"Here," Vera said, "cover him with this and we'll go lay him over there in that ditch."





On January 15th of this year, a little item appeared in the San Antonio Express News concerning a program of bicentennial activities sponsored by the American Issues Forum Committee of San Antonio, an organization indirectly funded by the federal government. The item listed nine programs, including the discussion of issues pertinant to blacks, women, Mexicans, Indians - and one project for gays titled, "Gay in San Antonio - A Sense of Belonging." The Forum committee evidently felt that gay lifestyles in America were an issue, like other minority issues, which merited academic discussion. The "powers that be" in San Antonio evidently felt otherwise, And very soon the you-know-what was hitting the fan.

An inflamed and, as usual, uninformed County Commissioners Court passed a resolution lambasting the allocation of \$50,000 for the gay meeting. Their statement, in part, read: "The Court hereby voices its opposition to the allocation of tax dollars to a homosexual organization to attempt to validate the need for such socially unacceptable behavior . . . an irresponsible and socially unacceptable program that is the height of decadence." The commissioners went on to call for a formal investigation of the whole affair. The wisdom of the county commissioners can best be demonstrated by noting that in all of their formal protest

documents and legal paperwork, the amount of the grant is listed as being "\$50,000," when, in fact, the correct figure was \$5000. So much for the mentality of the "good ole boys."

By March 3rd, San Antonio News columnist Paul Thompson was warning that gays from all over the country were going to descend on San Antonio. The next day, the paper included a ballot for their readers to voice their opinion on the issue. The ballot ran again on March 5th. And as might be expected, the incorrect and adverse publicity given the gay meeting by the paper produced the desired negative response. Readers said they did NOT want gays to descend upon their city from all over the country. Unfortunately, that was never the issue to begin with. "Gay in San Antonio" is, and was always to be, an academic discussion of issues, a forum, not a hell-raising convention. But then, fears of a gay "plague" sell more papers than news of a small intellectual gathering.

The Forum would not be intimidated, however, and on March 11, announced that its small grant to the gay question was a good investment and the project would not be withdrawn.

The papers were infuriated that they had not been able to produce a homophobic outcry to stiffle the project and began a new series of anti-gay editorials. The San Antonio News continued its



crys that the Alamo City would never recover if a gay person entered the city limits, while the San Antonio Express observed that the issue of homosexuality, unlike all other issues by other minority groups, did not deserve federal funds to finance a study.

By March 18th, the papers were giving coverage to San Antonio resident Mrs. Carolyn Ruggles, who speaks for "Women Who Want to be Women," an anti-women's-lib group. Mrs. Ruggles warned that the gay leaders are "trying to convince the world that homosexuality is normal and morally okay. I believe it is unnatural and immoral. If nobody protests this conference, our young people might start thinking there is nothing wrong with homosexuality." Mrs. Ruggles is now going door-to-door with her protest petition.

Conference coordinators Bettie Navlor and Kathy Deitsch stress that the May 1 program is going as scheduled, despite the outcry of those uninformed of its true nature.

"The conference purpose has been misinterpreted and misunderstood. It is not a gathering of gays at a homosexual convention. Rather, it is a day long event planned to address the question of "how gay persons 'belong' in the human community."
