NELSON-TEBEDO PHARMACY OPENS SOON

*Seeks Funds for Start-Up Inventory;
To Offer Low-Cost Medications,
Process Insurance Claims.*

DALLAS — “The Nelson-Tebedo Pharmacy is about to become a reality, finally!” John Thomas exclaimed. Thomas, Executive Director of the AIDS Resource Center, told Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS that the pharmacy has been in the talking and planning stages for years, and will be opening soon. The only remaining hurdle is to obtain the funding needed to purchase initial inventory.

Thomas said the pharmacy has been licensed by the Texas State Board of Pharmacy, and so it is now fully qualified to operate. “We need to raise between \$20,000 and \$25,000 for our start-up inventory, and we already have over \$8,000. We hope to get the money from home health care agencies who work with AIDS patients in the home.” He explained that such agencies want to be socially responsible, and that Nelson-Tebedo will acknowledge them as helping to underwrite the pharmacy.

“There are two positive things about this project,” Thomas said. “The revenue will help us to keep the clinic going and doing our research. We also hope to get designated by the state to offer AZT and pentamidine treatments for state-assisted patients, without their having to go through Parkland Hospital.”

Thomas said the pharmacy will process insurance claims for its clients who have insurance, and will offer medications on a low-cost basis for those who are not insured. “We will be able to keep our prices low by buying our supplies on a C.O.D. basis. We will also use electronic billing with insurance companies to cut down on the payment time.”

Once funds are raised to purchase inventory, the only adjustment to the facility at 4012 Cedar Springs will be the installation of double-dutch doors to make the pharmacy immediately visible to people entering the front door. Thomas said this modification was necessary to meet state regulations.

At first the pharmacy will have limited hours of operation, and it will be staffed by volunteer pharmacists.

PRIME TIMERS FORM HOUSTON CHAPTER

*First Organizational Meeting on
May 4 at Multi-Service Center*

HOUSTON — The Houston chapter of Prime Timers, an organization for mature gay and bisexual men and their admirers, is holding its first organizational meeting on Saturday, May 4.

The original Prime Timers group was founded in Boston in 1987. Interest in the group spread, and chapters have sprung up in Atlanta, Dallas/Fort Worth, Austin and Vancouver, British Columbia.

Prime Timers was founded to help meet the needs of older gay and bisexual men, including social, sexual, cultural, emotional, financial, recreational, health, security and relationships. Local organizer Ed Thomas told TWT NEWS, “Since some older gay men may not be in the mainstream of gay life and not read the gay press, all gay persons are urged to notify their friends who might enjoy or profit from membership in such an organization.”

Depending on the preferences expressed by members, activities may include socials, workshops, house parties, cultural events, outings, trips and rap groups, in addition to monthly meetings. Members will receive a monthly newsletter listing all events.

All mature gay and bisexual men, as well as younger men who enjoy the company of older men, are invited to attend the organizational meeting. Initial individual membership is set tentatively at \$15 annually, with \$22.50 for couples sharing the same mailing address. Those attending this first meeting will be asked to contribute \$1 to help defray expenses.

AUDETTE CLINIC NOW OFFERS CONFIDENTIAL HIV TESTING

Anonymous Testing Still Available; Clinical Research Network Begins Free Eye Screening Program.

HOUSTON — The Thomas Audette Memorial Clinic has announced that it is now offering confidential HIV antibody testing to clients who request it. The Audette Clinic, a branch of the Montrose Clinic group of community health organizations, will continue providing anonymous testing as well.

In anonymous testing, names are not used and clients are identified by number, whereas in confidential testing, names and other personal identifying information are disclosed.

Executive Director Ralph C. Lasher told TWT NEWS, "Some people need documentation of their test results and confidential testing provides that. It also creates a medical record which can be useful to persons for a number of purposes."

Clients will have the opportunity to choose whichever testing method better suits their needs.

Anonymous and confidential testing are offered Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 6 p.m. to 9:30 p.m., and Tuesdays and Thursdays from 1 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. Appointments by date and time are requested. Further information may be obtained by calling the clinic hotline at (713) 528-5531.

The Houston Clinical Research Network of the Montrose Clinic is also offering free eye screening to HIV-positive clients. The test is intended to identify early signs of ocular or neurological problems that might be associated with HIV infection. Patients with possible HIV-related eye problems will be informed and advised to seek further medical consultation.

Lasher said that current estimates indicate that about 45% of persons who are HIV-positive may develop ophthalmological complications at some stage of their illness. An equal number may develop some type of neurological dysfunction. Early diagnosis and intervention are important in combating such problems.

SMU STUDENT SENATE APPROVES CHARTER FOR GAY GROUP

20-13 Vote to Recognize GLSO A First for Traditionally Conservative Dallas University.

DALLAS — In a historic decision at a university long known for its conservatism, the Student Senate of Southern Methodist University voted on Tuesday, April 23 to approve a charter for the Gay and Lesbian Students Organization [GLSO].

A crowd of faculty members, students and representatives of Dallas media had filled the Hughes-Trigg Forum on the SMU campus for three hours of discussion and debate on the issue. When it was all over, the student representatives had decided in a 20-13 vote to recognize GLSO.

There was no lack of strong reaction from both sides after the vote was taken. Supporters and members of GLSO viewed the vote as a victory for tolerance and acceptance of diversity among students. It is also hoped that the chartering of GLSO will project a positive image to gay and lesbian students planning to attend the school.

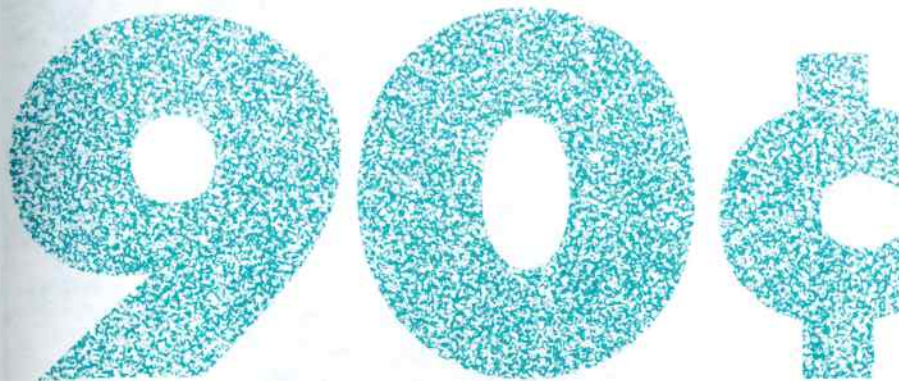
Other students opposed the measure and expressed regret that it passed. Reasons given for opposing it ranged from the conviction that a majority of SMU students did not support chartering GLSO, to a belief that officially recognizing a gay and lesbian group runs counter to traditional religious beliefs and SMU's longtime association with the United Methodist Church.

HOUSTON AIDS EDUCATOR WINS MAYOR'S AWARD

*UT Nursing School Professor
Da Cunha Honored For
Contributions to Community, AFH.*

HOUSTON — Dr. Miguel da Cunha, a professor at the UT School of Nursing and influential figure in the HIV education efforts of AIDS Foundation Houston, received the Mayor's Volunteer of the Year Award on April 22 at an awards banquet sponsored by the Volunteer Center of Houston.

Dr. da Cunha was cited for his efforts as an education leader in promoting good health and providing effective HIV/AIDS education to the general public and for providing vital social services to their families and loved ones.

Dr. da Cunha has served as a volunteer with the McAdory House of AFH, working with homeless persons with AIDS, and also served on the AFH Board of Trustees.

Da Cunha was instrumental in the development of the AFH Speaker's Bureau, which provides HIV education to over 60,000 persons in Harris County annually.

Through his recruitment efforts, especially within the health care field, da Cunha was also able to bring much-needed AIDS education programs into organizations such as the Harris County Sheriff's Department, and the Pasadena and Baytown police departments.

Dr. da Cunha told TWT NEWS, "While I am very happy about this special recognition, I am also reminded of the need to remain vigilant to the political and social issues of AIDS, and to continue bridging gaps, combating ignorance and breaking down the barriers to AIDS education."

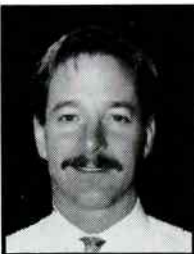

"Safer Sex Talks" is signed for the hearing impaired and deaf viewers in American Sign Language. Simultaneous voice interpretation will also be provided to make the show accessible to hearing viewers. The video features deaf presenter Steve Kennedy, with voice interpretation by Tom Cox.

"Safer Sex Talks" features discussions of safer sex methods, the correct usage of condoms and safe hypodermic needle utilization. Sexually explicit language is used, and viewer discretion is advised.

"Safer Sex Talks" is the second in a series of programs about AIDS aimed at a deaf audience. Future shows will discuss topics such as HIV testing, and the emotional and psychological impact of AIDS.

I am writing this letter to commend the farsighted support of the Mayor and City Council of Austin for AIDS Services of Austin [ASA], Travis County's largest provider of AIDS care and education.

In March of 1991, City Council, after realizing that the city's income would not meet projections, instructed the City Manager to cut the budget which had previously been approved for city services. A five percent cut in ASA's 1991 fiscal year city funding, approximately \$16,000, was among the resulting budget revisions.

Fortunately, City Council member Max Nofziger agreed to sponsor an agenda item at the council meeting to restore ASA's budget by taking money from the City Discretionary Fund. Louise Epstein offered to cosponsor the item, and both she and Nofziger spoke effectively on its behalf. The item was passed unanimously.

All of us at ASA wish to express our gratitude to and admiration of Council members Nofziger and Epstein for courageously bringing this item to the Council. The Council as a whole acted with intelligence and compassion in finding the funds for fighting AIDS.

Turn Out Against Legislator

Dear TWT:

Following the recent March on Austin, I tried to meet with my state legislators, Sen. Ted Lyon and Rep. Bob Glaze of District 5 in Smith County. I think other voters from the area would like to know the results of this action. Copies of this letter are being sent to the offices of the senator and representative, as well as to Rep. Glen Maxey.

Sen. Lyon was out of his office for the day, so I met with a staff member. Unfortunately, she had not spoken with the senator about gay/lesbian rights. I left some notes for the senator, including my address.

I was able to meet with Rep. Glaze. When I stated the purpose of my visit, he told me that he had worked against any repeal of 21.06 in the past and was pledged to do so in the future. He said that he had to represent his constituency. I reminded him that about 10% of his constituents are lesbian or gay. He replied that this meant that 90% were heterosexual, and he had to represent the majority. I pointed out that, regrettably, the majority is not always right (e.g., the majority of white Southerners once favored slavery). He agreed with my point, but insisted that he must represent the majority view anyway.

Represent the majority opinion even if it's wrong? Is this a man or a puppet? Represent the majority of his constituents? Would he vote for Jim Crow laws if 90% of his constituents were white? He insisted that 21.06 did not represent discrimination against homosexuals, which is blatantly untrue. We are not even afforded the "privilege" of "separate-but-equal" rights in partnership or parenting because of laws such as 21.06 which classify us as criminals. Throughout our meeting, I got the impression that Rep. Glaze was using political doublespeak to hide his own prejudices.

Rep. Glaze has made his political stance quite clear: he is decidedly anti-gay. I therefore urge all voters in District 5 who favor equal human rights for *all* to vote against Rep. Bob Glaze in next year's election. I will submit this letter again shortly before the election to remind us. We may only be 10% of the population, but we can easily make 20-30% at the polls if we turn out in force. Let's show people like Bob Glaze that our rights cannot be denied!

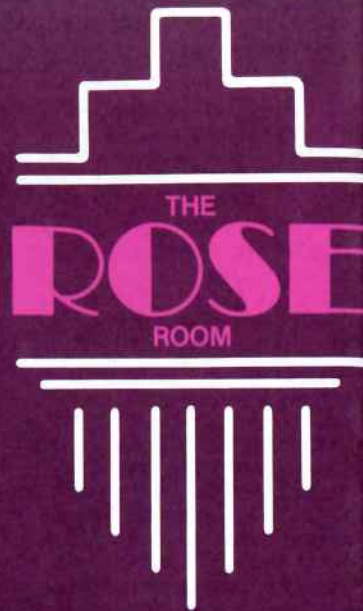

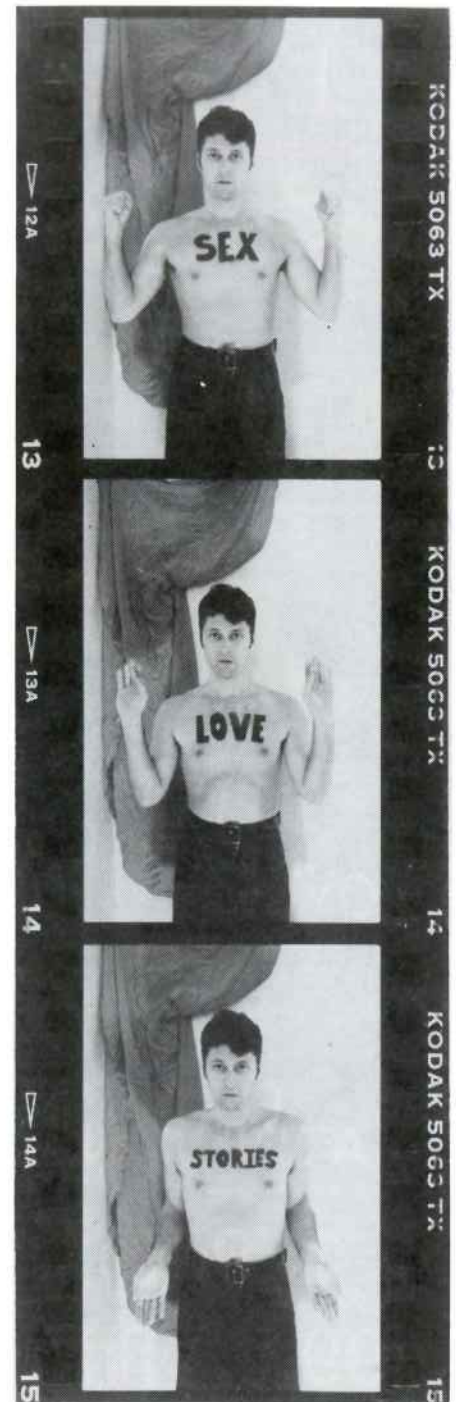



Toxoplasmosis and cat scratch disease are two reasons some HIV-positive individuals have been advised to give up their kittens and cats after their diagnosis. "Toxo" is a parasite carried through a cat's feces that is transmitted to humans, sometimes causing severe central nervous system infections. Most adults have already been exposed to toxoplasma, but in the presence of an intact immune system, symptoms rarely develop. The organism is commonly acquired through eating inadequately cooked meat or through contact with dirt contaminated with cat feces.

Veterinarian Ken Gorczyca is president of the San Francisco-based group Pets Are Wonderful Support [PAWS]. He believes that the risk of acquiring a disease from a pet is outweighed by the psychological and physical benefits of pet companionship. For those of us who are well or ill, our pets enhance the quality of our lives and are our friends.

"A suppressed immune system increases the risk of catching a zoonotic (caught from animals) disease," Dr. Gorczyca says. "But removing the pet from the home will do little to eliminate major sources of infectious diseases."

Since most people are already infected, it is believed that those who are HIV positive and develop toxoplasmosis are actually developing a "reactivation" of something that had existed in a dormant state until their immune system deteriorated. "Removing the pet from an at-risk home

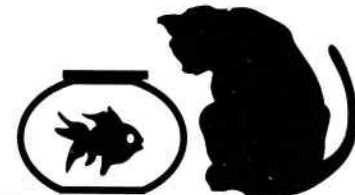

will have little effect on the number of new cases of toxoplasmosis in people with HIV," he added.

It is possible to reduce your chances of contamination further, however. At-risk or not, cats should never ingest raw food or unpasteurized milk. Feed them commercial pet food only. Wear gloves when cleaning the litter box and wash your hands afterwards. Prevent your cat from

consuming its own or other animals' feces, drinking from the toilet, scavenging through the garbage or eating birds or rodents. (Cats that are allowed outside may have less opportunity to catch and eat prey if they are equipped with a bell on their collar, announcing their stalk.)

Cat scratch disease is a bacterial infection that is not the same as a scratch that becomes infected afterwards. It is not common to PWAs and it is treatable. Rather than having your cat declawed, trim its claws regularly. Kittens seem to be the most likely carriers and are more likely than adult cats to scratch. If you are scratched by a cat, immediately clean the

This story has no happy ending, but it's a story that deserves telling. Several years ago I made the acquaintance of a man I'll call Carlos. He and I were sometimes friends, sometimes strangers, but we always stayed in touch. A few years ago it happened that we ended up working for the same employer, and so we saw each other on a daily basis. We shared a lot of stories over lunch.

Carlos was one of those guys who prided himself on his sexual conquests. After a few drinks—often too many—he'd hit on someone in a bar and end up going home with him. Usually he'd never speak to his sexual partners again, and in fact thought it funny that he wouldn't recognize them anyway, at least from the front.

Carlos had accomplished quite a bit in his life, having brought himself up from a poor rural background, graduated from a top university and obtained a prominent managerial position in a professional setting. Despite all those early successes, he never really came to grips with his own homosexuality. He refused to have any-

thing to do with gay community groups. He would take great care to avoid coming out to his co-workers. He insisted even to his own doctor that he was exclusively heterosexual. This was all necessary, he said, because family pressures and his Chicano culture wouldn't allow him to do otherwise. I never accepted that.

Carlos began to experience what I suggested were symptoms of advanced HIV infection. I urged him many times to be tested. He finally did have some blood drawn at the health clinic, but he never picked up the results because he was paranoid about his car being spotted in the parking lot. I also urged him to quit engaging in unsafe sex. When he responded to me at all, he would insist that he was healthy and therefore didn't have to bother with safe sex. For several months afterwards, Carlos continued to pride himself on having sex without condoms, all the while maintaining that he posed no risk to his sexual partners.

Not too long ago, Carlos moved out of town and disappeared from sight. Even-

tually I learned that he had been diagnosed with AIDS. He died last week.

I may sympathize with his family, but I do not grieve for Carlos. Certainly it takes two people to spread a sexually transmitted disease, but by his own admission Carlos used his personal achievements to convince potential sex partners—usually other Latino men younger and less educated than he—that they could trust him, that they could believe him. Carlos' legacy is the reckless infection of possibly dozens of young men throughout Central and South Texas.

If there is any message here, it's one aimed particularly at you younger men (and women) who might find yourselves the objects of someone else's assurances: don't trust *anyone* when it comes to their

HIV status. If your companions want to engage in unsafe sex, then you should at least insist on several months of joint HIV testing and counseling before you ever even consider taking such a step.

The Past Revisited

"Backward, turn backward, O Time in your flight..." And you know what? For Zila and Mother Ivy, two of Dallas' Grande Dames—beloved legends, both of them—Dallas club owner Gary Monier did turn the hands of the clock back almost four decades.

The afternoon of March 24 was so appropriately spring-like. (How did Monier arrange that?) From all over the Metroplex, partygoers converged on Zippers and funneled themselves into the back bar. There, enthroned on their bar stools and entwined with a black feather boa, sat the royalty of Dallas' gay society, Zila and Mother Ivy. The food was delicious, the decor festive and the crowd merry—although most of the guests were too young to remember the night of November 5, 1952 (some might not have even been born yet back then!)—the night Zila's Band Box opened. But they had merely to close their eyes, listen to the music and laughter, feel the excitement and suddenly... they were back in the velvet-flocked and mirrored bar on South Akard of the Eisenhower years.

It was a time of police brutality, of entrapment and imprisonment. But we tend to forget the bad and remember only the good things of times past. Times when on weekend nights "downtown" was alive and vibrant! Streetcars stopped at every corner, opened their doors and poured out

the people who had come to revel in the gaudy neon lights, to visit the splendid movie palaces and to meet friends at soda fountains and restaurants. Often, though, they came just to join in the hustle and bustle.

Times when downtown was flooded with servicemen on three-day passes, horny as only youth can be, and eager to be picked up. Eager to do the picking were the Queens of the day: Tiger Lil, Blonde, Toni, Coke Cola, Jo-Jo, Chartreuse, Bloody Mary... after all, there was little violence. As for sexually transmitted diseases, why worry? A shot of penicillin cured everything.

Times when the emerging gay community, like the nation, was prosperous and growing. We wanted a first-class bar. Zila, a straight woman, turned her Holiday Bar into a gay one because she found that we were usually better behaved and more fun. She instructed her staff to greet everyone by their first names—not an impossible task in those days when Dallas was half as big, and gays were closeted and frightened. If a stranger entered her bar, Zila introduced herself, then she introduced the newcomer to others. Little wonder that within two years she needed a larger, more richly decorated bar.

Her loyal patrons were not disappointed when Zila's Band Box opened. The decor was pissy, the service friendly and it was

the city's first piano bar. The pianist played everything: show tunes, sentimental favorites, popular songs, blues, even classics. After five years, Zila sold the bar and moved to the Zoo Bar and later the Town Pump. The crowds followed.

Today, at 75, Zila is retired and enjoying life. Happy birthday, Zila!

Mother Ivy, also non-gay, came into the community in 1957, starting with Gene's Music Bar. Like Zila, she was (and is) a friend to everyone. For more than 30 years she has worked many clubs, among them the Detour, Bayou Landing and the Bell Pepper. Of course, there's no way she can remember all the names or faces she's met, but thousands of gay men and women in Dallas and across the nation remember hers. Within a few days she is to undergo hip surgery. We all wish her well.

Gary Monier's party was reminiscent of the old days in that the more things change, the more they remain the same. True, many of the old faces are gone—some missed, some forgotten. But life goes on. Handsome new faces laugh and joke. New hearts love and are broken. (Just like ours. Don't they know that soon they too will be old? Or gone? But why should they? We didn't.)

The gay community is thankful to Monier for the opportunity to celebrate with our living legends. To mingle was to hear, "Whatever happened to..." "Honey, I haven't seen him in..." "The last I heard..." "Why, that old queen..." "Do you remember when the police..." "Would you like to spend the night..." Time has taken so many of us. How many will *not* be at Zippers for next year's party? Let's celebrate while we may!
