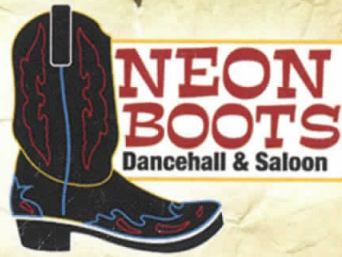

## *Prelude to a Gay Legend*

*Excerpt from The Diana Foundation: 65 Years of History*

David Moncrief invited a select group of approximately ten friends to join him at his apartment for a pre-awards cocktail party, which would be followed by the first televised Oscar broadcast.

Houston in 1953 was not an accepting place for gay men and lesbians, so private house parties were the only way for them to socialize freely. Johnna Lee Mueller, in her early twenties and a model at Sakowitz department store, was delighted to be included on Moncrief's guest list. She arrived for the party dressed in after-five cocktail elegance, as would the other guests.

Except for Moncrief and his roommate Curtis Wright, Mueller isn't sure who all the other guests were that evening. But likely possibilities are the other gay people she socialized with regularly—Jimmy Valentine, Clinton Quinn, Edward Terry, Wray Query, Charles Temple, Tom Adams, Bob Wilson, Charles Knight, Alan Richard, Glenn Smith, Virginia Lankford, and Jack Horton.

Moncrief lived in a beautiful New Orleans French Quarter-style enclave of apartments, shops, and gardens on Louisiana Street. The block had been designed by Parker Edwards, a much sought-after decorator of the time. Edwards rented out living and business spaces on the block to creative and artistic tenants.

In the living room of Moncrief and Wright's apartment was an eye-catching plaster model of Diana, the Roman goddess of the hunt. Nearly life-size, the statue stood in a corner. It had previously resided at Sakowitz, where Wright worked as a window dresser, and when the store no longer needed it, he decided it would add an eclectic touch to the apartment.

The statue reminded Mueller of the Diana statue on the grounds of Ima Hogg's Bayou Bend mansion in River Oaks. Diana's toga stopped just above the knees, and her right hand was bent up and backwards towards a quiver on her back.

Mueller remembers eating hors d'oeuvres and enjoying cocktail chatter up until the time of the awaited Oscar broadcast. The moment finally arrived. Moncrief turned on the television set. But, as often happened in those days, the reception of the broadcast signal failed, and the set displayed only black and white "snow," accompanied by the sound of static.

As they had for years before, the group listened to a radio announcer describe the event. But meanwhile other Americans were watching as Shirley Booth's face broke into delight at being named Best Actress for her role in "Come Back Little Sheba".

The party had not proceeded as Moncrief had planned. But it did serve as an important catalyst for the birth of Houston's Dianas. Little did Moncrief know that he had set the stage for what would become America's oldest continuously active gay organization.

# 2021-2022 Recipients

Diana members are proud to support our 2020-2021 beneficiaries. Each of the organizations provides something positive for our community.

## LAW HARRINGTON SENIOR LIVING CENTER

The first LGBTQ-affirming senior-living facility in Texas—and one of the largest of its kind in the country—is now open in Houston’s Third Ward. The complex, designed by Smith & Company Architects, features 112 one- and two-bedroom independent living apartments for low-income seniors ages 62 and older. Eligible seniors will pay no more than 30 percent of their income for rent. Additional features of the property include a social services department managed by the Montrose Center, geriatric primary care clinic provided by Legacy Community Health, a group dining area, meeting and game rooms, fitness center, a dog park, a vegetable garden, and outdoor recreational spaces. The Montrose Center empowers our community—primarily lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGBTQ) individuals and their families—to live healthier, more fulfilling lives.

## THE PET PATROL HOUSTON

The nation’s first Pet Patrol for PWAs was launched in Houston in August 1987, by founder Tori Williams, who realized the importance of pets in improving the quality of life for people living with HIV/AIDS. Through the dedication of its team of volunteers guided by the founding vision, the organization has grown to offer limited income elderly and people living with chronic illnesses a broad range of services, including free pet food and supplies, basic veterinary care and immunizations, foster care for pets in the event the owner becomes hospitalized, transportation to and from veterinary clinics, spaying and neutering, grooming, and education for pet owners and the community about the the healing benefits of pet ownership.

The Golden Bow Award was created by The Diana Foundation Board of Directors to honor those Diana Foundation members who have given of their talent, time and contributions.

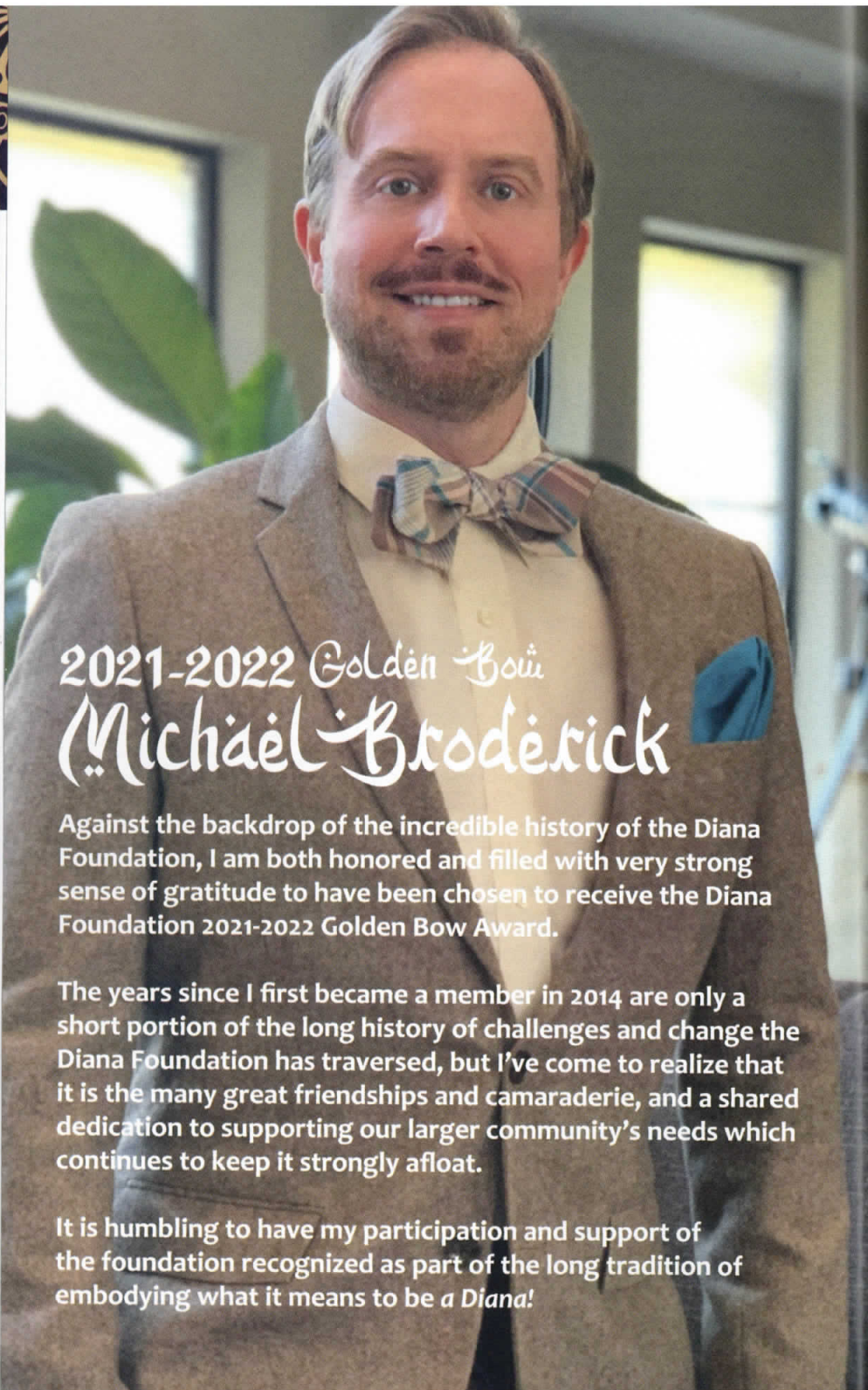

The Diana Award for Community Achievement

## Ann Robison

In 1988, Ann Robison was hired to lead the 13-person behavioral health organization known then as Montrose Counseling Center. Dr. Robison has transformed that small agency with its \$385,000 budget to the multi-service LGBTQ community center that exists today, with an annual budget exceeding \$6 million. Dr. Robison's vision to develop programs that improve the quality of life and outcomes for consumers has been instrumental in this growth. Her background as an anti-violence advocate led her to found Texas's first domestic violence/sexual assault/hate crimes services specifically for LGBTQ survivors. Her Ph.D. from the University of Texas School of Public Health lends a holistic view of service to the community. That perspective led to the rescue of two struggling organizations – a 24-hour crisis hotline (the LGBT Switchboard) and the oldest LGBTQ youth organization in Texas (Hatch Youth) – by bringing them under the Center's wing and providing an infrastructure and setting in which they could thrive. Under Dr. Robison's leadership, the Center staff and volunteers have integrated behavioral health with primary care, developed senior services and youth homeless prevention services. She also saw a need for a centralized Cultural Center offering community meeting space and synergy with small LGBTQ non-profit partners. With Ann Robison's leadership, the Montrose Center has flourished as a first-class LGBTQ center with a national reputation.

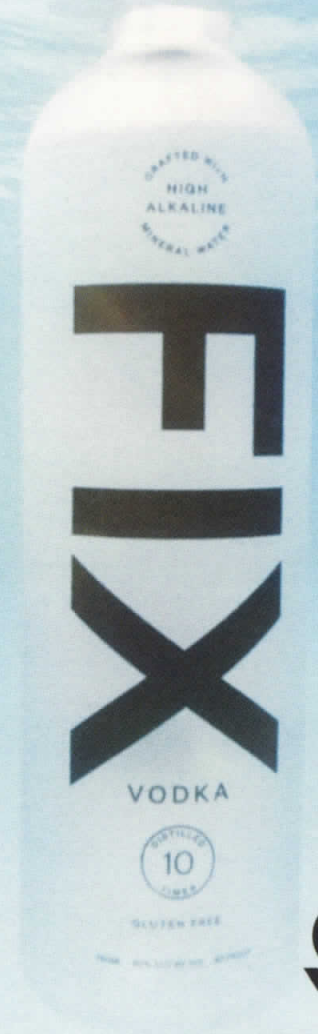
Dr. Robison is a founding board member of the Network of Behavioral Health Providers. This organization brings together the majority of behavioral health providers in Harris and Fort Bend Counties to collaborate on joint projects and advocate with a collective voice for consumers.
