away.

Instead of publicizing our bad aspects, or relying on the old standby industries and tourist attractions, we need to portray to the country a New City -not a Babylon of darkness and decay, but a Jerusalem of light and space. In the early 1800's they compared London as the black Babylon and Paris as the New Jerusalem. They're calling Houston both right now -and isn't it nice to know that both London and Paris have survived the criticism to become the fabulous centers of civilization they now are?

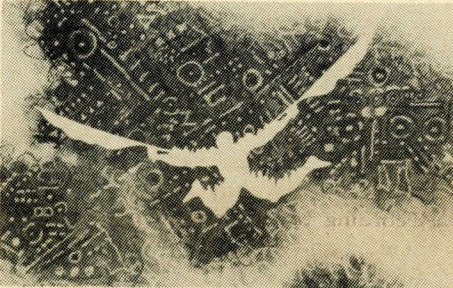


#### GARDEN PARTY TIME

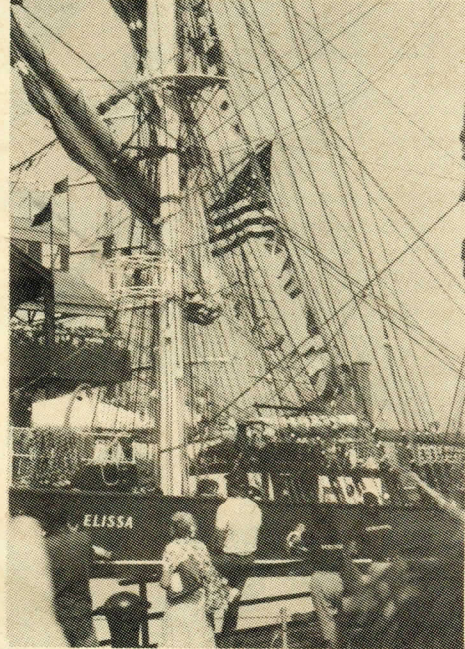
"Wearing The Wings," 14 x 18" Charcoal on paper.

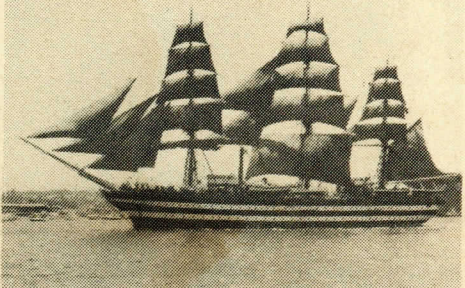
#### AROUND THE LOOP

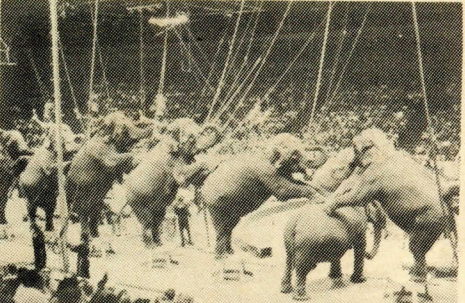

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
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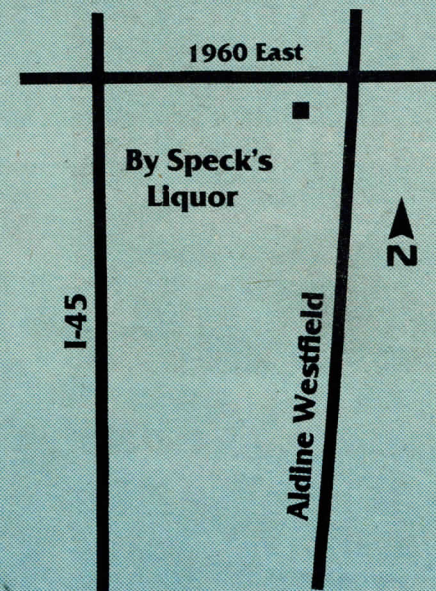

Perhaps the legislature can hire the Mets to come in and punch out anyone who disagrees with their cuts.

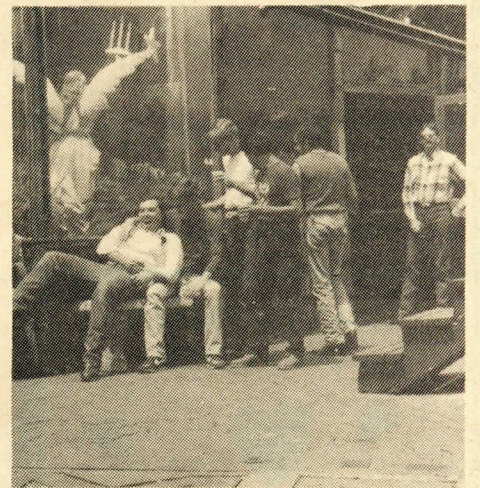
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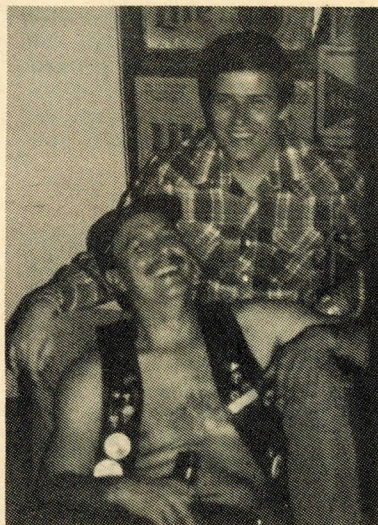
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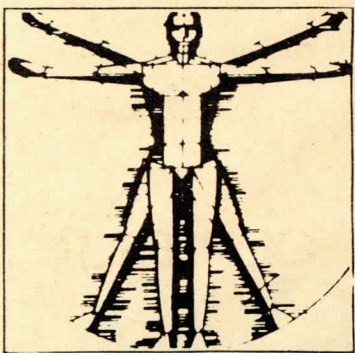
