## **HOUSTON POLICE FIND OUT WHAT GAY BASHING IS FIRSHTAND**

*Undercover Officers Posing as  
Gays Assaulted in at Least  
Two Separate Incidents.*

HOUSTON — In an unusual twist to the recent spate of assaults and gay bashing attacks in the Montrose area, Houston police officers posing as gay men have been attacked in at least two separate incidents.

Both male and female plainclothes officers have been patrolling Montrose. The police in disguise are part of an undercover sting operation aimed at curtailing hate crimes in Montrose.

The operation is thought to be the first of its kind in the country. Although police departments in many cities frequently mount undercover operations to fight crime, the HPD effort is apparently the first aimed specifically at catching people who attack gays and lesbians.

According to Capt. John Adamson of the HPD Central Patrol Division, Jason Hartman, 18 years old, was charged with aggravated assault and assault with a deadly weapon for attacking officer R.D. Grounds. Hartman is from northeast Houston.

A 15-year-old anglo male with Hartman when the attack took place was also charged, but his identity has not been revealed because he is a minor.

Andrew Ipock, 19, of La Porte, who attacked two officers with Chemical Mace, has been charged with assault and bodily injury, as well as possession of a weapon.

In a third case, a car full of young adults threw cans and rocks at pedestrians along Westheimer. All were charged with class "C" misdemeanors.

The murder of Paul Broussard on July 4 brought demands from the Houston gay community that police and city officials finally face up to the problem of hate-motivated crimes committed against homosexuals. HPD has since modified its official definition of hate crimes to include those motivated by the victim's sexual orientation.

The police department has also responded by increasing its presence in the Montrose area. In addition to the decoy operation, the effort has included tem-



porarily increasing the number of officers patrolling the area on bicycles from two to six, as well as encouraging residents and patrons of clubs and other businesses to report any and all assaults or threatening incidents.

The stepped-up enforcement activity is being funded through special grants, and area residents and community leaders acknowledge that it will not last forever. However, they are gratified that the police are finally addressing the problem, and they are encouraging people to become active participants in fighting the crime problem now and after the police begin pulling back.

## **ALAN ROSS FREEDOM PARADE SET FOR SEPTEMBER 12**

*12th Annual Dallas Pride Event  
Dedicated to Late Ron Petty;  
Applications Due by September 6.*

DALLAS — The eighth annual Alan Ross Texas Freedom Parade, Dallas' 12th annual lesbian/gay pride parade, has been scheduled for Sunday, September 22, beginning at 3 p.m. near the Oak Lawn Library.

The parade will wind up in Lee Park, where trophies for prize-winning parade entries and other presentations for community service will be awarded. There will also be speeches and entertainment.

The theme for this year's parade is "Together In Pride," which was chosen as the national lesbian/gay pride theme for 1991. The parade has been dedicated to the late Ron Petty, a longtime member of the Dallas community.

Petty is best known for his total involvement with Razzle Dazzle Dallas since its beginning. He was a past president and chief architect of many of RDD's, and also served on the Pride III:84 Committee that conceived of the Dallas pride events so familiar to the community today. Petty



died earlier this year from complications of AIDS.

Applications for the parade have been sent to businesses and organizations in the community. Anyone needing an application may pick one up at the Dallas Tavern Guild office at 3900 Lemmon Avenue (backdoor entrance). Deadline for receipt of applications is Friday, September 6.

Entry fees remain \$35 for nonprofit organizations and \$75 for profit-making organizations or businesses. A \$25 late entry fee will be added to all entries received after the deadline. All fees must be paid before entries will be allowed in the parade.

Forms are also available at the DTG office regarding information on events taking place the week leading up to the parade, known as the Texas Freedom Festival. Deadline for event information is Friday, August 30, at the DTG office.

AUSTIN — The Austin chapter of the Texas Gay Rodeo Association [TGRA] is holding a special fund-raiser on August 24 at Shady Springs Party Barn.

"Hot Texas Night, A Hill Country Party" is planned as one of this year's major fund-raisers for TGRA. Organizers stress that 100 percent of the proceeds will be donated to lesbian and gay charities in the Austin area.

Entertainment at "Hot Texas Night" will be provided by several performers from around the state, including Nicole; Dede's Used Swans, who will do their rendition of "Swine Lake"; and the Baptist Church Women in a special reunion performance. The evening will also feature a barbecue

dinner with all the fixings catered by Shady Springs from 7:30 to 9:30. TGRA will supply uniformed security for the entire evening.

## HOUSTON VOTERS REJECT 16-6-1 CITY COUNCIL PLAN

*4-to-1 Vote Against Expansion  
Leaves Nov. 5 Election in Doubt.*

HOUSTON — In an election that saw only about 12% of those eligible casting ballots, voters dealt a crushing blow to a plan to diversify representation by expanding City Council. Voters rejected the plan by a four-to-one ratio.

Houston City Council is currently made up of nine members elected from districts, five members elected at-large and one mayor. The plan rejected by voters on Saturday, August 10 would have created a City Council with 16 members elected from districts, six elected at-large and one mayor.

Supporters of the plan, who included Mayor Kathy Whitmire, argued that, in light of population changes and shifts over the past decade, an expansion of City Council was needed to make it more representative of Houston's diverse population. Hispanics, who now make up more than a fourth of the city's population, have only one representative, Ben Reyes, at City Hall.

Opponents of the 16-6-1 plan countered with the apparently very effective argument that enlarging City Council would cost too much money at a time when the city has more pressing budget needs. According to the city planning department, adding the new council members would have cost taxpayers well over \$1 million a year.

Results from Saturday's election showed that the plan was favored by large margins in Hispanic and black precincts,

but was rejected by even larger margins in predominantly white, non-Hispanic precincts.

Gay and lesbian community leaders had originally lobbied for a City Council expansion plan that would include a Montrose district, reasoning that such a setup would make it easier to elect an openly gay or lesbian City Council member.

When City Council refused to consider such a plan, opting instead for the 16-6-1 proposal, the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus decided to support it as a reasonable compromise that would expand Hispanic and Asian representation while also increasing the Montrose share of the vote in a newly redrawn District C.

The rejection of the redistricting plan leaves the November 5 city elections in doubt. Under the federal Voting Rights Act, the Justice Department must rule on whether the current 9-5 Council structure is discriminatory before those elections can take place.

## RAFFLE BRINGS IN \$10,400 FOR ASA

### Organizers Pleased with Final Total From Five-Week Fund-Raiser.

AUSTIN — AIDS Services of Austin [ASA] has announced that over \$10,400 was raised through the organization's recent fund-raising raffle. The winner of the raffle received a trip for two to San Francisco.

Loretta Holland, development assistant for ASA, told TWT NEWS, "We were amazed when we started adding up the totals. We knew that we had done well on ticket sales, but the final total was a well-accepted surprise."

Tickets for the raffle went on sale at the beginning of July and were available for purchase until August 8. The fund-raising contest was organized by Sheri Fults, who was assisted by Lew Aldridge, chair of the development committee on the board of ASA.

The \$10,400 was raised through the combined efforts of ASA staff members, volunteers and local businesses. The money will go to the Paul Kirby Fund at ASA.

The whistles are now available at several gay clubs in the Montrose area, as well as at Inklings and Lobo bookstores.

Parker said the gay and lesbian community could be proud that it had demanded and gotten a strong response by the police to recent violence in the Montrose. She outlined several measures people could take to further the fight against crime, like the establishment of Neighborhood Watch programs.

Parker also stressed the importance of using the Montrose Police Storefront. The storefront was established so that citizens could file incident reports and provide the police with any information that might help prevent crime. However, officers stationed at the storefront are not allowed to leave their posts, and so cannot respond to citizens' requests for help in emergency situations.

Parker said that writing city or state elected officials was also very important, especially now that the community has gotten their attention on the crime issue.

## MARCHERS PROTEST HOUSTON HOSPITAL'S TREATMENT OF HEALTH CARE WORKER

*Demand that M.D. Anderson Return HIV-Positive Employee to Original Job in Operating Room.*

HOUSTON — About 20 people gathered in front of the University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer last Monday, August 12 to protest the hospital's discrimination against HIV-positive health-care workers.

The demonstration, held at noon, was organized by Quick Response and People with Immune System Disorders [PISD], affinity groups within Queer Nation. Several health care workers took part in the action.

The protest was inspired by the case of operating room technician Brian Bradley, who was placed on administrative leave after he revealed in a July 20 newspaper article that he was HIV positive.

After they removed him from his job in surgery, hospital administrators told him he could remain employed as an orderly, a stock clerk or telephone operator—in effect removing Bradley entirely from the areas of work for which he is qualified.

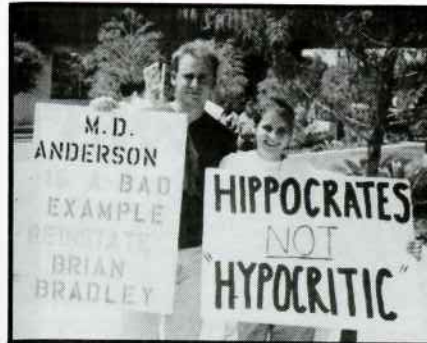

"There is no such thing as zero-risk. There will always be people with HIV in the operating room," Bourgault said. "Hospital administrators know this. By stating otherwise, they are only promoting a false sense of security in the public."

Amy Webb, a member of PISD, said she hoped the demonstration would have an educational effect as well. "We want to raise the consciousness of both the general public and health care professionals."

## Our Safety Is in Our Own Hands

Dear TWT:

The Houston gay and lesbian community is finally adequately addressing one of the most difficult problems any gay/lesbian community faces: prejudice-based violence against our people. We are receiving the kinds of help we need to accomplish real goals in making our community safer. The members of non-gay/lesbian community organizations welcome, support and join our efforts because they understand that their safety and ours are directly related. The general print and broadcast media have found good stories in the terrorism against us and our efforts to combat it. Even the police, prosecutors and courts are responding to our demands for better protection and equal prosecution of those who attack us.

Unfortunately, the tragic loss of Paul Broussard was a high price to pay for the new-found attention to the issue of hate crimes, but others have been brutally murdered and yet their deaths created no effort to address the problem. The time and conditions are right for solutions to be found now. It has been relatively easy to use the resources currently available to us now in an effort to secure our community. These resources are, however, finite, and maintaining a high level of safety will require our active participation on several levels and the allocation of energy and resources from our own community.

The very effective and creative sting operation with police officers posing as gay and lesbian couples is the kind of support that directly reduces violence in our neighborhood. It has received the endorsement and support of Montrose-area neighborhood groups and the media. Those officers are working overtime, funded by special allocations within the department. We have been assured that the project will continue as long as funds

are available. But the time will come when those efforts will run out of funds and the officers will be needed to address other problems in other areas of the city.

Before that happens, we need to be prepared to help protect ourselves. Montrose Peacemakers, a foot and vehicle patrol working with the police and other neighborhood patrol efforts, can provide us with a sustainable level of security that can save lives and improve our quality of life in Montrose. We need volunteers.

If you are mature, sober and drug-free and willing to give one or two weekends each month to join others watching for problems to report to the authorities during the late evening and early morning hours, please mail us your name, address, phone number and other personal information. Our address is: Montrose Peacemakers, P.O. Box 3624, Houston, TX 77253. Our first meeting will be held about the time you read this, so act promptly so you can attend the first training sessions.

There will be other important things to do and other community organizations will be coordinating them. Queer Nation meets every Tuesday at the Montrose Palace. Their number is 592-0100. The Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus meets the first and third Wednesdays of each month at 1475 West Gray, and can be reached at 521-1000. There is a list of organizations and groups in the back of each issue of TWT; call one or more of them and get involved. For more information, call the Gay & Lesbian Switchboard at 529-3211.

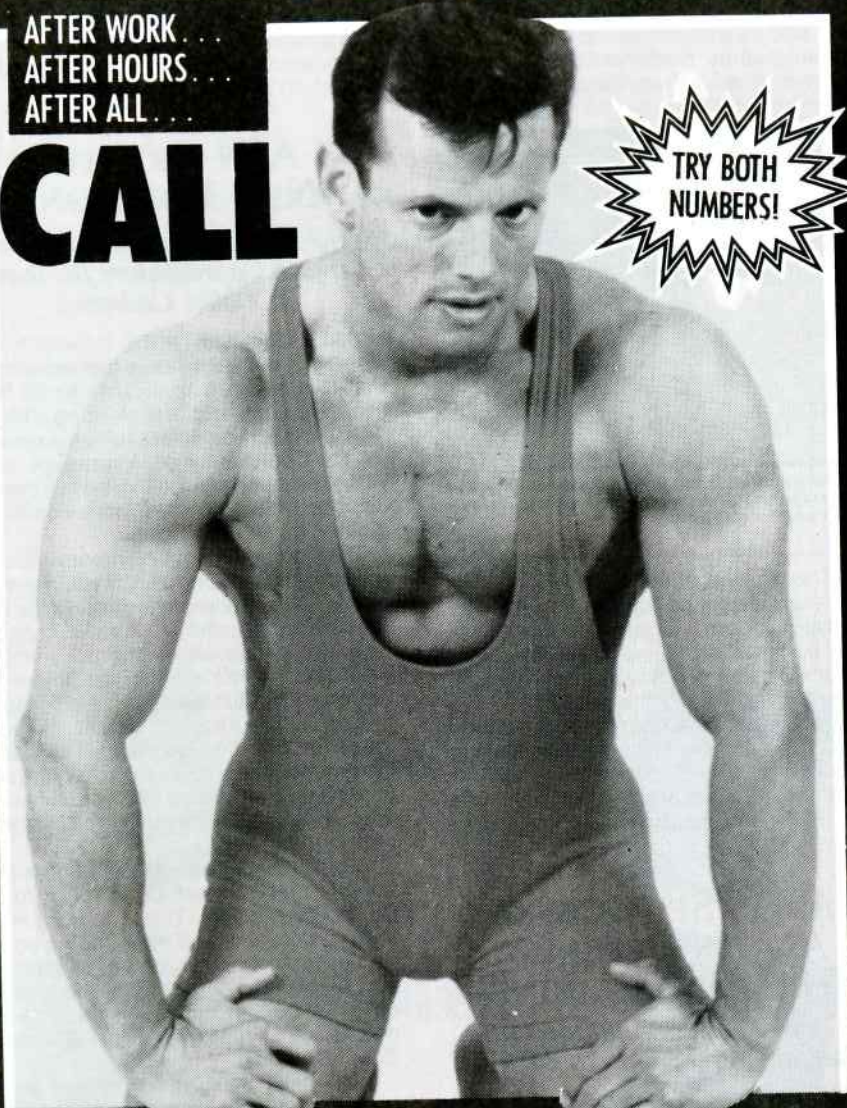

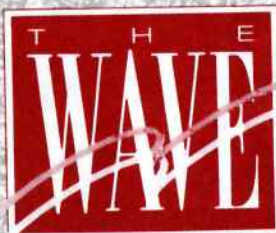

### Pro-Gay Means Pro-Choice

Control over our own bodies (the right to terminate a pregnancy or of sexual orientation) and the right to privacy are freedoms everyone should possess. This is exactly what the gay rights movement is all about. While the independence to make these decisions is in frequent jeopardy, members of the gay rights and pro-abortion movements are united in defense of these freedoms of choice.

It is absolutely unacceptable to us that the government could force someone to bear a child against her will. Furthermore, opposing a woman's right to choose

whether or not to have an abortion simply reinforces the government's attempt to control and to restrict decisions within the realms of sexual activity, family and reproduction.

The endangered Roe v. Wade decision is based upon a constitutional right of privacy. That is the same right that serves as the foundation to work against and overturn heinous anti-gay sodomy laws still in existence and enforced in 25 states and the District of Columbia.

The connection between gay rights and abortion rights goes beyond common interests and common enemies. Opposition to both gay rights and abortion rights is the mainstay of the radical far right's "traditional family values" movement.

When a woman's right to choice is threatened, then all rights (including ours) are threatened.

We as a community have never been fully united, nor have we taken the time to understand our own diversity within our own culture.



On Friday, July 12, the Centers for Disease Control [CDC] released guidelines for HIV- and hepatitis B-infected [HBV] health care workers. By the following Thursday, July 18, the U.S. Senate had unanimously passed two amendments dealing with HIV-positive health care workers.

The worse of these two amendments, sponsored by Senator Jesse Helms (R-North Carolina), would send health care workers to jail for up to 10 years if they become infected with the HIV virus and continue to treat patients without notifying them. The other amendment, seen as a compromise measure, conditions state funding upon the passage of laws incorporating the CDC guidelines.

By Friday, July 19, the mood at the state Capitol was decidedly in favor of mandatory testing and criminal sanctions against health care workers. Rep. Ron Wilson (D-Houston) had reintroduced his bill that the lesbian/gay community killed last session, and conservative Republicans were interested in carrying something similar in the Senate.

Although LGRL blocked three bills last session dealing with health care workers and HIV, some of the premises that we had been working with in the last legislative session were no longer true. For instance, during the regular session I argued that any action on the state level was useless until the CDC passed their guidelines. Now the guidelines have passed.

Another popular argument we used was

that the federal government had not yet acted on AIDS legislation; therefore, the state should not act. Again, this is no longer true. Of course, I employed arguments about the relatively small risk posed by HIV-positive health care workers, but these arguments do not carry much sway in an AIDS-phobic institution like the Texas Legislature.

Another problem exists with the nature of the special session itself. During the special session, only large legislative packages such as the budget or government reorganization are addressed. During the regular session we can count on the Governor and the Lt. Governor to block harmful legislation, but during a special session, vetoing any AIDS legislation would mean vetoing, for instance, the entire government reorganization bill. From a legislative standpoint this is not practical, and even our best friends in the Legislature would not do it.

In view of these facts, on Friday, July 19, it seemed that criminal sanctions and mandatory testing of health care workers were almost inevitable.

Fortunately, Senator Chet Brooks (D-Pasadena) took a stand against the more reactionary members of the Senate and worked with AIDS activists to strike up a compromise measure. Although I do not wish to see any unreasonable restrictions placed on health care workers, I believe that the Brooks amendment to the government reorganization bill is a good compromise measure, and I believe that it is in-



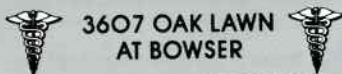

finitely more acceptable than the criminal sanctions and mandatory testing provisions in the other legislation.

## Under the compromise put forward by Senator Chet Brooks, mandatory testing of health care workers is not required.

Here are some of the main points in the legislation dealing with HIV-infected health care workers: Mandatory testing of health care workers is not required. Instead, the bill states that all health care workers should know their HIV and HBV status; HIV- and HBV-positive health care workers should refrain from performing invasive, exposure-prone procedures; and Universal precautions should always be used in health care settings.

According to other provisions in the legislation, health care workers who are HIV-positive may continue to perform in emergency situations, on other HIV-positive individuals as long as universal precautions are used, and on any patient who consents to being treated by an HIV-positive health care worker; and HIV-positive health care workers may continue to perform non-invasive procedures.

Nothing in the bill requires the revocation of licenses, registration or certification of health care workers who are infected with HIV or hepatitis B, nor does the bill set up any type of panel to review infractions of the law.

The Brooks bill is intentionally vague. The toughest measures in the bill concern the use of universal precautions. Basically, this legislation is a codification of the CDC guidelines with some improvements; e.g., the CDC does not suggest that HIV-positive doctors be allowed to continue to practice on HIV-positive patients. Although this section of the Senate bill "ghettoizes" HIV-positive doctors and patients, many of the AIDS practices in Texas are run by doctors who are themselves HIV-positive. Therefore, this provision was necessary.

Also, the provision allowing HIV-positive doctors to receive the consent of patients is not in the CDC guidelines, but as one HIV-positive doctor pointed out to us, there will be some patients who do not

care if their doctor is HIV-positive. This section of the bill covers that situation.

Again, I am not condoning the testing of health care workers. I think it is unnecessary and leads to more AIDS hysteria. However, in view of what was happening in the state Legislature, I believe that the Brooks compromise is far better than provisions in other legislation calling for mandatory testing and criminal sanctions against health workers.

Now the federal government is the problem. Please contact your U.S. Representatives and Senators, and tell them that you oppose the Helms amendment to the treasury bill and that you oppose mandatory testing of health care workers. If the federal government passes a more restrictive measure, then federal law will preempt state law and members of our community could still be harmed.

Please tell Senators Bentsen and Gramm that you are appalled by their votes in favor of the Helms amendment to the treasury bill. Your U.S. Senators are Lloyd Bentsen (Rm. 703, Hart Bldg., Washington DC 20510) and Phil Gramm (Rm. 370, Russell Bldg., Washington DC 20510). LGRL does not lobby at the federal level; however, your letters will help those organizations that do.

## Contact your U.S. Representatives and Senators and tell them that you oppose the Helms amendment to the treasury bill.

Finally, a word about hate crimes. As I stated in my last column, I believe that we have a very good chance of passing a hate crimes bill protecting gay and lesbian people in the special session. In fact, pressure from our community has already put a portion of the hate crimes bill on the criminal justice bill.

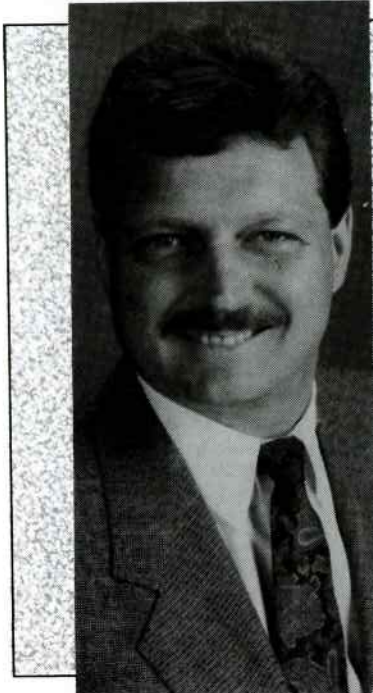

## ‘TRESPASSING’ PWA GETS DEATH PENALTY FROM MEDICAL SYSTEM THAT DOESN’T CARE

In all his years on the bench Harris County Court at Law, Judge James Anderson has never had the occasion to postpone a jailed defendant’s court appearance for health reasons. But last June he rescheduled one case for 24 hours after the bailiff advised him that the accused was too ill to be transported from his cell to the courtroom.

The next day, when the public defender assigned to the case declared to the judge that his client was dying, the judge, the clerk and a prosecutor walked over to the jail to see for themselves. As the trio approached the cell, the clerk gasped and jumped to hide behind the judge. She could not bear to witness the accused laying prone on the cold floor, his face oozing blood onto a gauze mask, his yellowish-gray face sunken and stretched over his skull and a soiled hospital gown exposing his cachectic backside, covered with sores.

“He looked like an Auschwitz survivor!” the normally calm and unruffled judge exclaimed. In an interview weeks later, he still spoke rapidly and at high volume, with rage and disbelief, about the “wasted” and fragile wisp of life he saw escaping before him.

Afraid the defendant would expire as he questioned him, the judge advised him, “Plead guilty and I’ll put you under my jurisdiction and get you into a hospital.” Too weak even to straighten his body out, the prisoner raised his face and declared, “I did it.”

It is unlikely that William (“Bill”) King Hensley knew what he was confessing to, or who the merciful stranger was standing

before him. He did know, however, that a hospital had been his intended destination for weeks and that all his efforts to obtain relief had been effectively aborted.

Bill, 36, had known all his life he wanted to “help people” when he grew up. After he graduated from Ross Sterling High School in Baytown, he applied to Humana Hospital and worked for seven years as a nurse technician. He was still on the roster of a Houston-area hospital as a per diem nurse technician when he died. According to all sources, he was an excellent employee, skilled and caring, satisfied with his vocation.

Bill was close to his family. He nursed both his parents in their old age and enjoyed a warm relationship with his sister and his nephews.

Bill’s aunt Jewel remembers him as a “prestigious housekeeper.” His lifemate, Jerry, laughed when she said that. He remembers coming home never knowing how to expect the house to look. Bill liked to decorate and rearrange the furnishings. An artist, he effortlessly drew portraits of Barbra Streisand and other personalities. As a child he used to cut up bars of soap and “beautify” them with bits of ribbons and hatpins.

Bill is most commonly referred to as “a nice guy” by those who knew him, an unlikely cause celebre for any scandal, gay, political or otherwise. But then Bill got AIDS, and then he developed AIDS dementia complex. People infected with HIV often worry about dementia. In fact, people are sometimes so worried about it that if they forget something, or have trouble concentrating, they wonder if they may be

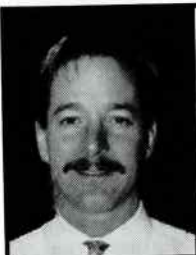

in the early stages of dementia.

Most of these people, like those who are HIV-negative, need not worry. Flabby memory and brittle attention spans are rampant among the worried as they become stressed or fatigued.

AIDS dementia complex strikes the brain itself only after the immune system has been profoundly weakened, usually past the point of poor muscle control, anorexia and other gross manifestations of HIV infection.

According to *The Guide to Living With HIV Infection* (John G. Barlett, M.D. and Ann K. Finkbeiner), "People with the symptoms of AIDS dementia complex should be examined and tested to exclude the possibility that the symptoms are caused by depression or by an infection of the central nervous system. The diagnosis of dementia will often be made by specialists: neurologists or AIDS physicians. The tests for dementia include a series of mental abilities, a neurological exam, a spinal tap and a brain scan."

Bill never had these tests. He had no medical insurance and no resources. He didn't even have Social Security Disability Income. People with dementia suffer severe loss of memory. They forget why they have entered a room, where they live, what their errand was at the store or what they did a minute ago. Their attention spans become very short and they have to work hard to follow a situation on TV or the plot of a book. A person with dementia might want to apply for Social Security Disability Income, but not be able to think through the process.

People with dementia have so much trouble concentrating and making decisions that they need clear, concise information and they need it repeated frequently. "Wait here, I'll be back" is not a reasonable directive to someone who is unaware of where "here" is, who the speaker is, who is addressed or even what time it is.

Even a "meticulous dresser," as Bill was described by his Aunt Jewel, becomes unable to button a shirt, and due to the exertion involved in the activities of daily living, eating, drinking, dressing and staying clean all come to be seen as less and less worth the energy needed to accomplish them. People with dementia sometimes resemble bums.

In the later stages of dementia, those affected can't handle spoons or door knobs, and they can't even bathe themselves. They tend to live in one room of their home, or one corner. They lose control over their bladder and bowels and don't know it.

Caregivers often believe these symptoms would disappear if only the patient were motivated, would cheer up a little or try a little harder. Physicians and other medical personnel realize, however, that these are not emotional reactions to the disease, but the disease itself.

**B**ill's lover did not know about AIDS dementia complex when Bill totaled his car in March. When Bill ran out of gas, he started walking, abandoning the car in the street. When he seemed not to miss it, and couldn't account for it later, Jerry wondered if Bill had been abusing drugs.

Another time Bill went to the store to buy a soft drink and cigarettes. He paid for the drink and put the cigarettes in his pocket with his change. He was arrested for shoplifting. He was demented.

Jerry is obliged to travel extensively in his profession. He was leaning on friends and strangers to assist with Bill's care in his absence until Bill's Social Security Disability Income was approved. Then, he hoped, he could hire a caretaker for Bill when he had to go out of town.

Bill often spoke optimistically about returning to work when he got better. The structure, the efficiency, the cleanliness and compassion of the hospital business suited his nature. He felt good in a place that "helped people."

Occasionally, when he went for a walk, Bill would find himself at Ben Taub Hospital, where he thought he knew someone. Then he would forget why he was there and return home by the roundabout route that seemed familiar.

On April 18, Bill went to Hermann Hospital. He was seen by a doctor, treated for a fever and sent on his way. He became lost on his way out and was discovered by hospital security on a medical floor, shuffling and mumbling to himself.

On May 26, he stumbled into the emergency department of Hermann Hospital and was seen by a nurse. Recognizing that Bill was desperate, she said, "Wait here, I'll be back," and went to alert the house doctor.

One hour later the off-duty officers who moonlight as security guards apprehended Bill as he was wandering around the grounds of the hospital. Unable to speak for himself, flushed and weakened, his skin parched and taut, he was unable to prevent himself from urinating on his clothes. The guards arrested Bill for trespassing. He was taken to the Harris County Jail.

In a story headed "Hermann Sends 'Wasted' AIDS Sufferer to Jail," *Houston Post* reporter Barbara Linkin noted that it did not take a medically trained observer to realize the devastated condition Bill was in. She wrote, "He had the sores common to the final stages of the disease and needed medical attention."

In an interview weeks later, Linkin emphasized that she was still disturbed by how severely incapacitated Bill had been. She kept asking, "Why did they have to arrest him? He couldn't have caused any trouble if he had wanted to! He went to the hospital to get help and they arrested him!"

Judge James Anderson was equally appalled when he met Bill in his quarantine cell a few days later. "He looked like an Auschwitz survivor," he said. "He was too weak to sit up." The judge says it was painfully obvious to him that Bill was very critically ill. He does not understand how anyone at Hermann Hospital could not have realized it.

All the judge could do to help Bill was convict him of his charge, loitering, and have him transferred to LBJ Hospital. Then he made arrangements, as part of Bill's probation, to place him in a hospice after hospitalization.

The public relations department at Hermann Hospital insists that Bill's situation was not an emergency and that he did not

suffer by the arrest. The officers claimed they did not know Bill had come to the hospital seeking help. These unnamed officers remain the only principals involved who were unavailable as this article was being written.

Patty Riddlebarger, the spokesperson for Hermann Hospital, was extremely officious, calling to "see how the story's going" and generously offering advice, until an interview was requested with the arresting officers. Hermann Hospital has not been heard from since.

**W**illiam King Hensley died in a warm bed between clean sheets at LBJ Hospital on June 6, 1991.

Judge Anderson is glad Bill was as comfortable as possible at the hour of his passing, but he is bitter that Bill was forced to testify against himself and plead guilty to a crime he did not commit in order to gain that rest.

"The criminal justice system had to do what the medical care system should have done," he said. "And Lord knows we're overburdened enough as it is now." He agrees that the hospitals are also overburdened. "But we all carry our own burden. And ours is criminals."

That Bill Hensley died a criminal is a travesty of justice. That he was denied care is a brutal, violent irony and a betrayal of our medical system.

Two days after Bill's death his Social Security Disability Income was approved.

At his memorial service, many comparisons were made between Bill and a young, professional homosexual man who was premeditatedly murdered in Houston this summer because he was gay. Gay bashing. AIDS discrimination. Homophobia.

"Look at me," Bill's sister implored, "I'm not gay! My kids aren't. None of us (indicating most of the mourners) should be affected by all this stuff. But we *are!* Bill was my only brother and now he's gone. It affects me! It affects all of us! It even affects people who don't realize they're affected. Somebody should *do* something!"

Somebody should.

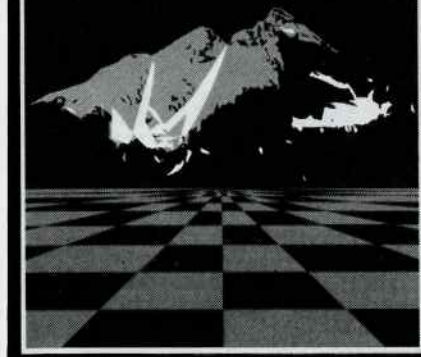

## GETTING LIFE IN PERSPECTIVE

*Getting Life in Perspective* by Toby Johnson; 210 pp.; Lavender Press, P.O. Box 998, South Norwalk, CT 06856; fiction; softcover, \$10.

In our capital city of Austin, situated in that part of Texas considered by many to be one of the most spiritual places on the planet, reside two men—lovers—who are working, living and loving together in a quest for individual enlightenment and the betterment of the "World Soul." The couple, Toby Johnson and Kip Dollar, together since 1984, jointly run Liberty Books.

Perhaps it is this penchant for prose that, thankfully, beckons Toby on multiple occasions to transform his myriad visions into a collection of so many dots on pure white paper. Just as this collection of dots irrevocably alters the face of the paper landscape, so, too, do Toby's words forever alter the reader's psyche.

Toby's works are, at once, powerful and gentle. It is this dynamic combination, however, which makes his works so important, for when consciousness-altering endeavors are your life's work, you must first help people to listen, and in the eye of the storm it is always the quiet voice that speaks the loudest. *Getting Life in Per-*

*spective* is the latest expression of Toby's quiet voice.

Imagine, as I'm sure so many of us can, that you are confronted with a rather dramatic choice—either totally and completely change your life, or lose it! Such is the quagmire that Boston writer Rick Carton finds himself in when his doctor diagnoses him with a degenerative brain disorder. The prognosis? Not good, unless Rick can reduce the stress in his life.

Enter Elizabeth, Rick's co-worker and confidante. Her father just happens to own property in the Texas hill country that needs a little restoration in preparation for its eventual sale. Elizabeth proposes to Rick that, in return for overseeing the restoration and showing the property to potential buyers, he can live there rent-free, and will be paid a modest salary. But how do you leave a lifestyle—and a belief system—that you have embraced for so many years? Even if it's killing you?

Quite simply, you just do it!

So with word processor and suit cases in hand, Rick sets out on a path forged by adventurers over a century ago—a path through the past and towards a brighter future.

Rick's first days in his new home are uneventful. He tends his garden, rests and helps the workers restore the fading structure. He also tries to write his first novel, but with little success. Until, that is, he begins to visualize the characters in his suppressed novel as real people, sitting across the desk from him. It's then that he achieves success.

\* \* \*

Ben and Tom are 19th-century lovers—Ben a boyish ex-seminarian from southern Illinois, Tom a handsome "ribbon-clerk" from San Antonio. Through a series of "coincidences," the pair meet on the streets of Chicago and recognize an instant. But in the late 1800s, theirs is a love that dare not speak its name—at least publicly. Compounding society's roadblock to their destiny is the intrusion of a wanderer, Josh B'Gosh, who has taken a

liking to Ben and becomes enraged at Ben's rejection of his advances.

Their flight from Josh, and from the persons they used to be, "coincidentally" brings them to the Clear Light Colony. The colony, established by Monty Hightower and his lover, is a Utopian retreat, nestled in the mountains outside of Perspective, Colorado—a place where gay men and women can "disappear" from the rigors of the outside world and become what they were meant, by God, to be.

While there, Ben and Tom gain a new perspective, i.e., that because God truly is in-dwelling, everything is God's experi-

ence of Himself. Every joy is God's joy, every heartache His as well. Consequently, each facet of God's experience is just one adventure in the development of the "World Soul."

This breakthrough philosophy completely transforms Ben and Tom's perceptions of life and empowers them. This empowerment allows them to confront their fears—Josh, society's disapproval—and, because of the freedom offered by this empowerment, to become the highest and most perfect expression of themselves.

\* \* \*

Rick is not unaffected by his visitation from these visions of the past. Just as Ben and Tom find new strength on their journey to the mountains, Rick is similarly able to discover new power in his journey to the hills—a power which transforms his experience from death to life.

I have spoken quite often throughout this review of "coincidences." Is it a coincidence that, with the volumes of work by gay authors that I receive weekly to review, Toby Johnson is the only author from whom I have received two books? I think not—I don't believe in "coincidences." I believe, rather, in a universe which provides all that is needed.

Apparently, Toby Johnson is very much needed. How very fortunate we are that, in our quest for a higher consciousness, we have this gentle, peaceful warrior leading us towards the highest expression of ourselves.

## BACKSTAGE By MARC ALEXANDER

Our first surprise of the week was receiving Sister's invitation to lunch at Baba Yega. We shouldn't have been surprised when she skirted around all her normal conversational issues to tell us about her "latest discovery." Sister likes to think she is the first in everything.

"Did you know that that BriarPatch Follies will be doing their fourth annual benefit show this month?" she queried. While we stuffed our face, she rattled on about the upcoming event. We have to admit that she did have her facts together; no idle gossip here.

"You know how it is after a night at the bars—it's closing time and suddenly everyone realizes that one simply can't go home and sleep on an empty stomach. Got the picture?"

Okay, so a bunch of folks had been out partying and jacked themselves up around the piano at the BriarPatch. "Of course, this was long before those Japanese started their karaoke thing, but I'm getting away from the story. Where was I? Anyway, someone suggested they all head over to the barrio and have a bite to eat at Doneraki's."

"Well, for a camp, someone said, 'Let's gather round the piano and sing a few tunes for the customers.' Lots of songs, lots of laughs led someone else in the group to snatch a line from one of those old Garland/Rooney flicks: 'Hey, let's do a variety show and raise money for PWAs!' And that's just what they did"

Four years later that same group of people have been joined by others and they're currently in rehearsal for their upcoming show. Cast members are required to rehearse a minimum of twice weekly. Drinking is not permitted during rehearsal, and being petty is an absolute no-no. Any participant can voice his or her opinion since everyone has a say-so in the production of the event.

Two months prior to each Follies show, the cast get together and discuss what they want to do for that year's event. They also vote on who will be the recipient of the money the show brings in. The Follies raise in excess of \$20,000 annually.

All this is put on by people who are leaderless—there are no elected officers in this group. Most gay and lesbian bars sponsor some sort of team, for example, bowling teams, softball teams, etc. The BriarPatch sponsors a theatre team, the BriarPatch Follies.

Three individuals from the cast comprise the Finance Committee, thus eliminating the need for the bar to be involved with the actual monies raised.

Time, money and materials all combine to make this a labor of love totally free of expenses. This year The Assistance Fund of Houston and Stone Soup Pantry will enjoy a 50/50 split of all the funds raised.

"Isn't it marvelous that no one has ever quit in the middle of the production schedule? That many of our bothers and sisters working together creating a special magic!" exclaimed Sister.

"It is sad that our dear friend George Manning won't be there this year for the annual barbecue. They're going ahead with it on Sunday, August 18. 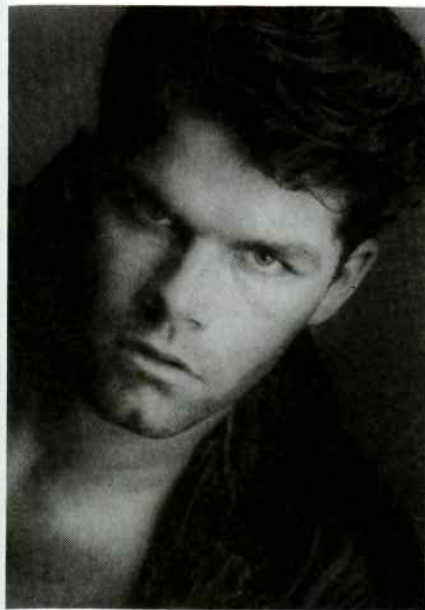




Naturally athletic, he enjoys all types of outdoor activities, especially motorcycling and snowboarding.

You'll find Stryker at the Men's Room on Maple Avenue, Dallas' newest menswear shop, which he and his partner Randy Gatewood have just




