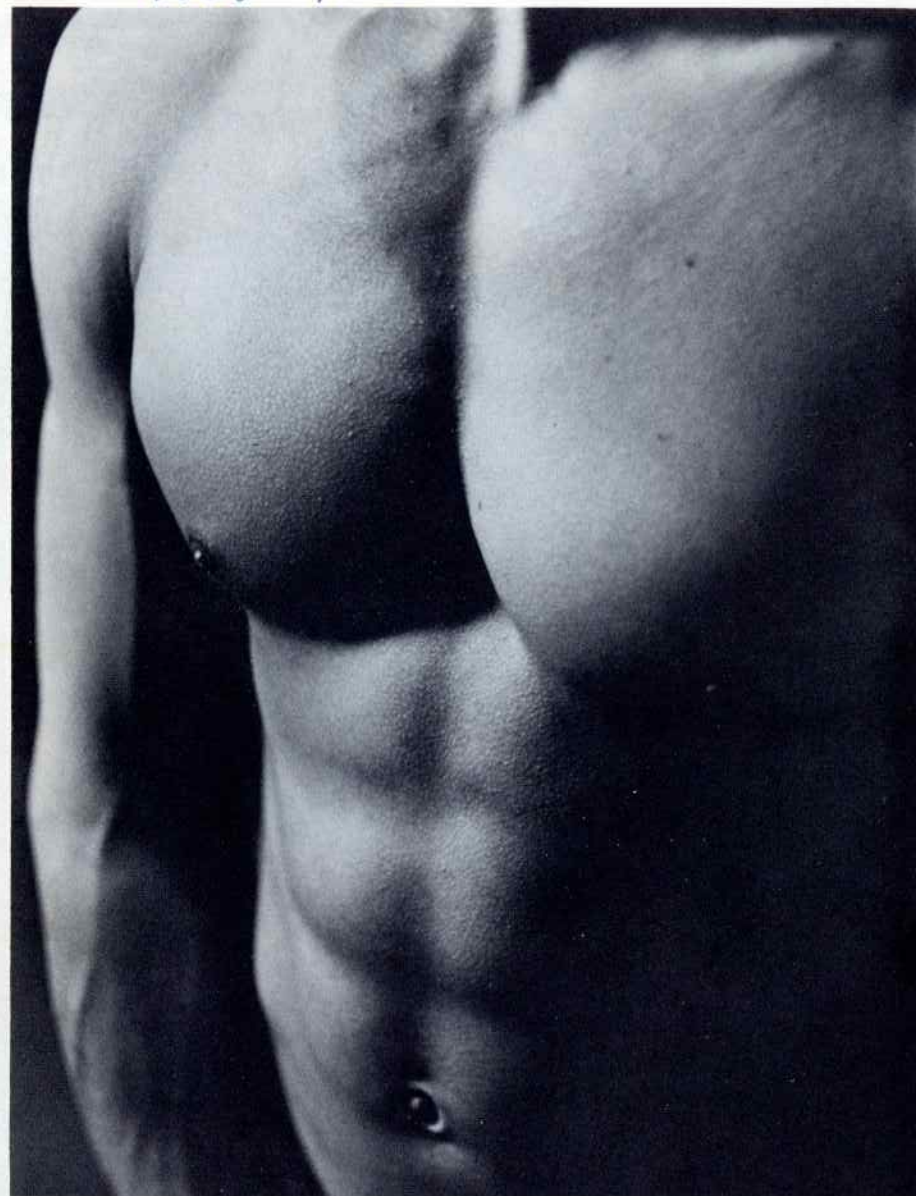

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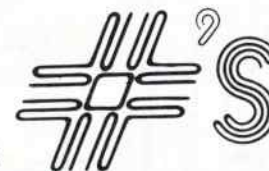

Remember, your vote does make a difference. If you don't know where to vote, call your county clerk's office or local newspaper, or gay organization for help.

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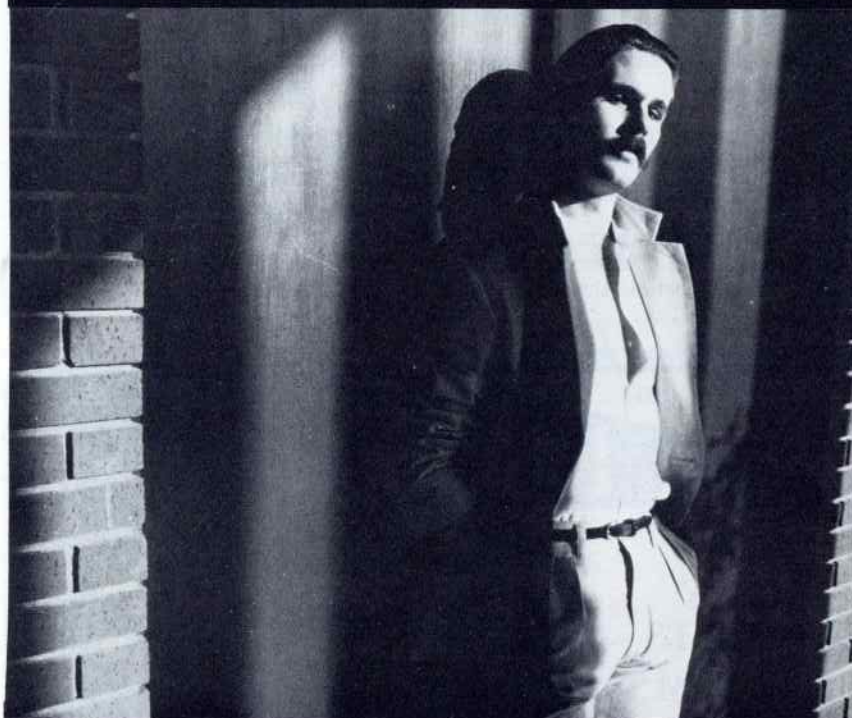
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STARSCOPE

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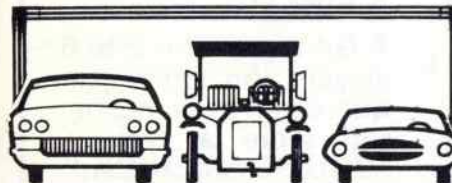
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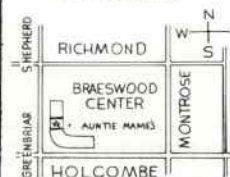
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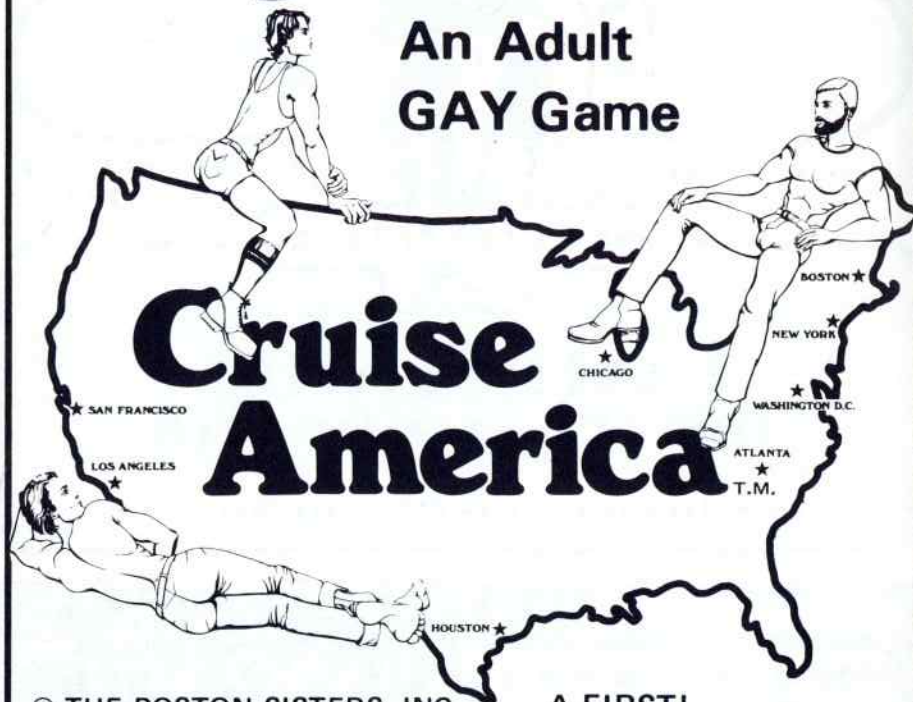
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DEAR ADAM by Adam Dennis

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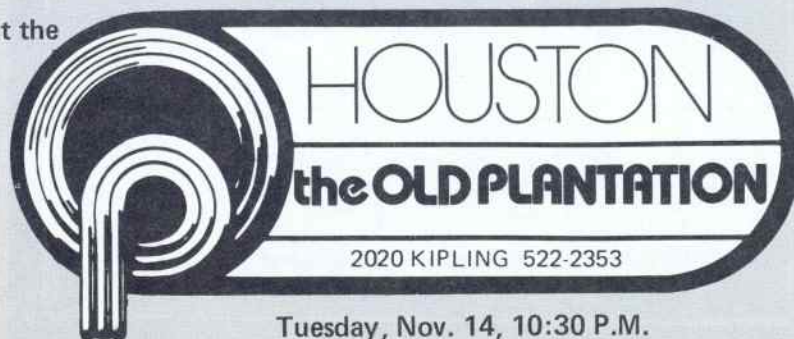

Robert Altman is one of America's most innovative film makers. He places an array of striking characters against a backdrop culled from this country's most sacred (and profane) institutions, and uses the entire framework as a metaphor for provocative social commentary. However, Altman's most recent film, *A Wedding*, lacks the scope and imagination of his earlier works, and ranks as little more than a puffed up soap opera.

Ostensibly, the film is concerned with the travails which emerge during the course of a fashionable wedding. Desi Arnaz, Jr. plays a spoiled, wealthy, upper class boy who marries a spoiled, wealthy, middle-class young girl (Amy Stryker). Each comes equipped with an appropriately neurotic family. The groom's mother (Nina Van Pollandt) is lovely, well-bred and a heroine addict. His father (Vittorio Gassman) was a humble Italian waiter until he married into this prestigious family, and is now totally dominated by a crotchety grandmother (Lillian Gish), who dies as the wedding reception is about to begin.

The bride's side of the family is headlined by Carol Burnett, her gauche, *nouveau riche* mother who is conspicuously out of place amidst the splendor of the wedding. Stryker's sister (Mia Farrow) is a pregnant nymphomaniac who has been "intimate" with the groom and approximately two dozen of his classmates. Her father (Paul Brenner) is a "good old boy" who loves his daughter, booze and God, but cannot stand his wife.

As might be imagined, the intrigues are numerous. The former lovers of the bride and groom are present and circulate an ap-

propriate number of stories about their old flames. The bride's mother and the groom's uncle arrange a liaison. The head of the catering service (Geraldine Chaplin) turns out to be a lesbian and makes a play for the bride. A black houseman and one of Stryker's aunts are having a stormy affair. Bridesmaids try to seduce groomsman and conversations about love, death, drugs money and religion permeate the entire movie.

The various encounters are moderately humorous and contain a fair dose of "Altmanesque" satire, but, on the whole, the film is laborious and predictable. The decadence of the rich has been a topic of conversation since the French Revolution and Karl Marx predicted the *bourgeoisie* would prove themselves to be a worthless lot sooner or later. The use of a wedding as a metaphor for American society is far too contrived. Weddings have been a mess since the ritual was invented. (It even took Christ to straighten one out at Cana).

We are all familiar with the thesis that society's time-honored traditions breed lunacy and that we all participate in the madness. *A Wedding* reiterates this theme, but accomplishes little else. In the past Altman has come up with some gems. He has dissected our complex society and reassembled the pieces to create incisive commentaries which leave audiences awestruck. Perhaps his long list of successes have led us to believe that every new film would bring us "bigger and better things." Such beliefs are truly unrealistic and *A Wedding* proves that Robert Altman, like any other human being, occasionally lapses into mediocrity.

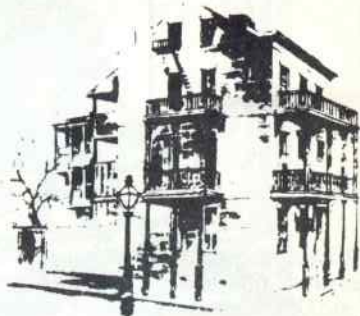
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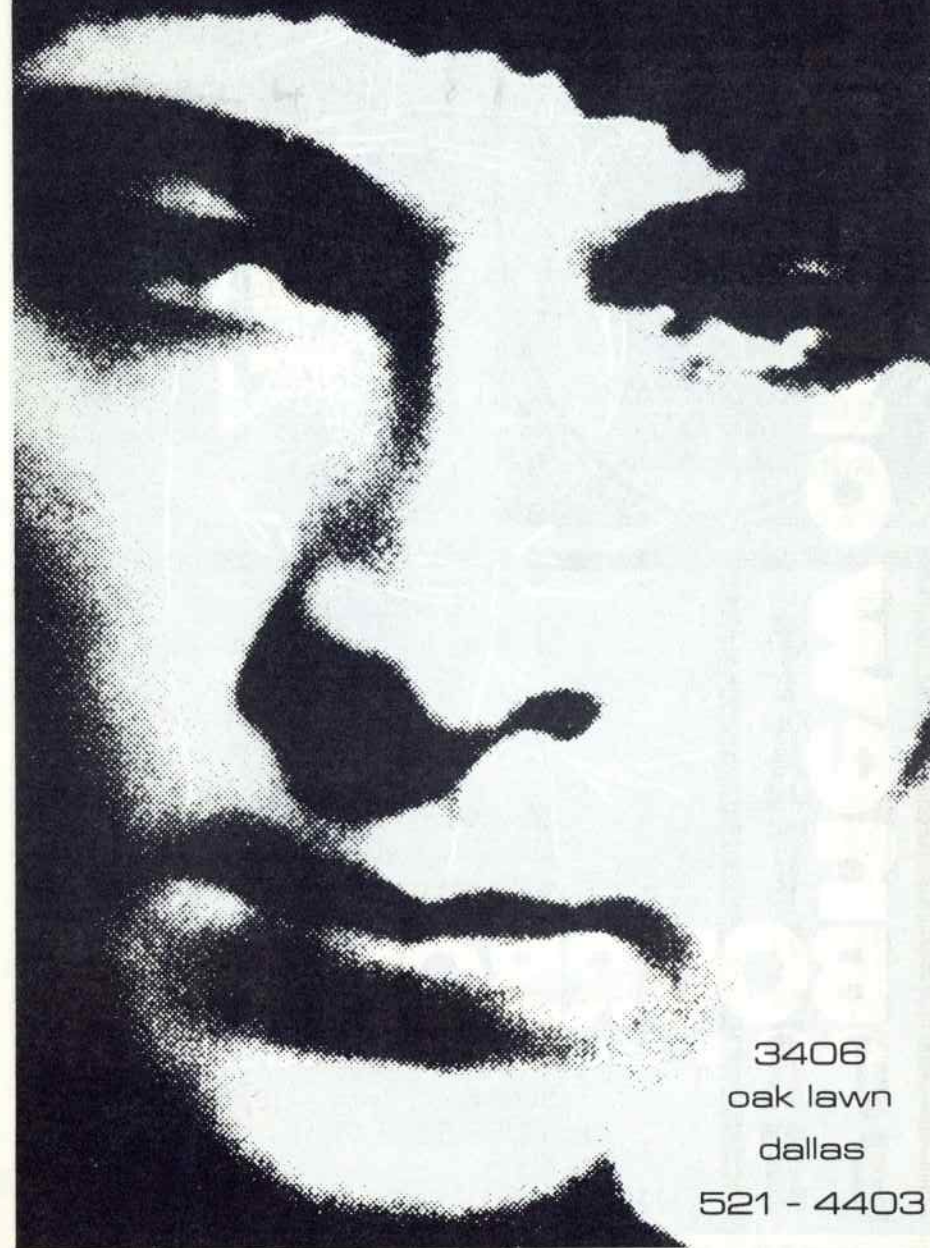
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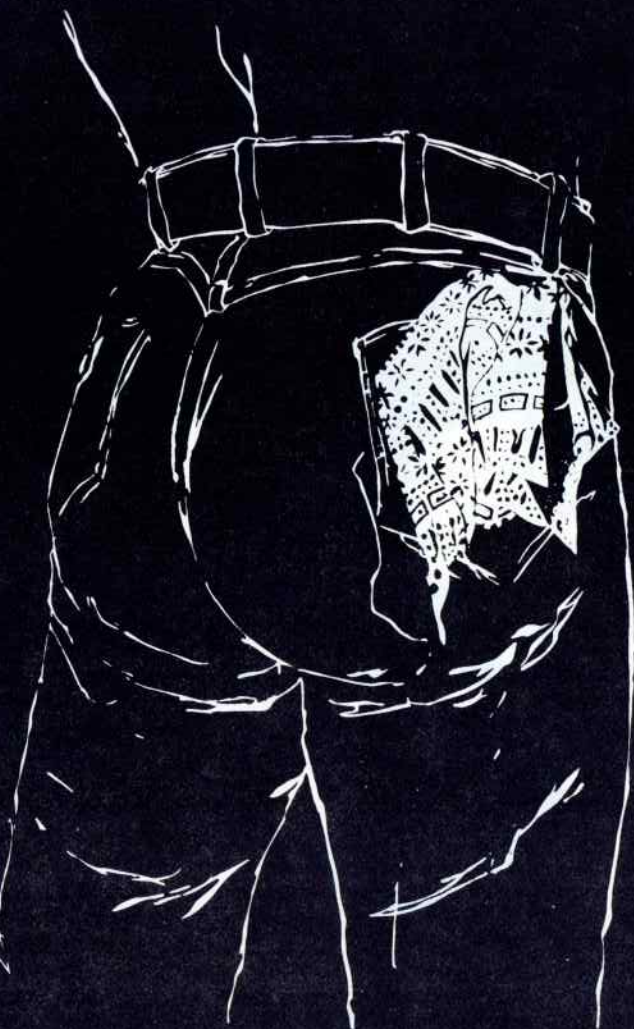
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ZACHARY by John Gardner



The name Zachary Whitney first appeared in the serial "Life With Vera" several years ago. And it was just that — a name. A piece of driftwood on Beach Vera that could, as likely as not, be swept out to sea at any moment. The tide of reader opinion, however, proved favorable and Zachary remained aground as a minor Life With Vera character.

From the occasional bits and pieces of information we received, we learned that Zach was a radical gay liberationist, originally from Dallas, the legal guardian of his nine-year-old niece Trudy, and the lover of Life With Vera co-star Burt Dennis. Zach was also perceived as having the most striking face, complete with moustache, and the hunkiest of muscular, sculptured bodies, complete with the biggest tool in town. Which could account for much of his popularity with TWT readers.

More flattering, however, is the slight possibility that it was Zach's spirit, rather than just his body, that kindled reader support. While Vera tickled our funny bones and typified things campy, Zach heralded the revolutionary wave of gay pride and optimism. Vera wanted to win our hearts; Zach went straight for the soul.

There remains, fortunately, a bit of Vera in all of us. But it is the spirit of political progressiveness and social change that is now the more dominant motivating force. Times change. Our gay community changes. As does reader interest. As does TWT.

We are proud now to begin our new serial, "Zachary!" And, like any good story, we must begin at the beginning. We must go back, back to Zach's first major series of battles with the heterosexual majority, their culture and laws. Battle One: Taking Custody of Trudy. It is 1976.

Zachary hated the Bible Belt. When driving through its mentally infertile terrain, he enjoyed jacking-off, shooting his spiteful semen onto the McDonald's sack on his lap beneath the steering wheel.

This was his second trip to Kansas from Dallas in a month. He had made the dreaded journey several weeks earlier to attend the funeral services for his sister and her

Instant replay, anyone?

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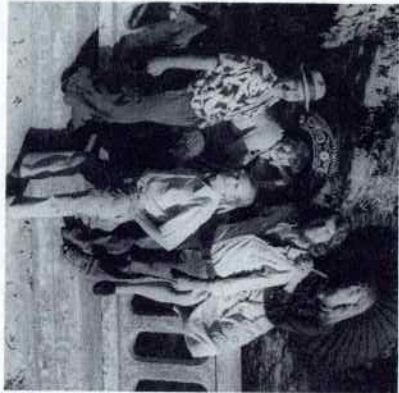

GAY ATHLETIC CLUBS FORM ACROSS TEXAS

Have you heard about the developing network of Texas Gay Sports Associations? It's more than just talk! Already the Montrose Sports Association of Houston, the Turtle Creek Athletic Club of Dallas and the Capitol City Athletic Club of Austin have been engaging in rousing and intense athletic competition involving volleyball in each of the three cities, while outings are also being planned for tennis and bowling. San Antonio, Lubbock, Galveston, Corpus Christi and other Texas cities will soon get the message about how much fun is to be had on and off the playing fields, and will organize their own teams for socializing and/or entering tournaments. The real goal is getting a lot of people involved and having fun. It does not matter if you have ever played any of these sports before or how well you play — there is a good time to be had by everyone!

CLUB PURPOSES

It is important to note that these clubs operate on two levels. First and foremost, on a social one responding to a need for relationship-building alternatives with relaxed dynamics. What this means is that men who perhaps would not meet otherwise have an opportunity to associate in different environments and can enjoy playing together in health-promoting activities. Also, spinoff events such as covered dish dinners, barbecues and cocktail parties are other social dimensions these men are enjoying by participating in the sports clubs.

Second, for those who aspire to higher athletic achievement, the creation of inter-city tournaments is providing a challenging means to all. This recent development of organizing sports in the Texas gay community (starting with volleyball in the spring of 1977) has been so encouraging that plans are being made to expand into many other popular sports. Besides bowling and tennis, softball, jogging, swimming and field sports are other areas in which there is enough interest and participation to make exciting and challenging fun for enthusiasts.

Tournaments are usually played during the day on weekends with the sponsoring city also hosting the visitors to all sorts of

soirees, poolside parties and dining excursions. In addition to "the thrill of victory and the agony of defeat" these athletic get-togethers are fostering a striving for excellence among aspiring, as well as accomplished, sports enthusiasts. Especially noticeable is a growing camaraderie among the participants which is truly encouraging. After all, any time the two legendary Texas rivals, Dallas and Houston, can spend the majority of two days together and walk away without bloody fangs and/or fingernails, you have to admit that a feat of inter-city diplomacy has occurred.

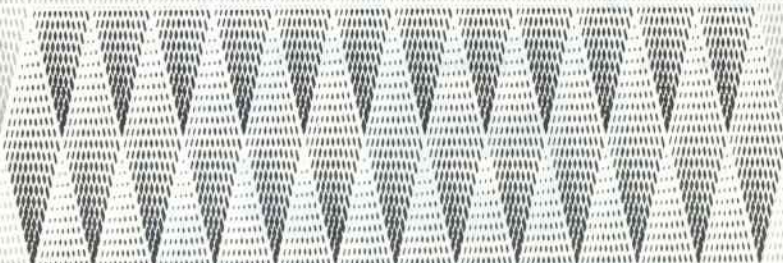
HOW TO JOIN

We also encourage more sideline supporters to come out and socialize. 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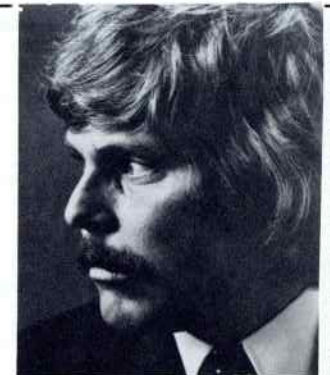



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
