## CHARGES FILED IN BROSSARD MURDER

*HPD Reverses Position, Says  
Houston Man Murdered  
Because He Was Gay;*

*Large Demonstration Draws Over  
1,000 Decrying Official Inaction.*

HOUSTON — In the aftermath of the murder of Paul Brossard and the attack on his two companions on July 4 in Montrose, the gay and lesbian community continues to call for a full response by public officials and law enforcement agencies to combat hate crime.

The Houston Police Department has announced the arrest of several suspects in the case, and has reversed itself on the question of whether the incident was a gay-bashing.

At a press conference held Friday, July 12 at HPD headquarters, police spokesman Sgt. Waymon Allen announced that two suspects had been charged in the case. He also stated that there was no evidence to indicate that the attack on Brossard and his two companions was a hate crime, and he would not speculate further on possible motives for the crime.

Over the weekend, however, HPD reversed itself and decided that the motive for Brossard's murder was, indeed, that he was gay. Community leaders and activists have been charging that HPD is dragging its feet on fighting hate crime in the Houston area, and they are demanding that the department set up an effective system for keeping track of and classifying such incidents.

The youths accused in the case to date are 17-year-old Derrick Attard, charged with attempted murder and arrested in New York on July 11; 17-year-old John Buice, charged with murder; 17-year-old Leonardo Ramirez, charged with attempted murder and aggravated assault; and



22-year-old Paul Dillon, charged with attempted murder and aggravated assault.

The case is now being reviewed by the District Attorney's office, and any further charges will be made at the direction of the Assistant District Attorney. The FBI is also looking into the case.

Activist Ray Hill expressed his confidence in the investigation arm of HPD and the speed with which the police began investigating the case. But he added that, regardless of the legal definition of a hate crime, "We are regarding this as a hate crime and are responding to it as a clear and present danger to the community."

A demonstration called by the activist group Queer Nation on Saturday, July 13 drew a crowd of over 1,000 participants. The protest march, which began near the site of the Brossard murder, culminated in a loud and passionate yet peaceful rally at the intersection of Montrose Blvd. and Westheimer. The crowd occupied the intersection for about an hour, carrying signs and shouting slogans decrying homophobia and official indifference towards hate crimes.

## JUDGE TRYING CASE IN BEAUMONT MAKES ANTI-GAY REMARKS

*Houston Attorney Files Complaint Seeking Impeachment or Reprimand Of Judge Referring to 'Queers.'*

BEAUMONT — A federal judge who is presiding over a civil rights trial in Jefferson County has drawn fire over anti-gay remarks he made reminiscent of those that led to the 1989 censure of Dallas District Judge Jack Hampton.

U.S. District Judge Sam B. Hall, a former U.S. Congressman who was appointed to the federal bench in 1985 during the second Reagan administration, was presiding over a civil rights case brought by 19-year-old David Todd Mayes, a convicted drug offender, in which the plaintiff alleges that his right of due process was violated because he was forced to await trial in the overcrowded Jefferson County jail. He asked for \$100,000 for his suffering. Hall, who normally sits on the bench in Marshall and Texarkana, was presiding over the case because U.S. District Judge Joe Fisher is on vacation.

Mayes' suit further alleges that his jail cell was "dirty, rat-infested and the plumbing sometimes didn't work." He also said he was placed in a cell where inmates engaged in sexual activity.

Hall's comments came while he was hearing the testimony of Lt. John Cassio, who said that jail officials can segregate inmates according to sexual preferences only if they request it. The judge asked Cassio if inmates were put in cells with "all that other bunch of queers?"

Hall acknowledged that he does not like homosexuals, referring to them as "their kind." "You call it what you want to, I'll call it what I want to," Hall said. "I have strong feelings about this."

The judge later said he would instruct the jurors to disregard all comments he had made.

In a further development, Houston attorney Michael Maness has filed a complaint with the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in New Orleans seeking impeachment or public reprimand of Hall.

Maness maintains in his complaint that Hall's comments constituted "conduct prejudicial to the effective and expeditious administration of the business of the

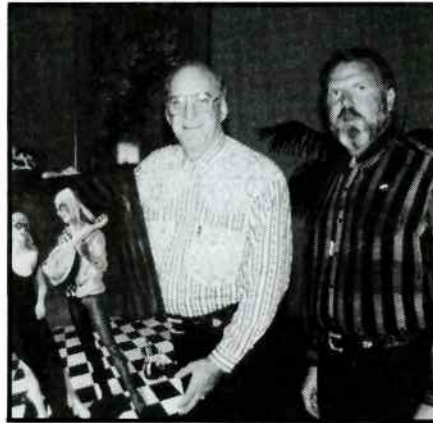
courts." The complaint was filed on behalf of Houston activist Ray Hill.

## FLORAL DESIGNERS CONVENTION BENEFITS DIFFA/DALLAS

*Over \$40,000 Raised in Auction Goes to Area Organizations.*

DALLAS — "This is new money for the Dallas area, coming from a source unused by any other organizations," Steve Burrus told Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS. Over \$10,000 was netted in a recent fund-raising event at the Anatole Hotel in Dallas. The hotel was headquarters for the national convention of the American Institute of Floral Designers.

Burrus, with the Dallas chapter of Design Industry Foundation for AIDS [DIFFA], explained that every year the institute holds an auction during their convention to benefit an organization in the host city. Last year's convention was held in Newport Beach, California and the site of next year's convention will be Atlanta. All money collected at this year's event will stay in the Dallas area, Burrus said.

"People who attend the convention bring special items from their home states to auction off to the other conventioners," Burrus explained. "Actually, there were people from around the world,

including mainland China, Taiwan, Canada and Great Britain."

One of the highlights of the evening occurred when some of this year's models for the Dallas Collection took off their DIFFA T-shirts to sell them. The highest bid for these items was \$165. Several conventioners verbally expressed the desire that the models go with the winning bidders.

Items in the auction ranged from floral arrangements to jewelry and paintings. The highest bid for a ring was \$2,000.

"I am glad that another industry is doing something to help raise funds for AIDS services," Burrus said, "and we encourage others to start. It was a great way to raise money and have fun doing it."

## **GAY & LESBIAN COMMUNITY CENTER MOVES INTO NEW FACILITY**

*'Putting Down Roots' Raises Funds  
For Building Repairs, Tree Planting.*

DALLAS — When we say someone is "putting down roots," what we often mean is that person is establishing himself in a new setting. That's exactly what the Gay and Lesbian Community Center [GLCC] is doing at their new home at Reagan and Brown.

A special use permit was granted by the City of Dallas for the center to move into the property formerly occupied by the Metropolitan Community Church [MCCD], with the stipulation that certain landscaping additions be made to the surroundings. The modifications include planting 18 additional trees around the lot the building stands and around the nearby parking lot. Each tree must measure 3½" around.

John Thomas explained to Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS that the Dallas Park Foundation would have donated trees for GLCC to use, but they only measured 2" in diameter. Now the Community Center Capital Campaign has organized "Putting Down Roots," a fund-raising effort to help pay for the trees. Businesses, groups or individuals can purchase a tree for an investment of \$1,000.

Thomas estimated the total cost of the tree-planting project at \$25,000-\$30,000, which will include the addition of curbing to help protect the roots of the trees. There will also be special triangles installed in the walkways to recognize the donations of special sponsors.

He also said that repairs had already been made to the gutters and the roof, and drainage problems had been corrected.

"While we were seeking someone to donate heating and air conditioning equipment, we contacted a woman at Snyder-General," Thomas said. "We explained our needs, and she said she thought she could help.

"The woman, who is an officer in the heating and air conditioning company, had been seeking information about AIDS for a friend in Houston whose son was infected. She had called the Center and received help, so she wanted to help us in return."

The Harold Reeder Estate is providing \$10,000 for electrical updating of the facility. "Our electrical service needs are much different than the church's were," Thomas said.

Holes for the trees are being dug by people from the World Trade Center, who offered to help with the project.

"I think people will be able to see this as our new home when the landscaping is begun. So far, the other changes can be seen at night only, when various organizations are using the facility and the parking lot is full," he added. "We want people to see that things are changing and to feel at home with the new center."

*Topics Covered Will Include AIDS Education, Treatments & Resources Available to PWAs.*

DALLAS — Oak Lawn Community Services is offering another of its Buddy Project Training and Public AIDS Information Forums this weekend beginning tonight, July 19 and continuing tomorrow and Sunday.

The Buddy Project places volunteers who work with people with AIDS to provide emotional and physical support. People who become buddies carry on a tradition of helping PWAs in the Dallas area that goes back to 1983.

The sessions run from 6:45 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. tonight, and continue tomorrow from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The training concludes Sunday afternoon, from 1 to 4 p.m. The program is held at the Oak Lawn Community Services, 3434 Fairmount, Dallas.

Continuing education credits are available for this training from El Centro College. Topics to be covered will include basic and advanced HIV-AIDS education, up-to-date treatment information, physical and emotional needs of PWAs, psycho-social issues, substance abuse education

and resources available to PWAs and their care-givers.

# THEN WHAT THE HELL IS A HATE CRIME?

Three men are walking to their car in Montrose. One of them is killed. That's a tragedy.

At last Friday's official HPD press conference, the Houston Police Department announced that the case would not be investigated as a hate crime. That's a travesty.

If any incident ever fit the definition of a hate crime, it is the murder of Paul Broussard. When skinheads in Dallas defaced a Jewish synagogue, that was a hate crime and investigated as such. When white youths in the Bensonhurst section of New York killed a black man just because he was in “their” part of town, that was a hate crime and it was investigated as such. And when ten young men leave their homes in the Woodlands area of Houston, drive 30 miles into Montrose, armed with two-by-fours studded with nails, and at least one knife, and systematically seek out gay people with the premeditated intent to cause bodily harm, that's most assuredly a hate crime. I know it, you know it, but the Houston Police Department apparently refuses to even consider that possibility.

Even as HPD spokesmen Sgt. Waymon Allen was announcing the arrest of two suspects in the case, he expressed what can only be regarded as the official position of Chief Elizabeth Watson and her department: that this would not be investigated as a hate crime. That's a bunch of shit.

What evidence has HPD gathered that they are not releasing to the public? Did the victims provoke the attack? I've interviewed the two survivors, and I can tell you they did not. Was robbery a motive? No.



Did the murderer know his victim and specifically seek him out? I don't think so. So how can HPD rule out even the possibility that this was a hate crime after what can only be called a preliminary and cursory investigation? In my opinion, something stinks and reeks of a coverup.

Now HPD has suddenly reversed itself and says it will, indeed, treat this as a hate crime. Why? Could it be that pressure from the gay community is having an effect? If so, good. If not, maybe it's time we applied more pressure.

I don't think Paul Broussard should be made a martyr. But we mustn't let his death be in vain, either. We should seize this opportunity to make a difference. We must let those who have supported the gay community in the past, as well as those who have not been particularly sympathetic to our cause, know that we will no longer be treated as second-class citizens.

Paul Broussard's killer is, first and foremost, a murderer and must be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law. But equally as important, we must have specific hate crimes legislation on the books of the city of Houston and the state of Texas.

Public demonstrations are important as a show of the community's anger, but we must also do the long, hard work necessary to bring about change. We must write, phone, go to the mayor, the City Council, the state Legislature, the Governor and demand action to address this issue now. If they don't respond immediately, then it's our responsibility to work to elect those who will. At last Tuesday's City Hall press conference, prior to the arrests, Mayor Whitmire, as well as several City Council members, made impassioned statements deploring the murder of Broussard and voiced their support for the fight against hate crimes. Let's hold them to it and demand that they get moving.

This has nothing to do with gay pride as such, although none of us should be ashamed of what we are. What this has to do with is the brutal, senseless murder of a human being and the apparent indifference and apathy of elected officials and law enforcement.

## Come Out, Fight Hate

Dear TWT:

Many times people have the opinion that things will or do always happen to someone other than themselves. A 27-year-old man named Paul Broussard who worked in a bank may have even thought the same thing.

Unfortunately, though, Paul is now a statistic of the constant hate crimes that are all too often inflicted on innocent individuals. Paul's life was ended when eight to ten youths decided he would be the victim of their gay-bashing expedition of the night only July 4, at about 3 a.m. after he and two of his friends left a Montrose bar.

While listening to Jim Carper and Buddy Johnston on KPFT's "After Hours" program July 7, a caller with Queer Nation called in talking of the plans they are making for a protest over this latest incident. They are still formulating actions, but I as one hope they heavily publicize where and when people like me can join them for the event. [A rally and demonstration was held on Saturday, July 13 at the intersection of Montrose and Westheimer.—Ed.]

During an election year in Houston in 1991, it is long overdue for anyone and everyone to make a change by electing openly gay officials such as Annise Parker. By statistics, well over one in ten people in Houston is gay, but unless we finally are willing to be heard, you might be the next Paul Broussard.

The youths used two-by-fours studded with nails, and possibly a knife was used to bludgeon and rip through Paul's skin as the youths made their attack. It sounds gruesome because it is. A scene comparable to this is the one in *Torch Song Trilogy* in which Matthew Broderick is a 27-year-old man bludgeoned with baseball bats.

To me, the Houston Gay/Lesbian Pride Parade didn't say that everything was great, but that pulling together is the only solution. HPD receives two or three calls a week from the Montrose area concerning everything from someone being shot at with a gun to someone riding their bike and being bashed in the head.

I'm not sure where I will start, but I don't intend on sitting back and being the next victim of a hate crime. Only you can decide if you are willing to be who you are and come out of your closet, or sit back and maybe read of a friend or lover being the next victim.

My heartfelt sympathy goes out to Paul's family in Atlanta, and to others who have had family members become victims of such disturbing crimes of hate and violence.

## Speak Up, Take Action

Dear TWT:

Over the Fourth of July holiday weekend, I learned of the death of a former boyfriend at the hands of a murderous group of assailants in Montrose. I am still gathering information as to all of the details of this tragic and senseless crime, trying to determine how it could have come about.

On a holiday when each and every American should be able to celebrate the right to "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness," it is a painful reminder that gays and lesbians are still a long way from possessing those rights. We are all the victims of hate crimes, whether the victimization be direct or indirect.

I am ashamed and remorseful that the death of a loved one had to be the event that would shake me into action. I have

been active in the gay community for the past five years in our fight against the AIDS epidemic, ignoring the fact that disease is not our only enemy.

I, like so many others, have been willing to enjoy the freedoms that we do have, while letting a small number of gays and lesbians fight for our civil rights. I will remain in the background no longer!

Our enemies are slowly changing the face of our community. One of our symbols, the pink triangle, is slowly deepening in color. With the death of each hate-crimes victim such as Paul Broussard, the symbol of our community pride gets nearer and nearer to the color red.

Am I being melodramatic? I don't believe so. As individuals, we need to become involved and join with those who are already fighting for hate-crimes legislation. As a community, we need to begin educating ourselves in crime prevention; specifically, in ways to lessen the risk of becoming victims ourselves.

The community is rightfully outraged by the death of an innocent man who committed no crime except in the eyes of his murderers. I have heard of angry promises by lesbians and gays. They are arming themselves as a means of protection. Some have vowed to see this thing through to the end.

I am apprehensive of the outcome, because I know personally the kind of rage that is being felt by others. It is difficult at best to think rationally at times like this, but counterviolence is not the correct solution to this serious issue. We must act responsibly so that we do not become perpetrators ourselves.

I implore each of you—*speak up and take action now!* Write a letter to your State Representative and Senator as well as their counterparts on Capitol Hill. Become involved in a local political caucus or organization that is lobbying for legislative action in regard to your civil rights. At the very least, learn how to protect yourself when you're out for a night on the town.

Ask yourself, "Am I willing to wait until I am a victim myself before I become involved?" If your answer is "yes," then you are already involved—you are part of the problem!

## Letter to Mayor Whitmire

The following letter was sent to Houston Mayor Kathy Whitmire by club owner Charles Armstrong.—Editor

Dear Mayor Whitmire:

On Friday afternoon, July 12, 1991, at 3 p.m., a press conference was held in the media press room at HPD headquarters, 61 Reissner Street. This conference was called to announce information regarding the arrest of the individuals responsible for the stabbing death of Mr. Paul Broussard, and the attack on two of his companions, on the morning of July 4.

During the briefing, HPD Sgt. Waymon Allen stated, at least twice, that this incident was not being treated as a hate crime. Since earlier statements by HPD had indicated that the case was, in fact, being treated as a hate crime, Sgt. Allen's remarks left the press corps in attendance stunned and confused, to say the least. Even after repeated requests for clarification of HPD's stand on the matter by media representatives, Sgt. Allen continued to state that it was not being handled as a hate crime.

The mixed signals and erroneous statements issued by Sgt. Allen, which resulted in conflicting media reports on at least five television stations Friday evening, are, simply put, irresponsible! I strongly urge you and each Councilmember to demand an immediate clarification from Police Chief Watson, and that you demand that Chief Watson investigate this media blunder.

Additionally, I urge each of you to request that Chief Watson publicly acknowledge that Paul Broussard's murder was, indeed, a hate crime, and that the Houston Police Department erred in previous statements, given by an ill-informed police sergeant, which indicated that a hate crime had not been committed, despite the fact that the murder was perpetrated by an angry mob of ten young men who traveled 30 miles from their homes to stalk and harm homosexuals in the Montrose area. And I strongly urge you to demand that Chief Watson categorically declare that hate crimes will not be tolerated against the lesbian and gay community, or against any individuals in the city of Houston.

I demand an immediate investigation and swift response from you, Mayor Whitmire, and from my City Councilmembers.

I anxiously await your reply.

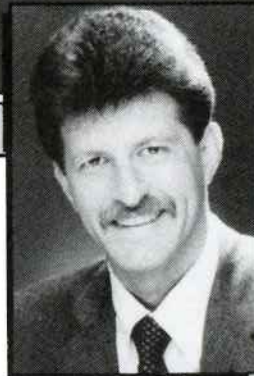

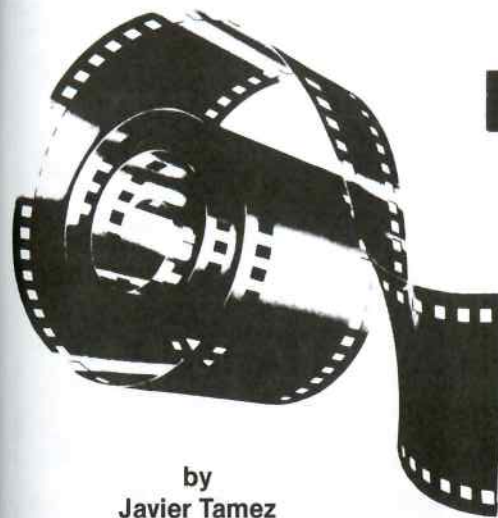

The summer movie season is now in full throttle, and the returns thus far have been surprisingly good. Midway through Hollywood's Memorial Day-Labor Day money-making stretch, the screens have been witness to wacky and endearing comedies, stunning special-effects adventure movies, first-rate dramas and revealing documentaries. A good many of these are now well into their theater runs.

Leading the pack in terms of substance, significance and art are two superb dramas. In *Thelma & Louise* (★★★★), Geena Davis and Susan Sarandon play the title roles of two women who are best friends, a lonely housewife and a seasoned waitress. A weekend getaway for them turns into a red-letter experience in which they grow and learn more of themselves and each other than they had in a lifetime.

Equally riveting is Spike Lee's latest outing, *Jungle Fever* (★★★★). It's the stormy, taut story of a black architect and an Italian secretary who let their passions spark and begin a relationship with serious consequences. Two scenes—a virtual war council among five black women and an eerie, pagan ride through a frighteningly huge ghetto crack house—are among the

best sequences to hit the screen in years. Spike Lee is a tremendous talent.

To engage the giggle box, we have the engrossing *City Slickers* (★★) with Billy Crystal, a goofy look at three yuppies in search of the ultimate adventure who find it on a genuine old-West cattle drive. Taking the spoof-of-the-summer award is *Soapdish* (★★½), with a headline cast including Sally Field, Kevin Kline, Robert Downey, Jr. and Whoopi Goldberg. It pokes merciless fun at daytime soap operas, showing us the cast and crew of a daytime drama whose real lives take even crazier twists than the lives of the characters they portray.

Special effects magic is the star of *Backdraft* (★★★), a powerhouse film that sets the relationship of two brothers in a fire station drama, complete with their respective love lives and the pursuit of an ingenious arsonist. Kurt Russell and William Baldwin are excellent in the lead roles, and Scott Glenn and Robert De Niro are also in fine form among the supporting cast.

Real-life drama is the stuff of Madonna's tell-all tale, *Truth or Dare* (★★★★½). Filmed entirely during the course of her

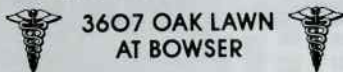

"Blonde Ambition" tour, it's a provocative, serious and yet funny look at the life of one of the world's most celebrated glitterati.

More recent releases have continued the trend of engaging, worthwhile productions.

**T**he *Rocketeer*. Movies that are geared for, and promoted as, wholesome family entertainment, have a tendency to get lost in their sweetness. Walt Disney Studios has for years provided just this kind of fare. There is, of course, nothing wrong with films suitable for even the tiniest of tots, but *The Rocketeer* is so careful to avoid even the slightest hint of anger or emotional outburst that even the graphic novel on which it is based contains more genuine human passion.

The story centers on Cliff Secord (Bill Campbell), a hotshot racing pilot. He and his mentor Peevy (Alan Arkin) have completed work on their single-seat entry for an air race, and Cliff is giving it a test run. He spots a car chase in progress and dips low to get a better look.

His presence, however, is apparently not welcome and his plane is machine-gunned. Cliff makes an emergency landing at the air strip. Their plane destroyed, Cliff and Peevy realize they will have to resort to clown flights to pay their landlord.

While checking out a plane to be used for stunt flying, they discover what turns out to be a rocket backpack. While still learning how to handle it, Cliff dons the device to rescue a friend from a plane about to go down during an air show, and the *Rocketeer* is born.

Unfortunately, the media's hyping of the flying man draws the attention of the FBI, the Mafia and the Nazis, all of them deter-

mined to get their hands on the device. A suave British actor, Neville Sinclair (Timothy Dalton), discovers Cliff has the rocket. Neville is also a Nazi agent trying to secure the device. So he seduces and then kidnaps Cliff's great love, aspiring actress Jenny Blake (Jennifer Connelly).

The excitement here is in the flight sequences. We feel a pulsing sensation as Cliff zooms through the sky, but unfortunately there's nowhere near enough of this kind of thing. Outside of these brief moments, the plot is listless, and just as lacking in originality as the comic book on which it is based.

The acting and direction are as thoroughly uninspired as the story itself, but despite all this the film retains an attraction as innocent fun. Sure, we all know that Cliff will rescue Jenny and the bad guy will get his proper comeuppance, but that is part of the movie's charm. This isn't film as art; it's film as pure entertainment, and that it does well enough. ★★

**R**obin Hood: *Prince of Thieves*. Bringing a legendary story to the screen is never easy. The filmmakers must contend with the inevitable comparisons with the original folklore, and the movie itself must compare favorably with any previous celluloid attempts. In the case of Kevin Costner's latest starring role, the result is a mixed bag. In some respects, *Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves* is far and away a better film than was the enormously popular Errol Flynn version of 1938.

The depression-era movie was created by Hollywood moguls eager to help a disenfranchised populace escape from the grim realities of the time. The story was squeaky clean and the line between good and evil was clearly defined.

In 1991, we have, fortunately, evolved into a more worldly society. Life comes in myriad shades of gray, and this is reflected in the new film. Robin Hood's motivation and methods are both under question here, and he expresses doubts about the path he has chosen for the ragtag mob of petty outlaws.

Further, a historical realism has been added. This is medieval England in all its barbarism—life was dirty, and even feudal lords led their lives both slovenly and unkempt.

Thus, the 1991 version more accurately portrays human frailties and the living conditions of the period. For thrills and ad-

venture, however, it's clearly a draw; both movies feature rousing sequences that will have you cheering for the good guys and hissing at the bad ones. Even here, however, *Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves* gets points because it benefits from the latest special effects wizardry—you'll feel the rush as you ride a flaming arrow straight to its target.

It's with adherence to the traditional legend that the new *Robin Hood* disappoints. A literal recap of the legend, of course, was not necessary as was the addition of a new character. A Moor by the name of Akeem (Morgan Freeman) is a major player in this version of the tale, but his value to the plot is virtually nil. Akeem's character does provide an opportunity for some interesting comparisons between Eastern and Western culture, but otherwise he serves only as comic relief. Nearly all of his lines are dry humor.

The comic overcoating is even more pronounced in the character of the Sheriff of Nottingham (Alan Rickman). Although he starts out sinister enough, his words and expressions quickly deteriorate into insipid, albeit laughable, farce, and his very presence on the screen becomes an occa-

sion to smile in anticipation of the next chuckle.

The performances by Costner, Freeman and Rickman are all good enough, as is that of Mary Elizabeth Mastrantonio as a coy and clever Marian. Christian Salter shows some promise as the young and volatile Will Scarlett, while Michael Wincott does relatively well as a moronic Guy of Gisborne.

*Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves* at times approaches excellence, but a Pen Densham story gone astray and lackluster directing by Kevin Reynolds make this a run-of-the-mill film. ★★

**T**erminator 2: Judgment Day. Hollywood's most expensive movie ever has hit the local screens, and it most certainly will cover its costs and go on to become one of the biggest box-office smashes ever.

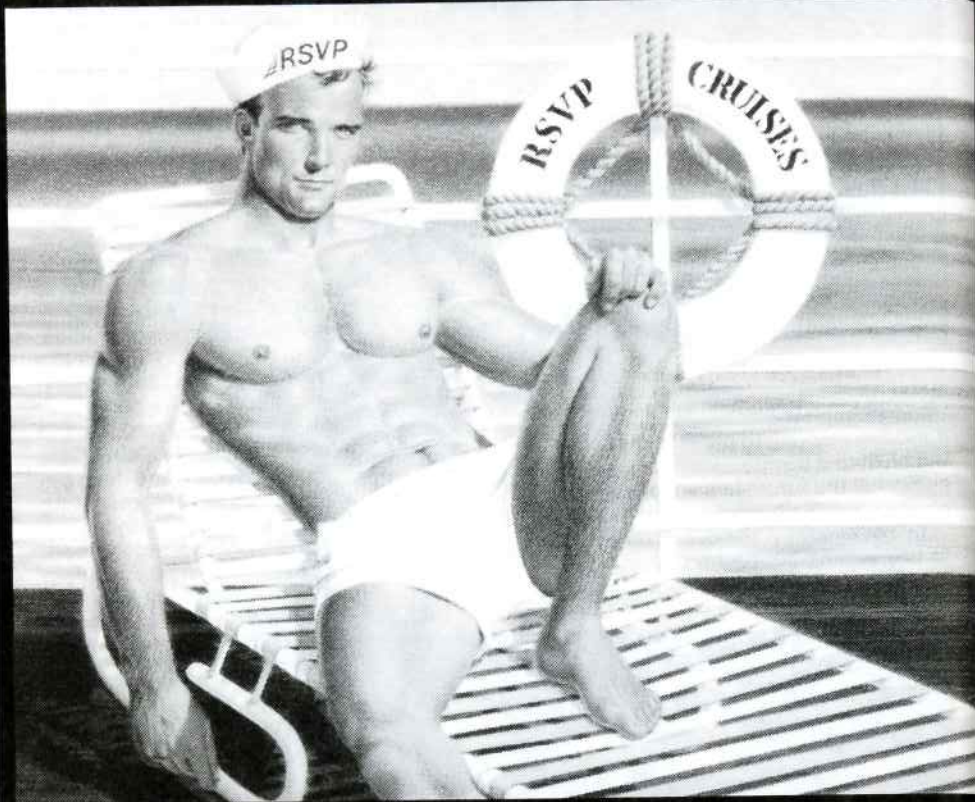
nation's energy policy, and the bad guys will stop at nothing to prevent Meinheimer from delivering his report.

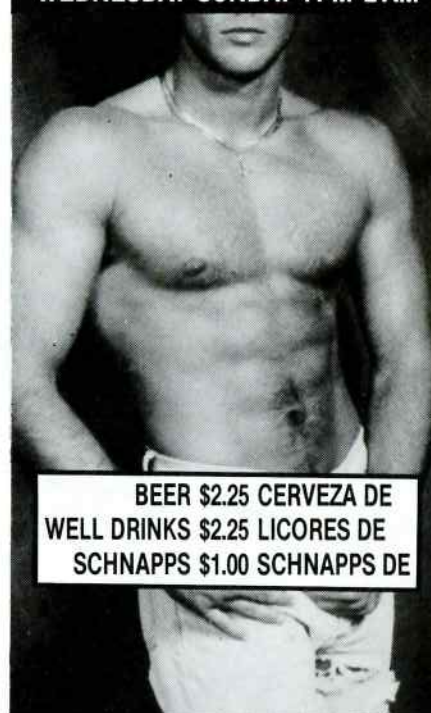

"I love Dallas, the trees, the open spaces and the friendly people," Jason said. "Visiting LA will always be fun, but I want to call Dallas home."

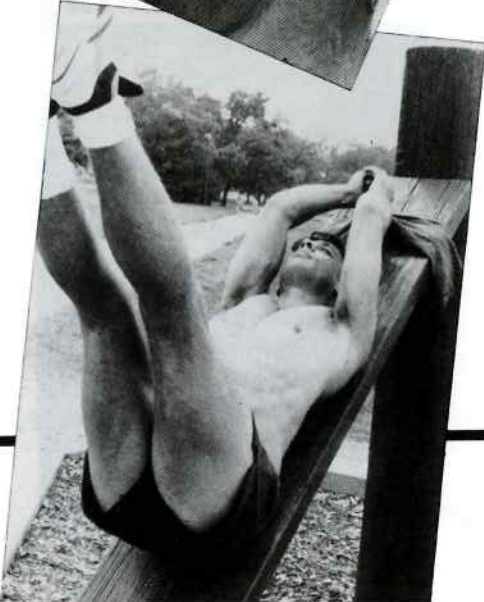
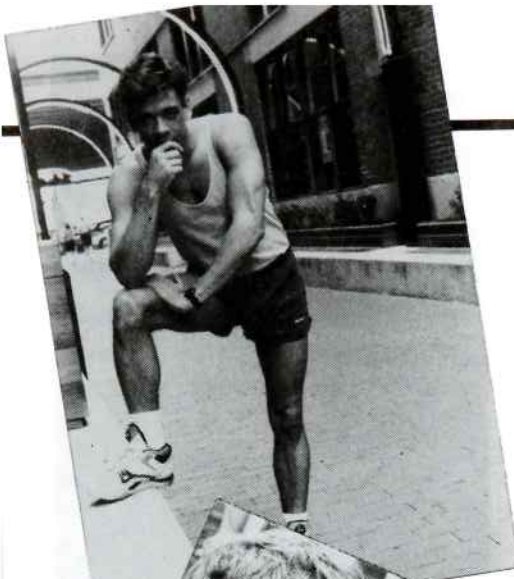
Jason received his BA degree in psychology from the University of New Mexico, and plans to pursue an MA in counseling. Tending or managing bars has kept him busy in the past.
