From Ray Hill

As I write this my friends in the Northeast section of the country are getting arrested in front of the White House, the President of the United States and his Vice President have both been recorded and reported making statements off the cuff like Louie Welch's "Shoot the queers" remark, and a call has been made for a broad HIV testing without informed consent.

Any objective analysis of the above would conclude that this is not the time of lesbian and gay pride, but I suspect that you, the reader, like this writer are not afforded objectivity. These things are very subjective to our lives and those of the people around us.

All of our lives we have been told by preachers, the police and the government generally that we were wrong about our attitudes and our lives. Even many of our non gay friends and families have taken those positions. But this time on this subject we can take great pride in knowing we are right. This time they are wrong.

In 1987 we find ourselves on the front line defending compassionate care for sick and dieing people; calling for intelligent response to ignorance and panic; advocating mass public education the only means to control the spread of AIDS.

We also find ourselves being used as a political football by a failing administration looking for diversions from the daily disclosure of its unconstitutional and often illegal activities to those easily frightened and more quilt ridden members of our community. These may seem the times to duck and cover. But most of us will proudly stand in mutual defense.

It is our turn to assume the responsibility of defending the great principals of this nation: Liberty, Justice, equal treatment under the law's and mercy. While those who hate and would abuse us wave the flag, wrap themselves in platitudes, and wipe their butts with the constitution, it is our job to seriously call witness to the meanness of their policies and actions.

So I invite you to Gay/Lesbian Pride Week 1987. Come out and Celebrate Pride.

INTRODUCTION

Statement of Purpose

Houston Gay/Lesbian Pride Week was founded in 1979 by a small group of Houston gay activist to coordinate a formal program and celebration each year for the gay community of Houston.

HGLPW, through its many cultural, athletic and educational events, seeks to "increase understanding of social, racial and sexual minorities, and to encourage acceptance of and tolerance of alternative lifestyles so that, together, the citizens of the City of Houston and the State of Texas may work in the spirit of peaceful cooperation to build a better society."

Background on Gay Pride/Lesbian Celebration

"One of the more volatile and emotional social movements in the nation's history emerged on a summer night 18 years ago at a ramshackle bar in New York City's Greenwich Village."

"At 3 a.m. on June 28, 1969, police raided the Stonewall Inn, investigating alleged liquour violations. Until then raids regarded as routine harassment of bars catering to homosexuals had met only token opposition."

"Within minutes, however, more than 400 people had gathered in nearby Sheridan Square and a riot erupted. More disturbances followed the next night."

"A minority shrouded in mystery, fear, self-deprecation and widespreaad looting decided it had enough. It was the Lexington of the gay rights movement, a gathering of forces and the beginning of a tumultuous march." (Ledwell, Tony. "Stonewall opened gay activism age." AP 1979)

The true story of events surrounding the Stonewall riots has always been a bit elusive, and media accounts printed at the time appear as blatantly biased and notable lacking in factual detail. However, the above quotes tell the story is most widely known, and the results of that night in New York City can be seen (continued on page 8)



today as the national gay and lesbian community grows in both influence and stature in our society.

In 1970, Morris Kight of L. A., was responsible for the "Remember Stonewall" vigil that became a yearly event around the country.

In 1975, the first gay and lesbian march in Texas was held in Dallas as a part of the Stonewall rememberance. Community activist in Houston held a widely attended news conference that summer which announced, among other events, the formation of a political coalition that has become the Gay Political Caucus of Houston.

History

In 1976, an estimated 200 people held a march in downtown Houston to commemorate the Stonewall riots, which was sponsored by the fledgling Gay Activist Alliance of the University of Houston.

Singer and former beauty queen Anita Bryant's appearance as featured entertainer for the Texas Bar Association convention in 1977 brought an estimated 6,000 angry gay women and men down Houston's streets in protest. The heavily publicized march, headed by such notables as gay publisher David Goodstein and Rev. Troy Perry of the Metropolitan Community Church, was in vivid reaction to Ms. Bryant's ordinance then in effect in Miami, Dade County, Florida. A few weeks later, Houston's gay community held its first Gay Pride Rally in Cherryhurst Park to celebrate what has become a national holiday for lesbians and gay men.

Over 4,500 community activist met at the Astroarena in 1978 for Town Meeting I, the first organizational gathering in Houston that included gay men and women from





every aspect of Houston society. Former state legislator and vice-presidential nominee Frances "Sissy" Ferenthold was the keynote speaker; and the meeting was chaired by Virginia Apuzzo, a leading gay activist who became executive director of the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force in New York. Many of Houston's gay services, including the Montrose Counseling Center and the Montrose Clinic, were formulated and organized at this first historic meeting. The first full week of events commemorating our pride in being free gay and lesbian Americans was held in this year

Since 1979, the gay community of Houston has celebrated Gay Pride Week with a full schedule of events spanning more than a week in late June. More than 70 gay and lesbian-related organizations sponsor a variety of events for the entire communty, ranging from judged art to athletic events and everything in between.

The final days on The Gay Pride Week calendar are devoted to a musical concert in memory of the late Fred Paez, a long-time Houston gay activist and political worker; the annual Houston Gay Pride Week Parade through the heart of Montrose; and the traditional community celebration sponsored by the Gay Political Caucus.

The year 1985 seemed to promise the bleakest tone for Houston's lesbian and gay community, because of the smear campaign in the debacle event known as the "gay rights referendum" followed by the straight slate campaign. But the expected destruction of the community never came. Lesbians and gay men are still proud and politically active. The initial fears about AIDS have lessened as the men in our community began to take their health more seriously and adjusted their personal lives in response to "safe sex education." The self pride developed through the 1970's is reemerging and interest in our liberty is as strong as ever.



This Year's Events

A few changes in the tradition are in store for the year 1987. In years past, expensive high profile floats were an integral part of the parade. The parade will become more people oriented. This year the Committee has asked that money set aside for floats be redirected to persons with AIDS. Each year two Grand Marshalls have been selected from the community as recognition for volunteer work. This year the Committee has chosen persons with AIDS as a class to be the grand marshall this year. This is in recognition for the pain and misunderstanding each person has to deal with.

Many other events encompass the week of celebration. A film festival, concert of Romanovsky and Phillips and an art show are among this year's events. The official title has been changed to include the word lesbian to reinforce that the community is comprised of both males and females. Deborah Bell and Ray Hill have been selected to be co-chairs for 1987.

KPFT has always played an important part in the development of the Gay/Lesbian community of Houston. Wilde n' Stein is the longest continual running gay/lesbian radio show in the country. This year we lost both Doug Turner and Mike Miesch from complications of AIDS. Both Doug and Mike have played an important part in the development of the show. Mike's involvement went beyond Wilde 'n Stein , he helped train other programmers, produce many shows and sacrificed his holidays so others could enjoy theirs.

The implications of AIDS has redirected Wild n' Stein to become a clearing house of the changing information being published. The freedom of community radio leaned itself to AIDS reporting. We were able to be objective in reporting the developments of the disease. While The New York Times virtually ignored it and other news outlets sensationalized the epidemic, we tried to offer the most objective information. The freedom of community radio has let us conduct many "safe sex" workshops on the air.

At press time all the details of Gay/Lesbian Pride Week had not been finalized. KPFT is planning a live broadcast on Sunday, June 28. Stay tuned to Breakthrough on Friday mornings and Wilde n' Stein at 9 p.m. Tuesday nights for more details.
