HATE-CRIMES BILL EXPECTED TO BECOME LAW OCTOBER 2

*Bill Requires DPS to Act as
Statewide Repository for Statistics
Gathered by Law Enforcement.*

AUSTIN — The recent special session of the Texas Legislature passed a hate-crimes bill that will enforce statistics-gathering provisions of the Federal Hate Crimes Statistics Act, which has been in effect for some time but has largely been ignored by Texas and most other states.

The hate-crimes legislation was amended onto a bill dealing with prison overcrowding which is expected to be signed into law by Gov. Ann Richards on October 1. The hate-crimes bill will then go into effect the next day, October 2.

The Federal Hate Crimes Act requires states to keep statistics on the number of hate crimes committed. Unfortunately, the Federal law contains no sanctions against states that fail to comply with the act, and it does not provide funds to help in the implementation of a hate-crimes reporting system.

Because of these lax provisions, Texas, along with most other states, has failed to comply with the Federal statute. The hate crimes bill passed by the Texas Legislature rectifies that situation by requiring the Department of Public Safety [DPS] to comply with the Federal law.

The new state law will require local police departments to keep records of hate-related crimes and report these records to the Department of Public Safety. DPS will act as a repository for hate crimes committed across the state.

Concerning the efficiency of the system, Eiserloh said, "I believe the statistics-keeping system will work; however, we must all do our part. If someone in our community is involved in a hate-related crime, they must report this incident as a hate crime to the police."

"Until the police are accustomed to reporting hate crimes, we may have to help them out."

The hate-crimes bill does not include penalty-enhancement provisions, but Eiserloh said it was nevertheless a very important first step in the fight against hate crimes, and she stressed the importance of statistics-gathering.



"Statistics help prevent the people who make and enforce laws from denying that a problem exists... They will give us the information that we need to fight all kinds of battles to protect the gay and lesbian community."

Eiserloh also said there was a chance the Legislature would pass penalty-enhancement provisions in the next special session, tentatively scheduled for next February.

DGA MEETING ADDRESSES ISSUE OF DRAG IN PARADE

*Ross Emphasizes that Impersonators
Are Welcome in Dallas Celebration;
Civil Rights Ordinance, Property
Enhancements Also Discussed.*

DALLAS — The recent monthly meeting of the Dallas Gay Alliance [DGA] turned into a veritable "Desert Storm" as various people and organizations voiced their grievances concerning the upcoming Alan Ross Freedom Parade. Members of the leather community and some female impersonators have claimed that they are being discriminated against by parade organizers.

Alan Ross, who was fundamental in the original organization of the parade back in 1980, moderated the program, which included a brief history of the event. The parade officially became known as the Alan Ross Texas Freedom Parade last year in honor of Ross' work in its behalf.

Ross explained that a dress code was initiated in 1984 that encouraged novelty costumes, but not anything overtly sexual or revealing. He said that, according to the original dress code, drag could only be part of a float and not in open cars, because some people had been falling out of their vehicles because of their elaborate costumes. The code has now been amended to allow drag in open vehicles as well as on foot.

"We have never discriminated against anyone," Ross declared. "The lead banner has been carried the last two years by female impersonators."

When discussion was opened to the crowd, many people echoed the sentiments Ross had expressed. "The problem is not drag showing up at the parade, but the shame of others being queer," one person said. He cited the ban on media coverage of the annual Black Tie Dinner due to the fact that so many of the participants are closeted.

Gary Monier, president of the Dallas Tavern Guild, which supports the parade through various fund-raising events, said there was more to the gay community than drag. "I've done drag myself, but do we want the straight world to see just that? Every organization needs guidelines."

Many of the members of the Dallas Tavern Guild were present at the DGA meeting, and they expressed the feeling that conflict over the issue of drag in the parade could have been avoided if it had been addressed directly, rather than through "the back alley."

"You can come to me directly," Ross said, "and we can discuss problems. You can even call me personally at home."

Another person attending the meeting argued that the rules were not enforced constantly, but rather selectively. "You are discriminating against drag people," someone else added. "We raise money, and now you are telling us that we are not a part of the community."



"We have never discriminated against anyone," states Texas Freedom Parade coordinator Alan Ross.

Throughout the meeting, Ross constantly restated his claim that no one is being discriminated against by parade

organizers. "The parade is a matter of pride, and we want to keep it that way. It is not a protest march," he said.

In other DGA news, Tom Kane of the Dallas Gay Political Caucus, a division of DGA, said that passage of a civil rights ordinance including sexual preference will be a top issue in the upcoming November city elections. He said plans are being formulated to hold a meeting with all the mayoral candidates to field questions from the DGA membership.

George McDaniel reported on the addition the new air conditioning system donated by Schneider General. The value of the system was estimated at about \$30,000. McDaniel also reported that the kitchen facilities were being updated by money received from the Design Industries Foundation for AIDS. "We now have a part-time staff person coordinating the volunteers who help around here. Things are really starting to look better," he added.

John Thomas, Executive Director of the AIDS Resource Center, reported that the Food Pantry is serving 641 clients on an active basis, with over 1,100 visits to the Pantry in the last month. There were almost 1,700 calls to the AIDS hotline, due in part to a scare letter that appeared in a local paper about someone intentionally infecting people with HIV. The Wellness Program of the Nelson-Tebedo Clinic for early intervention was started last month, Thomas reported, and 150 HIV tests were given during that period.

Brian Drummond reported on the Putting Down Roots campaign for planting 20 new trees around the grounds and parking area of the community center.

The center was required to make the improvements before the city would grant it a permanent use permit. The facility is in the midst of a multi-family zoned area. The trees can be purchased for \$1,000 each, by a group, individual or corporation, Drummond explained. "It will really make a difference in the appearance of our building. It is a matter of pride."

Tom Kane also mentioned the so-called Oak Lawn plan being considered by the city, which would place new restrictions on dance halls in the area and possibly force them to close. He urged the members to call their councilpersons and to attend the planning committee meeting on September 26 at City Hall.

"The Oak Lawn plan would send shock waves through our community," he said.

SAN ANTONIANS OUTRAGED OVER SENTENCE GIVEN GAY MAN'S KILLER

*Bexar County DA Lets Defendant
Plead Guilty in Exchange for
Ten Years' Probation with
Deferred Adjudication*

SAN ANTONIO — Leaders of both the gay and Hispanic communities reacted with outrage to news that a young serviceman was given a light sentence in the killing of a gay Hispanic man.

Thirty-seven-year-old substitute teacher Charles Perez Resendez was beaten to death on New Year's Day of 1990. Marine police cadet Nicolo J. Giangrasso, who was 18 at the time, admitted killing Resendez, but said he did so because Resendez had made homosexual advances toward him.

Giangrasso has given conflicting accounts of just what happened the night he murdered Resendez. Shortly after his arrest, he told police Resendez had made advances toward him after they stopped at a local motel.

However, shortly before accepting the plea bargain agreement, Giangrasso said he had awakened in the motel room the next morning to find Resendez in bed next to him. He said he assumed at the time that he had been drugged or raped; then he beat Resendez to death.

Bexar County District Attorney Steve Hilbig negotiated a plea bargain with Giangrasso whereby the defendant agreed to plead guilty in exchange for a sentence of ten years' probation with deferred adjudication.

Deferred adjudication means that if Giangrasso successfully completes his probation, records of his guilty plea and related court action will be erased, although the arrest record will remain.

Some community activists claim that the plea bargain arranged by Hilbig and approved by Judge Terry McDonald amounts to "judicial gay bashing" and that it conveys the message that killing gays is not a crime.

Laurie Eiserloh, director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, said an attempt would be made to file a complaint

against both Hilbig and McDonald. She acknowledged, however, that such a move might prove difficult as no trial was actually held, and so there is no trial record to examine.

But Eiserloh said it was encouraging that both the gay and Hispanic communities had reacted so forcefully to the light sentence given Giangrasso.

HOUSTON POLICE CLAIM PROGRESS IN FIGHTING HATE CRIME

*Incidents Involving Gays Now
Included in Hate Crime Definition.*

HOUSTON — The Houston Police Department recently changed its definition of hate crimes to include gays and lesbians, and is pointing to that and other changes as evidence that it is making progress in the fight against such incidents.

According to the revised definition adopted by HPD, "A hate crime is a criminal offense committed against a race, religion, ethnic/national origin group or sexual orientation group." Another change adopted by HPD is that the department will now view all hate crimes as "major, possibly organized criminal acts" and will give them the highest investigative priority possible.

Initial investigation and reporting of hate crimes remains the responsibility of the individual police officer out on the beat. Followup investigation will be carried out by various investigative divisions, including the Criminal Intelligence Division.

Sharon Thornton of the HPD Media Relations Office explained that the Criminal Intelligence Division will have specially trained staff who will make the final determination of whether an offense will be classified as a hate crime.

As part of the department's professed attempts to strengthen its efforts against hate crimes, several HPD representatives recently took part in a "Hate Crimes Training Conference" conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation in Dallas.

Toni Knight, president of the Houston Gay and Lesbian Political Caucus, told TWT NEWS that the inclusion of gays in the department's new definition of hate crimes is "the first concrete change in how

hate crimes committed against gays and lesbians are addressed by HPD."

Knight acknowledged that individual officers might not report incidents as hate crimes, and she encouraged people who felt they had been the victims of such crimes but couldn't convince the police to report them as such to get in touch with the Caucus.

"We want the police to know how important it is to us that they begin keeping track of these incidents and investigating them."

MACT CHAPTER FORMS IN AUSTIN

Newly Formed Group for Gay Black and White Men Holding Party on September 28.

AUSTIN — Gay men interested in getting to know others of different races or ethnic groups in the capital city area now have a new group addressing their interests and needs.

The Austin chapter of Men of All Colors Together [MACT] will be celebrating its founding with a party on September 28.

MACT, which in some cities goes by the name Black and White Men Together [BWMT], traces its origins back to groups formed in several American cities in 1980 by and for interracial-oriented black and white gay men.

In 1981, a gathering of such groups from around the country was held in San Francisco, and out of that meeting a national organization, Black and White Men Together, evolved.

Craig White of MACT explained that at first the interracial aspect was the focus of BWMT/MACT groups, but that men now find many reasons to join. One of MACT's premises is that getting to know people of different races and cultural backgrounds can really strengthen individuals and the gay community as a whole, he said.

"Some chapters have chosen the name 'Men of All Colors Together' to reflect the ethnic makeup of their own locale," White continued. "All chapters, however, engage in educational, cultural and social activities committed to fostering supportive environments wherein racial and cultural barriers can be overcome."

"Discussions have led to political action in some cities, to expose and eliminate the

subtle and overt manifestations of racism in society and the gay community in particular. Rap groups and consciousness-raising discussions are a mainstay of the organization."

Anyone interested in joining MACT/Austin or attending the party on September 28 may call White at (512)452-7360.

White said that forming an Austin chapter of BWMT/MACT is one step toward unifying the gay community in Austin. "Networking with other chapters is encouraged, for the exchange of ideas and the establishment of brotherhood, the organization's most important goal."

FINN & DRIGGS HOLD AUSTIN WORKSHOPS ON MALE RELATIONSHIPS

Waterloo Counseling Center Sponsors Lectures by Authors of 'Intimacy Between Men.'

AUSTIN — Stephen Finn, Ph.D. and John Driggs, a social worker, authors of the popular book *Intimacy Between Men*, will be giving lectures and conducting a workshop exploring issues of intimacy and relationship-building among gay men later this month.

Sponsored by Waterloo Counseling Center, the lectures are scheduled for Friday, September 27, and the workshop will be held the next day, Saturday, September 28.

On Friday evening, Dr. Finn will speak on "Uniting Sexuality and Intimacy in Gay Male Relationships." He explained to TWT NEWS that gay men are just like other people in that many of them desire sexual closeness, but find it difficult to unite intimacy and sexuality in one relationship.

"I will be exploring the origins of a split between sexuality and intimacy in gay men and give practical suggestions for how to achieve relationships that encompass both qualities," Dr. Finn said.

Driggs will speak on "Finding Our Fathers: Gay Men's First Relationship with a Man." Driggs told TWT NEWS, "Many gay men grow up with a deep ambivalence about their fathers—a longing to be accepted and understood, and resentment and fear due to rejections."

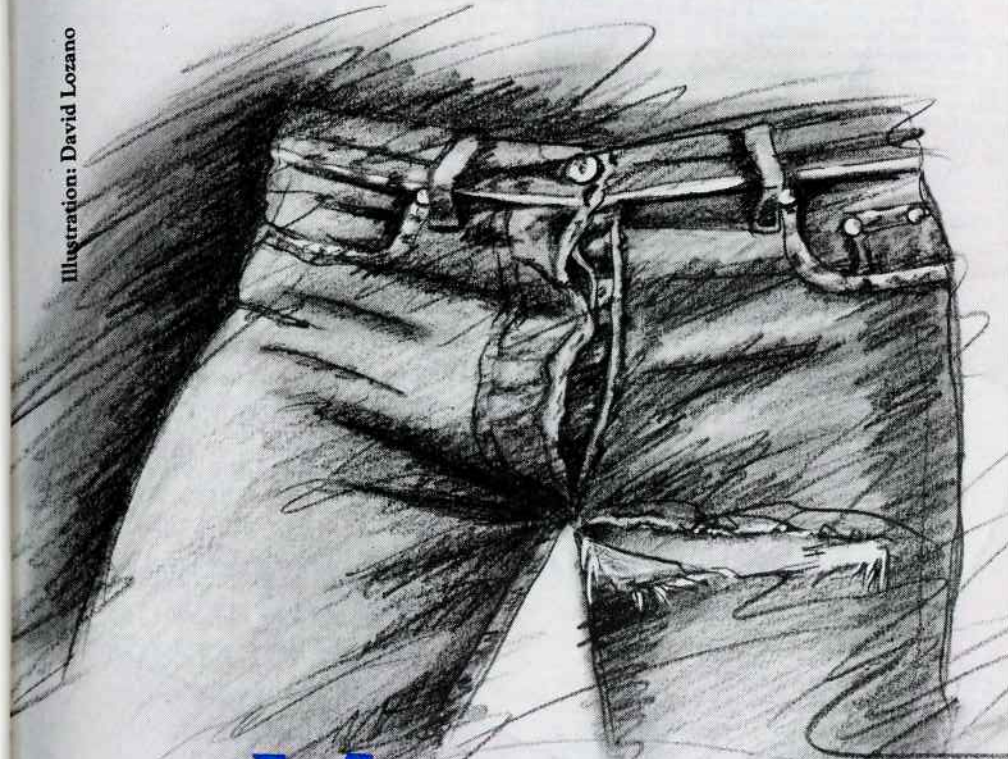

commitments more difficult and complicated," he added. Drigg's talk will explore the realities of gay men's relationships with their fathers and offer suggestions on how to reapproach one's father and grieve over what is not possible.

VENICE City of Serenity

Imagine a city seemingly rising from the sea. A city of unique and unparalleled beauty. A place that inspired one of Shakespeare's best plays. A setting where Richard Wagner could compose, and Lord Byron and Henry James would write. Galileo tested his telescope here and this is where Marco Polo began his journeys. A city that could lead Thomas Mann to write, *Death in Venice*, a depressing tale of a middle-aged man who dies of a mysterious plague before he can reconcile his obsession with a teenage boy.

A city with a dark side? The movie *Don't Look Now*, starring Donald Sutherland, gave a dreamlike vision of a man who foresees his own death, a hallucinogenic chronicle featuring a homicidal dwarf. A city famous for its masked balls and carnivals. A city haunted by ghosts? How can one city be so many things? History and background may provide some clues, but perhaps you have to see it for yourself.

Venice is actually 117 small islands separated by 150 canals and joined by 400 bridges, situated on Italy's northeastern Adriatic coast. Anyone visiting the city should have suitable footwear and be prepared to do a great deal of walking.

Over the passage of time, the city has undergone several transformations. It began as a place of refuge in the fifth century from barbarian attacks on the mainland. During the Crusades, Venice became a powerful city-state, dominating the entire Mediterranean. In the Renaissance period it was the focal point for the great trade routes to the Middle East.

Enormously wealthy, the city was able to finance spectacular art and architecture. In 1797, 1,000 years of Venetian independence ended when Napoleon traded the territory to Austria. Hapsburg rule ended in 1866 when the city joined the newly unified Italy. Today Venice is a city of 132,000.

The best place to take stock of the city is St. Mark's Square, the center of life in Venice. Take the elevator to the top of the 324-foot red campanile (bell tower) and en-

joy a breathtaking view on all sides, a vista of red-shingled roofs and countless domes. Down at the bottom you can mingle with thousands of tourists and pigeons.

Before setting out to investigate the marvelous structures surrounding the square, take a break at one of the cafes lining its environs. Indulge yourself with some gelati, the Italian ice cream. Sorry, Bluebell, but it's the best in the world.

Then proceed to The Doge's Palace. The Doges were Venice's chief magistrates. The pink and white building was a combination White House, Senate, Supreme Court, torture chamber and prison. The palace is filled with paintings, frescoes and carvings. A tour will take you through vast halls, grand staircases and secret corridors.

You can also walk across the famous Bridges of Sighs, named for the moans of prisoners on their way to execution. Next door to the palace is St. Mark's Basilica, founded in 832 A.D. and built to house the tomb of St. Mark the Evangelist, the city's patron saint. According to legend, his

bones were smuggled out of Alexandria, Egypt, to reside here.

The easiest and most scenic way out of the square is by the Vaporetti, or city water buses. A ride down the Grand Canal is an experience not to be missed. Lined with some 200 marble palaces built between the twelfth and eighteenth centuries, it has been called the finest street in the world. Traveling it at night when it's aglow with light will give you an entirely different perspective.

Moving along the Grand Canal, you come to The Rialto Bridge. More than a mere bridge, it is also a trademark covered with stalls, hung with all types of merchandise. It is the entrance to the heart of Venice's shopping district.

There is so much to see in Venice that almost every building seems worthy of inspection or a photograph. If you have the time, tour as many of the churches as you can. One in particular, St. Mary's Church, known simply as The Frari, is quite splendid. Inside are two of Titian's masterpieces. Another wonderful structure is the Scuola Grande di San Rocco, which contains a rich collection of paintings by Tintoretto.

You'll also want to see The Accademia, the Venetian Academy of Fine Arts. Here you can view paintings of Venice from the fourteenth to the eighteenth centuries, which will give you an idea of how the city looked and changed over the years. See it through the eyes of great painters like Canaletto and Bellini. If you're interested in fabric and design, The Fortuny Museum, located on the second floor of the fifteenth-century gothic palace, is right up your alley. The rooms are just as Fortuny left them at the beginning of this century.

You may feel you just can't leave Venice without a gondola ride, but a one-hour tour of the city could easily cost you \$50. If you're on a budget, there is still a way of getting around this. At various points along The Grand Canal, some distance from the bridges, you can take a ferry ride by gondola from one side to the other for 15¢. You'll have to stand and it only lasts a few moments, but at least you can say you experienced it.

While walking in Venice, you will notice the light and color of your surroundings. At different times of the day, the buildings appear to change hues and shades, an ongoing process that will delight you. No computer-enhanced graphics could ever come close to creating this effect, and it will linger on in your mind for years to come.

No matter how crowded Venice gets during the day, you can always find a place, sometimes just a few feet from a main passageway, where you'll find peace and serenity. At night, as the shops roll down their protective doors, the narrow, twisted streets and alleys become a land of shadows and dreams. It's easy to imagine yourself transported back in time to when Marco Polo walked these very same paths.

Color, lighting and an overwhelming sense of history make Venice a unique place that is hard to put into words.

So, is Venice a magical, mythical place as Henry James description of people who visited there would indicate? He said that they, "... have seemed to find here something that no other place could give." Or is it more like D.H. Lawrence said, "An abhorrent, green, slippery city"? You'll have to be the judge. As for me, I'd go back in a minute.

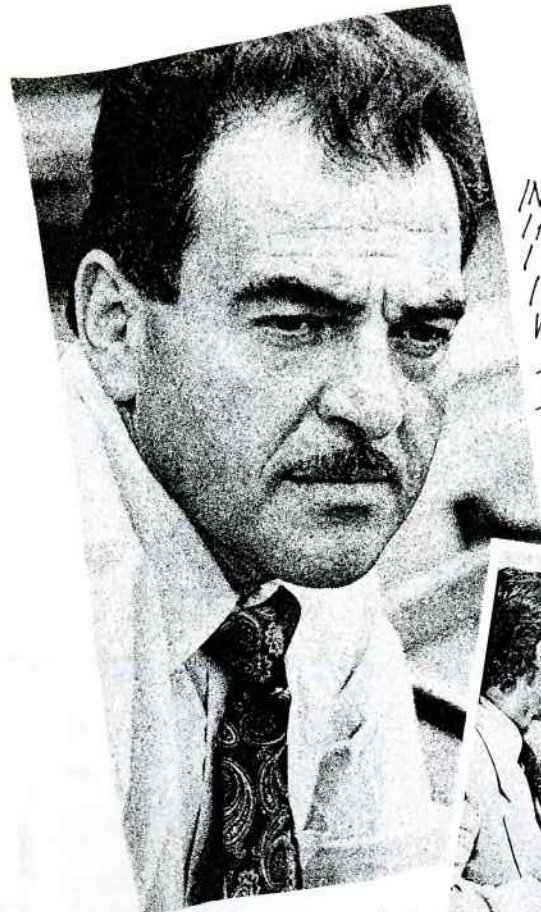

Is homosexuality biological? Maybe. Should we ask Jerry Falwell? ABC News did.

ABC News Nightline with Ted Koppel asked the question "Is Homosexuality Biological?" on their August 30 edition. The question has been getting a lot of attention lately because a neurological scientist, Dr. Simon LeVay, has come up with tentative findings that a small part of the brain is responsible for sexuality, at least in men.

Nightline took on the topic, and invited Dr. Richard Green and Dr. Evelyn Hooker, both basically pro-gay, to talk about the implications of this research. The opening film report was balanced. Having an openly lesbian or gay person would certainly have improved things, but as far as it went, it could be considered acceptable coverage. Except that, also invited to appear as an "expert" on the show was the Rev. Jerry Falwell.

As a result, much of the program centered on Falwell's assertions that, regardless of cause, homosexuality can and should be "cured" through religious conversion, and the other guests were forced to react to Falwell rather than discuss the scientific possibilities. It's news to us that Falwell has apparently become an expert on neurology.

It's an unfortunately common practice of investigative-type television to include an anti-gay "expert" whenever lesbian or gay issues or people are discussed. It's insulting to gays and lesbians to have our ex-

istence discussed without our input. And it's inexcusable for a major news show to give a free forum to a professional hater like Falwell.

What Nightline didn't say about Falwell, and what Falwell himself would possibly like to keep quiet, is that he makes a living off his homophobia. Falwell's far-right Liberty Foundation raises funds by exploiting the hatred of gays. Falwell recently sent out a fund-raising letter dealing exclusively with what he calls the "wicked agenda" of "radical homosexuals."

In it he cries, "We cannot allow the homosexuals to rule America!" and, among other things, professes to have a "national battle plan ready to be implemented to defeat the radical homosexual movement." It's impossible to imagine how Nightline thought Falwell could be a reasonable addition to a panel on a gay issue.

Some people still have just not got it into their heads that gay and lesbian people pay taxes just like everyone else, and sometimes even in greater amounts than others. With the party season of 1980 just a fond memory, the editors of the magazine were faced with the age-old dilemma of how to entertain the over 50,000 Texassexuals who perused the pages of the periodical.

Thanks to the inimitable talents of **Carl Cochran**, however, boredom was not to be a problem because, faced with this challenge, Mr. Cochran reached back into his own personal archives and extracted his game show masterpiece, "The First 'Just How Gay Are You, Anyway?' Quiz, Part II, Again." And with bonus round questions such as "The first night you spent in jail you . . ." and multiple guess responses such as "(a) got mad," "(b) planned retaliation," "(c) redecored the cell" and "(d) had a catered dinner party for 200," it was no wonder he was consistently relied on to provide comic relief.

Speaking of relief, then-President Jimmy Carter offered the gay community plenty of it during a campaign swing through Houston. In the first-ever NEWS conference support of gay rights by any American President, Mr. Carter declared "No one is free until all are free," and, later in a conversation with HGPC President **Lee Harrington**, "We hope to do as much as we can for gay rights."
