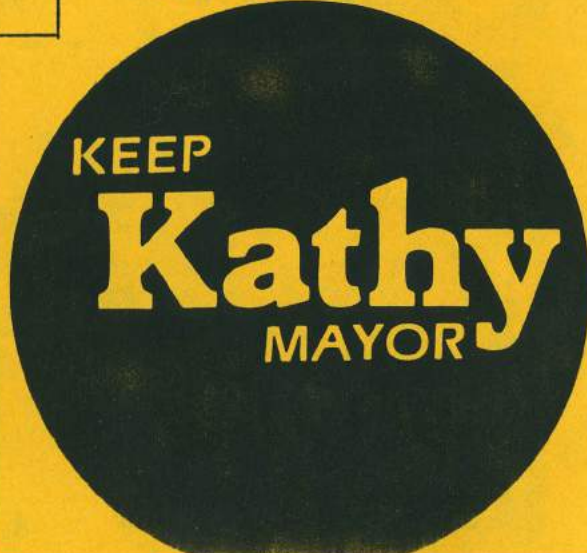

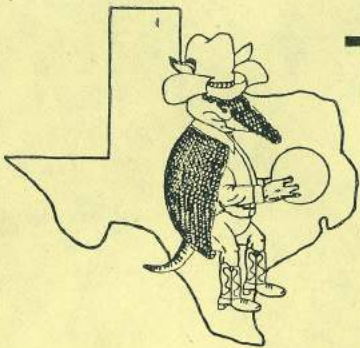

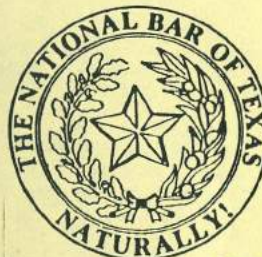

**Eligibility:** Athletes are eligible to enter Gay Games II as representatives of a city, township, or municipality. Everyone is eligible: gay and nongay, men and women. Only one entrant is allowed per city, township, or municipality in the following sports: Basketball, Bowling, Pool (Billiards), Racquetball, Soccer, Softball, Tennis, and Volleyball. If the Gay Games II Sports Committee receives more than one entrant from a single city, township, or municipality for one of these competitions, it will ask the applicants to conduct a pre-Games trial to determine which team will represent the city. In such cases, the applicants who do not represent the city will be asked to represent another city. The number of entrants is limited in certain sports.

Entries for the following sports will be open to groups or individuals with no limitations per city: Boxing, Cycling, Marathon, Physique, Powerlifting, Swimming and Diving, Track and Field, Triathlon, and Wrestling.

The entry fee is \$20 per athlete for each sport, including team roster sports. Fees must be paid in American dollars, checks, money orders, and cashier's cheques are accepted. Fees must accompany the entry form.

All entries must be received by June 1, 1986.

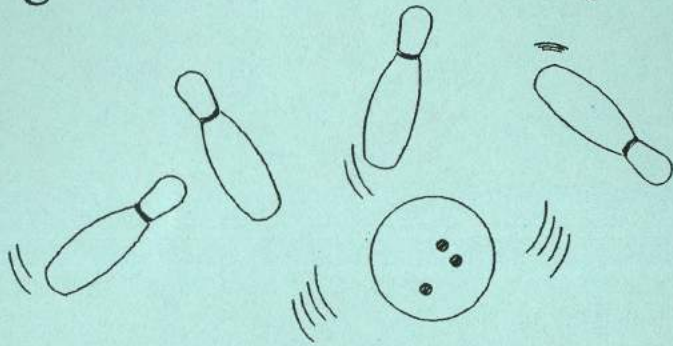
