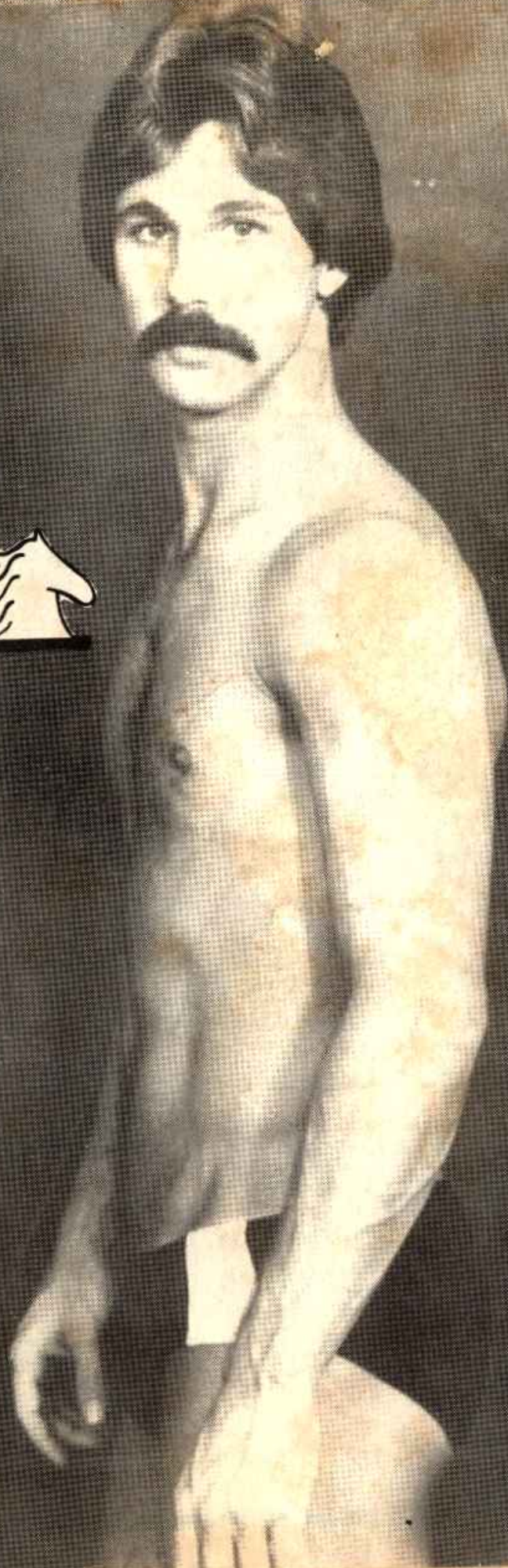
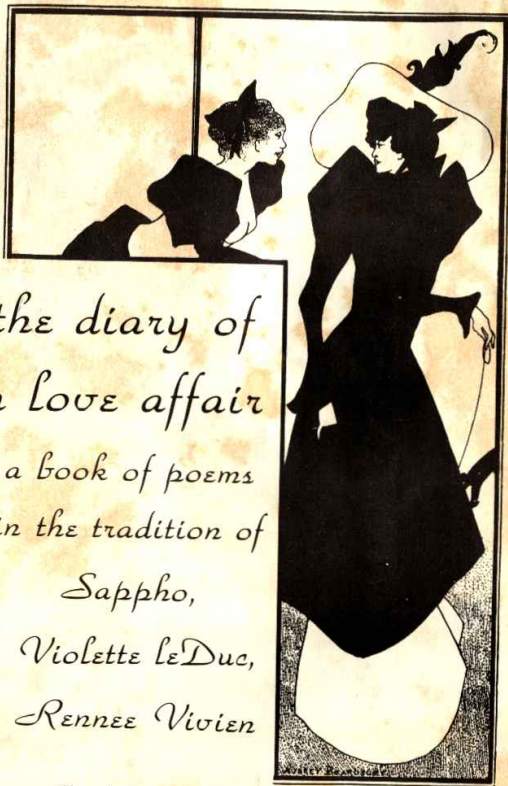

Brothers and Sisters,

The sad history of societies whose freedom eroded from within is that the demise of liberty has always started with the persecution of one identifiable group.

Now that we are increasingly identifying ourselves, we are committed to seeing that this sad history does not repeat itself in the United States.

We demand what our experience in this splendid city has taught us to believe in: Liberty and Justice for All.

Today, as we observe our annual celebration of Gay Freedom, we also serve notice to this nation that we will not long tolerate a condition of being half-free.

We will not accept the denial of equal rights to law abiding, constructive citizens, for no other reason than their choice of whom to love.

We do not accept discrimination in employment, housing, the right to teach. We do not accept the confiscation of our children. We do not accept that lesbian and gay foreigners are denied the right even to visit the Land of the Free.

These and other blatant indignities, are a slander against the words "Liberty and Justice for All."

Let no one misunderstand our goal. We will not rest until these indignities are abolished.

Let no one underestimate our numbers, or our determination.

And let those who would characterize our movement as selfish, or self-indulgent, understand that in seeking liberty and justice for ourselves, we are seeking liberty and justice for all. Ultimately, let them understand that if they want liberty and justice for themselves, they can not deny liberty and justice to us.

Today, we celebrate the very magnitude of our task, and the fact that we are chosen at this moment in history to be among the leaders in humanity's great struggle for liberty.

Today, we celebrate the city of San Francisco, whose success as a region where gay people are welcome is a reassurance to oppressed people everywhere that an end to bigotry cannot be long distant.

Today, we celebrate the cooperation we have achieved with our non-gay friends and with other minorities, and we join them in reaffirming our dedication to a goal that is not ours alone: Liberty and Justice for All.

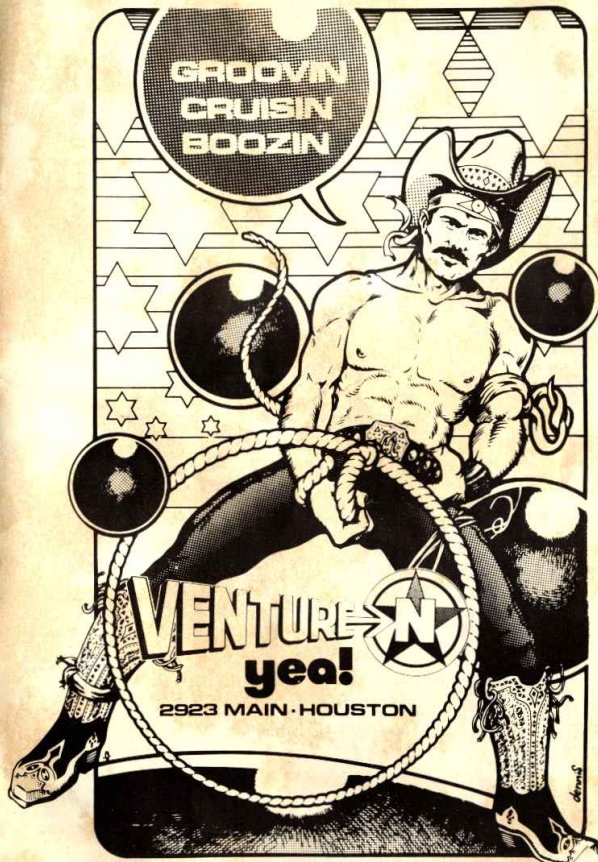

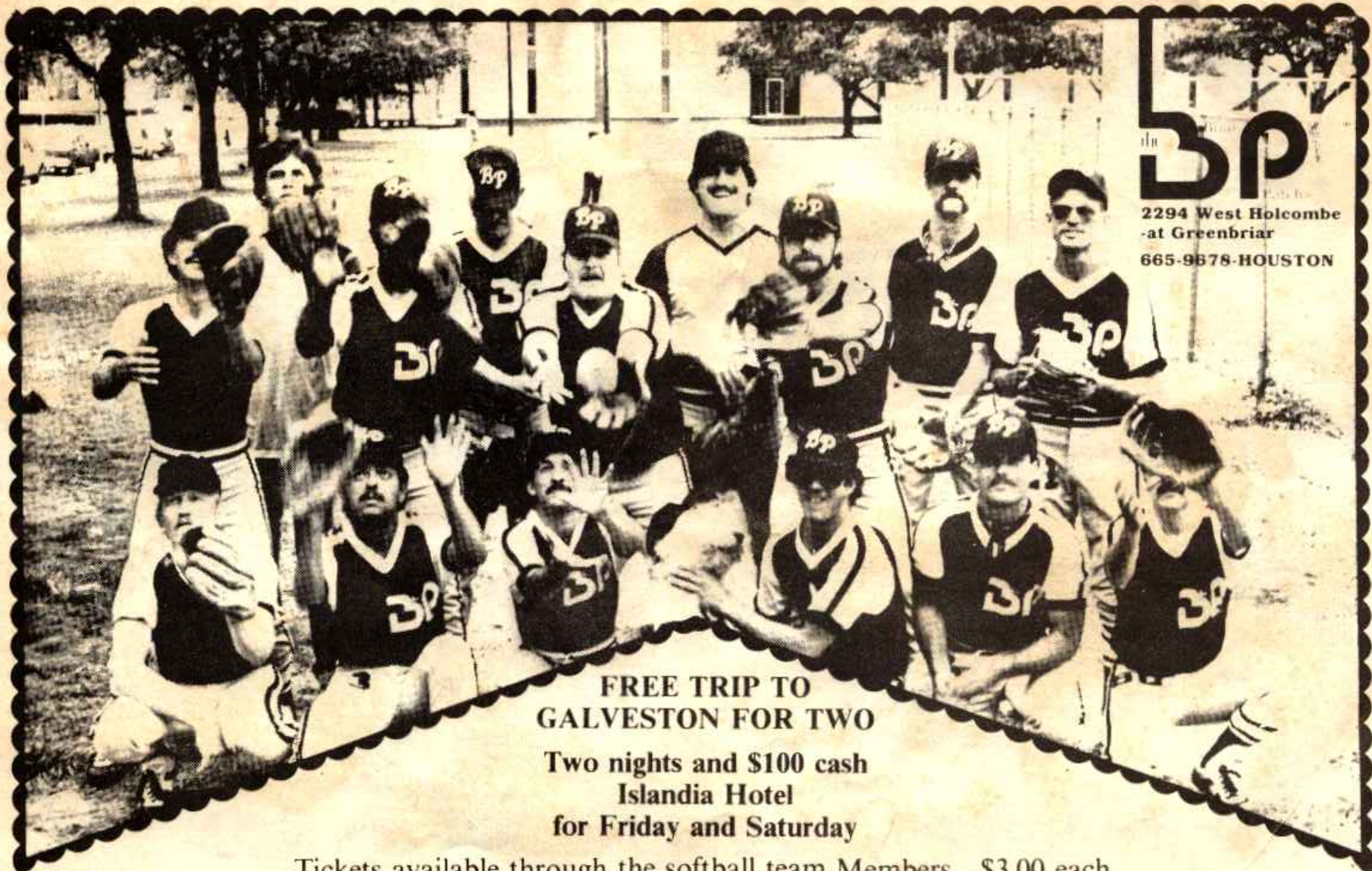
