February of 1989. The couple shared an apartment at the Lantern Village Apartment complex under a six-month lease in the lover's name.

When that lease expired, they moved into another unit at the same complex, this time renting in the plaintiff's name. She began working in the complex's video library, which loans out video tapes to tenants.

One day the manager of the complex asked her to stop by the rental office. There the manager told her that the office had had a complaint that she was gay, and that the manager couldn't have "that kind of conduct" in the complex. She would have to leave her job at the video library and move out of her apartment.

The plaintiff protested that she was a very private person and never made a public display of her sexuality, but the manager would not relent, and added that since she no longer had her job at the video library, she would have to vacate her apartment. At this point, the plaintiff still had more than six months left on her lease.

The manager also claimed at one point to have received several letters from other tenants complaining about the fact that the tenant was gay, but would not produce them when the plaintiff asked to see them.

According to the plaintiff, until she was asked to vacate her apartment, she had never had any trouble of any kind with the complex, and in fact had received many compliments from other tenants on her work in the video library. She believes that another tenant informed the manager that she is gay.

The plaintiff's suit makes claims for dismissal, eviction and defamation.


MDS GIVE MONTROSE CLINIC DONATION



have given the Montrose Clinic and its affiliates \$10,000, the largest single cash donation ever received by the clinic.

Executive Director Ralph Lasher told TWT NEWS, "We deeply appreciate the generosity of these five physicians. Our ability to serve our clients has been severely tried for the past year by a severe cashflow crisis. This substantial donation will go a long way toward allowing us to breathe a little easier."

The Montrose Clinic, a private, nonprofit organization, is comprised of the Thomas Audette Memorial Clinic, which offers testing for HIV and sexually transmitted diseases, and runs an aerosolized pentamidine program; the Audette Center, which offers health education and followup services to clients and also operates an HIV/STD hotline and referral service; and the Houston Clinical Research Network, which coordinates trials of experimental AIDS treatments and also conducts blood and lab work in connection with such trials.

LAMBDA LEGAL DEFENSE FUND SPONSORS SEMINAR

Stoddard, Eittlebrick to Present Workshop on Legal Protection Of Domestic Partnerships.

DALLAS — Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund, a national organization dedicated to advancing the rights of gay and lesbian people as they are affected by

legal issues and court decisions, is sponsoring a seminar in Dallas on March 24.

"Domestic Partnerships: Legal Protection for Alternative Family Relationships" will focus on medical powers of attorney and guardianships, relationship agreements and wills. Panelists will include local lesbian and gay attorneys. Lambda Executive Director Tom Stoddard and Legal Director Paula Eittlebrick are scheduled to talk briefly about recent legal challenges on behalf of lesbian and gay people. The two will also present a workshop on "Domestic Partnership or Marriage: Priorities and Strategies for the Lesbian/Gay Community."

Other sponsors of the seminar include the SMU Women's Center, the SMU Gay/Lesbian Student Organization and the Texas Human Rights Foundation [THRF], which is currently trying to eliminate Section 21.06 of the state penal code, the anti-sodomy statute.

The primary sponsor of the seminar, the Lambda Legal Defense Fund, is the oldest lesbian/gay legal organization in the country. Lambda "has a long history of involvement in Texas," according to SMU law professor Jane Dolkart, a member of Lambda's board of directors. The organization is currently involved in two cases involving Texas residents. In one, a Houston man with AIDS is suing his employer for imposing a lifetime cap of \$5,000 on any AIDS-related health insurance claims. That case has been appealed to the Fifth Circuit Court.

Lambda is also representing Mica England, the woman who applied with the Dallas Police Department but was turn-



HOMOPHOBIA SEMINAR COMES TO TEXAS

*Center for Homophobia Education
Sponsors Five-City Tour of
'Homophobia in Religion & Society.'*

TEXAS — The Center for Homophobia Education, a New York-based group whose aim is to combat fear of lesbian and gay people through education and enlightenment, is bringing its one-day seminar, "Homophobia in Religion and Society," to Texas on a five-city tour in April and May.

The seminars will be facilitated by Robert Nugent, who has a masters in theology from Yale Divinity School and is editor of *A Challenge to Love: Gay and Lesbian Catholics in the Church and Prayer Journey for Persons with AIDS*; and Jeannine Gramick, who has a Ph.D. in education and whose most recent book is *Homosexuality in the Priesthood and Religious Life*. Both seminar facilitators have been speaking and writing on the topic of homosexuality since 1971.

According to the facilitators, "Homophobia is an unwarranted fear of homosexuality in oneself or others—usually based on ignorance, stereotyping or other psychological factors. Unfortunately, some religious teachings are often used to justify homophobic reactions. In its mildest form, homophobia can be a general un-comfortableness about the topic; its most virulent forms can result in physical violence against persons and property."

Nugent and Gramick hope their seminar will help counter fear of gay and lesbian people by promoting sound education and discussion of the issues surrounding homophobia. They recommend the seminar to clergy, pastoral workers, educators, counselors, parents, youth ministers,

Families Affected by HIV.*

DALLAS — The Board of Directors of Open Arms has announced the appointment of Susan Streng as its Executive Director.

Steve Casey, Chairman of the Board of Open Arms, told TWT NEWS, "We are thrilled to have Susan on board. She combines great compassion and respect for people in need with strong management skills."

Streng was the first director of the YWCA Women's Resource Center and a director of the Women's Center of Dallas. She also served as Centers Administrator for 34 nutrition sites in the Dallas County Nutrition Program.



This weekend the clever lads of the CLASS outreach team will be out and about distributing condoms and safer sex brochures to promote the next Sexuality Workshop on Tuesday, March 19, at 7 p.m. at the AFH office. We will also give away free "Safer Sex Mini-Packs" to anyone who'll consider hosting a group of their friends to a "Safer Sex House Party." The mini-packs include safer sex guidelines, proper condomwear techniques and a variety of condoms in different colors, sizes and flavors.

Safer sex is still a major issue in the gay community, no matter which city you are in. I realize that many of us feel that we've been inundated enough with AIDS in our lives that maybe enough has been done to educate our community. I have heard hundreds of excuses for being unsafe, but the fact can't be denied that you *will* become infected if you have unprotected sex. We all need the facts and need to support each other. It is what you *do* with another person that places you at risk and not whether or not you know your partner's HIV status. This shouldn't be the issue...if you play safe.

I encourage everybody to call me to learn how to make safer sex not only a healthier option but also one that can make your sex life more fun and exciting. Our programs are available free to the public—although donations are always welcome. These programs are offered in most of the major cities throughout the state. The flag, it's not just for endorsing war, it's also a way of remembering our dead.







MARCH ON AUSTIN



For Lesbian-Gay Equal Rights

DATELINE: Austin, Texas, 1989. "Thousands of gay men and lesbians marched up the main street of Texas—Congress Avenue—to the State Capitol last Sunday, April 30, 1989, demanding their rights." Thus began the lead TWT NEWS story describing the historic first March on Austin for Gay/Lesbian Equal Rights.

Two years later, organizers of this year's March on Austin hope for an even bigger turnout for the whole weekend of March-related events beginning on Friday, March 15. There will be receptions hosted by local, state and national lesbian and gay organizations, and on Saturday, various groups will conduct workshops on matters of interest to gays and lesbians. A "Dance on Austin" is scheduled for Saturday evening at the Crest Hotel Ballroom. A complete schedule of weekend events follows. As in the past, the Lone Star Symphonic Band and Dallas' Oak Lawn Band will be leading the March. Performing together as the Texas Lesbian and Gay Freedom Band, the two groups will include representatives from Dallas, Houston and San Antonio. The keynote speaker at the rally following the March will be Urvashi Vaid, Executive Director of the National Lesbian/Gay Task Force. Houston Gay and Lesbian Political Caucus President Larry Lingle and Linda Morales, lead plaintiff in the 21.06 case, will also address the rally.

Organizers of this year's gathering believe that by marching on the Capitol, gays and lesbians will be making a statement, not only in Texas but to the entire country. They can visit with their elected officials and make known their views on issues of importance to gays and lesbians in Texas.

GOALS OF THE MARCH ON AUSTIN FOR LESBIAN/GAY EQUAL RIGHTS

- Adoption of laws to provide for protection of the equal civil rights of gay and lesbian people and specific laws banning discrimination based on sexual orientation.
- Legal recognition of lesbian and gay relationships, including parental rights and adoption, domestic partnerships and same-sex marriages.
- Support for the right of lesbian and gay people to serve without discrimination in the Armed Forces, National and State Guard, including law enforcement agencies throughout the state.
- Passage and enforcement of hate crimes legislation to end violence and harassment based on prejudice and hatred, especially as it applies to lesbian and gay people.
- Legislative repeal of Section 21.06 of the Texas Penal Code which criminalized lesbian and gay people for adult consensual homosexual conduct.
- Reproductive freedom and the right to control our own bodies.
- An end to discrimination against persons living with HIV, ARC and AIDS.
- Substantial increases in funding for and easier access to effective AIDS prevention education, funding and expansion for research and a major revision of the Texas health care delivery system, especially for the indigent.
- Access to and funding for new therapies, treatments and drugs for HIV disease.
- An end to all social, economic, judicial and legal oppression of lesbian and gay people, and people of every race, gender, ability, class, ethnicity, ideology, transgender orientation and sexual orientation.
- An understanding that the struggles of gay and lesbian people are affected by racism and sexism which oppress people of color and women. The liberation of lesbian and gay people is intricately linked to the struggle against racism, sexism and discrimination on the basis of ethnicity. We call for an end to these problems on all levels within the lesbian and gay community and in the larger society, and support the right of self-determination for all people.
