How to Get Information On Texas Legislation

Is there any bill in the current session of the Texas legislature that is of particular interest to you? If so, there are now two easy ways to find out its status.

The first way is to call the Legislative Reference number toll-free at 1-800-253-9693. The library is open 8 a.m.-6 p.m. Monday-Thursday, 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Friday, and whenever the House or Senate is in session.

Another way is to use the Internet. The address for Legislative information is <http://capitol.tlc.texas.gov>.

The information there is updated daily and includes the daily legislative calendar, a list of legislators with addresses and phone numbers, census information on each house and senate district, a 1994 election analysis, and visitor's info. There is also full information about every bill and resolution filed in this session.

Only five other sources currently provide legislative information on the Internet.
