

64 Men Held in Morals Raid in Texas
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WACO, Tex., April 12 (AP)—Sixty-four men were arrested in a Waco residence early today in what a detective called a raid on a "State-wide convention of homosexuals."

Fifteen detectives and police, a Texas Ranger and Asst. Dist. Atty. Burney Walker made the raid on a small two-room house in South Waco.

Most of the men were young. The majority were from Dallas. Others gave their addresses as Austin, Ft. Worth, Houston, Ft. Hood, and James Connally Air Force Base near Waco.

Police said the "convention" was by invitation in honor of four or five men and was to have been climaxed by a mock wedding.

They said several were wearing rouge and lipstick and women's clothes, including high heel shoes, evening dresses and spring hats. Raiding officers said beer, whisky, wine and champagne were in the house and a "floor show" was in progress when they arrived.

Italian Train Accident Puts Three in Hospital

MILAN, Italy, April 12 (AP)—The Novara-Milan train smashed into a buffer at the end of the tracks in Milan's North Station today. Three passengers were hospitalized and 10 others released after treatment for minor injuries. Officials said the engineer failed to brake in time.
