HOUSTON VOTES AUGUST 10 ON CITY REDISTRICTING PLAN

*Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus
Making Strong Effort in Support
Of 16-6-1 Plan as Big Improvement
Over Current Council Setup.*

HOUSTON — The city votes next Saturday, August 10 on a proposed amendment to the City Charter that would change the structure of Houston City Council.

The current City Council is composed of nine council members elected from districts, five at-large council members and a mayor elected. If Proposition 35 is approved by the voters, a 16-6-1 system would replace 9-5-1, enlarging City Council to 16 council members elected from districts, six at-large council members elected citywide and a mayor elected citywide.

The original impetus for changing the structure of City Council came from the Hispanic community, which, because of explosive growth over the last decade, is now greatly underrepresented on council.

Houston gay and lesbian community leaders were disappointed earlier this year when City Council failed to consider a council redistricting plan that would have created a Montrose district.

They were especially frustrated and angered by the fact that City Council members who had been supportive of the gay and lesbian community in the past made no attempt even to bring up a Montrose district for discussion.

In a July 3 HGLPC meeting, however, the caucus passed a resolution supporting the 16-6-1 plan. The reasoning behind the decision was that the plan does provide better representation for the Hispanic and Asian communities in Houston. Also, the Montrose neighborhood will comprise about 40% of the new District C, a higher percentage than in the current District C, thus giving the Montrose bloc vote greater influence.

Caucus officials also stress the wisdom of settling the redistricting issue as quickly and fairly as possible. They point to Dallas as an example of what might happen in Houston if the matter is allowed to drag on with no end in sight. There have been no elections in Dallas for the past two



years, and the city has spent four million dollars to argue its redistricting case in court.

Caucus President Toni Knight said she believes that the caucus' endorsement of the 16-6-1 plan will carry a great deal of weight with gay and lesbian voters, and the organization is working very hard to turn out the vote.

She told TWT NEWS, "The HGLPC endorsement is important because we work for and support what we endorse, we put our time and money into the effort. We've passed out thousands of flyers, we're doing a 9,500-piece mailout, and we'll be making a very strong get-out-the-vote effort on election day. We'll also be running a phone bank. We do all this because we need all of our community's voters to support 16-6-1."

Knight also noted what appears to be an upswing in political awareness and activity in the community. "Over half of the people who have helped us with our mailout say they have never been politically active before."

Since the August 10 vote is a referendum on the structure of city government, rather than part of a presidential or mayoral race that might be expected to draw more attention, general voter turnout is expected to be rather low.

A highly motivated gay and lesbian vote may therefore prove crucial in determining the outcome of the referendum and hence the future structure of City Council.

HGLPC Vice President Robert Bridges stressed the importance of the gay and lesbian vote in ensuring the success of 16-6-1 at the polls.

"Houston's gay and lesbian community really needs to turn out at the polls on August 10 to support Prop. 35 (16-6-1) for the benefits it affords our own community, and also to say 'yes' to a better form of municipal government that will serve the needs of the city well into the next century"

"Our influence in this election could be pivotal," he concluded.

DALLAS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS TURN DOWN PLAN TO FIGHT SPREAD OF AIDS

CDC Grant Would Have Gone to Purchase of Items for Distribution To High-Risk Groups.

DALLAS — Dallas County Commissioners have turned down a plan that would have helped the fight against the spread of AIDS, even though it would not have cost them anything.

Dr. J. Randolph Farris, Director of the Dallas County Health Department, explained to Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS that the money needed to finance the plan would have come out of a \$900,000 grant from the National Centers for Disease Control.

The money was to be used to buy condoms, lubricant and other items to help prevent the spread of AIDS. The items would be distributed through county offices to those adults considered to be members of high-risk groups. The matter was brought before the County Commissioners because it was considered to be controversial, and needed their approval.

Commissioner Jim Jackson said that he feared the plan would only promote promiscuity. "You're not changing lifestyles here, you're just making it convenient. I realize principles are a little old-fashioned these days, but I'd like to think I still have a few, and I'm not going to step over them for convenience's sake."

"I think, in terms of public health, we have an obligation to do this," said commissioner John Wiley Price. He said that the prevention of the spread of AIDS was a public health issue, and not one of principles.

The funds would have been used to purchase 16,000 condoms, lubricant with spermicide, a videotape training film explaining the proper use of condoms, and matchbooks imprinted with phone numbers to dial for more information.

Dr. Farris said he would make the proposal again, probably in another two weeks, when County Judge Lee Jackson returns from vacation. Farris said he knew that AIDS was an emotional issue, and that in the meantime he would make efforts to appeal to the other commissioners.

LESBIAN AUTHOR COMING TO AUSTIN

Carolyn Weathers to Appear At Liberty Books August 9.

AUSTIN — Noted author Carolyn Weathers will be returning to her home state next Friday, August 9 for a visit to Austin's Liberty Books.

Weathers, widely recognized for her contributions to the current lesbian literary movement, has written three books, *Leaving Texas: A Memoir, Shitkickers & Other Texas Stories and Crazy*. She has also written a play, *Mouse Soup*, which was staged at Los Angeles' Celebration Theatre in 1988.

As a result of the success of *Shitkickers & Other Texas Stories*, Weathers' story about pre-Stonewall gay and lesbian life in San Antonio was reprinted in *Common Bonds: Stories About Modern Texas Women*, edited by Suzanne Comer.

Weathers is a graduate of Texas Women's University and a native Texan who moved to California in 1968. She was an early participant in the gay and lesbian rights movement. She now works as a public librarian in Los Angeles, where she lives with her companion.

Weathers is currently at work on a novel about a Texas family caught between the conventionality of their Bible Belt community and the loving bond with their two daughters, who grow up to be lesbians and very unconventional women.

Carolyn Weathers will be appearing at Liberty Books, 1014-B N. Lamar next Friday from 7:30-9 p.m. The bookstore will provide light refreshments.

Toby Johnson, co-owner of Liberty Books and himself an author, encouraged the community to come out and show Weathers a warm welcome, and perhaps even persuade her and her partner to move back to Texas.

QUEER NATION LEADS SILENT PROTEST IN WOODLANDS

125 Take Part in July 27 March Against Hate Crimes.

HOUSTON — The local chapter of Queer Nation, the nationwide lesbian/gay rights group, led a silent demonstration in the Woodlands last Saturday, July 27.

The 10 youths who are implicated in the attack on three gay men in Montrose on July 4, resulting in the death of Paul Broussard, are all from the Woodlands area north of Houston.

teaching young people that it is all right to attack and kill those who are different from themselves, because prejudice is not natural. It is taught, in subtle and often unintended ways, by parents, teachers, ministers and the media.

"Today we challenge you to find ways to teach your children a better way. They must be taught tolerance and respect for human life and human diversity. You can begin by expressing your own concern over the murder of Paul Broussard, or any example of homophobia, racism, sexism or anti-semitism. They will learn from your example. Please begin now to teach them well."

The casket and the signs were then picked up, and the demonstrators moved back toward their starting point.

The protest was carried off without trouble, thanks in part to law officers, who cooperated in blocking traffic when necessary.

Workshops, Training and Seminars Updated to Address Current Issues.

At least 125 people gathered at noon at the corner of Montrose and West Drew, near the site of the crime, and drove to the previously selected location, a shopping center on Sawdust Road.

Carrying signs, and led by a group of six bearing aloft a casket, the demonstrators proceeded through the parking lot of the shopping center down to the next intersection and crossed the street to an open area on the other side of the road.

The casket was then laid on the ground, and four members of Queer Nation took turns reading from a statement calling on all Houstonians to accept responsibility for hate crimes and for parents to begin teaching their children tolerance and respect for human life and diversity.

"We come here today to ask the people of Houston a question," the statement began. "What are you teaching the children of our community? Someone is

as well as updates on medical treatments and the latest thinking on safe sex guidelines. "Truth Training" is offered on the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month, this month on August 14 and 28. Workshop times are 7-10 p.m. The course is free, but advance registration is requested.

"Positive Living, A Workshop for the HIV-Positive," offers a "next step" for those who have found out that they are HIV-positive. "Positive Living" will now be offered three times a month on Tuesday evenings. Each two-hour workshop will focus on a topic of current concern and need.

The topics and dates for the month of August are "Health, Treatment and Trials" on August 13, "Benefits" on August 20 and "Emotional and Legal Issues" on August 27. Sessions are from 7-9 p.m. and are free. The workshops are designed to be very interactive and specific. Advance registration is requested.

A new workshop offered by DGA and the AIDS Resource Center is the Volunteer Recruitment and Involvement Fair. This course is designed to give people who want to volunteer their time a chance to learn more about the options available and how best to direct their interests. Volunteer orientation is offered on the Thursdays following "The Truth, Pass It On." For August the dates are the 15th and the 29th.

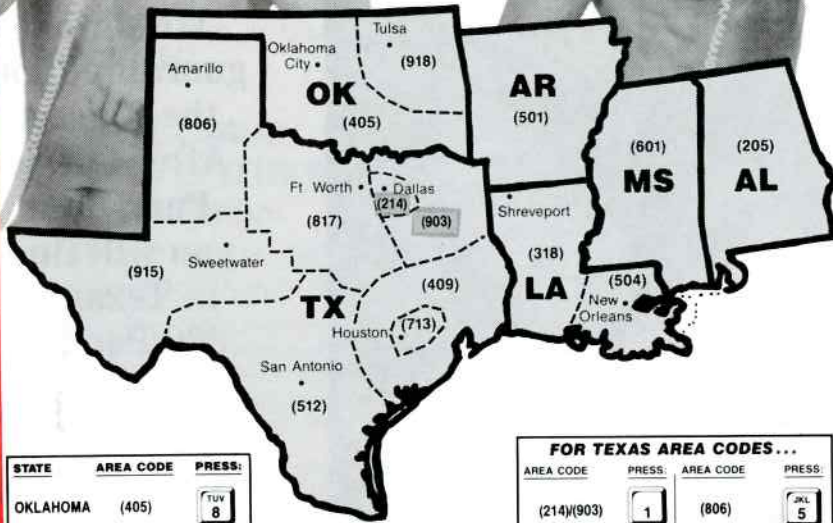

Austin Coalition Combats Violence

Dear TWT:

The newly-formed Austin Lesbian/Gay Anti-Violence Coalition arose from the increase in crimes against members of the lesbian/gay community in the Austin area. The organization's primary goal is addressing violence against lesbians and gay men by collecting statistics on hate crimes, encouraging the reporting of such crimes and educating the gay community on prevention measures.

The Coalition has contacted the Austin Police Department and City Council regarding the growing problem in the downtown area. We are working with the police and the City Manager's office to decide how best to handle the Fourth and Colorado Street situation.

The Coalition recently had a police officer speak at one of our meetings. The officer stated that reporting crimes correctly is most important for tracking and statistical purposes. When reporting a crime, the person must make sure the officer is aware that the incident was indeed a hate crime; otherwise, it will be categorized as merely an assault. It is imperative that all hate crimes be categorized as such.

The officer also suggested that crime victims get the badge numbers of officers they feel are not responding appropriately to the situation and follow through to insure the incident has been reported.

The Coalition was also successful in working with the City Manager's office to get additional street lighting in the area. We are attending City Council meetings to alert them to these problems.

The Coalition is working on developing printed materials that will inform the public about what specific actions to take after a hate crime occurs. These materials will hopefully include posters, brochures and smart-walk maps that should be available in area bars.

The posters and brochures will contain specific steps on how to report crimes and how best to avoid being assaulted. The maps will inform individuals—especially out-of-town visitors—how best to enjoy the downtown area safely.

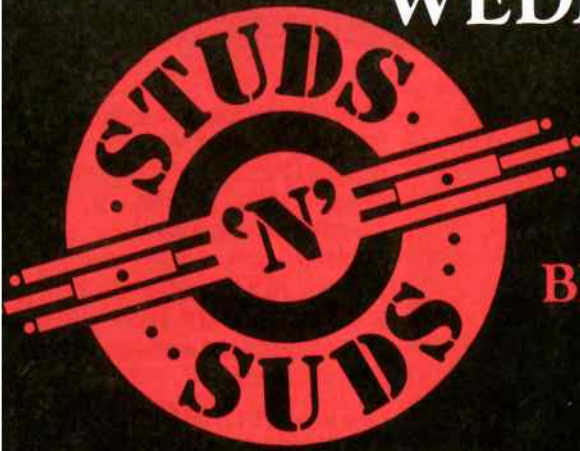

LOOKING BACK

MAGGIE'S CORNER

Downtown Heart of Early Gay Dallas

Maggie's Corner in Dallas, where Commerce meets Akard, that's where the belles of the 1920s, and for three decades thereafter, met and cruised.

Maggie's Corner was, of course, named after the Magnolia Petroleum building. Erected in 1921, it was at that time the tallest building west of the Mississippi River, 29 stories high. Wow! The building was made even more impressive in 1934 when the winged steed, Pegasus, was added. But down-to-earth Texans, uncomfortable with Greek mythology, preferred to call him the "Flying Red Horse." People traveling towards Dallas in those depression days would always look for that brilliant, neon-lighted red horse revolving high above the city's skyline. They bragged, "You can see the flying red horse from 30 miles away." They were close to the truth.

Fortunately, this graceful, elegant building has managed to escape the wrecker's ball—one of the few structures of our historic past that has not fallen in the name of "progress." Yes, our flying red horse is still there, although he no longer revolves. Sadly, his splendor is lost among the many modern skyscrapers that tower high above him. His beauty has been eclipsed by a multi-lighted ball, Reunion Tower. But, though many other cities have towered revolving restaurants, only Dallas has a flying red horse.

Today, downtown Dallas is all bluster and business by day. At night, except for the revitalized West End district, "downtown" is a silent phantom of its former days—days of gaudy neon lights; splashy movie marquees; busy restaurants; grand, imperial-like hotels; elegant, poo-poo department stores; less pompous five-and-dimes; free samples of hot, roasted peanuts handed out to sidewalk passers-by;

drug stores with friendly, handsome, college-age soda jerks; sidewalk scales that told your weight and fortune for a penny; Salvation Army brass and tambourine bands; and noisy, clanging streetcars constantly dumping exuberant, bustling crowds onto the already crowded streets.

Going downtown was a "dress-up" occasion. It was an event...a circus...a fair...a holiday every night! Every night!

"Yes, there's trouble brewing in Europe, but hell, there's always trouble brewing in Europe, and 'sides that's half-way 'round the world. We won the World War; this time let's stay out of it. Let Europe fight its own wars," people used to say. Well, we tried. But we didn't stay out of it.

If the years before 1925 were Dallas'

"diaper days," the depression, World War II and the Eisenhower years were Dallas' adolescent days. And then Dallas quickly grew up and became a metropolis—a city hollow in the center with an endless, ugly, urban sprawl for a rim, all this connected with a network of clogged expressways and look-alike shopping malls. The crowds followed the businesses to the malls with their acres and acres of free parking. Then, with the advent of TV, there was less reason to dress up and go "downtown." And so the center, the soul of Dallas died.

Who would have dreamed it? Certainly not the belles. "Downtown" was today's Cedar Springs and Westheimer all rolled into one. For our people the best night of all was known as "Gay Thursdays"—the night when the movies, some of them even in *technicolor*, changed; the night when the department stores stayed open late for the convenience of shoppers, and the belles of yesteryear, like those of today, shopped till they dropped, despite the depression.

The evening often started with dinner at Dunton's Cafeteria. Then, a movie at one of nine ornate movie houses, all on the north side of Elm Street. Cowboys and blue collar workers could be picked up in the dark last rows of the balcony in the Capital, the Rialto or the Queen. Dirt (rough trade) could be had at the Hippodrome or the Fox. But most belles preferred the majestic Majestic, the intimate Tower or the splendid Melba, named after the great Australian soprano.

Or the Palace! Oh, the Palace, with all that plush velvet, those phony (though few

knew it) marble columns and that gold filigree, and sometimes an orchestra. The Palace, where Dwight Brown, seated before his mighty Wurlitzer, slowly rose up out of the orchestra pit like Lazarus from the grave. Twisted painfully at the waist, he faced the audience, smiling and acknowledging its applause, all the while playing several of five ranks of keys, plus foot peddles and all kinds of knobs and gadgets. Oh, how they loved it when he pulled the xylophone and the drum-cymbal stops. But they cheered even more when he played "bird calls." Often the audience was invited to sing along.

Then came the movie. It was the golden age of Hollywood—an age, not of actors, but of *stars*: Rudolph Valentino, Clara Bow, Greta Garbo, Laurel and Hardy, Jean Harlow, Clark Gable, Errol Flynn, Jeanette MacDonald, Shirley Temple, Our Gang, Sonja Henie, Wallace Beery—oh, they don't make stars like that anymore! Nor movies!

After an evening at the Palace, what belle wanted to go home and go to bed? So there was a late snack at the B&B Cafe, at that time located on Akard near Maggie's Corner. The B&B was where the theatre crowd hung out: the singers of the touring Metropolitan Opera Company; the dancers from the Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo when it was in town; the local celebrities of the Starlight Operettas, Dallas Little Theatre and Margo Jones Theatre. The performing artists came to eat, but mostly they came to be seen, to be complimented and (it was said) to be propositioned.

If one didn't make out in the dark back rows of the balconies in the movie houses, or in the B&B, there was always Maggie's Corner where one could at least count on meeting friends. Or, if one wanted more, one could lean against the building provocatively while watching the cars slowly circling the block. If one stood there long enough....

Maggie's Corner became even more popular with the beginning of World War II. Texas was dotted with training camps. That meant servicemen, thousands of men.

During the war, servicemen were forbidden to wear anything but their uniforms when on three-day passes, so every weekend downtown Dallas became a sea of colorful uniforms—soldiers in starched khaki or olive-drab wools; marines in sexy blue, red and gold; and sailors in "tight white" or blue bell-bottoms with the alluring, tantalizing 13 buttons. 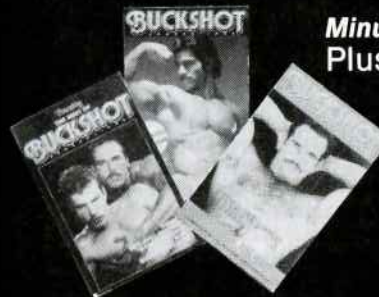

with the local girls. But the girls were not allowed to date the men when the dance was over. What were these young men to do? Were they to return to basic training without "getting any"?

If the years before 1925 were Dallas' 'diaper days,' the Depression, World War II and the Eisenhower years were Dallas' adolescent days.

Well, when all else failed, as it usually did because in those days "good girls didn't," there was either the whorehouses on South Akard or Maggie's Corner. Not all, but many service servicemen very quickly learned that "a belle is better than a bitch"—to use a popular expression of the day. With a bought woman, all the young man got was a wham-bam, because there was always a line of other servicemen anxiously waiting. The young woman was merely providing a service in return for money. The more men she served, the more money she made.

But with a belle, the young man kept his money and often got bed and breakfast in addition to a damn good blow job. It was said that more young men got their first blow job during World War II than at any other time in history. The soldier often returned to his belle whenever he could get a pass (or a leave, in the case of sailors and marines), happy to keep a good thing going!

Mingling among the belles was a jolly woman, a big woman. She called herself Big Bertha! Although she was not gay, she loved the gay crowd, and they dearly loved her in return. When the evening grew late and the streets began to grow quiet, Big Bertha would liven things up by leading a honking gay car caravan through the canyons of downtown Dallas, everyone laughing, shouting, singing, camping and cruising.

For some reason nobody recalls, she moved to Houston, and in time word came back that Big Bertha had died. But then, so had downtown Dallas. Drive by that corner, Maggie's Corner, late some Saturday night and you will see...nothing!

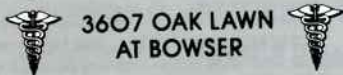

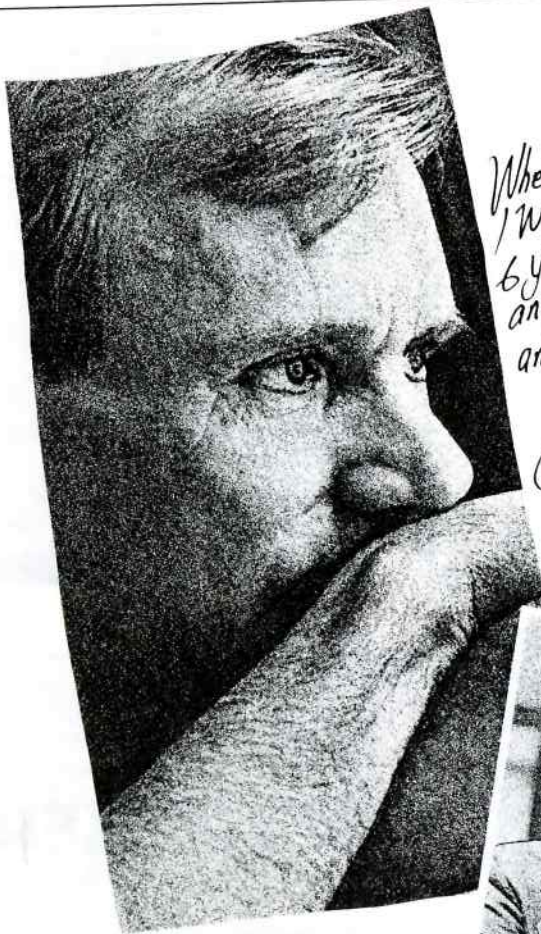

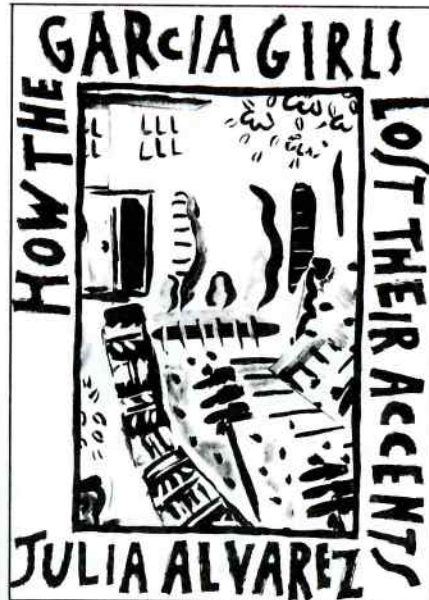

How the Garcia Girls Lost Their Accents by Julia Alvarez, novel, 290 pp.; Algonquin Books of Chapel Hill, P.O. Box 2225, Chapel Hill, NC 27515-2225; softcover.

If you indulge in only one cool confection this summer, make it *How the Garcia Girls Lost Their Accents*. As soft and cool as melting sherbet, this first novel by Julia Alvarez is sweet and sharp, urgent and dreamy. It is delicious.

As Yolanda rests on a hillside outside Santo Domingo, years after her father's failed coup attempt and their deposition, she absorbs the tropical breezes, feels the rich silence and wants the guavas. For the first time she admits to herself that she has never felt at home in the States, never.

Yoli's story proceeds backwards from here because, after all, it is the past that matters. The past was wealthier, prettier. The past was The Island. The Island was before now. Before the family of four little girls, so close in age as to be nearly indistinguishable, traded their innocence and servants to share a series of cramped, rented houses with their Mami and Papi in the redneck Catholic ghettos of the Bronx. "Cooped up in those stuffy suburban houses, the rules were as strict as for the Island girls, but there was no

island to make up the difference," Alvarez says.

In the best autobiographical style, this nostalgic look back provokes the longing all of us feel for our "real" home, whether we ever had one or not, and chronicles the way we will live until we can return.

With her extraordinary ear for the dialogue of non-natives and the strong flavors of Dominican syntax, the author makes one feel educated as well as entertained with the details she so sumptuously serves up.

At first acquaintance, the Garcia girls seem like ordinary American women—middle class, educated, assimilated. Carla is a therapist, Yolanda a poet and Sophia a new mother. Sandra is the recovered "crazy one." But circumstances change. Distinct voices emerge as the story becomes more powerful as it moves, then rushes, backwards. The real story is not who these women are, it is from whence they came.

Newly immigrated Papi, Dr. Carlos Garcia had to find new patients, Mami had to find herself and the girls had to lose themselves by ironing their hair, wearing American fashions and forgetting their Spanish. Exhilarated by their new freedoms, terrified by their new choices, they feel "*ni chicha ni lemonada.*"



Little revolutionary plots evolve at home. Pot, birth control devices, love letters are carefully concealed, but Papi will not be overthrown again. As the boarding schools fill up with Garcia girls, so do the analysts' couches and divorce courts. Through their stories we learn how the Garcia girls lost their accents—without really ever speaking the same language as "the Americans."
