





DALLAS — The Dallas Dinner Committee has announced plans for this year's Black Tie Dinner, presented by the 22 hosts of the 1991 Black Tie Dinner Committee.

The banquet, which has seen phenomenal growth in attendance in recent years, will be held this year on Saturday, September 14, at the Loew's Anatole Hotel.

Heading the list of speakers at this year's affair will be Congressman Barney Frank of Massachusetts, one of only two openly-gay members of the U.S. House of Representatives.

There will also be dancing, a silent auction, a raffle for a trip to Nassau, and a performance by Turtle Creek Chorale, Dallas' gay all-male chorus.

Dallas Dinner Committee board member Dick Weaver told TWT NEWS about something new at this year's festivities: a multimedia presentation exploring the growth of the Dallas gay and lesbian community over the past ten years. "A lot of gays, especially younger people, assume that the services and organizations we enjoy today have always been here. This presentation will show just how far the Dallas community has come."

As in past years, \$50 out of the price of each ticket covers expenses, \$50 goes to the Human Rights Campaign Fund in Washington, D.C. and the remaining \$50 goes to a charity of the purchaser's choice.

HOUSTON CITY COUNCIL PASSES HATE CRIMES RESOLUTION

*Statement Calls on Governor to
Add Legislation to Schedule of
Current Special Session.*

HOUSTON — City Council issued a resolution on July 17 deploring hate-motivated crimes and calling on the state Legislature to consider passage of a hate crimes bill.

The resolution comes in the wake of community anger over the July 4 attack on three gay men in the Montrose area, one of whom, Paul Broussard, died as a result of his injuries.

Many in the gay community have been outraged at what they see as the slowness of elected officials to condemn hate crimes and address the issue of remedies.

The resolution calls on Governor Ann Richards to add consideration of hate crimes legislation to the agenda for the current special session, or to any future special sessions.

One problem with that request is that a special session of the state Legislature normally deals only with what the Governor has placed "on call"—i.e., on the agenda—for that session, and the only three issues scheduled for discussion in this session are government reorganization, the state budget and revenue.

Unless and until these three issues are dealt with, no other matter, including hate

crimes, is likely to be addressed in this special session.

One hate crimes bill before the Legislature, House Bill 52, co-sponsored by Reps. Paul Colbert and Debra Danburg, both of Houston, calls for improved collection of information on hate crimes and for the strengthening of penalties to be imposed on those who commit such crimes. The Houston City Council Resolution specifically calls for the passage of HB 52.

SAAF WINS CLAIMS DISCRIMINATION CASE

DHHS, State Rehabilitation Commission Agree to Make Changes Expediting AIDS Cases.

SAN ANTONIO — The San Antonio AIDS Foundation [SAAF] has obtained a Voluntary Compliance Agreement from the Office of Civil Rights [OCR] of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services [DHHS] in response to a complaint of discrimination against HIV-infected persons by the Disability Determination Services department of the Texas Rehabilitation Commission.

In late 1989, SAAF staff members learned that people filing Social Security Disability and Supplemental Security Income claims were facing what appeared to be discriminatory delays in obtaining benefits.

On February 9, 1990, SAAF filed a complaint on behalf of a client documenting this abuse under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, which prohibits discrimination against the Texas Rehabilitation Commission because the Commission processes SSDI and SSI claims in Texas.

On November 16 of last year, the San Antonio AIDS Foundation filed a supplementary complaint recording specific instances of delays experienced by 56 other people. The agreement resolving the complaints calls for the agencies involved to make certain changes aimed at speeding up and improving the processing of AIDS claims.

The changes include the immediate creation of a "Program Operations Unit" to handle specialized types of cases to include HIV/AIDS claims, and the establish-

ment of a State Agency Medical Consultant staff to review denied claims and publish a new Personal Denial notice, taking into account variables and enhanced sensitivity.

Other changes include the creation of an AIDS Coordinator position to provide public relations and community outreach services and a strong effort by the agencies to create closer working relationships with support groups and organizations within Texas providing services for HIV-infected people.

The agencies also agreed to conduct specialized training to the AIDS unit on HIV infection and its clinical symptoms, and to make good faith efforts to employ medical practitioners who have clinical experience in diagnosing and treating people with AIDS and symptomatic HIV infection as consulting physicians.

In addition to the specific changes mandated, the agreement provides for detailed documentation of the changes and mechanisms to measure their success.


SAAF Executive Director Papa Bear told TWT NEWS, "The San Antonio AIDS Foundation considers this action a major success in its continuing effort to champion the rights of disabled people."

'HELPING HANDS' MASSAGE PROGRAM IN AUSTIN

Austin Immune Health Clinic To Provide Therapy to PWAs, Others Touched by AIDS.

AUSTIN — The Austin Immune Health Clinic has announced the startup of a new massage program called Helping Hands. The program will provide massages at reduced rates to PWAs and others affected by AIDS.

An hour-long massage normally costs at least \$40, while "Helping Hands" will provide complete massages by licensed massage therapists for only \$20. Matt Lyons, coordinator of the Helping Hands program, told TWT NEWS, "Proceeds from the program go directly to the Clinic, so when you get a massage, you feel relaxed and can feel good for helping out the Clinic, too."

Massages are available from 1:30 to 5:30 p.m. each Thursday at the Clinic, located at 502 Oakland. Eligibility extends to those of either sex with AIDS or HIV infection, as well as to friends, roommates, family and those who work with PWAs. Reservations are required and may be obtained by calling the Clinic at (512)472-2753. Sponsorships are available for clients with HIV and AIDS who cannot afford the fee.

The Austin Immune Health Clinic was established in January of 1988 by people who shared a belief that more could be done to prolong life, alleviate opportunistic infections and remove the stress associated with HIV and AIDS through their personal involvement in the development of a holistic health care system.

The "life-affirming" therapies offered by the clinic complement the treatments and physicians' suggestions provide a means of implementing lifestyle changes mandated by the AIDS epidemic.

In addition to massage therapy, the Austin Immune Health Clinic offers peer counseling, acupuncture, chiropractic care and nutritional counseling.

HOUSTON'S MCCR CREATES NONPROFIT SERVICE FOUNDATION

Grants Sought as Transportation Service, Meals On Wheels & Other Services Being Considered.

HOUSTON — Leaders of Metropolitan Community Church of the Resurrection [MCCR] announced last week that they are

filing with the State of Texas to incorporate a nonprofit foundation called Metropolitan Community Charities Foundation [MCCF] of Houston, Inc.

Church organizers explained that the proposed foundation will seek to serve the Houston community through expanding ministries at MCCR as well as beginning new programs to address specific needs in the community. MCCF of Houston will be the first foundation of its kind to be formed within the United Federation of Metropolitan Community Churches, the worldwide denomination to which MCCR belongs.

MCCR launched a study of the feasibility of such a foundation nine months ago as an offshoot of the church's successful Capital Gifts Campaign. Members of the church's Grants Committee discovered that only by forming an independent, nonprofit 501(c)(3) foundation could the congregation hope to fund the services it was interested in offering.

Grants Committee Chairperson Jeff Nytych told TWT NEWS, "The foundation does not wish to compete with existing services or organizations, but rather address needs not currently being met elsewhere.


A variety of possible services are currently being considered, among them a transportation service and a Meals on Wheels program. Nytych said the committee was seeking input from the community to identify the greatest needs. Committee members hope to obtain their first grant and begin serving the community by next year.

Thomas explained that various clinic programs had originally been expected to break even when, in fact, they were operating in the red. He said that part of the problem has arisen from the fact that those who have been guiding the Center did not have medical backgrounds.

Thomas cited as an example the fact that numerous people have been receiving aerosol pentamidine treatments at the clinic even before they had tried other medications. In the future, specific guidelines will have to be met before a patient can receive certain treatments at the clinic.

The new advisory committee will be comprised of three physicians, Brady Allen, Nick Bellos and one as yet unnamed; Don Hylan, a dentist; Wayne Falcone, a pharmacist; Robert Dain, psychologist; Sue Gibson, R.N.; DGA board members Bruce Monroe, Chris Ivits and Rose Padilla; and two people from the HIV-infected community, Larry Rigsby and another person as yet unchosen.

Thomas said that the "Keeping It Up" committee would offer special safer sex seminars starting this month at the Club Body Center. They will be held once a month, on a Wednesday night, when Club Body Center has a \$5 locker special.

Thomas admitted that he is still undecided about a possible run for a Dallas City Council seat. Such a campaign was one of the main issues discussed at a recent DGA board retreat, including what the board should expect and prepare for if Thomas decides to run. He said that he plans to meet with various political figures in both the straight and gay communities to seek their advice.

Once the filing and election dates have been set, Thomas said he will be ready to make his announcement.

AUSTIN SUPPORT GROUP FOR FAMILIES AFFECTED BY HIV

Austin Health & Human Services Dept., AIDS Services of Austin Co-Sponsor Free Sessions.

AUSTIN — The HIV Service Unit of the City of Austin Health and Human Services Department, in conjunction with AIDS Ser-

vices of Austin [ASA], is again offering a support group for families with members affected by AIDS or HIV infection.

Lois VanLaningham, MSW-CSW, explained to TWT NEWS, "When a family first learns that a loved one has been touched by HIV, they experience a multitude of emotions. Anger, shock, disbelief, helplessness, panic and guilt are common to family members."

"The stigma associated with HIV disease often results in family/social isolation," She continued. "Many family members do not have anyone or do not know others who are also experiencing similar feelings. Knowing that others share your feelings makes them less frightening. This support group offers a safe place in which open sharing, comfort, support and assistance can occur."

The Family Support Group will begin August 8 and run through September 26 from 5:30 p.m. to 7 p.m. Facilitators are VanLaningham and Michelle Martin, MSSW-CSW. The group is free of charge, and will be conducted on a confidential basis.

DALLAS LESBIANS ADDRESS VIOLENCE IN RELATIONSHIPS


Support Groups for Battered and Battering Lesbians Formed by Lesbian Resource Centre.



12 and 26. Victoria Hellman and Marti Kranzberg will facilitate a Saturday support group for battering lesbians from 10 a.m. until noon on August 17 and 31 and on September 7 and 21.

The Lesbian Resource Centre will serve as a referral service for the project. LRC recently installed a WATS "Hotline" specifically to reach lesbians outside the Metroplex. The top priority at this point will be to refer lesbians who are involved in battering relationships to therapists who have offer their services on a sliding-scale basis. The hotline, 1-800-766-DYKE, went into effect June 28.

The support groups are scheduled to run on a three-month trial basis to assess community need. The first sessions were held in early July. The long-term goal of the project is the establishment of a permanent shelter and ongoing support groups.



Stupidity = Death

Dear TWT:

It was with great regret and sadness that I read the account of the death of Paul Broussard, who was attacked by a group of people out gay-bashing. It was with even more regret that I realized that if the three men had used common sense, Mr. Broussard would be alive today.

Everyone has to realize that in today's world, no matter what your sexual preference is, you simply do not walk around the streets late at night. I have several straight friends who have been robbed this month by a group of Hispanic men who like to cruise up in a car, jump out, rob their victim and then drive away.

In every single case, my friends were careless enough to be walking down the street, late at night, carrying a bag of groceries from the nearby convenience store and they left themselves wide open.

These robberies have taken place over a period of a month. Everyone knows they are going on, but they still walk two blocks to the store and back again at all hours of the night. It is hard to feel compassion for someone who does not take an ounce of prevention.

It is my hope that our community will take the tragic example of Mr. Broussard's death to stop and think before they do something stupid in the future. It is so simple. If you have several people in one car and it is several blocks away, then call a cab and let the cab take one person to the car and he can come back and get the rest. Or, if possible, get a ride for one person from someone at the bar and bring the car back. I am sure Mr. Broussard and his friends would have gladly paid the \$3 or \$4 dollars fare to go four blocks in the wee hours of the morning had they known what was coming.

Secondly, if you are caught on the street for some reason and you see a car approaching, step back from the sidewalk behind a bush if one is near, or act like

you live at the house you are in front of and walk up to the front door getting out your keys. If the car looks as if it is stopping where you are, then knock on the door of the house for help or at least run away.

Don't ever approach a stopped car late at night—I don't care if they look like the neeliest queens you have ever seen. You mother always told you never talk to strangers, and there is a reason for that. If the three men attacked had ducked behind a house when they saw the car coming up the street, they might have avoided their attack.

Another thing to keep in mind is that if someone asks you directions to a gay bar, tell them you have not heard of the place and don't know where it is, or act surprised and tell them you really don't think they want to stop there because it is a gay bar...etc. If you give someone directions and tell them the bar is now closed, it is pretty obvious you have been there if you know where it is and the hours of operation.

Remember, you may have to think fast in such a situation and if you are confronted, what you say may determine your fate. I would gladly tell someone I was not gay if it meant getting away with my life, my friend.

So it all boils down to being careful. If you walk the streets after a night of drinking at a club and give out directions to a gay bar to anyone who drives up, then you are asking for what you get, but if you use common sense and park close to the bar, or get a ride to your car to return and pick up the rest of your friends so they don't have to walk through the streets, you will be a lot safer.

Straight or gay, in today's world, you have to take extra precautions when out at night or you will become a victim. It's that simple.

Gays Are Cultural Group

Dear TWT:

In response to Kevin Walter's comments ["Gays Not Ethnic or Cultural Group," Vol. 17, No. 17]: Ethnicity is related to genetic or physical characteristics of a group of people. We protect the rights of races and ethnic groups because their color and physical characteristics are inherited at conception. We protect the rights of both genders because sex is inherited at conception. We protect the rights of handicapped persons because the handicap is either inherited or caused by disease or injury and cannot be undone.

Our society protects the rights and supports in regard to the choice of a marriage partner and the right to privacy due to a concept extrapolated from the Declaration of Independence: "The pursuit of happiness." This protects choice, not inherited characteristics. This is a cultural choice.

The government protects freedom of religion, because our country was founded on the "right" to choose how one worships. This protects a cultural choice, not inherited characteristics.

There is a large body of scientific evidence that sexual orientation is either genetically transmitted or acquired from some action in the birth process. This concept is covered by the protections in the first paragraph of this letter. The other two paragraphs illustrate that our laws protect the choices of some citizens based on a specific ethic: Judeo-Christian values as interpreted by one segment of religious leaders and the political convictions of a group of judges.

It would seem rational that sexual orientation should be afforded the same protections, as it seems to be an unchangeable characteristic (as defined by the scientific community), or a choice that causes serious emotional damage if denied. Indeed, gay people are a cultural group, and deserving protection in their "pursuit of happiness."

Furthermore, the opinions of a specific religious group should not be allowed to

deny gay people their rights. Religious freedom is not the freedom to hurt one group with the opinions of another. That was tried for many centuries as a reason to deny rights to blacks (and women). Yes, the religious leaders of the 18th century and earlier found in the Bible that blacks (and women) were not really equal to white men.

Thus, our laws protect more choices of cultural groups than they do inherited or unchangeable characteristics. Yet the reason given to deny gay people their rights to the pursuit of happiness under the equal protection of the law is that sexual orientation is a choice for gay people, but the inborn propensity of heterosexual people. Somehow the logic escapes me.

Judicial Misconduct?

The following letter concerns recent anti-gay remarks made by U.S. District Judge Sam B. Hall, who referred to inmates in the Jefferson County jail as "a bunch of queers" while he was in court presiding over a civil rights case.—Editor

Please consider this letter, pursuant to the provisions of the Judicial Councils Reform and Judicial Conduct and Disability Act of 1980, 28 U.S.C. §§ 331, 332, 372(c) and 604, as a complaint alleging judicial misconduct by Sam B. Hall, Jr., a judge of the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Texas, Beaumont Division.

During the trial of a civil jury case on Tuesday, July 9, 1991, in the presence of the jury, counsel and the parties, Judge Hall referred to certain inmates in the Jefferson County jail in Beaumont as "a bunch of queers." The remark was reported in the news media, including two Houston newspapers. Copies of the articles are enclosed.

Judge Hall's misbehavior constitutes "conduct prejudicial to the effective and expeditious administration of the business

of the courts," within the meaning of 28 U.S.C. § 372(c)(1), is not a matter "directly related to the merits of a decision or procedural ruling" within the meaning of 28 U.S.C. § 372(c)(3)(A), *In re Charge of Judicial Misconduct*, 685 F.2d 1226 (9 Cir. 1982), and is deserving of public censure or reprimand, as authorized by 28 U.S.C. § 372(c)(6)(B)(vi).

We ask that you refer this matter immediately to Chief Judge Clark, in accordance with the provisions of the Act. Because we believe our complaint deserves immediate consideration and resolution, we are sending copies of this letter and its enclosures directly to Judge Clark and Judge Hall by Federal Express.



whether or not the other person is someone we want to sleep with), until unity and pride are practiced 365 days a year, there will always be great dissension in our lives, and we will certainly not have the respect or recognition from those outside of our lifestyle when we are unable to accept each other.

You endanger yourselves and others. You should seek immediate professional help.

PWAs are human and should be so treated. They should be treated in a positive manner. They should not be judged or treated as outcasts. They are our friends, our lovers, our family. People who abandon PWAs sicken me and also need immediate professional help.

We are all in the same boat. We are all at risk. No one is exempt and no one is superior. A true human being is made of a heart, a soul, emotions, personality and vital internal organs. A suntan and dick are only extras. Try to be a real man (or woman).

I am not perfect, but I truly care about people. I am attempting to learn as much about AIDS as possible. AIDS hasn't made our lifestyle unenjoyable, it only curtails sex.

CAPITAL REPORT

Once again members of the gay and lesbian community have fallen victim to hate-related crimes. For those of you who have not heard, in the Montrose area of Houston on July 4, three gay men were attacked by a group of high school or college-age men armed with nail-studded two-by-fours. One of the gay men, Paul Broussard, was killed in the attack.

The gay and lesbian community is not the only community in this state affected by hate-related crimes. In the Dallas-Fort Worth area, the Jewish community and the black community have been subjected to hate-related killings, cross burnings and graffiti.

This problem is not limited to Texas. The Southern Poverty Law Center reports that on a national level, 1990 was the bloodiest year in recent history for hate-related crimes. Indeed, in these days of rabid patriotism, intolerance of difference, a stagnant economy and increasing numbers of hate crimes, it sometimes seems that the fascists in our society may win some important battles. We must not allow this to happen. We must educate. We must legislate. And most importantly, we must fight back.

A variety of responses are needed to combat hate-related crimes. In Houston there have been empowering marches that have raised consciousness, educated people and brought media attention. At the legislative level, hate crimes acts have been the primary response to an increase in hate-related violence.

Hate crimes acts usually accomplish one or two different things. The Federal Hate Crimes Act is primarily a statistics act, i.e., it mandates the gathering of hate crime statistics by local law enforcement agencies. Funding for this act has not yet reached Texas.

The hate crimes bills which have been introduced in the Texas Legislature during the last two sessions are both statistics acts and penalty enhancement acts. Similarly, HB 52, the hate crimes bill sponsored by Reps. Paul Colbert and Debra Danburg that has been introduced for the special session, also addresses penalty enhancement and statistics.

Unlike most previous hate crimes bills, HB 52 employs very general language protecting "disfavored groups" from hate-related crimes. A more specific act would be better, but in the past, hate crimes bills that specifically mentioned sexual orientation have always failed in the Texas Legislature. If HB 52 passes, then the gay and lesbian community can request an Attorney General's opinion that defines gay and lesbian people as a "traditionally disfavored group." We can also ask Rep. Glenn Maxey to read "protection of gay and lesbian people" into the legislative intent of the bill.

The problem with HB 52 is that the Legislature is in a special session and not a regular session. Issues discussed in the special session are limited to what the

Governor places on call for the session. In her State of the State speech, Governor Ann Richards said that legislators must address government reorganization, the budget and revenue. Until these three big issues are covered, nothing else will be placed on call for the special session.

Despite these restrictions, it is my belief, and the belief of several legislators, that with enough grass-roots support from the gay and lesbian community, HB 52 will be placed on call for this session or some special session in the near future.

We must educate,
we must legislate...
we must fight back.

This is what you need to do. Write Governor Richards and ask that HB 52 be placed on the call for the special session. Also, write Lt. Governor Bob Bullock and ask for his support. He does not control what is on the call for the special session, but we will need his help to get this bill through the Senate.

The tone of your letters should *not* be harsh. In the last legislative session, Bullock and Richards were extremely supportive of our community. Bullock in particular is a hero for having blocked HB 702, a mandatory medical AIDS testing bill.

In your letters, simply state that you support hate crimes legislation like HB 52, and that you wish to see hate crimes placed on call for the special session. State that the murder in Houston demonstrates a need for this legislation to protect gay and lesbian people.

Because of legislative strategy, *do not* write or call your legislators unless you are fairly certain that they are supportive of gay and lesbian rights. Governor Richards' address is State Capitol Room 200, Austin, TX 78701. The phone number is (512) 463-2000. Bob Bullock's address is Room 219, Capitol Bldg., Austin, TX 78701. 

FEDERAL AIDS

In April of 1989, Dutch AIDS educator Hans Paul Verhoef, on his way to an AIDS conference in San Francisco, was detained by the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), an arm of the Department of Justice, after they found AZT in his luggage. As a result of legal action brought by the conference organizers, Verhoef was released and permitted to join the meeting, just as it was ending.

In June, 1990, the Sixth International Conference on AIDS in San Francisco was boycotted by the International Red Cross, the British Medical Association, the European Parliament and over 70 AIDS, medical and other organizations in protest of the official ban on HIV-positive travelers to the United States.

As a result of these experiences, Harvard University, the organizer of the May, 1992 Eighth International Conference on AIDS, announced that the institution will

revoke its sponsorship of the Conference unless people with AIDS are allowed to enter the United States to attend.

Earlier this year, the Centers for Disease Control proposed that only active tuberculosis remain on the list of medical conditions that prevent visitors and immigrants from coming to this country. (In June of 1987, President Reagan added AIDS to an already obsolete list of sexually transmitted diseases and the next month Congress approved the "Helms amendment," which included HIV.)

During the 30-day public comment period after this proposed ruling, right-wing religious leaders generated 35,000 letters, telegrams and postcards calling for the continued exclusion of travelers with AIDS or HIV infection from visiting or immigrating to the United States.

As a result of this and other controversies, an interim rule was put into effect on June 1 of this year, and public comment

will be heard for at least 60 more days. The consequences of not repealing this interim rule would affect not only those who seek to enter this country, but those applicants under the Immigration Amnesty Program who have lived here for at least nine years and are HIV-positive. Even though their tenure makes it almost certain that they became infected during their stay, their HIV-positivity makes them automatically deportable.

Without an outpouring of public demand to remove HIV from the blacklist of exclusionary conditions, the United States Public Health Service will be reluctant to endorse the Centers for Disease Control's position, even though it is unanimously supported by medical and public health experts.

The American Medical Association, for instance, has historically opposed all restrictions, of HIV infected immigration to the United States, despite the misrepresentation of the Republican Study Committee, which claims that the AMA has caved in to the committee's pressure.

For one decade, people living with AIDS and their dedicated volunteers, care-givers, families and sympathizers have faced overwhelming hostility.

Technically, the Justice Department cannot impose restrictions on travel. The Immigration Reform Act of 1990 explicitly designates the Department of Health and Human Services as the sole authority to determine who is and isn't fit to enter the United States. The so-called Justice Department has effectively overruled HHS through its own political clout. If, however, HHS does not acquiesce and if President Bush is unwilling to order the department to remove HIV as an excluding disease, the Justice Department might still accomplish its mission by adding a separate list to the "physical and mental disorders" section, an area in which the department does have a legally mandated role in developing regulations.

Ten years after its discovery, AIDS has

killed more than 100,000 Americans and endangers the lives of two million more. For one decade, people living with AIDS and their dedicated volunteers, care-givers, families and sympathizers have faced overwhelming hostility. Both personal and "official" persecution reign, notably in the use of our own government's policies and powers in antagonistic ways.

This is evident in the actions of the Justice Department, which lately has muscled its way into the AIDS issue to sabotage reforms that are lauded by public health experts around the world. If the diagnosis were cancer, heart disease or diabetes, it would be inconceivable that a nonmedical federal agency, without any of its own or borrowed expertise, would arbitrarily try to impose its agenda on the entire world.

We must organize now to prevent this travesty from interfering with the Eighth International Conference on AIDS, from exploiting persons who seek asylum here or those who seek to travel unencumbered. We must write letters demanding that HIV disease be deleted from the blacklist that governs immigration and travel. Anyone can write expressing their view; anyone can organize a letter writing campaign. If a group of ten people write five letters to different officials, then that one effort can affect public policy.

To be counted most heavily, your handwritten correspondence should be received by August 2, 1991. Write to: Director, Division of Quarantine, Center for Prevention Services, CDC, Mail Stop E-04, Atlanta, Georgia 30333, include in your letter your name, address and signature. Clearly indicate that you are insisting that PWAs not be excluded from visiting or immigrating to this country based on their HIV status.

Also write to: The Honorable Roger Porter, Assistant to the President for Economic and Domestic Policy, the White House, Washington, DC 20500; to Attorney General Dick Thornburgh, Department of Justice, 10th Street and Constitution Avenue, NW, Washington, DC 20530; and to Louis Sullivan, M.D., Department of Health and Human Services, 200 Independence Avenue, SW, Washington, DC 20201.

You should also write to your own U.S. Representatives and both Senators at their local offices or at their Washington addresses. Call your local League of Women Voters for more information.

In the aftermath of the brutal killing of Paul Broussard, two points beg for a closer examination. The first is why anyone would question the killing being labeled a “hate crime.” The second is how the media reported this tragic story of a homophobic murder.

These examinations say important things about the progress—or lack of it—in crushing homophobia and gaining respect and equality.

Last year the National Gay & Lesbian Task Force identified more than 8,000 hate crimes against gays and lesbians in the United States.

Ten young men drove more than 50 miles from suburban homes into the heart of the gayest area in Houston late on a holiday evening armed with home-styled weapons made of two-by-fours with protruding nails. The first carload selected the victims, and asked a qualifying question to determine if the pedestrians were gay. A second car of similarly-armed young men then cornered the likely victims. Both cars unloaded and beat the tar out of the innocent pedestrians, savagely killing one.

The gay pedestrians had no connection with these Woodlands-bred high-schoolers.

How could anyone deny this murder was motivated by hate and bigotry against a randomly selected group of gay men? That some Houston politicians and police officials at first withheld the “hate crimes” label was a laughable absurdity that made them all look stupid, especially within the gay and lesbian community, and especially now that FBI Director William Webster personally ordered an investigation.

Last year the National Gay & Lesbian Task Force identified more than 8,000 hate crimes against gays and lesbians in the United States. Mercifully, not all were murders; not all were this brutal, disgusting and senseless.

We can feel optimism from the way the media handled the story. Remember, this was less than two weeks after the grand, glorious exaggerations of excess televised and photographed in our gay/lesbian pride parades. What we got was, for the most part, unbiased, level journalism guardedly edited so as not to reflect, project or encourage additional bigotry and hate or copycat crimes.

How and why did this suddenly happen? Thanks should go to a large handful of Houston’s gay and lesbian leaders for applying pressure behind the scenes as well as in front of cameras. They rightfully sought meaningful, unbiased coverage and follow-up from the media. They created urgency in political and police circles to replace the indifference we have all too often seen.

The *Houston Post* printed two poignant editorial cartoons, ran good hard-news stories, profiles and sympathetic columns by its editorial staff. The *Houston Chronicle* gave less space to the story, but its coverage was fair and unbiased, without sensationalizing headlines.

While it is right to protest inaction and insensitivity, you can also write to praise compassionate and factual coverage.

Television and radio reports did not foster age-old negative stereotypes, but factually reported the tragedy. Some electronic media even actively and favorably publicized the Queer Nation rally before it took place, thus encouraging attendance! Individual reporters remarked, off the record, on their own needs to evade pre-conceived notions and unconscious homophobia.

While it is right to protest inaction and insensitivity, you can also write to praise compassionate and factual coverage. Write and chastize the politicians and the police. Write and praise the reporters and editors. Write the TV or radio station from where you got the news, and ask that your letter be placed into their Public File. (You later have the right to inspect their Public File to see that they put it there. It's an FCC violation if they do not.) Watch and write about the continuing coverage of this story and the indictments and trial.

What happened in Houston can also happen in other Texas cities. The only way to defeat homophobia is to fight it! Mournfully, Paul Broussard and his friends were hopelessly outnumbered and underarmed.




Blue Heaven, by Joe Keenan; fiction, 279 pp.; Penguin Books, 40 West 23rd Street, New York, NY 10010; softcover, \$7.95.

Since the age of 12, I've been enamored of Hollywood's greatest gift to mankind, the camp film. No, this genre is not new—good God, just look at *any* silent film and you'll realize that profoundly pathetic and summarily sappy cinema has delighted audiences since that first inch of celluloid was illuminated by the faintest of light bulbs. We all have our favorites—current ones include *Tootsie* and *Torch Song Trilogy*.

While films have always been looked upon as a shopper's paradise for camp, rarely have those of us who prefer Coleman products ever been able to derive camp pleasure from printed prose—until now! For on that proverbial literary horizon looms an author with a talent so great, an imagination so fertile (and a camp closet worthy of a state park) that I literally shake in awe and turn green with envy as I realize just what a bright future this young man really has.

At the tender young age of 29, you see, Joe Keenan has produced a work that is rich in texture and will, in time, become *the* handbook of gay quips and quotes, despite the fact that I don't even think that this is what he set out to do.

The book that has so captured my fancy is *Blue Heaven*, Keenan's premiere novel. It is a *Travels-with-my-Aunt* style novel documenting a "geelcan'tbelieveitall-startedoutsoinnocently" scam that beckons its readers to "comealongfortheride"—a scam contrived by some of the most colorful characters to be brought to life by an Olivetti.

Characters like the perpetrators of New York's greatest deception, Gilbert and Moira, possibly the most unlikely couple ever to take a blood test. Unlikely, you see,

because Gilbert is gay and Moira is a woman he detests so much that you'd think she made him that way.

But these two reluctant lovebirds are willing to put aside their differences and enter into the holy state of matrimony for all that wedded bliss has to offer: companionship, security and, best of all, wedding gifts. Lots of them. Possibly even thousands of dollars worth because, as luck would have it, both Gilbert and Moira come from blue-blooded families who, as tradition dictates, shower their precious children with all the benefits of their years of hard labor. Well, isn't that what you'd call Don Cellini's "family" meat-packing business and casino operations and Gwen Finch's efforts to land the Duke of Dorsetshire?

With such powerful relatives to support them, you'd think dear Gilbert and Moira would have no need to enlist the help of any of their multitudes of friends to accomplish the Herculean task of "pulling this one off." Au contraire. Gilbert, after all, needs Phillip, one of his gay friends—and former paramours—to keep his legions of lovers off his newly straightened scent, while Moira, bless her heart, needs Vulpina, her dressmaker and close confidante, to foster the rumor that there is, in fact, a Duchess of Dorsetshire.

Sound confusing? Not at all. Here's the dirt:

Gilbert, a down-and-out writer wannabe, needs a date to his cousin's wedding, so he invites Moira, who he hates, but he's desperate and she, like Gilbert, is so impressed with the multitude of gifts given to the blushing bride and her comely groom that they decide to get married and be supported in the manner to which they would like to become accustomed, so the plans are set but then Moira drops a bomb on Gilbert—the Duke and Duchess are broke and can't pay for a thing—and everything is almost ruined until Moira comes up with the brilliant idea to have Gilbert's family—who just happen to be mafiosi—pay for everything and then be reimbursed by the Duchess who has suffered a horrible riding accident and won't

arrive in the United States until just before the wedding—not two months in advance as she had earlier planned—when she will meet Phillip, Gilbert's best man and on-again-off-again lover, and Claire, Phillip's very-dear-friend who attempts to extricate Phillip from this scheme before it's too late.

WHEW!!!

In the midst of all this, we discover that Moira has been lying and that she doesn't have a mother who's a Duchess, but she does have a "working" relationship with Freddy "the Pooch" Bombelli, the god-father of the clan, who believes that Gilbert is reformed so it's okay that he used to be gay but then, Gunther, the neo-Nazi hairdresser, threatens to expose his sexual proclivities but then it's not really Gunther,

it's Moira who's just convinced her investment banker who's not really an investment banker but an inventor to portray her mummy the Duchess so that the Cellini and Bombelli families don't get suspicious...

There, there, I'm simply exhausted...

With quips like "off-Broadway's answer to Valium" and quotes like "His yearbook picture was an aerial photo" peppering *Blue Heaven*, I, quite honestly, laughed my way right through it. At 279 fast-paced pages, it is a quick and oh-so-enjoyable read, one that I earnestly recommend, especially since, at only \$7.95 a pop, Joe Keenan—a man who I have already added to my Christmas card and invitation list, I love him that much—needs to sell a lot of copies to afford the airfare to Texas.

FINDING SATURN — Although it's the most spectacular of all our planets because of its awesome ring system, few people ever get to see it, except when pictures of it are published. But this week offers a rare opportunity for stargazers to see Saturn, up close and personal.

Last time we were heading out into the Bavarian countryside to view some of King Ludwig's creations. During his short reign (1864-1886), he managed to build several monuments which leave the beholder in awe even today.

The theory is that Ludwig, unable to completely accept his homosexuality, sought to build himself a fantasy world in remote areas. Nevertheless, we can appreciate Ludwig's efforts. The most impressive is Neuschwanstein (new swan castle), which served as the model for Walt Disney's Cinderella castle.

Ludwig's personal favorite was Linderhof, a dreamy baroque and rococo structure. After seeing Linderhof, you'll agree that only a queen could have been behind its design. Even Liberace would probably have found it a bit much.

Once outside of Munich and deeper into the Bavarian countryside, you'll be hard pressed to know which way to turn. You could go to Oberammergau, a small village famous for its Passion Play presented once every ten years.

The Bavarian-style houses with wide overhangs are dripping with colorful flowers and painted with beautiful murals depicting historical, religious and fairytale scenes (one favorite was Little Red Riding Hood). You'll hate yourself if you haven't brought a camera. You might head for Ettal and see the baroque Benedictine abbey, Kloster Ettal. You'll probably think Ludwig designed this one, too.

From Munich we head south to Salzburg, Austria, with one additional stop. Herrenchiemsee was Ludwig's final castle and his attempt to recreate Versailles. Sadly, he died under mysterious circumstances before he could finish it, but what he did finish is truly splendid. Did he drown or was it murder? We'll never know.

You saw *The Sound of Music* and you didn't believe any place could look so good. Well, believe it. Salzburg is even more beautiful close up. The city has a fairy tale quality to it, with the copper domes and belfries of the old city outlined against a backdrop of mountains with the mighty fortress-castle silhouetted against the sky.

For a wonderful panorama of the city, you can ride a funicular (a small train) to the Festung Hohensalzburg, the castle, for a small fee. The old city with its narrow streets and archways is a pedestrian zone, and it is here you'll truly feel as if you've



been transported back centuries. You'll see Mozart's birthplace, the cathedral and the Mirabell Palace and gardens. It will make you want to rent *The Sound Of Music* when you return home just so you can see it all again.

Vienna, once the glittering capital of the Hapsburg Empire and the home of many musical giants (Beethoven, Schubert and Strauss, to name a few), is now the East-West crossroads between former Communist Eastern Europe and more advanced Western Europe. It's a fabulous city with much to offer.

Like most European cities, Vienna is walkable. The inner city, encircled by the Danube River (which, by the way, is not blue), and the ring boulevards (nine in all), covers about one square mile.


A list of must-sees includes St. Stephen's Cathedral (Stephansdom) with its intricately patterned tile roof and the Hofburg, which was the winter residence of the Hapsburgs. It has 2,800 rooms, but don't worry, you aren't required to view them all. It also contains the Spanish Riding School, home of the white Lipizaner Stallions. Then there's Schonbrunn, the summer residence of the Hapsburgs, with 1,441 rooms and some very lovely grounds to stroll through. Hey, these people knew how to live, didn't they?

Reserve time for some of the Viennese cafes. Pastry eating has been elevated to a national ritual here, and just looking at all the treats will give you a sugar rush. For fun go to the Prater Amusement Park and ride the Riesenrad, perhaps the world's biggest Ferris wheel with cars the size of small mobile homes (each holds 25-30 people). The Riesenrad survived World War II bombing and was featured in the old Orson Welles movie *The Third Man* as well


as more recent James Bond films. Vienna also has a modern subway system and plentiful gay night life.

By now you've spent about ten days and are probably exhausted. You have also seen a small section of Europe up close and have memories to last a lifetime. It sounds like a lot, but it is actually easily covered. The best way to do this might be by motorcoach or chartered tour, which eliminates the annoying details of checking in and checking out, making reservations, etc. But the adventurous can still do it unescorted.

One thing to keep in mind is that these types of trips are best suited for the person who is well organized and can keep to a schedule, and who likes to rise early and be on the go all day. Some may feel this is still too much to undertake, and so in the future we will cover some individual cities like Paris and Venice, or some smaller stretches of Europe, like The Romantic Road, at a more leisurely pace.


David C. Anderson, 45, died on July 15 at St. Paul Medical Center in Dallas.
