HOUSTON CITY COUNCIL PASSES SOB ORDINANCE

New Law Adds Adult Bookstores, Movie Houses to List of Restricted Businesses; Activists See Legal Battle.

HOUSTON — As expected, City Council passed a law Wednesday, February 13 imposing restrictions on the location of sexually-oriented businesses.

The ordinance, which is the result of efforts by Councilwoman Christin Hartung, is similar to one overturned by a federal judge in 1977. The law would regulate the location of businesses like adult bookstores and X-rated movie houses. They would be prevented from operating within 750 feet of schools, churches and daycare centers, and within 1,000 feet of other sexually oriented businesses. They would also be prohibited within neighborhoods that are at least 75 percent residential.

There are 54 adult bookstores and movie theaters in Houston, and it is believed that at least 26 of them will not be eligible for permits under the new restrictions. Those found to be in violation of the ordinance will have to move within nine months unless the city grants them an exemption to operate until they recover their investment.

The city council action comes at a time when Houston is moving toward instituting some form of zoning, which might strengthen the effect of regulations such as those imposed by the new ordinance.

City officials are apparently convinced that the new ordinance will pass constitutional muster because it is less restrictive than the law passed in 1977. That one was struck down by a U.S. District Judge who said it was too broad and that it had the effect of banning such businesses rather than merely restricting them.

But community activists and business owners believe the ordinance violates the First Amendment right of free speech and must be challenged in the courts. [See TWT VIEWPOINT, page 39, Vol. 16, No. 48].

THAT'S WHAT FRIENDS ARE FOR 2

Garrett told TWT NEWS, "The idea of raising funds for 501(c)3 charity organizations providing assistance or funding to people with HIV-related complications is what gave rise to the project; the initial success of the project gave us the incentive to do a repeat benefit with hopes of raising more funds this year."

The benefit is open to all who wish to participate. 1991 Host Committee members include Garrett, Ronnie Diaz, Marvin Davis (aka Lady Victoria Lust), Wayne Grabain, Rhan Jackson and Raymond Gonzales. Annise Parker, though not a com-

mittee member, has agreed to serve as benefit treasurer. "Anyone wishing to volunteer to work with the committee is welcome to call (713)864-0890," said Garrett.

The proceeds of Friends 2 will be divided equally among the Colt 45's AIDS TroubleFund, Body Positive Houston, the Montrose Activity Center and T.G.R.A. The AFH Stone Soup Pantry will receive all food items donated during the event. The committee has arranged the AFH Stone Soup van to be parked in front of Rich's the evening of the benefit to collect non-perishable food items donated by those attending.

Tickets for "That's What Friends Are For 2" go on sale April 1 for \$15 and \$20, and VIP tables may be reserved for \$100. Tickets will be available at Appearances, Brazos Back Pocket, Inklings and Printex Plus.

ASA PLEDGE WALK EXCEEDS GOAL

*Proceeds from Walk Shared
With Eight Area
AIDS Service Providers.*

AUSTIN — In ceremonies held Wednesday, January 30 at the offices of AIDS Services of Austin, the organization presented eight AIDS service agencies with checks representing a share of the proceeds from the third annual "From All Walks of Life" pledge walk.

ASA, the primary organization in the Austin area providing and coordinating services to persons affected by AIDS, sponsors the yearly event to benefit AIDS care and education. The group was pleased to report that this year's walk did even better than expected. The total funds raised, \$130,669.02, easily exceeded the goal of \$115,000. Expenses came to \$35,710.26, leaving a net of \$94,958.76. ASA shared 25% of the proceeds, or \$23,739.69, with eight other Austin service providers, each receiving \$2,967.46.

Recipients included ALLGO (Informe SIDA), which provides AIDS education and services to the Austin Hispanic community; the Austin Immune Health Clinic, which provides alternative therapies to people with AIDS and those who are HIV positive; and the Central East Austin Community Organization, a human service delivery agency targeting Austin's low-income and minority communities.

Also receiving checks were Christopher House, which is establishing a residential hospice and care center for PWAs who prefer a non-institutional setting; the People's Community Clinic, which provides acute health care to the "medically poor"; Planned Parenthood of Austin, which provides contraceptive services and education on human sexuality issues, including HIV; Project Transitions, which works to meet the needs of terminal AIDS patients who prefer to live out their final days in a home-like environment; and Waterloo Counseling Center, which provides individual and group therapy on AIDS/HIV-related issues.

HOUSTON FUND-RAISER FOR MAXEY CAMPAIGN

*Benefit to Aid LGRL Director
In Bid to Become First Openly
Gay Elected Official in Texas.*

HOUSTON — Houston supporters of LGRL lobbyist Glen Maxey are staging a benefit to help his runoff election bid for a seat in the Texas Legislature. If successful, Maxey will be the first openly-gay elected official in Texas. He told **TWT NEWS**, "I led the field of 13 candidates in the general election, and have an excellent chance of winning the runoff. My campaign has shown that an openly gay candidate is a credible candidate."

The Sunday fund-raising benefit has a "New Orleans Hot Jazz" theme, and features live entertainment headlined by the nationally known David Catney Trio, along with performances by the Lone Star Swing Band, the men from Muscles in Action and sultry New Orleans-style impersonations by Chablis and Regina Dane. There will be a light brunch and munchies, a cash bar and specials on certain drinks.

Houston organizer Jim Owens, the Montrose Democratic Precinct Judge, put together the benefit with the help of local underwriters. Owens says, "We've heard so much about openly gay officials across the country, but Texas doesn't have one! Glen's campaign is the first time we've had a reasonable chance to elect an openly gay person in Texas, and may very well be the only opportunity we have for years to come."

The benefit will be held on Sunday, February 24 from noon to 4 p.m. at JR's Bar & Grill on the Santa Fe Patio. A \$7 donation at the door will be requested, with all proceeds going to the Glen Maxey campaign.

DIGNITY/AUSTIN HOSTS REGIONAL CONFERENCE

*Gathering Held to Coincide
With March on Austin Weekend;
Workshop, Banquet Planned.*

AUSTIN — Gay and lesbian Catholics from Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas and Louisiana will gather in Austin March 15-17 for

the Dignity Region VII Spring Conference, "Gay/Lesbian Civil Rights: A Century of Catholic Teaching on Social Justice."

Dignity/Austin is hosting the event at the Best Western Quarters at the Capitol, 300 E. 11th St. at San Jacinto. The Dignity conference has been timed to coincide with the 1991 March on Austin for Gay/Lesbian Civil Rights.

As part of the gathering, a civil rights workshop on Saturday will be led by Christian ethicist Joe Lazor, Ph.D., and canon lawyer Denise Doyle, Ph.D., J.C.D., both of San Antonio. The workshop, which begins at 9:30 a.m., is open to non-conference participants for a \$10 door fee.

The public is also cordially invited to attend a Dignity mass at 6 p.m. Saturday at the Quarters Hotel.

Pat Roche, national president of Dignity/USA, will be the featured speaker at Saturday night's banquet, presenting an update on Dignity/USA programs, activities and civil rights concerns at the national level.

Following a business meeting on Sunday morning, Dignity members will join other participants in the March on Austin, the Rally at the Capitol and the Festival at Waterloo Park.

AIDS MASTERY RETURNS TO DALLAS

*Three-Day Workshop
Designed to Help Persons
Dealing with AIDS.*

DALLAS — Northern Lights Alternatives returns to Dallas with the AIDS Mastery Workshop on March 1-3. The Mastery Workshop is an intensive three-day workshop using one-on-one, group interaction, emotional exercises and visualizations to help participants deal with AIDS.

Although the workshop is designed primarily for people who have been diagnosed with HIV, it is equally effective for anyone who has been affected by AIDS or HIV in some way. The AIDS Mastery is about living life to the fullest regardless of one's circumstances.

RAGGIO ADDRESSES LGPC MEETING

*Attorney Relates Life Experiences
Fighting Discrimination; Stresses
Need to Keep Big Picture in Mind.*

DALLAS — A 71-year-old Dallas attorney made timely remarks at the March 12 meeting of the Lesbian and Gay Political Caucus. Louise Raggio, the first woman to serve as president of the Texas Bar Associates, told her life's story of involvement with civil rights and discrimination issues.

"All of us have been discriminated against in one way or another," Raggio

said. "It's part of nature that what is different receives the static." She cited her experiences with growing up around animals on a farm, where the "runts" were attacked by their siblings.

"You need to decide what your objectives are," Raggio said. She cited several examples where compromises had to be made to achieve her own objectives.

During a recent legal custody battle, she told a young man he had to cut his hair before testifying for his grandmother. "You have a right to wear your hair any way you want," she told the young man, "but the judge can't see beyond the length of your hair." The objective was to gain permanent custody of a child for the grandmother, but the grandson had to cut his hair as part of the compromise, she added.

In the 60s, Raggio was working for a constitutional amendment to give women their legal rights when at one point she had to make another compromise. "The amendment stated a basic principle, but you needed statutes to back it up. I made a deal to vote against the amendment in order to get the statute passed. I needed to exercise some leverage to reach my objective."

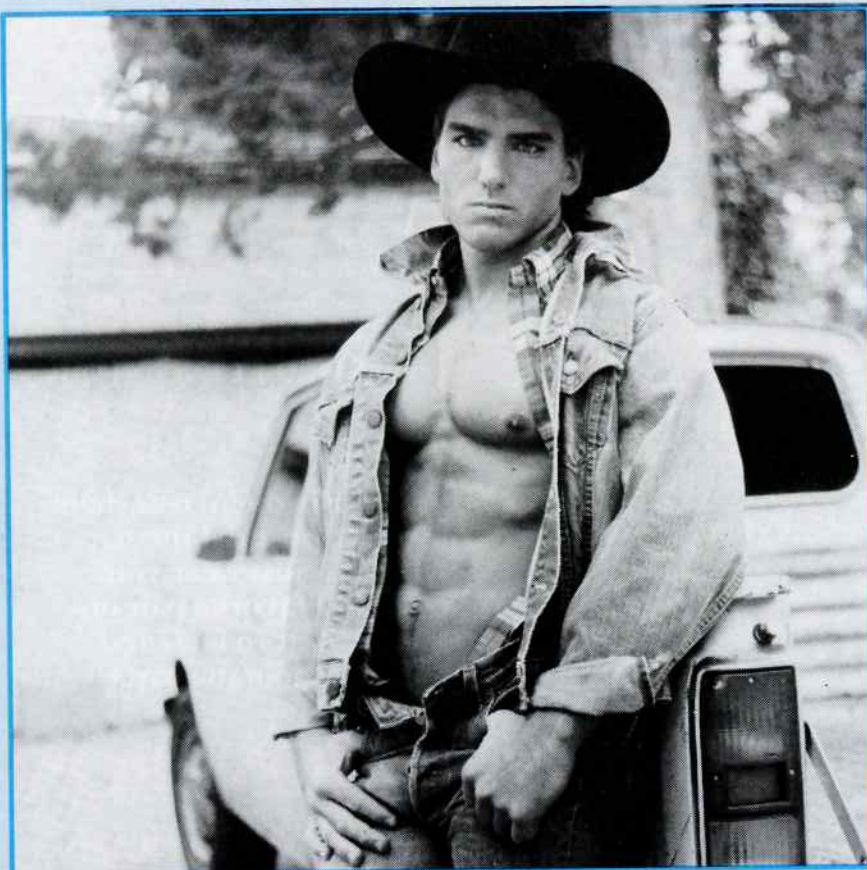

gio added. "You have to keep the big picture in mind."

She credits her interest in becoming an attorney and fighting discrimination to her husband, Greer Raggio. In the 40s, he was dismissed from a federal job because he was accused of being a Communist. "We had to fight the allegations by ourselves for years," she said. "Even though Greer was reinstated in his job, he never got a promotion. It really chills your blood when you go through a test of fire like this."

"I have learned more from the pain I've been through than the pleasure," she added. "It must be human nature. If life gives you lemons, just learn to make lemonade."

In other business, LGPC members discussed the redistricting plans for Dallas City Council, and vice-chair Peter Brown and male co-chair Paul Rodgers presented a screening and endorsement questionnaire for potential candidates for the probable upcoming city council election.

HCRN HIRES RESEARCH NURSE

*Weaver to Recruit Patients
For Research Protocols.*

HOUSTON — The Houston Clinical Research Network [HCRN], an affiliate of the Montrose Clinic, has announced the hiring of Sherrie Weaver as a research nurse. Executive director Ralph C. Lasher explained that Weaver's efforts would be concentrated on recruiting new patients for research protocols and assisting them in enrolling in the studies.

Weaver is a nurse and HIV counselor, and has been involved in HIV research for the past four years with Baylor College of Medicine, Harris County Health Department and the City of Houston Department of Health and Human Services.

She has worked with the Colt 45's AIDS Troublefund, and has also volunteered for the Texas Gay Rodeo, Montrose Clinic, Stone Soup Pantry and Body Positive. She is currently conducting a Women's Outreach Program for the Audette Center, which provides HIV education and HIV counseling and testing.

Support HIV Policy Change

Dear TWT:

In an urgent appeal to the gay, lesbian and AIDS communities, the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force [NGLTF] is asking individuals and organizations to write the Centers for Disease Control [CDC] in support of the deletion of HIV from the list of U.S. immigration exclusions.

Last October, the U.S. Congress mandated the Department of Health and Human Services [HHS] to lift restrictions on people with HIV and AIDS from the discriminatory U.S. immigration policy. On January 23, HHS published in the Federal Register [Vol. 55, No. 15] its Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, "Medical Examination of Aliens." The notice was in keeping with government regulations for informing the public of such changes. Citizens may then submit expressions of their support or opposition.

NGLTF has learned that the CDC has received more than 550 letters that *oppose* the deletion of HIV from the immigration policy and less than 15 that *support* it. Strong opposition could re-spark the controversy around the policy and fuel hostile Congressional amendments. AIDS activists in Washington, DC, are concerned about attempts to make an exception to

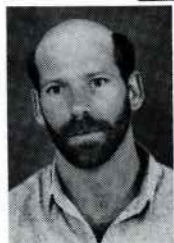

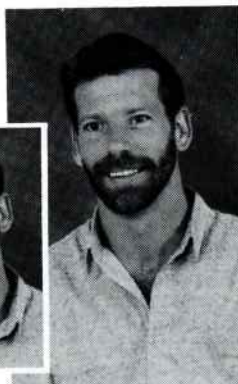

PLEASURES OF A TANGLED LIFE

Pleasures of a Tangled Life, by Jan Morris;
nonfiction, 209 pp.; Vintage Books

Jan Morris has lived a life as chock-full of excitement as any of her acclaimed travel books. Born James Humphry Morris in Clevedon, England, in 1926, she lived as a male until her gender reassignment in 1972, a transformation she chronicles magnificently in her bestselling autobiography, *Conundrum*. As a young man, she climbed with Hillary's expedition almost to the top of Mt. Everest and was the first to break the news of his success to the world. Later she served as a lieutenant in the Ninth Lancers of the British

Army, becoming a roving war reporter after her army stint. Her lively eye for detail of all sorts has made her one of the twentieth century's most popular light historians and travel writers.

Although it is somewhat autobiographical, a reader expecting *Pleasures of a Tangled Life* to be a guide to living life as a transsexual will be disappointed. Morris' transition is barely mentioned at all. She tells a few anecdotes about friends' and co-workers' reactions and how both men and women seemed to feel more comfortable and less threatened by her as she began to meld gender mannerisms and attributes. Such reactions were more likely caused, however, by her own newly comfortable and more relaxed feelings about herself.

Morris writes that, like most transsexuals, after her operation she tried at first to forget that she had ever lived as a man and dismiss everything masculine about herself and her former lifestyle. She found such an attitude much too limiting, however, and has now integrated aspects of her life as a man into her current life as a woman. The pleasurable entanglements created by such a gender amalgamation are nowhere more apparent than in her anecdote about her fascination with a long-dead naval general. "One half of me would like to be him," she writes, "and the other half would like to be loved by him."

This dichotomy extends to her views on sex as well. Although artfully reticent in revealing her own sexual proclivities (we later discover she still lives with and loves the wife she had as a man), she believes in a higher, more spiritual sexuality than messy physicality. When sex is elevated beyond the physical it can then occur without qualms at any time, anywhere: in the glance of a stranger, in an old woman's smile, in the ministrations of a mountain shepherd. Sexuality unfettered by the physical allows its participants, according to Morris, to see beauty in everything around themselves. "Only a dullard," she exclaims, "could see sexual beauty in only one sex!"

Although Jan Morris proclaims herself a pantheist, seeing God as every part of nature and the universe, she is more likely a "panphile" (if there is such a word). She expresses love for and derives a sensual, elevated sexual pleasure from both animate and inanimate objects, describing with equal fervor the pleasurable sensa-

tion, the "frisson," afforded by such diverse objects among others as her house, a cathedral, ships, Jewish friends, a French swimmer, her Abyssinian cat and her adopted Welsh homeland.

This book, then, is a catalogue of her personal pleasures. She warns early on, however, that these particular pleasures are her own and may not necessarily mean anything special to her readers. That unconscious amalgamation of masculine and feminine viewpoints which has always made her travelogues so fascinating is everywhere apparent in this work, and she bewitches her readers into joining her on a journey through the world and her life as she clasps each experience to her heart and soul with hoops of steel. As in her travel books, Morris blends memories with realities, adding a generous dash of Welsh romanticism, until we are entranced with each new entangling evocation. Whether she is jauntily whistling down an Italian street, fantasizing about a dangerous-looking Algerian feeding his cat, watching the ghosts of ancient ships pass by her window, guiltily reveling in the long-gone splendors of imperial India or picnicking on a hill overlooking the Sydney harbor, she awakes in her readers those same pleasurable emanations she herself has experienced.

Read carefully, *Pleasures of a Tangled Life* becomes much more than a mere set of essays on pleasurable sensations. Indeed, as Morris proposes, pleasures are "insufficient by themselves. Only alliteration...links hedonism with happiness." She ultimately ventures that the greatest pleasure is friendship, which becomes a type of putty smoothing the rougher edges of our existence. Taken together, the essays provide us as much insight into the tangled complexities of Jan Morris as could any volume of autobiography. *Pleasures* is as much a guidebook as any of her travelogues. It is not, however, a guide merely to various regions of the world, but a guide to the ultimate journey, the journey of a life lived in delicious anarchy, a life lived to its fullest, partaking of pleasures both sensate and mental, both grand and minuscule. Toss your Baedeker into the Grand Canal, fling your Michelin into the Himalayan winds—I can think of no better guide to the pleasures of the world and to life itself than this 65-year-old globe-trotting Auntie Mame. Vive la Jan Morris!

STARGAZER — We couldn't see Saturn as recently as a couple of months ago because it was lost in the Sun's glare. But since early February, the ringed planet has begun emerging right before sunrise. Look for Saturn about an hour before the Sun comes up.

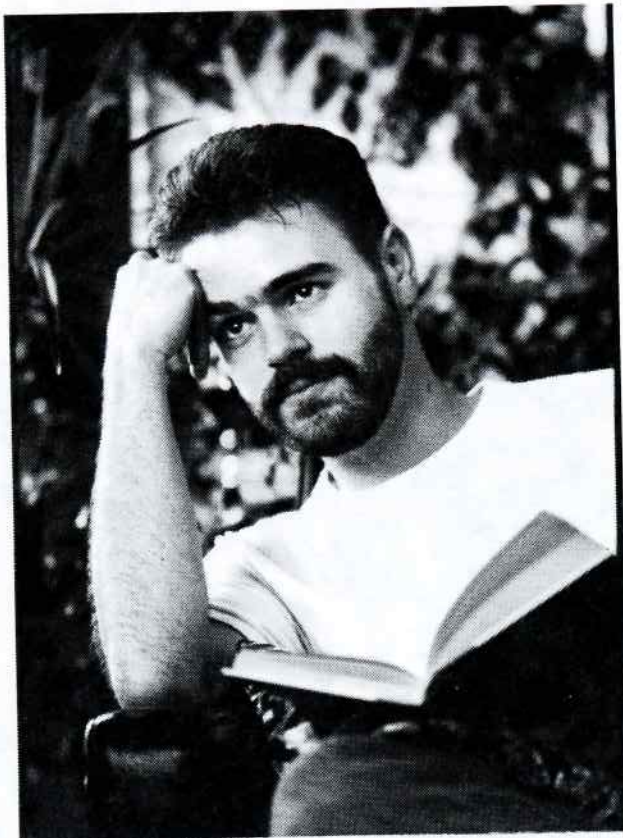
