
Dear Adam:

ENTERTAINMENT by Ajax

TELEVISION

Those of you who read this column with any regularity have probably guessed that I don't regard the majority of television programming too highly. There are, however, a few notable exceptions and ABC's "A Ouestion of Love" is one of those rare instances that proves television can offer, if it so chooses, provocative and timely material.

Gena Rowlands plays a divorced nurse, Linda Rae Guettner, who lives with her two sons (eight-year-old Billy and 16-year-old David) and her lover Barbara (Jane Alexander). Their home life is happy until David discovers that his mother is a lesbian. He decides that life with his father will be far less complicated and asks to live with him. When Mike Guettner (Clu Gulager) questions David about his move, he informs his father about his mother's homosexuality. The elder Guettner immediately files suit for custody of Billy, claiming that his wife is not morally fit to raise the child. What follows is a heated trial which focuses on the right of gay parents to raise their children.

Gulager's attorney (Ned Beatty) builds his case on the assumption that Rowlands' homosexual relationship will adversely affect the manner in which she rears her child. He infers that Billy will have no male role model, will be rejected by his friends, and will grow up with a perverted view of love.


Both Rowlands and Alexander articulately counter that the stability of the home and the presence of love in the home are far more important to a child than heterosexual parents. After a great deal of pro and con testimony, the jury finally awards custody

of Billy to his father, but Rowlands promises her son that he will return to live in her home.

What makes this program truly remarkable is the absolute lack of ballyhoo with which Rowlands and Alexander approach their roles. Although the audience never loses sight of the fact that it is watching two women fight for the right to live their lives as they choose, the viewer is not subjected to the grotesque caracatures which generally accompany programs which deal with homosexuality.

"A Question of Love" makes a bold statement, one that should have been made years ago. The notion that the sex of a bed partner is indicative of morality (or immorality) is odious. Discrimination based on sex, color or creed has been declared illegal. Yet sexual preference is still a potent weapon which can be used by "Godfearin', flag-wavin' folk" to deprive gays of their right to gainful employment, live where they choose and raise their children. "A Ouestion of Love" is an articulate statement. It realistically depicts the genuine fears and anxieties of its principle characters without flash or fanfare. The real issues are never obscured or camouflaged.

It is doubtful that one television program can offset all of the injustices perpetrated on gavs during the past years. It cannot reverse court decisions, or elections, but it can, and does, demonstrate that love, warmth, tenderness and affection are not the exclusive property of the straight community. ABC is to be congratulated for presenting this sensitive and revealing program.


Zach raced to open the door so Trudy could slide into the front seat, while simultaneously lobbing the boxes of her possession he carried into the back seat.

speeding around the first curve toward the highway, even before bothering to close the open car doors, he drove them away.


"Hi, kid. What's new?" Zach asked through gasps for air and uncontrollable laughter.

She wasn't in Kansas anymore.


