A&M FACULTY SENATE VOTES AGAINST DISCRIMINATION

*Measure Would Ban Discrimination
In Hiring, Firing and Tenure;
Awaits President's Approval.*

COLLEGE STATION — The faculty senate of Texas A&M University voted Monday, February 11 to include sexual preference in a list of types of discrimination that will not be tolerated in hiring, firing and tenure decisions. The move will become school policy if it receives the approval of President William Mobley.

Those leading the fight for the inclusion believe that it is needed to prevent discrimination against openly gay and lesbian faculty members and potential faculty members.

A group of faculty members and others identifying themselves as "friends of the university" signed a petition opposing the move, claiming it was unnecessary and would give gays and lesbians special recognition. But their bid to stop the inclusion of sexual preference was defeated 44-18.

PWA COALITION NAMES COORDINATOR

*St. Laurent Fills Newly Created
Position Aimed at Improving Level
Of Services to Area PWAs;
Coalition Chooses Officers for 1991.*

HOUSTON — In an effort to improve the level and consistency of services it offers to area PWAs, the PWA Coalition of Houston has created a new staff position of Administrative Coordinator. Karen St. Laurent, who has been involved with AIDS care for several years, was named to the position.

In explaining why there was a need for a full-time coordinator, President Bill Napoli told TWT NEWS, "The PWA Coalition is run by its board and by a dedicated staff of volunteers. One of the problems inherent in this is that there can never be any guarantee of the consistency of anyone's time. People have health issues and living issues that naturally take priority over their volunteer work. I understand this.



"But we need someone here to mind the store full-time. Our charge is to be here for PWAs... That's why we created this new position of Administrative Coordinator. Karen will coordinate all of our programs to make sure there is a continuity of quality and an absolute consistency in the level of our service. We are lucky to get her and we're delighted to have her with us at the PWA Coalition."

St. Laurent is well acquainted with AIDS. She was the Executive Director of Omega House from 1988 to 1990, and as such was in charge of the daily administrative operations of that special care facility for indigent AIDS patients. Asked what it was that drew her to this work, Karen answered, "Reading about the disease fascinated me so much that I wanted to work with PWAs. After three years of involvement I find there is something deep within me that tells me I am where I belong. I don't walk in thinking that I can change the world. But I do know that I can make a difference."

The PWA Coalition also chose its 1991 officers. Napoli was reelected president, and Gerry Quinones was reelected treasurer. Mark Siegworth is the new vice-president and Jay Slemmer takes over as secretary. Siegworth and Slemmer have served on the coalition board since May and April of 1990 respectively. A special election will be held to fill three vacant PWA positions on the advisory board.

21.06 PLAINTIFFS TO ADDRESS MARCHERS

LGTF Director Vaid Keynotes Capitol Rally Following March; Festival Space Still Available.

AUSTIN — In an update of plans for the 1991 March on Austin for Lesbian/Gay Equal Rights, the March Committee has informed TWT NEWS that Linda Morales, lead plaintiff in the lawsuit which resulted in the overturning of 21.06 last December, the state anti-sodomy statute, will be a guest speaker at the March on Austin Capitol Rally on March 17. Morales will be joined by her four co-plaintiffs, Tom Doyal and Pat Cramer, both of Austin, and John Thomas and Charlotte Taft, both of Dallas. Keynoting the rally will be Urvashi Vaid, National Director of the Lesbian/Gay Task Force. The speakers will address how the repeal of the anti-sodomy law will affect gays and lesbians in Texas.

Doyal is the former director of the Texas Human Rights Foundation [THRF], the organization sponsoring the lawsuit.

Marc Leitman, who is in charge of the March program, reminded TWT NEWS that the deadline for placement of ads in the program has been extended to noon, March 6. There is also a limited amount of booth space still available for the Waterloo Festival, which will follow the Capitol rally. Any groups or businesses wishing to advertise in the program, or to distribute information, solicit donations or sell food or merchandise were asked to contact the March office as soon as possible at (512) 474-0750.

NELSON-TEBEDO MOVING FORWARD

Clinic Expanding Services After Vote of Confidence from AMFAR And Hardardt Group.

DALLAS — In spite of recent setbacks, the Nelson-Tebedo Community Clinic is continuing to expand the wide range of services it offers to the community.

On Tuesday, February 5, Dr. Ken Greene, who had been medical director of the clinic since May of 1990, suffered a seizure and broke his shoulder. He was hospitalized and placed on an extended medical leave of absence, but is expected

to make a full recovery. Former clinic manager Gloria Goodwin resigned effective February 15.

Representatives from both the American Foundation for AIDS Research [AMFAR] and the Hardardt Group, study monitors for Adria's ansamycin clinical trial being conducted at the clinic, have visited Nelson-Tebedo to review the situation, and both have given their votes of confidence.

Nelson-Tebedo provides a wide range of programs and services to people affected by HIV, including blood monitoring, pentamidine mist treatments, retinitis screening, anonymous and confidential HIV testing, and HIV education and counseling on Thursday evenings.

Nelson-Tebedo conducts experimental drug trials such as the AZT-Acyclovir study, the MAI-prophylaxis, Ansamycin study.

Nelson-Tebedo also sponsors an AIDS/HIV awareness questionnaire and analysis aimed at women, and has HIV education, prevention, counseling and testing for women on Wednesday evenings. The Women's Health Project/Clinic reception this Sunday, March 3 will kick off a program targeting the health needs and preventive medicine of lesbians.

AFH NAMES NEW EDUCATION DIRECTOR *Mizwa Moves into New Position After Serving as an Outreach Coordinator with AFH.*

HOUSTON — The AIDS Foundation Houston announced the appointment of its new Director of Education. Michael Mizwa, who has been with the AFH education department as an outreach coordinator since 1988, took over his new position on February 4.

Mizwa, a graduate of the University of Houston, has achieved both local and national recognition for his efforts in the areas of substance abuse, homelessness and programs aimed at "at-risk" youth. One of his most noteworthy accomplishments has been the Juvenile Peer Education Program, in which three juveniles, two of whom are members of minority groups and the third HIV-positive, address the concerns of young people in the Houston area.

HOUSTON — The Houston chapter of the National Leather Association [NLA:H] chose its 1991 officers at a meeting held February 20, reported Brian Keever of TWT NEWS.

Dean Walradt and Jim Bernard were chosen as co-chairs, Douglas was elected secretary, Richard Thoen is the new treasurer, "Buzz" Davis is the new at-large member and Les Winsper became the chapter representative to the National Council.

NLA:H will host "HOT! A Night in Black Leather" and the hanging of its colors on March 2, and on March 8 the chapter will

hold a "bar crawl" aimed at attracting new members and increasing its visibility in the community. A bus will be available to shuttle participants to seven area bars.

NLA:H reminded that business meetings are held on the second Thursday of each month, and social nights are held on the first and third Wednesdays of the month. Meetings are open to all.

HOUSTON HEALTH DEPARTMENT SOLICITS FUNDING PROPOSALS

*Funding to Go to Organizations
Stressing Educational Outreach
Targeting Hispanic Community.*

HOUSTON — The City of Houston Department of Health and Human Services [DHHS] has announced that it is accepting proposals from nonprofit organizations in the Hispanic community to fund educational outreach programs targeted to Hispanics.

Glenda Gardner, chief of the DHHS Bureau of HIV Prevention, told TWT NEWS, "Despite efforts to inform all segments of the population of the risk of HIV infection, the rate of infection continues to rise. We must try to make access to HIV information personal, immediate and interactive. An active outreach program can achieve that objective."

A look at the statistics reveals the need for such programs targeting the Hispanic community in Houston. Out of 561 AIDS cases reported among Hispanics in the Houston area, 77 percent have been attributed to male-to-male sexual contact. However, 16 percent of all children and 11 percent of all women with AIDS in Houston are Hispanic.

The Health Department stressed that proposals should emphasize street outreach and activities designed to assist infected individuals in adopting behaviors that will decrease the transmission of HIV.

Information packets are available at the DHHS Bureau of HIV Prevention. All proposals must be submitted by noon on Friday, March 15 in the Office of the City Secretary of the City of Houston at City Hall. For more information call (713) 794-9338.

HOUSTON SWITCHBOARD ANNOUNCES TRAINING

Sessions Held March 8-10, 16-17; Switchboard Stresses Need for Women, People of Color.

HOUSTON — Gay and Lesbian Switchboard Houston [GLSH] has announced the schedule for its next volunteer training classes, which will take place on two weekends, March 8-10 and 16-17.

The training sessions will involve 34 hours of exercises and activities to prepare volunteers for phone service. All applicants must be at least 18 years of age and must complete both weekends of training to be eligible.

Ron Mohring, Outreach Coordinator of GLSH, explained to TWT NEWS that, while all are welcome to apply, the switchboard is in particular need of women and people of color to volunteer, so that the staff will represent the range of experience and diversity within the entire community.

Those unable to attend training in March may apply for the next training session, to be held in May. Anyone interested in signing up for either class, or obtaining more information about the switchboard, was asked to call GLSH at (713)529-3211, afternoons and evenings every day.

The Gay and Lesbian Switchboard of Houston is an all-volunteer organization providing business and organization referrals, HIV/AIDS information, phone counseling and crisis intervention. The Switchboard also operates a TDD/TTY line for the hearing impaired.

AIN ANNOUNCES NEXT CARE TRAINING

Volunteer Classes Scheduled for March 2 At Dallas Baptist University As Network Expands Care Teams.

DALLAS — As part of its continuing efforts to meet the needs of people with AIDS in the Dallas area, the AIDS Interfaith Network has announced another training session for people interested in volunteering to provide direct home care to PWAs. The class will be held March 2 at Dallas Baptist University.

AIN Director of Client Services Robert

Hensley told TWT NEWS, "We are delighted that DBU has agreed to host this training for us. It signifies the widening scope of AIDS awareness in the city and the growing number of people who want to assist those affected by the disease."

The AIDS Interfaith Network is a non-profit organization whose purpose is to provide the communication network and volunteer coordination that allow religious denominations in Dallas to respond to the AIDS crisis in an effective and caring fashion.

AIN volunteers are organized into "Care Teams" of up to 15 individuals who commit at least two hours a week to helping a PWA with basic household chores and errands. Currently there are over 20 Care Teams in operation around Dallas, two teams in Denton and ten in Fort Worth.

DALLAS GROUPS PROTEST PHILLIP MORRIS EXHIBIT

GUTS, ACT-UP Chapter Sponsor Protest Action Against Corporate Supporter of Jesse Helms.

DALLAS — The Dallas chapter of ACT-UP and the Gay Urban Truth Squad [GUTS] have announced that they will host a protest of Phillip Morris' upcoming exhibition of the Bill of Rights in Dallas.

Phillip Morris, the parent company of Miller Beer, has been the target of a national boycott effort during the past year for the company's support of far-right-wing Senator Jesse Helms of North Carolina. Helms' vehement homophobia, racism and attacks on the arts have been supported by Phillip Morris' contributions.

GUTS, the direct action arm of the Dallas Gay Alliance, has networked with other minority-identified groups and the art community to express the community's outrage of this tarnishing of the Bill of Rights. The objective is to demonstrate the diversity of groups whose rights are being jeopardized by the actions of people like Helms. The sponsoring groups strongly urged community members to support the action and demonstrate their numbers.

The display is scheduled at Fair Park's Automobile Building, and will run from Saturday, March 2 to Tuesday, March 5. In order to maintain an element of surprise, no specific details will be given out over the phone.

OLCS OFFERS WORKSHOP

'Straight Talk About Gay Issues' Emphasizes Positive Approaches & Improving Self-Esteem.

DALLAS — Time is on your side if you were planning to go to the workshop organized by the Oak Lawn Community Services. Originally scheduled for the first Saturday in March, it has now been moved back to May 4, Evilu Pridgeon told Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS.

"The workshop is entitled 'Straight Talk About Gay Issues in the 90s,' and it will be a really special opportunity for communication," explained Pridgeon. "It will be an awareness workshop, in which you can learn healthy ways to deal with today's issues facing the gay community. You will get special tools to use in handling these situations."

The emphasis is on improving self-esteem and taking positive approaches to facing gay issues. Codependency, substance abuse and eating disorders are some of the topics that will be covered as they are manifestations of feelings of isolation and alienation. The workshop offers alternatives such as the importance of a holistic approach to achieve and maintain health. Coming out and parenting issues, as well as religiosity and sexuality will also be discussed.

The workshop will be held at the Center for Community Cooperation, 2900 Live Oak in Dallas. Early registration is \$40 for the day-long seminar, and will include lunch.

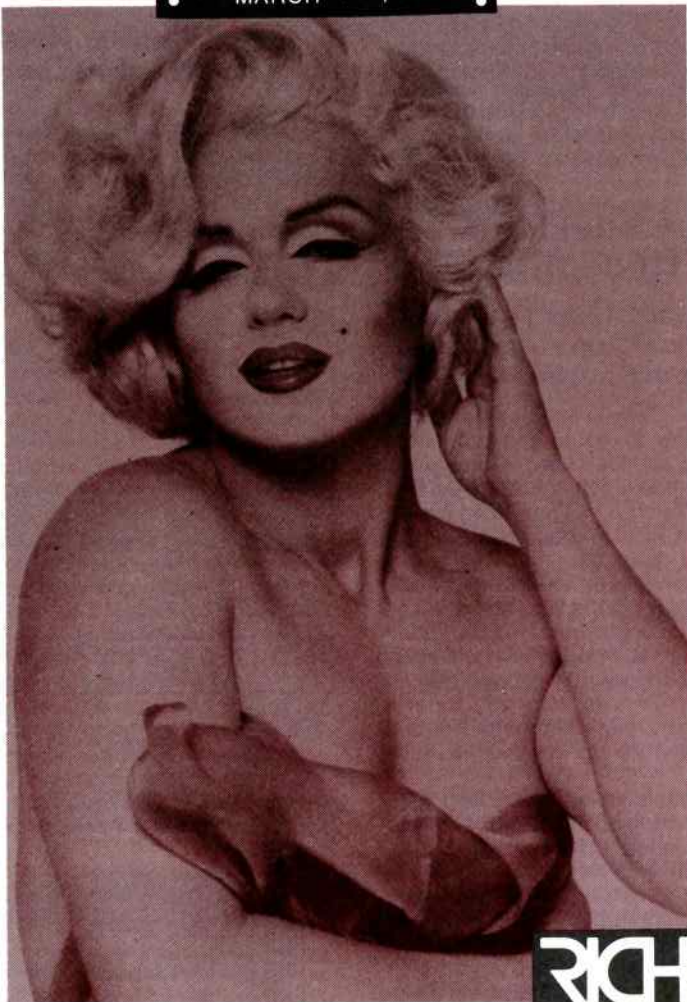

Mr. Jobe also indicated that this applies to all community organizations such as the new bicycle club, "The Chain Gang," for which I delivered flyers to these bars a couple of months ago. He said that none of the four establishments have space for community group flyers and that if he okays one, he has to do so for the others.

This seems to me to be quite unfriendly, since Mr. Armstrong's four businesses are immensely popular and surely he is doing well financially thanks to the gay and lesbian community. Without a doubt, he could find the space if he cared to. If the community supports his businesses, shouldn't he return the favor 100%?

While he does provide space for garage sales and car washes on his property and has welcomed the new bicycle group "the Chain Gang" to start rides from his parking lot, the same organizations are not welcome to leave flyers for the customers to see. It is important for all community organizations to be able to communicate with the lesbian and gay public, and flyers in gay businesses are a great way to do this. Maybe Mr. Armstrong and other business owners will try to support more fully our community organizations in the future. Most already do this, but some, like the four mentioned above, could improve a lot. We'll all gain for it, the businesses themselves and the community organizations.

Jobe Replies

Dear Mr. Hubert:

It greatly concerns me that your perception of my hesitancy in finding space for the "Lambda B.S. Rag," of which you are editor and sole advertiser, has been misconstrued to encompass all "community groups" and what you see as a failure to respond responsibly to requests to display printed materials. To even suggest that our clubs, Heaven, JR's Bar & Grill and the Montrose Mining Company, do not open our arms and hearts to the gay and lesbian community is, at best, misguided. What any business decides to promote within its walls should remain the prerogative of that business and its owner. I assure you, with the constant requests we receive, we do not

take lightly the matter of selectivity. In fact, we fully accept the responsibility to our clientele to keep them informed, and attempt to make what space is available, most effective.

It is not uncommon within our clubs to find printed matter, posters and flyers promoting nonprofit community organizations and their fund-raising events. More often, though, upon authorization, groups are afforded a much higher visibility by being encouraged to utilize space at our clubs to hold fund-raisers, sell tickets to their events, raffle tickets and other items. Other groups, again with authorization, choose simply to meet the clientele and distribute literature, and in some instances, solicit donations. Last weekend alone saw volunteers from the AIDS Foundation Houston distributing "safer sex" information and free condoms in front of Heaven. At JR's, volunteers sold tickets to EPAH's "Leather and Lace" party, proceeds from which will benefit the outstanding work done by the Colt 45's Trouble Fund and the Assistance Fund.

Currently on display in our clubs are posters for the March on Austin and schedules for the upcoming not-for-profit tour of gay and lesbian films hosted by the Montrose Activity Center. Flyers announcing a fund-raiser to "help elect Texas' first openly-gay public official" to the Texas House of Representatives are, as of this writing, available at JR's. Also, as you noted, we regularly make our parking lot available for car washes and garage sales, all of which raise funds for community and/or charitable endeavors.

However, to your request to display the "Lambda B.S. Rag," (which we *have* made space for in the past), we exercise our prerogative to decline for two reasons. Firstly, and this is a reason given to all who ask, the space for display is limited, and very few businesses deem it necessary to create space for items which are of the nature of your newsletter. Secondly, we recognize that the publication of which you are editor also lists your bookkeeping services as the sole advertiser in an "ad" carried in your newsletter. We are not in the business of directly promoting one person's small business venture through the guise of "community service." (I assure you that the requests to promote within our clubs everything from tree-trimming to tax services to carriage rides have been innumerable.) Instead, may we

recommend that you promote your business, as we do ours, through the support of gay and lesbian publications such as *TWT* and *The New Voice*, both of which provide affordable advertising rates.

Please, Mr. Hubert, before you stand in judgment of other successful gay businesses, please realize that those businesses did not rely on free advertising space. Rather, they formulated a marketing and development plan which included a budget for advertising. Though we wish you the best with your bookkeeping services, we are not prepared to use valuable "community groups" space to promote it. We hope that you respect our position, as we respect yours.

No February would be complete without the annual brouhaha that accompanies the announcement by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences of their nominees for outstanding achievement in film for the previous year. Tied for second were Francis Ford Coppola's *The Godfather Part III* and Warren Beatty's *Dick Tracy*, each with seven. Most of the Tracy nominations, however, were in technical categories.

In the Best Picture category, *Dances with Wolves*, *Godfather III*, *GoodFellas* and *Awakenings* all received expected nominations. The fifth movie, *Ghost*, was a surprise. The Academy seldom recognizes films just on the basis of box-office draw, and despite being a highly enjoyable film, *Ghost* is nowhere near being one of the five best of the year. *Alice*, *The Grifters*, *Longtime Companion*, *Mr. and Mrs. Bridge* and *Postcards from the Edge* are all better movies.

One of the biggest slights in recent memory came in the Best Actor category. Overlooked when all the votes were tab-



ulated was Robin Williams for *Awakenings*. This is even more surprising because Williams, a gifted comic, gave the best performance of his career in this dramatic role, and the Academy's inclination to neglect comedies is well known. Speculation abounded that Williams' successful transition to a "serious" role made him a shoo-in. His absence from the final five may have been attributable in part to a desire by Academy members to vindicate his co-star, Robert DeNiro, who was nominated. When the Hollywood Foreign Press Association announced finalists for the Golden Globe Award, Williams was included but De Niro was not.

Joining De Niro as Best Actor nominees are Kevin Costner (*Dances with Wolves*), Gerard Depardieu (*Cyrano de Bergerac*), Richard Harris (*The Field*) and Jeremy Irons (*Reversal of Fortune*). Costner and Irons both gave Oscar-caliber performances and their presence was expected. Depardieu is a minor surprise, but regardless, his American debut in *Green Card* was a better showing and more worthy of a nomination than *Cyrano*. Harris' nomination is a joke and reminiscent of the nod the Academy gave to Max von Sydow in 1988 for *Pelle the Conqueror*, and was certainly due in part to a heavy Oscar promotional campaign for the movie. Absent from films for several years before *The Field*, Harris' return to movie-making was well below the level of Williams, Al Pacino in *Godfather III*, Paul Newman in *Mr. and Mrs. Bridge* or even John Cusack in *The Grifters*.


Most of the Best Actress nominees were anticipated as well. The names of Kathy Bates (*Misery*), Anjelica Huston (*The Grifters*), Meryl Streep (*Postcards from the Edge*) and Joanne Woodward (*Mr. and Mrs. Bridge*) didn't cause a ripple when they made the list of hopefuls.

The appearance of Julia Roberts (*Pretty Woman*), though, caused many a raised eyebrow, and not necessarily with good reason. The Academy frequently rewards personally popular stars who score big at the box office. Some recent examples of this include Goldie Hawn (*Private Benja-*

min) in 1980, Jeff Bridges (*Star Man*) in 1984 and James Garner (*Murphy's Romance*) and Jessica Lange (*Sweet Dreams*), both in 1985. Still, the fact that it's happened before doesn't make it any less frustrating to see worthier thespians like Mia Farrow (*Alice*), Andie McDowell (*Green Card*) and Susan Sarandon (*White Palace*) left off the list.

The race for Best Supporting Actor contained no surprises. Bruce Davison (*Longtime Companion*), Andy Garcia (*Godfather III*), Graham Greene (*Dances with Wolves*), Al Pacino (*Dick Tracy*) and Joe Pesci (*GoodFellas*) were all deserving.

On the other side of the spectrum, the Best Supporting Actress category was filled with surprises. Whoopi Goldberg (*Ghost*) and to a lesser extent Lorraine Bracco (*GoodFellas*) both made the cut as expected. The remainder of the field was comprised of Annette Bening (*The Grifters*), Diane Ladd (*Wild at Heart*) and Mary McDonnell (*Dances with Wolves*). While all three gave performances that may have

been worthy of nomination, there was an unusually large number of strong performances that were equally deserving, if not more so. Among these were Shirley MacLaine's in *Postcards from the Edge*, Winona Ryder's in *Mermmaids*, Dianne Wiest's in *Edward Scissorhands*, Bonnie Bedelia's in *Presumed Innocent* and Joan Plowright's in *Avalon*.

The most questionable selections came, as usual, from the director's branch of the Academy, which failed yet again to nominate a woman for directing laurels. This year Penny Marshall (*Awakenings*) was slighted. The nominations of Costner (*Dances with Wolves*), Coppola (*Godfathers III*) and Martin Scorsese (*GoodFellas*) came as no surprise. Joining them were Stephen Frears (*The Grifters*) and Barbet Schroeder (*Reversal of Fortune*). Schroeder's appearance wasn't that much of a surprise, while Frears' appearance was dramatic because it was unforeseen, not because it was undeserving. Left out in the cold along with Marshall were

Woody Allen (*Alice*), Mike Nichols (*Postcards from the Edge*) and Rob Reiner (*Misery*).

The Academy Award nominations never please everyone and always anger someone. Each year arguments can be made in favor of those not making the cut. Much could be made, for instance, of the fact that some highly touted films like *Avalon*, *The Russia House*, *The Bonfire of the Vanities* and *Presumed Innocent* were shut out altogether in the major categories. Yet for all the posturing over this actor or that actress being robbed of a nomination, attention will quickly begin focusing on the real horse race with that golden statuette waiting at the finish line.

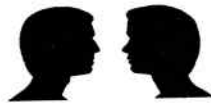

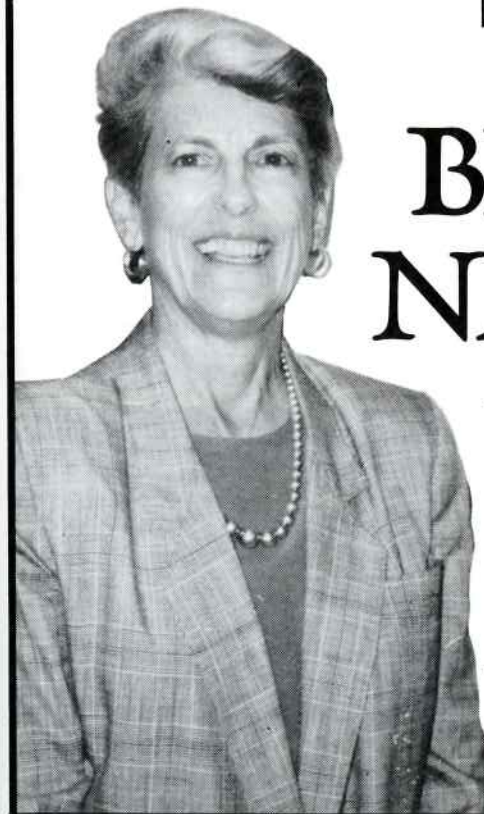

BETTIE NAYLOR

Executive
Director
& Lobbyist
of BOAT

Bettie Naylor, one of Texas' foremost gay and lesbian rights advocates, was born in Wichita Falls, Texas on June 23, 1927 to Carson and Hazel Marlow Steele. She and her sister, Barbara, spent most of their childhood and adolescence in the Wichita Falls area, graduating from Wichita Falls Senior High School.

After pursuing an associates degree from Harden Junior College (now Northwestern University), Naylor married in 1946; the marriage produced three children. In 1950, her husband entered the Air Force, a move which resulted in frequent transfers throughout the world for the family.

It was during a stay in California that Naylor first experimented in politics, taking an active part in that state's efforts

to guarantee John Kennedy's nomination as the Democratic candidate for the presidency.

In 1963, the Naylor family settled in San Antonio, where Naylor continued her political efforts. In 1972, she began to focus her attention on the women's movement, and her position as a precinct committee-woman helped her to push forward with rape and fair credit reforms for women, and to pursue her ongoing fight to ensure

that the state continued its observance of the Equal Rights Amendment. She also found time to support Frances "Sissy" Farenthold in her efforts to become Governor of Texas.

Then, in 1975, Naylor experienced a "lifestyle change," divorcing her husband and adding her rather powerful voice to a burgeoning gay rights movement in Texas—a movement which, she feels, has resulted in a tremendous attitude change since the mid-seventies. In 1975, remembers Naylor, "gays were run out of town," whereas today candidates "are gay-baited, but are elected anyway."

Today Naylor is the Executive Director for the Bar Owners and Associates of Texas [BOAT], and her lobbying efforts have done much to protect the rights of gay and straight businessmen and women throughout the state.

Because of Naylor's untiring efforts and devotion to justice and rights for all Texans, she has, naturally, appeared frequently within the pages of TWT. Some highlights include:

April 24, 1976: "Sampling Texas" reported on the adverse homophobic publicity—including scathing editorials and anti-gay resolutions by county commissioners—surrounding a conference entitled "Gay in San Antonio—a Sense of Belonging," scheduled for later in the month. The conference was part of the American Issues Forum Committee of San Antonio, which was presenting a forum on issues relevant to nine groups, including blacks, women, Mexicans, Indians and gays. Much of the hoopla surrounding the event was the result of San Antonio columnist Paul Thompson's claim that "gays from all over the country were going to descend on San Antonio."



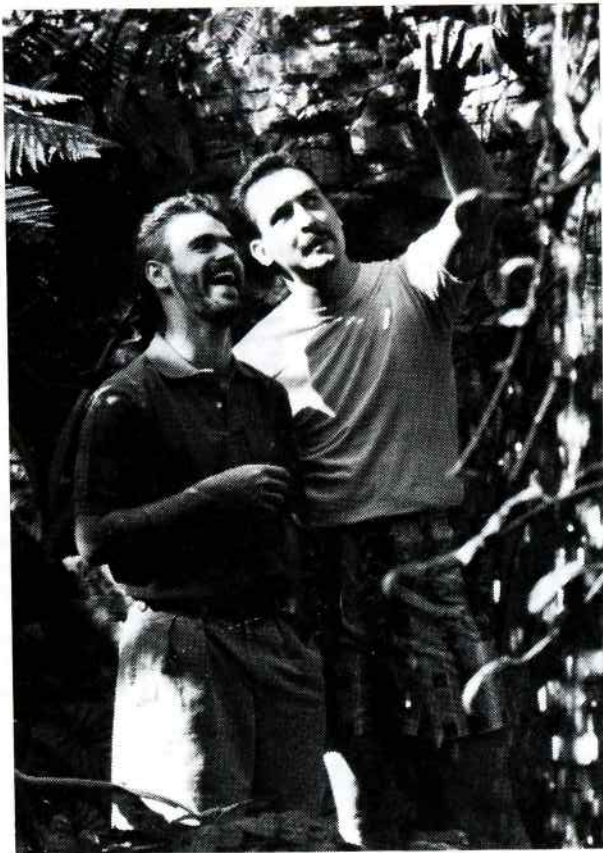
Bettie Naylor (l) and Frank Baker of San Antonio's Gay Switchboard (1983).

Despite death threats and other acts of violence, as well as the Oak Hills Motor Inn's refusal to allow organizers of the event to hold the conference, conference organizers Naylor and Kathy Deitsch asked everyone to remain calm, and assured Texans that the conference would go on as scheduled.

June 27, 1980: TWT NEWS reported on a gay rights resolution which was presented at the Texas State Democratic Convention in San Antonio. Naylor, then with the Texas Gay Task Force, exclaimed, "It's the first time that I can remember that a gay rights resolution has ever reached the floor. Two years ago, it would have been quickly defeated." Only 11 people in Naylor's district voted against the resolution, with 104 delegates voting in favor of it.

March 25, 1983: TWT NEWS reported on a new anti-gay bill trying to make it to the floor of the Texas Legislature. The bill, sponsored by Representative Bill Ceverha of Dallas, would have made all homosexuals lawbreakers. Austin gay lobbyist Naylor pleaded with the gays and lesbians of Texas to notify their representatives of their opposition to the bill, especially since it was so stringent it would have made one man's asking for a kiss from another man a crime.

October 26, 1984: TWT NEWS reported on the formation of the Bar Owners Association of Texas in Austin by owners of 58 gay bars across Texas. The owners unanimously elected Naylor to be the group's executive director and lobbyist. BOAT was formed as the result of Texas bar owners' desire to protect their interests after a new 20% liquor tax increase took effect earlier in the month.

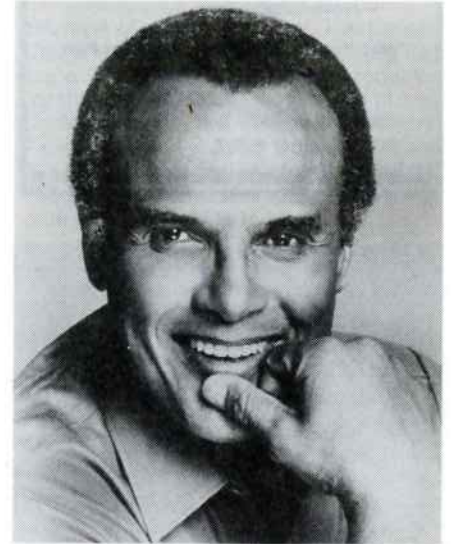

THE NEW FESTIVAL NATIONAL GAY AND LESBIAN 1991 FILM TOUR

Did you ever think you'd have a reason to be grateful to Jesse Helms? Not genuine gratitude of course, as in appreciation for all the fine work he's done (I hope we all recognize sarcasm when we see it), but rather the smug satisfaction of knowing that he and his hysterical ravings have served as one of the catalysts for "Passion, Politics and Popcorn—The New Festival National Gay and Lesbian 1991 Film Tour," which opens its Houston run tonight, March 1, at the Rice University Media Center.

The idea for the New York International Festival of Lesbian and Gay Film, now entering its third year, quickly took fruition among film advocates and aficionados in the Big Apple determined to fight right-wing attempts at censorship of lesbian and gay artists. Held in conjunction with Gay/Lesbian Pride Week, the New York City Festival is now a permanent exhibit.

In order to more effectively counter reactionary elements intent on stifling artistic freedom, a dedicated group of individuals concluded that a highly visible national tour promoting the diverse quality of gay and lesbian cinema would be an ideal way of ensuring that creative expression is brought to all parts of the country,

even in the current political climate. Thus, the New Festival tour was born.

Executive Director Susan Horowitz, Associate Director Nan Buzart and Tour Director William Vance Deare have been at the administrative and promotional helm of the festival since its inception. Serving as Program Directors for the tour are Sande Zeig and Jeffrey Lunger.

Zeig and Lunger, who both have extensive film backgrounds, had the primary responsibility for selecting works to be included on the tour; these selections were then presented to the governing body of the festival for final approval. The end result is a wonderfully multifarious collection of cinematic achievement from eight different countries (nine if you count separately a film produced in East Germany prior to reunification). Besides the United States, artists from Great Britain, Germany, New Zealand, Australia, Canada, Hungary and Denmark are represented. The diversity, however, is not merely based on country of origin. The films being showcased cover a broad range: powerful, sometimes scintillating dramas; intense stories wrapped in sultry *film noir*; off-beat and refreshing comedies; stylish collections of shorts; thought-provoking experimental works; and probing and revealing documentaries. Taken as a whole, the

body of feature-length and short films being presented is an arresting, invigorating display of the lesbian and gay experience.

In deciding which works to include, the directors made a clear effort to use a variety of sources. Some of the titles are well recognized—*Longtime Companion*, *Desert Hearts*, *Common Threads*, *Parting Glances*—and are included in this festival for their historical impact, their significance and even their creators. A good many others are imports discovered by affiliates of the festival through a network of independent filmmakers or at cinematic exhibitions such as the Berlin International Film Festival, the world's largest showcase for independent filmmakers.

Several of the films, including the opening night features, *Comrades in Arms* and *Nocturne* [see following reviews], have come to the festival through Maya Vision, a London-based production and distribu-

tion company which, since its founding in 1983, has been providing an avenue for gay and lesbian filmmakers to bring their works to the screen.

Not quite as voluminous a task as selecting the content of the tour was the decision on which cities should be included. In considering the many potential sites, the governing body gave a great deal of weight to the presence of a host organization to facilitate planning and the existence of facilities with the appropriate technical equipment and contractual availability. Also taken into account was the

fact that some large gay urban areas, namely San Francisco and Los Angeles, already have sizable festivals of their own. Additionally, geographic distribution and the occurrence of any local festivals were considered before the final stops and dates of the tour were announced.

The final schedule begins with Seattle, February 15-21, followed by Houston, March 1-10. Then the tour will move on to Washington, D.C., March 15-24, Boston, April 5-14 and Atlanta, April 19-May 2.

In Houston, the Montrose Activity Center is serving as host organization. The festival tour has taken advantage of the substantial support network MAC already has in place, including the use of mailing and phone lists as well as volunteers to ensure the smooth operation of the festival.



In discussing the future of the touring portion of the festival, tour director Vance Deare stated that the hope is to make the gay and lesbian film tour an annual event, with different tour stops every year. "We are also working on the development of an international tour along the same lines," said Deare.

Operating under a nonprofit status, the festival tour hopes to gather enough support from around the country to establish itself as a permanent fixture, traversing the nation as a voice for artistic freedom and a voice for our community.

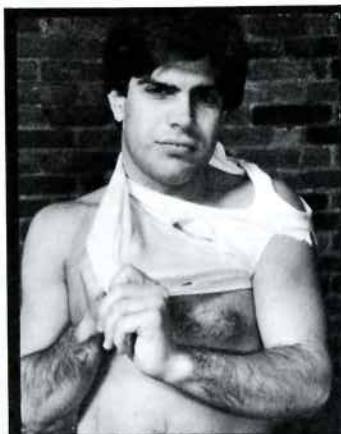

Looking for Langston and Comrades in Arms

So many documentaries are nothing more than video lectures, that when one comes along that enlightens without being pedantic, it's a joy to watch it, to absorb, learn, even be entertained. Two such works are being presented as part of the New Festival National Gay and Lesbian 1991 Film Tour. They are *Looking for Langston*, which chronicles the life, love and work of Langston Hughes, one of America's renowned black poets, and *Comrades in Arms*, in which six gay men and lesbians recount their experiences in the British armed forces during World War II. Both documentaries employ stylized dramatizations, but the resemblance ends there.

Looking for Langston is a provocative narrative of the life of Hughes, who made his greatest literary contributions during the Harlem Renaissance of the 20s, 30s and 40s. He was an unabashed homosexual who reveled in his lifestyle and drew eloquent praise from his contemporaries. In this retrospective of his work, we find his words spoken over lushly erotic sequences. At times the narration is combined with blues melodies by Essex Hemphill which lend a cultural and period force to the dramatizations. The sequences themselves combine archival footage with beautifully photographed images which underscore and enhance the text of the poetry. *Looking for Langston* does justice to the aching grievance and unforced contentment that mark Hughes' work.

Comrades in Arms might seem mere fluff by comparison, but a comparison is not in order. This is a far more "traditional" documentary. The men and women you meet relay their experiences with a humor, frankness and confidence that is both casual and forceful.

For the most part, these are memories fondly shared. One elegant gentleman happily recalls the time he was informed of his call to service. Friends, he tells us, informed him he didn't have to go if he would admit his homosexuality; they urged him to get out. "Get out!" he shrieked, "but I want to get in!" If there is any complaint at all about *Comrades*, it's that there isn't enough of this type of light banter.

The other stories are, to be sure, equally informative, and *Comrades in Arms* is a warm account of the life of gay men and

women in a time when discretion was not a choice but rather a necessity.

Nocturne

The use of parallelism is an enticingly effective means of underscoring the dramatic evolution of a protagonist, and in *Nocturne*, one of two short British films being shown on opening night of the film tour, it strikes a cerebral chord.

It opens with Marguerite a woman of striking appearance, contemplating the death of her mother. She sits at a piano in a drawing room, and a mellifluous Chopin nocturne elicits telling memories of her childhood. She recalls the stern formality of her mother and the unrestricted affection of her tutor. We also meet Sal and Ria, a carefree young couple with little regard for social niceties.

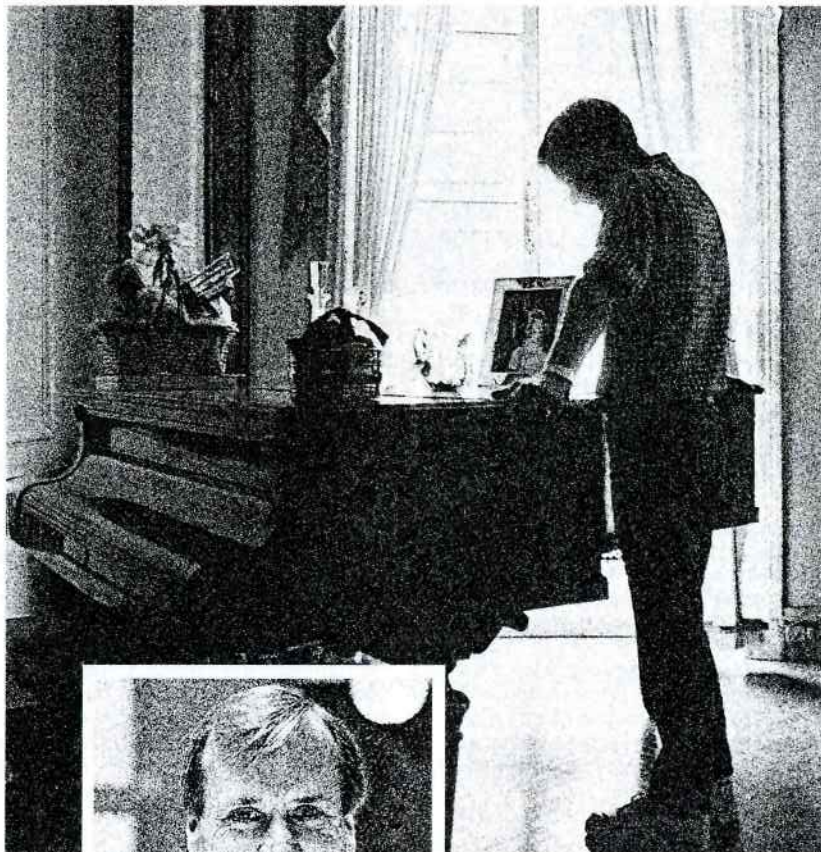
A rainstorm brings their lives together in what develops into a moment of discovery for Marguerite, and on the screen it is played out as a powerful juxtaposition. There is the young couple awakening latent desires in Marguerite interspersed with Marguerite's recollection of her mother's ardently suppressed passion slowly exposing itself through contact with the tutor.

The rainstorm itself serves as a symbolic cleansing for Marguerite, but as a sinister circumstance for her mother. This is exemplified by the French doors leading into the drawing room from outside. The mother has left them shuttered to keep out the elements, and when young Marguerite and the tutor run in through the doors to escape a sudden shower, her reaction is initially indignant. But the dripping tutor is unintentionally captivating to the mother. The mother acts on an impulse, and then angrily dismisses the tutor.

Marguerite, however, wants the doors left open. When the storm begins in the present, Sal and Ria seek shelter through the open doors. The same wet and alluring sexuality that was present on the tutor is found on the vagabond couple, but Marguerite invites them in, setting the stage for her self-discovery.

Director Joy Chamberlain has crafted an earthy, pleasing tale of two very different emotional responses to the same feeling of desire. She has succeeded in making this short film intelligent and evocative. It is a supple, sublime work that for many may trigger memories of their own self-realization.
