SAN ANTONIO — The Pride Committee of the San Antonio Lesbian/Gay Assembly, the planning group for this year's pride celebration in the Alamo City, has announced a tentative schedule of Pride Month activities.

On Wednesday, June 19, Juneteenth Day will be held at the SALSA Lambda Student Center from 7-10 p.m., observing the anniversary of the 1865 proclamation freeing the slaves; and

On Sunday, June 23, the "Out Is In" Pride Picnic features music, live performances on two stages, a volleyball tournament, food, beverages and exhibitor booths. From 2-8 p.m., San Pedro Park in the Gazebo area.

Gerald Aves is the new male co-chair, Kay Ford is the new female co-chair, Gilbert Casillas takes over as secretary and Lorna Klockenga assumes the post of treasurer. THRF TO HONOR 21.06 PLAINTIFFS IN DALLAS

*Reception Is Start of Effort
To Raise Funds for Continuing
Legal Battle Over Statute.*

DALLAS — The Texas Human Rights Foundation [THRF] is holding a reception on Sunday, May 19 in honor of Charlotte Taft and John Thomas, the Dallas plaintiffs in the lawsuit to overturn Section 21.06.

After hearing arguments in December on behalf of the five plaintiffs in the case, Travis County District Judge Paul Davis ruled from the bench that Section 21.06 of the Texas Penal Code was unconstitutional under the Texas Constitution. Under the law, anyone engaging in private consensual sex with a person of the same sex can be fined \$200. Though few people have actually been convicted under the law, it has been used to harass gay and lesbian Texans and served as an excuse to deny employment.

The decision by Texas Attorney General Dan Morales to appeal Judge Davis' ruling came after a meeting between Morales and 15 representatives of the statewide gay and lesbian community the weekend of the March on Austin. THRF officials regard the appeal as a necessary step in having 21.06 struck down permanently.

The reception is being held from 5 p.m. till 7:30 p.m. at the home of a Dallas couple. Donations of \$21.06 at the door are requested to help pay for the continuing legal battle over the anti-sodomy statute.

The reception honoring Taft and Thomas is a preliminary step in securing the funding necessary to pay for the present and future appeals. MONTROSE CLINIC 'MEDICAL STEPS' WORKSHOP MAY 25

Audette Clinic Now Has Wednesday Afternoon Hours for STD Testing, Immune System Evaluation.

HOUSTON — The Houston Clinical Research Network, an affiliate of the Montrose Clinic, is presenting the third in its series of four workshops entitled "Medical Steps" on Saturday, May 25.

"HIV Clinical Research: Experimental Therapies for HIV" will explore some of the issues involved in drug studies. Included will be information on drug trials being conducted in Houston.

The Medical Steps workshops are geared toward people with no medical background who are confused about the various blood tests, medical procedures, medications and treatments used for HIV.

In other clinic news, the Thomas Audette Memorial Clinic has announced an expansion of its hours for diagnosis and treatment of persons with sexually transmitted diseases. In a change that became effective May 15, the clinic is now open on Wednesday afternoons from 1 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.

The additional opening hours have been made possible through the efforts of Dr. Patricia Salvato, who volunteers her services every Wednesday.

Executive Director Ralph Lasher said he hoped the new afternoon session would be more convenient than evening sessions for many people. In addition to the stan-

Houston Chapter to Post Flyers In Pub Crawl Saturday, May 18; Dallas Chapter Hosts Pot Luck Dinner for Gay Hispanics, Asians.

TEXAS — Members of the Houston and Dallas chapters of Dignity, the organization for gay and lesbian Catholics, have some fun and informative activities planned this month.

Houston chapter members are taking a bar tour tomorrow, Saturday night, May 18, to make a point about the compatibility of being gay or lesbian and retaining one's religious faith. They will be posting flyers that read, "Lesbian/gay Catholic is *not* an oxymoron."

As Mike Kaney, president of Dignity/Houston, explained it, "An oxymoron is a combination of words that seem contradictory or incompatible, such as 'cruel kindness' or 'friendly fire.'"

"Over the past few years, the way Catholic teaching about homosexuality has been perceived has alienated many of our brothers and sisters," Kaney said. "We want to remind people that they can be lesbian or gay and still be Catholics, and that they are always welcome at Dignity's weekly liturgy," he added.

On Tuesday, May 21, Dignity/Dallas is hosting an International Pot Luck Dinner for the Gay Hispanic Group and the Asian Group. The evening will include mass, beginning at 7:15 p.m., followed by dinner. Visitors are welcome.

Dignity is a nationwide nonprofit organization for gay and lesbian Catholics and their friends. There are chapters in cities all over the country, including several in Texas. The Houston chapter meets for mass and a social hour every Saturday at 7:30 p.m. at 1505 Nevada. The phone number is (713) 528-0111. 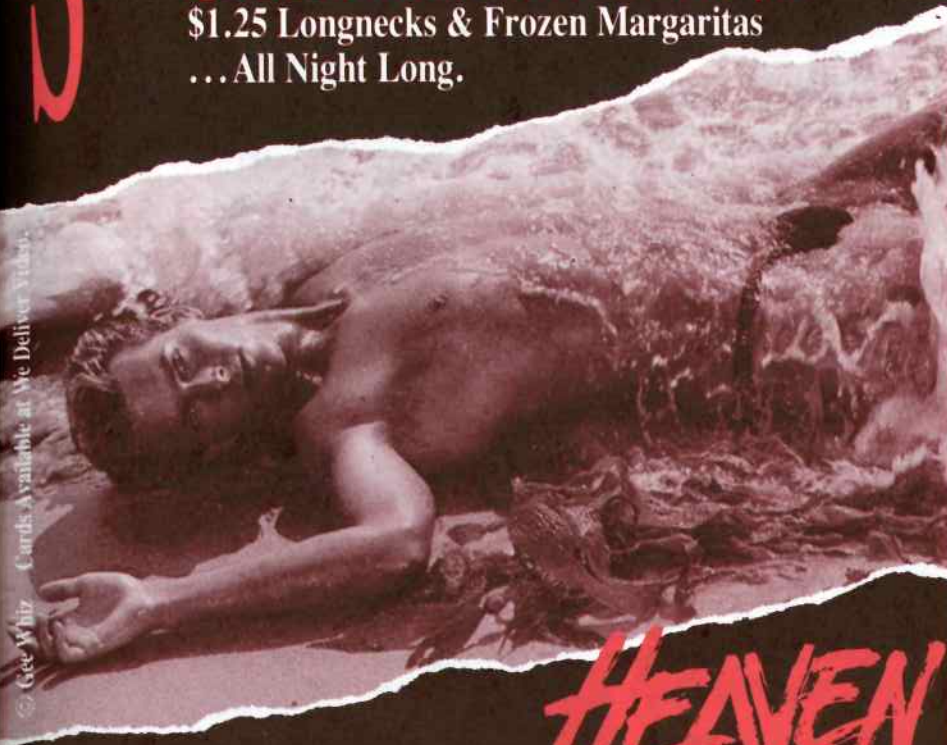

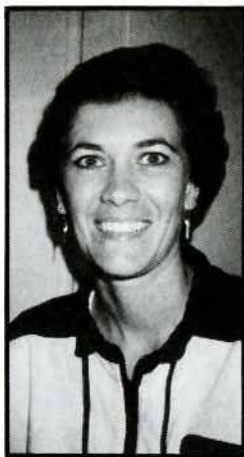

Dallas business owner and activist Carolyn Dunbar elected to HRCF Board of Directors.

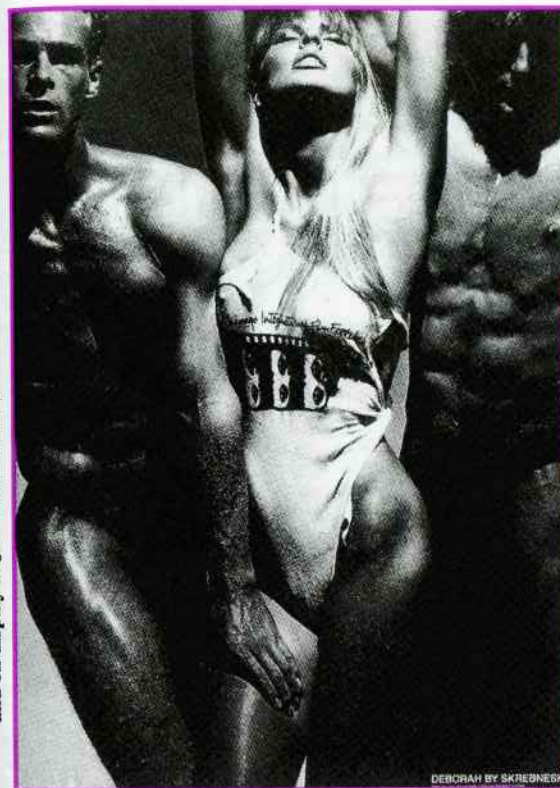

SAAF FILES SECOND BIAS SUIT AGAINST FOUR SEASONS

Action Comes on Heels of Failure Of Nursing Centers to Comply With Earlier Order to Eliminate Discriminatory Admissions Policies.

SAN ANTONIO — The San Antonio AIDS Foundation [SAAF] has filed another civil rights suit against the Four Seasons Nursing Centers of San Antonio. The complaint was filed under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. SAAF filed a previous complaint against Four Seasons on June 10, 1988 with the Office for Civil Rights [OCR] of the Department of Health & Human Services. [See TWT NEWS, "San Antonio Four Seasons Investigated," Vol. 16, No. 33.]

Papa Bear, President of SAAF, recalled that the organization originally became aware of discriminatory policies at Four Seasons when a female client was denied admission to all five Four Seasons locations on the grounds that she had tested positive for the HIV virus. In response to the complaint, the Office for Civil Rights instigated an investigation of Four Seasons Nursing Centers and its corporate owner, Manor HealthCare Corporation. On Sept. 28, 1990, the San Antonio AIDS Foundation was informed by OCR that its investigation showed that Manor HealthCare had instituted a policy of not admitting AIDS patients.

Kurt Dullnig, admissions director at Four Seasons Pecan Valley, claimed at the time that Four Seasons had instituted the policy because it did not have the capability to care for AIDS patients. However, the OCR found this not to be true. As a result of the investigation, Four Seasons Nursing Centers was found in violation of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act and was ordered by the OCR to change its discriminatory policies. To this date, however, Four Seasons apparently remains in violation of this legal order.

The failure of Four Seasons to comply with the order was brought to the attention of SAAF recently when yet another of its clients was denied admission on the basis of being HIV positive. Hence, San Antonio AIDS Foundation is filing a second civil rights suit against Four Seasons to force the company to comply.

OLCS BUDDY TRAINING THIS WEEKEND

Social Security Options

Dear TWT:

Most people with AIDS qualify for disability benefits from Social Security, but people with HIV-symptomatic infections [Human Immunodeficiency Virus] who have not been diagnosed as having AIDS may also qualify for disability payments from Social Security if they are unable to work because of their diseases.

Social Security pays disability insurance benefits to people who have worked long enough and recently enough under the program. Social Security also makes disability payments under the Supplemental Security Income (SSI) Program to people who have limited income and resources. The process for evaluation of disability is the same under both programs, but other eligibility rules differ.

To be considered disabled, a person must have a disability that has lasted or is expected to last at least a year or result in death. When the person applies for disability benefits, Social Security must determine if symptoms are severe enough to prevent that person from working, considering his or her age, education and work experience.

If a treating source verifies that an individual has AIDS, the case is flagged for speedy processing. A disabled person with limited income and assets may qualify for SSI and receive "presumptive" payments for six months while a full determination is being made.

Medicare is available to people who received Social Security Disability benefits for 24 consecutive months. People receiving SSI disability payments generally qualify for Medicaid, a state medical assistance program, which may begin with the start of SSI payments.

People who have HIV disease and find themselves unable to work because of it should apply for benefits. Even if you are later able to return to work, Social Security can help you during the period

when you are unable to work. If you know someone who has AIDS or HIV-symptomatic infections, you should have them contact the Social Security Office at 1-800-234-5772.

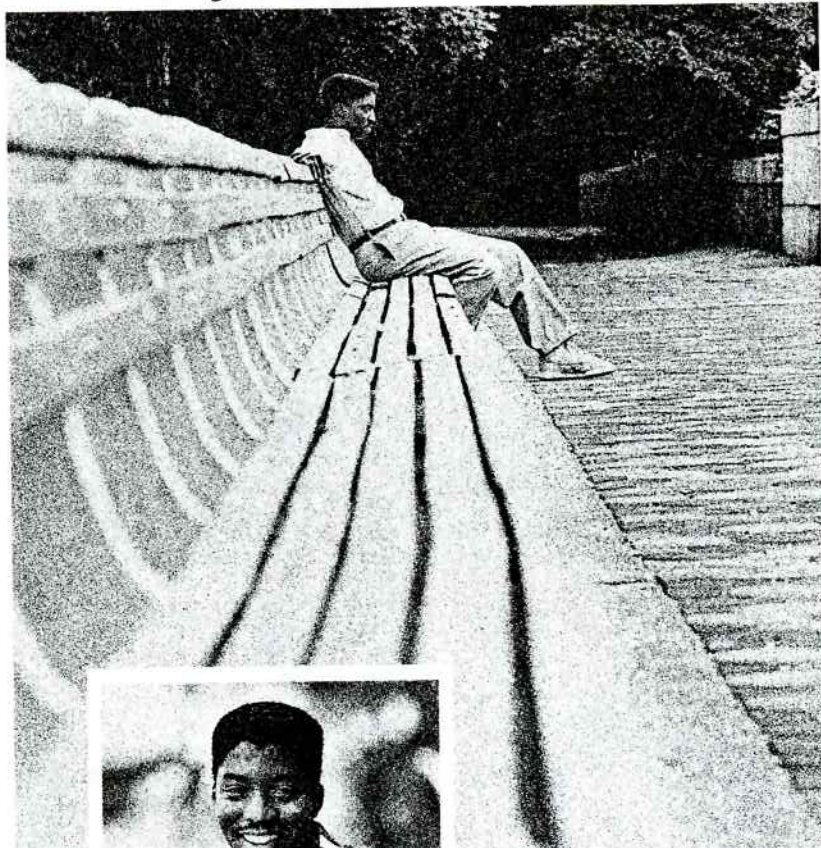

'Straight Talk About Gay & Lesbian Issues In the '90s'

The Oak Lawn Community Services [OLCS] is obviously an organization with a purpose and a dedication to service. On Saturday, May 4, OLCS presented a day-long conference entitled "Straight Talk About Gay and Lesbian Issues in the '90s." The seminar, originally aimed at health care professionals, was open to anyone interested.

The day was divided into two sessions before lunch, and one following. Pamela Bell, who sits on the Board of Directors of OLCS and is a member of the Mental Health Advisory Council, led a discussion



during the first session on the development of the lesbian and gay identity. She described the process as consisting of eight stages, even though each individual may or may not go through all eight: from sensitization, to identity confusion, comparison, tolerance, acceptance, first relationships, identity commitment and synthesis. Through the initial stages, we begin to recognize our homosexual feelings, but we often deny or rationalize them. In later stages, our contacts are more influenced by their emotional quality, whether favorable or unfavorable. Finally, we evolve from a feeling of "them" and "us" to the realization that there are common bonds between the gay and straight worlds.

Bell explained that achieving good mental health really means being able to come out to others. She did caution, however, that people need to consider reactions before coming out to others, and she stressed the need to seek the support of others through organizations like OLCS.

Amy Swetman, Clinical Director of Parkside Lodge-Westgate, lectured on the topics of homophobia and self-esteem. She defined homophobia as "an intense, irrational fear of homosexuality."

Swetman described the prevailing attitude in America as that of the white Anglo-Saxon Protestant culture. This external homophobic attitude wears away at our self-esteem and causes a much higher rate of addiction and self-destructive behavior. Swetman noted that in the gay and lesbian population, one out of three people demonstrates this destructive pattern, while the rate in the general population is only one out of ten.

"There is approximately an 80% relapse rate in the gay and lesbian community," Swetman said, "after they seek help. This is due to the homophobic effect and the feeling that 'I am not fitting in—I am deficient.' This external influence comes from your family, religion, legal system, the media and even the mental health profession itself," she said.

"Recovering from homophobia is an inside job," Swetman said. "You must affirm

the fact that you don't have to be a victim. Other people often find scapegoats to make themselves feel and look better," she said, "and the gay and lesbian community is frequently such a target. You cannot be a scapegoat unless you allow it to happen, so learn the facts and don't perpetuate the effects of homophobia yourself."

Swetman explained that overcoming homophobia involves several stages. First, you must identify and stop the self-destructive behavior. Then you must learn the facts about gay and lesbian lifestyles, and not accept the myths. You must learn to be good to yourself, and seek out the positive affirmation of others.

"Treat yourself well, and you will attract the same treatment from others," Swetman concluded. "The effects of homophobia didn't happen overnight, so don't think that recovery will either. Be gentle with yourself."

During the luncheon, Dr. Alan Hamill spoke about holistic health.

"We have all been sold on the idea that germs cause disease," he said. "Germs are merely components that allow disease to occur." Your being operates as a whole with the spiritual, mental, physical and emotional aspects all having an impact on your health.

Hamill made several concrete suggestions for improving one's wellness. The daily diet should emphasize carbohydrates, the complex starches that provide energy. "Regarding your food choices, the fresher, more seasonal, the better," he said, adding that he felt that the natural cycle of available foods was nature's way of providing the right nutrients at the right time of year.

"Exercise should be used to get away from the stresses of life," Hamill said. During exercise one should free one's mind of daily problems and focus on the sights and sounds in nature. Note the wonder of life itself. "Exercise should be used to assist your body in maintaining health."

All aspects of life work together and are very much interrelated. Hamill said that thinking takes energy, noting the tired feeling students have after studying or taking an exam. One's thoughts give off energy, too, he said, adding that "what you are thinking has an effect, even if not voiced."

"You must become conscious about all aspects of your life," Hamill said. "This means becoming aware of your physical

wellness or symptoms, as well as emotional and mental stress in your life. You must learn what causes symptoms, and not just suppress them. Physicians are educated to assist you in maintaining health."


Cindy Chandler, an assistant professor at the University of North Texas, spoke about multicultural issues in the gay and lesbian community. When dealing with someone from a different background than oneself, it is always important to ask them about themselves. She said we are often hesitant to ask, but most people are glad to talk about their heritage.

"Don't perpetuate assimilation," Chandler said. "Help to promote their self-esteem. Ask them about their culture, family, lifestyle, religion and customs. Find out if there are generational differences between them and their parents and grandparents. You can also ask them about the perceived disadvantages and advantages of their culture."

Chandler said that it was important for gay and lesbian organizations to learn to incorporate different minorities into their groups, but often this requires actively seeking them out. It is unreasonable to expect the minorities to take the initiative because there is often a lack of trust. "Minorities have learned that those in authority don't respect their differences, so the trust factor must be earned."

Chandler incorporated a Native American custom into her session, as she introduced the group to the "healing ceremony of the talking feather." A single turkey feather was passed from one person to another around a circle. Each person had to make and hold eye contact as the feather was passed. We were instructed to tell something we liked about ourselves, and what we were doing to improve ourselves.

As the feather was being passed to a visually impaired young woman, the giver said, "Let me hold your hand." As the young woman took the feather, she responded, "What I like about you is your creativity."

That simple passing of the feather seemed to be what the whole day was about. Learning to become more accepting of others, while learning how to accept ourselves. Even though the gay and lesbian community of the '90s is very diverse, our differences don't make us separate. We are one with humanity.

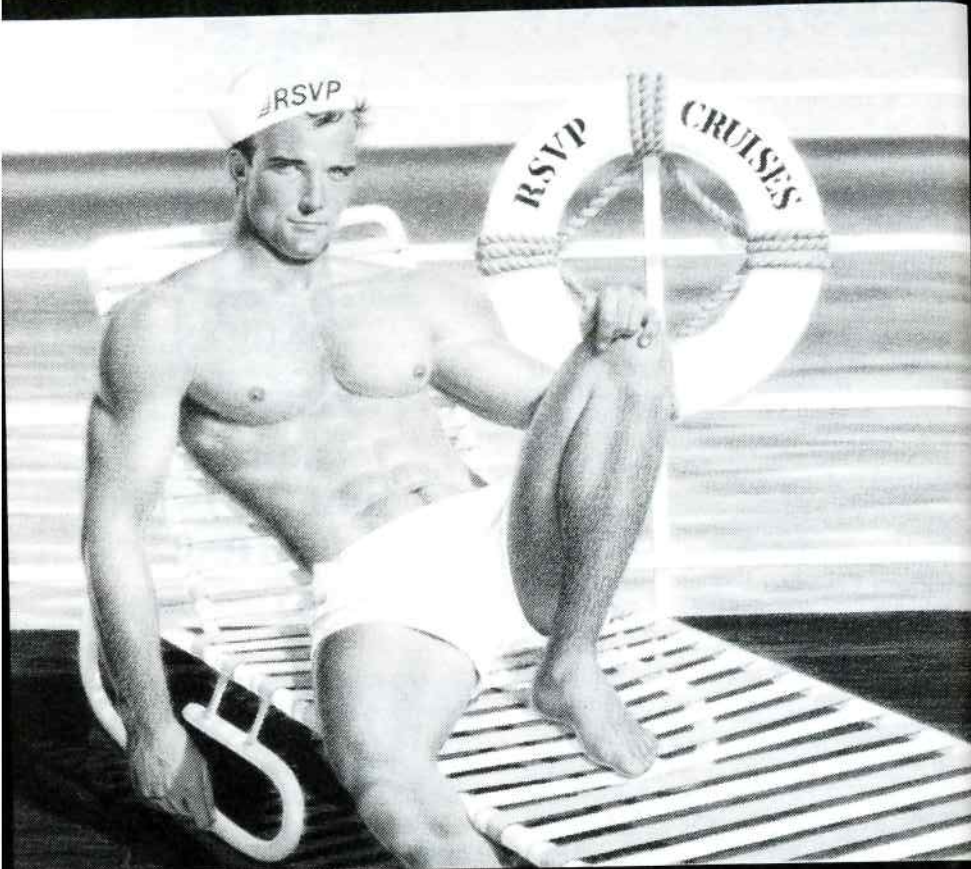

According to statistics gathered by the Southern Poverty Law Center, the number of hate crimes committed in this country has increased dramatically over the past three years. Indeed, 1990 was the bloodiest year yet since the Center began monitoring hate crimes 10 years ago.

While hate-related crimes of all kinds are on the increase, those perpetrated against gay and lesbian people have risen most dramatically. There are several reasons for this. Firstly, the increased visibility and political power of our community over the past two decades has led many people to perceive us as a threat. Secondly, greater visibility has made us easier targets for homophobic individuals. Finally, lesbians and gays are part of a larger social movement that is threatening the oppressive power structure of this country. Resistance inevitably follows, as formerly disempowered groups challenge the social and political forces of racism, sexism, ableism and homophobia.

Our reaction to this increase in violent hate crimes should not be a retreat into the closet, or a silencing of our challenges to the political system. We must continue our activism, demanding our rights and educating both our own community and the straight public. Nonetheless, faced with the everyday reality of living as lesbian or gay people, we cannot simply wait for a hostile public to become enlightened; we must attempt to protect ourselves through legislation.

One way to protect ourselves is by passing hate crimes legislation. There are several different methods of legislating against hate crimes. Some hate crime laws give the individual a civil cause of action against the perpetrator of the hate crime. Another type of legislation enhances criminal penalties against perpetrators of hate crimes.

Other legislation, such as the Federal Hate Crimes Statistics Act, directs police to keep records of the number of hate crimes perpetrated against specific groups, including gays and lesbians. Despite criticism, the Federal Hate Crimes Act has been effective. Since this act became law, some important state officials, as well as new Dallas police chief William Rathburn, have requested that police officers and government employees receive sensitivity training about gay and lesbian issues.

This session the LGRL is supporting hate crimes legislation that has been in-

troduced in both the House and Senate. All of the hate crimes bills that are being considered this session enhance penalties and require the state to keep statistics on hate-related crimes. The bills also require that law enforcement officers receive training in identifying, responding to and reporting hate crimes.

In the House, there were originally two different hate crimes bills. The first, HB 1362, gave protection to specific groups including gays and lesbians. The other general hate crimes bill, HB 1568, protected any "traditionally disfavored group." After a recent hearing in the House Criminal Jurisprudence Committee, the legislators who introduced the two bills determined that the best approach was to drop the bill that gave specific protections and concentrate all efforts on the more general hate crimes bill. The state Senate will probably follow this same strategy with its companion bills to HB 1362 and HB 1568.

Although the more specific bill offered our community better protection, there was not enough support for this bill to vote

it out of the House. However, there may be enough support for the general hate crimes bill. After the legislative session is over, it may be possible for Attorney General Dan Morales to render an opinion defining "traditionally disfavored groups" and include in this definition gay and lesbian people.

Moving from the hate crimes legislators to the hate perpetrators, on Tuesday, May 7, Pastor W.N. Otwell of Fort Worth visited the Capitol to protest the election of Glen Maxey, the state's first openly gay elected official, and to protest House Bill 1592, which prohibits a court from taking sexual orientation, race and religion into consideration in determining issues of child custody.

Rev. Otwell and his three bus loads of supporters wore T-shirts stating, "When God made Man, he made them Adam and Eve, not Adam and Steve or Annie and Eve" and "The sin of sodomy disqualifies you as a parent, a politician and a preacher." They also wore baseball caps picturing Adam and Steve, Annie and Eve, and Adam and Eve with a red "X" across what they perceived to be the "inappropriate" couples.

Otwell's group is called G.A.P., for "God Against Perversion." The G.A.P. position paper, which is sent to all Senators and Representatives, states that the group is "alarmed that Texas has elected the openly professed homosexual..." Also included in their information packet are a series of lurid descriptions (in painstaking detail) of what they imagine to be the sexual practices of gay men. Legislators are urged to "read for yourself the wicked, perverted and animalistic practices of the homosexual..."

Members of G.A.P. offered testimony against House Bill 1592, written by LGRL and introduced by Rep. Debra Danburg of Houston. Fortunately, they were about two weeks late in their testimony: House Bill 1592 had already had a hearing in which Rep. Danburg and members of the gay and lesbian community had spoken in favor of the bill. In fact, the Bible-thumping craziness of Otwell and his cronies seems to have convinced the committee that HB 1592 is very necessary.

Rev. Otwell's G.A.P., and other similar hate groups, are a danger to our community and we must fight back as a community. Often people express strong emotion, such as anger, in places where they

feel safe. In the gay and lesbian community this safe space may be a political meeting, a bar or a gathering of friends. However, we must be certain that our anger is directed outward at those who are perpetrating the hate crimes, and not inward at our own community. A divided lesbian and gay community is, after all, exactly what Reverend Otwell and his followers want.

If you are angry about Rev. Otwell and other hate crime perpetrators, then use your anger constructively and call your legislators. Tell them that you support HB 1568, the hate crimes bill, and HB 1592, which prohibits sexual orientation from being taken into consideration in determining issues of child custody.

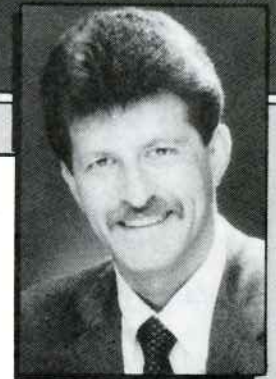

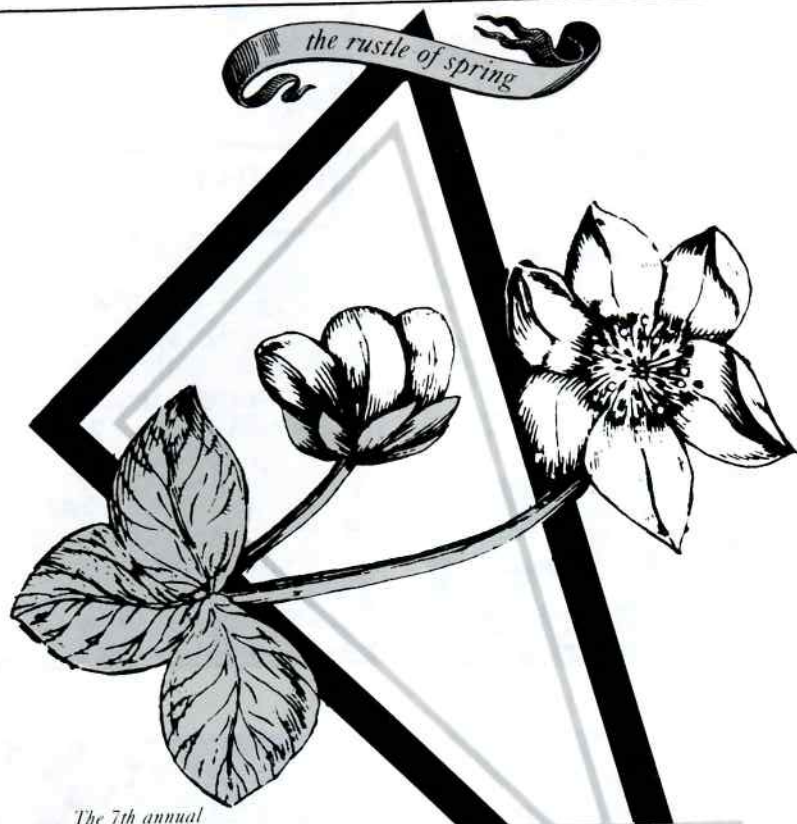

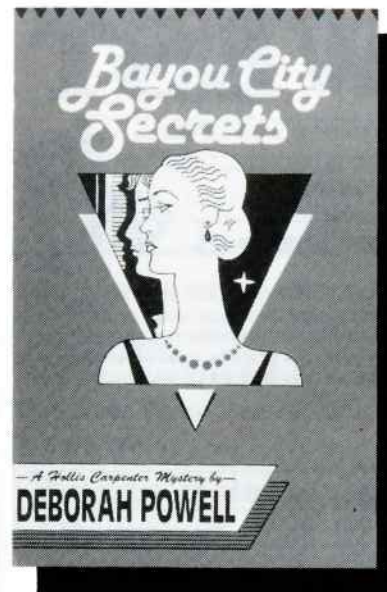

Bayou City Secrets

by Deborah Powell

Bayou City Secrets, by Deborah Powell; fiction, 208 pp.; The Naiad Press, P.O. Box 10543, Tallahassee, FL 32302; softcover, \$8.95

One of the Bayou City's best kept secrets was author Deborah Powell, before she mysteriously vanished to a new home in Colorado just a few days ago. She will live there a long time before she is familiar enough with her environs to tap out another book like *Bayou City Secrets*. Powell, who had never read a lesbian mystery, impulsively created this one in four months and has completed a sequel.

Set in the Houston winter of 1936, the story concerns Hollis Carpenter, an aggressive investigative reporter for the *Houston Times*. Hollis lives in the Montrose with her dog Anice, complains and commiserates with her friends Gael and Katherine, argues with her employer, Andrew Delacroix and lusts after his wife.

After refusing a transfer to cover the Houston and Dallas centennial galas (an insult to her prestige as a "serious" re-

porter), arguing with her boss and declaring to the publisher's secretary that "he could come crawling on his hands and knees" and still not persuade her to rescind her resignation from the *Times*, Hollis is beset by eerie events. Her apartment is burglarized. A cop friend is murdered. A strange car follows her every mile.

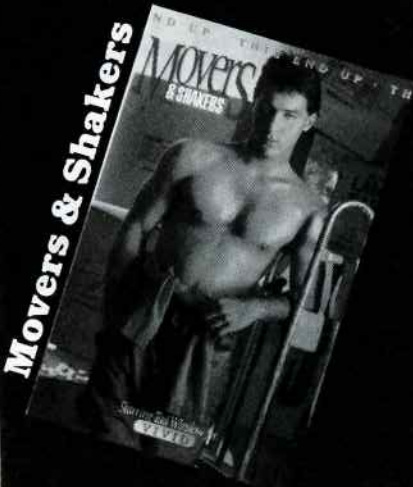
Through her easy intimacy with the city, Powell makes all readers feel at home with her descriptions of River Oaks, Buffalo Bayou, the Rice Hotel. Equally inviting is her portrayal of Lily Delacroix, the illuminatingly splendid wife-victim who confides to Hollis that she is frigid.

Without an explicit love scene in the whole book, lesbians, straights, whores and a madam all unwittingly conspire to relieve Lily's condition by revealing the secret of the Bayou City and allowing Hollis to win her love.

Finally, in both Dallas and Houston, police officers—apparently bored with such trivialities as murder, rape and robbery—instead focused their attentions on the backrooms of the two metropolitan areas' gay bookstores. 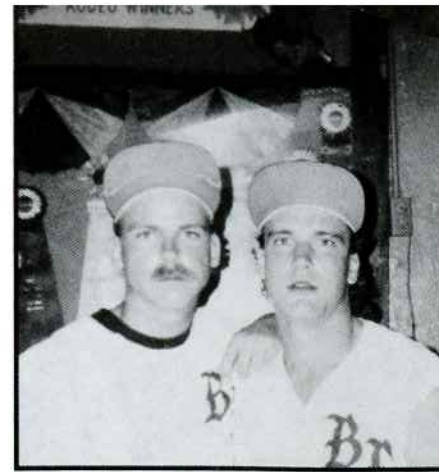

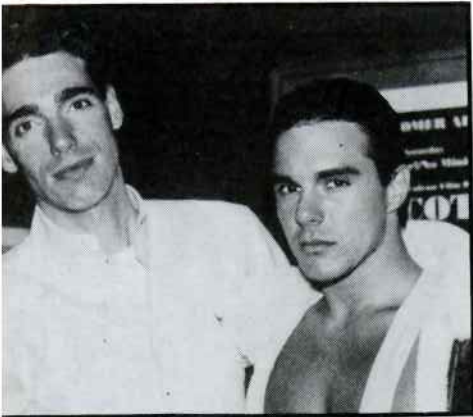

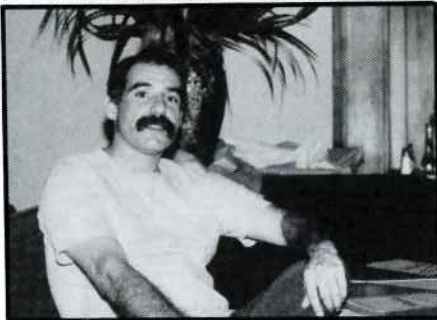

Wendell Lee Statchuk was born on May 17, 1957 in Baltimore, Maryland to Alexander and Loretta Holtz Statchuk.

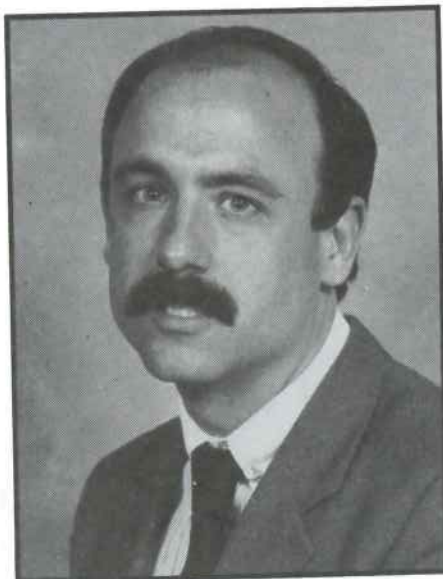

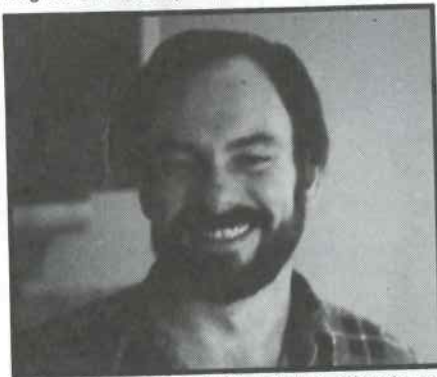

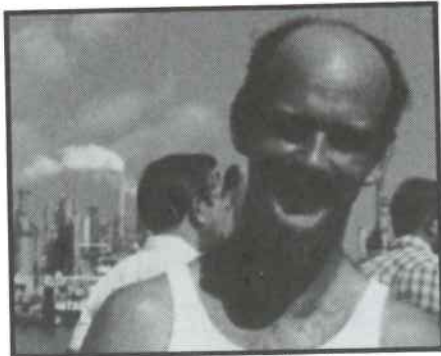


Greg Crosby (above), 39, of Dallas, died of complications from AIDS on April 28.

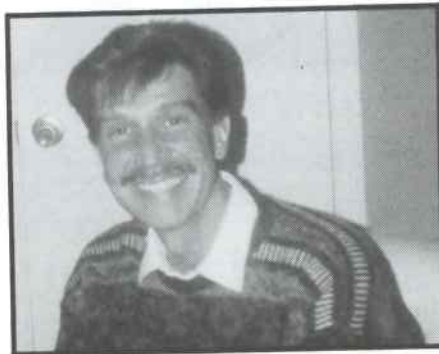
Larry W. Theriot (above)
