DALLAS GAY PASTOR ARRESTED

Piazza of MCC Jailed for Interfering, Police Say; Testifies at Council Meeting.

DALLAS — Michael Piazza, senior pastor of the Metropolitan Community Church of Dallas, found himself in a strange situation Sunday night, January 6. While trying to determine why police officers had come onto his church's property, he found himself being arrested for interfering.

"We were about to begin our evening service," Piazza told Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS. "I noticed police car lights flashing through the windows of our sanctuary, so I asked our Associate Pastor Carol West what was going on. When she came back, Carol told me that the police had shone a flashlight right in her eyes and angrily told her to go back inside."

When Piazza went outside, the officers told him that it was none of his business and that they were on public property. Piazza said that the police had followed a car onto the church parking lot for an expired license tag. The car contained two



regular members of the MCC who were coming for evening services.

"I was told to go back inside or get arrested," Piazza said. The next thing he knew, he was being handcuffed and put into the squad car.

One of the arresting officers told Piazza that he would understand the situation if this were happening in South Dallas. The peculiar thing is that the other officer, who ticketed the woman for the expired tag, said virtually the same thing to her. The two officers didn't hear each other, Piazza explained, which led him to question whether the police department had a different policy for handling people in different parts of the city.

"You could tell the officers were not from this area," Piazza said. "There was no rational reason for their reaction. I've worked in a psychiatric ward before, and the female officer's level of anger was dangerous."

Piazza will face trial on January 29, if the city feels there is a sufficient case. The charge is a Class B misdemeanor, which could carry a six-month jail term and/or a \$1,000 fine for interfering with police procedures. Piazza said that his attorney, Mike Aranson, had indicated that interference must be more than verbal in nature to be considered interference.

Piazza, Dallas Gay Alliance president Bruce Monroe and Carol West attended the city council meeting on Wednesday, where they reiterated three main issues.

"We stressed that the police need to stop their discrimination in hiring gays and lesbians," Piazza said. "That gay people, not straight people, teach the sensitivity training classes to the police recruits and that the new police chief be responsive to the gay and lesbian community."

The Assistant City Manager, A.C. Gonzalez, asked Piazza what the city could do to improve relations between the gay community and the Dallas Police Department. Piazza stressed the need for the sensitivity training of new officers to be conducted by gays and lesbians. Gonzalez responded that every minority would then want the

same thing, and that this would open a "whole can of worms." Piazza answered that all the other minorities were represented in sensitivity training, whether Hispanic, black or female. "Gays are not represented, but that is not our fault," Piazza said, referring to the discriminatory practice of not hiring openly gay and lesbian applicants.

"The police created this situation [lack of sensitivity training]," Piazza said. "Then they asked us what they could do to fix it. I think our point was well made."

HOUSTON BAKERY CHOSEN FOR CAKE

Acadian Bakers Create Cake For Inaugural Brunch At Governor's Mansion.

HOUSTON — The Acadian Bakers have served the Houston community for 11 years. They have become famous for their unique architectural cakes designed by Sandi Bubbert and partner Ted Sun, an engineer from Shanghai, China turned baker.

Governor Ann Richards fell in love with the Acadian signature Brownie Chocolate Mousse Cake at a Houston fund-raiser during the primary campaign last year. The cake was decorated with a picture of the state Capitol building proclaiming, "Future Home of Ann Richards." Sandi Bubbert promised the candidate, "When you win the governorship, we will build the state Capitol out of this Brownie Chocolate

Mousse Cake." Richards won the election, and Bubbert and Sun have kept their promise.

The Inaugural Committee selected the Acadian Bakers to be the official bakers for the private brunch at the Governor's mansion. The brunch, held last Monday, January 15, is a traditional event marked by the handing over of the keys to the Governor's mansion. Governor Richards and her family, former Governor Bill Clements and his family, former Lt. Governor Bill Hobby and Lt. Governor Bob Bullock and his family were in attendance.

Acadian Bakers also designed and baked the cake served to President George Bush and other world leaders attending the Economic Summit in Houston last year. A model of the state Capitol building cake is on display at the bakery, located at 604 W. Alabama in Houston.

HOUSTON GIG REACHES OUT TO BLACK GAY MEN


Over the Hill Group Holds Counseling & Testing in Street Outreach.

HOUSTON — Over the Hill, Inc. is a nonprofit community-based service organization serving the needs of a particular segment of the black community. HIV high-risk groups such as habitual drug users, bisexual males, hemophiliacs and recipients of HIV-infected blood transfusions have an impact on men in the black community as well as other ethnic groups.

The organization's Gay Interaction Group Project [Project GIG] is an HIV counseling and testing program designed to reach black gay men, through street outreach.

Brief educational sessions are held near local businesses, labor pools and homeless shelters which are frequented by the targeted population. Over the Hill's van is usually parked nearby for one-on-one educational sessions, counseling and testing. Test results may be received when the van makes a return visit to the outreach site or at the office at 3402 Dowling Street.

Persons who need clothing, housing, job training or help completing forms for federal, state or local programs are given



assistance. Jan Dedman, the project's director, says that "Project GIG is a one-stop store. The program is designed to help change personal life situations so that people can feel good about themselves."

Individuals who are HIV positive are referred to the Thomas Street Clinic for treatment, and Project GIG helps clients to complete the paperwork necessary to

prove eligibility for services.

Over the Hill also operates a home for persons who have been infected with HIV. There is a two-week waiting period for a background check prior to admission to the facility. A history of untreated drug use and criminal activity can preclude an applicant from eligibility.

The project is in need of a volunteer who has a background in psychology or sociology to act as the facilitator for a support group for black gay males who are living with HIV/AIDS. Interested parties were asked to call Jan Dedman at (713)520-9554.

H.E.L.P. HELPS AUSTIN CHILDREN

Community Responds Generously At Fund-Raiser to Build Wish List for Babies with AIDS.

AUSTIN — Rosemary Herrera and Josie McKinny of Austin have organized The H.E.L.P. [Helping Every Little Person] Group, Inc., a Texas nonprofit corporation. The sole purpose of this organization is to raise funds to assist children with AIDS and their families. Monies raised will be donated to other nonprofit agencies and organizations for distribution in the form of direct assistance to such children and their families.

Carl Botolo, manager of Alegro, hosted the first fund-raiser for H.E.L.P. on December 8. Austin's gay community responded generously with hundreds of dollars in money and much-needed items from the children's wish list. According to Botolo, the children are in need of baby food, baby wipes, disposable diapers, receiving blankets, clothing, toys, strollers and first aid items.

Presently there are 18 children known to have AIDS in the Austin area, ranging in ages from three months to 23 months. Herrera told TWT NEWS that being a single


parent with a healthy 12-year-old daughter had increased her awareness of the plight of children with AIDS. "I feel that these children [with AIDS] are being pushed aside, placed behind a closed door; we read and hear about so many other AIDS fund-raisers, but nothing about children with AIDS. I want to show my daughter and others that it is all right to volunteer; that no one should be fearful of these innocent babies who need love and affection," said Herrera.

pearance at the Summit, sponsored by radio station KLOL and Coca-Cola.

Andrew Dice Clay is not welcome here," stated Dennis Spencer, HGLPC president.

"I hoped that he would have learned his lesson from Dallas last summer, but evidently he has not." A grassroots boycott effort by human rights groups in August of 1990 resulted in the cancellation of Clay's scheduled performance in that city.

"Our recent election efforts have proven once and for all that gay-baiting and sexism do not work in Texas. We hope all concerned citizens will join us in condemning ignorance and hatred by opposing the appearance of this racist, homophobic bigot," Spencer told Brian Keever of TWT NEWS.



LGPC MONTHLY MEETING

Coalition Elects New Officers. Changes Bylaw Affecting Quorum, Discusses DPD Hiring Policy.

DALLAS - The Lesbian/Gay Political Coalition of Dallas held their monthly meeting on January 8, with special emphasis on the election of new officers. Deborah Wood was reelected as the female co-chair. Paul Rodgers became the new male co-chair, moving up from the vice-chair position. Peter Brooks vacated his male co-chair seat to become the vicechair, and Dale Hill was reelected as secretary. The only change came when David Bobbitt was elected treasurer, replacing Joe Mosley.


The bylaws were changed to require that no fewer than ten members be present to form a quorum at any given meeting. The old regulation used a percentage of the membership to establish a quorum. Since the membership is now approaching 200, that percentage could not realistically be met at each meeting.

A motion was made and discussed to ask Lori Palmer, the Oak Lawn city councilperson, about her feelings concerning the Dallas Police Department hiring policy. which discriminates against openly gay and lesbian applicants. It was suggested that this issue be raised by the board members with each member of city council.

Inclusive Community?

Dear TWT:

In the spring of 1990, I had a very rude and painful awakening. I had assumed that the 15 years that I had spent working for the civil and human rights of my lesbian sisters and gay brothers was an extension and part and parcel of my work for the transgenderal community (transvestites, female impersonators, transgenderists and transsexuals), for bisexuals and for heterosexual supporters.

I had assumed that we were all in this together. Gays and lesbians have a huge fight that anyone reading this magazine is already aware of. Heterosexual transgenderals carry the same stereotyping and prejudice plus a bit more. Even if all the legal homosexual barriers are removed, the homosexual transgenderals will still have the fight that heterosexual transgenderals currently fight. Bisexuals in a same-sex relationship are in the same boat. Bisexuals in an opposite-sex relationship carry the fear of the closet door opening with them and the prejudice when it does.

As to heterosexual supporters, just ask Ann Richards or Nikki Van Hightower or the Democratic Party at large. They are constantly being smeared with innuendoes and gay bashing.

I remembered the history of the pink triangle. The Nazis imposed the pink triangle on them.

We were certainly all in the same boat back then. I also remember the Stonewall riots, which began the modern movement to freedom.

The first March on Washington was heady stuff. But during the planning meeting held at the University of Houston in the late 70s, I had to make a really tough stand to even get the words dealing with transgenderals into the printed material. It was an uphill fight, but the language was inserted. Then it was neatly tucked away and we all marched under

the overt title and banner of only gay and lesbian rights.

The second March on Washington was the same. Overtly, we all marched only for gay and lesbian rights.

The March on Austin in 1989 was the same way. I even bought the entire back page of the program to demonstrate financial support. But overtly, we marched only for gay and lesbian rights.

At the time of the last Legislature, at least one bill was drafted to allow discrimination on the basis of gender identification (that means transgenderals) in housing. And if you read the federal handicap law that came out a few months ago, you will see that there are many categories of transgenderals specifically named and targeted for discrimination.

I asked the Houston Gay and Lesbian Political Caucus to overtly inclusify its name by adding an asterisk to the end of both its name and its initials and to include transgenderals, bisexuals and heterosexual supporters in its bylaws. Not only was the "*" soundly voted down, the bylaws change wasn't even debated.

I was told that night and I have been told since that the goal of the caucus is to gain the rights only of gays and lesbians. I have even been called "heterosexual" with the same sneer and hatred that our enemies muster up to call us queer or faggot or.

Now the March on Austin is being planned for 1991. Will it put an "*" in its name to signify the community's inclusivity? Will the planners overtly explain in each of the march's releases and all of its literature the need for and desire to have an "inclusive community" of gays, lesbians, transgenderals, bisexuals and heterosexual supporters?

Will it be the March on Austin for Lesbian and Gay Rights*? Or will it be the March on Austin for the Rights of the Inclusive Community? Or will it be the March on Austin to Resist Sexual and Genderal Bigotry? Or will it be some other overt name that includes us all?

If not, count me out!







AWAKENINGS

So when I learned that Robert De Niro and Robin Williams would be appearing together in *Awakenings*, I had my doubts.

My concerns were compounded by the fact that Penny Marshall was directing the work; while Marshall does show promise (Big), I felt she couldn't be of the same caliber as Arthur Penn (who had directed marvelous films like Bonnie and Clyde, Little Big Man and Night Moves before bombing with The Missouri Breaks) or even Beatty (who had succeeded with Heaven Can Wait and Reds prior to flopping with Ishtar).

My suspicions couldn't have been more wrong. Awakenings is an incredible movie that stirs emotional nerves.

The movie, which is based on a true story, is about Dr. Malcolm Sayer (Williams), who arrives at Bainbridge Hospital in the Bronx to be interviewed for a research position in the hospital's neurology


lab. At least, that's what he thinks.


It turns out that the hospital is looking for someone to work with chronically ill patients. Sayer meekly protests that his experience is confined to research and he lacks the expertise to deal with "live" patients.

The interviewing staff, led by Dr. Kaufman (John Heard), brushes aside his objections, stating that his medical school work with patients will more than suffice. Besides, who can say just how "live" these patients really are.

Sayer thus finds himself assigned to caring for neurological patients, all of whom exist, to varying degrees, in catatonic states.

When Sayer notices small reactions by his charges to outside stimuli, he becomes captivated by the possibility that these people are still mentally cognizant, that they're alive inside, and he becomes









increasingly tied to them. In particular, he develops an attachment to Leonard Lowe (De Niro).

Leonard's condition is severe. Unable to move or speak and observing everything with a blank stare, he draws special attention. Saver meets Leonard's mother, Mrs. Lowe (Ruth Nelson), and learns more about his patient's illness. He discovers that during childhood, Leonard began to have trouble controlling the muscles in his lower arms and hands. Later he fell victim to the sleeping sickness epidemic that struck much of the world in the 1920s and his mother brought him to Bainbridge. Through further investigation of old medical files, Sayer discovers that all of his patients have that common denominator in their case histories: they are all postencephalitic, survivors of that sleeping sickness epidemic.

He persuades the chief staff members of the hospital to permit him to use an experimental new drug, L-dopa, that is being used to treat people with Parkinson's disease.

The drug is used first on Leonard, and the results are miraculous. Sayer and his staff, including his nurse, Eleanor Costello (Julie Kavner), are overjoyed. The treatment is applied to the other patients and the ensuing emotional upheaval is a truly wondrous sight.

Personalities long dormant are reawakened in a human spectacle of rebirth, and on the screen the moment is inspiring.

Awakenings is a film of tremendous impact with all the right ingredients. Williams and De Niro are both superb. Williams solidly affirms his ability in strong dramatic roles. Unlike his role in Dead Poet's Society, which, although a drama, made wide use of his comedic talents, his work in Awakenings has no comic qualities. It is a straight dramatic role, and Williams delivers a tour de force performance.

De Niro proves, yet again, that his talent as an actor is limitless. As a man who emerges from a cocoon after a lifetime, he beautifully captures the wonderment, the appreciation and, ultimately, the frustration of someone stretching his mind and body after decades of sleep.

Penny Marshall has triumphed in her first dramatic directorial outing. She has evoked two of the best performances of the year from two of the best actors in Hollywood.

Awakenings is extraordinary. It more than fits the trite label "must see."





Horse Crazy, by Gary Indiana; fiction, 218 pp.; Penguin Books, 375 Hudson Street, New York, NY 10014; softcover, \$8.95

don't know about you, but I just love a good self-help book. Anytime that I can read some author's opinions extolling the virtues of a new hairstyle as a method to

inner peace, I feel that I have come a long way in perfecting this lifetime, thereby making the transition to the next plane easier. The problem that I have is that so many self-help books need their own special brand of dictionary to explain some of the words that we are accused of being.

As a result, I find that I am able to comprehend more, and, therefore, assimilate more, if I choose books of a more narrative nature. For example, when I was in the ear-

ly days of my search for higher consciousness, one of my favorite books, because of its narrative style, was Shirley MacLaine's *Out on a Limb*. Here was a book that provided answers to a multitude of questions about my search, but did it on a personal, familiar level—almost like the fairy tales (I promise, no pun was intended!) that my mother used to tell me. It made my search easier.

Well, imagine my delight when I picked up Gary Indiana's new book, Horse Crazy. Here, my friends, was the book that I have been waiting for for years. It tells all about relationships and, in the same narrative form, how not to have one! In journal-like and Jungian therapy session-like form, Mr. Indiana presents a relationship so real, so

vivid and, regrettably, so close to home, that one cannot read this book and not know which direction he or she must take in the course of his or her search for the perfect mate.

The hero/victim of this story is a delightful man who, like myself, happens to be a writer. Like many of us, he lives constantly in the shadow of death, residing in the greatly diminished gay population of the Village in New York. Every day, he hears news of yet another loss and wonders, as do we all, whether he slept with that person or whether someone he slept with slept with that person or...well, you get the drift.


Despite this fear, he craves the attention of someone who will "take control of my

body and soul, rule my life, fill my consciousness to the exclusion of everyone else." That someone is one Gregory Burgess, a waiter-cum-artist, a "beautiful younger man and notorious flirt." Their love is one built on mutual distrust and thoughts of destruction, much as is that of that famous couple the Roses.

Our hero/victim surrenders himself completely. And Gregory takes complete control of his every waking, and sleeping, moment. Using the bait of future sex as a lure, he traps the very being of his literary "love," causing sleepless nights, misspent funds and diminished self-esteem. But, our hero ponders, isn't this what love is all about? Oh, I know, Gregory sleeps with other men, he never calls and disappears

for days on end. He won't be seen in public with me, and when we are together he makes such incredible scenes, embarrassing me shamelessly or, worse yet, launching into such bouts of depression that I am scarcely able to breathe. But isn't it better to be with someone you love, even if you have these problems, than to be alone?

The revelation of the absurdity of this relationship and its incredible similarity to so many I have experienced in my life, absolutely floored me—and did more good for me than probably any book by Bradshaw, Ratner and the like. Not that their works are not essential to the development of the planet. I just still prefer a good fairy tale, don't you?













SULLIVAN REMOVES IMMIGRATION RESTRICTIONS—

orgive me if I'm not impressed that ten years into the AIDS emergency, the government has done one right thing. Health and Human Services Secretary Louis Sullivan has at long last authorized the removal of regulations that bar HIV-infected people from entering the United States. The world has been protesting this silly policy for years. Public health officials high and low have decried its stupidity. It still took the Bush Administration two years to issue the ruling, and then only after Congress told it to do so.

Even if I'm unmoved, we should still be pleased. At least this one time, well-conceived health policy has been placed above the politics of AIDS. And more important than even the political symbolism, the removal of these regulations is undoubtedly a shot in the arm for the world-wide effort against AIDS.

The U.S. ruling reduces the likelihood that other countries will enact similar restrictions. Americans could easily have borne the greatest burden from this policy. The U.S. has more HIV-infected people than any other country, so the effect of widely-adopted immigration restrictions would be to keep Americans out of other countries. If you're HIV positive, even if you're asymptomatic, a Caribbean vacation would be out of the question. More importantly, you could also forget about the possibility of medical treatment at leading research centers outside of the United States, like the Pasteur Institute in France. New AIDS drugs and treatments are coming out of Europe and Asia very rapidly, and smuggling these drugs into the U.S. is growth industry. New therapies are be-

ing approved for test in the U.S., though at a snail's pace, so treatment outside the U.S. may be a last hope for many.

The energy of the fight against AIDS is being kept up by those already infected. The restriction on the entry of foreign nationals, if enforced, would have crippled efforts to create a coordinated worldwide response to the disease. Potentially, the international HIV community could have been denied the opportunity to meet with U.S. researchers.

Thankfully, the restrictions were temporarily waived for the International AIDS Conference in San Francisco last June, but only after dozens of organizations around the world boycotted the conference in protest. No one knows how much information wasn't published, or what new insight could have resulted from the interaction between these researchers. Maybe an effective treatment. Maybe a cure.


You think none of this ever dawned on the politicians? They knew full well that foreign nationals with HIV posed no public health danger (and even if they did, the danger would be negligible compared to the emergency of millions of Americans already infected). But the politics of AIDS has always seemed more important to the politicians in charge than the deaths of our family members and friends. And make no mistake about it, barring HIV carriers from entering the United States was the first step toward mandatory HIV testing and reporting in this country. If the government thinks it's a bad idea to let foreigners with HIV into the U.S., then why not get rid of American citizens with HIV, too? The rumblings on America's irrational right wing contend that the way to deal with AIDS is to test everybody and quarantine those who test positive. Even as this ruling was made, the right-wingers warned that the real battle was coming over the testing of doctors, nurses and other health care workers. We can be pleased that a tiny victory has been won, but the bigots won't be giving up. Neither should we.

Now that the government has cleared away a stupid policy, perhaps they can get serious about fighting HIV and not the people who happen to be infected by it. After billions of dollars has been spent propping up the medical bureaucracy, we still have only one approved drug of dubious value. Big deal. The FDA and their cronies can be forced into clearing away the senseless obstacles that are preventing therapies from being found and approved. The government could stop the infighting and turf battles that are raging in its various research programs. We could get more serious about AIDS education, anonymous HIV testing and counseling. We could tell people that medical treatment and monitoring are crucial for anyone who is HIV positive and that no one has to die of pneumocystis anymore. We could overhaul the public health system to make it available to everyone, not just those with insurance.

The U.S. government may have given a slight boost to the fight against AIDS by removing the regulation that bars HIV-positive foreigners from entering this country, but the battle for an effective AIDS policy will still continue to rage.

Week of January 18-24, 1991

SKY SHOW — Time is running out to see this winter's sky show featuring Mars, because the red planet is growing dimmer nightly as it speeds away from Earth. Look for Mars, around 9 p.m., directly overhead next to the Pleiades, known as the Seven Sisters. Seeing Mars next to the Pleiades star cluster is a spectacular sight that stargazers won't want to miss. A rare occurrence!

GALILEO SPACECRAFT — We haven't seen the dark side of the Moon since our Apollo astronauts orbited the Moon two decades ago. But this winter we got to see the other side of the Moon once again thanks to the Galileo spacecraft, which glanced at the far side of the Earth's satellite on its way to Jupiter, after getting a boomerang boost from Earth. Galileo swooped to 597 miles above the southeast Atlantic Ocean. Using Earth's gravity as a slingshot, Galileo's orbit around the Sun will be expanded so it can the spacecraft can speed to a rendezvous with Jupiter in 1995. Galileo used Venus as a slingshot last February and will need to fly past Earth again in December 1992 to reach Jupiter.

Galileo snapped hundreds of pictures, one showing a giant meteorite impact crater on the other side of the Moon. Because the Moon rotates on its axis only once a month—exactly the same time it takes for the Moon to orbit the Earth—the Moon always shows its same face to Earthlings.




Steven Linn (above)


