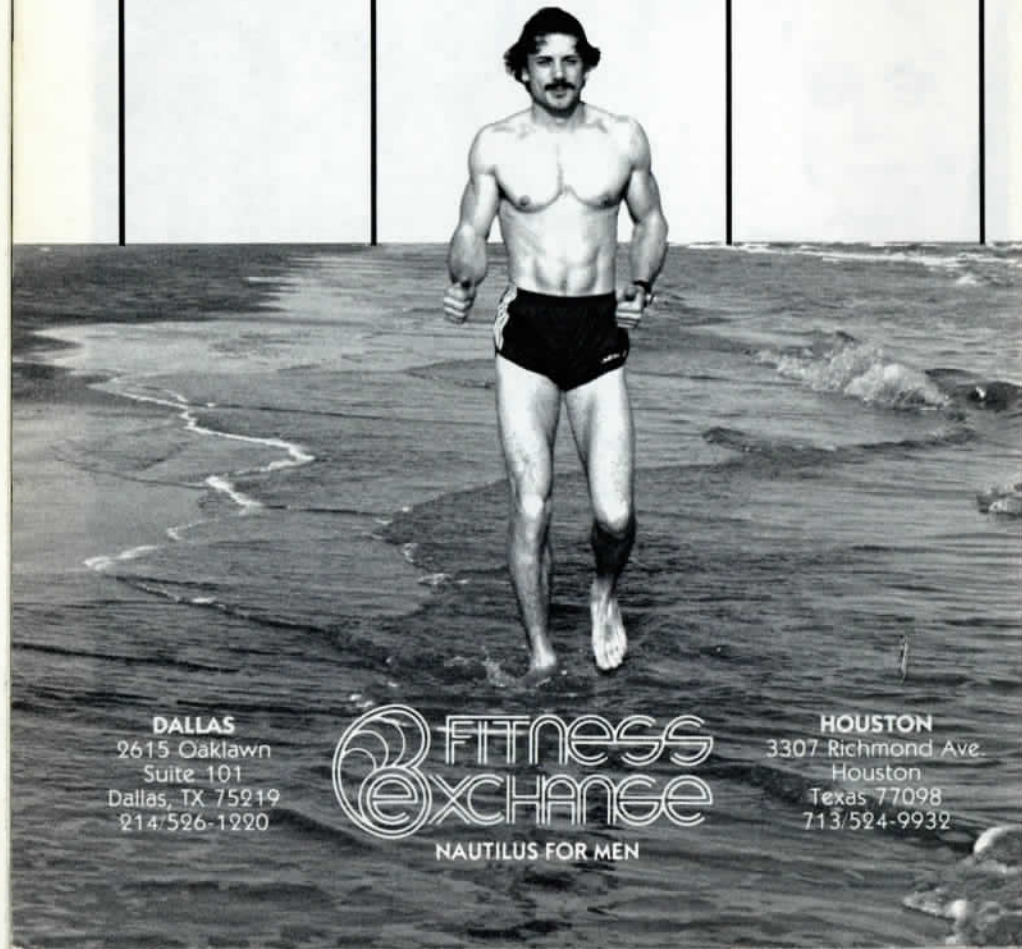

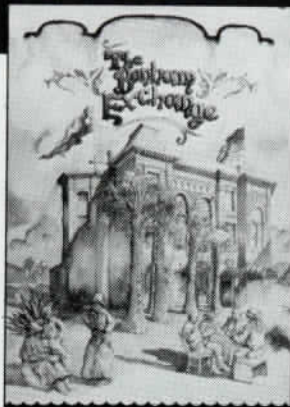

**LONG DELAY ON
21.06 DECISION**

DALLAS — In an effort to learn when Judge Jerry Buchmeyer will reach a decision in the Baker vs. Wade trial over the 21.06 sodomy statute, TWT NEWS was unable to learn any specifics. Although the judge had no direct comment for TWT NEWS on the matter, his office told TWT NEWS that "it could be a long time."

A reliable inside source on such matters has further stated to TWT NEWS that it "could take a year or two for the judge to reach a decision on the matter" indicating that such a long delay is not unusual in matters of like nature.

Meanwhile, the matter has become further complicated as the THRF has informed TWT NEWS that Wade contends the case should be dismissed as Baker had failed to prove standings as required for a federal court to have jurisdiction in a case. Specifically, Henry Wade, Dallas County District Attorney, has filed a post trial brief asserting that Baker had failed to show "injury in fact."

A brief filed in response on behalf of the plaintiff, Don Baker, Dallas Gay Alliance President, stated that "it cannot be denied that plaintiff here is facing a direct harm to himself in the form of a threatened criminal prosecution since it has been stipulated by (Wade) that Sec. 21.06 will be enforced against (Baker) whenever the opportunity arises." Therefore, the injury in fact test has been met.

In his attack upon the statute, Baker relied primarily on the right to privacy and equal protection guarantees under the U.S. Constitution. The right of a person to privately engage in sexual relations with consenting adults clearly falls within the protections afforded

under the Constitution, he said. To allow the state to criminalize only such acts between persons of the same sex on its face violates the equal protection clauses of the Constitution, it was stated.

M. Robert Schwab, President of the Texas Human Rights Foundation, explained to TWT NEWS that the latest filing of briefs will delay the expected date for a decision in this case.

MADNESS**

HOUSTON — This Saturday, February 27, this city's Mardi Gras Madness (MGM) will host a \$75,000 plus "state of the art party" called Fire and Ice. Some 4,000 people from every major city in America and ten different countries are to be in attendance, MGM told TWT NEWS.

This is MGM's seventh year "to stretch the ears and minds of fantasy party goers in a spectacular disco extravaganza" which will feature the incredible talents of DJ Sharon White of New York's The Saint, a laser show by Lasermedia of Los Angeles, a lighting by Showco of Dallas, and computerized dancing waters by Dancing Waters of New York.

Monies generated by the MGM collective have benefited the Houston 100 Club, the Montrose Activity Center, the Montrose Clinic, the Montrose Counseling Center, the Montrose Singers, the Montrose Symphonic Band, and other community service organizations including Gay Pride Week.

"The party is a private party for only those attending past parties or guests who have received invitations," TWT NEWS was told.

BACKLASH OVER GAY TEACHERS

HOUSTON — As expected, the conservative spectrum once again has unleashed their diatribe upon homosexuality as a result of last week's announcement in **TWT NEWS** that out-going GPC President Lee Harrington and Montrose Counseling Center co-founder Bill Scott had been hired to teach Houston Police cadet classes on the gay lifestyle.

Geneva Kirk Brooks, long time advocate of anti-pornography, spoke out at last week's city council saying that since sodomy was still against the law, it would be unlawful for gays to teach new policemen about something as unlawful as homosexuality. Brooks lumped homosexuality into the same pile with pornography, child molestation, and other controversial social issues which she paralleled with San Francisco.

HPD Deputy Chief Fred B. Bankston also hopped aboard the anti-gay bandwagon saying, "I think that if we hire homosexual teachers to teach in the academy for the gays, then we ought to hire thieves to teach about stealing, hire some prostitutes to teach about prostitution, hire dope fiends to teach about narcotics."

HPD Deputy Chief A.M. Gibson heaped additional criticism upon the plan by remarking to *The Houston Chronicle*, "in light of my belief that homosexuality, lesbianism, sadism, masochism, child molestation, on and on are sexual perversions and I don't separate one from the other . . . serves to give the stamp of approval on perversion."

Mayor Kathy Whitmire told *Houston Chronicle* reporter Jim Carlton that she

supported the concept, but opposed plans to hire gay political leader Lee Harrington as one of the teachers. She said, "the course should be taught by educators rather than political activists."

The idea for the cadet classes was that of HPD Capt. Leroy Michna, director of the department's police academy, who maintains his positive position. "If you want an Astro to talk about baseball, you don't go to the Oilers," said Michna. "Now is the time to have the gay community represent themselves in the course," he added.

The new course will begin March 22 with Harrington and Scott teaching a four-hour class "designed to present what is an accurate picture of homosexuals in Houston."

A similar gay course has been a part of cadet training for the past two years and "it has been well received by the cadets," Michna noted. That uncriticized course has been taught by Dr. John Matthews of the University of Houston.

Therefore, it is not the nature of the course which is being criticized, notes **TWT NEWS**. The issue at hand is who is going to teach the course.

Simply stated, it's not the class that's receiving criticism; it's the choice of teachers.

And, this time around, they are gay!

CHE URGES YOU TO CALL MAYOR

HOUSTON — Steve Shiflett, President of CHE has told **TWT NEWS**, "The Board of Directors of CHE officially endorses the educational concept of a gay sensitivity program at the Houston Police Academy. And, we support the use of credentialed and professional people with backgrounds demonstrating capabilities of developing educational programs. This is a definite need for the program to be successful in the long run."

"First and foremost, however, we strongly urge our constituents and Houstonians alike to support the concept of the program by calling respec-

tive Houston City Councilmembers and the Mayor's Office at (713) 222-3011," said Shiflett.

If telephone calls to HPD are any indication, public sentiment is running heavily against the decision. Bill Elkin, president of the Houston Police Officers Association, said calls to his office and others at the department last week had been running "four and five to one" against the decision.

"We must make them aware of how strongly we feel about this very important progress and how strongly we feel about credentialed people being hired to fill the positions," Shiflett reasoned.

GPC ELECTS NEW OFFICERS

HOUSTON — Larry Bagneris, Jr. became the new president of Houston's Gay Political Caucus at the Wednesday, February 17, annual election. Bagneris is joined by a host of newly elected staff members, all of who ran unopposed, **TWT NEWS** observed.

Terry Harris has become the new vice-president, Tony Vega has become the new secretary, and Kathee Smith has become the new treasurer.

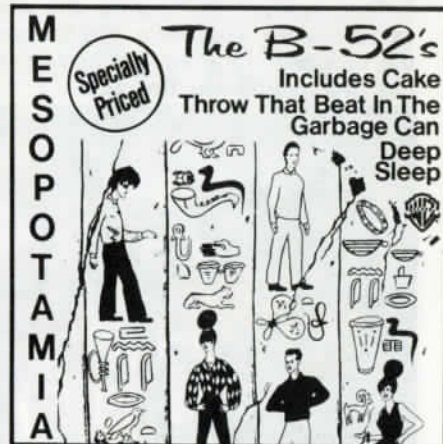

NEW GPC PREZ STRESSES ONENESS

HOUSTON — In his dynamic keynote address before the collective of Houston's Gay Political Caucus, Larry Bagneris, Jr., stressed "oneness" explaining "whether you be lesbian or gay male, rich or poor, black, brown or anglo, we are all still one... and my pledge to you is to deliver this oneness against the enemy!"

Bagneris, who holds a B.A. in political science and has been chair of this city's past very successful gay pride week celebrations, captivated the minds of those who had just elected him. "I intend to think and plan. It's time for action rather than reaction," he declared, adding "we have moved from confrontation to communication."

Bagneris backed up his rhetoric with planned action outlining a three-point program for success.

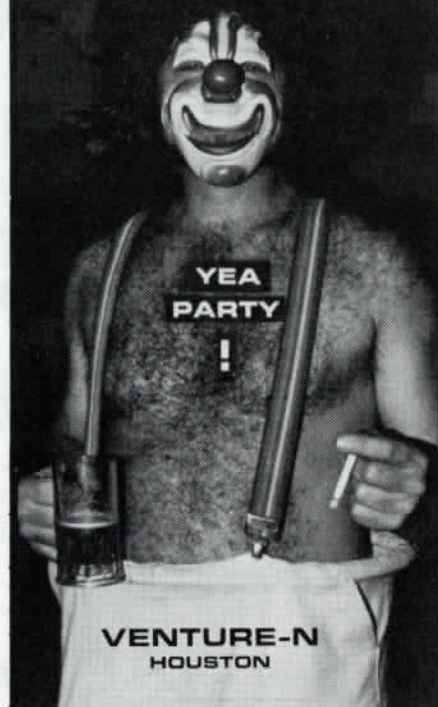
Point one is for GPC to be financed so as to provide a larger money base for GPC in order to develop a budget which can afford the hiring of a full time GPC secretary.

Point two is to be public relations within the GPC so as to give the GPC a new image by revising the GPC logo on t-shirts and buttons in order to increase the positive visibility of the GPC within the community.

Point three is to be inter-community communications so as to allow greater latitude of differing opinions through interaction.

"Let us agree to disagree," Bagneris said. "This is my main goal!" And, after all the disagreements have been ironed out, "let us deliver this agreement, this oneness, against the enemy!"

The problem of police brutality was not only discussed but a solution was also offered. "We must join the black and brown communities to remove the problem of police brutality since they too share in the commonality of this problem."

Clearly, Bagneris has done his political homework and under his strong leadership, Houston's GPC appears stalwartly poised for what Bagneris has termed "a new beginning," TWT NEWS observed.

COUNCIL OUTLAW DISCRIMINATION

AUSTIN — By a vote of five-to-two, the Austin City Council passed amendments to this city's controversial fair housing ordinance on February 18. The council outlawed housing discrimination on the basis of age, parenthood, marital status, and sexual orientation.

By passing the amendments as an emergency measure by a five-to-two vote, a referendum on the ordinance was ruled out, stated *The Austin American Statesman*.

Voting against the amendment was Austin mayor Carole McClellan and Austin city councilman Ron Mullen.

Reaction was quick to come from Dr. Steven Hotze who had lead the opposition in the recent January 16 election. "I will meet with the leadership team of the Austin Citizens For Decency before acting," he said. "We expected this would happen and now we'll just have to wait and see what our options are."

Elated that city council had passed the amendments outlawing discrimination, Robb Southerland remarked, "The vote was a great effort on the part of government to be certain that people won't be discriminated against."

Southerland represents the Citizens for a United Austin who last month spearheaded a very successful campaign to defeat Austin's unfair housing ordinance.

In the January election, voters in Austin defeated the measure by a landslide in a two-to-one decisive margin.

Gifted


Dear TWT:

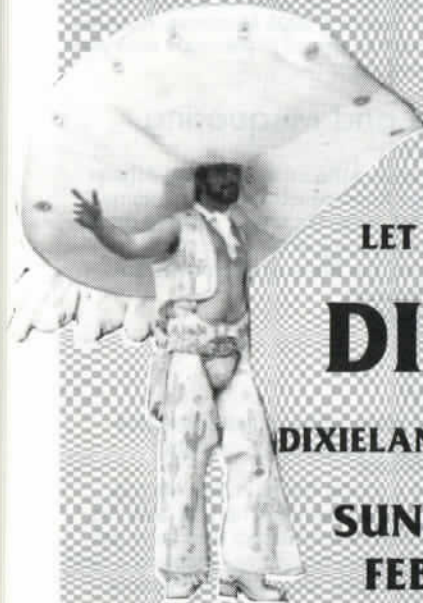

Sexually Transmitted Diseases

SYPHILIS

Syphilis is epidemic among sexually active gay men. Today it remains as one of the more common infectious diseases. For control of the diseases, education of the people affected is very important. People must be able to recognize the signs and symptoms of the various stages of syphilis. People must be willing to report to their sexual partners so that all known contacts will be treated.

Syphilis is caused by a microscopic bacterium called *Treponema pallidum*, which enters the blood stream and infects the entire body. It is almost always transmitted by sexual contact. There is contact between the infectious lesion of rash and the mucous membranes of the body such as mouth, rectum, vagina and penis. The organism can actually penetrate through a break in exposed skin.

The incubation period is 10-90 days after sexual intercourse with an infected person. A blood test may not detect the existence of the disease during this period. All sexual contacts of early syphilis must be treated to prevent the disease from developing. This

will insure that they will not transmit the disease to others, thus breaking the cycle of infection responsible for the syphilis epidemic.

After the incubation period, usually 3 weeks, there may be a lesion or chancre where the syphilis germ enters the body. It begins as a red swelling, which becomes eroded to form a small, painless ulcer, varying in size from 1/4 to 3/4 inch. A chancre has firm hardened edges and may increase from one to several lesions. The surface of chancres exudes serum that contains many bacteria. Sexual contact at this time should be avoided. Lymph nodes closest to the chancre are often enlarged and firm, but usually painless. The chancre can develop on the penis, vagina, rectum, mouth, throat. It disappears regardless of treatment.

When one has rectal syphilis, lesions produce few or no symptoms unless secondarily infected with other bacteria. When this occurs, symptoms are similar to gonorrhea, with a whitish or bloody discharge, burning during sexual intercourse and defecations, and intense irritation of the rectal opening.

After the primary lesions have disappeared, one goes into the secondary

stage of syphilis, usually two to six months after the infection. Body rashes, ranging in appearance from chicken-pox to measles-like rashes, to darkened spots and bumps under the skin, are the most prominent symptoms of secondary syphilis. The rash may last 2-6 weeks. They are frequently on the palms and soles. Headaches, loss of appetite, fever, sore throat, and joint pains may precede or accompany the rash. Again the rash will disappear without treatment.

Latent syphilis may last for years. Some patients will develop tertiary syphilis which may affect the heart, brain, spinal cord.

The diagnosis of syphilis is made by a laboratory examination. However, during the incubation period the test may be negative even when the patient has been infected.

Syphilis may be quickly and completely cured by specially prepared penicillin. Those allergic to Penicillin may be given other antibiotics. **WJ**

PATRICK WHITE

FLAWS IN THE GLASS

A SELF-PORTRAIT

Flaws in the Glass, by Patrick White, 260pp., illustrations, notes, The Viking Press, 625 Madison Avenue, New York, N.Y. 10022, hardbound \$14.95.

Patrick White is a Nobel prize-winning author in literature and has written a "self-portrait" (not a definitive biography) of his life under the title *Flaws In The Glass*. What strikes the reader most about the book is the double feeling of separation that he conveys, living in England, having been born in Australia, and loving men, having been born in 1912 and enduring the

repression of that era. This is the very source of his perspective and objectivity that enables him to comment on and examine the cultural assumptions of much of the world. This is how he makes the scenery and cultures he experienced in Australia, England, and South Africa (where he was stationed during WWII) so well elaborated in our minds.

Initially, White describes to us the adults around him, his parents, their brothers and sisters, and others that influenced his life. His experiences with them, and the events of his later years were the source of his characters and

novel themes, and he explains their evolution and presence in some of the works he has written.

He brings to this book the same style of writing that made his other novels, plays, and short stories so popular and successful. His writing evokes a "stream-of-consciousness" flavor that provides the intimacy and immediacy of a life that spans over seventy years. This visceral reality of his life as he expresses it restores to us what the revisionist historians have taken away. Those who would deny the full human experience, telling the future only what they think we should know, are just as much the enforcers of ignorance as any we have today. Patrick White relates to us his life and his love of Manoly Lascaris, the Greek he met in their middle years and who, these past forty years, has been his companion.

White's unique comments about the world are relevant and interesting, such as when he states, "The repression society demands of homosexuals obviously reduces them to some extent as members of that society, but if we can quench our fears, the perception gained through our temperament strengthens our hand as man, woman, artist, whichever it may be—or all in one." This comment is interspersed with others about his life as a writer, its dilemmas and unique qualities.

His works have included a few homosexual characters, but this is the first time he has emerged from his closet in this self-portrait. This book is one of several that is useful to others in providing a history, a guideline, an identity, or direction for their lives; for them to know what they can accomplish. People like Patrick White destroy the stereotypes the world holds, and defy the ones who would bolster this ignorance.

In the life-events he has accumulated, we see a vast landscape of color and variety, the depth and character of his life is rich with human emotion and achievement. Though he writes successfully, he tells us that it was very difficult to maintain his effort during the trying times of his life. At some points, the creative juices would not flow. But the reader may not be aware or interested in this aspect of the process and, yet again, maybe so. It is all here.

As Patrick White shares with us his story, the reader may gain an added appreciation of his own life, and the achievements that he has made in the past and future. The book is well written and the pictures, though some were made in the twenties and thirties, are excellently reproduced. It is not to be read in one sitting, but over time and savored for the life that it describes.

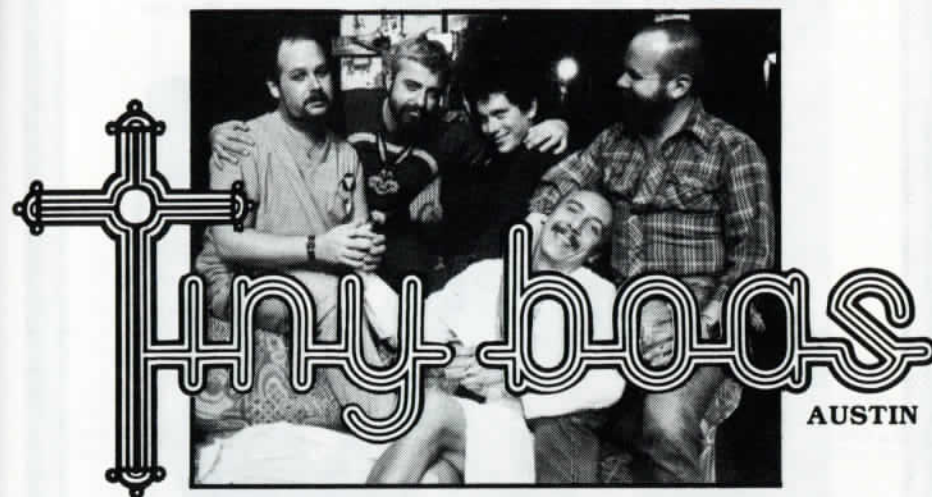

SHOOT THE MOON: ONE MORE TIME!!

The trouble with *Shoot The Moon*, the new blockbuster child of Alan Parker, is the lack of anything new to say.

American divorce, like pasta, gets mushier the longer you simmer. To make yet another movie concerning the problems of the split family is getting to be an obsession with the Hollywood clan. The tragedy is no longer a tragedy, but a dead horse.

Throw in alert, noisy kids, a rambling old house somewhere in Northern California, and you have a foundation. Give the film a lot of fog, a good deal of landscape photography, and two or three experienced and talented actors, and we have—still a foundation.

If you make the male lead (Albert Finney) a crusty, rather alcoholic writer of tennis society, you have some color.

Add a somewhat sophisticated,

though loving wife and mother, and tack on some excellent acting ability, and you have texture.

Weave some solid, rather unknown supporting actors into the background, and you have a tangible atmosphere.

What you don't find, and what you are dying for, is a plot.

Shoot The Moon has academy award winning Bo Goldman as the screenwriter, which should be promising, considering his past achievements. Unfortunately, Goldman seems to have built a mire of confusion and sentimentality

how can she effectively portray a believable role with grunts and groans?

Enough of husband and wife. They lose love, and divorce, but still love.

Two bright spots to look for: The children, headed up by Dana Hill, are refreshing and natural. Their constant love and healthy happiness in spite of the script is clean and sharp. Their urbane reaction to the divorce lightens the aimless wanderings of the cast and camera.

Also Frank Weller, newcomer to the screen, is excellent as Diane Keaton's

for his actors to get lost in. He gets carried away by the trauma of communication loss. Too bad his actors do not. They simply fumble in the fog and shadows of the set.

Dialogue in *Shoot The Moon* is bland and colorless. The potential for revealing, workable dialogue is lost from the beginning. Albert Finney's lines aren't spoken, but mumbled into his collar.

Diane Keaton, mistress of dialogue (*Manhattan*, *Annie Hall*) is struggling to make do with the chasm of divorce, without any meaningful words to help her. She is still the talented actress, but

post-divorce bedwarmer. He is a solid, exciting foil to Keaton's confusion and loneliness. His effortless ability to communicate without verbiage is an enjoyable relief.

Finney and Keaton are consummate actors, lost in an overdone, melodramatic flick with sensitivity without meaning, and photography without aim. Michael Seresin, photography genius, is shooting for a script that is beneath his talent.

The advice of this writer is to stay home, turn on the video machine, and watch *Divorce*, *American Style*.

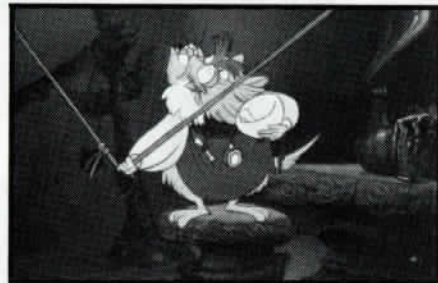

IN PRAISE OF WOMEN'S BODIES — While *Making Love* will undoubtedly be 1982's most controversial gay theme movie, the most dazzling reviews seem to be going to a new film called *Personal Best*, written, produced and directed by **Robert Towne**, who wrote the screenplays for *Chinatown* and *Shampoo*. *Personal Best* doesn't exactly have a gay theme (in fact it's still another track-and-field saga), but it does depict unselfconsciously a sexual

relationship between two female athletes played by **Mariel Hemingway** and **Patrice Donnelly**. The two women become lovers and later competitors in preparation for the 1980 Olympics and, in sort of a reverse on the *Making Love* story, one of the women falls in love with a man. Towne, making his directorial debut, has drawn outstanding performances from his cast which includes **Kenny Moore** and **Scott Glenn**. It's interesting that neither Patrice Donnelly nor Kenny Moore have acted before. Donnelly is a former track star and Moore is currently a writer for *Sports Illustrated*.

CUTE LITTLE RODENTS DEPT — Because of increases in costs and time factors, many of the technical effects involved in the artistry of film animation have been in a steady decline over the past several decades. Despite occasional touted "breakthroughs" in the

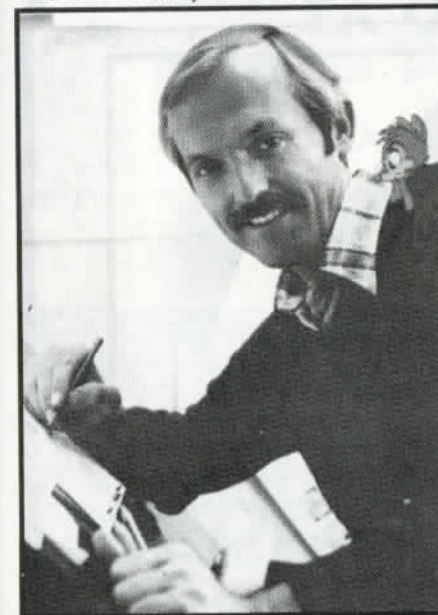
art of animation, animated films of recent years have been markedly inferior, lacking the attention to detail, the vivid drawing, characterization, and emotional impact of the Disney classics such as *Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs*, *Fantasia*, and *Cinderella*. A couple of years ago a group of artists with Walt Disney Productions rebelled against the state of the art and left to form their own company — Don Bluth Productions. The purpose of these de-

voted artists was to bring about "The Second Age of Animation" by returning the art of the animated film to the state

of glory it previously enjoyed more than 25 years ago. The first feature from the new company is *The Secret of NIMH*, a magical mystery tale involving some presumably endearing critters such as field mice, rats, owls, and crows, and a malicious cat named Dragon. Among the voices heard in the film are those of **Dom DeLuise**, **John Carradine**, **Elizabeth Hartman**, **Peter Strauss**, **Hermione Baddeley**, **Aldo Ray**, and **Lucille Bliss**, who did the voices of both step-sisters in Disney's *Cinderella*.

IN MEMORIAM — **Eleanor Powell** died Feb. 11 at the age of 69. Famous for her staccato tap dancing, she made her movie debut in 1935 in *George White's Scandals*, and later appeared in *Born To Dance* and the *Broadway Melody* films of 1936, 1938, and 1940. In the early fifties she retired from films, but later had success in television with the syndicated *Faith of Our Children*, for which she won 5 Emmys. **Lee Strasberg**, one of the most influential men of American theatre, died Feb. 17 at the age of 80. In 1948 Strasberg became artistic director of the Actors Studio, founded by **Elia Kazan**, and later taught **Marlon Brando**, **James Dean**, **Marilyn Monroe**, **Jane Fonda**, **Robert De Niro**, and **Al Pacino**, among many others. Actor **Victor Jory** also died recently at the age of 79. He may best be remembered for his portrayal of the slimy Jonas Wilkerson in *Gone With the Wind*. February also saw the deaths of two extremely influential music figures: blues singer and guitarist **Lightin' Hopkins** died at the age of 69, and jazz pianist **Thelonius Monk** died at 61. 

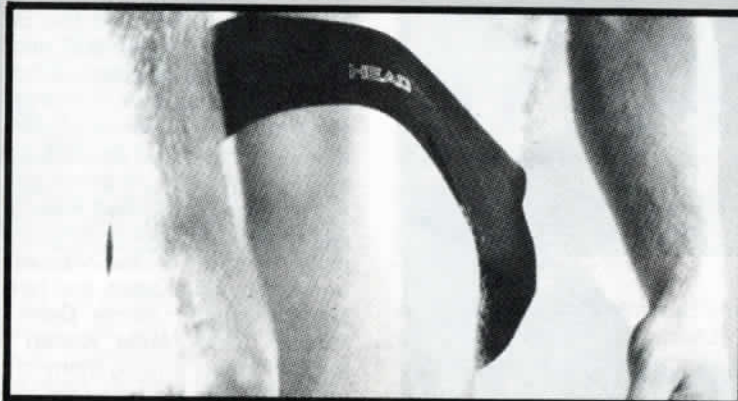

He then came to Houston and began fashion photography, in which he still specializes.

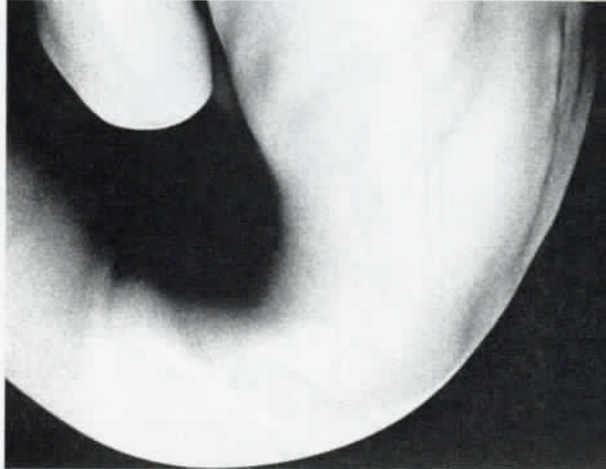


He started working for TWT (*This Week in Texas* magazine) in 1976, about a year after its inception, and has been with TWT ever since.
