CELEBRITY
BANQUET**

Actress Morgan Fairchild Is Guest of Honor at Banquet; Eleanor Tinsley Is Honored.

DALLAS — Actress Morgan Fairchild flew in from Hollywood last Friday, April 27, to be the guest of honor at the first black-tie celebrity banquet for AIDS Foundation Houston [AFH]. The elegant soiree, held at the Inn on the Park, was a fundraiser for AFH.

Fairchild, like Elizabeth Taylor and Dionne Warwick, has become a noted celebrity spokesperson in the battle to raise national awareness about AIDS.

At the Houston banquet, she told of how she first got involved in AIDS, recalling in

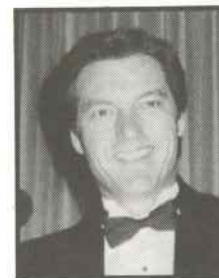


1981 when she read of a small cluster of young men in New York who had developed Kaposi's sarcoma. "They were gay, all 11 cases," said Fairchild.

"Then later I saw an article about 20 gay men in San Francisco who had developed pneumocystis pneumonia. One by one they started dying," she stated.

"That's when I got everything I could read about this strange new disease which at the time had no name. As the cases mounted, so did my concern.

"In 1985, my wardrobe man on my TV show died of AIDS. In the summer of that year, Rock Hudson woke up the press with the fact he was dying of AIDS," recalled Fairchild.

She told of how the press swarmed on Hollywood over the Hudson story and how the press came to her to speak about it.

"I was one of the only celebrities who knew anything about AIDS. I don't know why people will listen to an actress, rather

than a doctor, talk about AIDS," questioned Fairchild.

"I decided to go on the networks to help stem the panic and educate the public. Also, I feared there would be a homophobic backlash because fear brings out the worst in people. Frustration. Rage. It's not a pretty disease, nor a kind disease.

"But, I must tell you that PWAs are the greatest people I've ever met," said Fairchild. "Being involved with AIDS has been the best use of my life."

Fairchild closed her remarks by saying she had recently spoken with former U.S. Surgeon General C. Everett Koop. "He gave me two things to tell you: Don't fall prey to complacency. And don't fall for the lie that AIDS is manageable."

Fairchild, formerly of Dallas, said she was still proud to be a Texan. In this AIDS crisis, "We have that good ol' Texas willingness to be generous."

Also honored at last Friday's AFH banquet was Houston City Councilperson Eleanor Tinsley. Presenting the award to Tinsley was John Paul Barnich, who said, "I am real proud of Eleanor. She's a breath of fresh air.

"She's earned our support in her bid for county commissioner," he stated. "She came to AFH when AIDS first came along. She asked, 'What can I do?' She was there when we cut the ribbon on the food pantry," recalled Barnich.

In accepting her award, Tinsley remarked, "AFH has been in the trenches fighting AIDS for eight years. The foundation's work is so desperately needed. And you desperately need new and bigger quarters for the food pantry."

Tinsley quoted some numbing statistics about Houston, which has the country's fourth largest AIDS population. "Someone dies of AIDS in Houston every 17 hours and a new case is diagnosed every 12

hours, according to the statistics I get," said Tinsley.

During the program, Janice Gore Thomas was introduced as the new chairperson of the AFH Board of Trustees, succeeding Barnich, who recently stepped down after many years of service.

In her remarks, Thomas said she was "thrilled that the board of directors is a working board, devoting their efforts." She also recognized AFH member Jack Jackson for recently being honored with Mayor Kathryn Whitmire's Volunteer of the Year award.

Master of ceremonies for the black-tie banquet was Bob Boudreaux, news anchor for KTRK-TV. "AIDS is an affliction that affects more than just one segment of our population," he said in his introductory remarks.

Evelyn Cox, AFH Executive Director, told the audience that she hoped to make the celebrity banquet an annual affair. "I want to thank everyone who attended and especially those who bid on the silent auction," said Cox.

DALLAS PWA HOUSE FIRE

Oak Cliff Apt. House for PWAs Suffers Third Fire. Arson Causes \$150,000 Ruins.

DALLAS — There's been another fire of strange origin at the PWA Apartment House in suburban Oak Cliff. Even more strange is that this is the third fire the apartment unit has suffered in the last two years.

Like other fires, arson or carelessness at the hands of vagrants is suspected as the cause. Over \$150,000 in damage was estimated by the project's Executive Director, Don Maison.

Maison blames the fire, in part, on slow city funding which delayed putting up a security fence around the apartment project to keep out vagrants who are believed to have caused the fire.

In this latest fire, occurring Monday afternoon, April 23, 13 residents were

forced to relocate. The Red Cross said it was helping the eight adults and five children find temporary housing.

The first fire destroyed eight units in November of 1988. The second fire, more minor than the other two, erupted last New Year's Day. The latest fire destroyed 10 units.

NORTH TEXAS REST AREA POLICE SCAM

Over 400 Gay Men Bilked Out of \$140,000 in False Arrest Bail Bond Swindle.

FORT WORTH — Evidence of police officer John Byron Yarbrough's dark side continues to mount since TWT NEWS first reported on April 6 that the former Fort Worth police officer had been charged with capital murder in the death of a Fort Worth gay hairstylist, Jerry Lee Shaw, 29, in a shooting incident at a rural rest area on Interstate 35 West, near Burleson, Texas.

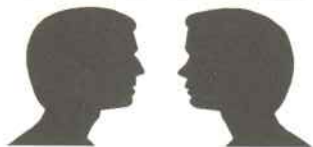
Investigation shows that Yarbrough bilked unsuspecting gay men out of \$140,000 in an undercover operation by Wise County deputies.

It turns out that Yarbrough, while sheriff, cooked up a scam for bogus bail bond fees with a friend, David Lowayne Box, who owned a bail bond company. Together, Box and Yarbrough would often pocket up to \$1,000 per arrest for reducing charges to a misdemeanor.

The ongoing investigation shows that over 400 men were arrested in the ill-fated sting operation. Often men who had simply stopped at the rest area to use the restroom were accused on trumped-up charges of public lewdness or indecent exposure.

According to a statement released to the *Dallas Morning News*, an accomplice of the two said, "When he [Yarbrough] was a cop, he used to mug gays in roadside rest stops. He would give the gay men the opportunity to pay him money or go to jail."

Naturally, most of the men paid the money to avoid embarrassment. The scam continued until it backfired with the recent murder of Shaw.

AUSTIN CITY COUNCIL ELECTION THIS SATURDAY

*ALGPC Endorses Max Nofziger
For Place 1 & Sally Shipman
For Place 3 on Austin City Council.*

AUSTIN — The Austin Lesbian/Gay Political Caucus [ALGPC] recently held its City Council Candidates Forum and endorsed two candidates in the upcoming City Council elections. The election is this Saturday, May 5, reported ALGPC's Rich Bailey.

After listening to the candidates, caucus members voted to endorse Place 1 incumbent Max Nofziger over his several challengers. In the race for Place 3, the caucus endorsed incumbent Sally Shipman over challenger Louise Epstein.

After listening to four of the eight candidates in the race for Council Place 1 who asked for the caucus endorsement, the caucus gave its endorsement to incumbent Nofziger with 72% of the vote.

In the Place 3 race, with three candidates challenging incumbent Shipman, the caucus voted, after much debate over Shipman's role in the closing of Sally's Apartment, to award her the endorsement with 66% of the vote.

Of the four candidates vying for the Place 4 position, currently held by George Humphrey, none of the candidates managed to gain the 60% of the vote necessary to win an endorsement.

Therefore the caucus gave a "failed to endorse" in that race. Challenger Susan Toomey Frost and George Humphrey were the top vote-getters, with 18 and 13 votes respectively.

Over 50 caucus members listened to and asked questions of the 10 candidates who had asked for the caucus endorsement. Questions ranged from concerns over AIDS funding and how the candidates would deal with the continued attacks on the lesbian and gay community from fundamentalists and APD Vice Squad activity, to questions about moving the airport.

Political Action Chair Cathy Cook expressed her satisfaction with both the turnout from the caucus and the number of candidates who asked for the caucus endorsement, saying, "I think that once

again, the candidates have shown how important they consider the ALGPC endorsement. I was also pleased with the number of caucus members who showed up and asked hard questions of the candidates."

If a runoff is needed, it'll be held on Saturday, May 26. Absentee voting took place from April 16 to May 1.

"The caucus encourages everyone to make their voice heard, by voting in this Saturday's City Council election," Bailey remarked.

VIOLENCE AGAINST AUSTIN GAYS IS ON THE RISE

*ALGPC Meets with Mayor
Cooke to Probe Dramatic
Rise in Vice Squad Activity.*

AUSTIN — In recent weeks, TWT NEWS has reported that violent acts and police arrests of gays were on the upswing in both Dallas and Houston. Shootings, stabbings, muggings and police harassment have become more common.

Now, TWT NEWS reports that similar acts of violence and discrimination are also on the rise in the capital city. Thus, such incidents have spread into Texas' three largest gay communities.

ALGPC Public Affairs Chair Glen Maxey said he had met recently with Austin Mayor Lee Cooke to discuss the issues surrounding the dramatic rise in vice squad harassment of gay men.

Maxey reported that the Mayor agreed strongly with ALGPC's position that this misdirection of the police department's personnel is of concern.

Maxey related to the Mayor the concern that anti-lesbian/gay violence and harass-

ment is on the upswing in Austin, and that the police should be used to protect the safety of Austin's citizens as a priority over patrolling bookstore arcades.

ALGPC has received many calls in recent months concerning police arrests for public lewdness of men who are by themselves in arcades.

"To the best of our knowledge, all of these cases are being thrown out by the courts as non-prosecutable," said Maxey.

"And yet, the vice squad continues to waste time, tax dollars and effort, as well as disrupting these persons' lives by arresting them in what appears to be a systematic plan of harassment," he remarked.

Mayor Cooke stated that the City Manager was to meet with the Police Chief and determine why these actions were occurring, and promised to report back to the ALGPC very soon.

As a follow-up, ALGPC will continue to press elected officials for resolution and explanation of these police actions.

Meanwhile, in Austin's adult arcades, *not* breaking the law can land one in jail. Vice squad officers "inspecting" arcade booths for required health warnings are using their "inspections" as probable cause to arrest single individuals within the privacy of a booth.

Vice officers Richard Blackmore and Richard McFadin appear to be using this tactic in a personal crusade, observed Maxey. And, even though municipal courts and the Travis County Attorney have declined to pursue these cases, police administrators are pressing for prosecution in other courts, it was learned.

Defense attorneys are working to develop an accurate picture of the scope of these bogus arrests, TWT NEWS learned.

AUSTIN FORUM ON TB & AIDS

*Doctors Hopewell & Lopez
Say There Is Definite Linkup
Between AIDS & Tuberculosis.*

AUSTIN — Speaking Friday, April 20 at an all-day forum at the Wyndham Southpark Hotel, doctors Philip Hopewell and Sylvia Lopez were joined by ASA's Dwayne Haught in presenting data that continues to show there's a definite linkup between AIDS and tuberculosis.

The audience was told that in New York City, there have been striking increases in numbers of tuberculosis cases. Between 1981 and 1984, the annual number of newly reported cases was steady at approximately 1,600.

However, in 1986, this number increased to 2,200, a 36 percent increase. This increase largely occurred in groups that epidemiologically were more likely to have the HIV infection, said the doctors.

Tuberculosis is perhaps the only HIV-associated infection that clearly can be transmitted from person to person, whether or not they are HIV-infected. If diagnosed, the disease can be effectively treated, they told the audience.

During the forum it was stated that at the turn of the century, tuberculosis, the white plague, was the nation's leading cause of death. As medical science advanced, the threat of tuberculosis diminished. Until now.

Many Americans are now aware of AIDS, which breaks down the body's immune system, which normally protects us against diseases such as tuberculosis.

Unlike other diseases, tuberculosis can gain the upper hand in a person in the early stages of the HIV infection with less severe degrees of immune system compromise. "Data suggests that the rate of persons infected with both HIV and tuberculosis is very high," said the medical officials.

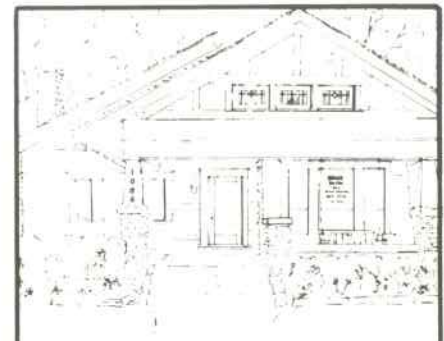

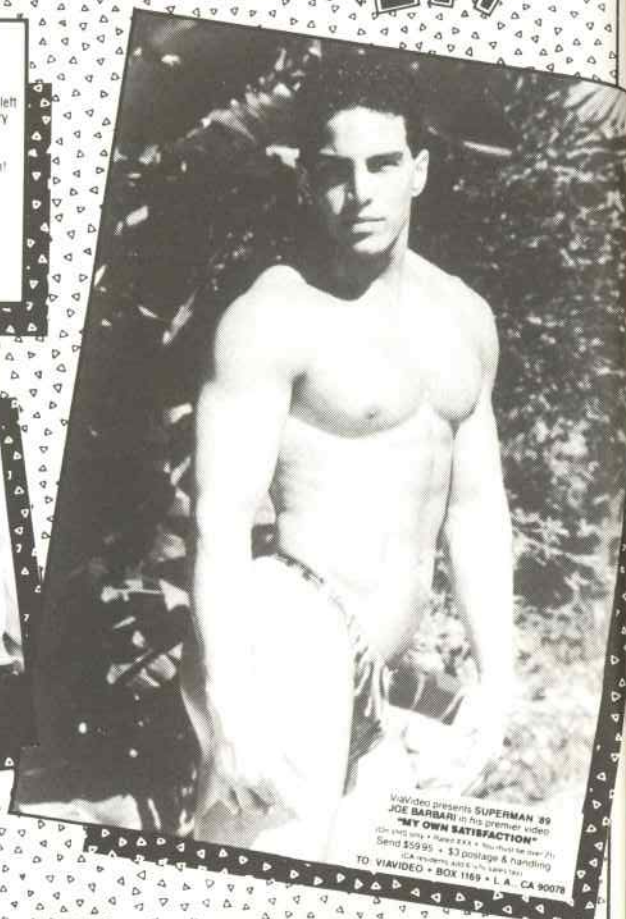

Of the grants awarded, one is for \$1,000 from DIFFA. DIFFA was the main producer of the national tour of "Heartstrings: An Evening of Hope for the Healing of AIDS," which featured former President and Mrs. Jimmy Carter as national honorary chairpersons. "Heartstrings" played in Houston in February of this year and in San Antonio and Dallas last year on its three-city Texas tour.

The \$1,000 will be utilized by THRF to help pay overhead costs in the operation of its AIDS Legal Resource Project. During the 12-month period ending March 31, the AIDS Legal Resource Project served a total of 528 clients. The project is a statewide counseling and referral service for persons who have AIDS-related legal problems.

Margaret Tucker, coordinator of the AIDS Legal Resource Project, expressed appreciation for DIFFA's support of the project and reiterated the need for legal services for persons with HIV infection.

"Texas now has three cities—Houston, Dallas and Austin—on the Centers for Disease Control's latest list of the 20 metropolitan areas with the highest incidence of AIDS diagnoses," said Tucker.

"At the same time, Texas has a legislature which has refused to provide specific protections for persons with HIV infection against employment and health care/insurance discrimination, but focused instead on criminalization of HIV transmission and homophobic limitations on AIDS care funding. Legal services are, unfortunately, an essential part of the AIDS struggle," she said.

THRF has also received a grant of approximately \$600 from Razzle Dazzle Dallas, receiving notification recently from that organization's president, Reed Hunsdorfer.

The \$600 grant represented additional proceeds held back by Razzle Dazzle Dallas after its 1989 event as an emergency fund, to be distributed Razzle Dazzle Dallas to organizations in the lesbian and gay community if not tapped sooner for an appropriate need. THRF had previously received \$6,120 from Razzle Dazzle Dallas as a beneficiary of the proceeds of the 1989 event.

THRF board member David Bryan said that the monies from Razzle Dazzle Dallas would be used to help pay legal fees and educational costs in THRF's lawsuit challenging the constitutionality of the Texas sodomy statute, Section 21.06.

BIG CHANGES AT NAPWA

National Reorganization Puts Texas in Four-State Unit 9; Jerrell Replaces Mason as Prez.

TEXAS — Austin PWA Charles Caulfield has just returned from the National Association of People With AIDS [NAPWA] annual Board of Directors meeting held in Seattle April 4-11, and reported that since requests for NAPWA's services have caused a massive organizational growth, structural changes in the geographic divisions of NAPWA have been made.

Regional congresses of local coalitions will allow a high participation in the activities of the national coalition, without the high cost of traveling to the national meetings, Caulfield told TWT NEWS.

Texas is in the newly created four-state Unit 9, which includes Kansas, Texas, Louisiana and Oklahoma. Local coalitions will be contacted through the national offices about how to proceed if they choose to participate in NAPWA.

Belinda Mason has resigned as president of the organization. Some recent health problems and her commitment to participating on the National AIDS Commission meant that she was not able to devote enough energy to the organization.

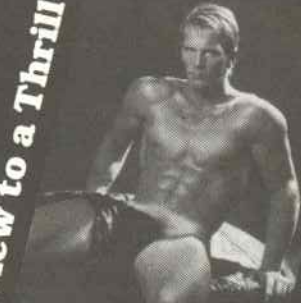
In her stead was elected Ron Jerrell, from Kentucky, as the new president of NAPWA. He will be the U.S. delegate and keynote speaker at the International Conference in Madrid, Spain in May.

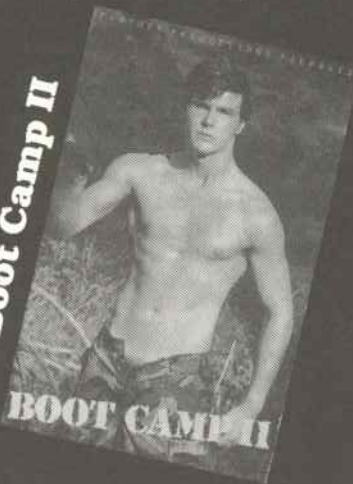

in Drug treatment access, and the negotiations with Burroughs Wellcome resulting in a 20% reduction in the price of AZT.

Billy Burton of Dallas resigned as a board member of NAPWA and as its liaison to the National Lesbian/Gay Health Foundation. He said he will remain an emeritus board member, with all privileges but voting.

As NAPWA reorganizes, coalitions will be updated on the changes as they occur. Until a Region 9 congress of PWAs can be convened, Caulfield said he will be the voting board member and interim chair.

BOAT OPPOSES NEW TABC RULES ON DRINK PRICES

*Bar Owners Prez Says
Proposed Rules Are Not
Needed Since Bartenders
Know Who's Drunk Enough.*

AUSTIN — As the TABC hearings on regulating discounted drink pricing got under way last Monday, Billy Ray Hill, president of the Bar Owners & Associates of Texas [BOAT], issued a stern statement opposing what has been proposed.

In a statement made available to TWT NEWS, Hill said the TABC doesn't need to set up more rules as there are already enough regulations in place. Hill also said that bartenders know better than anyone else who's had enough to drink and don't need any more rules to that effect.

"Each and every drink is served one at a time, no matter what the price," said Hill. "With each serving, the server [bartender] has another opportunity to look at the purchaser [customer] and make a judgment as to their level of intoxication before serving them again."

Hill also told the hearing panelists that servers, managers and bar owners "are well aware that the violation of any rules could lead to the loss of their business and their investment."

"This fact, coupled with the present rules and their active enforcement by the [TABC] commission, as we know they do, would seem to be more than adequate to restrict service to intoxicated persons in mixed beverage establishments without expanding the rules and without further restricting the manner in which permittees

are allowed to conduct their business," said Hill, a longtime Fort Worth bar owner.

The proposed rules which Hill refers to would place new regulations on happy hour, outlawing happy hour discounted pricing after 11 p.m.; eliminate two-for-one drinks; rule out nickel beer nights; nix liquor busts where customers can drink unlimited alcohol for one price; and other regulations such as serving larger drinks at regular prices.

"We feel that most of these new rules will only serve to restrict the boundaries within which responsible business persons will be allowed to operate their business," said Hill in a statement obtained by TWT NEWS.

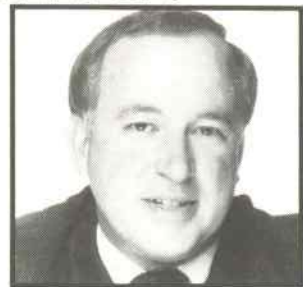

the Subcommittee is Congressman Lane Evans of Illinois, a supporter of many gay issues.

During his testimony, Huntington said he will brief members of Congress and congressional staffers on many issues of concern to all veterans, such as AIDS, homelessness, post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), quality of hospital care, as well as the importance of Congressional repeal of Article 125 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice, all of which is contained in Title 10 of the U.S. Code.

Article 125 of the UCMJ contains the onerous anti-gay provisions, and repeal or amendment of Article 125 would be a giant step toward allowing gays and lesbians to serve in the United States Armed Forces with dignity and honor.

After that, a Department of Defense policy needs to be rescinded. That policy, instituted in 1981, states that homosexuality is not consistent with good order and discipline in the armed forces.

Based on information received from NEGLBV and the Coalition of California Gay & Lesbian Veterans Organizations, Texas Gay Veterans is the only gay veterans organization between the Appalachians and the Rockies.

Texas Gay Veterans, in cooperation with the Tarrant County Gay Alliance, was at the forefront of last December's investigation of a witchhunt of over 20 gay soldiers at Carswell Air Force Base.

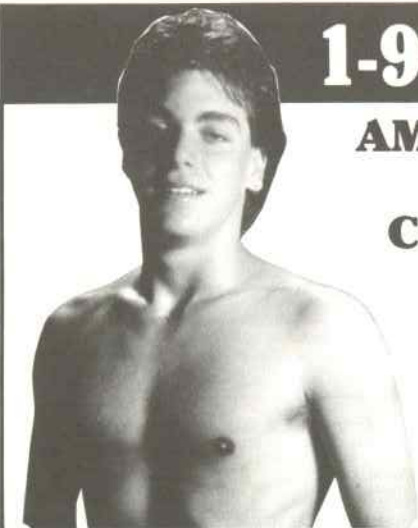

Arriagus Booking Fiasco

If you were expecting Florida entertainer Tiffany Arriagus to do a show recently at a club near you on her recent 12-city Texas tour and wondered what happened, the following COMMENT letter of explanation from Tiffany will relate the rest of the story.—Editor

Others were completed, but because of John, dancers didn't show up, thus making one of those contracts null and void. However, of the four (only four) contracts that I received from John, two were legally signed and two were forged.

Some people may think that writing this letter in a magazine is a bit extreme, but I don't. The public has a right to know when there is someone in our community that is totally wrong. No one deserves to be lied to and travel halfway across America at their own expense for work that isn't there. I've learned recently that I am not the first.


Art Fest Riddle

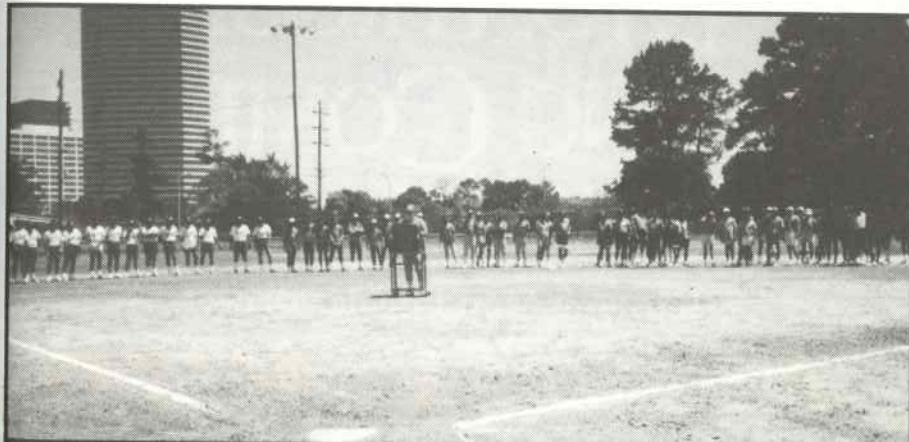

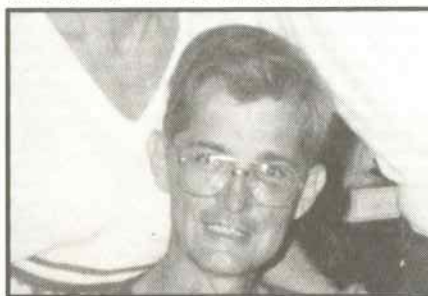
In Memoriam

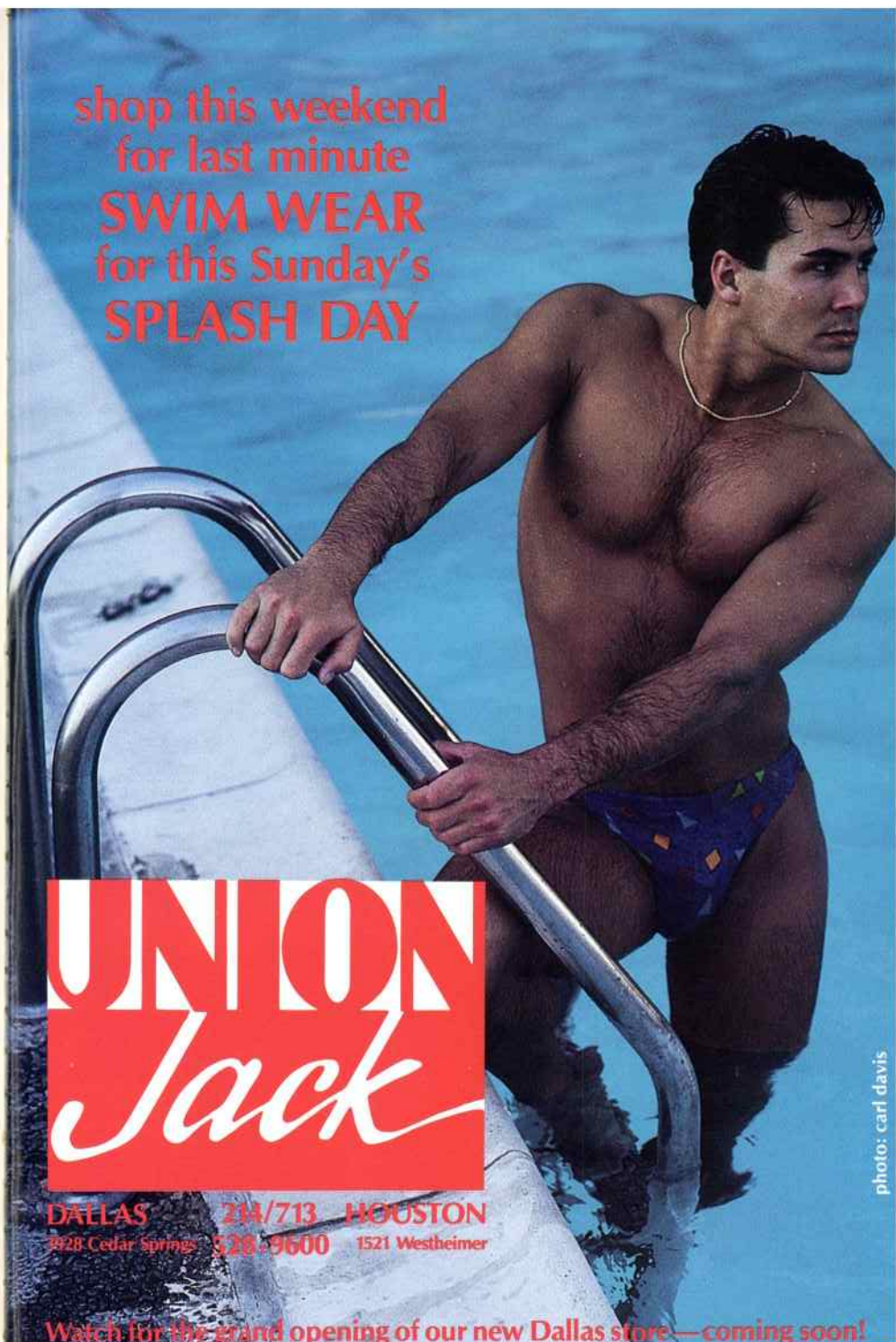

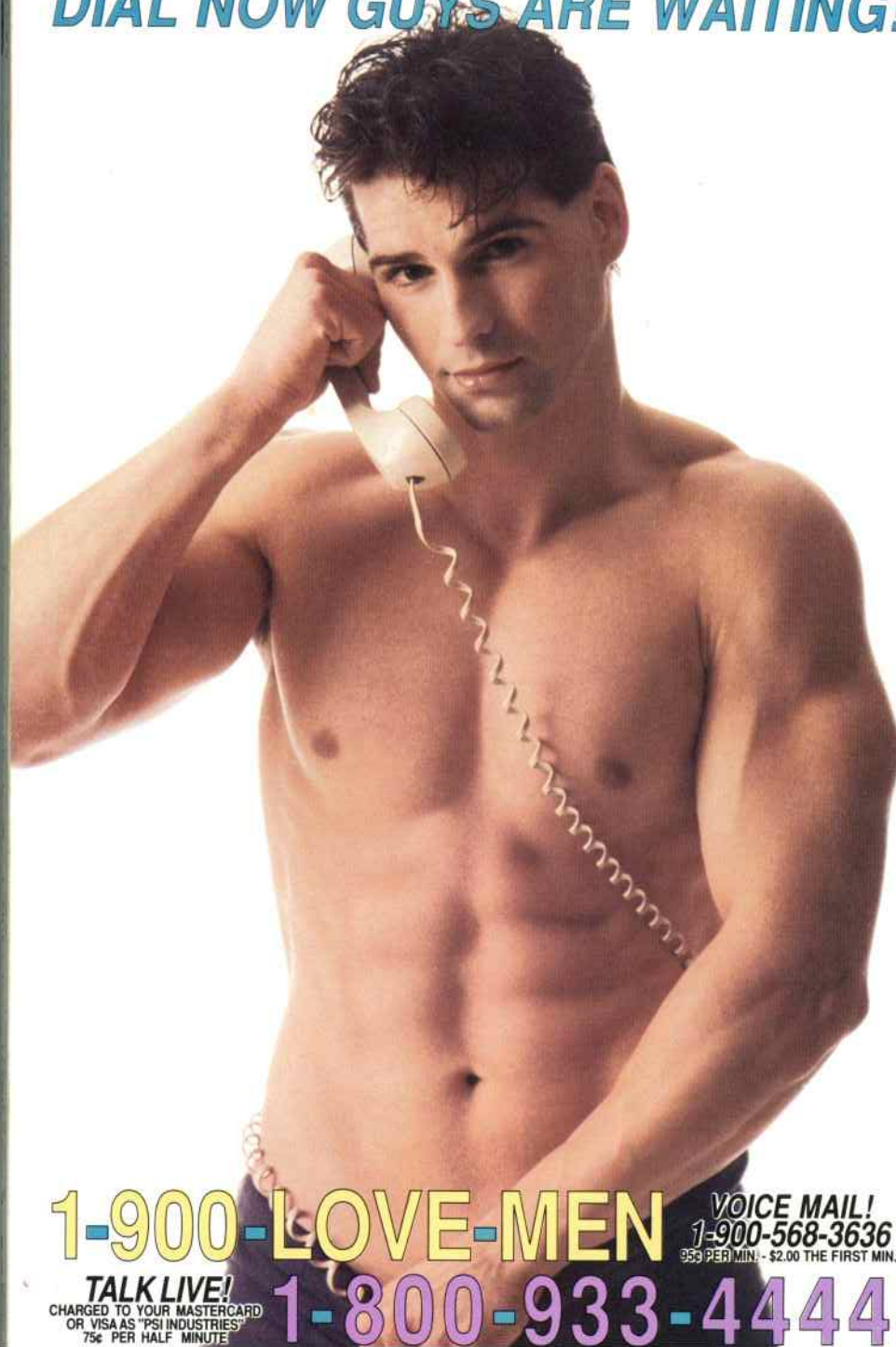
