

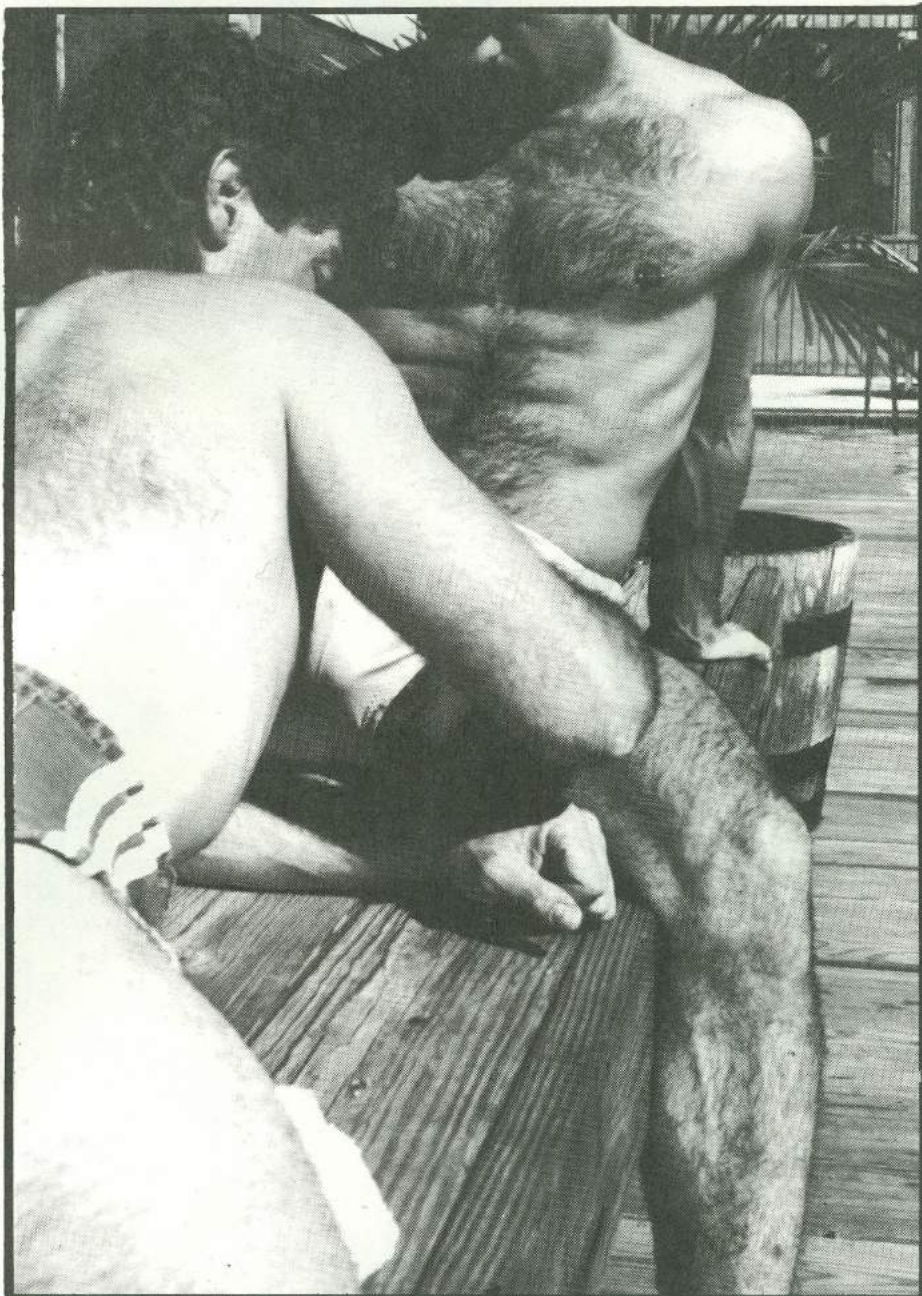

Our Pre-Season Tournament was held at Dunlavy and Peggy Fields. After 17 games of play trophies were awarded by League President, Martha Richie.

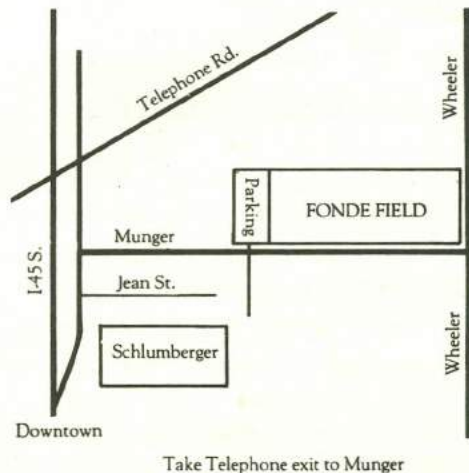

Softball

1982 LEAGUE

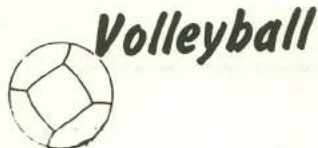

Finally, if you have anything you want to put in the newsletter let us know. If you want to help us and learn more about the printing business we would love to hear from you.

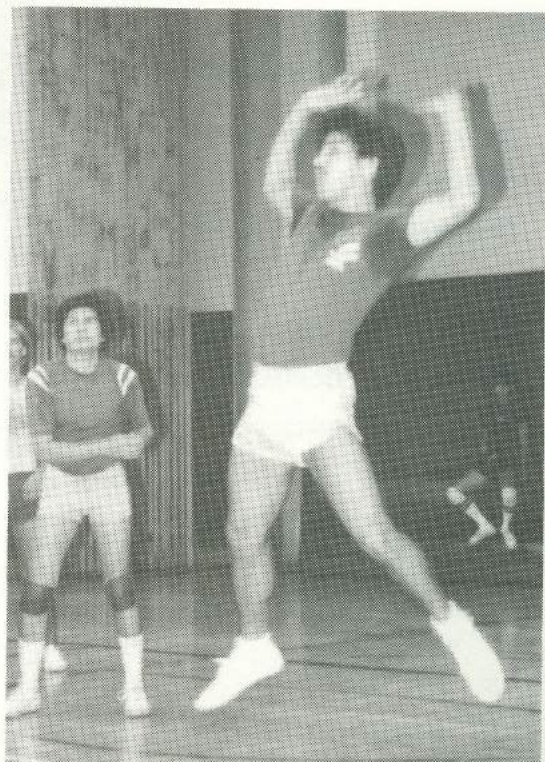

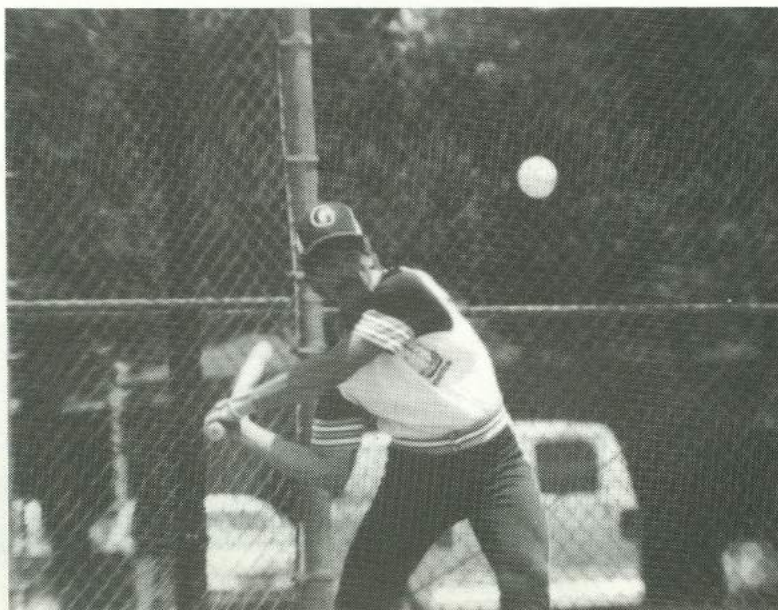

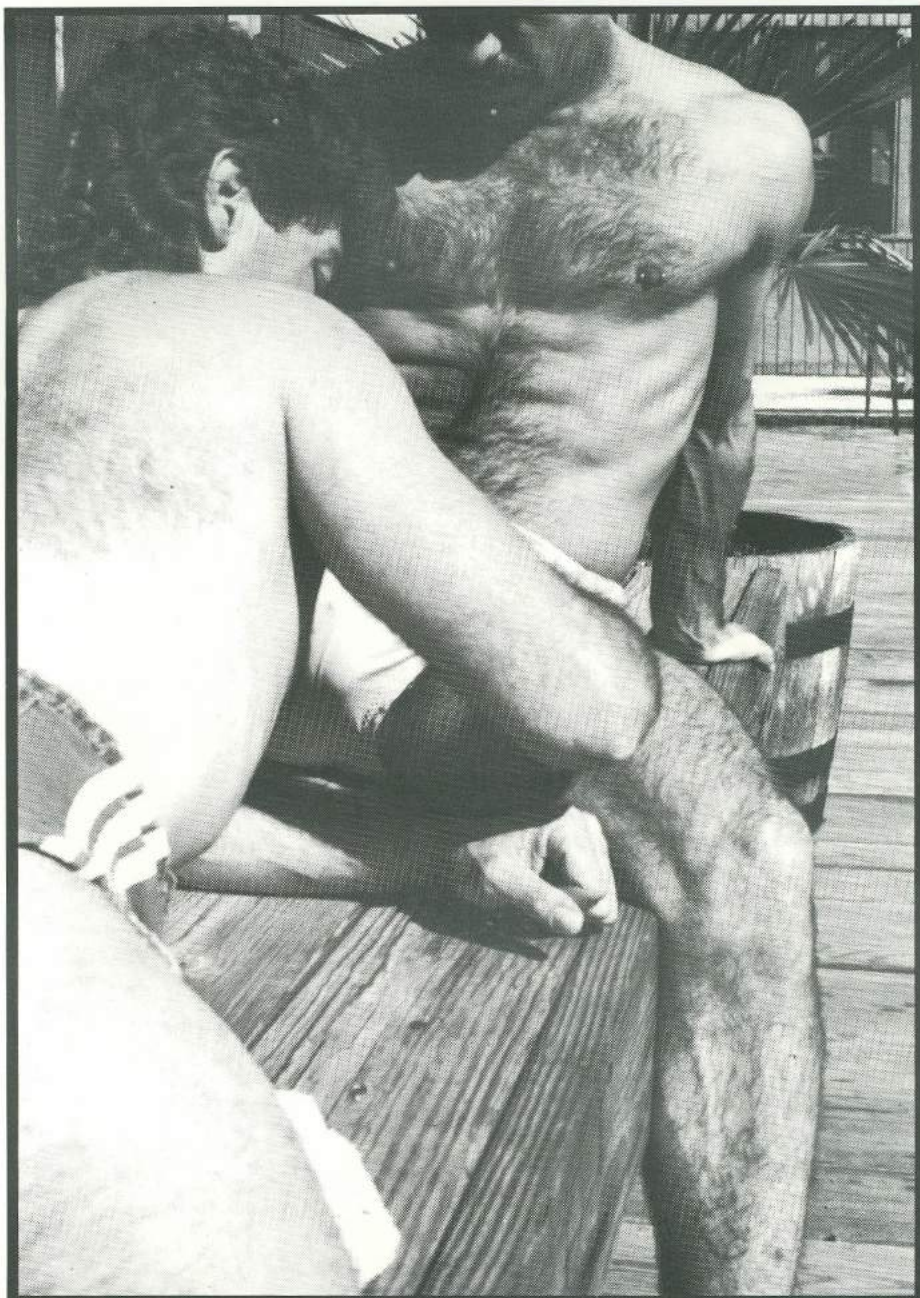
