Actually, I didn't abandon the diet, it abandoned me."


"What are you talking about?" Vera asked.


"It was impossible. All those exotic fruits and out-of-season vegetables. Nobody could stick to that diet. Not if they lived in Houston," Phoebe groaned.

STATEMENT BEFORE THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF HOUSTON, JANUARY 5, 1977

1976 was a year in which Houston's gay community experienced many new beginnings: We started an active program of professional continuing education for Houston psychologists, psychiatrists and personal counselors in the area of sexual behavior; we developed and offered group and individual self-development seminars; and we started gay studies courses in the non-credit Sundry School offered by the Campus Activities Department of the University of Houston. These were some of our successes.

In other areas we have not achieved our goals. One of the areas where little progress was made in 1976 was gay community/police relationships. Early last year we offered to promote a softball game between gay men and women and police officers. Not one police officer offered to participate in the project to improve relationships thru interaction in a sports event. Several gay groups and professional organizations have on many different occasions offered to provide academically qualified lecturers to speak at the Police Academy. None of these have been accepted.

In short, we have offered all of our resources to improve gay community/ police relationships but this administration and the police department have failed to respond to any of our offers.

1977 will bring another attempt to overcome the problem of homophobia in the Houston Police Department. With the help of the Sundry School program of the Campus Activities Department of the University of Houston, Central Campus, we are

offering a new course, titled: "Homosexual Reality for Police and Other Bureaucrats," (Course 168). Some of you, some of your aides, several police chiefs and many lower ranking police personnel have told me that you do not understand homosexuals, homosexual behavior, or the gay subculture, and, for that reason, this or that request can not or will not be considered. Some have been guilty of ignorance and/or buckpassing, saying, "I think it's a great idea but the council won't go for it," or some other sad statement referring to whole classes of people or individuals. This is no longer a valid defense position for anyone in city or county government. This course, offered on neutral ground to all interested persons, is designed to overcome any lack of understanding and information you or other city/county officials may suffer.

For more advanced students, a general gay studies course and a gay history course will be offered.

I will arrange for the Mayor's Office and the Police Department, through the Police Chief's Office, to have an amply supply of catalogs and hope you will distribute them. Please consider the other courses offered: The Art of Problem Solving might come in handy for most of you. And some of you might consider Diet Management and Body Workshop -or Exerslim. The History of Rock 'n Roll might interest Councilman Mann: Be a Model- Councilman Goven: and - if the strike continueswe might all consider Bicycling: A Viable Alternative.

A STAR IS BORN

Back in the 20's, when films were silent and the popcorn was made in a pan with a handle on it, rather than a pivotal caldron, the aspiring movie moguls began to recognize a most distinct threat to their financial futures-the star system. In 1937, A Star is Born was a property. A film, starring Frederich

And how it worked! So that brings us to 1976, and the new look of ASIB. It's not a property anymore, not even in part. It's now completely a personality showcase. And in this specific showcase it's earth, fire, hell, damnation, and water all combined into a flesh show of passion and fan-oriented lust which has yet to be rivaled on any screen or stage in the known or recorded civilization of this meek planet.
