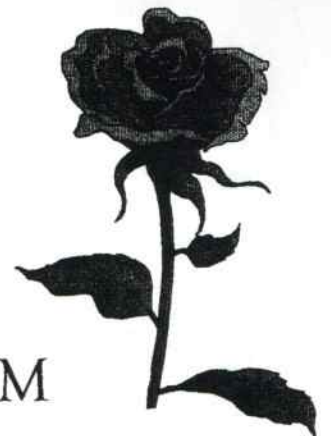

27.) Questions about our 501.3c status were answered by Lyle. Lyle mentioned it was the suggestion of the IRS. Jerry mentioned the advice may cost us money. We will listen to more suggestions from members.

MEMBERSHIP: OPEN TO ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO EXHIBITS QUALITIES OF, OR IS A PROFESSED URSAPHILE (BEAR LOVER).

A MEMBER'S ACCEPTANCE OR DENIAL SHALL BE ON THE SCRUTINY OF THE DEN OF ACTIVE MEMBERS.

OFFICERS: ALL GOVERNING OF THE DEN SHALL BE DONE BY A TRIAD OF ACTIVE MEMBERS WHO SHALL BE ELECTED AND/OR RE-ELECTED ONCE A YEAR BY A VOTE OF THE DEN OF ACTIVE MEMBERS (IN PERSON OR BY PROXY).

MEETINGS: DEN MEETINGS SHALL BE HELD ONCE A MONTH. MEMBERS ARE ENCOURAGED, BUT NOT REQUIRED, TO ATTEND.

EXCEPTION: VOTING FOR TRIAD MEMBERS.

DUES: ACTIVE MEMBER STATUS: \$20.00 YEARLY.

ASSOCIATE MEMBER STATUS: (NON-VOTING) \$10.00 YEARLY.

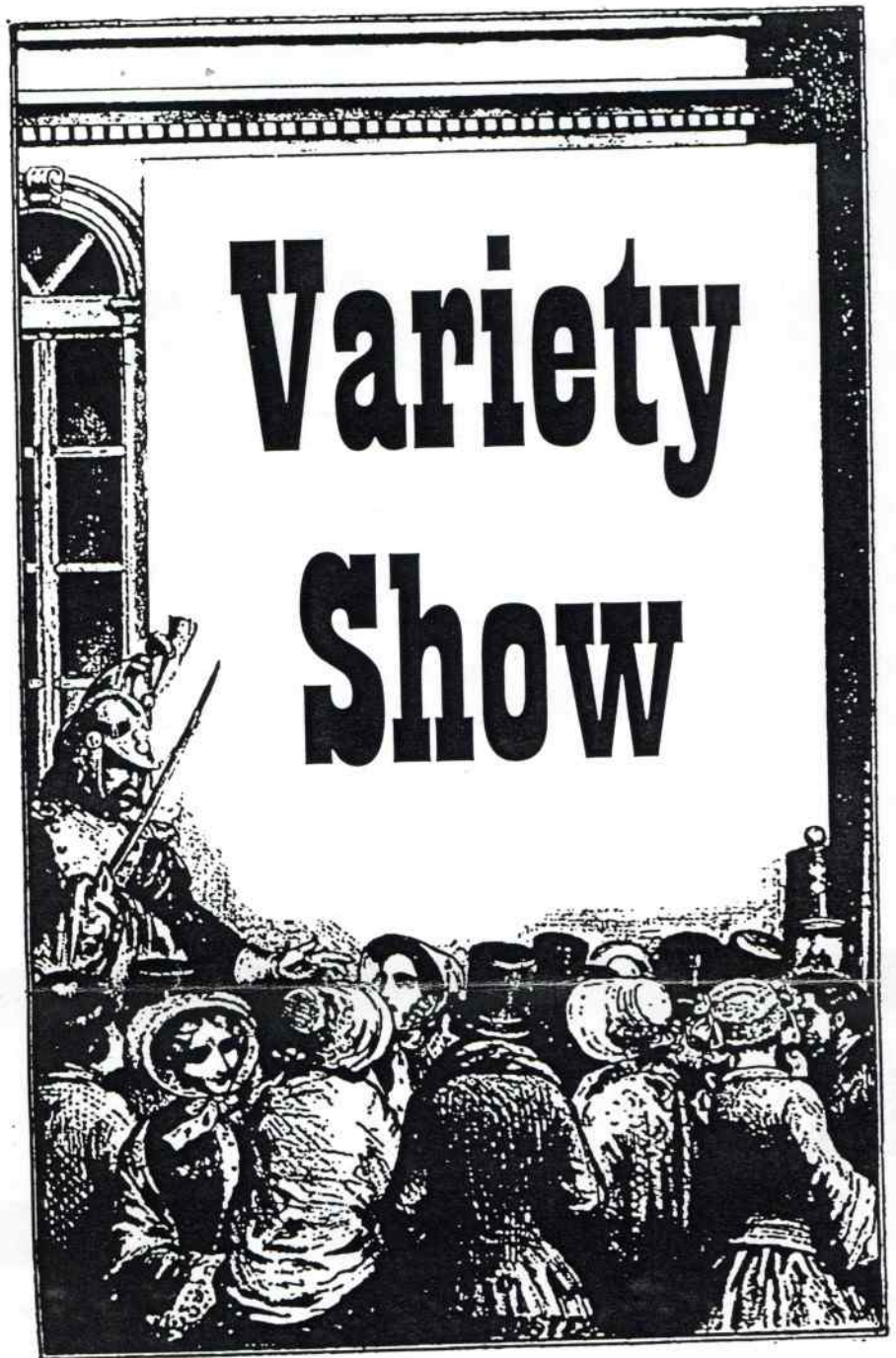

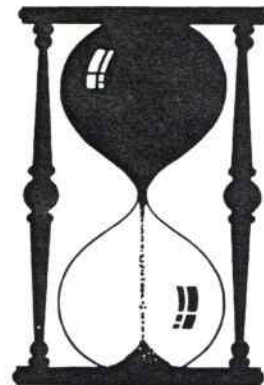

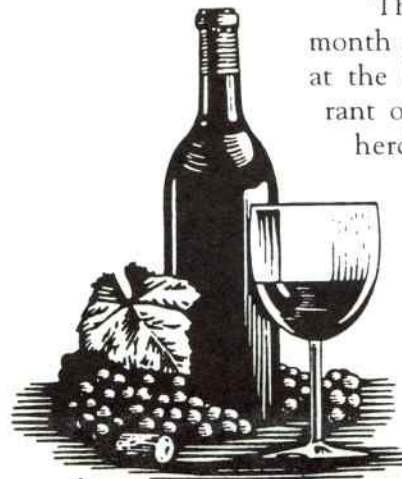
Meeting people online is fun and you can have a wonderful vacation by trading hospitality. Maybe we will see some new faces at LUEY.

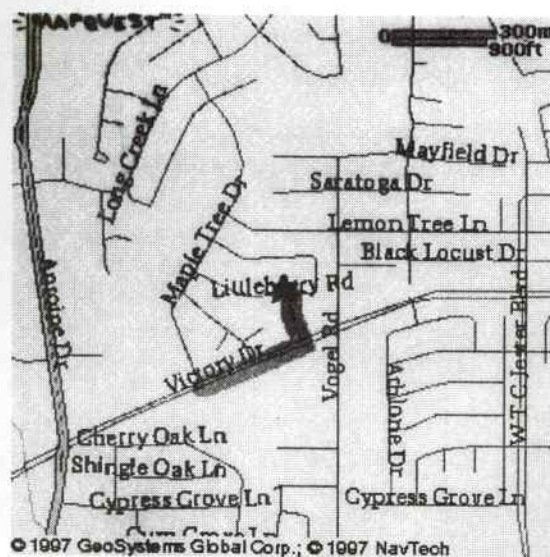
