AUSTIN COALITION FIGHTS BACK AGAINST ANTI-GAY VIOLENCE

Recent Incidents Serve as Catalyst In Formation of Group Seeking Input of Club Owners, Patrons.

AUSTIN — Due to the recent increase in anti-gay violence in the Austin area, a special coalition has been established to better inform the public on what to do they are attacked or if they witness an attack. The Austin Lesbian/Gay Antiviolence Coalition has been formed with Stewart Gallas serving as chair.

Gallas and other coalition members have been working with the City Manager's office, Austin City Council and the police department to help find a solution to the growing problem of violence against gays and lesbians.

Two recent such attacks have been reported to TWT NEWS. The first happened in early March when two men were attacked on the corner of 4th and Colorado while heading north. The attackers asked the men "where they were going" and then called them "fags and queers."

Ignoring the name-calling, the men kept walking to their destination and were jumped from behind. One was hit with a beer bottle and pushed down a flight of stairs on the corner, the other was set upon by several other attackers.

Reports indicate that as many as eight men took part in the attack on the two victims. Even though the police were across the street, one of the victims suffered a broken nose and both sustained numerous cuts and bruises. A report was filed with the Austin Police Department, but there was very little follow-up in the case because of a lack of hard information.

The second attack took place on the morning of May 9 at 2:15 a.m. Two gay men, both large and masculine in appearance, were walking to their car after leaving a Fourth Street club. Upon reaching

the corner of 3rd and Lavaca, the two men were attacked by as many as thirty men in their mid to late 20s. The attackers were all chanting, "Nigger Blue," "The bigger the better" and "You can't kiss on our block." One of the two victims was sent to the emergency room at St. David's Hospital, and a report was filed with the police department alleging it was a gay attack.

"The Austin Tavern Guild and bar owners have not been receptive to addressing this issue with their patrons," Gallas told TWT NEWS. "One bar owner in Austin is working with the coalition, but we'd like to see more interest from gay men, bar patrons, whether male or female, and also from other bar owners."

"There has been a lot of progress with politics, contagious diseases, work discrimination and with violence against lesbians and gays, but more needs to be done. There is work to do and people need to decide if they give a damn or not. If they do care, then they should do something. The coalition is one place people have the opportunity to do something," Gallas told TWT NEWS.

Gallas also added, "It's a shame that we have to let something happen to someone we care about before we take action against it."

UNITED WAY ACCEPTS MONTROSE COUNSELING AS AFFILIATED AGENCY

\$51,000 Allocation to Support LIFE Therapy Program

HOUSTON — The Montrose Counseling Center has announced that it has been accepted as a United Way affiliated agency for 1991-92. The \$51,000 allocation will be used to support the LIFE Program, which has previously been maintained solely through client fees and private donations.

The LIFE program employs empowerment and feminist therapy to help clients deal with such issues as stress, grief, depression, coming out and relationships. The allocation to this program is considered a major step forward for the community and the center, because in making the award to the Counseling Center, the



Jnited Way will be supporting an organization which openly and specifically focuses on providing services to gay men and esbians.

Commenting on United Way's decision, Denter Executive Director Ann Robison cold TWT NEWS, "We were at first concerned that United Way would want us to change our focus, which is not an option we would have considered," Robison continued. "We were pleased that United Way was open to our mission statement, our purpose and our clients.

"This allocation will ensure that we can continue the tradition we started in 1978 of providing quality and affordable mental health services to the gay and lesbian community. The community should be pleased to see that all United Way literature about the Montrose Counseling Center lists us as an agency that serves the gay and lesbian community" Robison concluded.

The Montrose Counseling Center was founded in 1978 as an all-volunteer organization. In 1982, it developed one of the first HIV/AIDS programs in the Houston area. The Center also has a chemical dependency program.

OAK LAWN SHOOTING LEAVES ONE DEAD, ANOTHER INJURED

Victims Hit Several Times in Apparent Robbery Attempt; No Suspects Yet in June 15 Incident.

DALLAS — A shooting in the Oak Lawn area on Saturday morning, June 15, left one person dead and one injured. The incident occurred in the parking lot of an

apartment complex in the 3300 block of Reagan.

According to police reports, Michael Hagedoron and Renee Diaz were both trying to park in the lot, in separate cars. They were approached by two men who apparently were trying to rob them before gunshots were fired.

Both Hagedoron and Diaz were hit several times. Hagedoron died several hours later at Parkland Memorial Hospital. Diaz, originally listed in critical condition at Parkland, has now been released.

Detective Lewis of the Dallas Police Department said that no suspects had yet been taken into custody, but that the department was following up on several leads. Anyone with information about the shooting was asked to call DPD at (214) 670-5146.

"The key to this issue is that there are lighted parking lots with guards less than 100 yards away from where this happened," Lewis told Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS. "This lot is for patrons of the establishment that these two men were apparently going to. Use well-lighted lots only, not dark areas," Lewis emphasized.


NEW WOMEN'S GROUP IN BEAUMONT

Weekly Meetings of Lambda Women's Support & Social Club to Address Various Issues, Plan Social Activities.

BEAUMONT — Lesbians in the Beaumont area now have a new group they can turn to for both fun and much-needed support.

Lambda Women's Support & Social Group held its first meeting on June 7. The gathering drew 24 participants. Spokesperson C.A. told TWT NEWS, "Right now we are just trying to get people interested in the group. Word of mouth travels faster than any newsletter." Meetings are tentatively scheduled every Friday from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m.

The group is not affiliated with Lambda A.A. or any one 12-step program, but welcomes members of those groups. Among topics to be discussed at future meetings are women's health issues, surviving a breakup, co-dependency, lesbianism and motherhood, coming-out stories, ex-lovers



and whether they can be friends, spiritualism, healthy relationships, and drug abuse and alcoholism.

On the lighter side, social activities may include potlucks, bowling, hiking, day trips, beach parties and camping.

Organizers said the group plans to be very health conscious, so no smoking will be allowed at meetings. Because many women are in recovery from drug dependency or alcoholism, a no-drinking, nodrugs policy will also be maintained.

The group is looking for a permanent meeting place, and anyone with information concerning potential meeting facilities was asked to contact organizers at the numbers above.

"We need the support of any women interested in this. This is our group; let's make it grow," C.A. said.

DALLAS RAINBOW **ALLIANCE HOSTS** INTERNATIONAL GAY **DEAF CONFERENCE**

AIDS Quilt Exhibit, Workshops & Guest Speakers Highlight Weeklong Convention at Loews Anatole.

DALLAS — The 1991 Rainbow Alliance of the Deaf-International Deaf Lesbian & Gay Conference is holding its 12th biennial national convention and first-of-itskind international conference this Monday, July 1 in Dallas. The theme of the conference is "Lone Star Conference...a country/western adventure with great opportunities for personal growth." It runs through July 7 at the Loews Anatole Hotel, 2201 Stemmons Freeway.

Hosting this year's conference is the Dallas Rainbow Alliance of the Deaf, a nonprofit organization. The gathering will feature workshop sessions, keynote addresses and panel presentations by regional, national, and international hearing and deaf gay and lesbian leaders, as well as social and cultural events. Organizers expect over 500 deaf and hearing gay men and lesbians to attend from all over the world.

Conference workshops begin at 1 p.m. on Friday, July 5 and Saturday, July 6 and run until 4 p.m. The workshops will cover such topics as culture, language, politics, history, health care, leadership skills and the arts.

Thousands of panels of the Names Project and Deaf Names Project AIDS Memorial Quilt will be displayed at the Trinity Hall, Loews Anatole. The guilt theme for the International Deaf Lesbian & Gay Conference is "Remember My Sign Name."

Opening ceremonies for the AIDS Memorial Quilt will begin on Tuesday, July 2 at 6:30 p.m. The quilt exhibit will then be open for public viewing from Wednesday through Saturday, 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. The closing ceremony is on Saturday, July 6 at 4 p.m.

The conference opening ceremony begins on Wednesday morning, July 3 with welcoming addresses by Rep. Glen Maxey, the first openly-gay elected state official in Texas: Larry Evans, Executive Director of the Texas Commission for the Deaf: Lori Palmer, Dallas City Councilmember; Bruce Monroe, President of the Dallas Gay Alliance; and Marlena Rosendahl, President of the Rainbow Alliance of the Deaf.


Entertainment will be provided by the Ms., Miss and Mr. Deaf Gay World Pageant Preliminaries on Wednesday at 8 p.m. with special guests Patti Le Plae Safe and Mark Branson at the Round-Up Saloon. The World Pageant Finale is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. in Stemmons Auditorium at the Loews Anatole, The first Mr. Deaf International Leather Contest will also be held on July 5 at 10 p.m. in the auditorium of the Loews Anatole.

Scheduled events for Sunday morning commence at 9 a.m. with an "Ecuspiritual Service," followed by a farewell brunch at 10 a.m. A special multimedia presentation by professional deaf lesbians and gays begins at 12:30 p.m. following the closing ceremony of the Conference.

The conference will provide professional interpreting services for all hearing, deaf, deaf/blind and international participants.

The Rainbow Alliance of the Deaf was founded in the early 1970's by deaf gays in San Francisco, and the group has grown to comprise over 25 chapters in the United States and Canada. The group's first convention was held at Fort Lauderdale, Florida in 1977, and conventions have been held in cities all across the country.

AFH SPONSORS FOCUS ON AIDS CONFERENCE

Physicians Will Discuss Recent Developments in HIV Treatment.

HOUSTON — AIDS Foundation Houston [AFH] is sponsoring a forum on July 9 entitled "Current Therapies: A Report on the International AIDS Conference in Florence." The forum will focus on the most recent scientific discoveries regarding HIV disease and treatment protocols.

A panel of physicians headed by Dr. Joseph Gathe, Jr. will discuss their perceptions of the June conference, which they attended in Florence, Italy. Topics to be covered will include the potential applications of various vaccines now under study, research results on new anti-retroviral drugs, and the current treatments for many AIDS-related infections.

The forum is free and open to the public. Park Plaza is providing space for the forum in their North Building Conference Room (1 NA) and a buffet of finger foods and beverages.

The forum is the second in a series of HIV treatment workshops being offered on a bimonthly basis at Park Plaza as part of the AFH Wellness Program. For more information regarding this or other wellness events, contact AFH wellness program coordinator Bart Loeser at (713)623-6796.

AIDS RESOURCE CENTER AIMS SAFE SEX MESSAGE AT STUDENTS


Proposed Textbook Covers Would Carry Message, 800 Number; Distribution in Dallas, Houston, Austin & San Antonio.

DALLAS — John Thomas and the AIDS Resource Center, as well as other Dallas AIDS organizations, are trying to target high school students in the newest wave of "safe sex" education. The idea is to get the message out through book covers, which are required for public textbooks.

The proposed message may read something like: "AIDS, get the information and know the facts to protect yourself." The message would be followed by an 800

number for students to call, and at the bottom of the cover would be printed an endorsement by the Texas Department of Health and the Texas Education Agency.

"The message must be innocuous," Thomas explained to Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS. "Even a phrase like 'protect yourself' might be seen as a condom message. The idea is to get the message into the subconscious, by seeing it everyday on the front of textbooks."

The issue must be resolved by next month in order for covers printed in time for the fall semester. The covers would cost approximately \$37,000 for four-color, or \$24,000 for a single color. They would be distributed in the Dallas, Houston, Austin and San Antonio areas, where contracts for the covers have not already been sold. Thomas said he hoped that the money to print the textbook covers can be raised through various private foundations, but he noted that time was running very short.


"Military recruit figures show that there is a disproportionate number of high school students who are HIV-positive, compared to the national average in the population at large," Thomas said. "The media needs to pay more attention to high school students, because they will end up on our doorsteps later, needing our services, if we don't stop this spread now."

"We want to get these students to start thinking about AIDS, and not to just think that it is something 'foreign.'"



Now Time for Gay Self-Reliance

The following letter by Robert Bridges, Vice President of the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus, concerns the failure of previously sympathetic City Councilmembers, in particular Vince Ryan of District C, to support the creation of a Montrose-based Council district. TWT solicited and received a response from Councilmember Ryan, which included a memo from Jerry Wood of the Planning and Development Dept. explaining the city's position regarding the proposed Montrose district.—Editor

Dear TWT:

Houston's gay community has reached a critical point in its political development. The time has come for us to move forward to the next level of empowerment, or we risk the possibility of remaining permanently trapped in the vicious circle of dependence and disappointment. This critical point was poignantly illustrated by the current redistricting of Houston's municipal election districts.

The Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus [GLPC] participated vigorously in the fourmonth redistricting process, the end goal being to create a Montrose-based Council district in which an openly gay or lesbian candidate would have a fair chance at being elected to City Council. The GLPC redistricting committee did a thoroughly professional job of coordinating public testimony, preparing maps and demographic data, and effectively lobbying members of Council. Throughout the process, the Caucus worked in concert with Hispanic, Black and Asian groups in order to present a united coalition front.

Many members of Council indicated support, and Councilmember Vince Ryan pledged his efforts to help implement the new Montrose district. It seemed too good to be true. Unfortunately, it was. We had again fallen into the trap of depending on

our friends to do the right thing when the chips are down.


As the redistricting deadline drew near, our friends on Council began to back away from the issue one by one. Ryan decided he could no longer support the creation of the district, as it would hamper his personal reelection efforts. Others became cool to the idea when it became clear that they would have to debate and vote publicly in Council chambers in order to approve the district.

It happens time and again; candidates who declare friendship and loyalty to the community at private gay political endorsement meetings suddenly get cold feet when asked to deliver that loyalty in public.

On Wednesday, June 5, City Council met to approve the district lines as drawn by the City Planning Department. When the motion to approve the map was made, the floor became open for discussion. Unbelievably, not one member of Council asked for discussion of the Montrose district, even though they had been lobbied continuously for the past four months. The 16-district map, without the Montrose district, was approved unanimously by Council.

Although we did not attain the district we desired, the gay and lesbian community of Houston has learned a lasting lesson from the redistricting process. We must break the cycle of dependency on our elected "friends." They will never do the things necessary to move our community forward. We must do them by ourselves, for ourselves. The time has come for us to elect openly gay candidates to public office. The time has come for us to articulate our own concerns in the elective process. The time has come to start playing politics for real. We can do it, we should do it, and we must do it. The time for self-respect, self-reliance and selfempowerment is now.

Councilman Ryan Responds

Dear TWT:

I appreciate the opportunity to respond to concerns about the recent redistricting efforts of City Council.

Due to the shift of population in Houston from eastern areas to the west and in response to the surge in Hispanic population, the federal Voting Rights Act required realigning our nine districts and the consideration of adding district seats to provide an opportunity for more Hispanic representation.

Early illustrative maps prepared by the City Planning Department had Montrose becoming a part of either a predominantly black or Hispanic district. At that point, I had one of my many conversations with Robert Bridges, who was spearheading the GLPC's efforts. I indicated that I would work with him to see if Montrose could be joined with areas more compatible with his goal.

Over three months of intense work began. By the end of the process, difficulties arose with basing a district in Montrose which joined it to areas not currently in District C. Following this letter is a memo from Jerry Wood with the Mayor's Planning and Development Department which fully explains those difficulties, particularly the splitting of several large, cohesive neighborhoods among several districts and the conversion of a minority district into an Anglo district.

Additionally, the civic club leadership of Montrose voiced concerns about the linking of Montrose with some of the areas to the west as proposed by Robert's plan.

Throughout the process many tough decisions were made. Only "if and when" the voters approve the 16-district plan in August will any changes take place.

Robert Bridges worked long and hard on redistricting.

Nevertheless, the requirements of the Voting Rights Act and the City's desire to minimize the division of neighborhoods made his efforts unsuccessful.

Personally, I remain committed to working with all communities in Montrose to improve the area and to continue the fight against AIDS. I have spent much of my life living and working in Montrose and believe it and its people to be among Houston's greatest assets.

Again, thanks for the opportunity to address these concerns.

Dear Councilmember Ryan:

This memo is intended to clarify the reasons for the Planning Department's recommendations in the 16-district plan which was adopted with amendments yesterday.

I believe that part of the confusion I have observed is a result of misunder-standing the role of the U.S. Justice Department and the intent of the Voting Rights Act. Because the Justice Department does not comment on issues until a submission is made, we must rely on the experience of our outside counsel, Bickerstaff, Heath and Smiley.

The Planning Department recommendations were based on the criteria included in the directive from Council to develop the district plans, and the legal advice from the outside counsel. There were a number of effects from the plan submitted by the Gay and Lesbian Political Caucus (GLPC) which conflicted with our criteria and legal advice, which caused us to recommend against their alternative plan. It is important to understand those objections because they are civil rights and community issues, rather than the political question of the possible electoral success of a particular individual or political organization.

Our primary objection to the proposal of the GLPC was that it converted a district in which a majority of the voting age population was made up of minority voters covered by the Voting Rights Act in Houston (O) into a district in which a majority of the population was Anglo. This, in the opinion of our outside counsel, could place the City in jeopardy of a Justice Department objection, since the staff proposal had demonstrated that a majority non-Anglo district could be established, but Council chose not to.

The political argument that linking the majority non-Anglo portions of district O with Montrose would be beneficial to that non-Anglo population has not been made by any minority group protected under the Voting Rights Act. Instead, it has been organized on behalf of a separate and distinct political organization (GLPC) that

does not purport to be an organization of voters protected against racial and ethnic discrimination by the Voting Rights Act.

The suggestion that the gay community has been disenfranchised by the plan as passed is a political argument, not a legal one, and is unfounded. The proposal which Council adopted does not divide Montrose or nearby neighborhoods of similar character into different districts. The alternative simply connected Montrose and nearby neighborhoods with a different collection of dissimilar neighborhoods.

There also seems to be some confusion over what sort of groups of people are covered by the Voting Rights Act. The only groups of Americans covered by the Voting Rights Act are racial and language minorities. Sexual or affectional preference is not covered.

A further concern regarding the GLPC alternative is that it split two neighborhoods in southwest Houston, both of which had previously expressed great concern about such a possibility. Westbury would have had a corner moved to district N, and Sharpstown would have been divided among three districts, C, F and P. Council had heard much testimony from Westbury when an earlier plan had failed to keep all sections of the neighborhood in C, and Sharpstown Civic Club had been the first neighborhood organization to define its boundaries and warn against a plan which would split it up.

When was the last time you saw a really great TV show? CBS's Northern Exposure is turning into a real "must see." For weeks it has been intriguing viewers with its comic and complicated plot twists.

An especially satisfying one involved the revelation that the show's fictional hometown was named after its founders—a lesbian couple! In relating this piece of history, a character commented that the two women "had a good thing and were lucky to have it."

This sensitivity continued with the May 20 episode, when a regular character, Maurice, enters into an agreement to sell a house to two men. It never occurs to Maurice, a rather unenlightened sort, that the two might be closer than friends. Maurice gets the message, however, at a celebration dinner; the lovers explain how they met at a Halloween party, and then they very naturally reach across the table and hold each other's hands.

As a confirmed homophobe, Maurice has a hard time accepting the idea that he has sold a home to a gay couple, and the rest of the show explores his personal struggle. In this episode of Northern Lights, unlike in so much other television, it's not gay people who are depicted as having the problem, but rather the homophobe.

Although Maurice is portrayed as a bit silly and ignorant in his bigotry, by the end of the show, he has adjusted to living alongside his gay neighbors. The closing sequence shows the gay couple dancing at a local tavern, comfortable and accepted by the straight townspeople.

One of the best aspects of this episode is the lovers' ease with their own sexuality. They express their intimacy and affection with quiet comfort and pride. Because they accept their love as natural, it is easy for the audience to do so as well.

Thank the producers of Northern Exposure for this wonderfully fair and humorous show. Encourage them to bring back the gay couple as ongoing characters. Some gay people like the "Men on..." skits, considering them great fun. Many others object bitterly, finding the skits mean-spirited and hateful. As the show has progressed, the characters have become more and more abusively stereotypical of African-American gay men, and increasingly misogynistic. The jokes are getting nastier, and the "humor" less funny.

This reached a peak on the season's last episode. Reviewing television shows like Golden Girls and Roseanne, Blaine and Antoine explain that they "hated" them, adding, "It's women like that who made us this way!" The implication that men become gay because they "hate" women is an ugly falsehood.

Then, in a takeoff on "cliffhanger" endings, a skylight falls on one of the characters. The accident induces amnesia, and he revives as a heterosexual. He proceeds to rebuff his former friend who, overcome himself, also takes a fall. The result of his mishap is left to next season's opener.

Just as the first "joke" suggested a link between homosexuality and hatred of women, so the second one implies that being gay can be "corrected" with a strong knock to the head. In a time of escalating anti-gay violence, this implication takes on particular nastiness.

Gay activists' previous appeals to In Living Color's producers have been ignored. However, since Blaine and Antoine are currently television's most visible gays, it is important that we keep trying. Over the summer, the characters from this skit may be undergoing significant changes.

Write the producer and ask that the current storvline be used to teach some lessons about homophobia. Encourage the producers to use this opportunity to counter the destructive myths they've been exploiting. Wayans has defended these skits by saying he makes fun of everyone. Challenge him to make fun of homophobes.

Another in A Continuing Series of Reports From Austin on Legislative Issues Affecting Gays and Lesbians in Texas

N ow that the 1991 legislative session is finished and the special session is not due to start for another two weeks, I'd like to take a break from the usual subject matter of this column to draw your attention to a global issue that the Texas lesbian and gay community should be aware of

The thirteenth annual International Lesbian/Gay Association Conference has been canceled. Mexico was the host for this year's conference, which was to be held in Guadalajara from June 30 to July 6. After months of deliberations, local organizers and members of the International Lesbian and Gay Association [ILGA] were forced to cancel the conference because the Mayor of Guadalajara, Gabriel Covarrubias Ibarra, refused to guarantee security for the more than 400 lesbian and gay activists from around the world who were scheduled to attend the conference. The Mexican Constitution contains a

clause guaranteeing the right to convene. Government officials, however, maintain that this right-to-convene clause does not include police protection of legal gatherings.

We must broaden the scope of our movement and work in coalition with activists in other countries.

Although Mexico City is generally seen as Mexico's most progressive city, lesbian and gay activists have made a lot of progress in Guadalajara, a city which is generally known for its conservative climate. Because of its history as a site of successful lesbian and gay organizing, local activists decided to locate the conference in Guadalajara instead of the capital city.

Although the Mexican lesbian and gay movement does not face regressive sodomy statutes such as Section 21.06 of the

Texas state Penal Code, which criminalizes sexual conduct between consenting adults, activists must nevertheless fight difficult social and legal battles. For example, in Mexico the age of consent for homosexual conduct is higher than it is for heterosexual conduct. Mexican activists have challenged this law, but so far they have been unsuccessful in their attempts to have it repealed.

The cancellation of the ILGA conference holds special significance for the lesbian and gay community in Texas because of our close ties to Mexico. In the context of an increasingly international economy. signaled by such intergovernmental agreements as the proposed free trade agreement between the U.S. and Mexico, we must broaden the scope of our movement and work in coalition with activists in other countries. We must learn to recognize the connections between, for instance, the threat by the local government in Guadalajara to fine or shut down hotels that offer lodging to ILGA conference participants. and our own Supreme Court's recent decision to punish physicians in federally funded family planning clinics who so much as mention the possibility of abortion. In the struggle against global oppression, we must work for global solidarity.

I urge you to follow the lead of activists in Mexico who are protesting this egregious decision. Please write to the U.S. ambassador in Mexico City and ask that he speak out against this latest act of repression against the international lesbian and gay community.

LEE PARK GETS LIVING TRIBUTE TO AIDS COMMUNITY

In 1989, Alan Ross of the Dallas Tavern Guild proposed setting up a tribute to all those affected by AIDS in Dallas' Lee Park. From the beginning, the project was beset by controversy as members of the Dallas Park and Recreation Board and others raised various objections to the proposal. Some of those opposed to the tribute said the park should be reserved a memorial to those who have died in military service.

The debate came to focus on the wording of the dedication plaque which was to be placed at the base of a cedar tree. The Park Board ruled on July 12, 1990 that a plaque could be placed in the park, but could not contain three key words—"gay," "lesbian"

or "AIDS."

Nearly a year later, after further discussion and negotiation, the effort to place the Living Tribute in Lee Park has finally met with success as the Park Board has voted to approve a plaque recognizing the AIDS community. TWT NEWS provides its readers with a report on the decision, followed by the text of a letter Alan Ross read to the Dallas Park and Recreation Board after its decision approving the Living Tribute.

ur intent was to recognize the AIDS community. I knew the words 'lesbian and gay' wouldn't pass with the Park Board," Alan Ross told Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS following the recent decision on the Living Tribute in Lee Park. "I feel that this is a very positive moment for our city, that an area has been set aside to recognize the AIDS community."

The Living Tribute has been an issue for the Dallas Park and Recreation Department since September, 1989. The issue has been the recognition of the gay and lesbian community and its involvement in the AIDS epidemic. The Board has always maintained that Lee Park was a memorial to war heroes, and that a plaque dedicated to those who had died of AIDS would set a precedent for recognizing people stricken by other diseases.

"We have to realize the evolving needs of the community," Ross said. "This may very well set a new precedent, but I think it will also help to educate people and open the lines of communication."

Ross said that the plaque was never meant as a memorial, but rather as a tribute to those who have been affected by AIDS, either themselves, their friends, or through their volunteer work. The plaque is likely measures only 21"×13", and was merely a part of the entire proposed project.

The newly revised plaque was approved unanimously by the Park Board. The only dissenting comment came early in the meeting from Ken Hahn of the Oak Lawn Committee, who suggested that the continuity of Lee Park be maintained by not recognizing a specific disease. He propos-

ed that the money be diverted to the AIDS Resource Center instead.

"I don't think he [Hahn] really understood the issue," Ross said. "This group has not been involved before. To him, it is just a plaque."

The tree, which is at the center of the Living Tribute, will be replanted by Lambert's, the nursery that guaranteed it for two years. The first tree died and was subsequently cut down. The plaque will be dedicated during a special ceremony on December 1 of this year, the date of the Fourth Annual World AIDS Day.

Alan Ross was commended by the Park Board for his diligence in working to bring the memorial to Lee Park. The Southern Memorial Association, which had vehemently opposed the plaque, finally gave its approval to the newly revised wording. "Everyone worked together to reach this compromise," one board member noted. "Mr. Ross has done a lot to make the Dallas community aware of this health issue."

On behalf of the Dallas Tavern Guild, sponsors of this project, I wish to make the following comments:

Today, with your positive vote and your acceptance of the Living Tribute in Lee Park, we celebrate the lives of 2,000 Dallas County residents who have perished from many opportunistic infections caused by Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome,

while helping to comfort and console the surviving families, lovers and friends who have suffered and have lost a part of their own lives because of AIDS. We also honor the estimated 10,000 men, women and children of Dallas who are living with AIDS, ARC and HIV infection, and we honor and pay tribute to over 100,000 Dallas County volunteers, professionals and financial contributors—homosexual and heterosexual—all working side-by-side fighting this devastating disease on many levels.

Because of the historical significance of your decision today, there will be a special ceremony at the site on Sunday, December 1, 1991, which is the fourth observance of World AIDS Day.

While your vote does not directly recognize the efforts, contributions and leadership this past decade from the lesbian/gay community of Dallas, I do thank you for your compassion, your leadership and your courage to accept our meaningful gift to Lee Park and the City of Dallas that will recognize the AIDS Community of Dallas County, which has been the principal intent and purpose of the project.

With today's momentous confirmation, you have lighted the path for the uneducated and the misinformed. As a person with an ARC diagnosis, I thank you very, very much.

Musical theatre legend Carol Channing will appear in two shows this weekend at Fort Worth's Casa Manana Theatre. Miss Channing took a break from rehearsals at her New York apartment to chat with TWT about her career and her upcoming visit to Texas.

n 1967, Carol Channing's final performance as Dolly Gallagher Levi in the musical Hello Dolly! rang down the curtain after 1,273 consecutive shows. Channing didn't miss a single performance and never played to an empty seat.

When TWT asked her how many times she had performed the title song "Hello, Dolly!," Carol replied, "Oh, I've stopped counting after, 3,000—it's probably in the neighborhood of 3,500."

"This is my 15th visit to Texas. Texans know it's all right to react in theatre; they make a wonderful audience for any entertainer. And they are quick!" added Carol.

Interviewing Carol Channing is like visiting with a long-lost friend. She plunges right into the conversation, and a simple question is her cue to respond as a friend, rather than as the subject of an interview. For example, "You were close to Mary Martin..."

"Did you ever meet my dear friend Mary? You know she's from Texas. They have a statue of her in her hometown of Weatherford. Have you seen her statue? I promised Mary I'd go see it (the statue), and I hope to have time on this visit to Fort Worth. Isn't Weatherford near Fort Worth? I'll ask someone at the theatre."

Carol began her career during World War II, fresh out of Bennington College. "The first job is a snap, the next job is the

problem." Carol's signature song is "Diamonds Are A Girl's Best Friend" from her 1949 smash hit, Gentlemen Prefer Blondes. She went on to star in other Broadway hits including The Vamp, Show Girl and Hello Dolly!

Channing's talent has been acknowledged on numerous occasions. She has received a Tony Award, N.Y. Critic's Circle Award and a Golden Globe Award. Her original cast album (Hello Dolly!) set an all-time record for sales in the Broadway musical category. Carol has ten gold albums for her recordings from Broadway shows, movies and children's renditions.

Carol Channing appears tonight and tomorrow at the Casa Manana Theater in Fort Worth. She will make costume changes on-stage behind a screen, and in the process she will be describing her next character to the audience.

For an evening of pure entertainment from the American musical theatre, go see Carol Channing this weekend.


