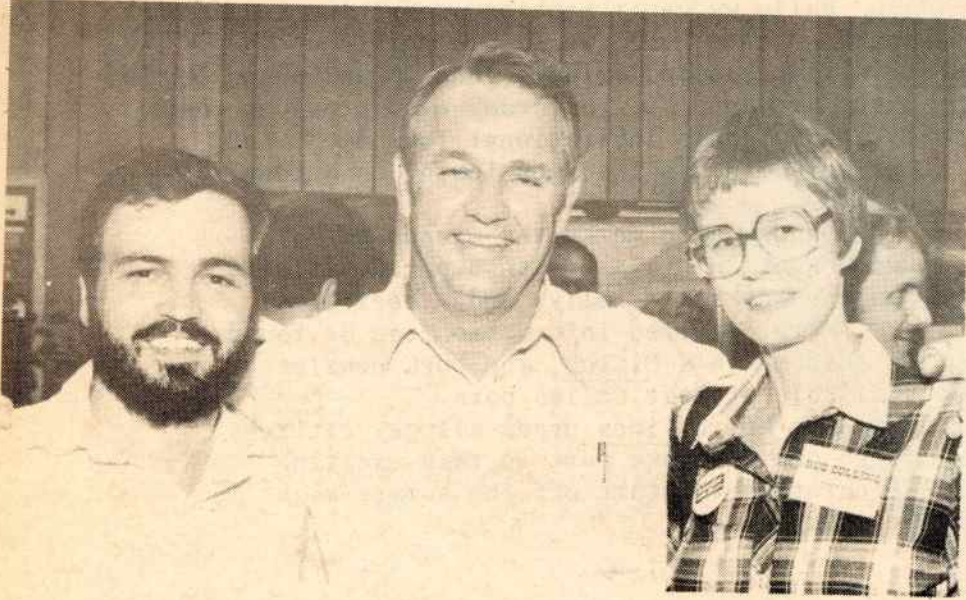

The Angry Apache, located at 2504 Berne, holds its Grand Opening Thursday, June 12 from 9 until 11 in the evening. In order to comply with local liquor regulations, the Angry Apache will be a private club with \$1.00 annual membership fee. A piano bar will be featured.

The new establishment is located near the corner of Illinois at Hampton, just minutes from major highways. Owner Jamie reports a good crowd thus far and anticipates better things as the public becomes aware of the club's existence. To reach the bar, take I-35 south to Illinois, right on Illinois to Berne (the last block before Hampton), and right on Berne to the end of the block, where the club is located on the right.

## B&W a Ball

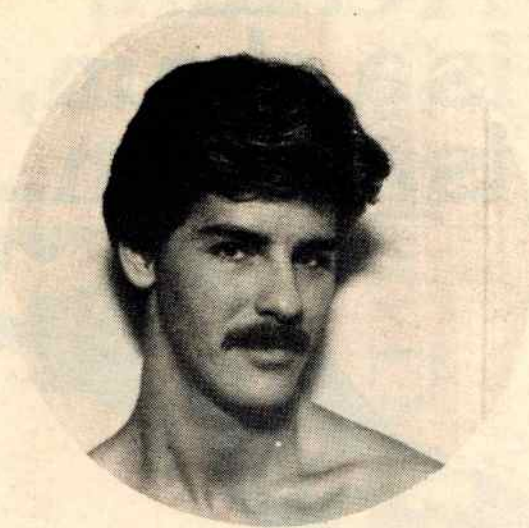
In the garden, an orchestra played for dancing while a nearby fountain sparkled with delicious champagne punch and lights twinkled in the trees overhead.

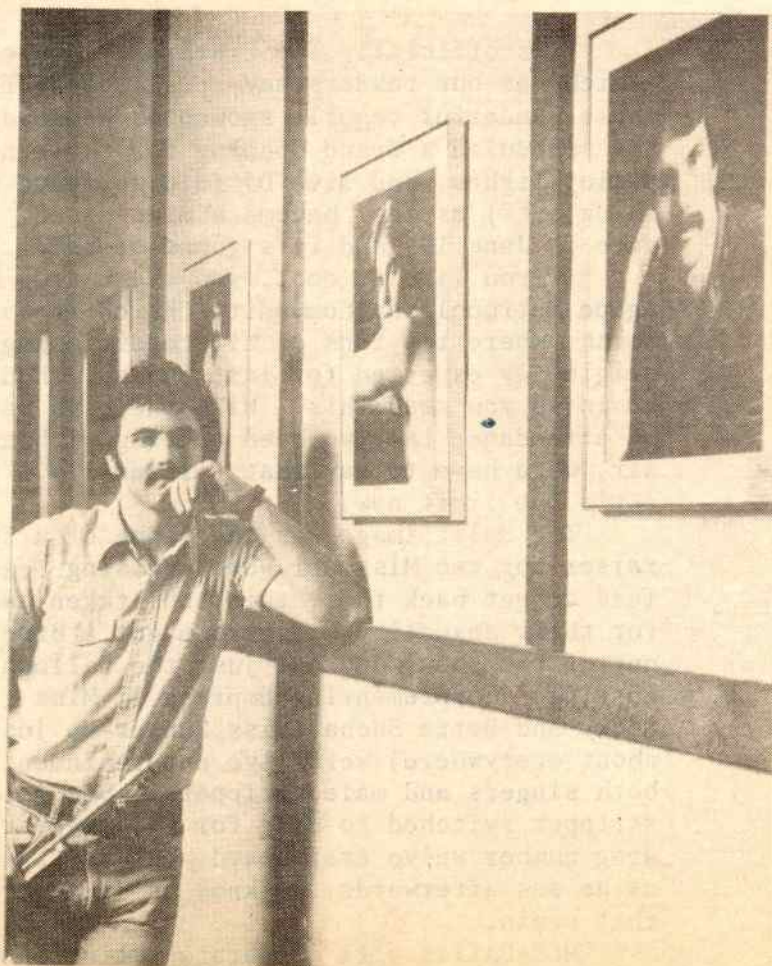
## Photos to be Exhibited

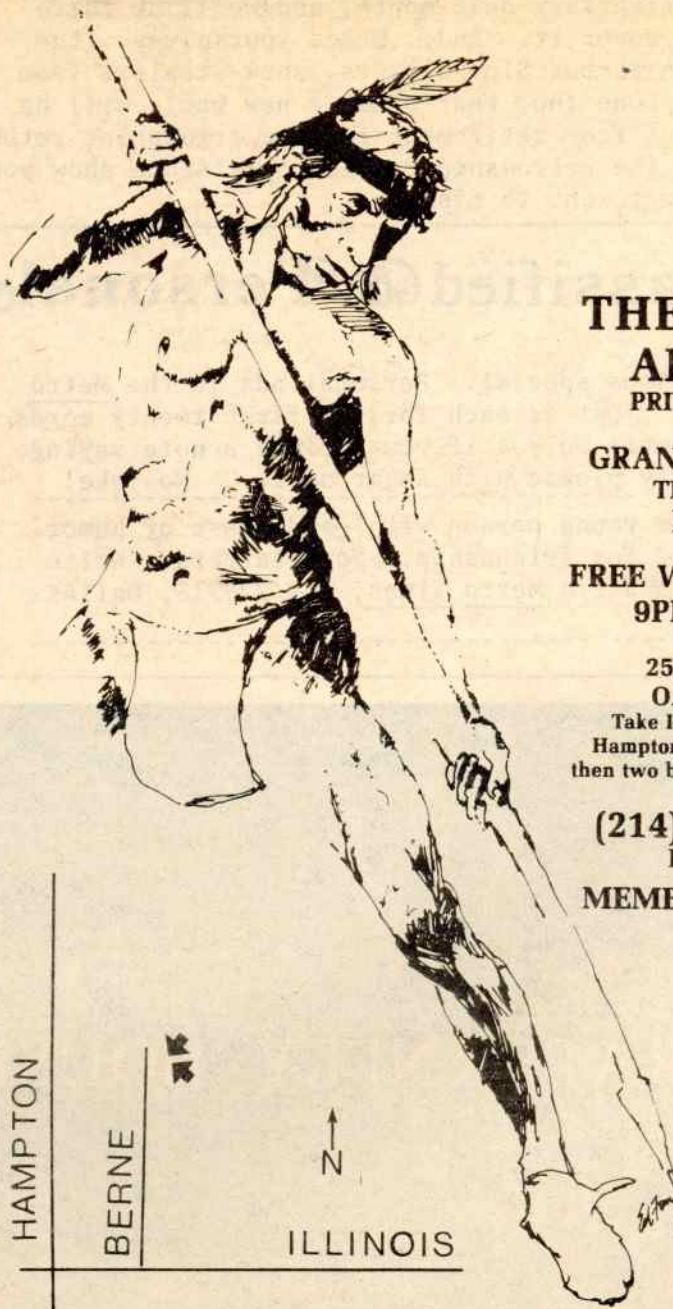

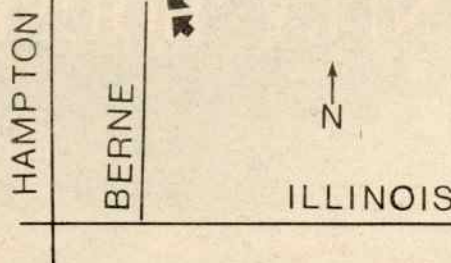

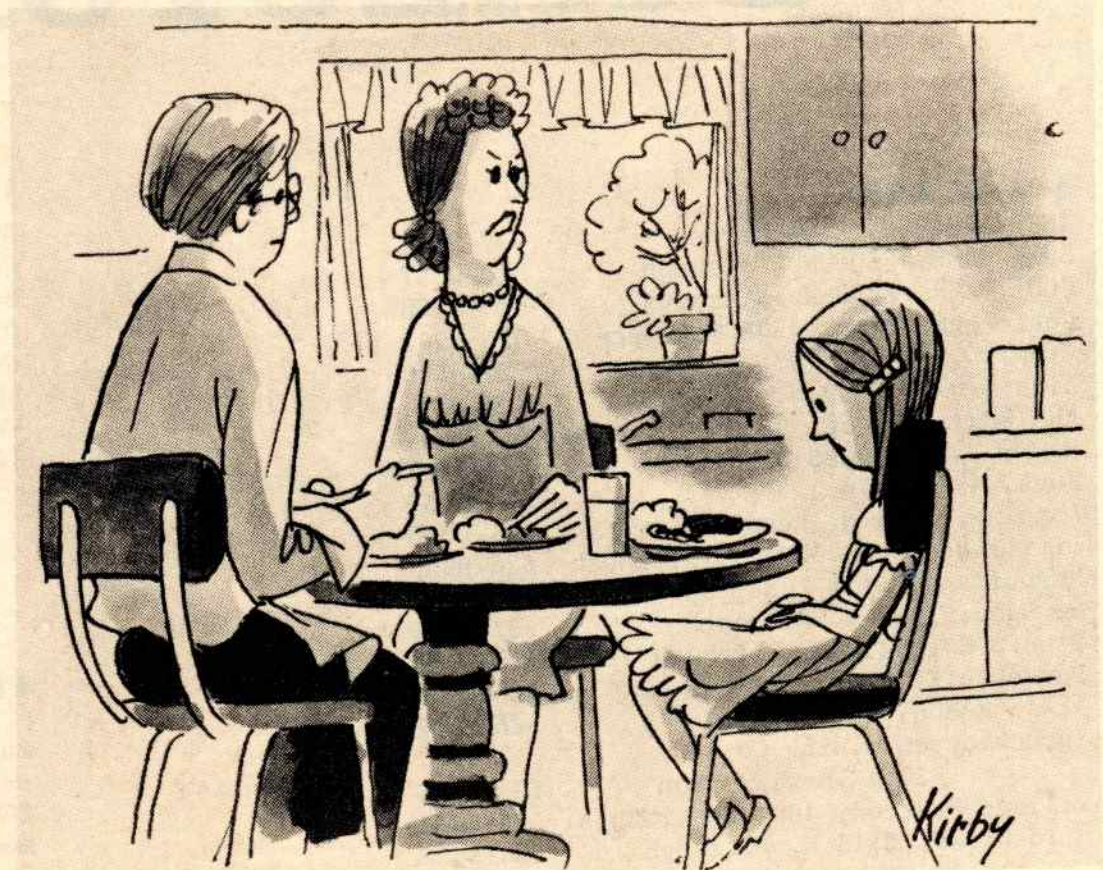
