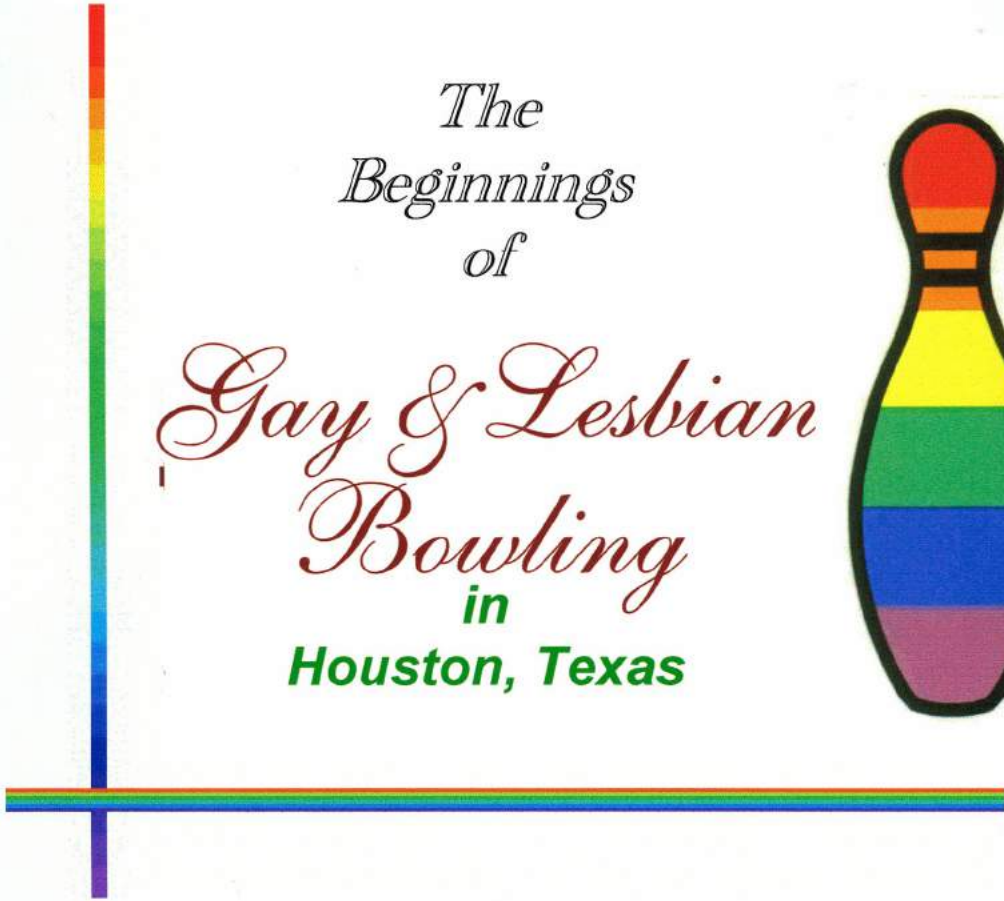

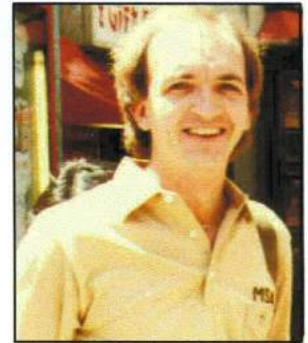

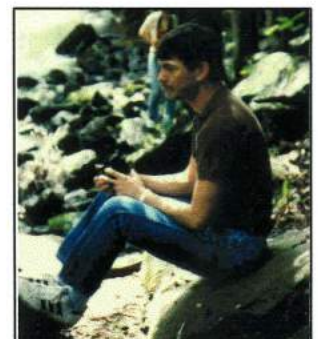

## **GAY BOWLING IN HOUSTON- THE BEGINNING YEARS**

**March, 1979:** Gay bowlers gathered by advertising in *TWT* for "a night out at the lanes" for practice fun at Stadium Lanes and Merchant Park Lanes.

**May 14, 1979:** Houston's first gay bowling league, MSA Men's League, begins with 6 teams and 30 members at Stadium Lanes.

**August 9, 1979:** An article in the *Advocate*, "Gay Sports in America," recognizes Houston gay bowling.

**September, 1979:** MSA Men's Winter League, begins with 22 teams (ending with 20) with 5 members each to be Stadium Lanes' second largest league for the season.

**October, 1979:** MSA Bowling is represented at the First Gay March on Washington.

**May, 1980:** MSA bowlers attend the 1st. Stonewall Tournament in New York at the first national-international gay bowling tournament held during the Memorial Day weekend.

**June, 1980:** MSA Men's Summer League begins its second Summer with 26 teams.

**August, 1980:** MSA bowlers attend the Hollywood Bowl Tournament in Los Angeles, where IGBO (the International Gay Bowling Organization) is founded.

**September, 1980:** MSA Men's Winter League begins the season with 56 teams (5 members each) and finishes with 54. The league is unofficially recognized by Houston Bowling Association as the largest 5 man team, men's league in the country, and officially confirmed as the largest league in the State of Texas.

**November, 1980 (Thanksgiving):** MSA bowlers attend the 2nd. HIT (Holiday Invitational Tournament) in Milwaukee where Houston receives the bid for the 1st. IGBO Tournament.

**February, 1981:** 1st. TROT (Texas Roll-off Tournament) in Dallas.

**April, 1981:** 1st. Dixie in Atlanta.

**May, 1981 (Memorial Weekend):** Houston hosts the 1st. IGBO Tournament with 65 teams (325 bowlers).

**June, 1981:** MSA Men's Summer League begins its third Summer with 48 teams.

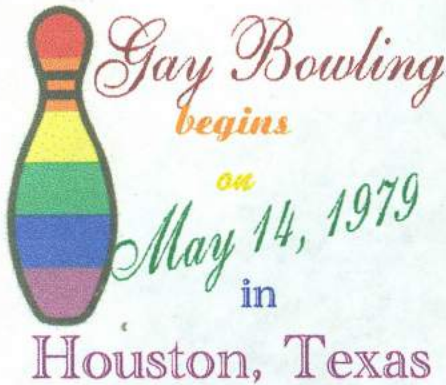
**September, 1981:** Mixed League Bowling begins with the Eddie Chavez League and MSA Men's Winter League begins its third Winter with 64 teams.

**June, 1982:** MSA Men's League begins its fourth Summer with 44 teams.

**September, 1982:** MSA Men's League begins its fourth Winter with an all time record of 66 (5 member) teams.

**July, 1986:** MSA Bowling hosts the first TIT '86 (Texas Invitational Tournament).

**- Season 1 -  
March-August, 1979: Pre League and The Beginning**



All bowlers, who are gay or lesbian, growing up prior to the 1970's probably dreamed of one day being able to enjoy what they like best-- bowling, with other gays and lesbians, especially once everyone started coming out after Stonewall. That dream became real when one individual began the process to make it happen in Houston, Texas.

Nick Escobedo, who was President of the Montrose Sports Association Volleyball League, with intentions of expanding the organization to other gay sports in Houston, gathered friends and fellow volleyball players who enjoyed and knew the game of bowling to begin Houston's first gay bowling league. They were Tommy Davis, Ed McKelvey, and Gerald Hagan. Little did any of them imagine that a lot was about to happen very rapidly within the inner circle of gay bowling during the first few years.

Together, they networked with other gay bowlers by recruiting friends and by advertising a "guys' night out at the lanes" in TWT's classified section during the months of March and April, 1979. Stadium Lanes and Merchant Park Lanes were chosen houses closest to the Montrose area to attract more people. As individuals would attend weekly, names were gathered of those interested in eventually forming a league. Thirty individuals were interested by the beginning of the ABC's Summer Season, May 14, 1979, to form the first gay bowling league in Houston, a 6 team (with 5 members each) league called MSA Summer League, under the umbrella of Montrose Sports Association. The league was small and "disappeared" on lanes 31-36 in the corner of Stadium Lanes' (a 72 lane house) "red" side.

The league felt somewhat unnoticed until at season's end there was talk of the league possibly moving to another house (which no longer exists) with only 16 lanes in the Galleria Shopping Center. The manager of Stadium Lanes approached the MSA League president and asked what would it take to keep the league at Stadium and questioned if the league was being hassled by anyone for being gay. That was the first acknowledgment to the house that this was a gay league. He was comforted in knowing that the league's concerns were lane conditions and the late 9 p.m. starting time and not that anyone was hassled for being gay. He then asked what would it take to keep this league. This was a market he wanted to be first in Houston's bowling industry to tap. (To our knowledge this was the first welcoming of the gay community in a Houston public place of business outside of the gay community.)

His offer to keep the league was as follows: (1) he would pay for all gay media advertising needed to recruit new members, (2) pay a nice sum toward awards and banquet expenses, (3) guarantee improvements in lane conditions, (4) keep the 9 p.m. Monday time slot, and (5) if achieved at least 20 teams, everyone in the league would receive a free, drilled bowling ball.

**- Season 2 -  
September, 1979 - May, 1980: MSA Men's Winter League**

The league accepted the manager's offer and grew to 22, five member teams for its first Winter season (1979-80). Everyone received their free bowling balls. Unfortunately, just as the season began, the manager was terminated. The new manager, Tom Dunn, had the responsibility of carrying out the house's commitment to the league. Tom wasn't too thrilled working with the gay league, but was encouraged by the house owner, Jamie Brooks of Galveston, to do so. After all, the league was already in its second season and the house's second largest. He continued to insist to Tom that this was a market he also wanted to tap. Tom still chose to take Monday's as his night off to politely avoid this gay league.

Stadium's new gay patrons experienced unacceptable treatment from one lady behind the desk. After the manager ignored the incident, the league officers took the matter to the owners. Since the beginning, many gay bowlers were practicing on other nights and made great friends with Nancy Perales, a desk clerk at the time who was also off on Monday's. Richard Dauchy, Treasurer, shared a leadership role in representing the league in negotiating the matter with management.

The owner, Jamie Brooks, once again very supportive of his

gay league, asked what action the league suggests he take for the employee's behavior. The league asked that he place Nancy in the position, who was very willing to make the change and wanted to be with the gays on Monday nights. She saw Mondays as a fun night to work. Jamie Brooks insisted that Tom give his gay league what they wanted and promote Nancy to Night Manager.

The reluctant manager recognized that this was his second largest league in his house, watched his bar tab proportionately increase for the league size, and hearing word that his gay league was probably the most "fun" in town. Of course, Nancy with her access to the house microphone contributed greatly to that.

Tom with curiosity then visited the lanes on his Monday nights off. Soon afterwards he eventually joined in the fun every Monday. By season's end of the first Winter (1979-80) season, the once distant manager, was taking his wife and children out on his night off to have fun with his gay league. The league rapidly achieved awareness of its existence throughout the bowling industry as "gay". Houston Bowling Association recognized the impact the league had achieved in the bowling community. Houston's first gay league was definitely out of the closet!

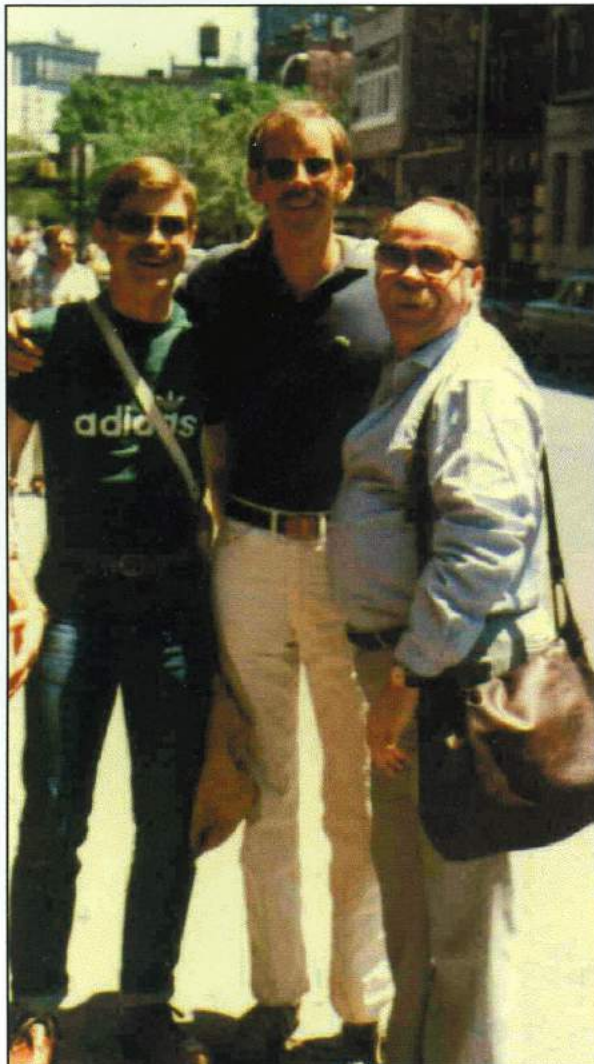
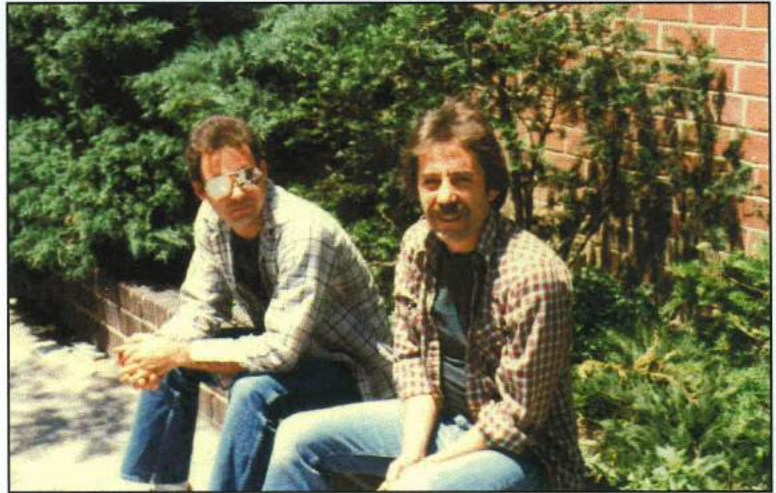

**National-International Gay Bowling Networking  
Begins with Article in The Advocate....and  
an Invitation to the 1st. Stonewall Tournament in  
New York, Memorial Weekend, 1980**

An article appeared in the August 9, 1979, issue of The Advocate on gay sports in America. This article identified individuals associated with gay sports in each major city. As a result, MSA Bowling was invited by Leo Gender of New York City's Gay Brotherhood Liaison to attend its first international gay bowling tournament, the Stonewall Tournament, during Memorial Holiday weekend, May, 1980. Leo's attempt to gather gay bowlers throughout the country was the first known effort ever as a gay national-international tournament. (In November, 1979, Milwaukee's HIT hosted a regional tournament of surrounding major cities.) Cities represented at the Stonewall Tournament were Atlanta, Houston, Toronto, and New York. The tournament was held at Madison Square Gardens. All guests were housed in New York City by GBL's members. Phil Howard, Wally Talbot, Jim Hampton, and Gerald Hagan from Houston attended the event.

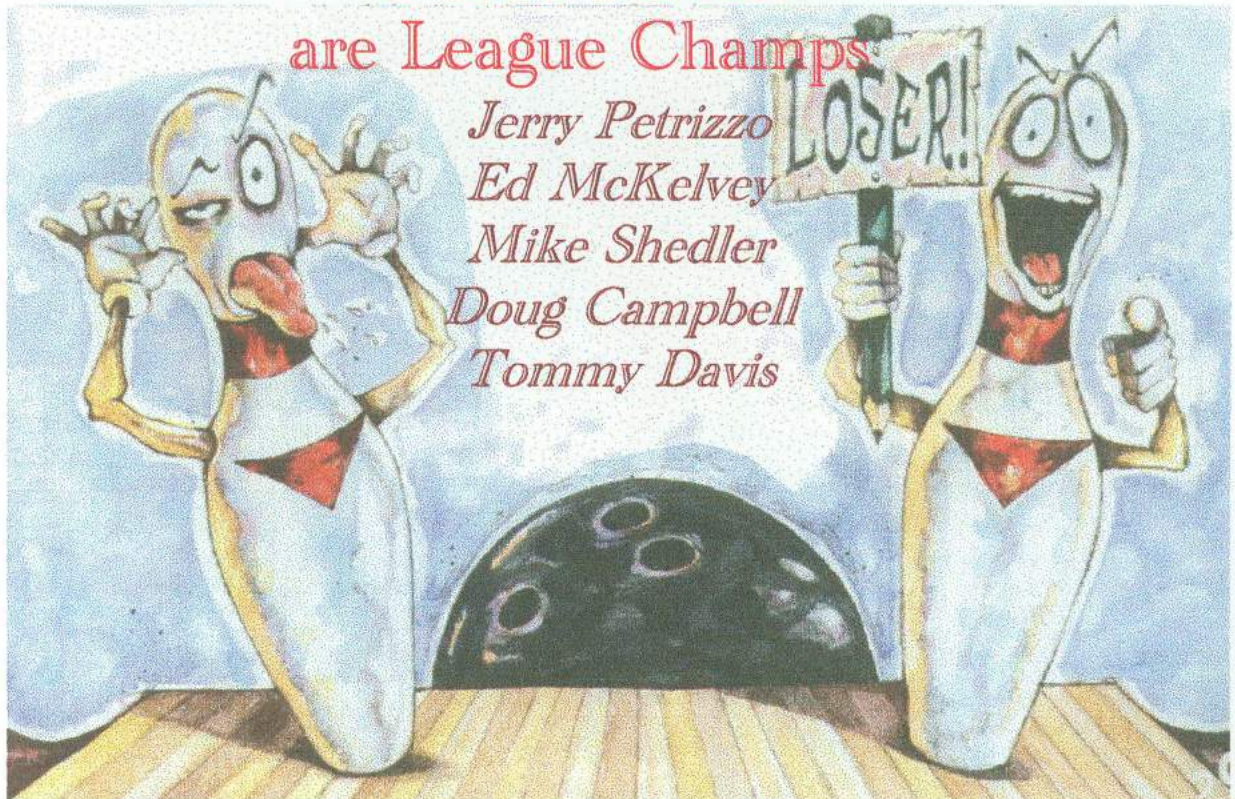

Through the parent organization, MSA bowlers enjoyed events outside of bowling such as a group excursion to Hippy Hollow at Lake Travis and an Astro Dome sky box for a home game.

## IGBO Is Founded August 29, 1980.

The highlight of MSA's second Summer season was the invitation to the Hollywood Bowl Tournament in Los Angeles where IGBO (International Gay Bowling Organization) was founded. The tournament was given in conjunction with the 1980 Gay World Softball Series. Houston was represented with one team by Tommy Davis, Rod Lee, Larry Westbrook, and Gerald Hagan. Only those cities with both softball and bowling were invited to the bowling tournament since softball's NAGA (North American Gay Alliance) was to vote on whether or not to include bowling in its organization. Before NAGA voted not to include bowling into its organization, the six cities (Houston, Los Angeles, Milwaukee, New York, San Diego, and Toronto) that attended the bowling tournament decided to form its own organization for bowling. The International Gay Bowling Organization, IGBO, was then born (and named later at HIT in Milwaukee) on August 29, 1980. Among the original founding fathers of IGBO were Houston's Tommy Davis and Gerald Hagan. Tom Hack of New York and David Theiss of Milwaukee were chosen by the 6 founding cities as president and secretary/treasurer until the Memorial Day, 1981 tournament. It was then decided that the organization would meet again a few months later in Milwaukee during their 2nd. HIT during the Thanksgiving Holidays, 1980. In the meantime the original cities would network to recruit others to join the organization. Then it would be decided on who would give IGBO's first tournament on Memorial weekend, May, 1981. Houston won that bid.

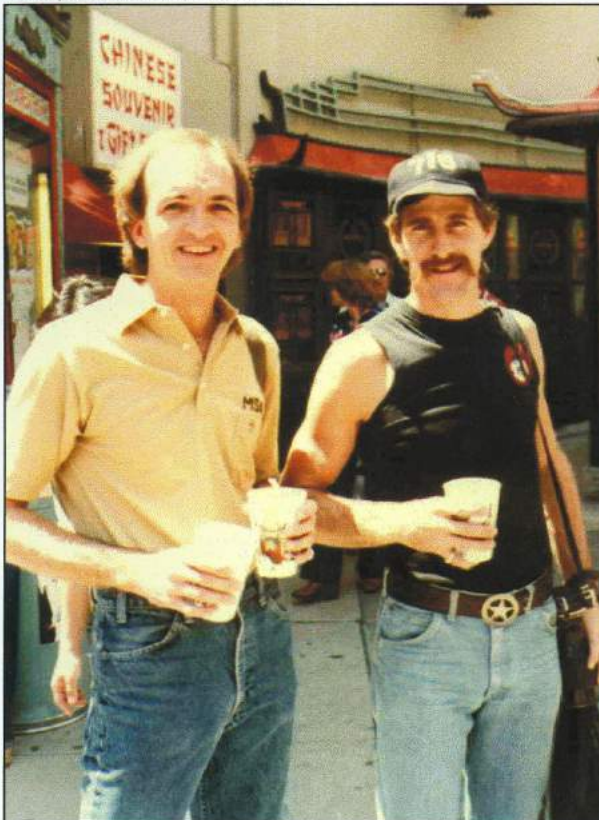

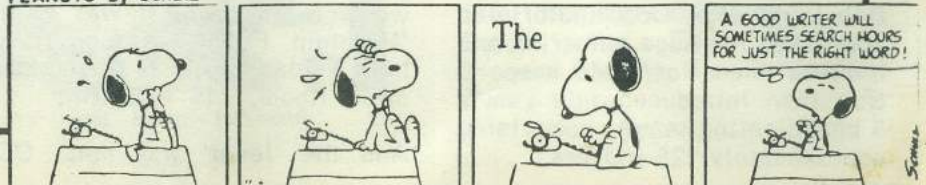

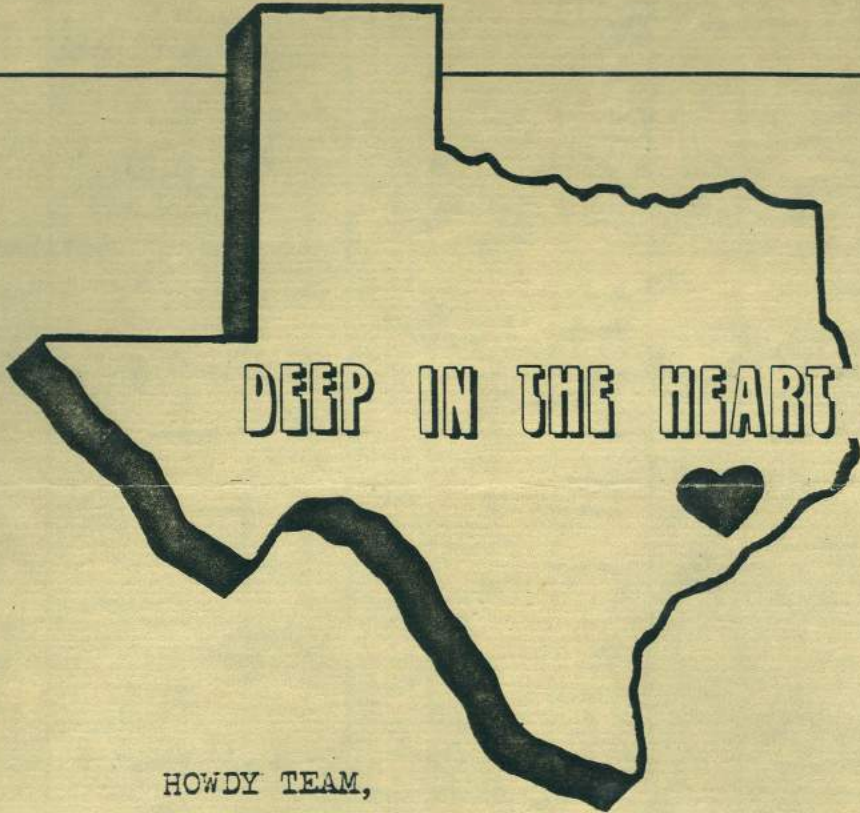

## LOOKING BACK TO THE BEGINNING

An article appeared in the August 9, 1979, issue of *The Advocate* on the topic of Gay Sports in America, and identified individuals associated with gay sports in each major city in the US and Canada. As a result of this article, Leo Gender, representing New York City's Gay Brotherhood Liaison, invited individuals from the various cities to participate in the Liaison's first international gay bowling tournament,

of 1979 which attracted a nice field of entrants from surrounding cities, Leo's attempt to gather gay bowlers from across North America was the first recorded effort towards a national-international tournament. Cities represented at the Stonewall Tournament included Atlanta, Houston, Toronto, and New York. The event was held at Madison Square Gardens, and all tournament participants were hosted and housed by members of the Gay Brotherhood Liaison. The event was a success and word spread quickly.



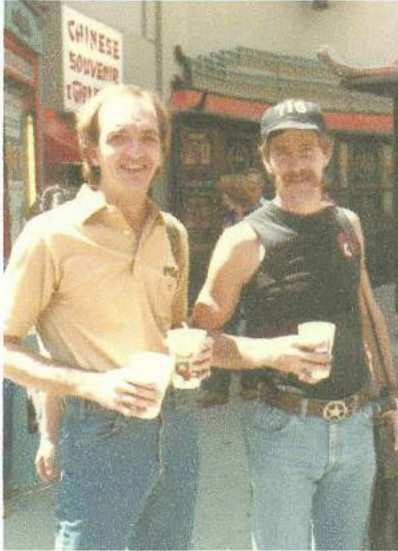
Shortly after the Stonewall Tournament, bowlers from across the continent were invited to attend another gay bowling tournament. The Hollywood Bowl Tournament was given in conjunction with the 1980 Gay Softball World Series being held in Los Angeles. Only those cities with both softball and bowling were invited to attend the event because the North American Gay Alliance (NAGA) was voting on whether or not to include bowling in its organization. However, before



NAGA could vote on the matter themselves, the six cities that attended the bowling tournament -- Houston, Los Angeles, Milwaukee, New York, San Diego, and Toronto -- decided to form a bowling organization of their own. Though not yet named, August 29, 1980 marked the birth of IGBO.

The original founding members of the organization were Houston's Tommy Davis and Gerald Hagan, Tom Hack, representing New York, David Theiss of Milwaukee, John O'Brien and John Hammett of Los Angeles, Steve Brown of San Diego, and Rick Edwards and Jim "Porno" Pullen of Toronto. It was decided

that the representatives would meet again a few months later during the 2nd. Holiday Invitational Tournament in Milwaukee to elect officers and select a site to host the organizations first Annual Tournament. It was during the meeting in Milwaukee that the representatives present voted unanimously to adopt the new name for the organization as proposed by Tom Hack-- International Gay Bowling Organization--IGBO. During the first IGBO meeting, Tom Hack was elected to serve as the organization's first President, and David Theiss was elected to the position of Secretary/Treasurer. Bids were accepted to host the first Annual Tournament, which was to be held Memorial Day weekend. Atlanta, Houston, Los Angeles, New York, and San Diego submitted bids. After the elimination round of balloting, Atlanta and Houston remained. On the second ballot, there was a 5/5 tie, with one abstention. On the third ballot, Houston was selected to host the first IGBO Annual Tournament.

And so we began!

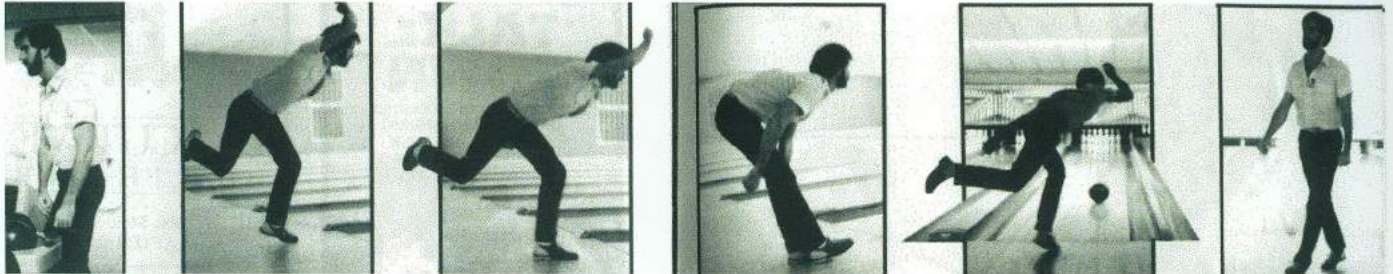

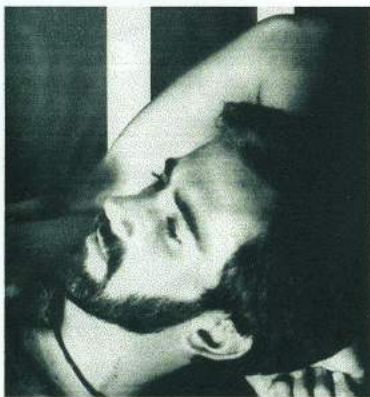
