ASA HIRES FIVE NEW EMPLOYEES

*Duties To Include Case Managers,
InfoLine Coordinator, and
AIDS Educator.*

AUSTIN — With continued growth in the client case load during the past year and in a continuing effort to provide quality services for their clients, ASA [AIDS Services Austin] has hired five additional staff members: Three new case managers, an Information Line manager and a Community Health Educator.

To fill the vacancy left by case manager Kate McCalley, ASA has hired Becky Ruiz who has a Bachelor of Social Work degree. She has experience working with a wide range of clients experiencing life crisis and in need of resources and support. Her medical social work experience, bilingual skills, along with her dedication and energy make her a valuable asset to ASA.

Michael Sherrill, a former volunteer with the ASA Helper Program, has also been hired as a case manager. He has extensive experience in medical social work, case management and working with children and families.

The third case manager position was filled by Grace Johnson, who has experience in drug and alcohol abuse, medical social work, and mental health counseling. Before coming to ASA, Ms. Johnson worked as a therapist at Shoal Creek Hospital where she provided individual and group counseling. All three new case managers have extensive knowledge of HIV and a real commitment to working with ASA clients.



Clifford Ueltschey has replaced Sandy Bartlett as the Information Line Coordinator. He will be responsible for recruiting, training, scheduling volunteers and publicizing the service throughout Austin and the central Texas area. Ueltschey has been a volunteer on the InfoLine for the past three years and has served as captain on Tuesday night for the past two years. He most recently was the Outreach Coordinator for ASA's 1990 pledge walk. An aggressive advertisement campaign to publicize the InfoLine will begin early in 1991.

Marty Kosarik, the newest staff member at ASA, was hired as Health Educator for the gay community. After serving as office manager for one year for the HIV Prevention Project at Texas Department of M.H.M.R., he started work for ASA in November, 1990. He has a bachelor's degree from the University of Houston and has resided in Austin for the past 3½ years. He will be responsible for reorganizing the "Rubber Fairies", Austin's most active safe sex education group.

MCA TEAMS VISIT HOSPITALS

Social/Service Group Brings Christmas Cheer To Area PWAs.

HOUSTON — "Are you a volunteer?" was the first question asked by a young PWA as the Miss Camp America hospital visitation team entered his room at Twelve Oaks Hospital in Houston. An MCA member told TWT NEWS, "Not one flower, not one family member was present in the room with him. A heartwarming smile expressed his happiness at having a visitor—any visitor. It took all our strength to maintain our composure."

Teddy bears and candy canes brought the spirit of the season to hospitalized Houston-area PWAs. Members of Miss

MCA's Pat Petty told TWT NEWS that the teams visited Park Plaza and Twelve Oaks Hospitals. The volunteers also visited with patients at Casa, the hospice, and were amazed at the number of female PWAs.

Miss Camp America is one of the oldest social/service organizations in Houston. For 23 years the group has raised funds for many of the charitable agencies in Houston. The group also assists other organizations in their fund-raising efforts throughout the year. In the past they have assisted Lady Victoria Lust's PWA Christmas, Songfest, Gay/Lesbian Pride Week and a host of others.

TEXAS HAS ITS OWN 'JESSE HELMS'

Bill Ceverha's Appointment To Panel Spells Bad News.

DALLAS — "We consider Bill Ceverha to be the Jesse Helms of Texas," Bruce Monroe said. "We will watch him very carefully."

Monroe, president of the Dallas Gay Alliance, told Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS that Ceverha had been appointed as one of 24 panel members who will decide on how funds from the CARE Bill should be distributed in Dallas County.

CARE stands for the Comprehensive AIDS Resource Emergency Act of 1990. The federal government has declared 14

sections of the country as disaster areas due to the AIDS epidemic. This means that Dallas County, one of the 14 areas, will receive \$950,000 in funds for AIDS services.

County Judge Lee Jackson is in the process of appointing 24 members and a chairman to the HIV Planning Council, which will decide how the money is to be disbursed, Monroe explained.

"As a former Texas legislator, Ceverha opposed every bit of gay anti-discrimination legislation," Monroe explained. "And since 93% of AIDS cases in the Dallas area are gay or bisexual men, we feel Ceverha will be in direct opposition to the mission of the council. This is not called 'emergency' funding for nothing."

Monroe added that all the other board members have worked directly in various

AIDS projects. He said Ceverha has gone on record as saying that too much money has been spent on AIDS already.

"Disbursement of the initial funds can begin within 60 days," Monroe said. "After the initial phase of the guaranteed funding of \$950,000 to Dallas County, there will be a second phase of competitive grants." He said that how wisely the first money was used and how well the proposal is written will determine if more funds will be available in Dallas.

"We could see more than one million dollars come to us within a year," Monroe

said. He added that this is the first time federal money has gone to direct services in Dallas.

"Everyone on the panel will serve in various committees, where each member will have a voice," Monroe said. "We don't have the time to educate Ceverha about our needs. He will just waste a lot of time using this as a forum to continue his bigotry against us."

Protests and Boycotts

Dear TWT:

I am writing in response to the letter "Questioning Intentions" in a recent **TWT COMMENT**, in which the validity of using protests and boycotts to broaden gay rights was addressed. The author's conclusion, using the guise of some form of tenuous "logic," was that they were probably unproductive, if not counterproductive.

Mr. Milstead needs to relearn physics 101, because there is no such equation as force = resistance. I think what he's referring to is paraphrased like this: "...for every action, there is an equal and opposite reaction." What Newton's law is saying is that when two forces are in *equilibrium*, their forces are the same and opposite in direction. He [Milstead] wrongly asks that we "...step aside and let the force of the opposition fall flat with no reaction to justify itself, no ground to stand on." If he's going to apply physics to this scenario, then it follows that the force of the opposition would "fall flat" on us as *individuals* if we step aside, since we would no longer be in equilibrium.

Anyway, protests and boycotts are effective because collectively we're more powerful and they allow us to influence other people's ideas while gaining us some self-respect in the process—not because of or in spite of physics applied to society. So keep it up!

The recent airing of *Lifestories* on NBC about a television news anchor whose dual lifestyles collide after he tests HIV positive reminded me of the desperate need for the gay community to remain keenly aware of three very important aspects of the AIDS crisis: 1) the never-ending fight against AIDS discrimination, 2) increased public awareness and 3) the search for a cure.

Although the show had much of the added drama necessary for television, the reaction of those who would choose to ignore the disease was all too real. Unfortunately, in real life, it is not just the heterosexual community that would rather look the other way and pretend this tragedy did not exist.

After discussing *Lifestories* with friends, I was disturbed to learn that there are those in the gay community who find it "too depressing" and would rather not see any documentaries or informative programming concerning the plight of those with the disease—ignorance is bliss.

It is this attitude that has perpetuated the spread of AIDS at an alarming rate. I find it absolutely shameful that there are those among us who, because they have been fortunate enough not to be personally affected by the disease, choose not to be

WHY I GO TO A SUPPORT GROUP—

A Mother's Perspective!

There are several reasons that brought me to Bering Memorial United Methodist Church's support group for those dealing with AIDS. I'm afraid all of them were selfish—desperation, anger and fear, to name a few. Even though I had a lot of moral support from my family members, it just wasn't enough. I felt completely alone and lost.

I had taken care of my husband for two years before he died of cancer in 1988. But nothing with my husband's long and painful illness really prepared me for coping with a son dying of AIDS. Mothers are supposed to fix and make things better for

their children. No matter what I did, I couldn't fix it or make it go away. I was devastated.

After he had one very bad bout with PCP, I came to the realization that no matter how much I loved my son or how well I looked after him, he was going to die from this thing that I couldn't even tell anyone about. Slowly but surely it was taking him from me.

At this time I hit an all-time low. I didn't have my husband to share my pain and at that time no one seemed to care about PWAs. At the hospital we met a very nice young man carrying a very large card. He was looking for one of the AIDS patients. He greeted us like we were family, and before he left he had invited us to the Wednesday night group at Bering and given us both a big hug, and he didn't even have plastic gloves on.

I'm not sure just what I expected when I attended, but what I found was a group of very caring and loving people who understood my every feeling and shared my pain. I don't feel alone anymore. I know that support is only a Wednesday or a phone call away.

There are times when I feel mothers are meant to be seen and not heard; well, that isn't the case at Bering. At one time or another, I have expressed all my feelings, some on subjects that might raise an eyebrow or two. I have found that you are never too old to learn.

I'm not very good at expressing myself, but what I'm trying to say is that whatever I came here for, I have found it and I continue to come because maybe I can share with someone else the caring and support I have found at Bering.

Spiritual? Yes, from where I'm standing that's just what is going on here.

TEAM DALLAS

Dallas — It is time to begin planning for Unity in '94: Gay Games IV and Cultural Festival, reports Phil Johnson of Team Dallas.

"If Dallas was not represented at all for the first Gay Games in 1982, by 11 athletes in 1986, and by 82 athletes and the Oak Lawn Band last August in Vancouver, what will Team Dallas '94 be like?" asks Johnson. "We can be bigger and better in 1994. But we must start building the team we want now," he added.

The first Team Dallas meeting of 1991 will be held on January 25 in the activities building of the new DGA Community Center [formerly the Metropolitan Community Church] at Reagan and Brown, starting at 7:30 p.m. A number of important issues will be raised. For instance, should the team name be changed to make it more representative? Not everyone on Team Dallas is from Dallas.

Johnson went on to report to TWT SPORTS that the first meeting of Unity '94, the group that is responsible for Gay Games IV, was held in New York City. The response from volunteers was overwhelming. Obviously the energy created in Vancouver at Celebration '90: Gay Games III & Cultural Festival has passed on to Manhattan.

The previous tradition of holding the Games during the month of August will change for 1994. The Games will be staged during late June and early July [June 25-July 4, 1994] to coincide with a giant Gay Pride Parade to commemorate the 25th anniversary of the Stonewall Riots.

Unity '94 organizers expect nearly 15,000 athletes and 200,000 spectators to attend the Games. At the same time, Heritage of Pride, the group organizing the parade, expects close to one million people to attend that celebration. It should be a gay summer in New York City in 1994.

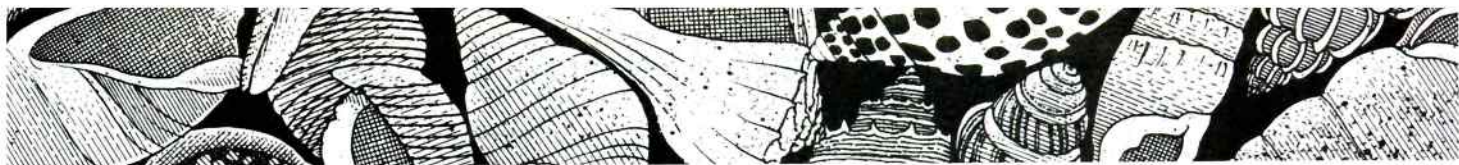

MERMAIDS

Reviewed by Bob Dineen

If, like me, you waited with unbridled anticipation for Michael Douglas to tear open the envelope naming Cher Best Actress for her performance in *Moonstruck*, then it's a pretty safe bet that you've been literally biting your nails in exuberant expectation of the release of the vehicle which brings the statuesque beauty once again to the big screen, *Mermaids*. In fact, wasn't that you I saw, standing in line at 10 a.m., waiting for the box office to open so that you could say that you were the first one on your block to see the film?

And who could blame you? With visions of Cher, dressed as a mermaid, occupying your cranial lobes, and the thought of Michael Schoeffling, he of *Longtime Companion* fame, in living color, 20 feet tall in front of you, well, my dears, of course you were dying to see it.

And, for the one or two of you who have not seen the film yet, to both of you I say—go see it! Not because this film will win any more awards for Cher, and not because it is the kind of cinema which per-

forms life-altering miracles on the audience. Simply, see it because of Cher, and because it is a lighthearted, whimsical and, oh okay, sometimes thought-provoking bit of movie magic.

The story is simple and, even though it's all happened before, timely. The age-old conflict between mother and daughter is explored yet again, with the added beauty of Cher in the mother's role. Her performance is restrained, offering her fellow cast members the opportunity to shine and demonstrate their considerable talents. As Mrs. Flax, the "town slut," she provides the catalyst for all the growth, emotion and action the other characters experience. And, while she never dominates any scene, her presence is always felt.

Not so with Wynona Ryder. As Charlotte Flax, she commands attention throughout the film, whether she is sitting calmly at the dinner table, or parading around town in a blatant parody of her mother. Her growth process becomes not just an obvious result of her experience, but a brilliant acting tour de force as well. In spite of her youth and somewhat limited credentials, she is, and will continue to be,

a major force in the thespian world.

Bob Hoskins of *Roger Rabbit* fame provides a lighthearted romantic interest for Cher who, like Cher, does not dominate the screen, but is never far from the audience's mind, or from the characters whose life he influences.

In supporting roles are Christine Ricci as Kate, Charlotte's sister and, therefore (you guessed it!), Cher's second daughter, who, in a scene reminiscent of *Mildred Pierce* almost 45 years ago, offers a Camille-like performance worthy of note; and the aforementioned Michael Schoeffling, who first garnered attention for his role in *Longtime Companion*. As in that film, his smoldering good looks and bedroom eyes captured my attention, as well as the attention of every living person in the theater.

Richard Benjamin's directorial career is long and varied. With *Mermaids*, he gives us yet another glimpse of the work he is capable of, and proves that, as a director, he is learning his craft well, with obvious improvement in his skill. And, while *Mermaids* is unlikely to capture the attention that other holiday offerings will this year, it still ranks pic-Cher perfect!
