## NELSON-TEBEDO STARTS WOMEN'S HEALTH PROJECT

*Program Addresses Health Needs  
Of Lesbians with HIV Testing,  
Mammogram & Pap Smear Testing.*

DALLAS — The Nelson-Tebedo Clinic is responding to what it feels is a serious lack of health care services for lesbians with a new program addressing women's health concerns.

“We realized that it was something that was needed in the lesbian community,” said John Thomas, Executive Director of the AIDS Resource Center [ARC]. In an interview with Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS, Thomas talked about the Women's Health Project, now being conducted at the Nelson-Tebedo Clinic.

“We recently conducted a survey in the women's bars, at MCC, through Lesbian Visionaries and others, and we found that the women in our community were not receiving the type of health care they needed,” Thomas said. “We had over 400 answers to our questionnaire, which is considered a good response.”

Thomas said there are two reasons lesbians do not get the type of health care they need. First, they sometimes think they aren't faced with the same problems heterosexual women have; and second, they don't feel their personal physicians are sensitive regarding their sexual orientation. Thomas noted that the majority of Ob-Gyns are men, and many lesbians wait until they have a real problem to visit their doctors.

## TEXAS NEWS

On Wednesday nights, women can receive HIV testing and counseling, as well as information on upcoming mammogram and pap smear testing. Local doctors are volunteering their time to coordinate the project, but there will also be a referral list available of doctors who are sensitive to lesbian health issues. Jill Havens, project coordinator, added that teams of women would be trained to learn to communicate with doctors about their own needs.

Thomas related a story he described as a “classic example” of how lesbians often hesitate to seek medical treatment. A woman who had had vaginal problems for over three years was not tested for HIV infection because her symptoms didn't conform to the Centers for Disease Control's list of AIDS-related infections. When she did finally get tested, it was discovered that her T-cell count was dangerously low.

“We found out there was a real need in the community, and now we are trying to meet it,” Thomas said.

## GOVERNOR APPOINTS BILL SCOTT TO TEXAS BOARD OF HEALTH

*Houstonian Is First Openly Gay,  
HIV-Positive Public Official;  
Sees Harvey Milk as Role Model.*

HOUSTON — Houstonian Bill Scott, CSW-ACP, has been appointed by Governor Ann Richards to the Texas Board of Health. Scott's appointment was unanimously confirmed by the Senate on March 7.

Governor Richards had indicated she wanted someone for the post who was actively involved in efforts on behalf of all HIV-positive Texans to receive assistance from the state Department of Health.

Scott's name was repeatedly mentioned in this connection by gay leaders around the state including State Rep. Glen Maxey.

Scott believes that he will do a good job because he is a social worker, a psychotherapist, an openly gay man and HIV positive. He said he was proud to be Texas'

first openly gay and HIV-positive public official, and feels he can present a strong presence for lesbians, gays and HIV-positive people, as well as champion many other causes affecting the state.

Scott said he plans to use Harvey Milk as a role model since "he did outstanding work for lesbians and gays, as well as other underrepresented groups."

## AUSTIN IMMUNE CLINIC CUTS MOST SERVICES

*Chronic Financial Problems Force Elimination of Acupuncture, Might Force Total Shutdown.*

AUSTIN — The Austin Immune Health Clinic, which has sought to provide HIV-infected people with alternative therapies such as acupuncture, chiropractic services and massages, has announced that it will be ending most of its services to PWAs.

Cliff Taylor, the clinic's Executive Director, said that the agency had been overwhelmed by an ever increasing demand for its services and was plagued by chronic money problems. He also indicated that if the clinic's financial situation deteriorates further, it might have to shut down completely.

The clinic's six acupuncturists, who had been working on a volunteer basis, have

all left and the acupuncture program has been closed down.

The Austin Immune Health Clinic, second only to AIDS Services of Austin in the number of HIV-infected people it serves, has for three years offered a roster of alternative therapies to people who have exhausted conventional medical options. The clinic offered its services at reduced rates, with clients paying \$3 to \$15 a visit.

Taylor stressed that the immune center will continue its counseling program.

## TROY PERRY TO SPEAK AT TRINITY MCC

*Founder of Worldwide Church Ministering to Gays Visits Newly Renamed Arlington Church.*

ARLINGTON — The Reverend Elder Troy D. Perry, founder of the United Federation of Metropolitan Community Churches [UFMCC], will be visiting Trinity Metropolitan Community Church Friday through Sunday, March 22-24. The Rev. Jo Crisco, Senior Pastor of Trinity, which was formerly known as Mid-Cities MCC, informed TWT NEWS that Perry would speak at the 7 p.m. services on Friday and Saturday, and at the 11 a.m. service on Sunday.

Perry, the spiritual leader of 30,000 Christians worldwide, is also a human rights activist who has authored two books, *The Lord Is My Shepherd and Knows I'm Gay* and most recently *Don't Be Afraid Anymore*, which was released in the fall of 1990. *Don't Be Afraid Anymore*, which is available through Trinity MCC, tells the story of the UFMCC, one of the most theologically innovative and fastest-growing Christian churches in the world today.

A reception will follow Friday's service, and on Saturday the 651 Arlington will host an autograph party for Rev. Perry from 1 to 3 p.m. Saturday's event will benefit the local church's building fund.

In speaking of the church's recent name change from Mid-Cities to Trinity MCC, Rev. Crisco said, "We are thrilled by the name because it represents our intention to continue the growth and mission of our congregation." She added, "We invite everyone to join us for this series of services to hear and meet Rev. Perry. Quite honestly, we expect overflow crowds at each service. Come and join the fun."

The song "Proclaim God's Glory" will be performed to the accompaniment of a flag ceremony representing all the nations in which MCC has missions. ## HCRN PRESENTS 'MEDICAL STEPS'

*Workshops Aimed at Laypersons To Cover Treatment, Testing Aspects Of HIV Illness.*

HOUSTON — In an effort to help educate Houstonians about the medical side of the AIDS epidemic, the Houston Clinical Research Network [HCRN] will be conducting a series of workshops entitled "Medical Steps." These workshops will cover a variety of topics and are geared toward people with no medical background who are confused about the various blood tests, medical procedures, medications and treatments used for HIV.

Ralph Lasher, Executive Director of HCRN, told TWT NEWS, "We hope to present these workshops on a rotating basis, depending on the success of the first few. Our goal is to cover four major topics over a four-month period and then repeat them."

The first workshop will be presented by Dr. Wayne Bockmon on Saturday, March 30 at 2 p.m. at the Montrose Clinic. The topic is "Common Lab Tests for HIV and What They Mean." On Saturday, April 27, Dr.

## MCCR Not Sexist, Racist, Anti-Gay

Dear TWT:

Today, as members and friends of Metropolitan Community Church of the Resurrection gathered at the Wortham Center downtown for our victory celebration, we were greeted by four people carrying signs and wearing ACT UP shirts. One had a bullhorn and was shouting to the people entering the Wortham Center, "Sexist! Racist! Anti-Gay! He's the God to whom you pray!"

While I'm sure these people really believe what they scream, I'd like to set them straight on their "facts," so that the next time they feel they need to shout something through a bullhorn, they'll know what they're talking about.

"Sexist": MCCR has on staff and in the congregation many women without whom the church could not function. Ms. Carolyn Mobley, our assistant to the pastor, is a very important part of our church family, as was Reverend Gloria Root, the woman who preceded her. Many of the staff positions are held by women and they are equally important. I fail to see where the protestors can justify their claim of "sexism."

"Racist": Did I mention that Ms. Mobley is black? Surely a racist church would not put a black woman in such a position...let alone devote an entire Sunday night service to the celebration of Black History Month. And, I might add, in no other church have I seen such a diverse mixture of races, cultures and socio-economic status as I have seen in the seats at MCCR. If the people who were protesting had just come *inside*, they'd have seen it, too.

"Anti-gay": This is purely ridiculous. How can a church with a gay pastor, gay staff, gay board of directors and mostly gay congregation be called anti-gay? I don't see their point.

"He's the God to whom we pray": First of all, we at MCCR do not refer to God as "He." In just one more point against their claims of "sexism," MCCR practices what is known as "inclusive language," recognizing that God is neither male nor female, but all things. If these protestors are saying "He," then they are obviously assuming we pray to a male God. We do not.

I can understand that they should be upset at a congregation that worships a sexist, racist, homophobic God. I would be, too. They must have gotten the wrong information. So, to those four people who have been misinformed, I offer an invitation: Come to MCCR one Sunday morning and actually *go inside*. Listen and learn. Then, if you still believe all the things you are saying, feel free to continue saying them. I'm all for free speech, provided you can back up your claims.

## Save HCHD AIDS Budget

*A copy of the following letter was sent to all persons on Body Positive/Houston's mailing list and to Lois Moore, President of the Harris County Hospital District [HCHD].*

—Editor

The budget for the Harris County Hospital District, which includes all HIV treatment programs at Thomas Street Clinic and at the county hospitals, has come under intense pressure recently by some county commissioners. The quality of care for indigent HIV/AIDS patients, which is already marginal using national averages of dollars spent per patient for comparison, would suffer as a result of budget cuts. Cuts in the budget are unjustified since the county and city health departments are projecting a 150% increase in the total number of AIDS cases by 1995. The number of patients relying on the county may increase even more because of the inaccessibility of medical insurance or inadvertent loss of insurance.

# SERENITY

*Serenity*, by Paul Reed; nonfiction, 112 pp.; Celestial Arts News, P.O. Box 7327, Berkeley, California 94707; paperback, \$6.95

Unchanged, however, is the pervasive fear and tragedy created by AIDS, and the impact the disease has had on the world and on individual lives. This is what *Serenity* addresses, with hope.

The essays are believable and personal. You don't have to be HIV-infected, or even at risk, to appreciate the universality of experiences Paul Reed shares. Growing up, growing older. Remembering (albeit not very accurately) the Good Old Days. Always calculating the odds, always hedging our bets, balancing anticipation and despair.

Never minimizing the urgent need to develop and protect one's physical health, the author inspires us towards what we can perhaps better control: our spirituality, serenity, harmony. Accepting things as they are, being nice to people, looking forward to the future without dwelling on the hurtful past. And then, what a relief when we can recognize each other, even in the midst of this chaos, as human beings, gentle people with feelings, all of us doing the best we can to survive, from meditation to angry protest, from early intervention to the fight for better treatment, for equal rights to the opportunity to lead healthy, hopeful lives.

Reed is a realist and he dares us to prepare, through study and consideration, to live in reality, to determine our limitations

Change the word on the cover to "cancer" (or any other disease) and this second edition of *Serenity, Challenging the Fear of AIDS—From Despair to Hope*, looks like one of those "inspirational" books that church members give their elderly relatives who have been ill for a long time.

It is not. This is a powerful work. It is, as it claims, support and guidance for people with HIV, their families, friends and caregivers. It is also good advice for people not in crisis. It is a relief from the unrelenting statistics, projections, headlines and carnage. Its argument that we should resolve to live life as fully and richly as possible, and to have as much, if not more, meaning in our lives than ever before is presented in an encouraging and credible manner.

In the three years since the original edition of *Serenity* was published, we have seen tremendous upheaval related to the AIDS epidemic: from the riotous demonstrations of ACT-UP to the founding of Mother Theresa's hospice for people with AIDS.

and then stretch them as far as possible, and then coexist with them.

He acknowledges that this is complex, time-consuming and painful. He advises that "if you feel confused, anxious and burdened with knowledge you wish you'd never gained, then you are, in fact, dealing with AIDS in the only realistic way there is." Which leads to abandoning the struggle to hide, which in turn leads to getting on with life and whatever circumstances it deals you, which means letting go, allowing transformation to begin.

Transformation is the process of becoming peaceful, willing to trust your developing reality, acknowledging the restrictions and operating maximally within them. Transformation has to do with health, physical, mental and spiritual.

Transformation lends itself to hope. Reed defines hope as "to want something when there exists the expectation or possibility of fulfillment." To hope is to take deliberate steps towards improving/stabilizing health in order to survive until more hope is forthcoming. Hope stimulates action, action that is required to survive. To help your friends survive, to comfort those who won't, to help alleviate fear, to help educate the public, or just yourself.

And in doing that, you discover that, yes, your world has changed, that indeed life is not what you had planned, but that in renewed hope, in peace of mind and good spirits, you have serenity, and the hope that is necessary to raise enough of a ruckus to cure this pandemic. We must all try to live to see the day.

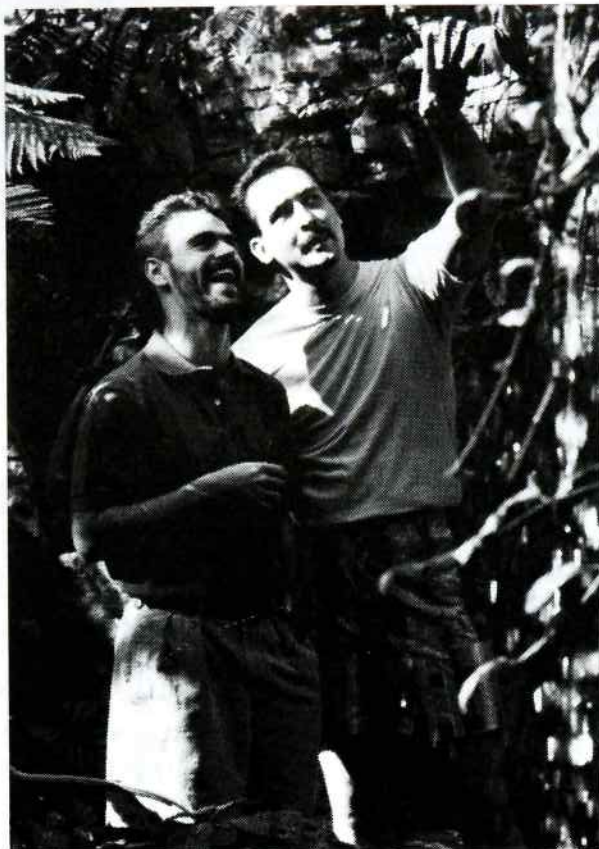

Six special people had a good reason to celebrate recently. They were Restart's first graduating class of 1991.

Restart, a nonprofit organization started in Dallas in 1983, gives homeless people an opportunity to start again, literally. The organization teaches life management and job search skills to those willing to make a commitment to the six-week training program.

Restart's newly acquired facilities in Oak Cliff allow the group more space to

They talked about their "treasure maps," collages of magazine photos illustrating each person's goals, dreams and plans for the future.

Each of the graduates exhibited a newfound confidence and ambition for the future. Recurring themes included homes and possessions in their homes, jobs and education, and lifemates and children.

Captain Jack, a former naval navigator, had photos of faraway places he had traveled to and would like to visit again. Photos of a lighthouse to guide him and his own boat were prominent in his collage. "And here is a rose," Jack said, "which represents the traditional symbol for the quality of life as we would like it to be."

Another graduate, Tammy, said, "This is the door into my new world. And I'm just like this puppy [pointing to another photo], which is climbing each step, one at a time."

Larry stressed the themes of peace and serenity in his new life. He also mentioned his love of nature, and his desire to own a home where he could entertain friends. "I am tremendously grateful to this program," he said. "It has made me more serene and loving."

Ray also mentioned his newfound serenity, and added that he had just received his 90-day chip from Alcoholics Anonymous. Anyone entering the program must be drug and alcohol free for at least 30 days prior to acceptance.

"Up is fun, and I don't have to wait for it!" exclaimed Tracy. He plans to study computers in school, and eventually buy a Southwestern-style home.

Susan got a job as an apartment manager trainee, and now has her own apartment to begin furnishing. "I want to be active in the outdoors," she said, "and have slim hips and legs. I've learned to place great value in myself." Pointing to one of the photos in her collage, she added, "Every step of this ladder brings you closer to the top, and I will be at the top."

Captain Jack summed up things for the entire class. "This program has kept us from being ambushed or distracted while we were seeking our goals. We want to continue to pass our success down the line, once we get our 'sea legs.' We would like to come back and be facilitators and trainers ourselves. Restart is not just about getting a job, but it is about getting your life back together."

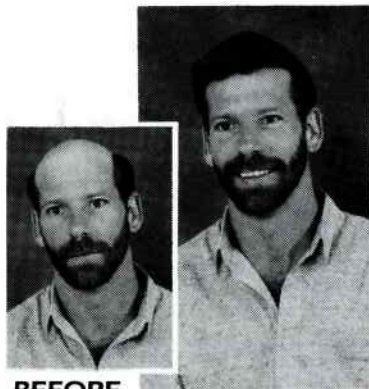

wearing a shirt made entirely of chains in 1972. There have been shocking and wonderful acceptance speeches, such as Sacheen Littlefeather declining for the absent Marlon Brando in 1973 and Maureen Stapleton ensuring she covered everyone by thanking "my children, my family, my friends and everyone I ever met in my entire life" in 1982. And who could forget Katharine Hepburn's electrifying appearance in 1974, or Cher's stunning everyone by presenting an award dressed in knee-high boots, a bejeweled loin cloth, a metal brass plate, a bare midriff and an exploding Mohawk hairpiece? It's all part of the Oscar magic and this coming Monday night should be no different.

This year's telecast will be in the capable hands of Billy Crystal, who serves as solo emcee. Crystal did a great job last year, and the use of a single emcee lends some continuity to the show that suffers whenever the producers use a multi-emcee format.

To a certain degree, the suspense has already been eliminated in some of the categories. *Dances with Wolves* is far and away the front-runner, and there is no doubt that it will take most of the awards. But it won't be a clean sweep for the Western epic. *Dick Tracy*, for instance, is a virtual shoo-in for Art Direction, and *The Hunt for Red October* is a strong contender for Sound Effects.

Still, *Dances with Wolves* has everything the Academy loves in a motion picture—grandeur, spectacle, glory. It's movie-making at its very best, and it will win top honors. If, however, you favor underdogs, then go with *Awakenings*. It was highly visceral and will lock up the votes of those members who prefer evocative performances. *GoodFellas* and *Godfather III* are movies in the same vein, and they will more than likely split what few votes this genre can attract under *Dances'* shadow. *Ghost* shouldn't even be on the list.

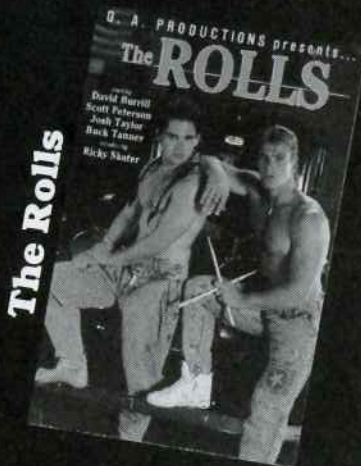
The artistry and mechanics behind the triumph of *Dances* also make Kevin Costner a best bet as Best Director, and no

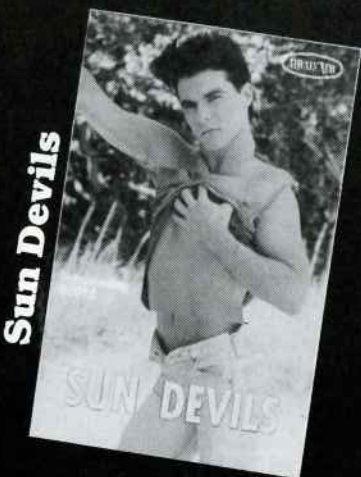
To be sure, there have been many Oscar telecasts that reeked of boredom, but chances are always good that you'll catch one of those treasured Oscar moments. There have been unforgettable numbers like Mitzi Gaynor's powerhouse dancing to the tune of "Georgy Girl" in 1967 and Isaac Hayes' blistering rendition of the "Theme from *Shaft*" on an illuminated organ while

wonder. Though only a novice, Costner handled the logistical nightmare of 3,500 buffalo, 300 horses, two wolves, 42 wagons, 35 tepees, 125 crew members and almost 500 extras. He took a story in a genre that has not been popular in three decades, used a cast of unknowns and a script that had a sizable portion of dialogue spoken in Lakota Sioux with subtitles, and he created a masterpiece. He earned it; he deserves it; he'll win it. But if Costner comes up short—and a backlash against him is always possible because of his tremendous popularity—then the only reasonable alternative is Martin Scorsese for *GoodFellas*. He did an incredible job and an award for him is past due. Francis Ford Coppola was honored for the second installment of his *Godfather* saga; he won't get it for Part Three. Stephen Frears [*The Grifters*] and Barbet Schroeder [*Reversal of Fortune*] are destined to be also-rans.

The run for Best Actor has, in the space of a few short weeks, gone from a walk-away to a tight race. Initially, it appeared that Jeremy Irons would win easily for *Reversal of Fortune*. His performance was outstanding and widely lauded. Equally important, the Academy hates to honor anyone too much in the same year. No one has ever won both directing and acting laurels, and only one actor has ever directed himself to victory. History, it seemed, was stacked against Costner, so Irons looked like he had a lock.

Enter Richard Harris. Having used a hefty advertising campaign to secure a nomination for his melodramatic pretensions in *The Field*, Harris has now launched full-throttle into a self-promotion tour. He's done all the morning news shows and several of the daytime talk shows. At every opportunity he talks about his return to Hollywood. In Tinsel Town, they're eating it up.

The Academy has a strong sentimental streak whose influence is felt particularly among older members. Costner's supporters, however, are steadfast. Harris' vote will come primarily at the expense of Irons. With Robert De Niro (*Awakenings*) and Gerard Depardieu (*Cyrano de Bergerac*) both extreme long shots, it'll be a close three-way finish. But I'm putting my money on Irons.

The Best Actress race has also become a three-way contest, but it's not nearly as tight as for their male counterparts. Julia Roberts (*Pretty Woman*) was rewarded for

starring in a blockbuster, and Meryl Streep (*Postcards from the Edge*) gave her usual fine performance, but neither is a likely winner. Kathy Bates was superb as the obsessed fan in *Misery*, and she is clearly the front-runner. Her only serious competition will come from Anjelica Huston, who was enthralling as the tawdry mother in *The Grifters*. The wild card here is that Academy sentiment. Joanne Woodward as the helplessly devoted wife in *Mr. and Mrs. Bridge* could surprise, but she's won before so there won't be a large outpouring of affection in her favor. Go with Bates.

More so than in any other category, the Best Supporting Actor run is already decided. Bruce Davison's magnificent portrayal in *Longtime Companion* and Joe Pesci's tour de force as the violently erratic mobster in *GoodFellas* would have made them the two top finishers regardless. However, Davison has become a symbol for our community and the struggle against AIDS all over the world. Moreover, the substantial role our community plays in all aspects of the film industry makes it thoroughly inconceivable to think that Davison would not win. The other nominees, Andy Garcia (*Godfather III*), Graham Greene (*Dances with Wolves*) and Al Pacino (*Dick Tracy*) may as well not show up.

In the scramble for Best Supporting Actress, the winner will not be the woman who gave the best performance. Whoopi Goldberg as the zany and reluctant medium in *Ghost* will almost certainly win, but of all five nominees her showing was the weakest. Goldberg, however, has a lot of appeal and since this is the first film to make good use of her comedic talents, she'll walk home with the prize. Lorraine Bracco as a tempestuous wife in *GoodFellas* and Mary McDonnell as a white woman raised by the Sioux in *Dances with Wolves* are outside possibilities. Annette Bening (*The Grifters*) and Diane Ladd (*Wild at Heart*) will, I'm sure, dress nicely for the affair.

The contest for Best Song is way up in the air. Nothing is harder to gauge than the musical tastes of Academy members. Sometimes they go with big show-stopping tunes, while at other times they'll favor crooning ballads that are soon forgotten. Of late, though, they've shown a marked preference for pop songs. Based on this, I'll eliminate "Promise Me You'll Remember" (*Godfather III*) and "Some-

where in My Memory" (*Home Alone*); heck, I can't even remember these two. "Blaze of Glory" (*Young Guns II*) fits the bill, but it's probably just a bit too rock-and-roll. That leaves "I'm Checking Out" (*Postcards from the Edge*) and "Sooner or Later, I Always Get My Man" (*Dick Tracy*). Is the Academy ready for Madonna? Of course they are, but Meryl Streep sang "I'm Checking Out" herself, and that number is better than Madonna's torch song. I think it'll be "Checking Out."

For Best Original Screenplay, it's a two-way heat between Woody Allen for *Alice* and Barry Levinson for *Avalon*. The Academy loves Allen and his quirky ways, and he might take yet another writing award. However, there's a well of sympathy building for Levinson because his semiautobiographical work failed to make the cut in so many other categories. The others, Bruce Joel Rubin (*Ghost*), Whit Stillman (*Metropolitan*) and Peter Weir (*Green Card*) have been honored with nominations. Let's go with Allen.

For Best Adapted Screenplay, it's no contest. Michael Blake (*Dances with Wolves*) will win on the strength of the film as a whole. Nicholas Kazan (*Reversal of Fortune*), Nicholas Pillegi and Martin Scorsese (*GoodFellas*), Donald E. Westlake (*The Grifters*) and Stephen Zaillian (*Awakenings*) at least get their names mentioned.

Finally, Best Foreign Language Film. I've only seen two of these movies. *The Nasty Girl* was the better of the two, but I know the Academy, and enough of the members saw *Cyrano de Bergerac* to nominate Depardieu for Best Actor. That alone makes it the film to beat, but it won't lose. I haven't seen *Ju Dou*, *Journey of Hope* and *Open Doors*, and will offer no comment on them.

The Oscars are excellent fodder for a public that loves its stars. The show thrives on itself and is a huge showcase for an industry that loves itself and a public that loves it even more. Perhaps it's been taken out of perspective, as Janet Maslin of *The New York Times* complained when she said the award seems "to have been confused with the Nobel Prize." Putting it more accurately was Leroy Johnston, a member of the Academy Press Committee who said, "The Academy Award is the Nobel Prize of motion pictures." That it is, Mr. Johnston, but this show is a helluva lot more fun to watch.

The Lone Star Volleyball Association will make a donation to a local AIDS charity that evening. Following the banquet, video highlights of the tournament will be shown at Rich's. Also on Saturday, the Brazos River Bottom is hosting a brunch to bring tournament activities to a close.

"A tournament of this caliber is roughly an \$11,000 endeavor," said LSVA president Ken Newberry. "A successful tournament is determined by excellent playing facilities, tight organization and the support of official sponsors and advertisers. We strive to make the event mutually beneficial," he added.

One goal of the tournament is to positively affect commerce in the community. Many businesses expect higher traffic over the three-day weekend as a direct result of the tournament.

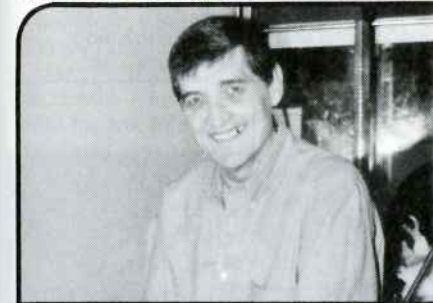

He is survived by his mother Raynell Parks, two sisters, Marilyn and Mary K., his brother Mike and his eternal friend Michael.

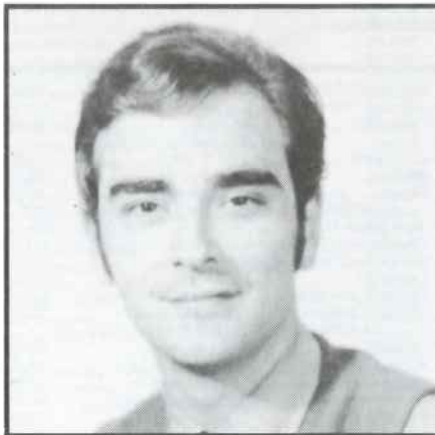

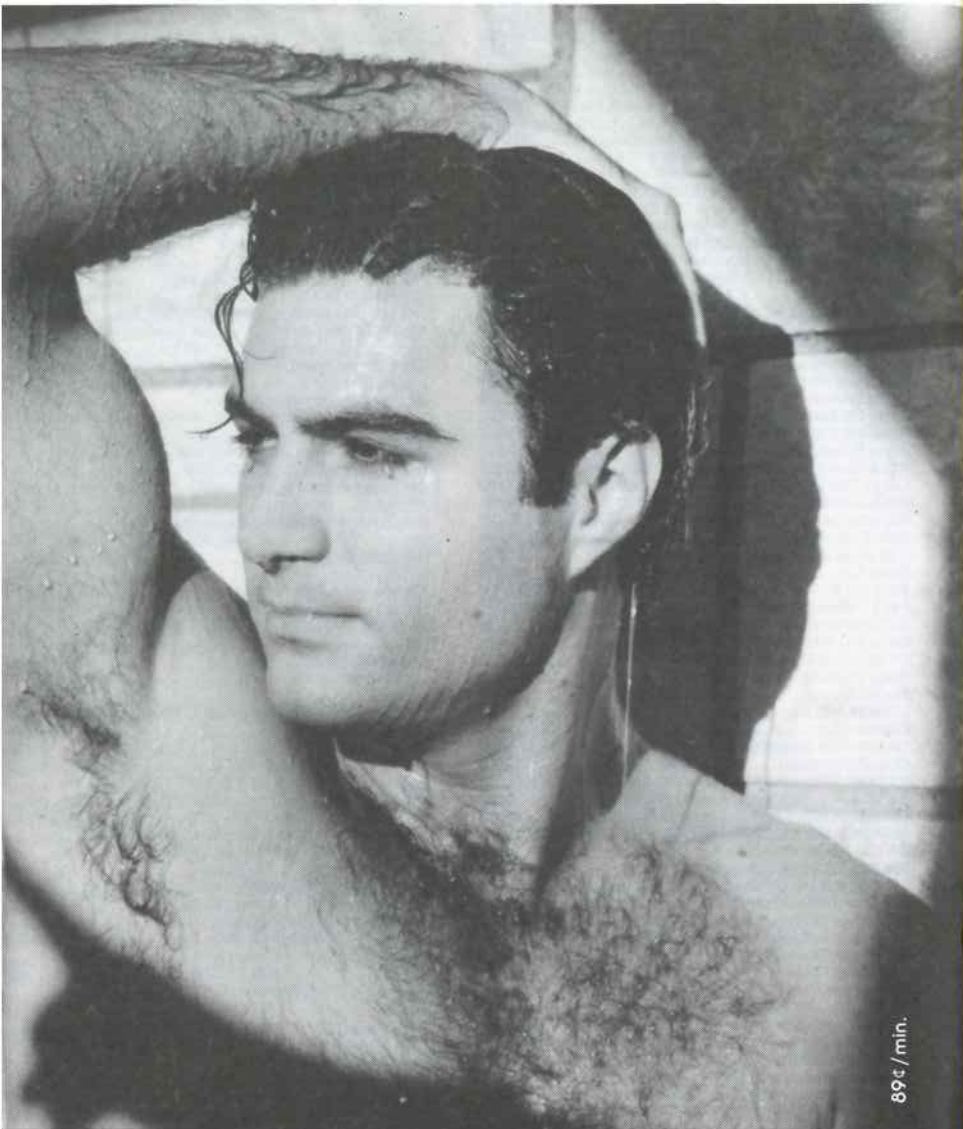

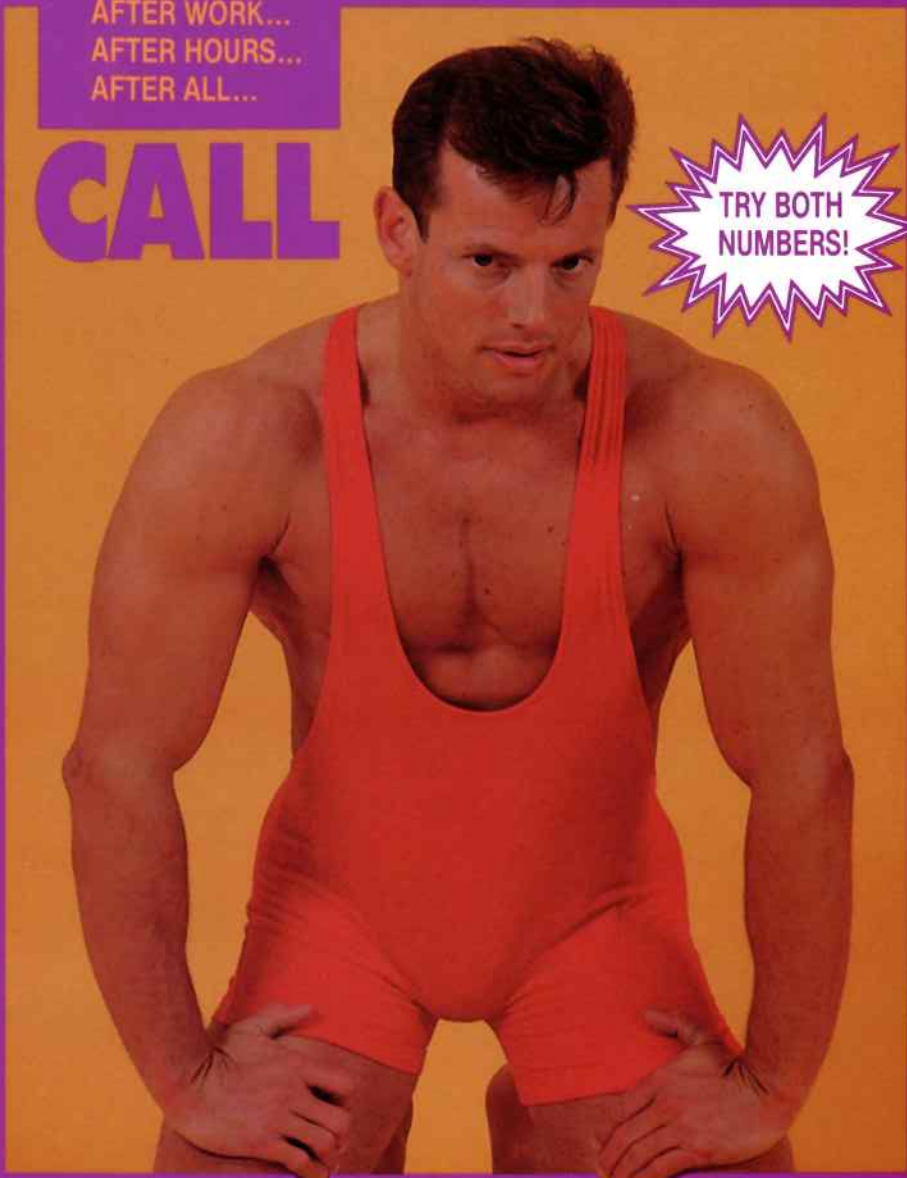
