DALLAS CITY COUNCIL ELECTION TENTATIVELY SET FOR NOVEMBER

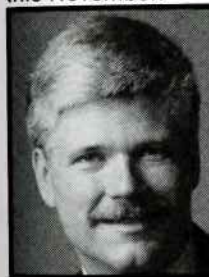
*AIDS Resource Center Executive
Director Thomas Planning Run
For Seat on Redesigned Council.*

DALLAS — The election for the new Dallas City Council, originally scheduled for May 4 under the plan imposed by Judge Jerry Buchmeyer, has now apparently been postponed until November of this year.

Buchmeyer had originally ruled that the 10-4-1 plan for dividing up city council, which had been approved by voters, did not provide adequate representation for minorities and was therefore unconstitutional. That plan provided for 10 members elected from districts, four members elected from four large districts and a mayor. Judge Buchmeyer substituted his own plan, under which city council would be composed of 14 members elected from districts and one mayor.

The city then appealed Buchmeyer's decision and the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals in New Orleans ruled in the city's favor. The court said that the city of Dallas should have been allowed to wait and let the Justice Department review the 10-4-1 plan. The Justice Department would decide whether the plan met the requirements of the Voting Rights Act.

As the situation now stands, if the Justice Department approves the city's original 10-4-1 plan, elections will be held this November.

John Thomas, Executive Director of the AIDS Resource Center, is strongly considering a run for city council, and has already done much of the advance work necessary to place his name on the ballot.

"Even though the gay community is dispersed around the city, we have definite

pockets of concentration in many of the new districts," Thomas told Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS. "Some people see this as a strength, but we must learn our lessons, and make our demands up front, before we elect candidates."

Thomas said that, based on the donor base for the Resource Center, the area with the greatest concentration of gay and lesbian voters was in the 75219 zip code area, the heart of Oak Lawn. Other areas of the city with large gay and lesbian populations were 75206, East Dallas; 75204, East Oak Lawn; 75214, East Dallas/Lakewood; 75235 North Oak Lawn/Love Field; and 75211, Oak Cliff.

Thomas says he has done all his homework as a potential candidate for city council, distributing petitions to garner enough signatures to be placed on the ballot.

"In my 11 years in Dallas, I have seen politicians court the gay vote but when they were elected, they didn't marry us," Thomas said.

"I feel that the gay community is different from the time when Bill Nelson ran for city council. There is a new feeling of self-esteem. The community wants someone there to represent their issues and to do it well," Thomas concluded.

Thomas considers his strengths as a potential candidate to be his background as a corporate vice president of the *Dallas Times Herald* and a desire among voters for a change on Dallas City Council.

GLPW ELECTS GAY PRIDE GRAND MARSHALS

*Morales Chosen Female Grand
Marshall, Harrington & Jackson
Male Grand Marshals.*

HOUSTON — At its March 19 meeting, Gay and Lesbian Pride Week '91 chose the Grand Marshals for this year's pride celebration. Linda Morales is female

Grand Marshal, and Jack Jackson and Gene Harrington tied for the position of male Grand Marshal.

Morales is a Hispanic community activist and the lead plaintiff in the 21.06 case to overturn the state sodomy statute. Harrington, a law professor at Texas Southern University, founded the AIDS Equity League of Houston and has served on the boards of GLPW and the Lt. Governor's Task Force on AIDS. Jackson is a longtime volunteer and community activist who has been involved with the Diana Foundation, EPAH and many other organizations.

Honorary Grand Marshals are Katy Caldwell, Harris County Treasurer; and Marvin Davis, also known as Lady Victoria Lust, who is active in fund-raising for PWAs. Also, Jack Valinski was chosen male co-chair.

In other business, members were reminded that GLPW will have a booth in front of Mary's at this spring's Westheimer Arts Festival April 20 and 21. The next business meeting of GLPW is Tuesday, April 16 at 7 p.m. at the Metropolitan Multi-Service Center, 1475 West Gray.

DIFFA-DALLAS BENEFIT

*Fourth Annual Dallas Collection
Features Live, Silent Auctions of
Designer Jackets for AIDS.*

DALLAS — "Tonight is really our kick-off party," said Steve Burrus of DIFFA-Dallas. Standing just outside the doors of the totally remodeled Village Station, Burrus exclaimed, "Here we go again!"

In a conversation with Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS, Burrus described the plans for this year's Dallas collection. The show, now in its fourth year, is a special auction of custom-designed Levi jackets, featuring work by major clothes designers from around the world. Last year's event raised over \$140,000.

The Design Industry Foundation for AIDS [DIFFA], begun in the mid-'80s in New York, now has chapters throughout the country. People in the design industry pool their talents to raise money for AIDS by holding special events year-round.

"This year we will have some new and different things," Burrus said. "Besides the jackets, we will have custom designed

furniture, art work and jewelry to bid on. The show will be held at the Dallas Convention Center Arena, in the round, so no one will be too far from the stage."

"Tickets are within everyone's price range," Burrus added, "from \$35 for general admission, to \$150, which includes a special party ten days prior to the show at which patrons can meet some of the designers." Included in this year's show is work by Bob Mackie, Nicole Miller, Geoffrey Beene, Victor Costa and Alexander Julian.

HOUSTON NIGHTCLUB OWNER SLAIN

*Owner of Studio 13, Galveston
Clubs Found Shot to Death
In Fort Bend County.*

HOUSTON — Wendell Lee Statchuk, the owner of Studio 13 in Houston as well clubs in Galveston, was found shot to death in an undeveloped area in Fort Bend County on Wednesday, March 15.

Authorities said Statchuk, 33, had been killed sometime Tuesday night. He was shot several times in the neck with a small-caliber gun. His 1991 Ford pickup was originally missing, but was later found in the parking lot of an apartment complex in southeast Houston.

Statchuk's attorney of several years, James Stephen Keyser, 38, has been charged with the crime. A motive for the crime has not been determined.

AIDS EQUITY LEAGUE EXPANDS BOARD

Governing Body Enlarges Board Of Directors to 25 Positions, Begins Work on 1991 Agenda.

HOUSTON — The AIDS Equity League of Houston has voted to expand its board of directors to 25 positions from the current 17.

The eight new board members, chosen at the league's March board meeting, include Ralph Lasher, Executive Director of the Montrose Clinic, Associate Pastor of Metropolitan Community Church of the Resurrection and a member of the Ryan White Community Panel; Robert Rosenberg, a local attorney and co-founder of Houston Art for AIDS, as well as a board member of the Texas Human Rights Foundation; Chris Bacon, an associate with the law firm of Vinson and Elkins and vice-chair of the Board of Houston Gay/Lesbian Political Caucus [HGLPC]; and Denise Parkins, a medical service provider who has been active with Cure AIDS Now and Action Against AIDS, and is presently working with Queer Nation.

Also appointed to the board were David Fowler, a past president of HGLPC who was instrumental in the formation of Action on AIDS, GUTS and Queer Nation, and was the principle organizer for the national Cure AIDS Now Project last summer; Ed Bradshaw, a social worker who is a board member of the Greater Houston AIDS Alliance and serves on the Montrose Counseling Center Board of Directors; Tom Schnor, a pharmacist who has been active with AIDS legislative agendas and is working on an employer awareness project for the HIV Service Organization and the Houston Chamber of Commerce; and Maurice "Mo" Jones, vice-president of Body Positive, who represents the gay at-risk population on the Ryan White Panel.

The AIDS Equity League is a nonprofit organization composed of community members who work to ensure that the gay at-risk community will be adequately represented in city and county AIDS funding and service organizations.

One of the League's main goals in 1991 is the adoption of a state legislative agenda that includes securing funding for insurance premium subsidies and obtaining support for drug access for indigents.

Other items on the agenda include pushing for adoption of a city/county AIDS education and prevention plan; attracting more clinical and alternative drug trials to Houston; and urging the Centers for Disease Control in Atlanta to do a basic study assessing the risk of female-to-female HIV transmission.

RAY HILL ARRESTED IN CONFRONTATION WITH POLICE

Longtime Community Activist Asks for Jury Trial on Assault, Disorderly Conduct Charges.

HOUSTON — Longtime community activist Ray Hill was arrested Friday, March 15 and slapped with one charge of disorderly conduct [verbal] and two charges of assault.

It all began when Hill received a call from the clerk at a Houston adult bookstore the day before, Thursday, March 14. The clerk told him that several police officers had just come into the store and forced their way into the theater, harassing customers. Hill said he asked the clerk to contact him again if the police returned.

Hill made a trip to the bookstore later that night and again the next day after the police had visited the bookstore again. He said he wanted to talk with the police about efforts being made by businesses in the area to cut down on prostitution and narcotics traffic.

The police had already left when he got there, so Hill and the clerk left the store. They noticed several police cars parked at a nearby fast food restaurant, and decided to go in. The sergeant he had missed back at the bookstore was there, and Hill went over to his table to discuss with the patrolman the efforts of the bookstore and other businesses in the area to reduce crime. But the sergeant was unwilling to

listen, and got upset when Hill referred to his officers as "goon squads."

The sergeant jumped up and walked away. Hill tried to continue the conversation, and at this point the officer threatened to arrest him. Hill challenged him to do so, claiming there were no grounds for it. "You can't arrest me for what I say... You'll have to come up with something better than that. But if you think that's a good idea, go ahead and arrest me."

The officer then cuffed him, and Hill demanded to know what he was being charged with.

Hill claims that at one point one of the officers complained, "It's too bad we can't beat him like they do in L.A.," and another said, "The faggot don't understand he's in the wrong neighborhood."

After a good deal of waiting, Hill was taken to jail. The next morning, Saturday, March 16, he learned he had received one charge for disorderly conduct [using abusive language to a police officer] and two assault charges [one with his stomach, the other by spitting]. Hill pled not guilty, asked for a jury trial and was released on personal recognizance.

HOUSTON OPERA PRESENTS 'MAGIC FLUTE' BENEFIT

*Proceeds of Performance Go
To Bering Foundation Programs
For People with AIDS.*

HOUSTON — The Houston Grand Opera will give a preview benefit performance of Mozart's *The Magic Flute* on Wednesday, April 3 at 8 p.m. in the Wortham Center's Brown Theater. Billed as "An Evening of Hope," the opera and pre-performance gala dinner will benefit the Bering Community Service Foundation's programs for PWAs.

This production of *The Magic Flute* is co-directed by Maurice Sendak and David Dunn Bauer. Sendak, a noted author of children's books and illustrator, also designed the sets and costumes for the production. Bauer is director of the New York City Opera.

Browning-Ferris Industries and Enron Corporation are the premier underwriters of "An Evening of Hope." Browning-Ferris

chairman William D. Ruckelshaus said, "It is crucial that all of us, corporations as well as individuals in the community, come forward to address the threat of AIDS." Ruckelshaus and his wife Jill are chairing the opera and pre-performance dinner.

The Bering Community Service Foundation, founded in 1987, provides major funding to help those who test HIV positive or have AIDS. Programs include a dental clinic, day care center, support groups, counseling and emergency financial aid. The *Magic Flute* benefit is part of a fundraising program instituted by Bering executive director Beverly Lerner to expand the foundation's services.

The Trouble Fund, which was implemented in 1988, obtains all of its funding through voluntary contributions. It has a client list of approximately 300 and expends between \$3,500 and \$5,000 a month. All work is handled by volunteers, and the organization has no paid employees.

Among their many charitable activities, the Colt 45's sponsor the Lady Victoria Lust PWA Projects. At present members are distributing food baskets to supplement the assistance PWAs receive from Stone Soup. The baskets contain a ham, eggs, canned vegetables and other articles to provide Easter dinner for recipients. These baskets are made possible by the fund-raising efforts of the Lady Victoria Lust PWA Easter Hams for Hams Project.

Deja Vu Time

The following letter is addressed to Larry Lingle, president of the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus. Lingle's response follows. —Editor

Dear TWT:

Darn if it isn't deja vu time! I remember with clarity dukin' it out with another community representative in these pages over the self-same issue a few years ago. As the then manager of the French Quarter Theatre, I challenged Gary Van Ooteghem's appearance in Houston courts on behalf of and in support of Houston's brand of the Gestapo in the precedent-setting "Men's Room Trial" at the time of the famous "Siege of Montrose" incident. It was his appearance at that trial against other scions of the community such as Warren Duncanson, "Disco" Grandma and others who were giving freely of their time and energy in support of our civil liberties that prompted that fight.

Now I find myself in a similar position—addressing the mistaken notions of another "leader" of our community who is using his privileged position of paid-for thought-molding in his space in the *New Voice* to whip up a consensus of opinion that it's okay to turn our backs on specific civil-liberties issues that are indeed the "bedrock" of our fight for freedoms.

Like Gary, when challenged, Lingle retreats via his paid advertising in the *New Voice*, March 15, 1991 to a cowardly position of trying to twist the issue around to the stance that he is entitled to his opinion. (I believe Gary used the phrase "opinions are like assholes, everyone has one"—prompting me to suggest that his opinion must have been derived from his.)

I can't remember anyone ever saying Lingle wasn't entitled to his opinion (however stupid) and his dumb device of trying to "lump" this debate together in the same frame of reference with the

antics of [Leslie] Perez and "her" crowd is a blatant attempt to distort thinking away from what we were talking about in the first place! Most right-thinking folks around probably won't fall for that trick. It was silly of him to try it.

Mr. Lingle needs to lay his personal vendetta against Ray Hill (for having opposed his effort to "stack" the recent HGLPC elections—which, let's face it, is the root cause of all this brouhaha) aside. He needs to clear his thinking long enough to realize that as the titular head of the most prestigious political leadership organization in our community, he is taking a position diametrically opposed to the official (voted for and passed!) position of his organization, and as its head should either step down from that position or cease his opposition to it.

In either case, Mr. Lingle's privileged position of community responsibility is badly served by (1) his disregard of the facts, and (2) his vicious reference to those who dare to disagree with him as being somehow associated with Nazi Germany. Both positions are, to this writer, inexcusable, and both are far removed from reality and call into question Mr. Lingle's ability to continue to serve this community in a position of trust and high responsibility.

Ray Hill—the issue I raised some weeks ago was that, contrary to Hill's claim, the issue at stake is not one of the First Amendment. The new Houston SOB ordinance (actually an amended older ordinance very similar to Dallas' SOB ordinance with which I am also well acquainted) attempts to regulate adult businesses by a form of zoning. My point initially was that Hill was asking our community to defend arcade-oriented adult bookstores with their encouraged sex-on-premises for the benefit of absentee owners in St. Louis and elsewhere, and then after it became the law.

I have always opposed all such SOB ordinances. I supported Hill's resolution to that effect before the HGLPC. However, once it became law the caucus resolution ceased to be in effect—the caucus did not vote to support violation of the law. I do not stand in conflict with my position on the ordinance or my position as president of the caucus. I became active in the caucus because of its democratic structure, and for that very reason Barnhart, as a new member of the caucus, is free to pursue whatever course of action he desires under its bylaws.

As for the second Lobo ad which compared Leslie Perez and Ray Hill, it was and is my opinion that the antics of these two when they act against gay businesses are comparable to those of the Nazis at the beginning of their campaign against Jewish businesses. By threats and intimidation, Perez and Hill have each singled out gay businesses for attack.

As for my "vendetta against Ray Hill," Barnhart, without either knowing or talking to with me at any time (other than his one strange phone call to me) boils down my actions as being rooted in Hill's supposed opposition to my effort "to stack" the last caucus election. Mr. Barnhart, you give too much credence to Hill's opinions, and Ray gives himself more credit than deserved in believing that his actions carry any weight with me.

For the record, I did not attempt to stack any election. Hill's lone effort at that election was his vain effort to oppose David Fowler for a board seat. David, a former HGLPC president, was completing a one-year term and seeking another. Hill received about 25 percent of the vote, a rather dismal showing against someone he had defeated for president two years earlier.

Frankly, Barnhart seems to be someone

emerging from the shadow of Ray Hill with the latter's somewhat limited grasp of the facts. And I doubt that our community is much moved by Mr. Hill's lobbying efforts, for money, on behalf of shadowy adult bookstore owners. Apparently Hill is in his element among the sexually charged arcades fending off, even with his stomach, the relentless charges of the boys in blue.

I am in agreement with those who believe protecting oneself from HIV is an individual's own responsibility. I also agree that sometimes discussing one's HIV status can be difficult and painful. HIV, as we all know, is a serious health threat to everyone. We must all make the effort to curtail its spread through safer sexual practices and education. I can remember the fabled "good ole days," and wonder if the price that has been and is being paid by thousands of men, women and children was worth those long nights filled with drink, drugs and casual sex?

One of the ways I have found to deal with the HIV issue is to simply assume that *everybody* is HIV-positive and play safe all the time. I have not noticed any significant differences in sexual pleasure at all; they say the biggest sexual organ is between the ears, and I believe that is true. There are new safer sex products becoming available all the time. Recently I saw some flavored condoms and even some that glowed in the dark!

STICKS AND STONES QUEERS AND GAYS

by Phil Johnson

Part I

*"Sticks and stones
may break our bones,
But words, if we allow them,
can hurt even more."*

The following TWT HIGHLIGHT is Part I of a trilogy that looks into the names and labels gay and lesbian people have applied to themselves, as well as the labels that the rest of society has stuck us with. Phil Johnson of the Dallas Gay/Lesbian Historic Archives explores the history and the controversy behind this fascinating issue. Parts II and III will run in succeeding issues.—Editor

A recent writer to TWT COMMENT, who speaks for many in the gay community, objected to the name "Queer Nation." "I thought in the name of progress we had dumped the word 'queer' a long time ago." The writer might be right, and he's certainly to be respected for his well-stated opinion. But if not queer, what shall we call ourselves?

The first word to come to mind is "gay." But that word has not always been considered "tactful" either. Although there was never an organized effort, we—you and I and thousands of gay men and lesbians before us—made it so. We made it so over the objections of bigots who like to say, "Remember when the word 'gay' meant happy?"

No one knows how the word "gay" came to be associated with homosexuals, but one thing we know for certain: We didn't "appropriate a perfectly good word," as the bigots like to claim. According to *Time* magazine, "...in the 19th century 'gay' had a connotation of immorality or racy living. Example: 'gay woman' was a euphemism for 'prostitute.'" *Time* goes on to say, "The term did not come into common use until the 1950s." (That might be true for *Time* and for straights, but the term was very common in our community decades previously.)



Contrary to what *Time* claimed, there are lexicologists who believe the word comes from the 16th-century French word "gai," the feminine form of the word "gai," used to describe the male. The term was hurled at our people in hatred and ridicule. For want of a better word, gay people accepted the label. In time we did for "our word" what the Christians did for their Sign of the Cross centuries before.

There was a time when thieves, murderers, prostitutes and the followers of Christ had a cross burned or cut onto their foreheads. Those so branded were despised, spat upon, mutilated, raped, bashed and murdered. (Sounds kind of like what our people have endured for centuries, doesn't it?) Despite the abuse, the Christians defiantly displayed (flaunted?) their signs as if to say, "Get used to it; we're here to stay." Today the cross is revered all over the world.

Much to the frustration of some, though not all, Christians, gay men and women are proud to be called "gay." Like the early Christians who refused to retreat into the catacombs from which they had emerged, gay men and women are just as adamant about not returning to the dark closets from which we came. And because of this pride and the fact that "truth will out"—despite the lies of the world's Anita Bryants ("Homosexuals cannot recreate, therefore they recruit from the young.") and the Jerry Falwells ("So-called gay folks would just as soon kill you as look at you.")—gay people, by not cowering, are becoming an accepted people. And so is that word. Our word.

As I understand it, Queer Nation is determined to gain the same acceptance for the word "queer." It's their intention to disarm the bigots by wearing the intended insult proudly. They may be right; they may be wrong.

Either way, we cannot run from that word. But we can stand up to the bigots. Eleanor Roosevelt once said, "No one can make you feel inferior without your consent." Similarly, no one can insult us if we refuse to allow mere words to hurt. It's up to us.

SPRING STARGAZERS — Since springtime offers a new view of the sky, stargazers should waste little time in heading for the outdoors. The first thing you'll notice is that the Big Dipper has shifted on its axis. It has climbed into the northeast sky.

The evening sky is flanked by two very bright, silvery planets—Jupiter in the east and Venus in the west. Both are brilliant. In fact, Venus and Jupiter are so bright they even penetrate the pollution and lights of the city.

A much dimmer planet, Mercury, is now putting on a rare early evening sky show. Look after the Sun sets and you'll spot Mercury. It's between Venus and where the Sun sets on the horizon. Thirty minutes after the Sun sets is too late, since Mercury lies very close to the Sun. Use the half hour after sunset to spot Mercury.

The other planet you'll want to pick out of the sky is Mars. And it's not as easy to find these spring nights as it was last winter when it was much closer to Earth and therefore much brighter. Mars is ruddy in color and high in the southeast sky. Go outside early as Mars sets around midnight.

FULL MOON — This month's Full Moon occurs this Saturday, March 30 at exactly 1:17 a.m., Texas Time. This month's Full Moon shines from the zodiac sign of Libra. Since this is the sign of partnerships, all romantics will want to pay close attention to this week's Full Moon STARSCOPE message.

ARIES: (Mar 21 - Apr 19) This Saturday's Full Moon makes this a weekend of touch and go conversations and actions between partners, since the Full Moon occurs in your seventh house of marriage. 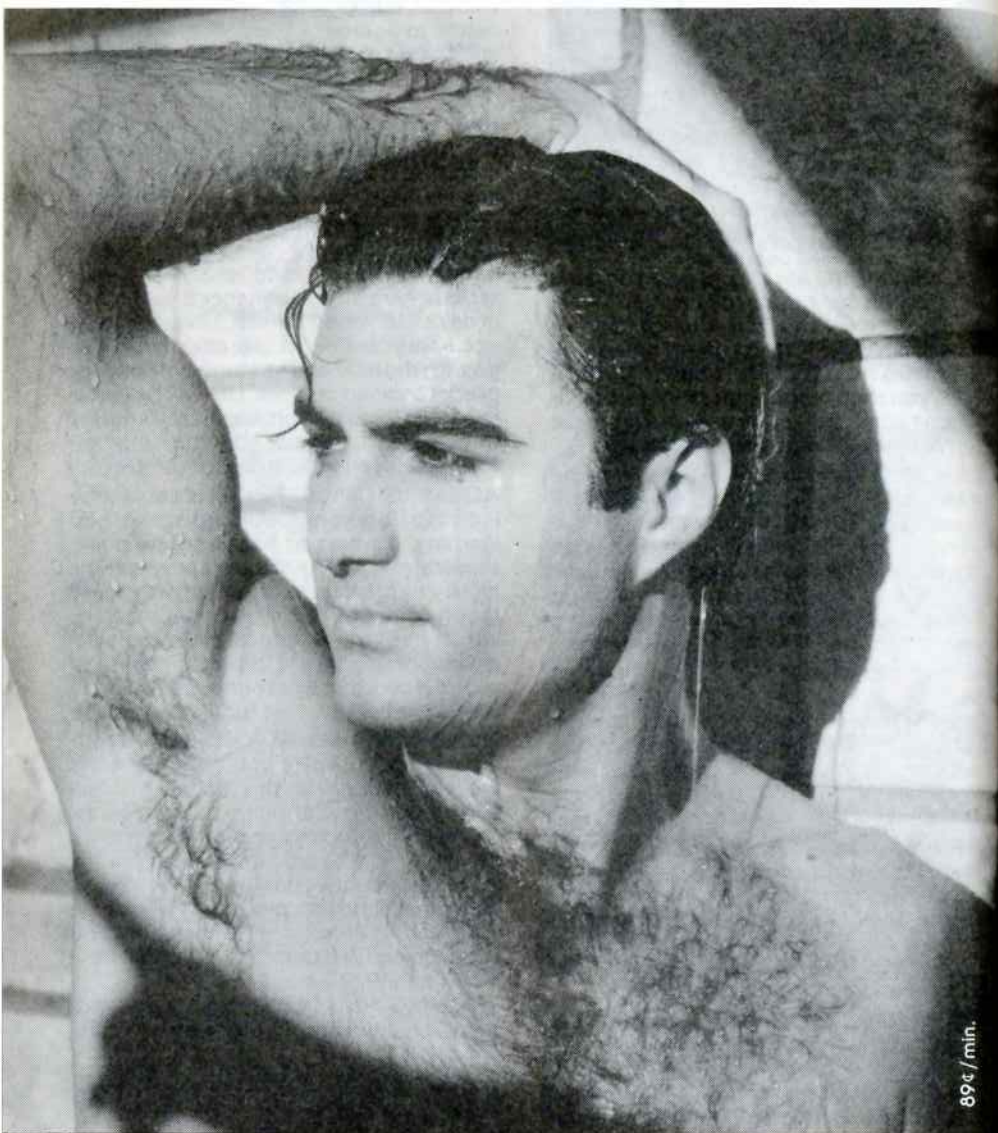

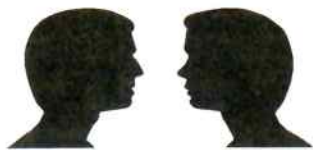

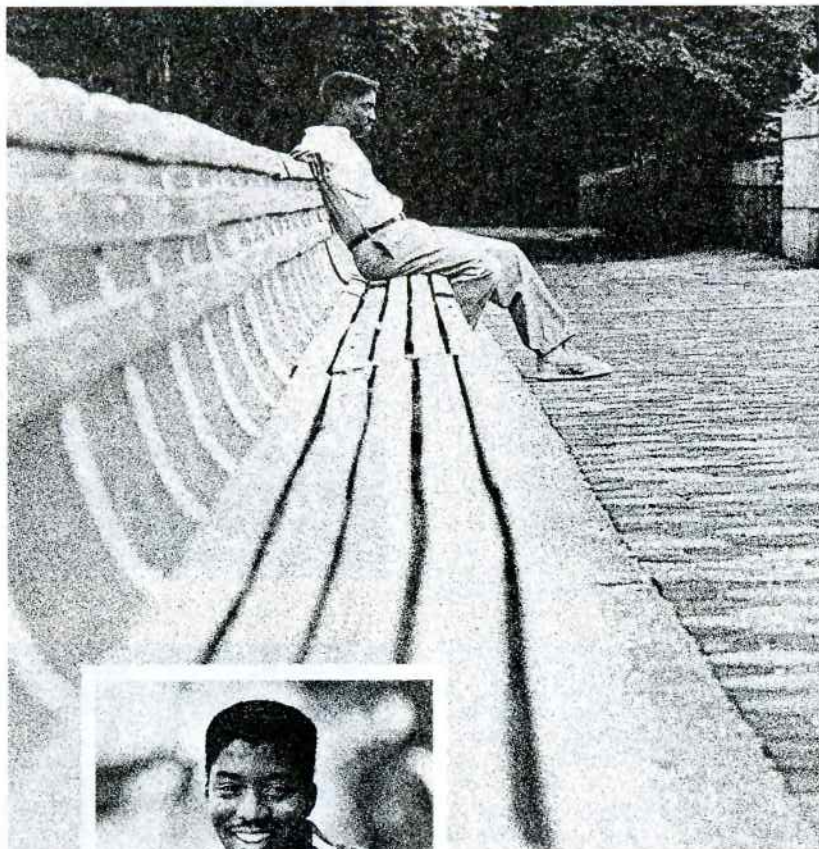

IS..."

Another Oscar show has come and gone, and this latest installment will likely be remembered as much for who didn't win as for who did.

Sure, *Dances With Wolves* walked with seven awards out of 12 nominations, but the big surprise that marked this presentation was the dumbfounding result in the Best Supporting Actor category. That choice will likely be what people discuss whenever this year's show is a topic of conversation.

He lost. Bruce Davison did not win. Never mind that he was good as Joe Pesci. The Academy long ago set a precedent for preferring powerful performances that are also powerful statements. What happened before a worldwide audience serves as strong evidence that this was utterly unexpected. While the nominees' names were being read, Davison's name was greeted with vigorous applause before and after the clip from *Longtime Companion*. When Brenda Fricker opened the envelope, she looked visibly surprised; a stunned audience offered only muted applause for the winner. Pesci himself was so ill-prepared for victory he could only garble a terse "It's my privilege, thank you."

It still strikes me as unbelievable. Beyond that, or maybe because of it, and not to detract from *Dances with Wolves* and the other winners, the show was uninspiring.

The evening began with an adequate but conventional dance number choreographed by Debbie Allen and led by Jasmine Guy. That went straight into emcee Billy Crystal's dialogue, but his jokes flopped as fast as he could deliver them.

With the exception of Pesci, all the winners in acting categories gave rousing thank-yous. Best Supporting Actress Whoopi Goldberg stridently proclaimed her pride in being an actor. Best Actress Kathy Bates was touching in expressing her hope that her father, whose whereabouts are apparently unknown to her, might be watching. Best Actor Jeremy Irons was properly gracious even as he thanked David Cronenberg, director of 1988's *Dead Ringers*, which was a better, though un-nominated, outing for Irons than *Reversal of Fortune*.

The evening, of course, belonged to Kevin Costner and *Dances with Wolves*. The movie became the first western since *Cimarron* in 1930-31 to take the top prize. Costner himself was poised and controlled.

He showed all the fortitude and demeanor expected of a double-winner. He was crowd-pleasing charm epitomized.

Presence alone, however, does not make a successful awards presentation. This telecast was helped long by excellent performances of nominated songs by well-costumed artists. Madonna appeared in a peachy-pink gown with a matching fur boa, one arm gloved, the other exposed, and a Joan Blondell hairdo. She was sultry without being distastefully provocative as she sang "Sooner or Later, I Always Get My Man" from *Dick Tracy*, which won Best Song.

Reba McEntyre, singing "I'm Checking Out" in green velvet, was surprisingly fresh and forceful, especially considering her recent loss. Harry Connick Jr. was all class for "Promise Me You'll Remember" while Bon Jovi discarded their usual guitars and spandex to perform "Blaze of Glory."

Not singing, but looking resplendent, were Barbra Streisand, Sophia Loren and Debra Winger, who each took a turn at elegance in basic black. Loren gave the evening's best speech as she graciously thanked the Academy for honoring her body of work. She also received the only standing ovation.

Conversely, Geena Davis was a fright in a golden blonde dye job matching a disgusting shroud of almost identical hue. Also coming off as ridiculous was Jeff Bridges in a quasi-colonial tux.

The disappointment over Davison's loss aside, the evening's biggest flub occurred with the award for Best Original Screenplay. In this category, *Ghost* defeated the far better efforts in *Alice*, *Avalon* and *Metropolitan*—another clear indication that the Academy can be swayed by box-office success even when faced with quality alternatives.

When all was said and done, this show was mundane even by Oscar standards, but therein lies the risk that makes these displays so eagerly anticipated.

This year's show confirms the puzzling view Academy members sometimes take when casting their ballots.

This Oscar psychic was caught off guard and could manage only six out of ten correct predictions. This was not a problem for our Oscar Trivia Contest winner, who successfully predicted the most winners and went 17 for 22. From a local perspective he gets the prize—the winner is Randal Tolbert.
