GRAND JURY INDICTS TEN SUSPECTS IN **BROUSSARD KILLING**

Community Leaders Satisfied with DA's Vigorous Pursuit of Case.

HOUSTON - All ten of the suspects in the Paul Broussard case have now been formally accused of murder.

Previously indicted in the case were 17-year-old John Christopher Buice, on a charge of murder; and 17-year-old Leandro Ramirez, 17-year-old Derrick Jan Attard and 22-year-old Paul Chance Dillion, on charges of attempted murder. Dillion was on probation for a 1990 burglary when the brutal crime occurred.

It appears that the defendants met at a location near the intersection of Studemont and Washington to "do some gaybashing," said prosecutor Mike Anderson of the Harris County District Attorney's office.

Now also charged with murder are 17-year-old Gayland Earl Randle and Jeffrey Valentine, both 17, 18-year-old Jaime Rafafi Aguirre, his 17-year-old brother Javier Romero Aguirre, 17-year-old Brian Douglas Spake and 18-year-old Raphael Gonzalez.

Bond has been set at \$10,000 for each of the 10 defendants, all of whom are residents of the Woodlands in Montgomery County, just north of Houston.

All ten of the defendants either currently attend or formerly attended McCullough High School in the Conroe Independent School District. One of the suspects' father, Thomas Randle, is Assistant Superintendent of Conroe ISD.

Paul Broussard and two friends were walking back to their car from a Montrosearea nightclub when they were attacked four blocks away in the 1000 block of West Drew by at least 10 young men who pulled up in two cars, got out and attacked them. Broussard was stabbed in the chest and back, and died in the hospital later that morning. One of his friends was hurt, while the other escaped injury.

Anderson indicated that the district attorney's office is still investigating Broussard's death, and is looking into the possibility that the 10 young men charged might be connected with other hate crimes committed in the Montrose area, as well as the possibility that other youths



might have been involved in the Broussard killing.

Toni Knight, president of the Houston Gay and Lesbian Political Caucus, said the group would set up a committee to monitor the progress of the trials through the judicial system, keeping track of such things as possible changes of venue and plea bargaining agreements.

Houston activist Ray Hill, expressing his satisfaction that the District Attorney is aggressively prosecuting the case, acknowledged it's unlikely that all the defendants will be tried and convicted for murder. He anticipates that murder charges against some of the defendants might be dropped in return for testimony for the prosecution.

The Broussard murder has drawn statewide and national attention and has galvanized Houston's gay and lesbian community, which is working to keep the attention of police and elected officials focused on the problem of crime in the Montrose area.

The issue of crimes against gays and lesbians has become part of a rising public outcry against the tide of violent crime now sweeping Houston as well other cities around Texas and the nation.

CONDOM CORPS LAUNCHES AUSTIN SAFE SEX CAMPAIGN

Group Takes Over Objectives of Rubber Fairies, to Make Debut at 'White Knight Out with Siros.'

AUSTIN - AIDS Services of Austin's [ASA] Rubber Fairies are undergoing reorganization, and will be sporting a new name and plan of attack. The Condom Corps will be hitting specific areas of concern like younger groups of gay people, but will also be taking over the other obiectives of the Rubber Fairies.

The Condom Corps is assuming the responsibility held by the Rubber Fairies

of promoting safer sex in the Austin area. Marty Kosarik, Gay Community Educator at ASA and Kris Robanza, head of the Condom Corps, have several events planned to help promote the new organization as well as the various outreach projects of ASA's education department.

A major emphasis is being placed on relapse prevention, which has become one of the major topics of AIDS organizations around the country. Relapse prevention is aimed mainly at those who have been practicing safe sex in the past but who, for some reason, have strayed or started becoming careless. "Be a rubberman, use a condom every time" has been adopted as the slogan for several relapse prevention campaigns.

Kosarik told TWT NEWS, "Even though you may be celebrating an anniversary, birthday or other special event, you should always practice safe sex. It only takes that one time of not using a condom or other protection to be infected by the HIV virus."

The Condom Corps also will be distributing literature and information to Austinarea bars to hand out to their customers. Kosarik said most of the information is being provided by the San Francisco AIDS Foundation.

The Condom Corps will be making their debut at "White Knight Out with Siros," to be held at Oilcan Harry's on Friday, August 16. The party is being held in conjunction with AIDS Services of Austin. A portion of the cover charge will be donated to ASA's Austin Safe Sex Committee.

On the agenda for the evening will be the unveiling of Siros' latest work, his seventy-two-foot masterpiece "Play, But Play Safe Please." Safe sex kits made specially for White Knight Out will also be distributed. Requested attire for the evening is shorts, boxers, briefs, minis, bustiers and bras.

Kris Robonza, head of the Condom Corps, told TWT NEWS, "The Condom Corps is still looking for a few good men. If you are over 21 and an openly gay man, please call the ASA office for information on how to join. Watch out, you never know where you might find the Condom Corps. You'll find them tonight and tomorrow night handing out special invitations at Oilcan Harry's," he added.

GOP COUNTY COMMISSIONERS WANT TO MOVE POLLING FROM OAK LAWN

Democratic Commissioners Oppose Effort to Transfer Station from Gay & Lesbian Community Center.

DALLAS — The Gay and Lesbian Community Center has recently become the focus of attention for yet another political controversy. The center serves as a polling place for voters in Precinct 3304, but some Dallas County Commissioners want to change that.

U.S. District Judge Robert Porter, who resides in the precinct, wrote to Commissioners requesting the change. He made his request as a resident of the area, and not in his official capacity. Porter and others contend that many people do not vote simply because they are offended at having to cast their votes at the center.

In defense of the present location, John Thomas told TWT NEWS that voter turnout has been far greater since the polling place was moved from the Reverchon Recreation Center at 3505 Maple Avenue. "The Voting Rights Act guarantees that polling places must be easily accessible to minorities," he added.

Precinct election judge Brian Drummond received approval for the move from the Justice Department because the proposed new location is considered more

centrally located. "Accessibility is the real issue here," Drummond said.

Recent elections have already proven that the move to the Gay and Lesbian Community Center was successful, Thomas explained, because there has been a larger turnout of minorities, as well as a larger overall turnout, since the relocation.

Commissioners Jim Jackson and Nancy Judy, both Republicans, favor the move from the center, while Democrats John Wiley Price and Chris Semos favor leaving the polling place where it is. Lee Jackson, a moderate Republican, will be the deciding vote, Thomas said.

"We would like to see things stay the same until the new precinct boundaries are established from the census results," Thomas added.

Thomas went on to explain that the gay and lesbian community often suffers in an election because polling places are frequently located in churches or schools. "These are often the places where people are brainwashed in their religious views or fears of child molestation."

Precint 3304 includes the major portion of the Oak Lawn area. The polling place was moved to the Gay and Lesbian Community Center in July of 1990 from the Reverchon Recreation Center. Dallas County Commissioners were scheduled to vote on the matter on August 6, and TWT NEWS will report the results.

Any change would require federal approval, so it would not become effective immediately.

'Sound of Music' Benefits Coastal AIDS Group

Show to Help ACCT Keep Up With Increasing Demand for Services.

GALVESTON — The AIDS Coalition of Coastal Texas, Inc. [ACCT], in conjunction with Galveston Island Outdoor Musicals, is presenting *The Sound of Music* as its benefit show for 1991. The benefit will provide funds to help ACCT keep up with the rapidly increasing demand for its services.

ACCT is a nonprofit organization providing community-based HIV/AIDS education and services. ACCT's services include case management, hospital visitation, a resource bank, emergency assistance for

PWAs, rent and utility assistance, and counseling and referral.

ACCT also provides caregiver assistance, entitlement assistance, transportation and personal services, and also sponsors various support groups. ACCT is the only full-service AIDS organization receiving local referrals for outpatient activities in Galveston County. The group's programs are carried out by four full-time employees and approximately 75 volunteers.

ACCT offers HIV education programs through its speakers bureau, anonymous hotline and safer sex workshops. The organization also provides AIDS survival kits, street and beach outreach, minority outreach, and distribution of literature, videos and books.

The special benefit performance of *The Sound of Music* will be presented at 8 p.m. on Saturday, August 31, at the Galveston Island Outdoor Theatre. Seats in the special section reserved for ACCT are \$25.

In order to benefit ACCT, tickets to *The Sound of Music* must be purchased through ACCT before Monday, August 12. They may be ordered by mail from ACCT, 1419 Tremont Street, Galveston, TX 77550, or by calling (409) 763-AIDS. All major credit cards will be accepted.

Tickets may be used by the purchaser or donated back to ACCT so that clients, their families or volunteers may use them to see the show. Benefit sponsorships are also available.

Among the organizations receiving a share of the funds were the Texas Human Rights Foundation, which got \$4,437, and the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby, which received \$2,088. AIDS Services of Dallas, Oak Lawn Community Services and the Foundation for Human Understanding each received \$12,006.

Also benefiting were the Metropolitan Community Church of Dallas, Northern Lights Alternative, AIDS Interfaith Network and Legacy Counseling Center, which each received a check in the amount of \$1,827, and the Community Outreach Center, which received \$1,305. In addition, Alpha House and the South Plains Resource Center of Lubbock received \$544 each.

PARKER SPEAKS **BEFORE HOUSTON** CITY COUNCIL

District C Candidate Outlines Two HPD Budget Proposals.

HOUSTON - Houston City Council candidate Annise Parker spoke before City Council on Tuesday, July 30, outlining two

of her suggestions for revamping the Houston Police Department budget. Parker, a former chair of the Houston Police Advisory Committee, is running for a seat from District C.

In her address to City Council, she proposed eliminating most city jail functions. If this proposal were put into effect, most offenders would be sent directly to county jail. Supervision of those arrested on public intoxication or lewdness charges could be contracted out to MHMR and the Texas Council on Alcoholism.

Parker believes implementation of these changes would save money and free up more police officers for actual crimefighting duties. She also declared her support for further civilianization of HPD, saying that civilians or other city agencies could take over certain functions now performed by the police.

"Citizens of my district are afraid to walk the streets, afraid to sit on their own porches and afraid in their own homes," Parker told City Council.

"We must do whatever it takes to make Houston safe. We can put more of our veteran officers on the streets now through budget cuts and reorganization," she added.

Parker also spoke this past Tuesday, August 6 at a special event celebrating "Neighborhood Night Out," the annual nationwide effort held to encourage people to become acquainted with their neighbors. The "Night Out" gathering was held near the intersection of W. Clay and Taft and featured speakers addressing issues of crime and taxes.


'FROM ALL WALKS OF LIFE' SCHEDULED FOR OCTOBER 20

Dara Gray, coordinator of the walk-athon, told TWT NEWS that the time has arrived for people to mark their calendars and begin preparing for the walk. It's also time, she said, for the employees of both

large and small businesses to contact their employers and stress to them the importance of the walk and the cause it supports.

"If employees contact their employers now about becoming corporate or business sponsors with AIDS Services of Austin, we will have one of the best walk-a-thons ever," Gray added.

The goal for the 1991 walk has been set at \$150,000, up from the \$130,669 raised in 1990. Last year's total exceeded the

\$115,000 goal set for 1990.

A large part of the money raised goes directly to ASA, but a portion of that amount is donated to charities in the Austin area. The recipients for this year's walk-a-thon have not yet been designated. Interested charities were asked to contact Gray for information on how to apply.

Gray also pointed out the importance of volunteer work in helping put on the walk. Dates are now being set for upcoming volunteer nights, including a very large mailing the first week in September.

tional Rothko Chapel.




Nancy Rodriguez, mother of Paul Broussard, attended August 3 memorial service at Rothko Chapel coordinated by HGLPC president Toni Knight.



AIDS Foundation Houston [AFH] was established in early 1982 in response to growing concerns in the community and the obvious health threat posed by AIDS. As such, it is the oldest and largest provider of AIDS-related services in the Houston area. Recently, AFH announced the curtailment of certain services due to shortfalls in 1991 budget projections.

One of the services jeopardized by the cutbacks is *The Lifeline*, which is the official newsletter of the Foundation and a vital aspect of its effort to effectively distribute essential information to over 3,200 clients, volunteers and staff.

In order to ensure the continuation of the publication, AFH is currently soliciting underwriters. It is estimated that for the next year, approximately \$12,000 will be required to cover the total cost of production, which includes printing, folding and mailing. (Cost for personnel is not considered as all editors, writers and technical staff are volunteers.)

Benefits to underwriters are threefold: (1) Because of the tax-exempt status of AFH, all donations are tax deductible; (2) Underwriters are identified in the publication, much like advertisers, thus



TWENTY YEARS AGO Part I

The First Gay Pride Parade, Sort of

by Phil Johnson Dallas Gay/Lesbian Historic Archives

Twenty years ago, to protest America's involvement in Vietnam, a group of hippies planned a "Love Day" parade in downtown Dallas. But no one would have guessed it 30 minutes before the parade was scheduled to begin. Where were the marchers? "Oh, somewhere smoking pot," I thought. "And besides, it's raining."

Finally, this writer (who at that time wrote under the pen name Phil Jansen for fear of police harassment, common in those days) spotted a skinny young man with long blond hair pulled back into a pony tail. He was wearing a tie-dyed shirt with fringe, hip huggers with two holes in the seat so that the world could see his ass peeking out, and Jesus sandals. "Ah ha, a hippie," I thought. And then, "How did I ever guess?"

Always anxious to start a conversation with an attractive youth, I eagerly inquired, "Isn't the hippie parade supposed to start here at City Hall any moment now?"

"Oh, yes," he replied nonchalantly. "Well, where the hell is everybody?"

"Oh, don't worry. Reverend Bob Jones has this all planned. And if he planned it, it will happen. And what's more, the rain will stop." He seemed so smugly confident.

Just at that moment the rain stopped, a friendly sun smiled down and flower children descended on City Hall, seemingly from nowhere and from all directions. So about 30, maybe 50, colorful people started marching, singing and dancing down Main street. (Theirs was a peace-



loving, environment-loving, people-loving philosophy that somehow never quite caught on. Too bad for the world. Perhaps these children were naive. If so, they were beautifully naive.)

The pavement, scorched from the Texas sun just an hour before, was now delightfully cool as a result of the spring shower the Reverend Jones had somehow arranged.

The gentle children began handing out carnations to passers-by, who accepted the flowers with a smile, but who really didn't want them. (What does one do with a wilting carnation in downtown Dallas?) But because the givers were so engaging, who could refuse the gifts?

If there had never been a Love Day Parade, would a Gay Pride Parade (sort of) have followed the next month?

A teenager and future drag queen, brave beyond his years, carried a banner saying, "Gay is Good." But it must have been painted by someone on mind-expanding drugs because the damn thing was so filled with abstract psychedelic symbols and splotches of wild colors, it was hard to read. That probably saved the young man's head from being bloodied by a policeman's club.

Anyway, when the parade ended at the Kennedy Memorial, this tiny, rag-tailed celebration had added a bit of color to dull, conservative Dallas. Did it accomplish anything else? Maybe. If there had never been a Love Day Parade, would a Gay Pride Parade (sort of) have followed the next month?

On June 26-27, the tiny congregation of the Metropolitan Community Church of Dallas (just a year old and the first MCC outside of California) planned an overnight camp-out somewhere way out in the

woods near Lake Grapevine. About 30 gays and lesbians arrived with tents, toilet tissue, sleeping bags, food, water and gavis-good enthusiasm.

The weekend quickly became a joyous romp in the woods (despite copperheads), motor boating, swimming in the lake (despite water moccasins), lovemaking, dancing, chigger scratching and eating food cooked over a camp fire. (Have you ever noticed how good everything tastes when burned over a campfire and dropped in the ashes?)

A teenager and future drag gueen, brave beyond his years, carried a banner saying, 'Gay Is Good.'

After supper, couples and small groups held each other as they sat by the evening fire listening to a lesbian with an unusually beautiful voice play a guitar and sing simple folk songs.

Then it was time for an old-fashioned havride. Someone had rented a horse (or was it a mule?) and wagon from a nearby farmer. A big, round, pale-orange moon hung in the summer sky as if to light the woods, the field and the lonely country road for us. For a few precious moments, time ceased to exist. Night sounds, unfamiliar to city ears, filled the air. Cicadas? Tree toads? Hoot owls? Varmints?

Otherwise the night was restfully quiet. Someone told the story of the Stonewall Inn riots in Greenwich Village two summers before. Someone else commented that Los Angeles, San Francisco, San Jose and New York were celebrating with Gay Pride Parades that very weekend, so why shouldn't we? And so we yelled, "Two, four, six, eight. Gay is just as good as straight.'

Then, "Three, five, seven, nine. Lesbians

Too bad only the crows, chickens, chiqgers, lizards and armadillos heard us. But that was Texas' first Gay Pride Parade. It





MURDER MAGNOLIAS

REVIEWED BY JAVIER TAMEZ

comic whodunit is the basis for en-Agaging theatre, and in Murder in the Magnolias by Tim Kelly, currently being presented by the Actors Workshop, it's brought to the stage in a crisp and wryly

delightful form.

The action takes place in the sitting room of Belle Acres, a tarnished but once gleaming plantation house of the old South. Colonel Rance Chickenwing (William McSherry) has just revealed to his sister, Amanda Chickenwing (Margo Valen), and their housekeeper, Jezabel (Ann James), that he knows the location of the lost treasure buried somewhere on the grounds of the grand old estate. Before he can reveal the site, however, he drops dead.

An assortment of family members and other characters then begin to gather in preparation for the reading of the will: the flamboyantly fruitful Thornbird Chickenwing III (Mark Siegworth), a doltish cousin, Bubba Kamrowski (Kelly T. Campbell), a Hollywood has-been, Princess Lotta Cargo (Marri Lewis), her secretary, Lorraine Carruthers (Kris McGaha) and a devious conniver, Blanch DuBlank (Carol Orsak).

Joining this oddball group at various points are a wacked-out Voodoo Woman (Joleen Bishop), an outsider who has come to the plantation to check on drainage problems, Pete Moss (Andrew Wupper), the family attorney, Lawyer Possum (Harvey Shifrin) and the local law enforcer, Sheriff Billy Jerk (Rodney Robb).

The family is aghast when they learn that the Colonel did not die of natural causes, but was murdered. Still more unsettling, the Colonel has decreed in his will that the bulk of the fading fortune will pass from one family member to another as each meets his or her demise. The stage is set, then, for a round-robin look at the characters, each of whom has a motive.

Murder in the Magnolias is replete with literary allusion, with a particularly strong emphasis on Tennessee Williams. A Streetcar Named Desire, The Glass Menagerie and Cat on a Hot Tin Roof all figure prominently in references throughout the play. Though at times just a tad corny, the allusive humor is sharp and quick and peppered through much of the dialogue.

A sizable portion of the humor also comes from the names of the characters and the plantation itself. The surname "Chickenwing" is disfigured numerous times, the clan being referred to at various points as "Chickenfeed," "Chickenlips," "Chickenpox," "Chickenwire" and "Chickenhawk."

Several members of the cast are masterful. Ann James shuffles along with all the gumption of a disgruntled and disheartened Mammy, with facial expressions grimly affected enough to pop Aunt Jemima's kerchief. She's a delight.

Marri Lewis as the once glamorous Tinsel Town queen Lotta Cargo gives a raucous performance, mimicking Carol Burnett doing Gloria Swanson as Norma

mouthed Bubba and Mark Siegworth as the hopelessly elegant poet Thornbird. also give laudable performances.

Director Karen Douglas, who also serves as Artistic Director of The Actors Workshop, has done a fine job of eliciting the most from her cast. Much to her credit, she allows affectations to bloom where they enhance the humor of the characters.

Set designer Douglas Matens has created a faithful reproduction of the glorious old mansions that are so familiar from the

Desmond. She rolls her eyes and thrusts her arms about in dramatic gesture like a celluloid star of the silent era.

Carol Orsak as the pitiable Blanche DuBlank is also first-rate, and there's no mistaking her character's inspiration. She pulls it off wonderfully, demurely clutching and fanning, all the while casting furtive glances at the manly Bubba.

Rodney Robb as the good ole boy Sheriff Billy Jerk, Kelly Campbell as the loud-

stage and screen, complete with French doors, imposing portraits and ostentatious chandeliers. Ubiquitous cobwebs and dusts emphasize the withered age of Belle

Murder in the Magnolias is a funny and clever spoof with just the right additive of sophistication in the form of literary references. The play is grand, the cast is great and the direction is clean. It's a production worth catching.

Transvestites. Cross-dressers. Female impersonators. Drag Queens. Whatever they're labeled, their world has always seemed oddly esoteric to outsiders. Whether regarded with stoic embarrassment, unruffled indifference, benign curiosity or hearty appreciation, these would-be women, these stars of the bars have always been a source of controversy and inspiration.

A microcosm of this culture within a culture is examined in *Paris is Burning*, a documentary both entertaining and thought-provoking, which opens tonight for a limited engagement at the River Oaks Theatre.

Producer/director Jennie Livingston has brought to the screen an intriguing look at the lives and lusts of the drag houses of Harlem. Through interviews and "ball" sequences, she shows the fantasy world in which the performers exist; a world which they emulate with envy and unabashed longing. Ironically enough, the lives they pine to lead belong to the people most likely to exclude them, but that means nothing to them. We see through Livingston's camera that their existence is myopic—for better or worse, they live for the ball, for the walk down the runway, for the applause and those fleeting moments in the spotlight.


Do they sound pitiable? They're not. Far from it. These illusionists have accepted their dreams and above all else live to fulfill them, in the manner most readily available given their surroundings and socioeconomic status, the drag houses.

These gay clans provide a nurturing ground for countless souls who would otherwise find themselves adrift in a cycle of drugs, theft and prostitution. The names of the houses bespeak the elegance they grasp and the adulation they seek. These, then, are the Houses of Harlem: Xtravangaza, Saint Laurent, LaBeija, Pendavis, Ninja and a score of others.

They all have house mothers (and some have fathers) who rule with an imperious if benevolent hand. The "parents" speak lovingly of their "children" and indeed display strong maternal instincts in the manner in which they protect the members of their house.

Parental affection, however, has strong limits imposed by the unpredictability of life in the ghetto. This is strongly evidenced when one of the house mothers relays without a flutter of emotion the news of





the murder of one of her favorites. "That's part of the life here," she states with indifference.

This attitude should not, however, be construed as entirely cold-blooded. By necessity, the individual is not as important as the house, and the houses conduct themselves with all the determination of a violence-prone street gang. But their battlegrounds are not back alleys and deserted lots. The battle for turf between these gangs occurs at the balls, and it is a fiercely competitive struggle. To win at the ball is to be acclaimed by their peers, and it is a goal for which they are willing to sacrifice almost anything.

The ball is, in fact, of such highly prized significance that even meals and shelter become secondary. The performers must be in their finest form for the galas, and if they win, their desperation is justified and they have been vindicated. If they lose, they'll be back to try again.



Disturbingly enough, this obsession with the ball is so overriding that theft is not only common, it is taken for granted. "'Mopping' is stealing," says one of the young men who acts as a drag groupie, yet this pronouncement comes only after hedging and stuttering have failed to provide a more euphemistic definition for the ghetto slang. Shoplifting is so pervasive that when an article or accessory is actually purchased, that fact is emphasized with exclamation and reiteration.


Still, when the goal is to look like you've just walked off the set of *Dynasty*, no risk is too great in the minds of these performers. They contemptuously speak of shopping at discount stores and are highly wary of the belittling they would face if they dared to appear wearing something that was available at a nominal price.

"Mopping" aside, their lives outside the balls seem rather ordinary by comparison. Time not spent in preparation for an evening's festivities, appears to be passed under the most routine of circumstances. For instance, "reading" is as familiar to anyone in our community as cruising, but as shown here, it is practiced by ill-versed amateurs who would probably be eaten alive in any given bar on any given night in Montrose. This banality in repartee, however, becomes insignificant under the lights of the balls.

The balls themselves are showcases for a remarkable variety of creative expression. From the House of LaBeija comes a mistress with the robotic features and mechanical makeup of Grace Jones, dressed in garish gold with wildly exaggerated puffed sleeves, which for convenience's sake are also removable. From Xtravaganza comes a dainty willow who floats across the floor with the luster of dew. These, however, are only competitors in the fairest of categories.

To be sure, there are categories aplenty that would fit the generalization "fairest": evening wear, Paris high fashion, most natural, schoolgirl. The men (at least those who are still dressing the part) also have their categories—schoolboy, military, executive. Included as well are roles for the tongue-in-cheek such as butch drag.

By far the most captivating part of the competition is the dance. Long before Madonna popularized voguing in song and video, it was flourishing along the runways of the balls. The competitors twist and turn with enough skill and fluidity to grace any MTV escapade. It becomes guite clear,





moreover, that much of the choreography employed by Madonna, as well as the use of things like blower fans, comes straight from the children of the houses. Interestingly enough, it is the men, not the drags, who dominate this particular arena of the balls.

The dance category notwithstanding, however, the balls are made for and of drag queens, yet for all the gender proselytizing that occurs at the balls, the percentage of the members of these houses whose goal is to undergo sex changes is not large.

Those who do wish to become women seem genuinely satisfied with the changes made possible by medical technology. While lying on the beach, one brags of how she has had work done on her breasts, cheeks, chin and genitalia. "I am a complete woman," she states with triumph. "And you still got that voice," her companion derides her playfully.

Another winsomely speaks of the time when she will be a woman and hopes, regrettably enough, for the day when she will have a husband and house in the suburbs where no one knows her (so she can more easily perpetuate herself as a woman) complete with adopted children, no less. She languidly expresses her feeling that she has no masculine features.

while her size 10-plus shoes virtually scream out at the camera.

The measure of the extemes to which the drag houses will take their illusions is not at issue when the talk turns to money. While it can be argued that everyone would like to be wealthy, for the houses of Harlem it is a fantasy they realize every time they don their gowns.

It is refreshing, then, to hear the voices of wisdom and innocence in this babble of conceit and self-aggrandizement. The words of experience come from an aging drag queen by the name of Dorian Carey. She apparently has no house affiliation, but she speaks sagely of her life and the lives of her sisters in panty hose. She knows the balls are illusion carried to the point of delusion, but she accepts them at face value and can discern their worthiness as a largely undisturbing pastime.

"If everyone stopped doing drugs and went to the balls, the world would be a better place." A true enough statement, yet she knows that the world won't be a better place for them, and she matter-of-factly reveals how the years have altered her dreams: "I used to want to make a mark in the world. Now I just want to get through it"

Lines perhaps even more telling come from a 13- and 15-year-old boy, both of them street waifs. They talk sweetly and confidently of their contentment with their sexuality and the reasons for their presence on the streets of Harlem. "It's like a church community wants to pray together; well, the gay community wants to be together too."


This, in the end, is the manifesto for any group, gay or straight, lace or leather. Paris is Burning is beyond doubt a wonderful portrayal of the drag scene in Harlem. The drag houses are almost certainly reflective of the various imperial courts scattered across the Southwest, and therefore their

message is most appropos.

This film's gospel is to live the fantasy; celebrate the illusion; feel the applause. This is a documentary that explores the lives of drag queens, with all their foibles and chutzpah. Paris is Burning is a monument to their lifestyle and an exemplary piece of filmmaking. If you are a drag queen, you'll know their stories. If you're not a drag queen, you'll learn from their stories.

Anyway you look at it, to the creators a toast, and to their subject matter a toast from a slipper. Bravo

The Perseids give off colors of yellow and white as they streak through the night. Because the New Moon will have set long before the Perseids begin around midnight, you should have a sky dark enough for meteor watching.
