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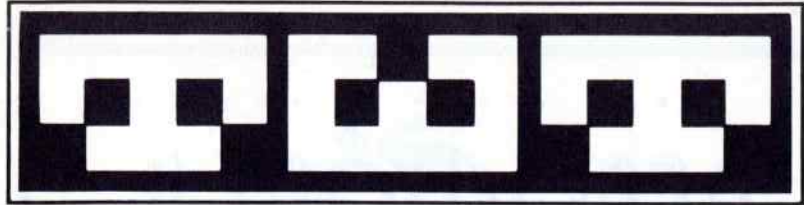
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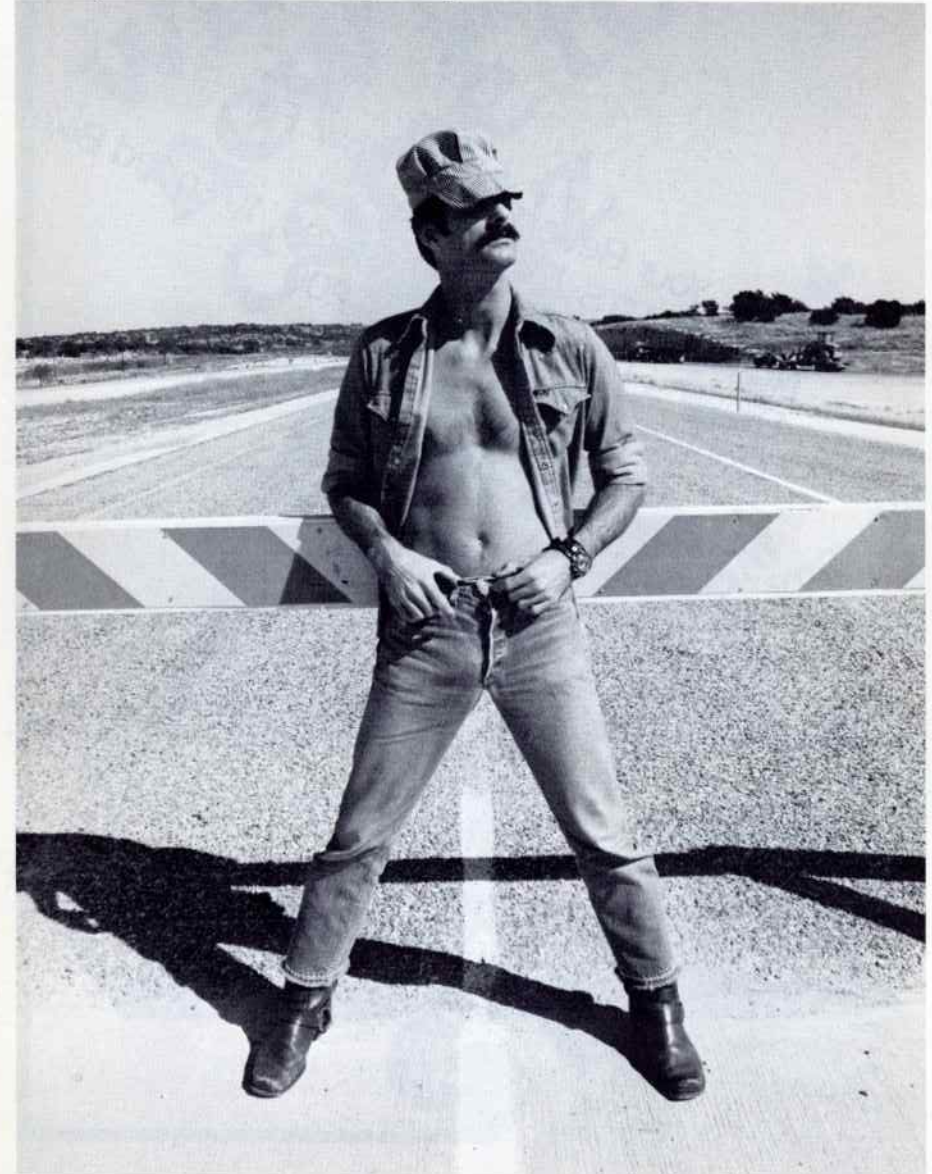

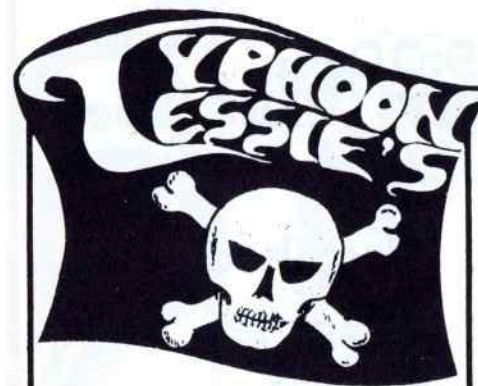

TWT LABELED PORNOGRAPHIC

This Week In Texas, and its sister publication, The Montrose Star, are "examples of locally produced pornographic material and a place where police could start cracking down on the filth in our community." So said Houston's Committee on Community Standards in a meeting at the First Presbyterian Church Tuesday, December 14. The community standards group has been active for several months in attempts to define obscenity and to remove material they determine to be obscene from retail stores throughout the city. They started with convenience stores and succeeded in getting periodicals like *Hustler* and *Penthouse* removed from open display. Now the Committee on Community Standards has targetted adult book

stores, gay bars, bath houses, gay sex and the gay lifestyle, and your friendly weekly gay journals as obscene, offensive, and deserving of being removed from the community. What's more frightening, though, is that they might just succeed if they are allowed to continue unopposed.

The committee's current objective is to get 50,000 signatures on a petition endorsing certain "community" standards — among them a rule allowing strict enforcement of state penal section 21.06 (that's the law that makes what gay people do in bed illegal). Armed with this petition as evidence that they speak for at least 50,000 citizens and voters, the committee plans to get their standards introduced before the state legislature and enacted as state law. If they should ultimately succeed, it will spell

the end of Texas' relatively free and open gay lifestyle. You stand to lose a lot if you sit apathetically back expecting someone else to counter the efforts of these fanatically homophobic people.

What can you do? First, any citizen may attend meetings of the Committee on Community Standards. Your gay media will attempt to keep you informed as to exact meeting times and places. You can assess what we are up against, take part in the committee's discussions, and vote on matters be-

fore it (most actions are decided by majority vote of the citizens present). Second, you should support the Houston Gay Political Caucus with your time and money — each of which is very much needed to insure the vitality and effectiveness of the Caucus in the face of this new and well organized threat to gay rights. In a successful fund-raising meeting with gay business persons Tuesday, December 9, executives of the GPC discussed several viable strategies to counter the threat of the Committee on Community Standards. The discussion resulted in a definite plan to establish a gay chapter within the American Civil Liberties Union to act as a deterrent to violations of First Amendment rights by the Committee on Community Standards. Several business leaders pledged generous donations to support this action. However, the generosity of these business leaders does not absolve you, the individual gay, of your responsibility to protect your own rights. "If I had to do it alone, yes. But I knew you wouldn't mind helping me wrap them."

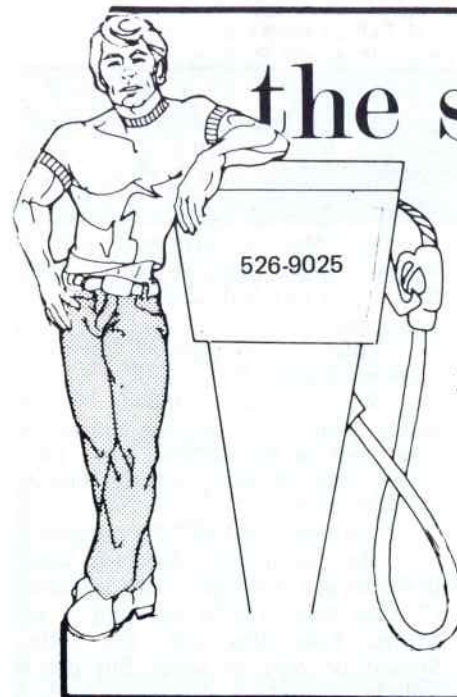
"I think I'd prefer to just charge you a month's rent."

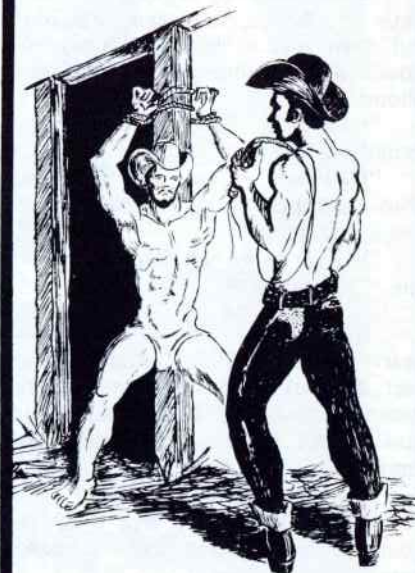

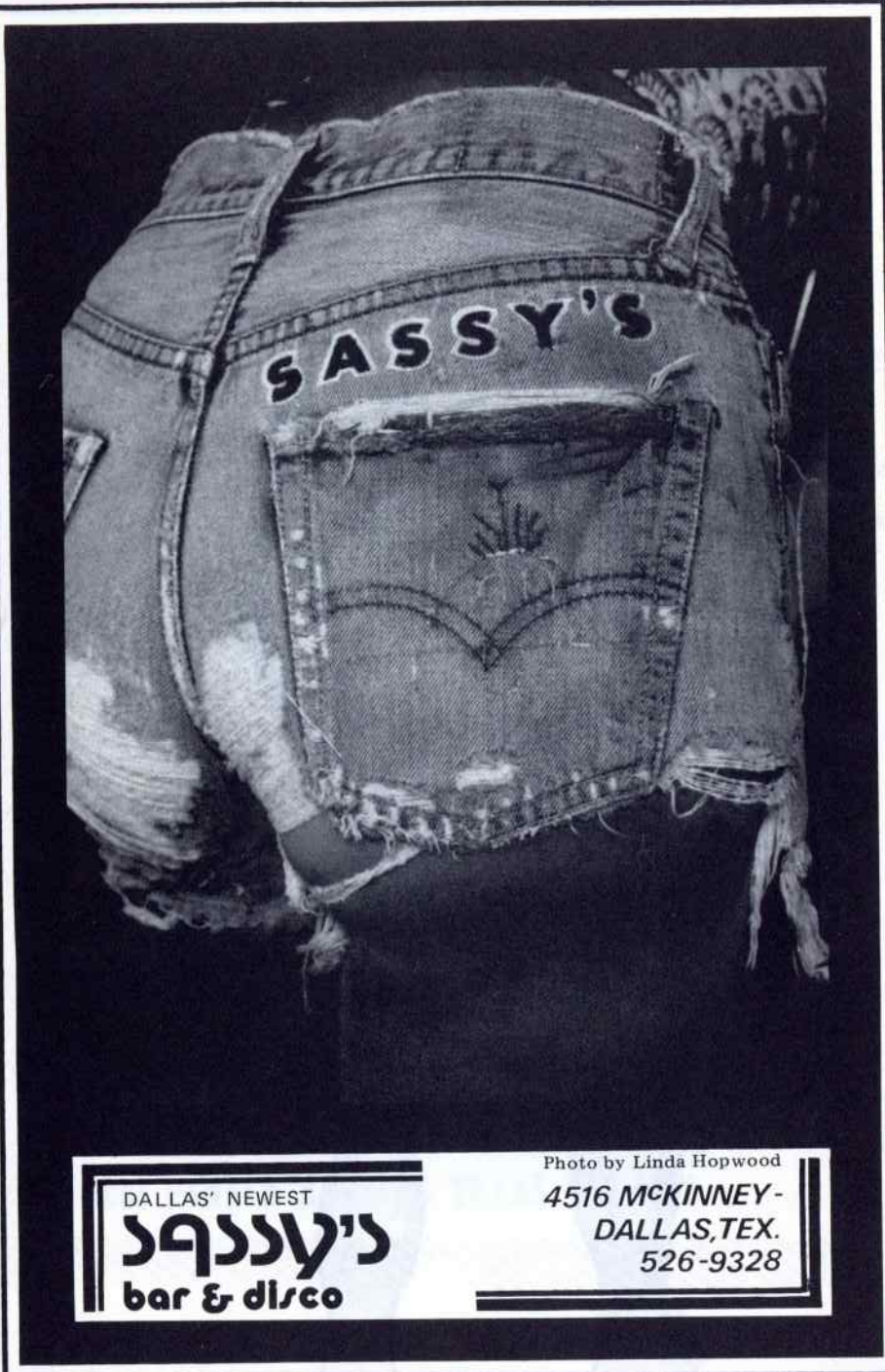

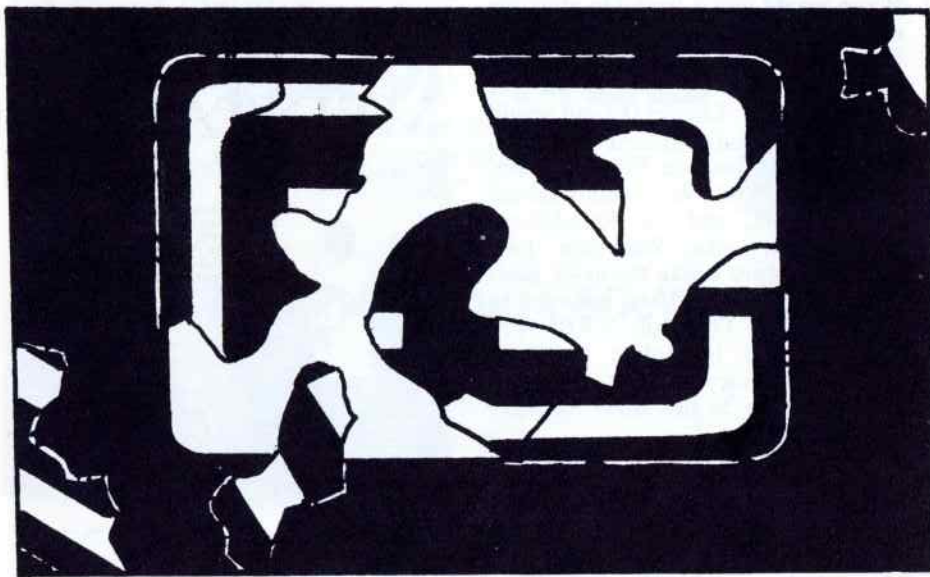

Between rehearsals at the Old Plantation, TWT rapped with actor/funnyman Michael Greer who has been packing 'em in during his current road show engagements in Dallas and Houston.

TWT: Michael, how did this all begin?

GREER: I always wanted to be in show business; my parents were frustrated performers and they pushed me. In fact I was an Irish tenor on the radio at age 10 in Galesburg, Illinois, which is the home of Carl Sandburg, Superman (actor George Reeves), and me.

TWT: From that early start in radio to...

GREER: To joining the Air Force at the illegal age of 16 where I did some service shows. Then, I moved to Boston where I did amateur nights. After that I spent 5 years in New York doing \$20 talent nights with Tiny Tim, Barbra Streisand and others.

TWT: Did you win?

GREER: No. Streisand won that night. I came in second.

TWT: How about your first big break?

GREER: That's hard to say but it was probably in 1965 when I started a new show in California. It was the first live show people had seen. We did it at the Redwood Room in LA... called "Jack and the Giants." My partners were Roy Gaynor and Jim Bailey, the famous impressionist. We did the show for 16 months. Then, one night Judy Garland came and saw the show. Actually she came to see Jim do his impression of Judy. Well, Miss Garland flipped out and she turned all her movie friends on to the show and pretty soon it became the place for celebrities to come like Carol Channing, Liberace, Rita

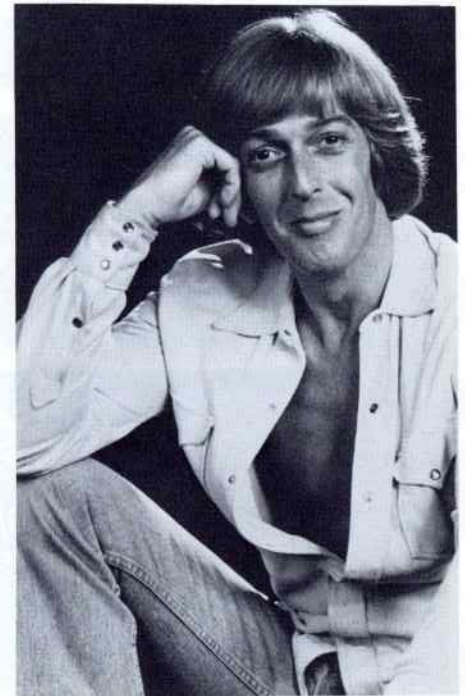
Hayworth. We became a Hollywood favorite...to go see those three guys do that crazy show. This is when I wrote my Mona Lisa routine which I still do.

TWT: What happened to that group?

GREER: We broke up and I put together a second group called "The Giants" which included three members of the current "Mama's Boys": Robert Redding, Joe Danova, and John Palmer. This was when I was at the Purple Onion Club in San Francisco.

TWT: Did that show last long?

GREER: Yes, 2 years. In fact Sal Mineo came to see the show one night and afterwards asked me to be in "Fortune & Men's Eyes." That ran a year. Then, the producers of "Gay Deceivers" wanted me to be in that play. Later I starred in the film version

for American International, playing the role of Queenie.

TWT: How many films have you made, Michael?

GREER: Eight in all. Two gay; "The Gay Deceivers" and "Fortune and Men's Eyes." Oh, I also got a 7-minute standing ovation back in 1972 at the Continental Baths in NY... this was about 6 months after Bette Midler had played the tubs.

TWT: Do you play only gay clubs?

GREER: No. But the gay clubs have been more loyal than the straight clubs. Since I've always been a writer I could always play gay clubs if there were no films or plays.

TWT: How about the audiences here in Dallas and Houston?

GREER: Dallas audiences are surprisingly uptight and nervous...maybe it's the police. But, in Houston the

crowd is more relaxed and has more fun. However, the Metropolitan Community Church in Dallas seems to be better organized. Actually, people are people wherever you go and I can't find too much difference from one gay club to another.

TWT: What's your zodiac sign?

GREER: Born April 20, I'm on the Aries-Taurus cusp...same as Hitler.

TWT: Really! Do you have a lover?

GREER: Not like what most people would call a lover. It's hard to mix the heart and art. Most guys don't have the patience to put up with all the commotion that surrounds an entertainer. But, I have some very close and dear friends who will put up with that and me. As you travel around, it's just who will help you make it through the night.

TWT: How about friends in Texas?

GREER: Lots! I went to school 1 year in San Antonio and 2 years in Dallas at Oak Cliff. I know Tiffany Jones, Ernestine, Jennifer, Craig Pierce...we all look after each other.

TWT: Michael, thank you for taking time to talk with us and I know all your friends in Texas will enjoy reading about "the local boy who made good."

GREER: In closing let me say, just remember wherever you may go...there you are.

TWT: And, where are you going from here?

GREER: I'm moving to New York... to do a play, then an album and also opening after the New Year at the Grand Finale.

TWT: And, that's the finale to this interview!
