INDIVIDUALS, GROUPS HONORED AT 1991 HOUSTON PRIDE AWARDS CELEBRATION

Attendance at This Year's Banquet Nearly Double That of 1990 Event.

HOUSTON — The Montrose Activity Center and the Metropolitan Community Church of the Resurrection sponsored the 1991 Pride Awards last Saturday, June 15 at the Stouffer Presidente-Greenway Plaza Hotel in Houston.

Three organizations or individuals were nominated in each of seven categories by the Pride Awards special nominating committee. The recipients were chosen by secret ballot and voted on by those in attendance at the dinner. Ballots were also available in the lobby of the hotel for people not purchasing tickets.

The Honorable Glen Maxey was the guest host for the event. Maxey, former Executive Director of Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby [LGRL], was recently elected to the Texas House of Representatives. He is the first openly gay elected Texas state official.

Featured speaker Sheila James Kuehl received the committee's Special Recognition Award.



Guest speaker for the evening was Sheila James Kuehl, founder of the Southern California Women's Law Center. The former actress, known to her fans as Dobie Gillis' girlfriend Zelda from the popular 1960s TV show, left her acting career to attend Harvard Law School and "came out" as a lesbian activist working to change laws to further feminist causes.

Felix Garcia, former co-chair of the March on Austin and former co-chair of Houston Gay/Lesbian Pride Week 1991, was singled out for Promoting Pride by an Individual (Male). Linda Morales, one of the codefendants in the court case to overturn Section 21.06 of the Texas Penal Code, was recognized for Promoting Pride by an Individual (Female). Host Maxey was

honored for Promoting Pride Beyond the Community and featured speaker Kuehl received a special recognition award from the Pride Committee.

Bering Community Service Foundation won the award for Promoting Pride Within the Community. The AIDS Equity League was recognized for Promoting Pride by a Community Organization, while last year's Pride Week Parade 1990 received the award for Promoting Pride and Gaiety Through a Community Social Event.

Specials Include 'Andre's Mother,' Nelson Profile & Panel Discussion.

DALLAS — In observance of Gay and Lesbian Pride Week, KERA-TV Channel 13 has scheduled four specials that examine

various aspects of gay and lesbian life in America today.

Wednesday, June 26 at 8 p.m., Channel 13 will air the "American Playhouse" presentation of *Andre's Mother*. This one-hour drama tells the story of a mother's grief when her son dies of AIDS.

At 9 the same evening, Out in America features a diverse panel of notables exploring the struggle for gay rights and how it compares with other civil rights movements.

Hosted by gay television personality Andrew Humm, *Out in America* will offer a cross section of viewpoints from such guests as Congressman Craig Washington, D-Texas, San Francisco Supervisor Roberta Achtenberg, New York State Supreme Court Justice Richard C. Failla and author and activist Larry Kramer, the founder of ACT UP.

Before Stonewall, airing on Channel 13 Thursday, June 27, at 11 p.m., examines what life was like for American gays and lesbians before the birth of the gay rights movement. On Friday, June 28, The Final Fight: Bill Nelson, a profile of the pioneering Dallas gay activist who died last year, airs at 6 p.m.

COTILLION, MARATHON RAISE \$13,700 FOR ASA

Plans for Next Year's Cotillion Already Being Made; Response to Chamber Music Event Greater Than Expected.

AUSTIN — AIDS Services of Austin [ASA] brought in \$13,700 from the seventh annual Spring Cotillion and the third annual Austin Chamber Music Marathon, both held in May.

The Spring Cotillion was held on May 25 at the Johnson House in west Austin. Michael Penning was the chair for the event, one of the major fund-raisers benefiting ASA.

What originally started out as a group of people getting together for cocktails and a friendly game of croquet has evolved into one of the most outrageous parties of the year, with participants coming from all over the state and country. Plans are already being made for next year's soiree. Over \$7,000 was raised at the Cotillion, with even more money still coming in.

The Austin Chamber Music Marathon, which also benefits ASA, is considered the

classical, jazz and folk music extravaganza of the season. This year's event, held on June 1, brought in \$6,700. The marathon has given musicians in the Austin community a vehicle for directly expressing their concerns regarding the AIDS crisis, while also providing a day of fabulous entertainment and raising badly needed funds for AIDS care in Austin.

Over 200 musicians performed at the First Unitarian Church from noon until midnight. Performers included Jill Trinka, Tapestry, Susan Groves, the Austin Symphony Bassoon Trio and the Capital City Men's Chorus.

This year's marathon was directed by Danielle Martin, and assistant director was William Cory. Members of the organizing committee were Alison Welch, Brian Marks, Martha Hilley, Cecelia Behague, Wonda Reynolds, Marlee Dietz and Scott Donald.

Dara Gray, Development Director for ASA, told TWT NEWS, "The marathon was so much greater than last year's, with more response from the community, both straight and gay, than we thought we were going to receive. The gathering is the best assembly of music professionals that Austin has to offer."

PAST PRESIDENTS ADDRESS JUNE MEETING OF DGA

West, Young & Waybourn Look Back on Terms in Office, Survey Evolution of Alliance.


DALLAS — At the June meeting of the Dallas Gay Alliance [DGA], past presidents of the organization spoke to the leaders of the future.

The DGA had invited the former presidents to address the meeting in commemoration of the group's fifteenth anniversary. The past officers recalled the most pressing issues they had dealt with during their terms, and described the influence they felt they had had on the organization.

Chance West, who served from 1976-1978 as the first president of the Dallas Gay Political Caucus, which later

became the Dallas Gay Alliance, said his main concern while in office had been apathy in the community. "Everybody was having too good a time to get serious," West said. "I told people they had the two most powerful tools to make significant changes, their voice and their vote."

Dr. Louise Young, who served as president in 1978-79, said that harrassment and arrests in the gay bars brought about a change in the apathetic attitude. She also discussed the political impact the gay community developed when it supported Jim Mattox in his run for office from the 5th Congressional District.

"In what was traditionally a Republican district, we helped Mattox win by 400 votes. Even the Dallas Morning News gave the gay community credit for his victory," Young said. "In those days we merely 'recommended' a candidate, because we were afraid that our 'endorsement' would scare off the voters."

William Waybourn, who served from 1987-90, said that the AIDS crisis forced the DGA to take a look at services and issues. "We began to change from a politically-focused group to one aimed at community service. The gay and lesbian community needed a place of their own."

Bruce Monroe, current president of the DGA, brought members up to date concerning the alliance's various programs. He said that new drug treatments have begun at the Nelson-Tebedo Clinic, and that 133 people are currently receiving counseling and treatment at the center. Fifty-two PWAs are also taking part in the visitation program. The AIDS hotline fielded 1,547 calls in June, while the Food Pantry was visited 1,002 times during the month. The Speaker's Forum reached 1,614 people with AIDS information.

Rose Pedia, an advisor for the Women's Health Project, said volunteers are needed for the "Keeping It Up" safe sex campaign in lesbian and straight bars.

Gary Bellomy explained that during Gay Pride Week DGA members are going to try to refocus attention on the Stonewall Riot as the beginning of the gay pride movement. DGA members will be manning information tables at Razzle Dazzle Dallas, with the theme being "Fifteen years of Service, Dedication, and Pride."

Joe Desmond reported that membership in the Alliance has increased by 200 in the last three months, bringing the total to 814 paid members. He reminded his

listeners that, in order to receive the DGA's new MasterCard, applicants must first be members of the organization.

Mary Franklin, who works with the DGA Food Pantry, asked for more canned food donations, reminding members that supplies traditionally run low during the summer months.

June 28 has been set as the date of the fundraiser at the Wave for the Texas Human Rights Foundation. The "underwear party" will help raise funds to continue the appeal of 21.06.

By unanimous acclamation, Rodd Gray, Joey Jenner, John Wimberly, and Chris Ivits were chosen to serve on the DGA board for the next twelve months.

ANNISE PARKER PLANNING RUN FOR HOUSTON CITY COUNCIL SEAT

Sees Race as Turning Point for Houston Gay & Lesbian Voters; Formal Announcement Soon.

HOUSTON — Houston activist and community leader Annise Parker told TWT NEWS last week that she will be running for Houston City Council in District C, currently represented by Vince Ryan. A formal announcement of her candidacy will be made in the near future.

In explaining why she had decided to run, Parker said it was no longer enough for gay and lesbian voters to help elect candidates sympathetic to their cause. She believes the community has reached a turning point, and it is now time for gays and lesbians to start electing their own to public office.




"I feel that we have been disenfranchised, that we haven't been represented," she told TWT NEWS. "We have been told, in so many words, that nothing will be given to us, that we will have to organize and go out and get it for ourselves."

Parker cited the apparent unwillingness on the part of City Council members, even among those who have enjoyed strong gay support in the past, to push for the inclusion of a Montrose-based council district in redistricting plans.

When asked what she considered her strengths as a candidate, Parker said she hoped she would be able to appeal to voters outside of the gay and lesbian community. But she stressed that her base of support would be among gays and lesbians.

She acknowledged that running against an incumbent like Ryan would be an uphill battle, regardless of the configuration of the new district, but that any outcome was possible. She stressed that her decision to run from District C should be seen not as a move against Ryan, but as an attempt to achieve direct representation for the gay and lesbian community in city government.

Parker, a native Houstonian, is co-owner of Inklings Bookstore. She served as one of the co-chairs for the March on Austin earlier this year, and was a Grand Marshal of the 1990 Houston Gay/Lesbian Pride Parade. She was president of the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus from 1986-1988 and has served on the Board of Directors of Montrose Activity Center.

WATERLOO OFFERS 'COMING OUT' GROUP FOR WOMEN

Topics to Include Self-Acceptance, Affirmation & Relationships.

AUSTIN — Waterloo Counseling Center has announced that it is offering a new eight-week coming out group designed specifically to meet the counseling needs of lesbian women who are just beginning to recognize and accept their sexuality. The first meeting was held on June 17.

The meetings are being co-facilitated by two licensed counselors, and will meet for eight weekly sessions. Potential topics to be addressed include self-acceptance and affirmation, deciding whom to tell, how to become more in touch with the lesbian community, and dating and relationship issues.

Applicants will be accepted after placing a screening phone call to the Center. Women interested in taking part are urged to contact Angela at (512) 322-9653. She

stressed that strict confidentiality is maintained.

Waterloo Counseling Center, Inc., is a nonprofit organization providing mental health counseling to the Austin lesbian, gay and bisexual community. The Center provides individual, group and couples counseling, and offers its services on a sliding scale fee basis.

'FEEL THE MUSIC' HOUSTON PRIDE PARADE KICKS OFF THIS SUNDAY

This Year Marks 12th Anniversary of First Houston Pride March; KPFT to Broadcast Four-Hour Special with Live Coverage.

HOUSTON — The celebration of Gay Pride Week in the Bayou City climaxes this Sunday, June 23 with the "Feel the Music" parade.


Gay/lesbian pride celebrations have been held throughout Texas and the nation annually since the seventies, in commemoration of the June 27, 1969 Stonewall riots in New York City. That uprising is widely considered the beginning of the modern gay/lesbian rights movement. This year is the twelfth anniversary of Houston's first Pride Parade, which was held on Sunday, July 1, 1979.

There will be a pre-parade reception for the Grand Marshals at EJ's, Parade Central for this year's event. The parade starts off at the intersection of Westheimer and Dunlavy at 5:30 p.m., proceeds east down Westheimer and turns south onto Whitney, terminating at the intersection of Whitney and Lovett. The reviewing stand for this year's parade will be located in the parking lot next to Mary's, and will feature signing for the hearing-impaired.

A short walk will take parade goers to the site of the StarNite Pride Festival '91, which runs both Saturday and Sunday from 3-10 p.m. in the Kwik Kopy parking lot, Montrose at Lovett. On Saturday, the highlight will be the Lone Star Symphonic Band's Take Pride Concert featuring Teresa Mauney and Nancy Ford. Houston City Council member Sheila Jackson Lee will narrate the "Lincoln Portrait" by Aaron Copland to the accompaniment of the

Grand Marshals of this year's Pride Parade are Linda Morales, one of the codefendants in the case to overturn Section 21.06 of the Texas Penal Code; activist Jack Jackson, who has devoted countless hours to community organizations; and Gene Harrington, who organized the AIDS Equity League and continues to work on improving the legal condition of people with AIDS.

Honorary Grand Marshals are Harris County Treasurer Katy Caldwell, who is involved with the AIDS Trouble Fund Citizen Advisory Committee, and Lady Victoria Lust, longtime entertainer and current Empress of the Imperial Court of the Single Star, who has given many performances benefiting the fight against AIDS.

In connection with Sunday's festivities, KPFT 90.1 FM, the Pacifica Radio affiliate in Houston, will have a special live four-hour broadcast from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m.

The special will highlight key events in gay and lesbian history through historic tape from the Pacifica Radio archives and music selections. The broadcast will also feature live coverage of the parade and interviews with local gay men and lesbians.

AIDS QUILT COMES TO DALLAS IN JULY

Display Being Held at Loews Anatole in Conjunction with Gay & Lesbian Deaf Conference.

DALLAS — The Loews Anatole Hotel has donated the 73,000-square-foot Trinity Ballroom to display the Quilt when it comes to Dallas July 2-6.

The display will consist of a special shipment of panels from San Francisco in conjunction with the Rainbow Alliance of the Deaf/International Deaf Lesbian and Gay Conference, also being held that week at the hotel.

Organizers originally planned a display of 15 panels representing hearing-impaired

people who had died of AIDS. When a larger facility became available, the decision was made to expand the display.

"This project has really blossomed overnight," Craig Hess told Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS. "What normally takes up to a year to plan, we are doing in six weeks." Hess is the co-chair of the steering committee for the Quilt display.

"We are very short on manpower," Hess continued, "and we really need volunteers to help in all areas. We need some people who would like to help make new panels for the quilt, to cut out material or sew." Hess said that people have phoned in requests for panels to be made, but he stressed that organizers were trying to encourage direct participation.


Weldon Stewart, a volunteer with the Names Project since 1987, described the experience as being cathartic. "It is a wonderful way to work out your grief, and to deal with the entire process of coming to grips with your loss." His first panel was made for his lover to "immortalize my own love," but he has made at least eight others since then for close friends.

"We really need a lot of help and a lot of supplies," said Dennis Darcy, the business manager of Names Project/Dallas. "We are asking people to loan us sewing machines for the duration of the project, and also need lots of material, industrial strength thread and other sewing supplies." Darcy explained that the base fabric for the panels should measure $31/2 \times 61/2$, to make the task easier to complete.

"We need crews of people to help in preparation for the Quilt," Hess said. Work to be done will include sweeping and mopping the floors of the ballroom on Sunday and Monday before the opening ceremony. "To be part of the unfolding ceremony is a real honor," Darcy said, "so we expect these people to work with us prior to the ceremony."

The opening ceremony takes place at 6:30 p.m. on Sunday, July 2. The display will be open to the public through Saturday, July 6, with closing ceremonies at 4 p.m.

We now print a followup letter from Ms. Paire in which she reports that the situation has been resolved to everyone's satisfaction.

To whom it may concern/Zales Corp.:

In December, 1990, I sent in to TWT COMMENT a letter of complaint ["Incident at Sweeney's," Vol. 16, No. 44] regarding a Sweeney's store located in Houston at Town & Country Village. I reported an incident between the manager of the store, Mr. Stanley Stone, and myself. At the time, Mr. Stone had expressed to me that he did not appreciate me and my girlfriend shopping in his store.

Recently, I received a telephone call from my salesperson at that store notifying me that the wedding bands my girlfriend and I had selected were available on sale. Because of the savings and because I enjoyed dealing with this salesperson, Shawna Harris, we decided to return to the store to look at the rings.

I fully expected to receive the same treatment from Mr. Stone that I had in the past, but was willing to shop there one last time. I must admit I was ready to stand my ground if necessary.

When we entered the store, Mr. Stone approached us immediately. I must admit I was quite surprised when he apologized for his previous behavior and explained to us that he was very sorry for the way he treated us. I was a bit suspicious of his apology in the beginning, but he went on to explain that he never meant to hurt us and hoped that we would forgive him. He then made sure that we received attention right away and about every ten minutes thereafter, he came over and made sure that everything was being handled properly.

As I believe that any serious problem should be reported by consumers, I also believe that good service should be commended. I feel that Mr. Stone not only apologized, but went out of his way to make sure that we left satisfied. I am a forgiving person and believe that we all make mistakes occasionally.

I must recommend that anyone in the gay community who is in the market for wedding bands or jewelry shop at Sweeney's Town & Country and ask for Shawna Harris. She is an excellent salesperson and has gone above and beyond the call of duty to make sure that my girlfriend and I got the merchandise that we desired.







STRAIGHT TALK ABOUT AIDS

"The health of the people is really the foundation upon which their happiness and all their powers as a state depend."

-Benjamin Disraeli

In the period since 1981, when the first identified case of AIDS was reported in the United States, 167,803 cases have been verified. Eighty thousand women of child-bearing age may have HIV, says Dr. Marta Gwinn of the National Centers for Disease Control. At least 106,361 individuals have died of AIDS in this country.

Gay men remain the disproportionate victims of the carnage, and coping has become an intensive, emotional challenge. As safer sex workshops proliferate, homosexual males are among the best educated population at risk.

Indeed, gay groups have done more to provide counseling, education, home health care and hot lines to gay and nongay clients than have the country's public health agencies.

Many experts believe that PWAs who have recently become symptomatic were infected years ago, even before the virus was identified, and that if younger men take heed and protect themselves, the stigma of AIDS now borne by gays will be forwarded to another minority.

Still, some internalize their own homophobia and, instead of practicing safer sex with each other, they indulge in what they mistakenly believe is "straight safe" sex with nongay persons who are assumed to be HIV negative. Dr. Gwinn says this form of denial is extremely risky, however, as HIV is a firmly established epidemic in our society. She says that, although the highest degree of HIV positivity is found in urban areas, she and other researchers have been surprised by the rate of positivity in rural areas.

As the disease spreads among the larger population, there is an increase in the number of heterosexuals who are sero-positive (and less likely to be aware of it) and asymptomatic, who will develop AIDS, proving again that AIDS is a risk of behavior, not of group membership.



Since 1983, when the first evidence of heterosexual AIDS was reported, there has been a steady increase in the number of those affected who are straight. Heterosexual transmission is now the leading cause of AIDS worldwide.

Dr. Gwin believes that some of the increase in AIDS is attributable to intravenous drug abuse. Dr. Richard Chaisson, director of AIDS Services at Johns Hopkins University Hospital in Baltimore, says, "We are seeing PWAs infected by IV drug abuse among all levels of society. But it is concentrated in big cities." He adds that the figures pose a "huge, huge challenge."

Another very difficult-to-reach population at risk is closeted, heterosexually married men. Since such men do not consider themselves gay, they do not attend the workshops advertised to gay men. They are among those most likely to engage in anonymous homosexual activity and to share the risk of AIDS. According to the Kinsey Report of 1948, "Data makes it appear probable that the true incidence of homosexuals in married groups is much higher than we are able to record."

Typically, minorities are being punished by AIDS more than others. In Houston, the AIDS case rate among blacks is 36.2 cases per 100,000 in 1989 (latest figures available from the Houston Health Department), whereas among whites it is 28.6 per 100,000. Despite the differences, 71% of Houston-area PWAs are white and 17% are black. Although only 17% of women in the United States are black or Hispanic, they account for 73% of the 15,493 AIDS cases involving women through 1990, Centers for Disease Control figures show.

None of these groups, IV drug abusers, straights or closeted homosexuals are likely to be as well informed about, respectful of or comfortable with safer sex as the out, proud gay man who is skilled at and willing to practice safer sex.



AND THE BANDS PLAY ON

In two Texas cities, friends play gaily together every Monday night. As charter members of Lesbian and Gay Bands of America, the Oak Lawn Band of Dallas and the Lone Star Band of Houston are community resources that share their camaraderie and devotion to music with all comers. Each organization boasts professionals and also shelters and even encourages abject neophytes, with the majority of performers being those who have left their instruments closeted since high school.

The Montrose Marching Band (now the Lone Star Symphonic Band) was created by the Montrose Activity Center in Houston in 1978 with the purpose of leading the March on Washington. Loosely organized, it met its modest goals of having fun and entertaining the community by practicing in the service building of Cherryhurst Park. Its fitful, fragile life almost expired between periods of allegretto and bravura that diminished in strength to calando and perdendosi.

In 1980, an ad was placed in TWT by some hopeful Dalfas musicians who wanted to gather a group to play and march in their Pride Parade. Their success was such that they decided to meet again and again to perform together as the Oak Lawn Band. Current membership numbers about 40, according to secretary James Gebhardt, and new and former members join rehearsal almost every week.

Russell Williams, secretary of the Lone Star Symphonic Band, says that his group, though it doesn't have as many active members, energetically competes to match the rowdiness and revelry of the Oak Lawn Band. Often the artists of the two groups join together to dedicate themselves to their common aspirations. This spring (as in 1989), under the banner of the Texas Freedom Band, the Oak Lawn Band and the Lone Star Symphonic Band led off the March on Austin, and last summer they joined representatives of 25 other American lesbian and gay bands to perform in the opening and closing ceremonies of Gay Games III and Cultural Festival in Vancouver, and they also marched in British Columbia's first Pride Parade.

An Interview with Todd Haynes, Director of Poison

June 14 is a very important day throughout the nation. It is the day which marks the official beginning of 1991's Gay Pride Week activities—a week set aside to celebrate the accomplishments of gay men and women across the United States, but also a week envisioned as one in which the struggle that homosexuals face is brought to the attention of the national media, as well as Mr. and Mrs. John Doe in Anytown, U.S.A.

June 14 assumes even more importance this year, however, because it also marks the opening of a controversial new film by renegade filmmaker Todd Haynes in Houston and Dallas as part of each city's Gay Pride Week festivities. The film, *Poison*, lends added meaning to Gay Pride because it poignantly illustrates the plight of all outcasts and the society which destroys them.

I had the pleasure of speaking wih Todd while he was in San Francisco for *Poison*'s premiere in that city. He is a warm, dedicated and caring man of supreme intelligence, with a sincere commitment to the betterment of the society in which we live. It is because of this commitment that *Poison* was made.

Poison is based on the autobiographical works of French thief and author Jean Genet, a man who, as Todd Haynes puts it, "fully rejected society. He made it his life's project to stand up against society's cruelties." Todd first began reading Genet's works in college, but finds that "what he has to say has even more importance in today's conservative climate. Today's cruel state of affairs—the AIDS crisis in particular—needs to be challenged by

somebody 'tough.'" Genet, through the contemporary voice that Todd Haynes provides, is that somebody.

I wondered if, possibly, there was a part of Todd Haynes' nature which mandated a need to be controversial—to confront and challenge the norm. Todd reminded me that many reviewers had compared him to "June Cleaver's son" and other boynext-door types, so that it was doubtful that any need to be controversial was a part of his nature. But he did admit to an "inquisitive and investigatory nature with critique of society as part of the agenda."

Any controversy, he feels, is generated by the press and by people such as the Rev. Donald Wildmon of the American Family Association—a man who has not even seen *Poison*, yet has condemned it based on the rantings of a friend who saw a screening of the film in San Francisco. But Haynes isn't complaining. "The controversy," he said, "pulls them in. The film touches them, wins them over."

With the subject of Rev. Wildmon finally broached, I asked Todd how he felt about the campaign being mounted by Wildmon and his American Family Association to unseat chairman John Frohnmayer and dissolve the National Endowment for the Arts.

The Association is "something we need to fear," declared Haynes. "I'm seriously afraid of the outcome with the NEA, not so much for me, but for other independent filmmakers who need funding more than I do." I wondered if he had ever met Rev. Wildmon or his band of merry men. "No," Todd responded. "We have nothing in common. What would we ever talk about?!"



raised another interesting point. The budget for Poison was only \$250,000-a mere pittance—with only 10% being provided by the NEA. How on earth was such a high-quality film made on a shoestring budget? "Pre-planning and actual production work made such an effort workable on a low budget," explained Haynes, That, in concert with a "great creative team" and the "use of test audiences" to monitor the film's progress, were the keys to Poison's success. Todd currently has no plans to enter the

mainstream market with his films. His philosophy in filmmaking is to "do it for the work itself, then worry about the consequences. I basically just follow my instinct. I've garnered more attention just by going about the business of filmmaking than I ever could have hoped for if I had set out to achieve it (the attention).'

As for the future? "The life of a filmmaker is so self-centered that it occupies your body and soul. It takes you away from groups (like ACT-UP and Grand Fury)groups that I'd like to get involved with again." Until then, Todd is off to the South Pacific for the premiere of Poison in Sydney and Melbourne, Then, back to New York to work on his next project before heading to Austin and then Europe for more Poison promotion, "It's really great because Poison has given me the opportunity to do things I never would have had the chance to do."

I can think of no one more deserving of those chances than Todd Havnes because, through his work, he gives each of us the chance to one day express ourselves in the same courageous way that he has—in spite of and, hopefully without. fear of repercussions and recrimination. This, ultimately, is the true message of his work.

Week of June 21-27, 1991

SKY SHOW TRIO — Hopefully last Saturday night, June 15, there was no cloud cover where you live in Texas so you could have seen the once-in-a-lifetime sky show view of Venus, Jupiter and Mars bunched up close together next to a silvery New Moon. Awesome! In case you missed it, there's still more to see as the sky show continues.

Now, a week later, the trio are pulling apart, but ever so slowly. By month's end, Jupiter will have gone from being on top to being on bottom while Mars and Venus remain very close together. Look above the western horizon right after sunset.

SUMMER BEGINS — Spring ends and summer officially begins this Friday, June 21 at 4:19 p.m.—the exact moment of the summer solstice—the point at which the Sun is farthest north of the celestial equator. This makes June 21 the longest day (i.e., the one with the most sunlight) of the year.

ECLIPSED FULL MOON — This month's Full Moon occurs next Wednesday, June 26 in Capricorn. The Full Moon will oppose Cancer and square Aries and Libra. These are the four signs of the zodiac which will be most altered by the coming Full Moon. The exact time of full illumination is 9:58 p.m. Texas Daylight Time.

Interestingly, there is a rather strange penumbral eclipse of the Full Moon. The lunar eclipse is only partial in western North America. Texans won't see the entire path of shadow as the lunar eclipse will already have begun as the Moon rises over Texas. It's minor. Only 34 percent of the Full Moon will dim as the shadow misses dead center. Mid-point in the eclipse is 9:15 p.m.

Much more spectacular will be a total eclipse of the Sun coming on Thursday, July 11. With up to seven minutes of totality, it'll be the longest solar eclipse of the century—in fact until the year 2050.

The partial eclipse of next Wednesday's Full Moon is the topic of this week's STARSCOPE message.
