GLEN MAXEY STEPS DOWN AS LGRL EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

*To Become Ex-Officio Member;
Laurie Eiserloh New Director.*

AUSTIN — In an effort to devote more time to his new job, recently elected State Representative Glen Maxey has stepped down as Executive Director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas [LGRL]. He submitted his letter of resignation to the LGRL board at its May 4 meeting in Austin. The board expects to bring Maxey on as an ex-officio member at its July meeting.

For four years Maxey has worked for repeal of section 21.06 of the state Penal Code, the state's antisodomy statute, and also promoted AIDS legislation for funding and community-based programs. He also worked in coalition with CHOICE activists on legislation affecting a woman's right to choose abortion.

Maxey was elected State Representative from District 51 in south Austin on March 6 in a special election called after Governor Ann Richards appointed Representative Lena Guerrero to the Railroad Commission. Following his election, Maxey requested a ruling from the Legislative Legal Council to determine if he could stay on with the lobby in any capacity. The council ruled that he was well within the law if he maintained an administrative position, but that he could no longer engage in lobbying.

As the first openly-gay elected state official, Maxey says his decision to leave the lobby was not an easy one, but that several things finally convinced him it was a necessary and positive step. On a personal level, he said he struggled with burnout and realized there simply weren't enough hours in the day for him to do both jobs.

Maxey also says that, while current Texas law allows him to have a paid position with the lobby, that will likely change when new ethics legislation currently being written by the Legislature goes into effect in September. Maxey feels that it is crucial for the lobby to maintain a sense of propriety, and in fact to be a leader on the ethics issue.

Maxey's departure leaves the lobby under the direction of lobbyist Laurie Eiserloh. A recent graduate of the University of Texas School of Law, Eiserloh was



hired by the LGRL board in November as a lobbyist and community organizer. Currently she focuses her efforts on legislation dealing with hate crimes, AIDS programs and funding, and repeal of 21.06. Her work also includes efforts to change child custody laws to prevent discrimination against gay and lesbian parents.

In addition to maintaining a full-time lobbyist in Austin, the LGRL also sponsors various events throughout the year, including the recent March on Austin for Lesbian and Gay Rights which drew 28,000 people. The LGRL board is made up of individuals who represent supporting organizations from around the state and at-large representatives elected by LGRL membership.

PLUS + TALKS DIRTY FOR SAFER SEX IN DALLAS

*Chuck Frutchey of San Francisco
Conducts Workshop on Issues
Of Sex, Being HIV Positive.*

DALLAS — A recent Sunday afternoon really heated up with a lot of dirty talk, but it was all for a purpose, to promote safer sex. PLUS + , People Like Us, held their monthly meeting featuring Chuck Frutchey of the San Francisco AIDS Foundation. PLUS + is the special interest group of the Dallas Gay Alliance for HIV-positive people.

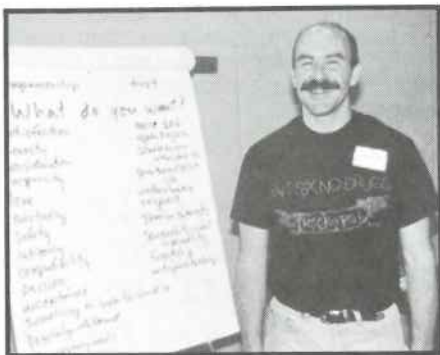
At the beginning of the meeting, everyone in attendance was asked to rate their current sex life from 0-10. The average rating was pretty low. "If I came back in six months or a year, I would hope to see your answers averaging several points higher after this session," Frutchey said.

Why people have sex was the next question Frutchey raised. The answers ranged from pleasure and lust to love, affection

and "skin hunger." "The reasons we have sex are many, and we shouldn't always expect fireworks to happen," he said. Knowing what one wants from sex and holding realistic expectations are essential.

Frutchey told participants to get out of their chairs and meet four other people they did not know, without using a traditional handshake. A lot of smiles and hugs helped to break the ice. After pairing off with a new partner, each person had to draw an image showing how he felt about being HIV positive. Each person then shared his images with his partner.

Groups of six people then formed from the pairs, each one receiving a printed word for one of six categories describing sex: oral, tactile, condoms, visual, verbal and intercourse. Through brainstorming, the groups listed specific ways to demonstrate these affections. The results were graphically exciting.

After a short break, Frutchey discussed some of the psychological and emotional issues relating to sex among HIV-positive people. When questioned about their feelings toward men who are HIV negative, participants gave answers ranging from jealous to angry, questioning to avoidance to shunning. "There is a lot of excess baggage that we carry with us, being positive, before we have sex. We need to learn to eliminate that, emotionally and psychologically," Frutchey explained.

Participants were asked to admit if they had ever made a verbal commitment to someone else always to practice safe sex. Then they were asked whether, if they "slipped," they would confess it to someone else. Role playing was used among

the pairs within the groups to encourage the use of condoms.

Frutchey demonstrated the proper use of a condom, stressing using the proper side and ensuring a snug fit. "You must learn to eroticize condoms, to make them part of sex. After a while, the use of condoms will cease to feel awkward and will simply become second nature."

The next meeting of PLUS+ is on Sunday, June 9 from 3-5 p.m., at the Gay and Lesbian Community Center, 2701 Reaga at Brown.

GAY, LESBIAN PARENTS MEET IN HOUSTON THIS WEEKEND

Three-Day GLPCI Conference Divided into Three Levels for Parents, Young People & Children.

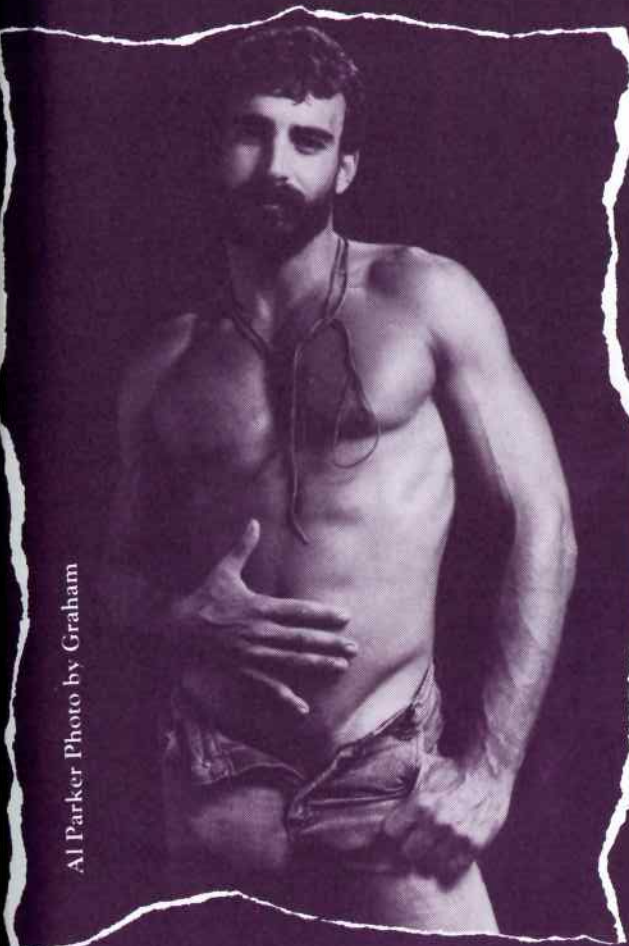
HOUSTON — An estimated 300 parents and children are expected at the twelfth annual conference of the Gay and Lesbian Parents Coalition International [GLPCI] on June 14, 15 and 16. The conference will be divided into three levels, with different programs aimed at parents, youth and children.

The youth conference (for ages 13 through adults) is called "Just for Us" and is organized and administered by young people. "Just for Us" will feature workshops dealing with AIDS, the history of the lesbian and gay community, religion and many other issues affecting the children of gay men and lesbians. Activities for children under 13 will include sightseeing and special workshops oriented to their age group. The conference will also make available child care for children under six years of age.

The parents' conference will consist of workshops covering adoption, foster parenting, coparenting, legal issues, parents without access to their children, dealing with ex-spouses, organizing support groups and other topics. Also planned are activities that will bring all three groups together to share in a family atmosphere.

A family-style Texas hoedown will highlight Friday evening, and on Saturday events will culminate in a Yellow Rose Awards Banquet and dance. Rip Corley, author of *The Final Closet*, will be honored

GLPCI is an organization worldwide in scope that serves as an advocate for the rights of lesbians and gay men in their roles as parents and for those who are considering parenting and their children. Formed at the time of the first March on Washington, the Coalition convenes each summer to present workshops and provide an atmosphere of support and opportunities for sharing of information.

*Special Gala Presentation of
Bride Who Is a Stranger' Tonight;
Play Being Underwritten by HMSS.*

DALLAS — Looking for something special to do this weekend? Then why not consider the Crescent Theater's production of *Bride Who Is a Stranger*. A presentation of the Chicago Industrial Theater, *Bride* continues through June 2, with a special gala presentation tonight, Friday, May 31. All proceeds from the play will benefit the AIDS Resource Center.

Bride is about dealing with the AIDS crisis and the differing ways individuals and institutions have responded to it. When there are no "built-in" mechanisms for dealing with a situation, society and culture must struggle to reinvent these and adjustments.

Conceived and directed by Audrey Heller and Justin Hayford, the play concerns

itself with the effect of AIDS on the public and private conscience. "We have this indissoluble union with the disease," explained Hayford, "and we don't even know what it is. We're walking down the aisle with a strange man or woman on one arm. There are no conclusions, only questions which are both broad and personal. The idea is to find personal meaning in the images which linger beyond the theatre."

The Crescent Theatre is located at 2215 Cedar Springs, across from the Crescent Hotel. Performances are at 8:15 p.m., with a Sunday matinee at 2 p.m. Tickets are \$10 and \$25 for tonight's gala. For more information, call (214)522-4460.

PRIDE-A-THON TO RAISE FUNDS FOR HOUSTON PRIDE WEEK

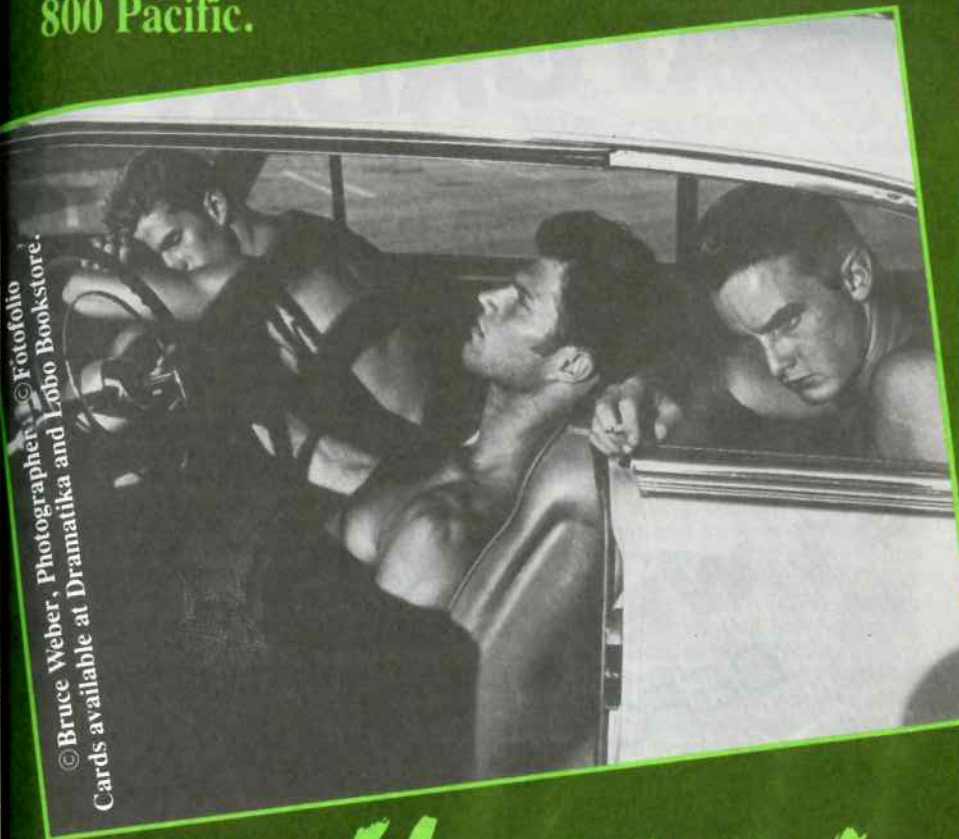

AIDS SERVICES OF AUSTIN EXPANDS STAFF

Fills Newly Created Position of Black Community Educator.

AUSTIN — AIDS Services of Austin [ASA] is expanding its range of services with the addition of three new staff members to its Client Services department and the filling of its newly created position of Black Community Educator.

In Client Services, Kimberly McFann, the new Case Manager, will be working closely with volunteers and student interns to provide quality case management services to ASA clients. Before joining ASA, McFann worked with Austin/Travis County Mental Health and Mental Retardation as a therapist and case manager. She has a BA in psychology and a Masters in Divinity, and has worked as a counselor and hospital chaplain.

Michele Clark, RN, works with Nursing Coordinator Dwayne Haught to provide home health care services to clients. She will also be providing pentamidine mist treatments once a week at ASA. Clark has a PhD in Nursing and extensive experience in home health care.

Michele Silvan, a registered, licensed dietician, will provide contract nutritional counseling services to clients. Silvan served as Food Service Director at Shoal Creek Hospital and worked as a clinical dietician at Seton East Community Center.

Patricia Simmons will fill the newly created position of Black Community Educator in ASA's Education Department. She was formerly the AIDS Minority Outreach Coordinator for the Shreveport YWCA. Simmons' duties will include managing condom and literature distribution, one-on-one street intervention and specific outreach to black gay men.

The new ASA staff positions were made possible through local, state and federal grants.

TGRA ANNOUNCES SITE OF 1992 ROYALTY COMPETITION

November 7 Competition Marks Culmination of Campaigns for Mr., Ms. & Miss Titles.

DALLAS — The Texas Gay Rodeo Association [TGRA] has chosen the location for its 1992 TGRA Royalty Competition.

Debe Powell, TGRA State President, told TWT NEWS the group had selected the Round-Up for the annual event, which takes place on November 7.

The competition marks the culmination of the Royalty Candidate campaigns of those members seeking the coveted titles of Mr., Ms. or Miss TGRA 1992. The *OUT!* exhibit features artwork by lesbian and gay artists from around the state and deals with homophobia as experienced, viewed and critiqued by its targets.

THRF trustee Robert Rosenberg, one of the organizers of the show, is participating as an artist as well.

To know that this type of attitude not only exists, but can be published and supported by advertisers, really scares me. I'm afraid if my disease ever became known, I'd have burning crosses on my lawn and lynch mobs at my door. I have a difficult enough battle for life; I don't need to live in fear of my neighbors. Please let your readers know how much work still has to be done by our community to fight this type of gross ignorance.

Take Control of Your Health

Dear TWT:

As with many of us in the community, I could fill a book with the number of tragic stories of people discovering they are HIV

positive only once they have become desperately ill, often at a point when little can be done to help them. This situation really angers me because it can be prevented.

Taking the HIV antibody test is still a choice (so far), but many people don't realize that getting tested can be considered a life-saving decision. Not knowing your HIV status can be more stressful than finding out that you are HIV positive.

Now I don't mean to suggest that being diagnosed with HIV isn't stressful, but at least you may have a chance to intervene and take control of your health. There are many opportunities in Houston and in other major cities in Texas to improve one's body, mind and attitude to best deal positively with the challenges of living with HIV and AIDS.

Unfortunately, few people are aware of these opportunities or know how to find out about the various classes available. The AIDS Foundation Houston [AFH] Wellness Program began in 1989 to increase this public awareness and help consolidate the many sources. To accomplish this, AFH publishes a monthly "Wellness Calendar" that summarizes upcoming events of interest, promoting free or low-cost classes to teach people with HIV and AIDS how to enjoy fuller and healthier lives.

Many of the classes are available on a monthly basis and encompass such areas as nutrition, stress management, self-hypnosis, exercise, spirituality, safer sex and personal growth. Although targeted primarily to persons infected with HIV, the classes are open to all interested people.

Where Were Eiserloh, Danburg?

Dear TWT:

I read, with interest, Lauri Eiserloh's "Capitol Report" entry in the May 17 issue

in which she reports the bashing by members of Rev. W.N. Otwell's church of HB 1592 carried by my Representative, Debra Danburg. She notes "the bible thumping craziness of Otwell and his cronies seems to have convinced the committee that HB 1592 is very unnecessary." (This bill would have protected the rights of parents in a custody dispute. The courts would have been disallowed from using sexual orientation as a factor in awarding custody.)

What Ms. Eiserloh failed to mention is that she could have spoken in favor of the bill to the subcommittee of the Judicial Affairs Committee that was holding the open hearing. But she chose not to be there. Instead, she sent one of her staff members who reported to me that what she witnessed was just too horrifying.

Two other items need note concerning that hearing. First, only two members of the subcommittee were present. They chose not to comment or curtail the six hours of bashing that went on. Second, when it became evident that this was going to be a bashing of the bill, the counsel of the committee sent for Rep. Danburg. She sent a reply that she would not be seen near the building where the hearing was being held that day. In essence, the bill was killed because no one was willing to stand in front of the "crazy" (Eiserloh's adjective in the article) people and defend its value. The authors of all of the other bills being considered by the subcommittee that day were present!

Furthermore, the whole Judicial Affairs Committee was to hold a hearing for Rep. Danburg's "gay marriage" bill. I was told that it was decided to simply drop the "gay marriage" bill because the committee could not count on Rep. Danburg's presence to defend that bill, and they did not want a repeat of what had transpired earlier. This same committee reported out the "decriminalization of dildos" bill which passed the House last week.

Yes, we need to write our legislators to protect the bills that could benefit us. But we need to have those who are elected and/or paid to represent us to be present, speak and be heard in the defense of rights as well. Shame to Laurie Eiserloh and Debra Danburg. You need to write them as well and present your displeasure!

Crosses Not Just Religious

Dear TWT:

I have just read the article in today's *Houston Chronicle* about the scuttling of the AIDS memorial planned by AFH board member John Paul Barnich for Memorial Day. The event was to have been a large number of white crosses placed in the esplanade along Montrose and Westheimer to symbolize a cemetery much like Arlington National Cemetery. Anyone who has been to or seen pictures of the Arlington cemetery knows that the rows and rows of crosses make a very moving image, much better than a list of numbers.

Unfortunately, the use of crosses for this commemoration was deemed unsuitable by a group of people. I was unable to determine from the article if it was the ACT UP organization itself, or just some of its members, which caused the cancellation of the event. Because they found the cross to be a symbol repugnant to them for its religious connotations, they overlooked the larger purpose which Mr. Barnich had in mind: public awareness of the large number of people who have died of AIDS.

The claim that this was a "religious ceremony" is ridiculous. While the cross is a religious symbol, in the context in which it was being used it is recognized as a symbol of death by most Americans. That is the point that was being made, the needless death of a large number of people, not the promotion of a deity.

It has been my understanding that ACT UP and its members wish to promote AIDS awareness by any means necessary. Is it impossible for them to put aside personal feelings about a symbol in order to do this? Would they, or anyone else, have been injured by the use of this symbol? I begin to wonder about their sincerity.

WITH END OF BOYCOTT, COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS ENCOURAGED TO APPLY FOR GRANTS FROM PHILIP MORRIS

Our community has been through some rough times. We are constantly reminded of AIDS and its tragic toll; how our brothers and sisters are discriminated against in employment, housing and child custody cases; and how we are frequent targets of abuse, hatred and indiscriminate physical violence.

All too often, our community is short-changed by an uncaring and seemingly indifferent corporate environment. Certainly, this appeared to be the case when the Dallas Gay Alliance, the Tarrant County Gay/Lesbian Alliance, the Dallas Tavern Guild and various ACT-UP chapters from around the country called upon Philip Morris Companies, Inc. (specifically, Miller Beer and Marlboro Cigarettes) to cease giving political action committee funds to bigoted Sen. Jesse Helms' reelection campaign last year.

When such requests failed, a nationwide boycott of these Philip Morris products was called. Our community responded in a definite and responsible manner, as a recent survey (*Washington Blade*, 5/10/91) showed that more than half (51 percent) of the beer-drinking lesbians and gay men in this country were actively boycotting Miller Beer. A smaller number (7.5 percent) said that they no longer smoked Marlboro Cigarettes.

As you will soon learn, representatives of the organizers (including DGA and ACT-UP) and Philip Morris executives have been in negotiations to determine mutually beneficial and constructive projects that our community and Philip Morris could share.

As the announcement today indicates, Philip Morris and representatives of ACT-UP and the gay and lesbian community have agreed upon a plan to encourage community-based organizations to apply for grants from Philip Morris.

The guidelines for these grants are simple: (1) Requests must come from groups



considered nonprofit, tax-exempt or 501(c)3 organizations; and (2) projects to be funded must be based in, or directed to the gay and lesbian community. Successful grant applications may include organizations providing direct services and making innovative efforts that cannot find funding from more traditional sources. Educational efforts to combat AIDS and homophobia discrimination may also be funded. All agencies providing these programs to the gay and lesbian community are encouraged to apply.

A committee composed of community activists will identify worthwhile projects and bring them to Philip Morris' attention. As the DGA and Texas representative to this committee, I encourage you to be creative, concise and community-oriented. Successful applications will be awarded based upon concept and need. Professional grant-writing skills and neatness are not determining factors.

Grant applications should be directed to Stephanie French, Vice-President for Corporate Giving and Cultural Affairs, Philip Morris Companies, 120 Park Avenue, New York, NY 10017. Please send a copy of your cover letter to my attention, Gay and Lesbian Victory Fund, P.O. Box 34715, Washington, D.C. 20043. This will enable me to identify local and state requests as they are received at Philip Morris. Please do not send your actual application to me, as this will only delay consideration of your request.

Your involvement in a national effort (the boycott) to educate Philip Morris on concerns affecting our community is greatly appreciated. We knew it would take lesbian and gay consumers, acting individually, ordering other brands, to make the difference. You have proven Thomas Jefferson's statement that "One man (or woman), with courage, makes a difference." I encourage you to redirect the commitment that guided you throughout the boycott to now purchase Philip Morris products. Just as we showed them then that we cared, we should show them now our appreciation for the commitment they have just made upon behalf of our community.

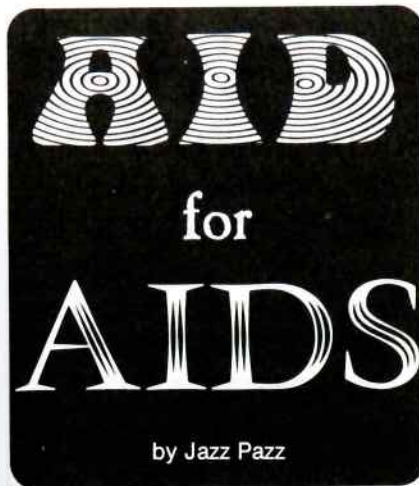

This year America's pharmaceutical companies will invest \$9.2 billion in research and development of effective therapies to deter AIDS. Only one new AIDS-related drug received FDA approval in 1990, Diflucan (Fluconazole).

Diflucan is a once-a-day, broad spectrum antifungal agent used to treat cryptococcal meningitis and severe, systemic candidal infection. Candidiasis affects about 90% of people in advanced stages of AIDS. Diflucan is seen to have several advantages over the previous antifungals because of its low toxicity and the longer time it remains in the body.

Another 62 medicines and vaccines are currently under development by 40 companies to counterattack AIDS-related disorders.

Last fall, New Zealand was the first country to approve Imuthiol (sodium ditiocarb or DTC). It is an oral or IV-administered medication intended for HIV-positive individuals at least 18 years old whose T4 cell count is less than 200, or for symptomatic persons who cannot tolerate AZT regardless of their T4 level. Its major effect seems to be a decrease in the number of opportunistic infections experienced by PWAs. Although the way it works is not fully understood, trials of up to 74 months in length have not turned up any significant toxicities.

The PWA Health Group in New York City (212/532-0280) has made Imuthiol/DTC available to buyers for \$30 for a month's supply.



HEALTH

An existing drug marketed for leg pain associated with heart disease, Trental, has been determined to slow multiplication of the AIDS virus in the laboratory. It has also been found to lower the body's level of TNF (tumor necrosis factor), which causes fever and wasting in cancer patients. There is evidence that Trental might increase the potency of AZT if they are taken together. Human trials will begin soon at Boston's Beth Israel Hospital.

Bristol Myers has recently applied for government permission to market its anti-AIDS drug, ddl, which would become the second approved therapy that slows the progress of AIDS. Under the brand name Videx, ddl is similar to AZT in that it inhibits an enzyme that HIV needs to grow. AIDS activists have been pushing for speedy approval of ddl. Over 23,000 patients have participated in worldwide clinical trials. The FDA has promised to move "as rapidly as possible" on the company's application.

The problem in creating a vaccine for HIV is the relatively quick mutation which a viral strain goes through.

It's old news that pentamidine can prevent 60-70% of recurring attacks of PCP (AIDS-related pneumonia), but a recent issue of the *New England Journal of Medicine* claims the drug could avert initial attacks as well. A team of Swiss and Italian doctors have determined that it costs about \$8,500 to treat a case of PCP as opposed to about \$4,000 to prevent one. The main side effect of pentamidine in this study was moderate to severe coughing when it was inhaled.

Peptide T, a synthetic protein that appears encouraging as a possible AIDS treatment, is the subject of the first major study designed to determine its effectiveness, the National Institute of Health said recently.

Studies done on Peptide T, developed in 1986, have so far been limited to a tiny number of patients and dealt mainly with toxicity and dosage levels. AIDS activists have been agitating the government to proceed with further studies on Peptide T, calling it "a promising drug."

Even more promising, however, are the optimistic predictions of the long-awaited AIDS vaccine. The FDA has approved clinical trials for humans to test a prototype AIDS vaccine manufactured by Immunous, Inc. of Rochester, Minnesota. The vaccine, rgp 160, successfully protected a chimpanzee from AIDS for nearly three years in a preclinical study. This is the longest known protection provided by any AIDS vaccine tested on animals.

Phase I trials will take place in five centers where 12 volunteers per center will be vaccinated. All volunteers must be healthy and at low risk for AIDS.

Dr. Dani Bolognesi of Duke University believes that a vaccine is still three to five years away, however. The doctor notes that research has been more effective in preventing AIDS transmitted by needles than by sex. Dr. Jonas Salk is hopeful that vaccines will be found to suppress the virus, minimize damage and prevent symptoms. He doubts that human vaccines will ever eradicate the virus once it has entered the body by any route.

The problem in creating a vaccine for HIV is the relatively quick mutation which a viral strain goes through, which renders it immune to antibodies elicited following vaccination. Dr. Adan Rios of Houston thinks he may have a product that will overcome this problem, HGP-30. A Stage I trial is almost finished in London and the first human trials on HIV-positive individuals are underway in California.

There are similar studies in other Texas cities. Ask your health care providers for advice on how to apply for inclusion. Among your resources, include nurses, therapists and agencies that serve PWAs.

Always remember that there is strength and comfort and perhaps real healing in the power of asserting personal responsibility for one's health. Here's to yours.



Another in A Continuing Series of Reports
From Austin on Legislative Issues
Affecting Gays and Lesbians in Texas

This has been a busy week for homophobes at the state Capitol. Although it is a little too early to tell, it appears our community may have emerged from this round of gay bashing relatively unscathed.

One of the worst bills this session—HB 702, introduced by Democrat Ron Wilson of Houston—passed the House with only five opposing votes on the third hearing. Those casting opposing votes were Reps. Glen Maxey, Debra Danburg, Sherri Greenburg, Elliot Naishtat and David Hirschi. Rep. David Cain was not on the floor at the time of the vote. Rep. Wilhelmina Delco could not vote because she was acting as Speaker.

Had it become law, HB 702 would have required all dentists and doctors who practice while knowingly infected with HIV to be reviewed by their licensing boards. All HIV-positive patients who failed to inform their doctors and dentists of their HIV status would have been subject to \$10,000 of civil liability. Also, doctors and dentists could have refused to treat HIV-positive patients.

It appears our community may have emerged from this round of gay bashing relatively unscathed.

The real effect of HB 702 would have been upon patients, particularly those in rural communities. In larger cities there may be doctors who will treat PWAs, but in rural communities, where there is already a shortage of doctors, patients may have a difficult time getting medical care. Because this bill would have allowed doctors and dentists to refuse to treat persons with AIDS, it presumably would have violated the Americans With Disabilities Act.

The good news about HB 702 is that it was effectively killed in the Senate last week when it was tagged by Senator Eddie Bernice Johnson (Dem.-Dallas) and Senator Rodney Ellis (Dem.-Houston), two members of the Black Caucus.

Another bill that has received a lot of attention this week is a hostile amendment to SB 1316. SB 1316 is a civil rights bill that protects an individual's contractual rights

by prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, sex, religion, disability, national origin, color or age. Sexual orientation is not included in this bill. However, homophobic Senator Kenneth Armbrister (Dem.-Victoria) added an amendment stating, "Nothing herein shall be construed to permit marriage licenses to be issued for a marriage between persons of the same sex."

Legally this amendment accomplishes nothing. Persons of the same sex are already prohibited from obtaining marriage licenses under a specific provision of the Texas Family Code. Specific statutes like the marriage license statute of the Family Code usually preempt general statutes. Currently I am lobbying in the House to drop this homophobic amendment from the House version of this bill. Again, things are changing so rapidly with this bill that writing to specific senators or representatives would not be useful.

Finally, there has been another shift where the hate-crimes bills are concerned. Several weeks ago it appeared that both House and Senate were going to adopt

very general hate-crimes bills that would punish hate crimes against “traditionally disfavored groups.” Now it seems that the Senate is considering a hate-crimes bill that would protect specific groups, including gay and lesbian people.

It is important to realize that without an appeal, our community has only a district court decision...with little or no precedential value outside of the district in which the court sits.

Both approaches have advantages and disadvantages. The Senate’s bill is useful because it specifically mentions gay and lesbian people as a group and gives us protection. However, given the homophobic tenor of the Senate this session, sexual orientation could be deleted from this bill at any time. The general protections of the House bill, while not as strong as the specific guarantees of the Senate bill, have a better chance of passing without hostile exclusions or amendments.

After the session is over, Attorney General Morales may be able to render an opinion defining “traditionally disfavored groups” and include gay and lesbian peo-

ple. Call or write your senator and representative and state that you support HB 1568 and SB 1317, the hate-crimes bills. If you do not know the names of your senator and representative call 1-800-253-9693 or in Austin call (512)463-1251. Senators may be reached at P.O. Box 12068, Austin, TX 78711. Representatives may be reached at P.O. Box 2910, Austin, TX 78768-2910.

It is important to emphasize, once again, that the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby, along with most if not all other gay and lesbian rights organizations in the state, supports an appeal of the case which overturned the state’s anti-homosexual conduct statute, section 21.06 of the Texas Penal Code. Support for an appeal has confused many people because of our victory in the Austin District Court. However, it is important to realize that without an appeal, our community has only a district court decision. District court decisions have little or no precedential value outside of the district in which the court sits. Therefore, in Austin, where the case was decided, 21.06 has been overruled. But in the rest of the state it remains in force.

On the Saturday before the March on Austin, Morales met with about 15 lesbian and gay community leaders from around the state and promised that in his appeal, he would stick to legal issues and avoid the morality issues that have plagued other appeals of 21.06 and similar statutes. He also pledged his support of our community.

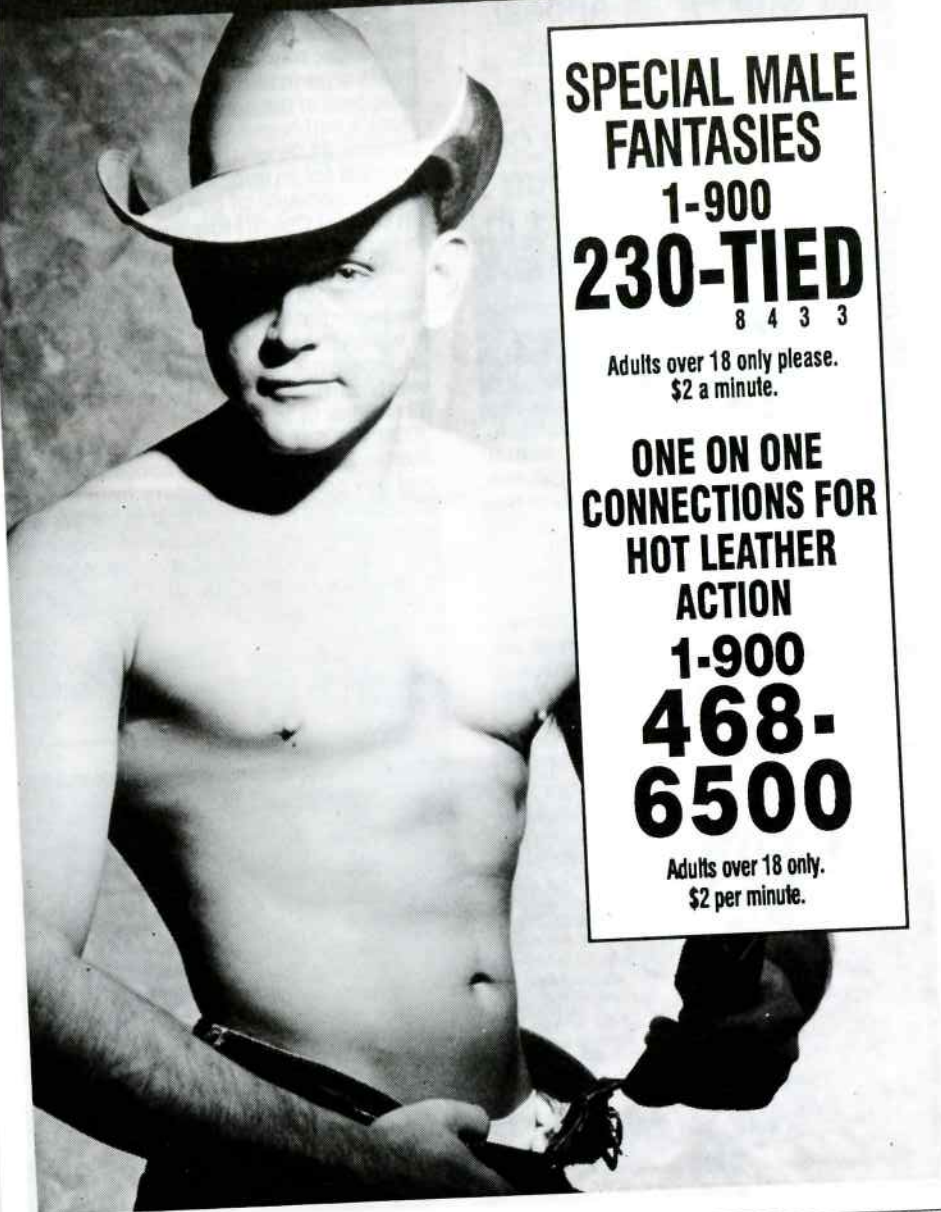

And one of his other friends, Jesus Las Vegas, an impersonator de la femme par excellence, had the audacity to sleep with Clay, Zero's new par amour. So you really can't say that he has a wide circle of friends, or that he is particularly loved by any of them. Can you?
