HOUSTON PRIDE WEEK ELECTS NEW OFFICERS

*Valinski, Clark & Wunrow Returned
To Office, Silva New Secretary.*

HOUSTON — Houston Lesbian/Gay Pride Week chose its slate of officers for 1991-92, with the candidates for female and male co-chair making a campaign promise not to resign before the end of their terms.

During the 1990-91 term, both the male and female co-chairs removed themselves from office for health and personal reasons before their terms had expired. In their absence, Jack Valinski and Carol Clark volunteered to assume the duties of the two co-chairs, and Pride Week members were so pleased with the way the two had fulfilled their duties, that they had no opposition.

Both Valinski and Clark were overwhelmingly approved by those attending the Houston Pride meeting August 20. Jim Wunrow was re-elected as treasurer, and Gloria Silva was elected secretary.

After the election of new officers, discussion turned to the Pride Week Conference coming up in Boston October 11-13. Members voted to provide funds to purchase air transportation for Clark and Valinski to attend the conference.

The Pride Week Conference is a national networking workshop bringing together Pride Week representatives from across the country. Houston Pride Week members said they expected Clark and Valinski would return to Houston with stories and ideas from other cities that will benefit HLGPW '91-92.



Member Diane Williams volunteered to chair the Pride Week Outreach Committee as part of the organization's desire to increase its presence in the community. Valinski updated those in attendance on the status of efforts to make Houston Pride Week a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization.

Debbie Hunt of Moore and Hunt is legal counsel for the project, and accountant Kathy Hubbard is also volunteering her services. Previously Houston Pride Week operated under the nonprofit status of the Montrose Activity Center.

The next meeting of Houston Lesbian/Gay Pride will be held September 17 at 7 p.m. at the Metropolitan Multi-Service Center, 1475 West Gray.

JUDGE WON'T BE CENSURED FOR ANTI-GAY REMARKS

*But Chief of 5th Circuit Labels
Hall's Language 'Inappropriate.'*

TEXAS — U.S. District Judge Sam Hall will not be formally censured for anti-gay remarks he made several weeks ago while presiding over a civil rights trial in Beaumont.

Judge Charles Clark, chief judge of the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals based in New Orleans, wrote in a six-page ruling that Hall had used "inappropriate" language when he referred to gay jail inmates as "a bunch of queers," but that he "did not go beyond the evidence in the case before him."

David Todd Mayes, a convicted drug felon, had filed a \$100,000 damage suit, saying his right of due process was violated because he was forced to await trial in an overcrowded jail in which homosexual activity was taking place. Hall had presided over the trial, held in Beaumont.

One day while court was in session, Hall had asked Lt. John Cassio of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Dept. if inmates are put in cells with "all that other bunch of queers

in the tank?" The judge also asked the sheriff if there was "just a whole lot of partying going on" and referred to homosexuals as "their kind."

Hall also was heard later to declare outside the courtroom, "I don't like them" (referring to homosexuals).

Houston gay rights activist Ray Hill and his attorney Ray Maness filed a complaint with the 5th Circuit Court against Hall. Hill's contention was that gay and lesbian people would not receive justice in a legal system which condoned the kind of remarks Hall had made.

Responding to the complaint, Hall wrote to Judge Clark, "I now understand that even though some organizations use the word 'queer' in their title, that the term is offensive to many homosexuals."

1992 TEXAS LESBIAN CONFERENCE LOGO SEARCH CONTEST

English-to-Spanish and Hearing-Impaired Interpreters & Other Volunteers Needed for 1992 Event.

DALLAS — The planning committee for the 1992 Texas Lesbian Conference [TLC] has announced a contest to find an eye-catching logo for next year's May 15-17 gathering. The committee has invited lesbians and lesbian-affirmative women to submit designs by October 5.

The new logo will be used on letterhead, envelopes, buttons, T-shirts and other fund-raising items. All submissions must be of presentation quality and must reflect the slogan chosen for the 1992 conference, "Diversity, Unity, Community." Multicultural and multilingual considerations must be incorporated in the logo design.

As part of the TLC outreach, an "Honorary Lesbian" T-shirt and button will be sold for gay men and lesbian-affirmative women, and logo designs should allow for this adaptation. All pertinent information concerning the conference must also be incorporated in the design.

A \$3 fee must be included with all submissions, which should be mailed to P.O. Box 191443, Dallas, TX 75219 c/o Lesbian Visionaries. Finalists will be required to provide camera-ready art. Deadline for submissions is September 31. The winning logo design will be chosen on October 5.

The Texas Lesbian Conference is designed to bring together lesbians from all across the state for education, social interaction, empowerment and spiritual celebration.

Committees are now being formed to coordinate TLC, which promises to be the largest lesbian event in the state next year. Featured will be workshops, dances, spiritual celebrations and round-table discussions.

TLC planners are looking for interpreters for the hearing-impaired and for English-to-Spanish translation. Also needed will be workshop facilitators, vendors, artists, musicians and volunteers.

AIDS QUILT COMES TO LUBBOCK IN OCTOBER

Texas Tech to Host Display of 140 Panels in Only Scheduled State Appearance This Year.

LUBBOCK — Texas Tech University will be hosting a display of panels from the Names Project AIDS Memorial Quilt October 17-22. The Lubbock display of the Quilt is its only scheduled appearance in Texas for the upcoming year.

The University Center will be the site of the exhibition of approximately 140 panels of the 14,000-panel quilt, which was nominated for a Nobel Peace Prize and served as the inspiration for the Academy Award-winning film *Common Threads*.

Sponsors said they have three goals in mind in bringing the Quilt to Lubbock. They want to present Texas Tech, Lubbock and the entire South Plains area with the opportunity to see firsthand one of the most emotionally stirring exhibits in the world and also want to provide PWAs and their friends and families with a vehicle through which to express their grief.

Another goal is to generate interest in AIDS education so that people will receive accurate information regarding the urgency and seriousness of the AIDS crisis.

In Lubbock, at least 296 residents have been diagnosed with HIV, 60 of whom have died. It is estimated that over 1,500 people in Lubbock are HIV-infected and do not know it.

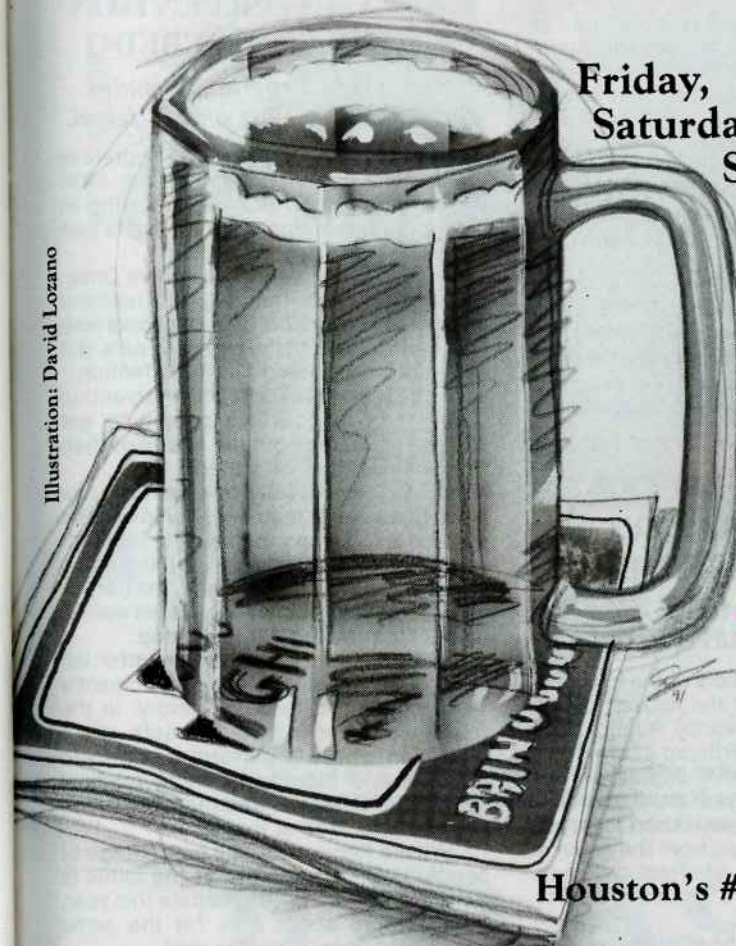

The idea for the Names Project AIDS Memorial Quilt first arose in San Francisco in 1987, when Cleve Jones spray-painted the name of his friend, Marvin Feldman, onto a piece of cloth the size of Feldman's grave. To date, over two million people have seen the Quilt, which now includes panels representing at least 14,000 people who have died of AIDS.

This year marks the tenth anniversary of the discovery of AIDS in the United States, and the Quilt display will be a highlight of AIDS Awareness Week in Lubbock, sponsored by the HIV/AIDS Issues Awareness Committee, which includes representatives from UC Programs, the Dean of Students Office, Department of Student Health Services, Texas Tech Schools of Medicine and Nursing, the Lubbock City Health Department, Education Services Center and the South Plains AIDS Resource Center.

The AIDS Memorial Quilt will be on display in the University Center Ballroom of Texas Tech from Thursday, October 17, through Tuesday, October 22, from 10 a.m.-8 p.m. (Sunday 2 p.m.-8 p.m.). The display will be open to the public and admission free.

HOUSTON CHAPTER OF QUEER NATION TARGETS 'GREENSHEET'

Paper's Refusal to Accept Same-Sex 'Heart-to-Heart' Ads Stirs Action.

HOUSTON — Members of the Houston "tribe," or chapter, of the activist group Queer Nation voted Tuesday, August 20 to boycott the local advertising publication *Greensheet* and remove copies of the paper from racks in the Montrose area.

The decision by Queer Nation to target the *Greensheet* resulted from the paper's recent refusal to print ads from gays and lesbians in the paper's "Heart-to-Heart" personals section.

Representatives of the tabloid-size publication have claimed that they and their readers are not comfortable with what they describe as "the homosexual lifestyle."

In other business, those in attendance discussed a possible party for National Coming Out Day on October 11, and a letter received from Channel 8 concerning the public television station's refusal to air the controversial gay-themed program

Tongues Untied was circulated among members. *Tongues Untied*, which deals with growing up black and gay, has aired in other cities in Texas and around the country, including San Antonio.

Queer Nation meets at the Montrose Palace, Commonwealth and Waugh, at 7 p.m. on the first and third Tuesdays of each month.

EARLY INTERVENTION AT NELSON-TEBEDO

Four-Week Program Includes Testing, Counseling and Referral.

DALLAS — "Our Wellness Program is underway." John Thomas of the AIDS Resource Center [ARC] was referring to the early intervention program that is part of the Nelson-Tebedo Clinic.

Thomas, the center's Executive Director, told *TWT NEWS* that a recent national survey had shown that 38% of people who have had gay sex in the last five years still have not been tested for HIV infection.

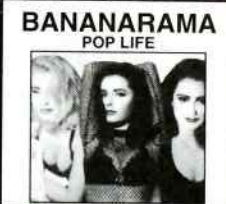
"The idea behind the early intervention program is to convince people to get tested and learn about the status of their immune system," he added.

The four-week early intervention program is aimed at men and women in the gay and lesbian community. The first visit involves pre-counseling and testing for the HIV virus. In the second week, the participant receives his or her results, as well as further counseling if it is needed.

During the third week there is further lab monitoring to determine the participant's T-cell count and medical history. In the fourth week, the individual meets with a physician who will perform a complete physical and record still more medical data. Future medical treatments will also be recommended at that time.

"We are finding that the percentage of people who test positive at the clinic is running at about 12-13% to date this year, compared to about 20% for the same period last year," Thomas said.

The Nelson-Tebedo Clinic will have specific guidelines for the referral to private medical care of patients who have been through the early intervention program. Thomas explained that it would be up to the physician to whom the patient was referred to determine whether that person should remain under private care or return to the clinic for specific studies or treat-

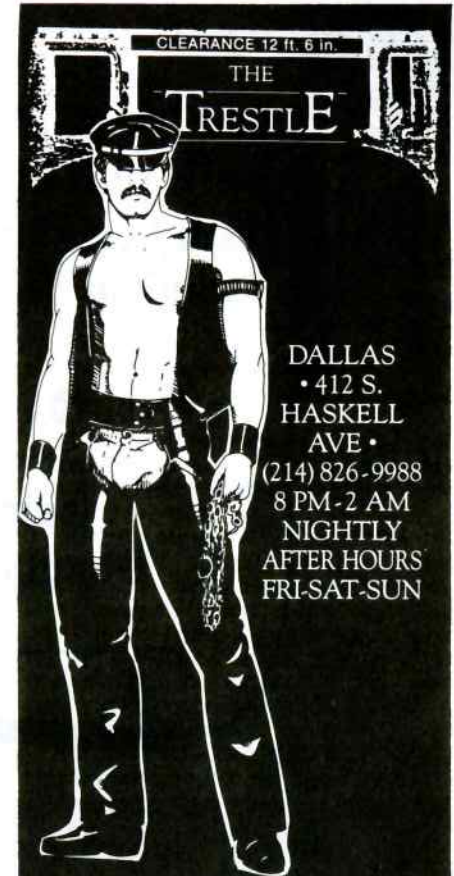

TEXAS HUMAN RIGHTS FOUNDATION:

What's In A Name?

I took over the position of Director of Development and Administration for the Texas Human Rights Foundation [THRF] on August 27, 1990. At that time, I was very surprised and discouraged by the number gay men and lesbians in the state who were not very familiar with THRF and the work we do.

Inarguably, there are numerous organizations at work in the gay and lesbian community, serving a variety of purposes. Clarifying the differences among those organizations can be very confusing.

It doesn't help matters that we have a very generic-sounding name. We constantly receive calls from heterosexuals who are seeking legal counsel. Just last week, a woman called looking for an attorney to handle her divorce. When I told her that we do legal work on behalf of gay

men, lesbians and HIV-positive individuals, she giggled nervously and hung up. That is a very common reaction, as is silence, followed by a resounding "CLICK." A person could get a complex around here!

To set matters straight (in figurative terms only), I would like to talk about THRF, its history and some of our work, past and present.

THRF is a statewide nonprofit organization dedicated to fighting discrimination against gay men, lesbians and HIV-positive individuals through public interest impact litigation, education and lawyer referrals. In simple terms, we *file lawsuits*. Sometimes, an actual lawsuit is not necessary; the threat of one is sufficient to accomplish our goal.

THRF was founded in 1976 by the late Houston attorney Robert "Mort" Schwab,

as the Houston Human Rights Defense Foundation, Inc. Its name was changed when it broadened its scope of service in 1979. THRF is now headed by a 15-member board of trustees comprised of established community leaders from around the state and is staffed by three individuals.

Over the 15 years of its existence, THRF has been involved in many precedent-setting court battles in Texas to vindicate the basic civil rights of lesbians and gay men. A few examples:

1) In January of 1990, THRF was active in obtaining a Texas Attorney General's opinion which allowed the release of state funds to AIDS service providers by the State Department of Health, even if the organizations providing the services were gay-identified.

2) In 1988-89, THRF was the complainant in the disciplinary proceedings against Judge Jack Hampton of Dallas, who had allowed anti-gay sentiment to enter into his sentencing of a person who had murdered two gay men.

3) THRF operates an ongoing AIDS Legal Resource Project [ALRP], which provides a mechanism for Texans to access legal information and attorneys trained in the legal aspects of the rights of persons with AIDS, AIDS-related conditions or HIV infection. It is the *only* statewide AIDS legal resource and is operated by THRF Legal Coordinator Margaret Tucker and intake assistant Kim Vickery. The ALRP toll-free phone number is 1-800-828-6417. Please call if you need assistance or would like to know more about the ALRP.

4) Perhaps the best-known project of the Texas Human Rights Foundation is our lawsuit challenging Section 21.06 of the Texas Penal Code, the law that makes sexual relations between adults of the same sex a crime.

THRF challenged this archaic law for the first time in 1979 in federal court in Dallas. The case, *Baker v. Wade*, worked its way through two successful court rulings, later to be reversed in 1985 in a bitterly divided 9 to 7 vote of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 5th Circuit.

The current case challenging 21.06, *Morales et al. v. the State of Texas*, was filed by THRF on April 12, 1989. Many individuals are confused about THRF's involvement in this case, or are simply not aware of it. Basically, we are sponsoring this lawsuit: we sought out individuals

who were willing to be named as plaintiffs, we are paying all court costs and attorneys' fees in the case, and attorney Nell Hahn, THRF co-chair, is serving as "of counsel."

As many are aware, State District Judge Paul Davis declared this statute unconstitutional on December 10, 1990. State Attorney General Dan Morales appealed Davis' decision on April 5 of this year. The case is now going to the 3rd Circuit Court of Appeals in Austin. We expect arguments to be heard around the first of the year.

The December decision was certainly a victory for our community, but a trial court ruling is of little precedential value. For that reason, we welcomed Morales' appeal.

A victory at the appellate level would be binding on a statewide level. It would declare this outdated statute unconstitutional. Homophobic institutions would no longer have this law to point to as the basis for bigotry and discrimination.

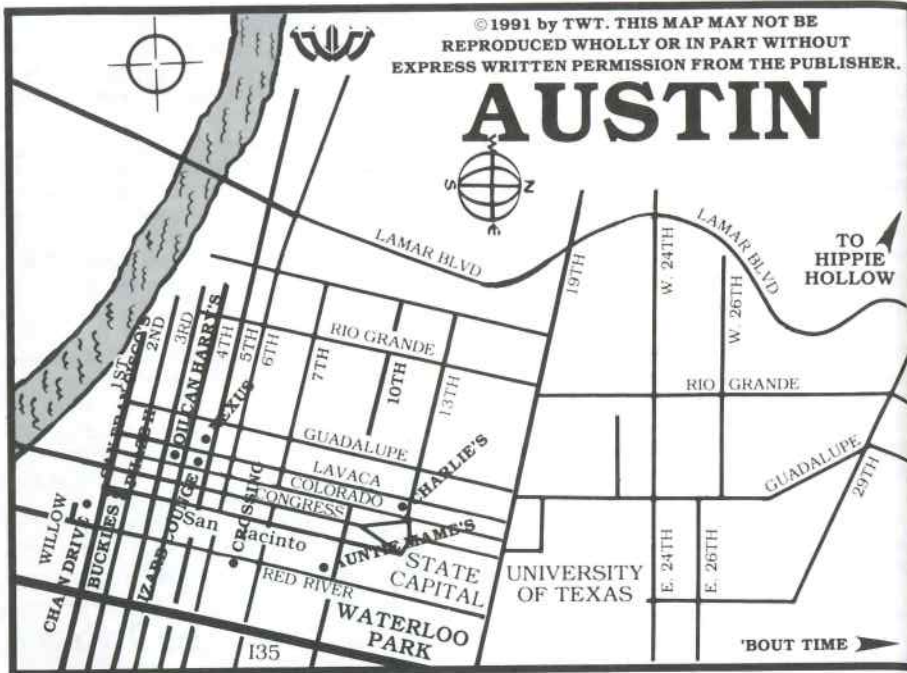

In essence, we have won the first battle, but not the war.

In looking toward the future, THRF is growing and preparing to expand its scope of service. We are in the process of hiring a full-time litigator. With a litigator on staff, we will be able to personally take on cases affecting gay men, lesbians and those with HIV or AIDS. The need and demand are there. Now THRF will be able to respond.

In October, TWT will begin a new column entitled "Legal Update," written by THRF staffers, examining legal cases involving discrimination against gay men, lesbians and HIV-positive people in Texas.

He is a member of the Austin Community College Gay/Lesbian student organization, MCC-Austin and a volunteer with interpreting services.

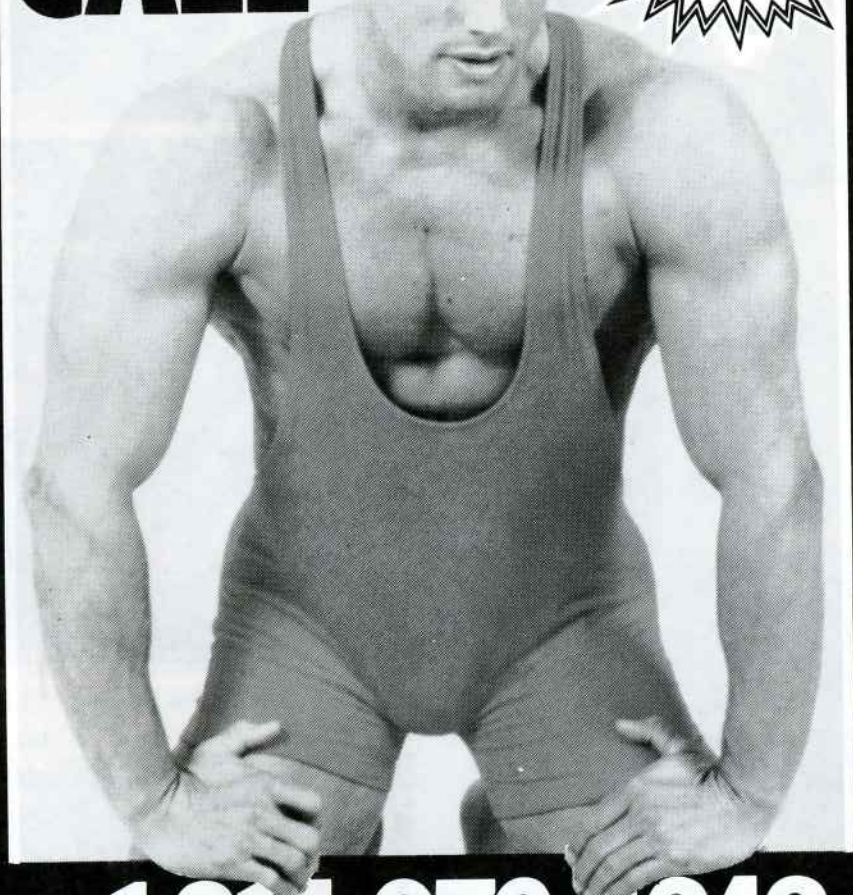

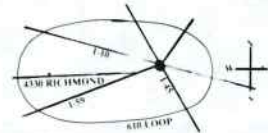

The Night It Hit The Fan

Dallas Gay/Lesbian Historic Archives

In 1971 we had never heard of AIDS, little dreaming that within a decade many of our people would be dying of it. For the gay community, just starting to become Stonewall proud, the Vietnam War was our disaster. We loved our soldiers, but we hated the war. Should we serve and risk death or dishonorable discharge, or should we support those who were burning their draft cards?

Were those who wanted to "effect change" too serious, or were those who just wanted to "have fun" too frivolous? Who were the patriots—those who were motherhood-and-apple-pie, "establishment," or those who felt that the best way to be a good citizen was to question "establishment icons"?

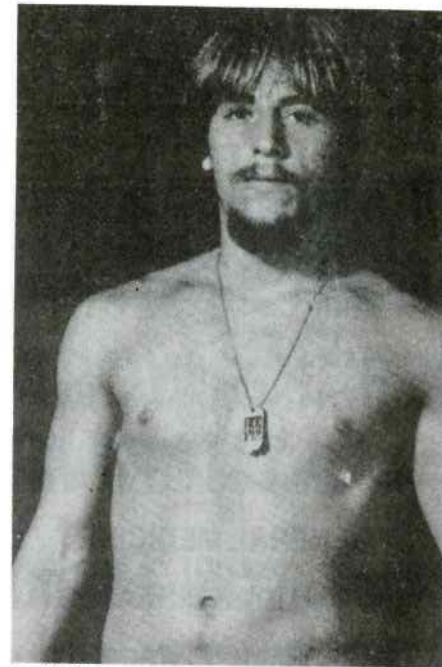
Should we wear our hair short or long? Clean or natural? Which sticker should we place on our bumpers and risk getting our windshields smashed, the one that said, "America, love it or leave it," or the opposing one, "Vietnam, love it or leave it"? Or how about the one that said it all, "Vietnam—they gave me a medal for killing two men and a dishonorable discharge for loving one."

The red, white and blue sparks began to fly on the night of July 4. The Maars Bar on lower Henderson was packed. Performers from all over the Southwest were competing for the usual prizes: Best Butch, Best Costume, Best Talent, Mr. Maars and Miss Maars. Indigo, a Sugar Plum Fairie, won the prize for Best Bad Drag, but indignantly walked out before



the trophy, a gold-plated horse's ass, was awarded.

The scheduled program came to a stop when Peaches, a Fairie, remained onstage to voice her objections. Because the show was running late, the management ordered the spotlight turned off her. When she still refused to leave, a security guard was called. Some members of the audience demanded that she be heard and objected to a gay man calling in a straight man to remove another gay man. Therefore, permission was given for Peaches to speak for two minutes.



Bo, Mr. Maars.

She began, "While we're here enjoying ourselves, others are fighting in trenches and starving. While we're smoking our cigarettes..." At that point someone shouted, "Smoking what?" That did it. Peaches was never allowed to finish. From the back of the room a voice began sing-

ing "God Bless America" and others joined in. But many others, just as adamant, began shouting, "We want to hear Peaches!" A youth jumped on stage and yelled, "Why don't these dirty hippies get a job?" "But this is my job..." Peaches tried to explain.

Angry supporters from both sides stormed the dance floor and the stage. Miss Tina tried to calm the crowd and spoke in favor of continuing the show. Bo, a 20-year-old straight hunk who had won Mr. Maars, felt that Peaches was cutting down straights. She wasn't. But so many people were shouting and so few listening that no one was heard. Fearing violence, spectators quickly made for the exits.

Perhaps a drag show was no place for a lecture on drag shows or the Vietnam War. But whether one would have agreed with Peaches or not, surely we can all gain from listening to those whose views differ from our own:

"While we're here enjoying ourselves, others are fighting in trenches and starving. While we're smoking our cigarettes and drinking our booze, there are gay people who are confined in prisons and men-

tal institutions. However, more than that, there are gay brothers in the dressing room in this very bar who are sincerely in doubt about their beauty or their real worth as human beings because this kind of show is just about the only outlet they have for expression of this sort.

"I'd rather not see people paraded back and forth on this stage as objects to be judged, but I'd rather see us coming together to sing and dance and to express an affirmation of life, in hopes of creating a solid basis for fighting those people who not only drop bombs on Vietnam, but who make life practically unbearable for a gay person in this society that forces us into bars instead on the streets.

"My patience has worn thin with competitions. My hope is that anyone who wins any of these competitions will refuse the prize on the basis that we are all winners. Off competition!"

Whatever happened to Peaches, the Sugar Plum Fairies, Indigo and the impressive youth in the red dress? More importantly, whatever became of the naive dream of a world without hatred and violence?

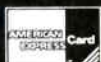

SCHOOL RULES

New shoes, new "do's" and a fresh box of crayons were what I used to look forward to each school year. That, and catching up with family members around the dinner table, reunited after the kids and our parents spent weeks and months at camp, visiting cousins and enjoying assorted vacations.

I used to look forward to writing those "How I Spent My Summer Vacation" essays, preparing months in advance, inventing chilling tales of backpacking through the Yucatan or critiquing the Masters at the Louvre.

I loved school. School was beyond the breath-to-breath supervision of the extended family. School was where I could experiment with being free, hanging out with the girls my parents deemed unseemly, or "acting like a public school kid" at St. Agnes Academy. School was a relief, an escape from real life.

My kids love school, too, but not for the same exhilarating choices. I don't get it. They're so...different. They go to school to be "normal"! They like "normal." They like cloak rooms—hey, we're friends, right? My kids like *closets*!

On his first day of first grade, my son Jose came home gloating, "I know something you don't know," he sing-songed with all the authority in the world. "There are other shapes besides triangles! Ms. Femme showed us! And triangles come in colors other than pink!"

And I had wanted my kids to enjoy an education less elitist than mine had been. Maybe I was being too broadminded. Perhaps I should see if there were still desks, uh, spaces, available at Butches and Beaus Day School for the Inclusive. It had been a temptation to enroll Lawrence in their pre-kindergarten, Dykes and Tykes. Even then he was a timid child, as if uneasy at being the only four-year-old with a rainbow Mohawk and pierced nose.



The school's catalog was inviting. "We encourage our students to assertively Act Up! Take Pride! And Parade around in their mothers' clothes!"

But Lawrence cried and clung to the grease-stained legs of my coveralls and begged not to go. He wanted to go to a "normal" school.

In a compromise reached under duress, this family now celebrates Real Life all summer and suffers through oppressive cultural experiments during the school term. This season we marched in the 1991 Houston Gay/Lesbian Pride Week "Feel the Music" Parade, celebrated with MCCR in Dallas and partied in Corpus Christi with the Lone Star Symphonic Band. We worshipped at San Antonio AIDS Foundation's Casa of Care and took part in the March on Austin. We did our AIDS Mastery Workshops.

So what will Jose write his summer vacation essay about? "I'm gonna write that I spent the summer at camp with my cousins," he says.

Lawrence says he's moving to Beaumont to live with his dad.

HOW WOULD YOU FEEL IF YOUR DAD WAS GAY?

Based on a series of real incidents, and written with the help of the children involved, *How Would You Feel If Your Dad Was Gay?* poignantly reminds adults that homophobia affects their children, too. The book also offers the family and the community the opportunity to explore and express their feelings.

During a classroom discussion, first-grader Jasmine reveals that she has three dads, her biological father, his live-in lover and her mother's husband. Her pride is hurt when her classmates observe that her dad is a "faggot" and her teacher doesn't restrain them. Before lunch, the scandal has spread to her brother Micheal in the fifth grade.

And Noah. Noah's mom is lesbian, so he tries to defend Micheal against those who called him "sissy" and "gay punk," but becomes the target of the name-callers himself.

Joe tries to comfort Micheal by revealing that he has two fathers, a dad and a stepfather, "So big deal if you have three dads."

But it is a big deal and it seems to Jasmine that it gets much worse the day an assembly is called at school to discuss families.

The principal, Mr. Kay, has invited a doctor to speak to the students and faculty about the different choices people make in creating families and how these choices affect the community.

Although she is embarrassed when the doctor mentions "gay families," Jasmine is relieved that it helps her teacher understand her family.

Since the authors admit to having taken liberties with their kids' experiences that inspired the book, I wish they had also avoided the stereotypical young, female teacher and older, male principal.



I also wish they had not found it necessary to invoke a doctor's (children's counselor) authority to pronounce gays okay. As a lesbian parent of two school-age children, I found insulting the fact that the authors used the doctor to deliver such a positive opinion, so that the principal wouldn't have to.

The sweetest passage of the book has Noah explaining to his mom his obligation to defend Micheal "since we're gay, too."

His mother corrects him, saying, "No, we're not gay. I'm gay." But she shows her own internalized homophobia when she advises him not to defend other gay people or gay people's kids just because she's a lesbian. She should have added that he should not tolerate prejudice against anyone because he is an honorable person.

If enough of us taught our children that, there would be no need for *How Would You Feel...?* books.

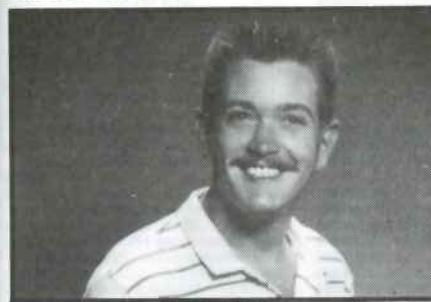


Ernie Dougherty (above)

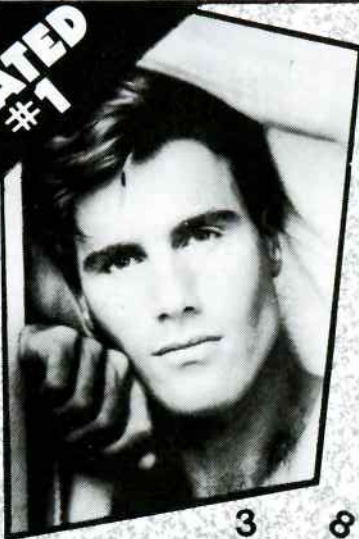



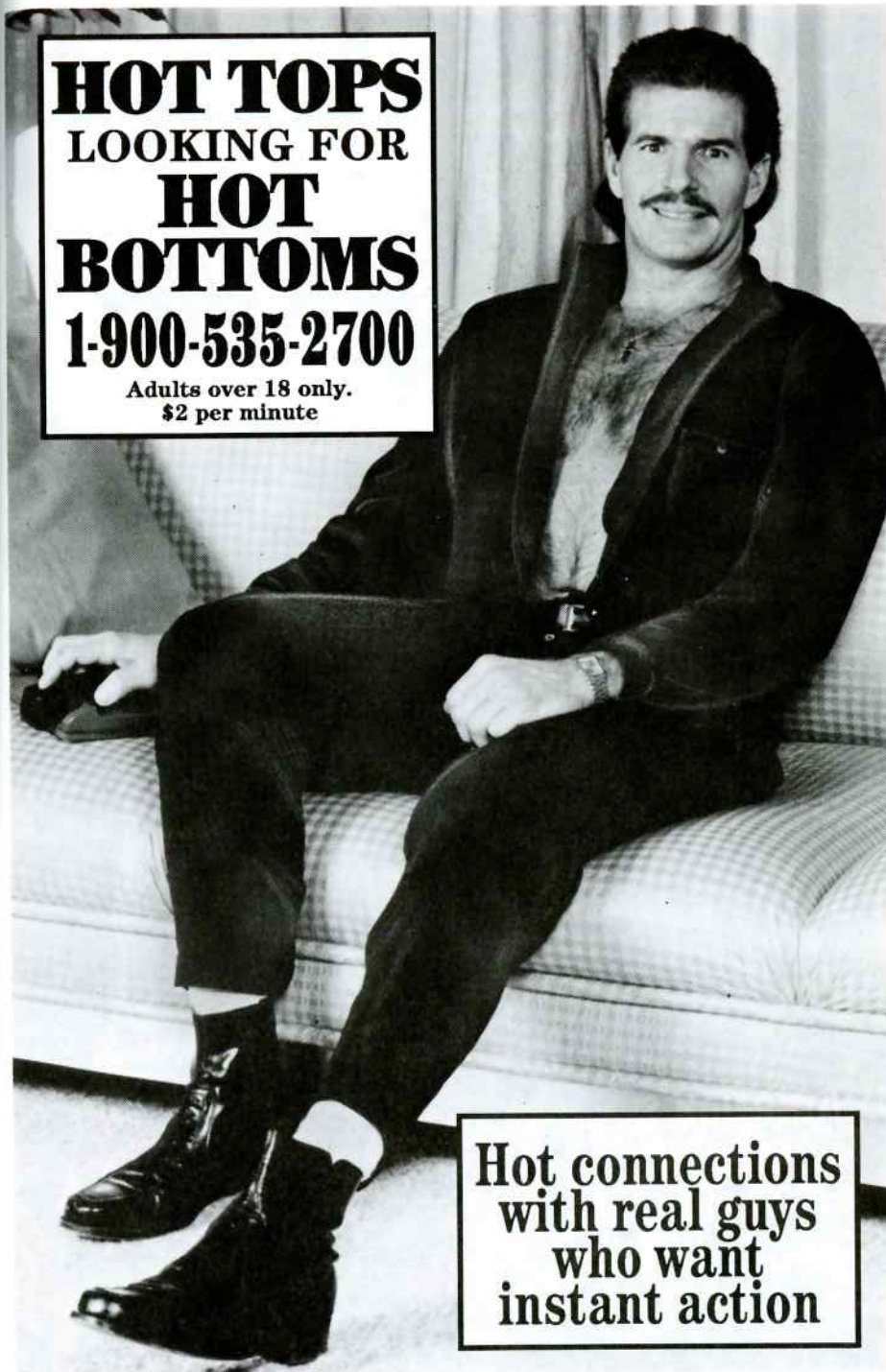
