MAXEY SEEKS HOUSE SEAT

LGRL Lobbyist to Run for House Seat Vacated by Guerrero.

AUSTIN — Glen Maxey, director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, has announced his candidacy for the House seat being vacated by Lena Guerrero, D-Austin, stating, "This race is not about a gay candidate."

Maxey is the first candidate to announce formally that he will seek election in the District 51 House race. TWT NEWS has learned that numerous other politicians are expressing an interest in the race, including Bettie Naylor, lobbyist for the Bar Owners and Associates of Texas, who has appointed a campaign treasurer.

Guerrero is Governor-elect Ann Richards' choice to fill the vacancy on the powerful Texas Railroad Commission, and feminists across the state have applauded Richards' selection. The nomination of



Guerrero to the commission creates the need for a special election.

Current governor Bill Clements has eight days to accept Guerrero's letter declining her House seat. He then has 20 days to schedule the election to fill it. State law requires that such an election be held on a Tuesday or a Saturday, and that the election must take place 21 to 45 days after it is ordered. The most likely month for the election is February, creating an abbreviated campaign.

Political consultants indicate that this election is going to pit one or more Anglo candidates against a large field of Hispanics. District 51 is made up of approximately 38 percent Hispanics, eight percent blacks and 54 percent Anglo. Maxey is hoping that ethnicity and sexual preference will not become major campaign issues.

One Austin political consultant predicted that Maxey's opponents would find it self-destructive to make sexual preference a major issue in this race. Maxey has proven himself to be a moderate force during the 1987-89 legislative sessions concerning AIDS issues.

Maxey worked diligently on behalf of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas. While some gays dressed in skeleton costumes and stood on Capitol stairways during the 1989 session to dramatize the need for increased funding for AIDS, Maxey testified before legislative committees or talked directly to members.

SAAF FILES COMPLAINT ON MORTUARY CHARGES

Several San Antonio Mortuaries Charge Extra to Handle HIV-Related Cases.

AIDS Foundation [SAAF] is filing a complaint with the Texas Division of Consumer Affairs about discrimination against PWAs at several San Antonio mortuaries after some of SAAF's clients or the families of clients complained about discrimination. Those making the complaints claim that they were presented with additional charges based solely on the fact that the cause of death of the deceased in each case was AIDS. After hearing these complaints, SAAF initiated a investigation into this matter.

SAAF contracted 30 San Antonio mortuaries and asked what the charge was for a direct cremation. SAAF then stated that the deceased had died of AIDS and asked if there would be any additional charges. Four of the 30 mortuaries replied that there were additional charges for AIDS cases. The mortuaries of Carter-Taylor-Williams, Collins Mortuary, Rodriguez ME Funeral Home and Southside Funeral Home all indicated there would be an additional fee for cremations. In fact, Collins Mortuary advertises in the Yellow Pages for AIDS cases. The additional "AIDS" charges by these mortuaries range from \$75 to \$250.

It appears that there is no reason for these additional "AIDS" charges but simple discrimination. With the complaint filed with the Texas Division of Consumer Affairs, SAAF is working to correct the discrimination against people with AIDS, both living and deceased.

GAY EVENTS FOR INAUGURATION

AUSTIN — Longtime Lesbian/Gay Rights lobbyist Glen Maxey has informed TWT NEWS that the Austin Lesbian/Gay Political Caucus and the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby will host a hospitality suite at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in downtown Austin on Monday evening, January 14, directly following the "Texas Our Texas" gala.

will be available at the information desk in the lobby of the hotel.

The People's March up Congress Avenue will begin at 10 a.m. Tuesday, January 15. Governor-elect Ann Richards will lead the marchers to the steps of the State Capitol where she will be sworn in as Governor of Texas.

Gay organizations wishing to walk together will be meeting at the corner of Riverside and South 1st Street, right next to the Palmer Auditorium sign between the hours of 9 and 9:30 a.m., the morning of the march. Groups having flags or banners are encouraged to bring them as a locating device.

Inauguration officials anticipate 10,000-20,000 participants, depending on the weather.

SAAF FILES CIVIL RIGHTS COMPLAINT

Foundation Goes to Bat for Client Dismissed from Job Program After Testing HIV Positive.

SAN ANTONIO — The San Antonio AIDS Foundation [SAAF] has filed a civil rights complaint with the Department of Health and Human Services against the McKinney Job Corps Center near Dallas.

In what foundation president Papa Bear says is "utter stupidity on the part of administrators," a client was dismissed from the training program after testing positive for the HIV virus. In addition to the dismissal, the client was given a one-way ticket to San Antonio and a copy of the positive lab report.

The dismissal letter also directed the client to contact Papa Bear at SAAF, who would assist him with job referrals and medical assistance.

A civil rights complaint was filed shortly after the client's arrival at the foundation, and asks that the client be reinstated in the Job Corps program, reimbursed financially for pain and suffering and that those personnel involved be disciplined.

The McKinney Job Corps handbook promises "medical, dental and family planning services" and "equal opportunity without regard to race, religion, color, sex, age, national origin or handicap."

The dismissal letter, signed by Vivian Duren, the center's health services administrator, stated, "With the center physician and the mental health consultant, we are granting you a medical termination from the McKinney Job Corps Center." It concluded by stating, "Job Corps does not assume responsibility for medical expenses or any other expenses after your termination. If we may be of further assistance, please notify me."

The McKinney Job Corps Center is a resident program established during President Lyndon B. Johnson's administration to strengthen basic educational skills and provide vocational training for unemployed young men between the ages of 16 and 22.

AFH BEGINS RIDES FOR PWAS

Foundation Goes to Bat for Client Dismissed from Job Program After Testing HIV Positive.

HOUSTON — The AIDS Foundation Houston [AFH] has begun their new transportation program for PWAs and PWARCs. Those who qualify can receive Metro bus passes, bus tokens or round-trip taxi rides to medical or entitlement programs through AFH's Department of Social Services.

To be eligible for the bus services, an individual must be a client of AFH, provide documentation of income of less than \$390 per month on file at AFH, have a Metro reduced fare card and reside within the Metro service area.

To be eligible for taxi rides, limited to two round-trips per month, an individual

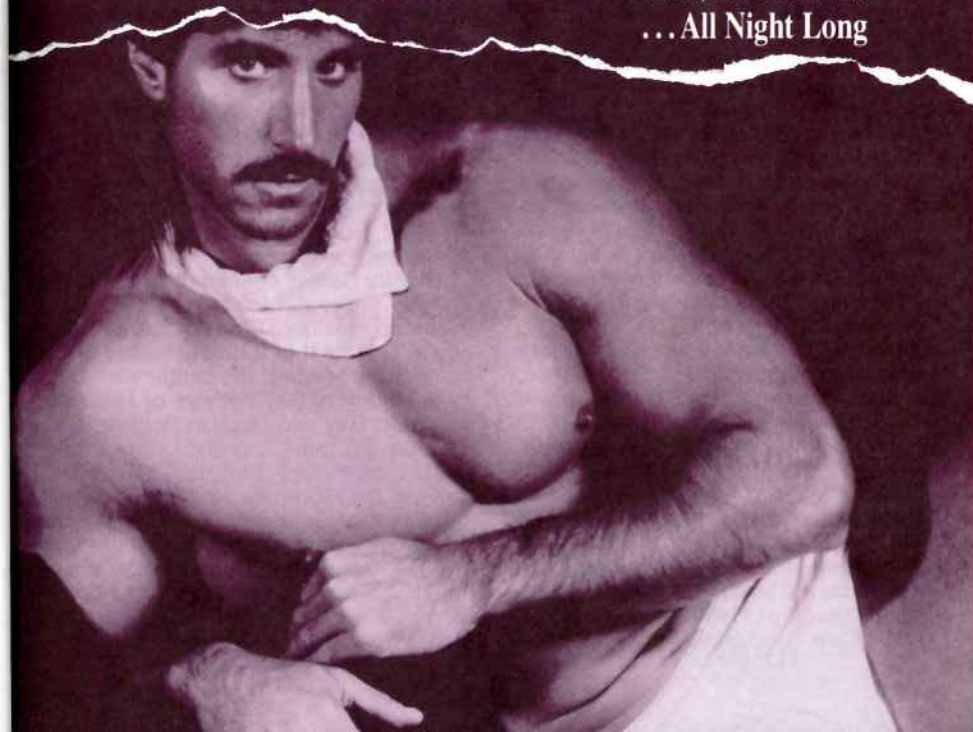

must be an AFH client, provide documentation of income of less than \$390 per month on file at AFH, have an address outside the metro service area and be traveling to a medical or entitlement program appointment.

This program is funded through a grant from money raised at the Houston Heartstrings program by DIFFA, the Design Industries Foundation for AIDS. The DIFFA grant also included funds for the AFH Utility Assistance Program and the Stone Soup Food Pantry.

NORTH TEXAS GROUPS TO SPONSOR BUDDY TRAINING

Dallas Area Buddy Projects Need Volunteers.

DALLAS — Oak Lawn Community Services will sponsor a Buddy Project Training and Public AIDS Information Forum January 18 through 20.

The Buddy Project places volunteers who work with PWAs to provide emotional and physical support. This has been an ongoing project of OLCS since 1983. As the agency caseload continues to increase, the need for volunteers to become buddies also increases.

Continuing education credits are available for this training from El Centro College. Topics include basic and advanced AIDS education, up-to-date treatment information, physical and emotional needs of PWAs, psychosocial issues, substance abuse education and resources available to PWAs and their caregivers.

The training and education program, which is free, is open to anyone who wants to learn more about AIDS and HIV issues, and lunch is provided on Saturday. It will be held at Grace Fellowship Church, 5029 Lemmon Avenue in Dallas. For information, call Tom Gibson at (214)520-8108.

In a related story, TWT NEWS has learned that the AIDS Interfaith Network, Inc. of North Texas will sponsor a Care Team training seminar on Saturday, January 13. The seminar will be conducted at the First Baptist Church of Plano.

AIN's Care Team project organizes vol-

unteers into groups of eight to 15 people to provide respite care in the home for PWAs.

Participants in the training session are asked to bring a sack lunch. AIN will provide all other materials. For further information, call Rev. Robert Hensley at (214) 358-4724.

DIGNITY/HOUSTON MEETS AT PALACE

Gay Groups in Search of New Permanent Home After Dignity Center Closes.

HOUSTON — With Dignity Center closing permanently on December 31, Dignity/Houston has temporarily moved its weekly liturgy to the Montrose Palace, 1505 Nevada at Commonwealth.

"We regret that Dignity Center will no longer be available as a meeting place for Houston's gay and lesbian organizations," Dignity President Michael Kaney told TWT NEWS. "Our current tenants—Houston Mission Church, Gay and Lesbian Hispanics Unidos [GLHU] and Houston Women's Softball League—will have to find a new home, just as we will."

Recurring problems at the center and a disagreement with the landlord about the leasing arrangements prompted the move, Kaney said.

Dignity/Houston, an organization for gay and lesbian Catholics and their friends, celebrated its first liturgy in the temporary new location recently. Until a permanent location is found, Dignity plans to meet every Saturday evening at the Montrose Palace.

Dignity Center opened at 3217 Fannin in 1985 under the leadership of Dignity/Houston President Stan Ford. Among the organizations that formerly leased office or meeting space at the center were Couples Houston, Gay Fathers of Houston, Houston Gay and Lesbian Political Caucus, Gay Mothers, Gay and Lesbian Pride Week Committee, Montrose Activity Center and the Montrose Symphonic Band.

TWT NEWS spoke with Ron Davis of the Montrose Palace. Davis said that the facility was "a perfect place for organizational meetings, benefit shows, private receptions and a host of other events that are liquor-free social activities."

QUEER NATION COMES TO TEXAS

*Tribes Organizing in
Several Cities Across State.*

TEXAS — Queer Nation, a gay activist group with chapters, or "tribes" across the nation, is now organizing in Austin, Dallas and Houston.

The Austin chapter of Queer Nation/ Republic of Texas has scheduled its first meeting for Saturday, January 12 at 7 p.m. Austin tribe organizer Thom Prentice told TWT NEWS that the group will establish goals, plan direct action and organize promotion of local chapters throughout Texas.

"The focus is to introduce Queer Nation and individuals to the dominant culture and media with as many provocative local events, protests and invisibilities as we can possibly arrange," Prentice said.

The tribe will explore ways to support the legislative agenda of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby during the 1991 legislative session. The group will also explore "direct action" ideas used elsewhere in the country.

Other Queer Nation chapters have

staged such activities as kiss-ins at various county clerks' offices and heterosexual clubs, and outreach to homophobic churches.

Prentice says, "The first direct action everybody can do is to hold hands in public with your lover, boyfriend, girlfriend or date to increase gay visibility."

Houston has also formed a chapter of Queer Nation according to David Fowler, who organized the tribe. "I feel we need to keep up with other major cities that have chapters. We will be announcing our first meeting in the near future."

"Queer Nation is a group of people helping to sensitize the heterosexual community about homosexuals. We will deal with homophobia and gay and lesbian rights as well as the AIDS issue, since that's not being done in Houston at this time," stated Fowler.

Fowler concedes that the name may make many uncomfortable. "Any discomfort pales in comparison with the fears most gays and lesbians have about being 'discovered' by their neighbors and employers," he said. Queer Nation wants to "unapologetically" announce the gay and lesbian presence in Houston.

Dallas organizer Bill Travis told Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS, "Queer Nation will be in your face. The idea is to create visibility, to get the gay people out in the community. We don't have horns or scoop up children. We're here, we're queer and we are here to stay," he said.

"The acronyms we use are designed to be humorous," Travis added. "L.A.B.I.A. [Lesbians and Bisexuals in Action], M.A.L.E. [Men Assisting Lesbian Empowerment] and Project S.H.O.P. [Suburban Homosexual Outreach Project] are some examples of this type of humor."

Travis also said that an upcoming project is aimed at corporations and organizations which make the world safe for queer bashers, emphasizing that there will be no more "Business as Usual." The project is called D.O.R.I.S. S.Q.U.A.S.H., for "Defending Our Rights in the Streets, Super Queers United Against Savage Heterosexism."

UNDERSTANDING ANTIVIRAL THERAPY

by Dr. Richard M. Olson, D.O. of Dallas

The previous articles that I have written discussed the future of antiviral therapy and the need for early identification of HIV status to benefit from early treatment. What was predicted has come to be: that AIDS need not mean the end of a terminal disease, but the ability to manage it in an effective manner so that a person remains a productive member of society and is able to function in life in a much more positive manner.

When the drug Retrovir (formally known as AZT) came on the market in 1987, little was known about the long-term effectiveness or side effects of the drug. What we have learned over the past several years is that too much was given too late for most patients infected with HIV. The criteria for prescribing the drug, basically that one be symptomatic with a T-4 count of 200 or lower, were far from making the most beneficial use of the drug. Most physicians who were comfortable with prescribing AZT started experimenting with dosage and criteria for initiating the drug earlier after the prescription requirements were lowered in September of 1987. What we all discovered was brought out in the 016 and 019 studies that were released at the end of August 1989. Early intervention with low dose AZT slowed or halted progression of the disease.

These studies will lead to major changes in patient and physician attitudes toward HIV testing, T-cell monitoring and treatment of HIV infection in all stages. I could spend pages on the implications of

these studies. The bottom line is that anyone who is HIV positive with a T-4 count less than 500, symptomatic or asymptomatic, needs to be on AZT. I understand the difficulty of accepting that one is unhealthy in the absence of any symptoms. But with lab work that has become so sophisticated, we now can predict the future so accurately it is often frightening.

Another significant fact that has come out of these studies is the lack of side effects that occur with low AZT dosing when it is done early. Virtually 95% of the HIV-positive population can tolerate AZT with little or no side effects. I know all the horror stories, as I have seen them all, but times have changed as we have learned through experience.

I am also very aware of the argument that AZT loses its effectiveness after 18 to 24 months. However, starting someone on AZT now will prolong the progression of disease in a great number of cases. This will buy time and allow other drugs or combinations of drugs to be developed and studied to treat the illness. There are some drugs already being tested that hold promise in both the treatment of HIV disease and prevention of opportunistic illnesses.

The message remains the same: early identification of your HIV status makes a much more pleasant and manageable illness that holds fewer surprises. The current thinking is that the incubation period from exposure to symptomatic illness can be as long as nine to ten years, so be tested now.

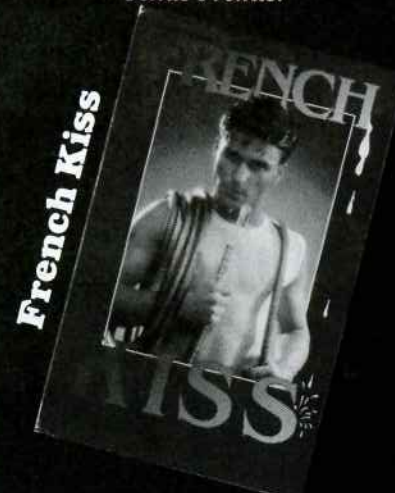

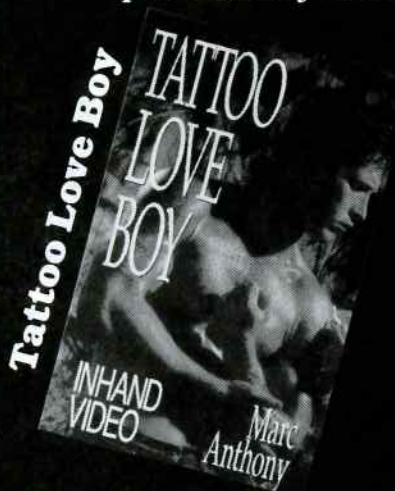

Peer Counseling Groups

Dear TWT:

In response to Shane MacIntyre's letter published in TWT COMMENT [December 28, 1990-January 3, 1991], Body Positive/Houston has in the past conducted afternoon peer counseling groups. Our peer counseling program consists of 12 people meeting in a group session once a week for ten weeks. The meetings are closed and confidential. Each group is led by two HIV-positive facilitators who are trained and supervised by a psycho-therapist. Topics discussed range from "working with your doctor" to "dealing with anxiety, depression and stress" to "healing alternatives" to "mortality issues." There is no charge for this service.

We start new groups throughout the year based on demand. If enough people (at least 10 men/women) call us at (713/524-2374) and let us know they are interested in daytime sessions, we will schedule enough sessions to meet demand. Our office hours are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday-Friday.

More Ceverha Feedback

The following letter, a copy of which was provided to TWT COMMENT, was sent to Judge Lee Jackson of the Dallas County Commissioners Court concerning the recent appointment of Bill Ceverha to the Dallas County HIV Health Services Planning Council.—Publisher

Dear Judge Jackson:

We are appalled by your appointment of Bill Ceverha to the Dallas County HIV Health Services Planning Council. *It is in direct contrast to the spirit of the Ryan White Comprehensive AIDS Resources Emergency Act of 1990.* Mr. Ceverha is a well-known bigot and admits that he

believes that too much money has already been devoted to the AIDS epidemic.

You may think that his hatred of gays and lesbians is not of issue here, and he may say that himself, but we must remind you that over 93 percent of all AIDS cases in Dallas County are still among gay and bisexual men. And someone who publicly and openly expresses his bigotry against this affected community should not be responsible for the distribution of AIDS funding.

His appointment to this council is an *insult* to the 1,738 persons who have already died of AIDS in Dallas County. These people did not have the benefit of federal, county or city monies for AIDS services.

His appointment is an *insult* to the 2,687 people living with AIDS in Dallas County who desperately need the research and services that would be made available under this emergency law.

His appointment is an *insult* to the thousands of HIV-infected people who are expected to come down with AIDS in the next few years. The very same years that this panel will be making crucial funding decisions that will affect their lives.

For ten years, our pleas for the funding of community-based organizations have gone unheard in the state, county and city governments, and finally, in our desperate hour, the U.S. Congress has, in effect, declared Dallas County a disaster area.

And Mr. Ceverha believes that too much has already been done?

While in the Texas Legislature, Mr. Ceverha took it upon himself to personally crusade against all legislation to end discrimination against the gay and lesbian citizens of Texas. This included vital AIDS funding that was obstructed because the groups leading the fight were community-based gay and lesbian organizations. The gay and lesbian citizens of Dallas were fighting this disease when no one else would help, not even our government.

Our concern is that Mr. Ceverha will use this council as a public forum to continue his hatred and bigotry against the gay and





Johnson, regional manager of Sweeney's Jewelry, concerning an incident which took place in one of Sweeney's Houston stores. TWT COMMENT also solicited a response from Sweeney's Jewelry, but had received no reply as we went to press.—Publisher

Dear Mr. Johnson:

I have been a customer at the Sweeney's Jewelry located at 450 Town and Country Village for a short while. I have particularly enjoyed shopping at this store because of the excellent service I have received in the past by various salespeople.

On Saturday, December 15, I went to this Sweeney's to do some Christmas shopping. I was accompanied by my girlfriend, as she was to be the recipient of the gifts and I needed to get her opinion on the various items I had selected for her.

Upon arriving, we noticed our favorite salesperson was helping other customers, and because she was our particular favorite, we opted to wait for her rather than be helped by someone else. While we were waiting, we were approached by the manager of that store, a rather elderly gentleman that we had met on previous visits. In the past, he had always been tolerable.

On this occasion, however, he apparently decided he did not care for having two women shopping together in his store, and he let us know of this by walking by us and informing my friend that she had better make her decisions carefully. Not knowing what he meant by this rather cryptic comment, we just looked at each other and shrugged.

He then walked all the way across the store and began talking to another employee. At the top of his voice, he began to discuss us and our "unwise choices" and how we must not realize "that I have customers in my store." He went on to say that "if they want to play that game, they can do it outside of my store."

We chose to disregard these statements for the moment, as we were not doing anything to offend others in the first place. After we were waited on by an extremely embarrassed salesperson, and were almost ready to leave, the manager approached me and asked me if I had been "all fixed up."

At this point, I was so enraged by the entire situation that I chose not to answer.

I knew that if I even tried to speak, I would definitely say something that would warrant being asked to leave. He then responded, "it doesn't really matter, it's only money anyway." I understood this to mean that he didn't care if I spent my money in his store or not.

I realize that this gentleman is extremely old and is from another generation, but this does not mean that he should be allowed to treat customers like dirt if he doesn't approve of them. We were not engaging in any inappropriate behaviors and we certainly did not deserve such public humiliation in a store crowded with customers. We chose not to leave the premises mainly because that is what he wanted us to do, and I refused to be inconvenienced by this man and his attitude and also because we didn't want to punish our saleswoman for this man's rudeness.

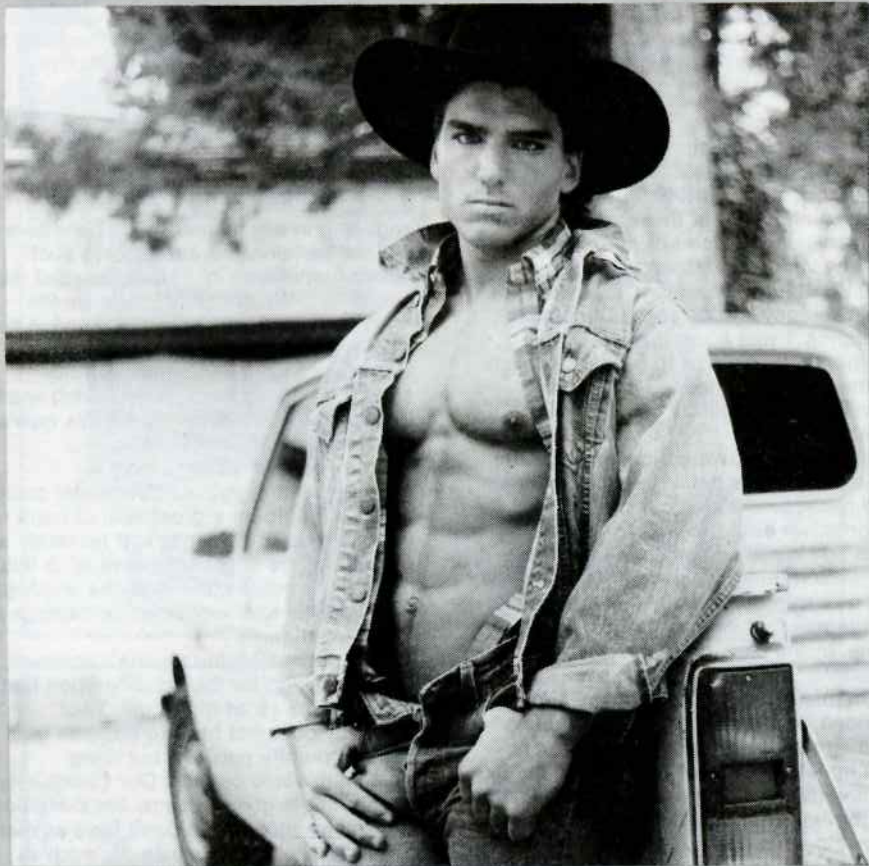
I truly believe that this man is misrepresenting your company and could be responsible for a great deal of harm to the business of Sweeney's. If he treats all people that he doesn't approve of in this manner, he could quite likely be limiting his business to a very small percentage of the population.

I am not asking for anyone's approval, I am just asking for the consideration that is due to me as an individual. Your company does not have to endorse the gay community publicly, but equal treatment would be nice. Our community is one that is good to show consideration to because most of us don't have as many expenses as heterosexuals do, such as supporting families, and that allows us to spend more as consumers. My friend and I will be in the market for wedding bands to commemorate our union and we did have sets chosen at the Sweeney's in Town and Country Village. We are now reconsidering our choice and are trying to determine if we really want to spend over \$2,000 to support a store that was responsible for publicly humiliating us.

I appreciate your attention to this incident and if no reply is forthcoming, I assume that your attitude is the same as that of the manager in question. This most certainly will assist us in determining if we, and our friends, should take our business elsewhere where it would be appreciated. Thank you.

OTWELL ATTACKS GAYS AND THE 21.06 RULING

The enemy is already on the march, protesting our new legality: Pastor W.N. Otwell of Fort Worth is spearheading a campaign against the overturning of 21.06. On Monday, January 7, as the 72nd Texas Legislature was about to convene, the conservative minister led a small group of demonstrators to the state Capitol to demand that lawmakers retain prohibitions against gay sex, saying, "Leave the law alone!" as supporters chanted, "Adam and Eve—not Adam and Steve!"

Pastor Otwell is no stranger to controversy, and obviously thrives on it. Formerly of Corpus Christi, Otwell once ran a home for troubled youths. He continually found himself in trouble with the law, as his operation couldn't pass state inspection. Local residents complained about the treatment of the children and the heavy religious indoctrination.

Otwell opposes the ruling by Judge Paul R. Davis that declared Texas Penal Code section 21.06 to be unconstitutional. He has said that he wants to warn the people of Texas about the consequences of this ruling.

Now Otwell has turned his venom toward the gay community. The following quotes come directly from a special letter faxed to TWT as well as to other gay organizations, directly from Otwell's office. It appears he wants to confront us.

"We are no stranger to Judge Paul Davis and his liberal, anti-family, anti-Christian rulings," says Otwell. "He has ruled twice against our Boy's Home ministry and actually ordered our doors to be closed and our church property sold to pay for \$97,000 in fines."

"He (Davis) was nothing but a puppet for Jim Mattox and the liberal Democrats then, and in ruling in favor of the perverted sodomites, whom God has already condemned to hell, it is evident that he will continue to be a tool in the hands of the



liberal Democrats in 1991," Otwell continued.

"He (Davis) has ruled against the traditional family, the Bible and Almighty God Himself. This will just add to the judgment God has already put on Texas with the increase of killer floods, hurricanes and tornadoes, explosions, "freak" tragedies, violent crimes, economic crashes and poverty. Texas needs to brace for yet another even stronger wave of God's judgment on this state," Otwell said in his press release.

Otwell goes on in his press release to quote many Bible passages to support his condemnation of homosexuality. Most of the quotes are from the Old Testament and pertain to Hebrew religious laws.

Interestingly, not once is there a quote in the Bible from Jesus Christ about the issue of homosexuality. If someone's sexual orientation condemns him or her, why didn't Jesus speak about it?

Otwell evidently wants to confront the issue of homosexuality. He faxed his press release to gay organizations on January 4. At the close of the letter it says, "Copies of this release are being sent to the gay community."

In his letter, Otwell includes his address prominently on the letterhead. Members of the gay and lesbian community must let Pastor Otwell know how we feel. He has stated how he feels. Now it is your turn. TWT encourages readers to sit down and write him, intelligently and with a clear head, explaining to him how you feel about his thinking.

Otwell needs to be told that we will not let his intolerance and prejudice grow and spread like the ugly cancer that it is. It must be stopped now. We must learn to live together, through cooperation and understanding.

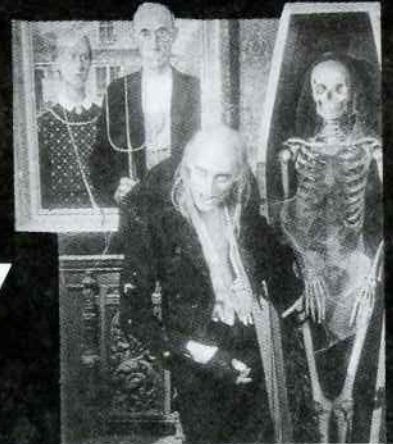

Carlton David Woodring (David) (above) of New Mexico died on Saturday, December 8, 1990, after living with AIDS since November, 1987. His death is a significant loss to all those who live with HIV disease, to those who participate in HIV service, education, advocacy and to his many friends. David was actively involved in every aspect of HIV education, prevention, advocacy and service programs. His initial experience with the HIV pandemic occurred in Houston, Texas in 1981.

Following David's HIV positive diagnosis in 1985, he served as a caregiver to people living with HIV in Houston and while there lost many friends. He moved to Albuquerque in 1988 and began his significant contributions toward public awareness of HIV and service to those who struggled to live with it. He demonstrated active concern and compassion for everyone, especially children and adolescents.

Born in Oklahoma, David was proud of holding membership in the Osage Tribe. He collaborated with 12 American Indian teenagers to create a video tape, "David's Song," that provided HIV education to Native American adolescents. His concern led him to active participation in HIV organizations both in New Mexico and on a national level. In 1988 he served as Co-chair of the National Association of People With AIDS, was President of the Board of the New Mexico Association of People Living With AIDS, and until his death was a member of the New Mexico AIDS Task Force. In 1989 David was Treasurer of the Board of the National Native American AIDS Prevention Center, served on the Executive Planning Committee for the National Conference on HIV Infection and AIDS among Racial Ethnic Populations and from September 1989 to September 1990 was President of the Board of Directors of New Mexico AIDS Services.

During these years David tirelessly made public education presentations nationwide and throughout New Mexico with concerned emphasis on the state's youth and multi-cultural population.

David wished donations to go to the David Woodring Memorial Fund in support of children living with AIDS, NMAS, 124 Quincy NE, Albuquerque 87108.

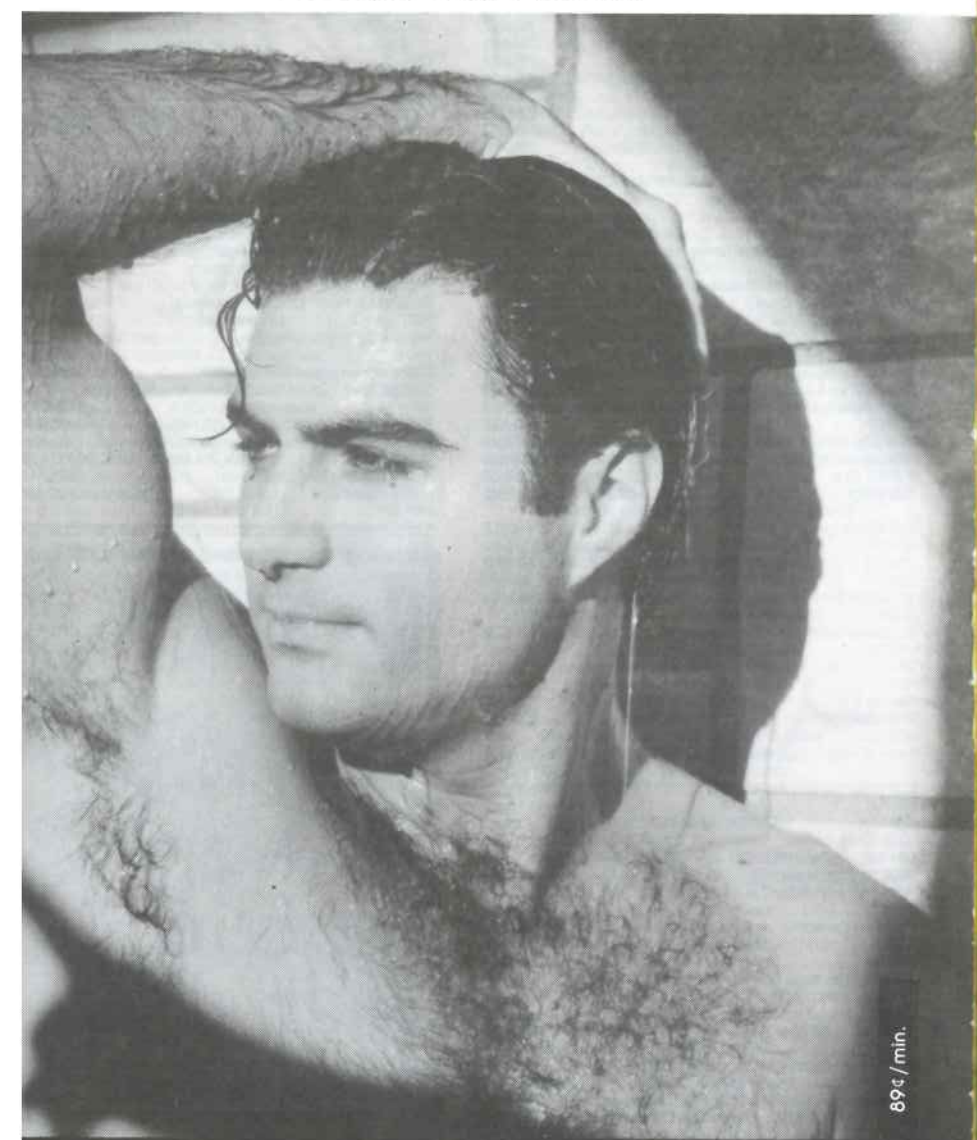

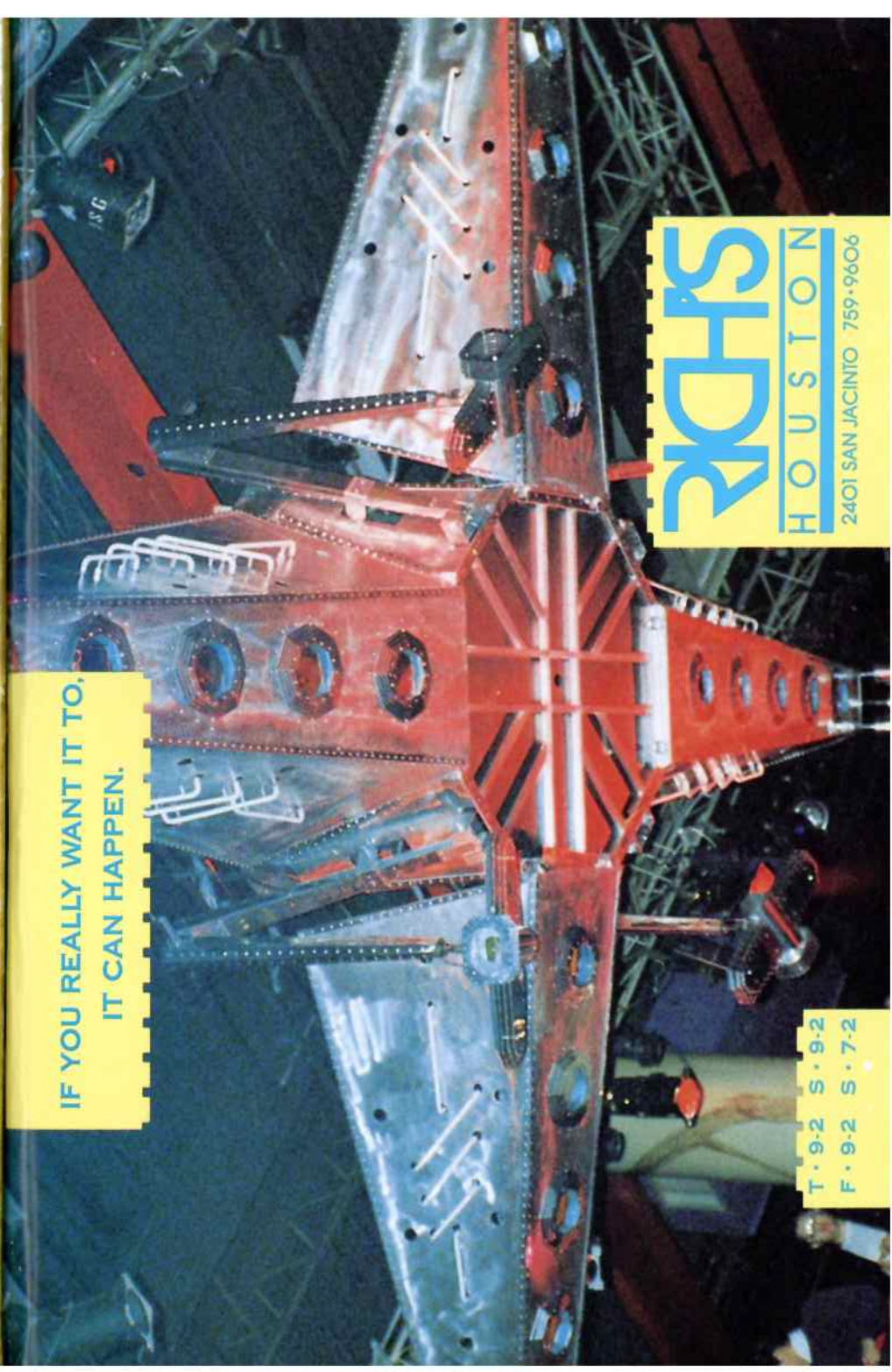

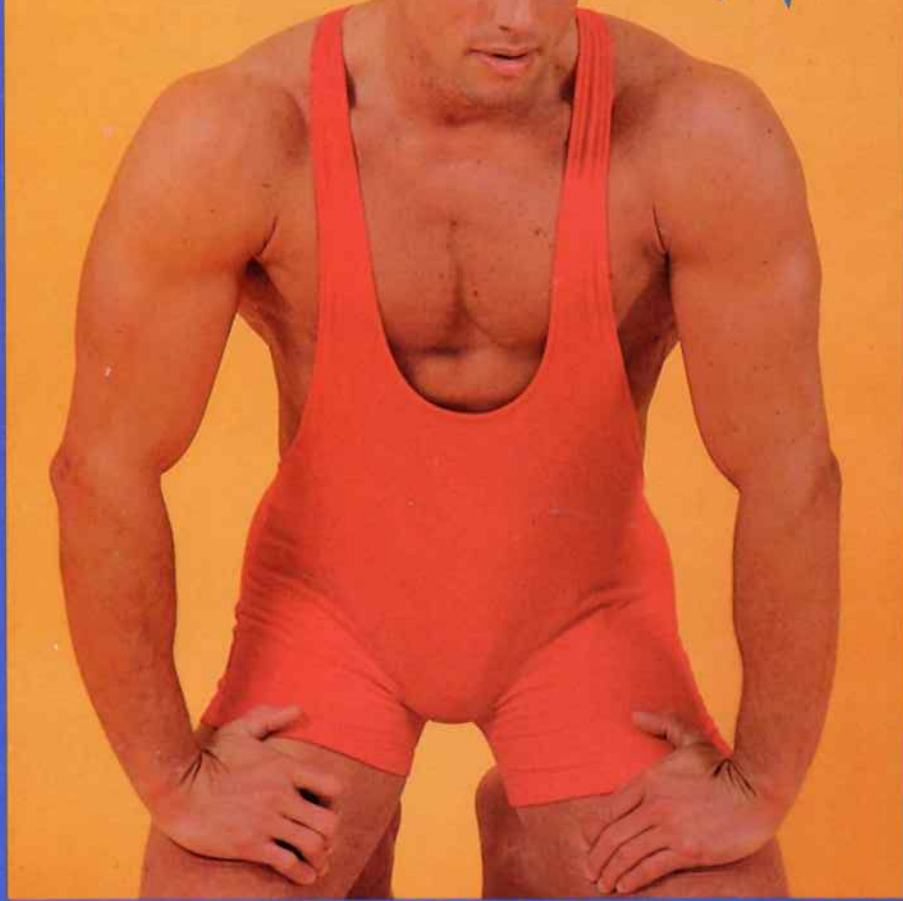
