MARCH ON AUSTIN GOALS, PLANS SET

March Committee Schedules Packed March 15-17 Weekend as Thousands Expected to Converge on Austin.

AUSTIN — Plans for the 1991 March on Austin for Lesbian/Gay Equal Rights have been announced by the March on Austin Committee.

The theme of the March 17 event, the second gay and lesbian march on the state Capitol in Texas history, is "The spirit continues...share the excitement of history in the making."

"The point of this march is to demonstrate that we're no different than anybody else," said Dawn Tschabrun, co-chair of the March on Austin.

"We are asserting our claim to Thomas Jefferson's promise of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness," added Thom Prentice, News Media Relations Coordinator for the march and a member of the March Executive Committee representing Gay Fathers.

Goals of the march include legal recognition of gay and lesbian relationships, including same-sex marriages; passage of anti-discrimination and hate crime laws; supporting the right of gay men and lesbians to serve in the U.S. Armed Forces; legislative repeal of section 21.06 of the State Penal Code; reproductive freedom; ending discrimination against persons with HIV, ARC and AIDS; increasing funding for AIDS preventive education and treatment, and working to end discrimination and oppression based on racism and sexism.

March planners are expecting thousands to converge on Austin for the event,

and have scheduled a wealth of activities for the entire weekend. Friday evening receptions will be held by the Names Project, the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby and the Coalition of Lesbian/Gay Student Groups. There will also be functions held by groups ranging from the Austin Radical Faeries to gay and lesbian religious organizations like Beth el Binah and Dignity.

A banquet and "Dance on Austin" will be held Saturday evening at the Crest Hotel to raise funds for the march.

The Names Project will hold a check-in of new quilt panels for the AIDS Memorial Quilt at the Radisson Hotel, where 12' x 12' portions of the International AIDS Memorial Quilt will be displayed. The Names Project will march with the panels to the Capitol rally on Sunday.

The march itself will begin around 12 noon near Palmer Auditorium and work its way up Congress Avenue, culminating in a rally on the Capitol steps featuring remarks by recently elected state officials as well as remarks by state and national speakers, including Urvashi Vaid, Executive Director of the National Lesbian/Gay Task Force. A festival will follow the rally at Waterloo Park just northeast of the Capitol grounds.

The next day, Monday, will be Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby Day at the Capitol.

MAXEY IN RUNOFF FOR STATE SEAT

*LGRL Director Finishes First in
District 51 Special Election;
Tie for Second Place.*

AUSTIN — In what may be a first for Austin politics, Glen Maxey, director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, finished first in balloting for the District 51 seat on Saturday, February 9.

Maxey, who would be the first publicly acknowledged gay legislator in Texas history if he wins the runoff, garnered 1,634 votes or 25.6 percent, to 1,170 votes each for lawyer David Rodriguez and Maria Luisa Flores, also a lawyer. In all, about 14 percent, or 6,380, of the district's voters went to the polls.

As TWT went to press, a recount for second place had not yet been held, and it was not clear who would be challenging Maxey in the runoff.

In the opinion of some political observers here, Maxey faces an uphill battle in the runoff because the district has more Hispanics than any other in Travis County, and the second-place finishers are both Hispanic. Maxey ran well in traditional liberal precincts, but not as well in some minority precincts. Rodriguez and Flores did well in both.

The special election was held to replace former State Rep. Lena Guerrero, who was appointed by Governor Ann Richards to a position on the Texas Railroad Commission.

The runoff date is to be set by the Governor, and will probably be the first Saturday in March.

MAC CREDIT UNION MOVES FORWARD

*Charter Application Submitted as
Credit Union Begins Search for
Qualified Personnel, Elects Officers.*

HOUSTON — The Montrose Activity Center Federal Credit Union held its first meeting on Monday, February 24. The most important business conducted at the meeting was the completion of the application for a charter. The application, which took eight months to complete, will be submitted to the National Credit Union Association for approval. The approval process takes about three months, and the credit union hopes to be open by June.

Jeff McGuire, a consultant with the Texas Credit Union League, attended the meeting. He had assisted in the final preparation of the charter application, and at the meeting presided over a brief question and answer period about the formation of new credit unions. McGuire characterized the application preparation done by MAC as "very professional" and evaluated the potential for growth as "excellent."

During the period between the charter application and final approval, the MAC credit union is actively searching for individuals interested in assisting its future growth and operations. New President Larry Lingle informed TWT NEWS reporter Brian Keever of the following appointments: Chris Bacon was chosen Candidate Screening chairperson;

Bill White is the new chair in charge of the Black-Tie Banquet; Annise Parker will represent HGLPC on and chair the Host Committee for International Conference of Gay & Lesbian Elected & Appointed Officials, to be held in November, and will also serve as HGLPC's representative on the Police Advisory Committee; Dennis Spencer is the Political Action chair; Pat Gandy and Robert Bridges were chosen to represent HGLPC on the statewide board of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby; Kevin Davidson is the new Membership and Computer chair, and Toni Knight is the new Activist chair.

GAY FILM FESTIVAL COMES TO HOUSTON

International Selection of Films Highlights Tour Schedule at Rice Cinema March 1-10

HOUSTON — The New Festival National Gay and Lesbian 1991 Film Tour will make the second stop of its nationwide tour in Houston March 1-10 at the Rice Cinema, Rice Media Center, University

Boulevard at Stockton, Entrance #7. The nonprofit tour, hosted in Houston by the Montrose Activity Center [MAC], will feature a broad selection of films from around the world with gay and lesbian themes.

The promoters of the tour see it as an expression of the diversity of gay and lesbian experience as depicted on film, and as a challenge to people like Senator Jesse Helms who want to impose censorship on lesbian and gay artists.

"Through the tour theme, 'Passion, Politics and Popcorn,' we hope to convey the diversity of the programs and the range of experiences that we offer for viewers' enjoyment," said Susan Horowitz, Executive Director of the New Festival, Inc. "Our tour proves that we will not be stopped or silenced, regardless of the current political climate," she added.

There will be an opening night benefit for MAC on Friday, March 1 at the Rice Media Center. Cocktails and hors d'oeuvres will be served from 7-9 p.m., followed by a double feature screening of two British films, *Comrades in Arms* and *Nocturne*.

The board also presented a plaque to outgoing President Bob Bagot thanking him for his service to the guild in 1990 and over the years. Bagot, co-owner of The Tire Place, has been instrumental over the years in guild projects such "Christmas in Montrose," which sponsors a parade, special children's events and a decoration contest.

After the election, the board voted unanimously to support a resolution asking for a public referendum on instituting zoning in Houston. The previous board had voted in 1990 to oppose zoning on the grounds that it was costly, prone to corruption and unsuitable for a mixed-use neighborhood like Montrose.

AIN WORKS TO MAINTAIN SERVICES

Dallas-Based Coalition of Service Groups Increases Staff and Budget; To Open Office in South Dallas.

DALLAS — Persons living with AIDS can find help for their daily needs through the AIDS Interfaith Network [AIN]. Now in its third year, the organizations that are a

part of AIN seek to help PWAs and those affected by HIV/AIDS through the efforts of their volunteers.

AIN was started by members of the religious community to make a positive impact on the AIDS epidemic. Currently there are over 250 volunteers organized into "Care Teams," with each team consisting of eight to fifteen people. The 22 Care Teams now serve over 100 PWAs in their homes, performing everything from meal preparations and grocery shopping to household chores.

The AIN budget is \$225,000, which provides for six full-time and three part-time professionals. The group works with PWAs in Dallas, Tarrant and Denton counties. Charles Carnahan, Executive Director, told Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS that the budget and staff had increased in the last year, as has the need for volunteers.

"We are trying to stay abreast of the caseload as more and more people are diagnosed. Because we are serving vital, basic needs, in terms of physical as well as emotional and spiritual support, we don't want a single PWA on a list waiting for a Care Team," said Carnahan.

The AIN is in the forefront of home care assistance in many ways. This year the network will establish an office in South Dallas to meet the needs of that part of the community. AIN will be the first AIDS service provider to establish an office in the minority community.

The National Executive Council of the Episcopal Church has recognized the AIN as a Jubilee Center, a community-based program that can serve as a model for the national church. The AIN consists of more than 85 ministries and religiously-based community organizations.

Stepped-Up Harassment of Shops Includes Confiscation of Stock; Some Stores Consider Legal Action.

DALLAS — Adult video stores appear to be under increasing attack by police in the Dallas area. The pretext being used is enforcement of a state commerce law that says all videotapes must contain the

Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS spoke with two people in the Dallas area who both requested anonymity. They said they believed that the current harassment of video stores was a new wave of censorship. [See "Sexually Oriented Businesses Are Threatened," page 39, in last week's issue of TWT—Editor]

The police have raided 16 stores in the Dallas area in the last three weeks alone, confiscating more than 40,000 pornographic videos. There have been 38 felony commerce charges filed against owners and clerks since the raids on January 25 and 26.

"The police said that they had also gone to the large, legitimate video chains to check for the identifying labels," said one source. "But we went out and checked, and found those tapes are not marked."

"It didn't really hurt our business," he continued. "Our customers are very understanding, but they were outraged. The police took a lot of our stock."

Both informants were considering legal action to combat these practices. "It's just unequal enforcement against the adult video stores," another source said.

PWA SUPPORT GROUP AT COUNSEL. CENTER

Montrose Counseling Center & PWA Coalition Houston Co-Sponsor Daytime HIV/AIDS Support Group; Counseling Center Begins Gay/Bisexual Men's Program.

HOUSTON — In response to requests from the community for an HIV/AIDS support group during daytime hours, the Montrose Counseling Center and the PWA Coalition Houston have announced the beginning of such a group. The two groups invited persons with HIV/AIDS to join beginning Thursday, February 7. Meetings will be held from 1-2:30 p.m. at the PWA Coalition offices, Metropolitan Multipurpose Center, 1475 W. Gray.

The group will be professionally facilitated by Ken Anctil, M.Ed., staff therapist with the Montrose Counseling Center. The PWA Coalition will provide soft drinks and sandwiches for those interested. To help

defray some of the costs, the Counseling Center said it would request a donation per group attended, but that no one would be turned away if unable to pay. Additional funding for the support group is being provided by a recent award from the Names Project.

In other news, the Counseling Center began a series of presentations addressed to the specific needs of gay and bisexual men. These presentations will be held on the first and third Wednesday of every month from 7-8:30 p.m. Topics will be presented by various community members on such issues as taxes, legal issues, relationships and spirituality and will be facilitated by Jean-Louis Amand, MSW-CSW and Ken Anctil, M.Ed.

The first presentation on February 6 dealt with gays and the IRS. On February 20, Bud Peterson, CADAC will address "Finding Your Niche in the Gay Community."

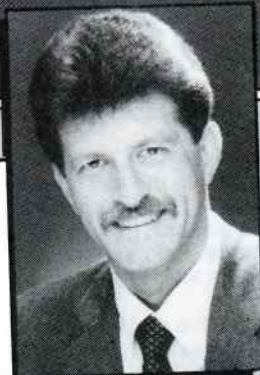

Gays Just Cannon Fodder?

Dear TWT:

Gay servicemen and women have been told by the military that they can serve in the Persian Gulf war and that they will be discharged after they return. This fact was revealed in the *Wall Street Journal* (January 24, 1991, Section B1). Gay veterans groups and gay-rights attorneys claim the military has relaxed its ban on homosexuals because of the war but still plans to throw them out after the fighting is over. At least 14 gay and lesbian reservists have been notified of this. The military has always maintained that this ban is necessary to preserve good morale and discipline among the troops.

Other puzzling injustices have included troops who were told that agent orange would not affect their health and were then denied proper medical care. One gay was told, "We're going to ship your ass to Saudi Arabia, use your butt as cannon fodder; and if you come back, we'll throw you out." If gays are fit for service during wartime and are willing to risk injury or death, then they are equally fit to serve during peacetime.

This brings me to the "we support our troops" cliché that you see and hear everywhere. I hope all these people who

say they support our troops really do support them and also will support them against the injustices that they face from the American government. That support requires more than just flags on their car antennas.

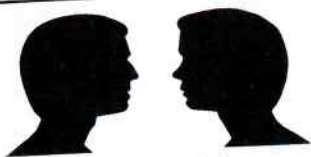

basis for a modern-day horror story that captures the terror we experienced as children, and adds a new twist. His new work, *Silverwolf*, is a brilliant retelling of Montague Summers' 1933 classic, *The Werewolf*, but in a 1990s twist, the monster is gay, and his victims are all young, beautiful men.

Leo Morrison is the physical embodiment of the cursed soul Lycos, the werewolf. After ritualistically becoming a werewolf in the woods of Minnesota, Leo is tormented by "nightmares" in which he stalks the streets of Chicago in search of prey. But are they really "nightmares," or are they terrifying blackouts during which Lycos overcomes Leo's persona? In an effort to escape this horror, Leo packs up and leaves the Windy City for the supposed safety of the Pacific Northwest. But his flight does not end the "nightmares," and Seattle falls prey to the vicious attacks of the night-prowler.

While Edmonson's depiction of the classic wolfman in *Silverwolf* is superb, it is not his greatest achievement. Rather, the true power of the work comes in its uncanny correlation to another curse befalling the gay community—AIDS. For the same terror that affects Seattle's gay community because of Lycos' torrent of death, the same disruption of daily life which his murders dictate, can be found in the health crisis now plaguing America. And the same desire by all those affected to "make sense out of nonsense" is one of the common threads in the two crises.

Similarly, the method of destruction in both instances can be directly traced to the unprotected sexual act. In *Silverwolf*, Leo/Lycos destroys his victims in an act of passion. His body is that of "a Greek statue, every muscle clearly delineated under his pale skin." With such a body, he is able to attract and, then, render lifeless. He prowls the cruise areas, and has his choice of victims. Regrettably, how similar does this sound to some AIDS stories?

In addition, the havoc that both AIDS and Lycos wreak on the gay population is identical. The sense of loss that the signif-

icant others of their victims feel is the same. When Joel is attacked by Lycos, and himself begins to be transformed into the beast, his detachment and coldness towards his lover, Ben, parallel many people's reactions to being diagnosed with the HIV virus. When news of the latest victim reaches the ears of friends and associates, they react with the same feeling of powerlessness, the same sense of "when does it all end?"

On the positive side, however, it does all end, and does have a beneficial impact on the individual and the community. Cliff, one of the Seattle Police Department's finest fired years ago for being caught with his pants down in the backroom of a bar, finds a renewed sense of commitment to

his ex-lover, Mark, whom he left years ago in search of "something better." Through Cliff's commitment, and the commitment of those in his sphere, the monster is destroyed, just as, some day, AIDS will be as well.

While it is doubtful that Roger Edmonson's stated purpose when he began to write *Silverwolf* was to create an analogy to the AIDS crisis, the correlation cannot be denied; it is simply too strong. What must be remembered is that in *Silverwolf*, as in all fairy tales or horror stories, there is a happy ending, and good triumphs over evil. In following this format, Edmonson reaffirms that belief as it applies to all tragedies, analogous or not. And for that, he must be applauded.

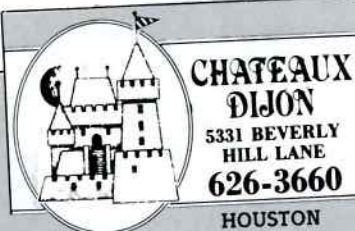



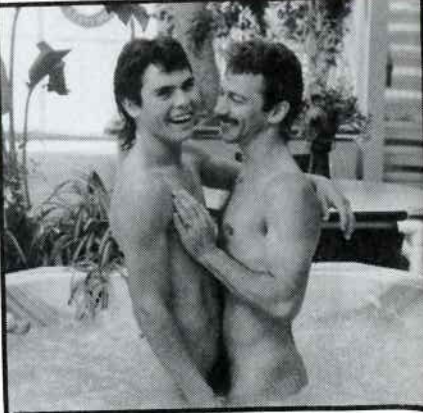

SIGHTS & HIGHLIGHTS IN BEAUMONT, TEXAS

Magnolia blossoms, seamen, oil derricks, green rice fields, all laid out on the tidewater of the Neches River, are the ready images of Beaumont, especially to those who zip on through, pausing only for the local cuisine at Patillo's Barbeque, or the Copa.

Ninety miles east of Houston, Beaumont seems further than an hour and a half away; indeed it seems like a hundred years ago, and yet up-to-the-minute. From the McFaddin-Ward House and the Tyrrell Historical Library, to the visions of Felix "Fox" Harris's contemporary American Folk Art

decorating the courtyard of the Art Museum of Southeast Texas, Beaumont offers the arts to people of all interests and persuasions.

Many attractions are within walking distance of each other in the downtown area. The Art Museum of Southeast Texas, 500 Main, focuses on 19th and 20th century American fine art and folk art. Film and video showings, contemporary artists in residence, lectures and musical performances are sponsored by the museum. The Museum Shop and Museum Tea Room Restaurant are particularly delightful. For restaurant reservations, docent tours or other information, call (409)832-3422/722-2331.

Worth the trip is the sight of 50 tall, totem-like sculptures by local folk artist Felix "Fox" Harris. Neither aware of nor interested in what other people considered art, Harris directed his energy after the example of God, who "took nuthin' and made somethin'." After God appeared to him in a vision, Harris took discarded tools, machines, toys and scraps of metal and plastic, and with his keen eye for color and design he created some remarkable sculpture in his yard, working on stilts to reach them. After his death his great nephew donated them to the Art Museum of Southeast Texas in 1985.

One block away is the Texas Energy Museum at 600 Main. The Smithsonian Institute calls this collection of talking robots and other creative exhibits "the finest in the world." See for yourself Tuesdays through Saturdays and Sunday afternoons.

The Fire Museum of Texas occupies the whole first floor of the city's 1927 department headquarters, exhibiting restored antique trucks and other vintage equipment. 400 Walnut. Open Monday through Friday.

The Edison Plaza Museum displays models of Thomas Edison's inventions at 350 Pine Street. The Travis Street substation was built in the 1920s to distribute the first electrical power to many Southeast Texas towns. Gulf States Utilities Company renovated the structure to house the largest collection of Edison inventions west of the Mississippi.

In 1903 the First Baptist Church built a Romanesque Revival-style church with a vaulted roof, stained glass windows and picturesque gray stone. Soon outgrown, it was purchased in 1923 by philanthropist W.C. Tyrrell and given to the city as a gift. In use for half a century as part of the lending library system, it has been renovated and renamed the Tyrrell Historical Library. Many come here to research their ancestors in the comprehensive genealogical files. Others come to study the structure itself when the winter afternoon sun glows through the colored windows, into rooms full of manuscripts, books and documents. One steps into this building from the rush of civilization to enter something very much like noble solemnity. 695 Pearl Street. Tuesday through Saturday.

Moving away from the downtown area, visit the Babe Zaharias Memorial Museum featuring the many trophies and artifacts, including Olympic medals, of the Beaumont schoolgirl who grew up to be the World's Greatest Athlete. The city's Visitor Center is located inside the Zaharias Museum, 1750 East IH-10.

In Old Town, Beaumont's historical district, tourists may visit a cornucopia of specialty shops, with fashions, antiques, decorative interiors, jewelry and more. It is in this neighborhood that one of the best-preserved Beaux Arts Colonial-style homes in the United States is located. The McFaddin-Ward House, built in 1906, reflects the wealthy lifestyle of a Southeast Texas family which owned and managed ranches, rice farms and oil fields.

Museum tours of the house reveal the sparkling silver, elegant furniture, Oriental rugs, European porcelains and American brilliant-period cut glass. The style and grace of the past have been maintained, with many of the rooms restored to the ambience of an earlier period.

The McFaddin-Ward House, 1906 McFaddin, is open for tours (reservations recommended) Tuesday through Sunday. For more information call (409)832-2134.

Cultural activities play a vital role in Beaumont, including the performing arts. The Beaumont Symphony Orchestra's season runs from September to May. Opera and ballet are appreciated and Lamar University sponsors performances of its own in drama, dance, music and visual arts. Church services were held on February 16 at Bering Methodist Church. The Vargas family wishes to express their thanks to all.

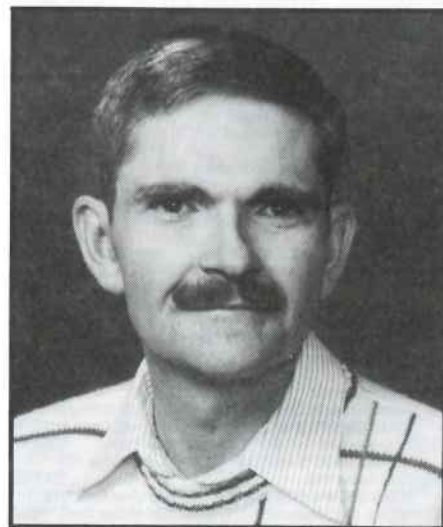

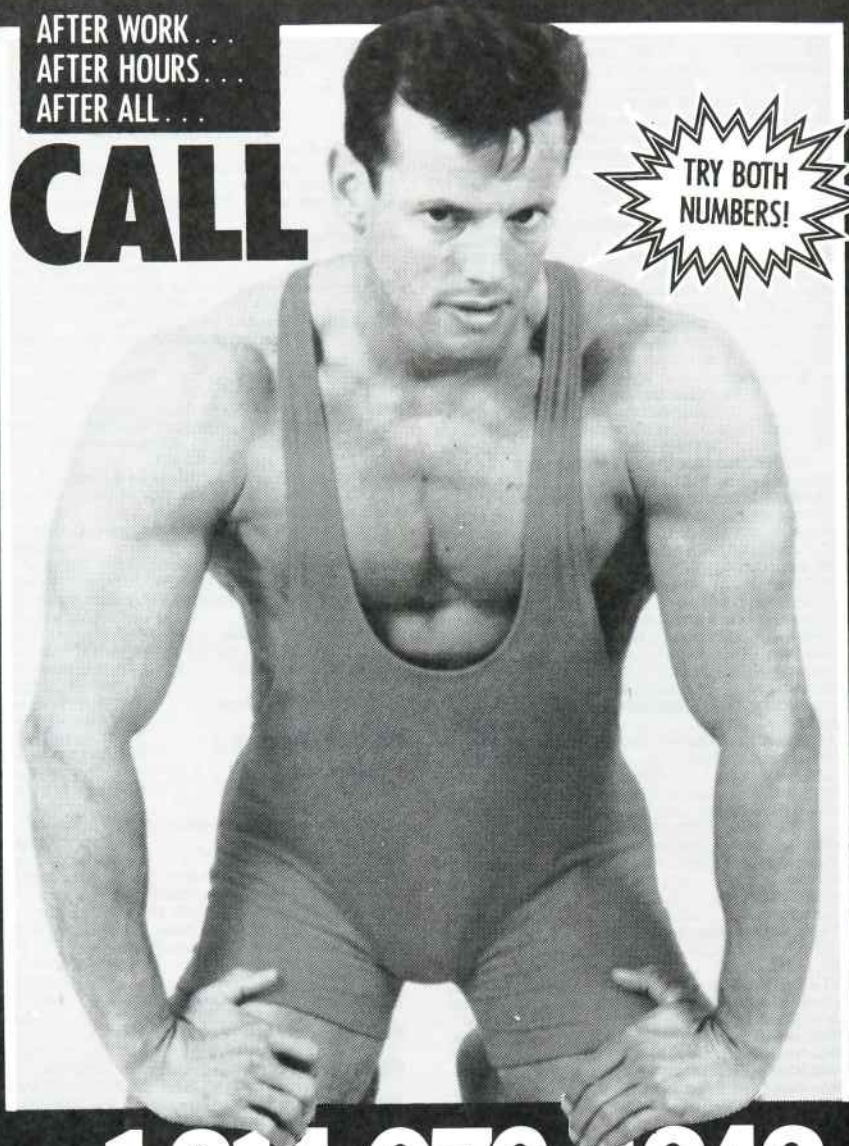

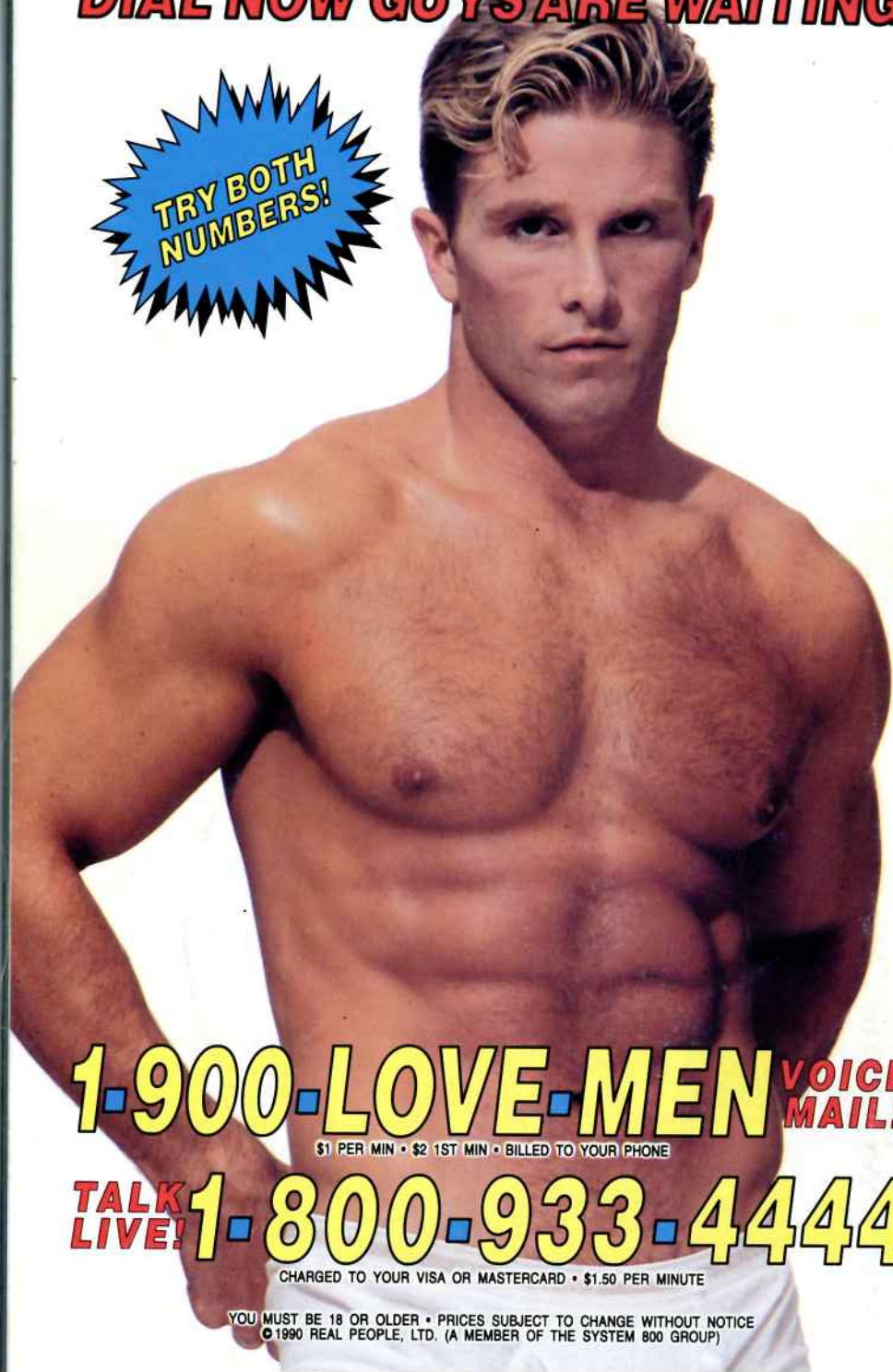
