TEXANS TO JOIN IN CELEBRATING NAT'L COMING OUT DAY

*Date Commemorates 1987
National March on Washington
While Increasing Visibility of
Lesbians & Gay Men.*

TEXAS — Four years ago, in October of 1987, gays and lesbians from all over the nation converged on Washington, D.C. for the second National March on Washington for Lesbian and Gay Rights.

National Coming Out Day was created both to commemorate that historic event and to help increase the visibility of gays and lesbians by encouraging them to take that most important step, both personal and political in nature, in self-acceptance: coming out.

Texans will be celebrating along with the rest of the country, and various local organizations have planned special events to help get people into the spirit of the day.

In Dallas, as in past years, representatives of the Dallas Gay Alliance and other groups will celebrate the day by calling attention to the fact that gays and lesbians still cannot obtain legal recognition of their relationships.

They will gather in front of the Records Building at noon and, after a brief press conference, will proceed into the building and ask to be issued marriage licenses. After they are turned down, they will again gather outside for a "kiss-in."

DGA board member Gary Bellomy told TWT NEWS he anticipated strong participation by groups like ACT UP and Lesbian Visionaries. Bellomy stressed, however, that participation in the event would not be limited to couples. "This event has symbolic significance. We welcome people who are not coupled, and ask them to bring friends."

In Houston, the local tribe of Queer Nation is hosting a party on October 11 from 7 p.m.-2 a.m. at DiverseWorks, 1117 East Freeway. Featured will be entertainers from the West Coast and New York, as well as local talent.

Space will be available free to community service organizations who wish to sell refreshments or merchandise, or to promote their causes. The highlight of the evening will be the Coming Out Debu-



tantes, who are intended to serve as positive models of the meaning of National Coming Out Day, of being out and proud.

The Queer Nation party is being underwritten by area clubs, businesses and individuals who support Queer Nation. There will be a \$5 cover charge. For more information, call Tracy Brown at (713)524-4657.

In San Antonio, the San Antonio Lesbian & Gay Assembly [SALGA] will celebrate Coming Out Day by sponsoring a party on Friday at the Bonham Ballroom. The festivities begin at 7:30 p.m., and will include music, a cash bar, free food and nonalcoholic beverages.

DALLAS LIFEWALK THIS WEEKEND

*6 1/2-Mile Event Raises Funds for
Oak Lawn Community Services.*

DALLAS — The weekend for LifeWalk is finally here, but it's still not too late to get involved. The six-and-one-half mile walk through Oak Lawn, the downtown area and the West End which benefits Oak Lawn Community Services kicks off Sunday, October 6 at noon in Lee Park.

"We want people to know that we will walk, come rain or shine," organizer Fred York told Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS. "Of course, we hope we'll have beautiful weather. Everyone should dress comfortably, in walking clothes."

LifeWalk is a fund-raiser for OLCS in which donations will be collected prior to the event. A minimum donation of \$10 is

requested of each participant, and those donating \$50 or more will receive a free T-shirt through the mail after the walk.

"This will be a really fun day for all involved," York said, "but we are doing it for a serious reason. We want to remind everyone about the thousands of friends and loved ones who are living with AIDS. We are asking people to give us one-half day of their time to raise funds for those who need it."

The walk will start at approximately 1 p.m. and last until 3:30, when participants return to Lee Park. There will be entertainment in the park, including performances by Rayn, Barbara Ann Humphries and Southern Mirage. Refreshments will be available, and everyone is encouraged to bring a picnic lunch.

For further information or to obtain registration forms, call (214)520-3339. Last-minute registration can also be done at the park prior to the walk.

"We are asking people to bring donations in the form of checks, made out to LifeWalk," York explained. "We will have first and second prizes for both individuals and groups who raise the most money. Bring a friend and walk together for those who need it!"

PAMALA STANLEY TO PERFORM AT SA GAY FIESTA

*This Year's Event Includes
Raffle for Two Trips, Gourmet
Tour Of Alamo City.*

SAN ANTONIO — Recording superstar Pamala Stanley, a longtime entertainment favorite with Texans, is bringing her act to the Alamo City for Gay Fiesta 1991. Stanley will headline two special performances during the event, which takes place on Sunday, October 13 at La Villita Assembly Hall from noon to 8 p.m.

Stanley will perform "This Is Hot," "I Don't Want to Talk About It," "Coming Out of Hiding," "If Looks Could Kill" and other hits. She was nominated in 1984 for Grammy awards for both Record of the Year and Best Female Vocalist, and she has had three top 20 hits on the Billboard dance charts.

Organizers of this year's Gay Fiesta said they had worked to make the event bigger

and better than in previous years, with more booths, better entertainment and more community involvement. There will be several new features this year, including a Fiesta Raffle with prizes like a round trip for two to New Orleans, sponsored by Anchors Aweigh Cruises and Tours, and a weekend for two at the gay-owned and operated Seahorse Inn in Port Aransas.

Also being raffled off is a special gourmet dinner tour for two to four people of some of San Antonio's trendiest restaurants, presented by Magnolia Gardens, Cafe Camille, Rosarios and Little Naples. Raffle tickets are 50¢ each and give the purchaser three chances to win.

Gay Fiesta volunteers will be out in area clubs on Friday and Saturday nights selling originally designed Gay Fiesta T-shirts, advance tickets and raffle tickets. T-shirts are \$12 and tickets are \$5, or \$6 on the day of the event.

Gay Fiesta Coordinator Evan Pope invited everyone to come out and have fun at Gay Fiesta this year. "This will be an event not to be missed, one that San Antonio will not soon forget."

GAME NIGHT FOR YOUTH AT DALLAS' COMMUNITY CENTER

DALLAS — Young gay people in the metroplex who are too young to get into clubs now have a place to go and have fun on Saturday nights. Beginning this month, the Gay and Lesbian Community Center will be holding alternative Game Nights, chaperoned by one of Dallas' most popular entertainers.

Patti Le Plae Safe, who is sponsoring the Game Nights, told TWT NEWS that, though the weekly gatherings are aimed at gay and lesbian youth, "Our doors will be open to anyone, not just gays and lesbians."

HOUSTON GLPC ENDORSES CANDIDATES FOR CITY ELECTIONS

*Whitmire Gets Nod for Mayor;
District C Endorsement Goes to
Former Caucus President Parker.*

HOUSTON — The Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus voted to endorse an incumbent mayor for reelection and one of its former presidents for a seat on City Council.

Mayor Kathy Whitmire, who is running for her fifth term as mayor this year, had not asked for the caucus's endorsement since 1987. This year she did seek the group's endorsement, and even spoke at the caucus's candidate endorsement meeting held on September 25.

Some GLPC members speculated that Whitmire had sought the caucus' approval because this year's mayoral race is shaping up as much more competitive than previous contests. GLPC voted to endorse Whitmire over her opponents, state Rep. Sylvester Turner and Bob Lanier.

In her speech to caucus members, the Mayor said she would continue trying to work with the gay and lesbian community to combat problems like AIDS and discrimination.

Speaking of the problem of crimes committed against gays, Whitmire said, "We had all hoped that the kind of horror associated with hate crimes was in our past, but we now know that is not so."

Turner claimed in his address that Houston could be a much better city. In trying to convey his vision for the future, Turner spoke of leading the city out of the "dark ages, into the glorious light—that's the kind of city I want to be part of."

Former HGLPC president Annise Parker easily won the caucus's endorsement in the race for City Council District C. Parker, who received a standing ovation when her turn came to speak, recalled her years of service to the community, and said she would always represent the gay and lesbian community.

District C incumbent Vince Ryan reminded the audience that he had lived in and been actively involved in the Montrose area since long before he became a City Councilman in 1987.

GLPC also voted to endorse incumbent Ernest McGowen for District B; May Walker, a police officer and current president of the Afro American Police Officers League, over incumbent Al Calloway for District D; incumbent Ben Reyes for District I; and incumbent Beverley Clark over activist Sylvia Ayres for at-large Position 1.

Also getting the caucus's endorsement were incumbent Eleanor Tinsley for at-large Position 2; incumbent Jim Greenwood over Ken Willett and Lee Demas for at-large Position 3; incumbent Sheila Jackson Lee for at-large Position 4; and Glenda Joe over Judson Robinson III for at-large Position 5.

The caucus endorsed incumbent City Controller George Greanias, as well as educator Carrie McAfee over Arthur M. Gaines Jr. for Houston school board District 4 seat.

Garnet Coleman, who came in second in the race to replace the late Rep. Larry

Evans, stopped by to thank the caucus for their support. He stressed that he needed more help to win the runoff, which will be held October 15.

Also getting the GLPC nod was Proposition 2, a measure which would limit elected city officials to three two-year terms in office.

CDC BROADENS DEFINITION OF AIDS

*Expected Increase in Numbers May
Strain Already Burdened Agencies;
HIV Now on List of Top 10 Killers.*

TEXAS — The Centers for Disease Control in Atlanta has announced a change in the way it defines AIDS, and the resulting increase in the caseload may further strain already overburdened AIDS service agencies.

According to the current definition of AIDS, one must test positive for antibody to HIV, have an immune deficiency for no apparent reason and also have experienced one of a list of opportunistic infections or secondary malignancies.

The revised definition of AIDS, which is expected to go into effect early next year, will add to the count people who have T-helper cell counts of 200 or below.

The currently accepted list of illnesses that define AIDS has been criticized by some who believe it too restrictive. They claim it has led to undercounting of AIDS cases among women and IV drug users, for instance.

HIV-infected women, in particular, often suffer from conditions peculiar to women but which are not on the list of AIDS-defining illnesses.

AIDS service agencies in Texas, faced with ever-increasing caseloads and, in some cases, declines in private contributions and government funding, may find their budgets stretched way beyond the breaking point.

Bill Hunt, with the AIDS Resource Center's Food Pantry, said the agency had seen a 100% increase in its caseload over the last year. The huge jump in demand has been accompanied by a decrease in government funding. Dallas City Council, for instance, recently voted to cut the money it allocates for AIDS by 80%.

"We will do everything we can, however,

to avoid cutting the services we provide to our clients," Hunt assured.

The change in the definition of AIDS comes at a time when the disease has already climbed onto the list of the 10 leading causes of death in Texas.

According to figures released recently by the Texas Department of Health, 1,836 Texans died as a result of HIV infection, 354 more than the 1,482 who died of AIDS in 1989. AIDS has now moved into tenth place on the list, displacing cirrhosis of the liver.

TROUBLE AT DALLAS' AIDS ARMS NETWORK

*Outgoing Director Claims Progress
In Resolving Funding Crisis.*

DALLAS — Officials with the AIDS ARMS Network, which serves as a conduit for state and federal money to local AIDS service agencies, have admitted that the Network received \$85,000 from a Texas Department of Health grant which the agency then failed to pass on to subcontracting organizations.

Outgoing director Warren Buckingham insists, however, that AIDS ARMS is making progress in closing the funding gap. Buckingham said the final payment on a Texas Department of Health grant, together with proceeds from a special fundraising program, should enable the agency to make overdue payments to Dallas-area subcontractors.

Buckingham earlier stated that he would be resigning effective October 31, but he actually left the agency on Monday, September 30. He has claimed that he was unaware of the trouble that had developed at the Network and that resulted in the current funding crisis.

Don Maison, executive director of AIDS Services of Dallas, said his organization has had to lay off nine employees, and might not be able to meet its mid-October payroll if AIDS ARMS did not come across with all the money due his agency. AIDS Services of Dallas has two residential facilities and cares for about 40 clients.

Most other Dallas AIDS agencies who receive funding through AIDS ARMS have indicated that they were watching the situation closely, but did not anticipate having to make drastic cuts in service as a result of the problems.

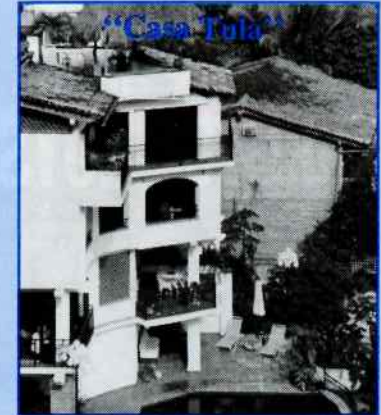
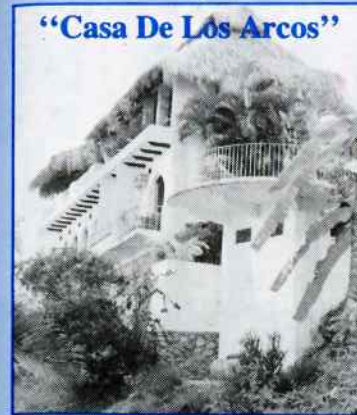

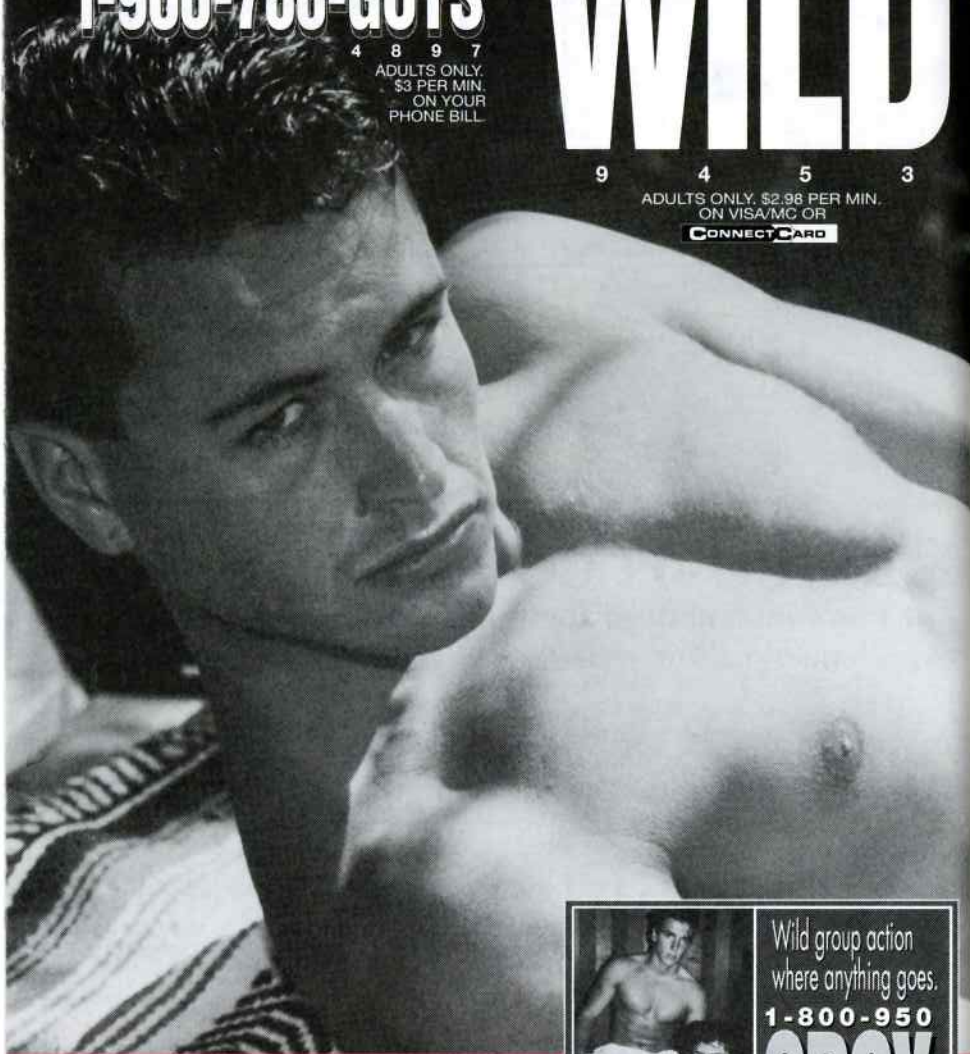

Setting Record Straight About Coors Boycott

Dear TWT:

I read with considerable interest the **TWT VIEWPOINT** [Vol. 17, #29] by David Herndon. Mr. Herndon's account of what happened to the former employee of the *Greensheet*

was nothing short of creative. Several of us stood with Mike and his mother Clare through that ordeal and know firsthand how ruthless Helen Gordon was toward Mike and how insensitive to his medical needs.

But what really disturbed me was Herndon's remarks about the Coors boycott. Coors admitted every element of what Herndon calls an "unfounded rumor." John Russo, Coors' public relations director, flew to Houston with resolutions by the Coors Board of Directors meeting every demand set forth by the boycott resolution adopted by the Houston Gay Political Caucus (now HGLPC).

The company pledged to ask no questions about sexual orientation in their job application process or in their polygraph testing, but they admitted to having done that in the past. They pledged to stop major supportive advertising in publications that take editorial positions opposed to basic civil rights protections for gay and lesbian people, but they admitted doing that in the past.

So outraged was one of the Coors brothers at the corporation's action on these demands that he sold his stock to other members of the family and became a right-wing crusader independent of the support of the brewer.

I know Herndon opposed the Coors boycott at the time, but he cannot alter the fact that Coors admitted their wrongdoing and surrendered to the pressure of the boycott. I can only assume his position on the *Greensheet* issue is based on more misinformation.

As to people's knowledge of our history, I, too, regret that we have not done a better job of teaching it. Perhaps if some of us remembered our history more clearly, we could pass it on to subsequent generations more accurately.

Queer Nation Responds on the Greensheet Issue

Since the inception of Queer Nation Houston, its primary purpose has been to "zap" homophobia (discrimination) in all of its forms. Unfortunately, homophobia has struck our community in a most brutal way... death.

After the march that took over Montrose and Westheimer, Queer Nation voted to declare Montrose a "discrimination-free zone." Any form of discrimination that goes unaddressed escalates, and the end result is murder.

As of eight weeks ago, the *Greensheet* would not allow the words "gay," "lesbian" or "homosexual," nor would it allow same-sex ads in its "Heart T Heart" section. This paper distributes 300,000 copies citywide and 52,000 in its Inner Loop edition weekly. It is distributed through businesses and vending stands free of charge, but its distribution points are paid a fee to allow its distribution.

We are incensed by the company's policy, and have questioned whether people who advertised with them knew about it. After Paul's murder, our organization gathered many members, because we were sick and tired of just laying back,

waiting for bigoted society to one day come to us and say, "We were wrong. Discrimination is barbaric and inhuman, and we would like for you to have every right that we have." This is not likely to happen.

Unfortunately, the *Greensheet* could hide behind the laws (or lack of them) that so many who discriminate do. We did not want another innocent life to end. We have had enough.

Demands were placed on the *Greensheet* to change its policies. They would not, citing that their paper upheld "traditional family values" (as if we came from or had perverted families). On behalf of Queer Nation, I began calling all Montrose-area businesses that distributed this bigoted paper and informed them of the paper's policies and to whom they could speak to verify them.

Whole Foods, A Moveable Feast, Eckerd's, Walgreen's, Butera's, Apple Tree—in all, a total of 16 different locations—pulled the paper after my calls, to show their support of equality.

Not all businesses feel that equal moral treatment is appropriate or should be

mixed with business. Business before politics is their point, and they hide behind the same laws (or lack thereof) that the *Greensheet* uses.

This is not about businesses' political views, it is about gay-supported businesses' moral view of part of their customer base.

A boycott of the *Greensheet* and any business that chooses to distribute (making a profit) this blatantly discriminatory paper was called for. Another issue was the discrimination by the *Greensheet* against Mike King, a PWA who took a leave of absence only to have his insurance canceled without his knowledge. He performed to the highest standards and received awards of merit for sales records.

But he became a liability upon discovery of his health problem. This alone would, if the *Greensheet's* ad policies were not enough, be enough of a reason to pull the papers.

In the '50s, blacks turned on blacks out of fear, saying, "you don't need to start trouble by sitting in the front of the bus; we have a place to sit back there." This was not equality, and the reply was, "I too should be able to sit where I see fit, not constrained by my skin color."

All may not have agreed then with the "radical" demand simply to ride in a different seat, or eat at the same counter or use the same restroom. Now those views don't seem radical at all.

We can't win the war all at once, just a battle at a time. It would end sooner if we all stood up and demanded change. Queer Nation is addressing our fears, and we demand a seat at the front of the bus. Gay and lesbian brothers and sisters, we will save one for you no matter how much you choose to fight for it.

As we continue to work toward our goals, we have seen many victories. The Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus has supported our boycott, and now the *Greensheet* accepts the words "gay," "lesbian" and "homosexual." But they still exclude us from "Heart T Heart." We will not give up.

Two thousand people rallied to let the city know that we were no longer sitting targets for discrimination. Paul's murder was changed to a hate crime, the Woodlands had their shame marched through their own backyards, hate-crime legislation tracking crimes both state- and citywide passed—we assisted by sending

1,800 letters—C.I.D. was reinstated by the police department, police visibility grew overnight, the city of Houston changed its referral number for calls asking about homosexuality from a Christian fundamentalist organization to the Montrose Counseling Center, *Houston Metropolitan Magazine* now accepts same-sex ads, Juan Palomo has a job, the Greater AIDS Alliance has new outspoken members to keep us all informed, *Greensheet* is slowly leaving Montrose, and the city knows we again have found a voice and choose to use it on election day.

All of this happened because of the actions of Queer Nation, all the other gay/lesbian organizations and politicians in support of equality.

I and other members of Queer Nation have been personally accused of misrepresenting the truth and being politically ignorant. David Herndon has misrepresented my comments, failed to state that he received letters from GLPC President Toni Knight in support of the boycott, read letters published by both TWT and *The New Voice*, did not mention that he was part of the boycott until he gave in to bigotry by a few customers and received from the *Greensheet* a slanted view, and compared personal ad discrimination by the *Greensheet* to 14 other papers (one of which has not been published for a year and seven others of which don't have personal columns), and informed our group that if we protested outside his place of business, he would come out and "kick our asses."

I am new to Houston and have lived in cities where gays have rights, and after a brief stay here I saw that I could either run to the comfort of San Francisco or assist in making Houston an even finer city. Here Queer Nation fights with natives and newcomers, with anyone wanting equality.

Regarding the moral issue of discrimination, the only issue brought up, I ask of David and anyone else, is it okay to discriminate against anyone due to their age, race, sex religion, political affiliation or sexual orientation?

It seems that he has spent his time and effort slanting the truth, unearthing supporters of bigotry, only to rationalize your ability to discriminate.

As pride burns a brighter candle, letting everyone know that we demand equal rights and not special treatment, Queer Nation wins another victory.

Another in A Continuing Series of Reports
From Austin on Legislative Issues
Affecting Gays and Lesbians in Texas

Once again, the lesbian and gay community has been subjected to gay bashing, this time at the hands of Bexar County District Attorney Steve Hilbig and District Judge Terry McDonald.

Hilbig and McDonald have outraged activists across the state by allowing the murderer of a gay man to go free on probation with deferred adjudication. This means that the murderer will serve no jail time and, because of the deferred adjudication, he will have a clean record if he commits no crimes within the next 10 years.

At this time, there are no known witnesses to the murder. Therefore, we have only the defendant's version of the story. This is further complicated by the fact that the defendant told two different versions of the story, one upon arrest and another under oath. I will recount both versions; however, I must caution that neither version may be true.

On January 1, 1990, Marine Cadet Nicolo J. Giangrosso and some friends were attending a city-sponsored New Year's celebration in downtown San Antonio. Giangrosso, a resident of New Jersey, accepted a ride from Charles Perez Resendez, a gay man and a schoolteacher from San Antonio.

In the version of the story that Giangrosso told on the night of his arrest, he accepted a ride from a man who took him to a motel. Once there, the man told Giangrosso to wait in the truck and went

into his motel room. About 15 minutes later, Giangrosso entered the motel room and found the man naked on the bed. Giangrosso stated that he tried to leave but the man grabbed his arm. Giangrosso then brutally beat the man and killed him.

In the version of the story that he told under oath, Giangrosso passed out in the man's truck and woke up in a motel room with his pants around his knees, a used condom on the floor and the nude man next to him. Giangrosso concluded that he had been drugged and raped, and then beat the man to death. There has been little or no effort on behalf of the District Attorney's office to explore the inconsistencies in Giangrosso's stories.

Giangrosso was indicted for murder, but charged with manslaughter. Manslaughter can carry a sentence of up to 20 years, but as a result of a plea bargain, the sentence was reduced to probation with deferred adjudication.

At times like this, we as a community must focus our outrage and work for change. However, we must keep in mind what we can and cannot do.

Although many of us would like to see Giangrosso brought to justice, it is not possible to try him twice for the same offense. At the moment, the best thing for us to do as a community is focus our efforts on the district attorney and the judge so that they know that judicial gay bashing will not be tolerated.

There are many different approaches we

can take. In San Antonio, the Lesbian/Gay Media watch group has been working with the *San Antonio Light*, a local daily paper, to assure that the story gets abundant and favorable coverage in the mainstream media. At the state Capitol, the LGRL is working to alert elected officials. We are also planning to file complaints against the judge and the district attorney. I will elaborate upon these complaints in my next column.

TWT readers may become involved in this process by writing directly to Bexar County District Attorney Steve Hilbig and District Judge Terry McDonald. The address is 300 Dolorosa, San Antonio, TX 78205.

Your letters should not be personal attacks on the judge or district attorney, but should state that they abused their discretion by allowing a murderer to go free. Tell them that they have endangered people everywhere by failing to properly sentence this man. Remind them that they have set up a two-tiered justice system.

It is quite possible that the result in this case would not have been the same if the victim had been an Anglo and a heterosexual. If you live in San Antonio, remind Hilbig that one of his campaign promises was that he would be "tough on crime," that there would be "no plea bargaining." The district attorney and the judge are both elected officials and in the next election we must all work together to oppose the reelection of these individuals.

On Tuesday, September 17, I met with members of the victim's family to talk with them about possible strategies for addressing this injustice. I wanted to meet with the family before starting a statewide campaign against officials involved in this case because I felt that our efforts would be difficult, if not impossible, without the support of the victim's family. They expressed their enthusiasm for LGRL's efforts and have offered to help in any way they can. Currently the family is considering a civil suit.

The lesbian/gay community is not alone in our opposition to the handling of this case. We are joined by LULAC as well as MALDEF (Mexican American Legal Defense and Education Fund). As I have explained in earlier columns, coalition politics can be extremely effective, particularly when two powerful groups are involved. As this case evolves, I will discuss it further in future columns.

Carter-Wallace Inc., the makers of Trojan condoms, has declared that their best-selling condom will be advertised only in mainstream men's publications. The policy, which is nothing new, keeps needed advertising dollars from the gay press (even though studies show that gay men are more likely to buy condoms than are their straight counterparts). The Carter-Wallace policy has brought comment from both the *Wall Street Journal* and *New York Newsday*, which called the policy "the most startling example of advertisers' avoidance of gay publications."

The Trojan response to informed speculation that they're afraid of being labeled "the gay condom" is that their advertising schedule is dictated by audience reach and cost. Who do they think they're fooling?

While none of the major condom brands advertises in the gay press, Trojan is the biggest seller, and should set the standard. They're happy to take our money, but refuse to put it back into our community. Systematic homophobia in corporate America has long kept companies from advertising in gay publications. This corporate cowardice amounts to an advertiser boycott of lesbian and gay papers, and must be confronted. Condom makers are a good place to start.

Tell them why it's insulting to sell condoms to gays using straight images in heterosexual men's magazines. Demand that they begin supporting the publications that represent a huge portion of their market. By now just about everybody has heard about the preliminary study that suggested a biological link between part of the brain and sexual orientation in men. And with this news came a spate of anti-gay coverage in the media. The latest in this series comes to us from a columnist with depressingly homophobic credentials.

Cal Thomas, a writer syndicated by the Los Angeles Times Syndicate, has come out with his own personal take on the brain study. His basic beef with the study is that it's being seen by some gays and lesbians as a "silver bullet" for our movement. Thomas is clearly worried, even though some other gays and lesbians are dismissing this study as well. Naturally, to this extreme homophobe, formerly with the Moral Majority, it would be very threatening if his deep-rooted prejudice were to be proven invalid and illogical.

A self-righteous column Thomas cranked out recently reveals "the good news for homosexuals" is that we can change. And

the source of his information? Thomas quotes at great length from a quack psychology book recently published by Joseph Nicolosi, *Reparative Therapy of Male Homosexuality*, which advances the same old "causes" of male homosexuality refuted many years ago. And Thomas is just one of the many far-right creeps lining up behind Nicolosi's book, desperately grasping at straws to rationalize their hatred.

Thomas neglects to point out that there is no documented, verified case of a permanent change of sexual orientation, while stating as fact that such change is possible. In a further attempt to validate his prejudice, Thomas dismisses the concept of homophobia, and asserts that gays and lesbians are "moralphobic."

The implication that all gay people are immoral is an indisputably defamatory statement, and one the likes of which lesbians and gays alone continue to be subjected to in print.

EMOTIONAL HEALING

A Conversation
with
Shakti Gawain

Michael K. Wilson

Shakti Gawain's best-selling book, *Creative Visualization*, is considered to be one of the best self-improvement books ever written, with over two million copies sold. Gawain has facilitated countless workshops all over the country for the past 15 years and recently completed a nationwide tour with Louise Hay, Bernie Siegel, M.D., Depak Chopra, M.D. and others. In addition, she has a healing retreat, Kai Mana, on the Island of Kilauea, Hawaii. Her books have been translated into five languages, and she is internationally prominent in the human potential movement.

Michael K. Wilson, who is on the management staff of Houston's A Moveable Feast Health Food Store and Restaurant, interviewed Shakti Gawain when she was in Houston recently.

Michael K. Wilson Shakti, do you feel that it is possible, using visualization, affirmation, meditation and other forms of mental healing, to shift the consciousness of an individual so that he or she can move into some form of physical healing?

Shakti Gawain: I don't think it's possible just with mental healing. I think a very important requirement is emotional healing, and that is the level of healing that is usually skipped over. A mental shift through affirmations and visualizations is a very powerful step that can take someone to the point where they are ready to do the emotional level of work. In order to have a physical healing, my belief is that you have to do the work on the emotional level, and this is the most difficult and challenging level. With this understanding, I feel that a physical healing can take place.

MW: That there is a possibility?

SG: Absolutely. With the commitment to do the mental and emotional levels of healing, anything is possible.

MW: That's true. One thing we don't hear a lot about is the emotional aspects of ourselves; it's more the mental side.

SG: Exactly. And I get frustrated with that because it makes it sound so simple, and

it's not simple because there is the emotional level of work to do. Now, it's not like the emotional level is that complex or difficult once you understand how it works, but it works differently than the mental level. We need to understand how to deal with our emotions and feelings, and all those repressed from the past need to be released and healed.

MW: I would like to ask you for your insight and perhaps some direction and guidance on AIDS, cancer and other life-threatening illnesses?

SG: First of all, I do believe that all illness has emotional roots. In reality, there are spiritual, mental and emotional roots to illness, and I do believe that physical illness can be healed through spiritual, mental and emotional healing if that is the person's choice in this lifetime. I think it is also important to understand that a lot of us come into this lifetime to learn specific things, and it may not be the soul's choice in this lifetime to heal. It may be the soul's choice to experience this process and leave the body.

One thing I worry about is when people take the attitude, "Oh, we should be able to heal anything" and then feel guilty and

terrible because they aren't able to heal themselves. It's a much deeper level than any of us can fully understand, that choice of life and death that we make on a deep level, but I do believe that it is a choice on a soul level, and I do believe that it is possible—if your choice is to live and to heal yourself, then it can be done through commitment to all the levels of processing and especially the emotional level.

MW: What I'm hearing is that, even though a physical healing or recovery may not take place, something on the mental, emotional or spiritual level can.

SG: No, I think a physical healing can take place from the commitment to the healing on the other three levels. I'm just saying that it's not going to be everyone's soul choice to heal. Some people will follow through with the illness and leave their bodies as a result of that illness. I also believe that anyone who has a critical illness or disease can very much use it as a learning process, as a consciousness process whether or not you heal the physical level. You can undergo tremendous evolution and learning and healing from that process.

MW: Shakti, I was wondering if you might give us some pointers on developing and trusting one's intuition.

SG: Well, one thing is that we all have it; it's really right there and we usually develop a habit of ignoring it, not trusting it. So it's really a matter of cultivating a habit of just feeling and listening to your own gut feeling. You need to be able to drop out of the mental level, to move out of your head and bring your attention down into your body. Usually we experience it here (indicates lower abdomen); a real gut feeling about what feels right for me; what feels true to me; what doesn't feel right or true for me. If we cultivate the habit of listening to that sense of truth, then we can practice acting on it.

MW: I guess that would fall under developing it?

SG: Yes, and that feels kind of risky because it usually means we have to break some of our old patterns and habits—like giving our power away to other people and doing things the way we think we should do them as opposed to the way that really feels right to us. So basically, practice makes perfect.

MW: Shakti, in our earlier conversation you were speaking of the "dis-owned self" and I related that concept to the fact that a lot of people who are suffering from

various illnesses and diseases do not speak up for themselves. Could you expand on that?

SG: Yes, “dis-owned self” is a term that comes from the process known as voice dialogue. Voice dialogue has been most healing for me, and I see it as having the most potential for healing people as well as healing the world. It really works on all the levels, and that is what is so great about it. It encompasses all of it, a view of everything. It creates a space for actually developing every aspect of yourself. Voice dialogue is a very powerful tool and is, in fact, one of the processes that I use at my healing retreat in Hawaii.

Now my personal feeling is that most illness and disease has its roots in the fact that we have dis-owned parts of ourselves, and as a result we are out of balance and this imbalance starts to manifest in our physical body. The fundamental healing work that must be done to create a physical healing is to deal with the emotional process of what we have dis-owned or repressed, our shadow side, that part of us we are afraid to look at, that part of us that we haven't explored and expressed.

I would like to say specifically that illnesses like AIDS and other serious disease, in my understanding, come from tremendous amounts of inner conflict, inner emotional conflict within a person. What we need is to get more consciously in touch with what those inner conflicts are, and part of that is definitely self-hatred. It is part of oneself that is so self-critical and has internalized so much rage against oneself that ultimately it destroys you.

So there is a need for some very powerful and intense emotional healing work to be done, and I think that there is a possibility then of really shifting things if the person is willing to do that work.

MW: Well, we are seeing that; we are seeing a lot of people with those illnesses do-

ing very well. Could you address the problem of addictive lifestyles or compulsive behavior patterns? So many people feel hopeless and powerless to change that aspect of themselves.

SG: The basic thing about any addiction is that it comes from our (inner) child's needs for love, contact, safety, the fundamental needs that our child has, like nurturing. We have gotten out of touch with the child's true needs. Somewhere along the line, the child didn't get his or her needs met, got frustrated and then diverted into a secondary thing that gives a temporary relief or satisfaction. This temporary relief doesn't satisfy one's real needs, so this sort of endless cycle is set up.

For instance, drinking alcohol temporarily makes the child feel better, takes the child out of their pain. Eating food provides a certain kind of nurturing for the child temporarily. All the other things we get addictive about give a temporary relief but don't really solve the child's real needs, and this creates an addiction. The basic process of dissolving addictive behavior has to do with getting in touch with that needy child underneath and finding out what the child really needs, then learning to give them what is required.

One of the reasons the 12-step programs work so well is that they actually start fulfilling some of the real needs of the child in that person, like going to groups and feeling that unconditional love and support from the group, being a part of a group and having the sense that you belong. All these things start to satisfy some of the real needs of the child and allow that person to give up some of the more addictive behavior. The answer is to become more aware of your child and what his or her needs really are and then learn to take care of them in positive, real ways so that they don't need that other addictive thing anymore.

MW: Shakti, earlier when we were talking about people bonding with their animals, I thought that was such a wonderful way to connect with nature and also to experience unconditional love. Could you go into that for our readers?

SG: For the vulnerable child in us, animals are very safe. Animals are very present in the moment and very real in their experience. They can't fake it the way people can, so they are trustworthy to the child in us and there is a lot of connection and contact that we can permit our inner child-self to have. I love animals, and I sometimes think they are the very best friends that we can have.

MW: Shakti, as a pioneer in this work and someone who has been involved for so long and seen people grow and become more aware, what do you see for us in the future?

SG: I see a real big challenge that we are facing, because if we don't make some pretty radical changes quickly the very earth itself is threatened. The challenge for each one of us as individuals is to be committed to this path of transformation. This has to do with being willing to do the healing on spiritual, mental, emotional and physical levels with emphasis on the emotional, since that is the one people tend to block out.

We have to do this. It's essential, and the process of integration within ourselves, I believe, is going to bring integration, balance and harmony into our world. By looking at the problems and owning them as being reflections of the imbalances within ourselves, we can get to work and really heal and bring these things back into balance. I think we can have a tremendous effect in a very short time, because it is already happening and I think we will see it happening even more as we get close to the turn of the century. It's a very powerful time.

MW: A very exciting time to be alive.

SG: Yes, very exciting, and my hope and my sense of it is that we are going to see the world transformed in quite an incredible way, to be a much happier and more fulfilling, healthier place to be.

Homosexual Acts is the umbrella title given to two one-act plays by renowned gay playwright **Robert Patrick**. They are

part of a series of seven plays each of which presents a slice of gay life from a particular decade of the 20th century. If these two plays are any indication of the quality and depth of the other five plays, it is my most fervent wish that we be given the opportunity to see them all.

Bill Batchelor Road makes up the first half of *Homosexual Acts*, and it's one of the funniest plays I've seen in ages. It's set in the '40s in the very small town of Honeydew, California. How small is it? Well, Bill and Bob are its only residents. A surprise visitor in the form of a minister from West Virginia provides the catalyst for the action. He is in search of a Mrs. Bill Batchelor from whom his deceased son, Howie, received comfort and care before being shipped overseas to die in World War II. With impeccable timing, the Reverend and the audience learn just what form the comfort and care took.

Field Blauvelt and **Steve Barcus** play Bill and Bob, and are joined by **Eddie Malley** as the Rev. Lawson. Blauvelt and Barcus are at their best when we see them in their own relationship. They perform beautifully together. They seem unsure, however, how to react to Malley's presence. Malley himself seems uncomfortable in the role of the Reverend and never quite pulls it off.

He is much better in *Odd Number*, the evening's second half. Here we find ourselves in the living room of a house in Drinking Water, New Mexico circa 1955. Brad, a member of the Air Force, and Edgar, a naive teenager, enter after a marathon bout of lovemaking, and admit to the love they feel for one another. Malley as Brad and Barcus as Edgar imbue their characters with depth and individuality.

As in the first act, the conflict is created by the arrival of a third party—in this case, Blauvelt as Capt. Graham Curtis. With his entrance, we finally get a feel for the paranoia and fear of the postwar years. *Odd Numbers* is charged with tension, and the ending provides no easy answers.

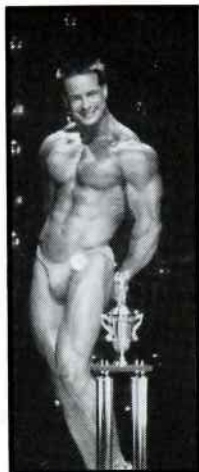

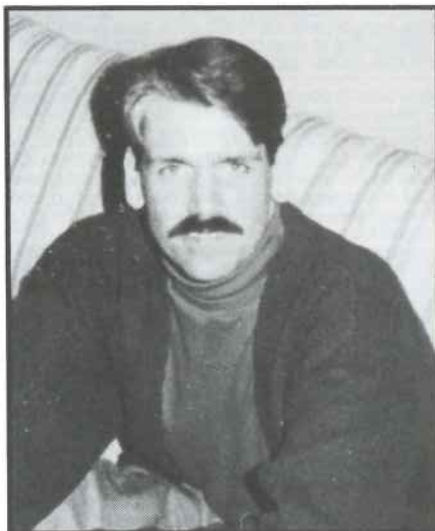
Conrado Trevino (above)
