MCC DALLAS REVEALS PLANS FOR CATHEDRAL OF HOPE

*Facility to House Meeting Rooms,
Bookstore, Production Studio;
Foundation Work Begins in May.*

DALLAS — “We are calling this a ‘cathedral’ because, as in the olden days, it will serve as a community center. It belongs to us. It will be a first-class church that the community can be proud of,” said Michael Piazza, Senior Pastor of the Metropolitan Community Church in Dallas. In an interview with Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS, Piazza laid out the congregation’s plans for their new facility, the Cathedral of Hope.

The actual foundation work begins by the middle of May, Piazza said, adding that a lot of work had already been done that was not readily visible. The church is being constructed on land just north of the intersection of Cedar Springs and Inwood.

Earlier this year the project appeared to be in financial trouble. Piazza said that the budget was \$12,000 behind at the beginning of the Lent season. “I challenged the leadership of our church through fasting and prayer to meet our needs. As of Palm Sunday, we were \$5,900 over our budget. We have just had the biggest month financially in our history.”

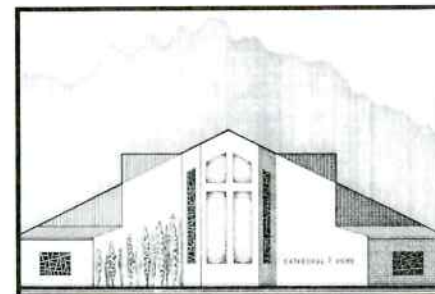
Piazza said he feels that the financial status of a church is an accurate barometer of the health of its congregation. “We found out that a lot of our members felt that they were in an interim period while the new church was being built. They were waiting until we moved into our permanent facility before they got serious.” Piazza said the church has made some changes in its outlook, and the resulting upturn in finances is indicative of the congregation’s commitment to the project.

The new sanctuary has been designed with music in mind, and will be uniquely suited for community concerts, Piazza said. The space was designed with angled walls to eliminate echoes, and there will be no carpeting since it tends to absorb sound.

“The front of the sanctuary can be moved to accommodate performances on different levels. We will have a safe and adequate space for gay and lesbian music to be performed.” The area will seat 1,100

people, and eventually there will be a first-rate organ with 35 ranks of pipes.

The facility will house nine small meeting rooms and two larger ones. “We have also designed an area for children’s classrooms. We felt that the single parents in our community were a segment that was not being served at all,” the pastor explained.

There will be literacy classes held at the new church, Piazza said, as well as a lending library with positive-themed gay literature. The church’s bookstore and resource center will be located near the entrance for easier access during the week.

“We will have a production studio for video and audio taping of our services. We have plans for a television ministry in the future, to reach people in smaller towns. We will videotape our services, and then mail them to ‘cells,’ groups of 15-20 people in other cities.

“This will be a facility everyone can be proud of,” Piazza said. “The top of the cathedral will be 57 feet high, and will be easily visible from Inwood and Cedar Springs. It will be the most spectacular building owned by gay and lesbian people.”

When Piazza is asked about what he is proudest of, though, he doesn’t talk about the new church. “At least 80% of the energy of our congregation is for others, for the community. These people never fail to respond to the needs of others.”

CAPITAL GAY COUPLES TURNED DOWN FOR MARRIAGE LICENSES

*Law May Be Challenged in Court;
Rep. Danburg Files House Bill to
Delete Gender References.*

AUSTIN — Section 21.06, which outlaws sexual behavior between persons of the same sex, may have been struck down recently, but gay and lesbian people still cannot legally be married in Texas.

Citizens of the capital city and of the entire state were reminded of that recently when two gay couples, one male and one female, applied for marriage licenses at the Travis County Clerk's office on Tuesday, March 26. County Clerk Dana DeBeauvoir declined to issue licenses to Toby Johnson and his partner, Kip Dollar, and Pamela Voekel and her partner, Dana-lynn Recer.

In declining to issue the licenses, DeBeauvoir issued the following statement: "Today I have declined to issue a marriage license requested by two individuals. I regret that the law prohibits me from issuing a marriage license to two persons of the same gender. When male-female gender couples apply for a marriage license, I don't ask questions about their sexual relationship. Marriage licenses are about legal relationships, not about lifestyles.

"A marriage license establishes legal rights. Texas is a community property state. All individuals and their loved ones should have the right to establish legal relationships to own and protect property, plan for retirement and promote their financial decisions. The marriage license is a legal tool which assists in the normal investment decisions of life. Every qualifying citizen should have equal access to these legal rights regardless of race, color, creed, national origin, sexual preference or gender."

Recer and Voekel said they planned to challenge the law, claiming it violates the Equal Rights Amendment of the Texas Constitution.

Under Texas law, marriage licenses may be issued only to a man and a woman, and not to two people of the same sex. A bill has been filed by Rep. Debra Danburg [House Bill 2684] of Houston that would delete the law's gender references.

The fact that the law does not recognize their unions adversely affects gay and lesbian couples in many ways, economically and legally. For instance, they cannot normally obtain joint credit or put their spouses on their medical insurance coverage.

ART LEAGUE OF HOUSTON OFFERS DRAWING CLASS TO PEOPLE WITH AIDS

*Free Ten-Week Course Aims at
Providing PWAs with Outlet for
Creative Expression, Interaction.*

HOUSTON — The Art League of Houston has announced that it is organizing a drawing class to people with AIDS. The course will be offered to individuals who have a serious interest in art but who cannot afford to attend regular art classes.

The drawing class is aimed at experienced as well as beginning artists, and will be taught by an Art League faculty member.

Organizers of the course explained that it is designed to provide the community with an AIDS service while giving individuals with AIDS an avenue of creative expression through drawing. Participants should also benefit from improved self-esteem and the opportunity for social interaction with other PWAs in a nonmedical setting.

The League is seeking sponsors to underwrite the cost of supplies for each student. The estimated cost for supplies per student/per semester is \$15.

The class will meet on Saturday from 1 to 4 p.m., beginning April 27, and will run for 10 weeks. Those interested in the class are encouraged to register as soon as possible, as studio space is limited.

DALLAS GAY ALLIANCE TO HOST NEW DALLAS POLICE CHIEF

*Rathburn Meets with Representatives
Of Community to Discuss Gay and
Lesbian Concerns; Agrees to
Take Over Role as Liaison.*

DALLAS — TWT NEWS has learned that the Dallas Gay Alliance will host new Dallas Police Chief William Rathburn at its May 23 monthly general meeting and introduce the new chief to Dallas' gay community at a reception immediately following the meeting.

DGA president Bruce Monroe told TWT NEWS that Chief Rathburn accepted the invitation following a meeting DGA leaders had with him and members of the department's command staff on March 20. Monroe said the new chief was interested in the relationship the department had had previously with the gay and lesbian community and outlined his views on how both groups could work together.

"We brought up the same concerns the DGA has outlined over the past eight years, including hiring and training, and we were impressed with his interest in our issues," Monroe said. "He is also the first police chief to admit that there were already gay men and women serving as police officers," he added.

Monroe said he could discern a difference between the attitude of Rathburn and former chief Mack Vines when the new chief was reminded that the gay community had suffered from the absence of a suitable liaison since the retirement of Sgt. Earl Newsom. Rathburn inquired about Newsom's responsibilities as liaison and then indicated he would do it himself.

Others in attendance at the meeting with the chief were DGA executive Director John Thomas, former president William Waybourn and former board member and member of the Mayor's Task Force on Crime Dan Wallace.

Issues covered in the meeting included improving police response and ending patterns of violence directed at gay men and lesbians.

Rathburn readily accepted Monroe's invitation to meet leaders and members of the gay community on May 23 at the DGA's Gay & Lesbian Community Center, 2701

Reagan, at 7:30 p.m. A reception will follow the meeting. Monroe encouraged everyone to attend.

GLHU APPOINTS AIDS EDUCATOR

*Varela to Coordinate AIDS Battle
Targeted at Hispanic Community.*

HOUSTON — Gay & Lesbian Hispanics Unidos [GLHU] has announced the appointment of David M. Varela to coordinate the organization's AIDS education programs aimed at the Hispanic community.

Brad Veloz, president of GLHU, told TWT NEWS that Varela is uniquely qualified for the position because of his experience in the health care field and his work in the community.

Varela has worked in the field of AIDS services for the past four years, as both an HIV counselor and health educator. He has also worked with family planning and maternity clients, and is currently involved with a study on battered women during pregnancy.

In addition to his clinical work, Varela makes presentations on AIDS education and prevention, safer sex, family planning, contraception and sexually transmitted diseases. He has also conducted AIDS education classes in halfway houses.

Varela is a board member of the Houston Hispanic AIDS Coalition and a member of the Texas AIDS Network. He has done volunteer work with Amigos Volunteers in Educational Services.

Varela told TWT NEWS he has a great desire to assist people who are in need for AIDS information, and he especially wants to promote AIDS education in the Hispanic community. "Houston's Latino community is in desperate need of adequate health services in fighting this disease," he added.

Bimonthly activities will include home "platicas," or informal talk sessions with health care providers. The first session is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. on April 6 at 2612 Whitney. Dr. Miguel DeCuna will be leading that platica. Persons interested in attending this session are asked to call (713) 523-5254 as soon as possible.

SHEILA JAMES KUEHL TO SPEAK AT HOUSTON PRIDE AWARDS.

*Sheraton-Astrodome Serves as Site
Of This Year's Festivities;
Voting to Take Place at Banquet.*

HOUSTON — The 1991 Pride Awards Committee has managed to snare a real celebrity as featured speaker at this year's Pride Awards Banquet. John Early, in charge of publicity for the banquet, informed TWT NEWS that Sheila James Kuehl will be keynoting the June 15 affair.

Kuehl is perhaps best known for her portrayal of Zelda Gilroy in the early-60s television sitcom *The Many Lives of Dobie Gillis*. Today she is a feminist lawyer living in Santa Monica with her life partner of eight years, Torie Osborn.

In 1989 Kuehl founded the nonprofit Southern California Women's Law Center, which works to change laws affecting the rights of women. She trains attorneys to bring discrimination suits, drafts legislation and advises people on how to challenge discriminatory statutes. Osborn is Executive Director of the Gay and Lesbian Community Services Center of Los Angeles.

The committee, co-chaired by Annise Parker and Bernard Barbour, chose the Sheraton-Astrodome Hotel as the site of this year's affair. The banquet serves as the kickoff event for Houston Gay Pride Week. There will be seating for approximately 400, and ticket prices remain the same as last year. The committee decided there would be no dance this year because lack of interest. A silent auction precedes the banquet.

Early explained that the nominating and voting procedures have been changed slightly for this year's Pride Awards. The Pride Awards Committee has sent out letters to various community leaders asking them to serve on a blue-ribbon nominating committee which will choose a list of nominees for each of the voting categories.

The categories and the number of awards remain the same as last year, but voting for nominees will take place the evening of the banquet.

MCCR OFFERS COURSE ON HOMOSEXUALITY AND BIBLE

Church Repeats Popular Class Addressing Nature, History of Bible & Interpretation.

HOUSTON — As part of its Spring Educational Series, Metropolitan Community Church of the Resurrection is offering a repeat of its popular course "Homosexuality and the Bible. Carolyn Mobley, Assistant to the Pastor and coordinator of Christian Education at MCCR, explained to TWT NEWS that so many people had expressed interest in the course that the church was offering it again.

The course is being taught by Rev. Ralph Lasher, Associate Minister of MCCR. This time around it includes an introduction to the Bible itself, which will help people understand the nature of biblical literature and something about how the Bible has come to be in its present form.

Susan Palmer, publicist for MCCR, said, "All of us living in the Bible Belt have been influenced adversely by negative cultural expressions of the Christian faith and con-

servative interpretations of the Scriptures," she said. "If you have felt overwhelmed, intimidated or threatened by fundamentalists and biblical literalists, come be informed for your own benefit. Being enlightened will build your confidence in dealing with homophobic people claiming to be Christian, who are often biblically ignorant."

GLAAD/USA SETS NEXT MEETING IN DALLAS

May 11-12 Gathering Part of Effort To Form Nationwide Organization; Deborah Johnson to Facilitate.

DALLAS — The Steering Committee of the Gay & Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation/USA [GLAAD/USA] has announced that its next meeting is set for May 11-12 in Dallas. The meeting will be held in the Dallas Gay & Lesbian Community Center.

California activist Deborah Johnson, who facilitated the Texas-wide Town Hall Meeting in Austin last July, is serving as facilitator and consultant for the Dallas meet.

The Steering Committee of GLAAD/USA, which seeks to confront public expressions of homophobia, is composed of representatives from chapters in New York, Los Angeles, Baltimore, Dallas, the San Francisco area and the Washington, D.C. area. There are also chapters or chapters in formation in Houston, Atlanta, Denver and other cities around the country. A GLAAD/USA spokesperson explained that the Dallas meeting was part of the organization's continuing efforts to form a truly nationwide federation.

GLAAD/USA sees its mission as confronting public expressions of homophobia or heterosexism, as well as promoting understanding of the breadth and diversity of lesbian and gay lives. The organization pursues these goals by organizing grassroots responses to public expressions of bigotry and by working with the media to promote accurate coverage of issues that concern the lesbian and gay community.

Write in Support of Bills

Dear TWT:

I am writing concerning two very important issues facing our state Legislature. The first concerns the level of AIDS funding to be appropriated this year. The second concerns two extremely important bills which, if funded, would make a major difference in insurance coverage of many HIV-infected Texans and could save local counties' hospital districts and rural health care facilities millions of dollars in expenditures.

Like most social and medical issues, AIDS has been vastly underfunded at the state level in Texas. Most of our AIDS services are funded through federal grants. All of this money and most of state AIDS services are in serious jeopardy because of a new federal law which mandates termination of federal AIDS grants to any state which lowers its present AIDS state funding. Thus, under this federal maintenance of effort provision, Texas will lose up to \$10,000,000 in AIDS support over the next two years if our legislature cuts back on the present Texas AIDS budget. Almost every conceivable service in every area of the state would be affected and many would be eliminated: from pediatric care to rural health outreach to minority prevention programs, our Texas AIDS response would be curtailed or eliminated. This cannot happen! Please write today to your local state representative and senator as well as the Senate Finance Committee and the House Appropriation Committee members.

There are two very urgent issues which face the Texas Senate Finance Committee:

1) Senate Bill 777 (Brooks)—Under the High Risk Insurance Plan for Catastrophic Illness, the state is allowed to provide an insurance program for health coverage for major illnesses such as AIDS, cancer, etc., to persons who would ordinarily be unable to purchase private insurance. This would provide basic private health care and help keep many ill Texans from having to rely on our already overburdened public health care systems. Senate Bill 777 needs to be funded! Write to the members of the Texas Senate Finance Committee and your local state representative and senator today.

2) Senate Bill 1254 (Ellis)—Many persons who are initially covered by health care

insurance eventually lose it as they become indigent and can't afford the premiums. The Insurance Subsidy Program allows the state to pay the insurance premiums for those indigent but insured, seriously ill Texans. This allows them to retain their basic private health care, and is a savings for the state's staggering public health systems. If the program is not funded, the consequences for counties could be far-reaching and catastrophic.

AFTER THE MARCH: LOBBY DAY AT THE CAPITOL

Lesbians and gays from all across Texas were united in their call for an end to social, economic and political oppression on Lobby Day, March 18, following the March on Austin for Lesbian/Gay Equal Rights. Approximately 10 lobbyists from Houston, Dallas, Fort Worth and Lubbock worked diligently throughout the day to garner support from their State Senators and Representatives on issues ranging from repeal of Section 21.06 of the State Penal Code to AIDS funding and protection of the right to reproductive choice.

"I feel we were all very effective in educating our elected officials regarding major issues of importance to our state lesbian/gay community," reported Harry Livesay, lobbyist for the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus. "Representative Debra Danburg continues to be our most supportive advocate in the Legislature from Houston and has proved this again by authoring House Bill #1153, calling for the repeal of 21.06. We are not very hopeful of its passage in the 72nd Legislative Session, but we are very proud of Debra for bringing this matter before the House and we are certain of additional support this session which will be of great benefit when public hearings are held on H.B. #1153."

Joining Livesay in the Houston lobbying effort were Toni Knight, representing LGRL and the Lesbian/Gay Democrats of Texas, and Bill Willis of the HGLPC. "This was the first time I've participated in lobbying efforts in Austin, and I found it both challenging and frustrating," stated Willis.

"I felt that LGRL lobbyist Laurie Eiserloh and newly elected Representative Glen Maxey were most helpful in working with the lobbyists and providing us with the most current information on pending legislation in the House and Senate."

A review of pending legislation of great interest to gays and lesbians throughout Texas includes:

- House Bill #1153—(Danburg) Calls for repeal of 21.06 of the Texas Penal Code;
- Senate Bill #454—Calls for the adoption of hate crimes legislation protecting lesbians and gays from crimes of violence;
- House Bill #2709—(Maxey) Relates to release of liability for funeral homes in Texas for following the wishes of the deceased in funeral preparations. This would give gay and lesbian couples more power in the planning of their estates without interference from parents or other relatives of the deceased;
- Senate Bill #1254—(Ellis) Called the "Catastrophic Health Funding Bill," this legislation would maintain AIDS funding in Texas at present levels until the State Legislature meets to address the state budget in special session this summer; and the following bill, of particular interest to gays and lesbians in the Houston area:
- House Bills #237 & 341—(Martinez and Gallegos) Calls for 16 single-member City Council districts in the city of Houston, and elections for these 16 seats after redistricting. Local efforts by the HGLPC could result in a Montrose district on City Council if this legislation is adopted.

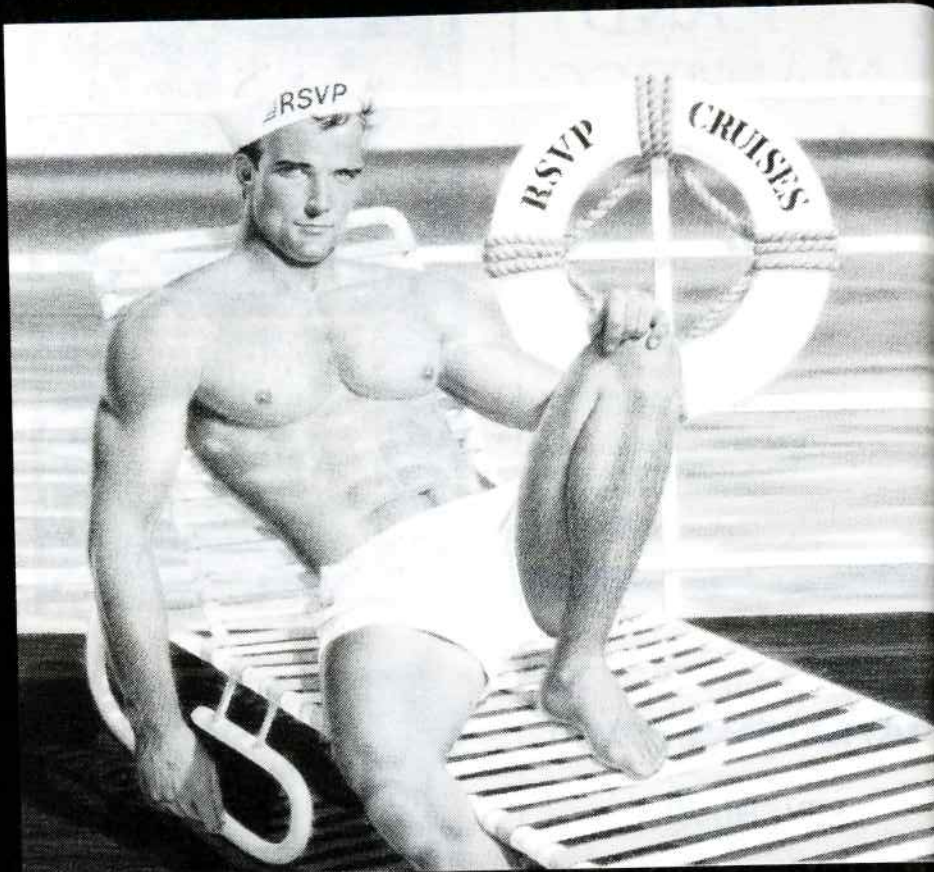

The proper, clinical-sounding word for our people is homosexual. Yeah, but we the people don't accept that word. According to Webster, a homosexual is one who is *sexually* attracted to another of the same sex, the antithesis of the word "heterosexual." Both words are bad. Real bad. People are attracted to others for many reasons, sex being only one of them.

Four decades ago, to get away from all that sexual connotation, One Institute, the world's first learning center for gay and lesbian studies, introduced the word "homophile," meaning one who *loves* another of the same sex. A good word, but somehow it never caught on. One reason might be that the straight media refused to use it. They hate to think that gay love is equivalent to what Anita Bryant described in her song "There's Nothing Like the Love of a Man for a Woman." (She introduced the song just before her divorce. It, too, was a flop!) Another reason might be because gay men and women didn't much care for "homophile" either. Too clinical.

The word "gay," on the other hand, has a nice down-to-earth sound. It's also descriptive. Yes, it's true that gay folks are not always, but most of the time we are—gay, that is! Homophobic adversity has caused many of our teenagers and young adults to kill themselves. But overcoming adversity has made the rest of us strong. Strong enough to deal with most of life's problems.

Some people use the words "gay" and "homosexual" synonymously, as if they are interchangeable. "Not so," insist many

In the gay/lesbian movement. Consider: According to Kinsey, approximately one out of every ten people are exclusively or significantly homosexual. That would mean there are about 1.7 million homosexuals in Texas. Right? Well, where the hell are they? You'll not find them at gay pride bashes, not at the gay bars on a Saturday night. Not at Hippie Hollow on Splash Day. Not at rallies for gay rights.

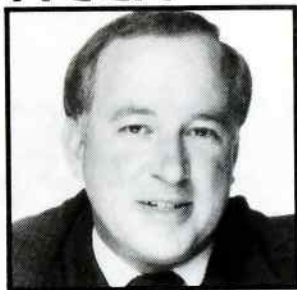

THE BOYS IN CELLBLOCK Q

at Austin's
Capitol City Playhouse

Robert Whyburn is a native Houstonian who migrated to Austin in search of a drama degree at the University of Texas. Along the way he discovered Capitol City Playhouse and became their resident Lighting Director. Whyburn also works with other theatres in the Austin area such as Live Oak Theatre, Summer Musicals in

Zilker Park and the Vortex Repertory Theatre.

I first encountered Whyburn's work while reviewing *La Cage Aux Folles* several months ago. I was particularly impressed with the lighting design for that production. He successfully paced the lighting with each scene, from sidewalk cafe to cabaret.

Whyburn attended the Austin debut of *The Boys in Cellblock Q* during an at-

random theatre production at the University of Texas. He told me, "The play is pure fun—total camp. There are so many heavy-hitting AIDS dramas and they are important, but people shouldn't forget laughter; it's great medicine and that is what this play is about—laughter."

Lighting director turned producer Whyburn is definitely on the right track. Playwright John Wall has created an outrageous spoof of trashy prison films. *The Boys in Cellblock Q* takes place at a Louisiana prison farm for juvenile offenders. Cellblock Q is reserved for the most dangerous offenders, with a cruel and corrupt warden and a priest just looking for love as role models for these wayward boys.

And let me tell you that this is where the fun begins. Six deliciously delightful characters romp through the production thanks to the talents of six of Austin's finest actors. There is usually a weak character or

at least a weak actor a critic can find fault with. Not so in this group; each actor pulls his weight and works in tandem with his fellow thespians.

Every audience loves a scene stealer and the culprit in this production is Frankie Woodruff as Lana. Not only does Woodruff steal the scenes, he takes the cast along with him. Woodruff milks his audience for each laugh, yet he never once forgets that there are other actors onstage with him. He ignites the natural instincts of the other actors, illustrating the simple fact that without his fellow actors his lines would be senseless.

Woodruff and Clayton Colwell (Father Bruce) had this reviewer and the audience in hysterics with their projection of the interplay between their characters. The following is a bit of the dialogue between the two:

Lana: "I bet you never wore a pair of spiked heels in your life."

Father: "I don't have the calves for it. But in my own way, I was just as rebellious and flamboyant as you are."

Lana: "Are you trying to say that before you became a priest, you were..."

Father: "I turned to the church because I was ashamed of the way I was living."

Lana: "Now you're reformed."

Father: "No, I just got over being ashamed..."

A script is never as funny as the actual performance. You have to witness this entire production—let me assure you that it is a laugh a minute.

Director Christian McLaughlin substituted for A.C. Otey in the role of Ludes for this performance. McLaughlin is superb as an understudy, leaving Otey a hard act to follow. McLaughlin is also an extremely talented director in this illustration of how a play should be directed.

Chris Wilson is Boss Turnbull, just what one would expect of a Louisiana prison guard with a bit of redneck Texan thrown in. Meeting him out of character only enhanced the fact that the man can act—he is the complete opposite of his character.

In every gay play I have attended there is always the token hunk. You know the type. Not so in this production; this play has two hunks. To add insult to injury, they can act! Their acting ability is as natural as their good looks. I was particularly impressed with their interpretations of their characters. Darin Dietiker (Beef) and Andrew Criss (Timmy) not only fill the bill physically, they project the look as part of the character rather than as part of the actor. Dietiker and Criss both give outstanding performances.

The Texas Dip to the entire cast and crew of *The Boys in Cellblock Q*. Just one little thing: The producer (Whyburn) and the set designer (Whyburn) need to get together and repair that leaky toilet on the set; my boots got wet.

Professional rodeo as a major competitive sport evolved from the hardworking life of the American cowhand. The hard life of the Old West developed a character and an attitude that have become legendary, and have given us the American cowboy and cowgirl and their spirit of freedom.

It is only natural that that same spirit of freedom would be evident in the makeup of gays and lesbians reared in such an environment. Nineteen ninety-one marks the eighth year since the founding of the Texas Gay Rodeo Association [TGRA], with the eighth annual TGRA Rodeo scheduled for November of 1991 in Dallas at the Coliseum in Fair Park.

Members from the eight TGRA chapters throughout Texas will assemble in the capital city this weekend as the Austin chapter hosts the quarterly statewide TGRA meeting. Regular monthly meetings of the state chapters are conducted in chapter cities the first Sunday of each month. State meetings are scheduled on a quarterly basis and hosted by the various chapter cities.

TGRA is a member of the International Gay Rodeo Association [IGRA], which was founded in 1985 to foster national and international amateur competition and related arts and crafts. IGRA also encour-

ages the development of amateur athletes and activities for such competition.

The rodeo association is recognized throughout the state for the many charitable works of its chapter members. Through the Royalty Candidate program,

various charities and agencies benefit from the candidates' fund-raising events. The candidates compete throughout the rodeo year in hopes of attaining the title of Mr., Miss or Ms. TGRA. From garage sales to drag shows, the funds raised are presented directly to the benefit recipients. Royalty candidates also compete at the annual state rodeo in the following categories: talent, western attire, interview and horsemanship.

Gay rodeo association members are also competitors in the rodeo arena. Rodeos have become an exciting sport to watch and a stressful one to compete in; gay rodeos are no exception to the rule.

One of rodeo's most contested events is bull riding. It is also the favorite, as well as the exciting, spectator event of any rodeo. Bull riding has the added factor of danger for the contestant in swinging his or her legs over an unpredictable animal that may decide to come looking for him or her after he or she completes the ride.

The contestant rides with only one hand without touching the bull with the free hand—and he or she must stay on the bull for six seconds of erratic and violent twists and leaps.

Then there is the event in which the contestant must wrestle a 500-pound-plus horned steer to the ground. Again, this event is a race against time with the fastest time winning the event. Not only must the contestant wrestle the steer to the ground, the steer must be lying on its side with all four feet pointing in the same direction, at which time the rodeo judges signal time. Calf roping and team roping are other timed events in rodeo competition.

A symbol of power and freedom, the horse has been warrior, friend and money-maker. Rodeo expresses the unique association of horse and rider; arena events test the ability of horse and rider in a non-

working situation. Speed and agility are of utmost importance in a mount; the gaming events pit the "snap and cattiness" of the horse under the skillful hand of its rider against the clock.

Barrel racing requires contestants to vie for the fastest time in running a cloverleaf pattern around three barrels set in a triangle formation. Timing starts and ends on crossing a visible starting line, with five-second penalties for knocking over barrels. Pole bending pits horse and rider against the clock as they work a linear pattern through six equally spaced poles, with a five-second penalty for knocking down a pole. Again, the fastest time wins.

Pride in ability gave rise to a competitive spirit in our ancestors along the untamed frontier. That same pride in ability is evident in the men and women of the Texas Gay Rodeo Association.
