HOUSTON 'FROM ALL WALKS OF LIFE '91' BRINGS IN \$80,000

Hundreds Brave Cold to Raise Funds for AIDS Foundation.

HOUSTON — Temperatures in the 40s were not enough to keep hundreds of enthusiastic people from taking part in the third annual "From All Walks of Life 1991" last Sunday. The fund-raiser easily topped last year's event, raising at least \$80,000 for AIDS Foundation Houston.

After registration, opening ceremonies emceed by Channel 2's Bill Balleza and warm-up exercises led by aerobics instructors, participants set off from Sam Houston Park in two groups—the 5K run and the 10K walk & roll—making their way down Buffalo Bayou and back up to the Park.

Musical groups were on hand to entertain throughout the afternoon, and snacks and beverages were also provided.

The top individual fund-raiser, whose name had not been released as TWT went to press, brought in pledges totaling over \$2,800. The winner will receive a three-day two-night trip to Las Vegas including hotel and air fare.

James Urban, assistant to Development Coordinator Cathy Coleman, told TWT NEWS, "Although the cold weather may have kept some people from taking part,



we were pleased with the turnout we had. "Some people who didn't show up will bring in their pledges, pushing the total even higher than our initial figures show."

Preliminary figures showed that "From All Walks of Life" brought in, after expenses, at least \$80,000. Although short of AFH's stated goal of \$100,000 for this year's walk, the \$80,000 figure represents a huge increase over last year's total of \$44,000.



Major sponsors of this year's event were the Houston chapter of the Design Industries Foundation for AIDS and ONCOL I.V. Therapies. Doctors Jorge Quesada, Adan Rios, Gary Brewton and Gordon Crofoot of ONCOL contributed \$10,000 to help underwrite "From All Walks of Life '91."

LGRL TO ROAST & TOAST REP. MAXEY

Reps. Naishtat, Danburg, Columnist Ivins Among Speakers At Nov. 16 Salute.

AUSTIN — The Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas is hosting a roast and toast of State Rep. Glen Maxey on Wednesday, November 16.

Among those "roasting" the former LGRL lobbyist will be syndicated columnist Molly Ivins, former Agriculture Commissioner Jim Hightower, Land Commis-

sioner Garry Mauro, State Rep. Debra Danburg of Houston, State Rep. Elliot Naishat of Austin and Travis County Clerk Dana DeBeauvoir.

The salute to Maxey will be held at Saengerrunde Hall, 1607 San Jacinto at 6 p.m. Tickets are \$25 and available to the public, and may be obtained by writing to LGRL, P.O. Box 2579, Austin, TX 78768. Proceeds from the affair will benefit LGRL.

Maxey left his position as Executive Director of LGRL when he became the first openly gay elected official in Texas earlier this year. As Representative of District 51, he has championed such causes as ethics reform, consumer protection, AIDS funding, civil rights and environmentalism.

Maxey was replaced as LGRL Executive Director by Laurie Eiserloh, who has enjoyed successes in lobbying the legislature on issues of hate crime, AIDS, domestic partnerships and child custody.

During the last legislative session, LGRL helped promote a hate-crimes bill protecting lesbians and gays and blocked passage of AIDS bills that would have hindered PWAs and outlawed future marches on Austin for lesbian and gay rights.

'LIVING TRIBUTE' TREE DISAPPEARS

*Cedar Was to Become Part of
Memorial in Lee Park.*

DALLAS — "It appears that someone has sabotaged the tree," Alan Ross told Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS. "I went to Lambert's on Friday to get an exact date for the planting, and I found out the tree had been sold."

The tree in question is the 20-foot deodar cedar that was to have replaced the tree in Lee Park that died earlier this year. The tree and the accompanying memorial plaque have been at the center of controversy for over two years due to the proposed wording on the plaque. The words "gay," "lesbian" and "AIDS" were eliminated from the plaque as part of a compromise aimed at winning final approval for the memorial.

After the city's Parks and Recreation Dept. gave its approval, the replacement tree was to be planted in late October or

early November.

"I went to Lambert's to confirm the planting date, and they told me it had been sold. I have now heard three different stories," Ross said. "The nursery told me that two women identifying themselves as representatives of the Tavern Guild came out to check on the tree about two months ago. They said the chosen tree did not meet their standards, and they would not take it as the replacement."

The replacement tree was selected by Ross last spring, and tagged by Lambert's to be held. The tree could not be planted then because Ross was still waiting for approval from the parks dept. After he got approval, the weather had turned too hot to plant the tree, so it was postponed until late fall.

Ross said that Richard Zavala of the Parks and Recreation Department is investigating the disappearance of the replacement tree. He also said he didn't think anyone from the city or council was responsible. "I think someone who originally opposed the entire Living Tribute is responsible," Ross said. He noted that the two groups that have fought the memorial all along are the Oak Lawn Committee and the Dallas Southern Memorial Association.

"At this point, there is no guarantee that the tree can be replaced, and the dedication date is doubtful. The date on the plaque is already set," Ross said. "If the tree cannot be replaced by that date, they will have to pay for another plaque."

Ross went on to question why he was never notified or called about the matter, when he was the one who had dealt personally with the nursery all along. "I don't think I will ever really find out what happened, but I am sure going to try," Ross added.

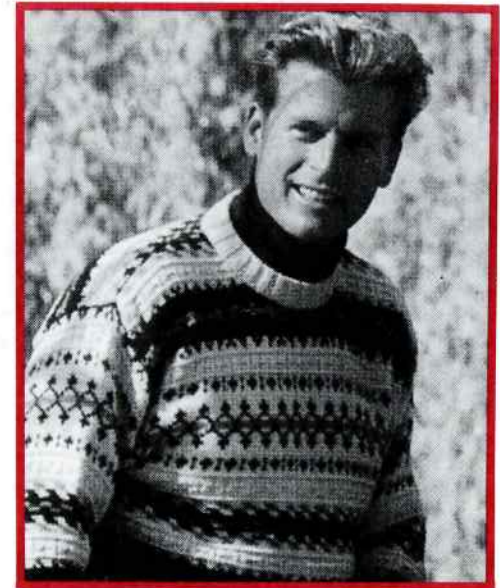

A symposium for people touched by the entire spectrum of HIV/AIDS infection is being held tomorrow, Saturday, November 9 at Texas Southern University.

On the agenda for discussion will be Social Security entitlements, legal rights in the workplace, COBRA plans, living wills and durable powers of attorney, insurance policies for PWAs, benefits for uninsured residents of Harris County. There will also be booths manned by representatives of Omega House, Body Positive and other area agencies and companies.

ASA FILLS NEW STAFF POSITION

Liberatore Will Help Target Homelessness, Facilitate Search For Low-Cost Housing.

AUSTIN — ASA case managers and clients have long been aware that there was a need for a staffer dealing with the housing needs and problems HIV-positive people face. The agency could not fill the need, however, until federal funds became available under the Ryan White Act.

Now that the funding has been obtained, ASA has hired Alex "Lex" Liberatore to fill its newly created position of Housing Information Specialist.

Liberatore is a graduate of Kings College in Pennsylvania and has worked in the social services field for seven years. He has also worked as a counselor mediator at the Austin Tenants Council and as a caseworker at Caritas, an emergency social service in the Austin area.

Sue Gallego, ASA Director of Client Services, told TWT NEWS, "Lex has a great deal of experience as a housing rights advocate and a solid knowledge of local housing options. He has also been an ac-

tive member of a local task force which encourages accountability and cooperation among social service providers."

Liberatore will be working to create a strong liaison with HIV service providers, local public housing agencies and agencies for the homeless. He will also be providing one-on-one information and assistance to HIV-positive individuals.

Liberatore said that some of his main priorities will be working towards the prevention of homelessness in the Austin area and the development of new options within the local housing market for low-income people with HIV. He added that he would need ideas, housing opportunities and special experience from anyone who can help.

SAN ANTONIO WALKS FOR AIDS NOV. 24

First Alamo City 'Walk for Life' To Benefit AIDS Foundation, Bexar County HIV/AIDS Consortium.

SAN ANTONIO — Residents of the Alamo City will get the chance to show their support for local AIDS services by taking part in the city's first walkathon on Sunday, November 24.

"Walk for Life," inspired by similar fund-raisers in other cities around the country, will raise funds for the San Antonio AIDS Foundation [SAAF] and the Bexar County HIV/AIDS Consortium.

The major sponsor of the fund-raiser is Curaflex Infusion Services, which has been involved in AIDS fund-raising walkathons in other Texas cities. Other corporate sponsors include Miller Lite Beer and Coca-Cola.

San Antonio's first AIDS walk comes at a time when SAAF is having serious financial troubles, and organizers are hoping for an enthusiastic turnout. The foundation provides counseling, food, clothing and medical attention for PWAs and HIV-positive people, and also runs the city's only residential facility for PWAs.

Registration begins at Market Square at 1 p.m., followed by opening ceremonies and the walk itself, which will begin at 2 p.m.

From Market Square, participants will proceed two and a half miles up Houston Street past the Alamo to Bowie, south on Bowie Street to Commerce, then west on Commerce Street back to the starting point at Market Square.

Registration is \$7, and participants are encouraged to ask friends and family members to pledge at least \$1 for every mile they walk. Participants are asked to bring to the walk a check for the total amount they have raised made out to

"Walk for Life." All participants will receive a "Walk for Life" T-shirt.

MONTROSE ACTIVITY CENTER CHOOSES '91-'92 OFFICERS

Major Fund-Raising Campaign Planned for Purchase of Building To Serve as Community Center

HOUSTON — The Montrose Activity Center is gearing up for a new year with a new slate of officers and plans to purchase a building that would serve as a community center.

Recently elected for the '91-'92 term were Clyde Williams as president, John Hill as vice-president, Linda Marshall as secretary and Gary Burns as treasurer. All officers will serve one-year terms.

Also chosen were five new board members, Suzanne Anderson, Robert Harris, Glyn LeBlanc, Lori Moore and Linda Marshall.

The Montrose Activity Center was originally established under the name Gay Community Center in 1975. MAC purchased a building that was used for group meetings, entertainment, drama productions and social events.

The building was sold in 1983 and the proceeds divided among local gay and lesbian organizations. Since then, various community groups have operated under the organizational umbrella of the Montrose Activity Center, among them Gay/Lesbian Pride Week, the NAMES Project/Houston, the PWA Coalition, the Houston Organizing Committee for the March on Austin, Team Houston, the AIDS Equity League and Gay & Lesbian Hispanics Unidos.

MAC's current primary focus is the eventual purchase of a building that would serve as a community center, housing gay and lesbian social, recreational and civic activities. A high-profile fund-raising campaign is being planned to make this purchase possible.

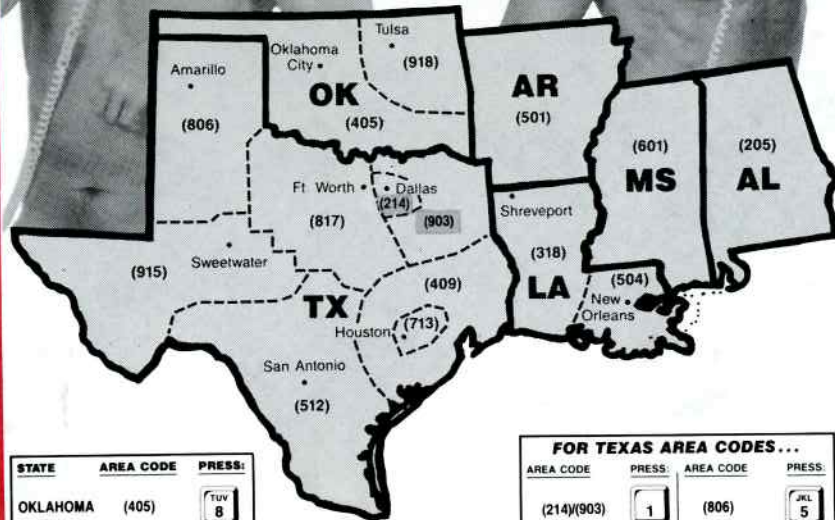

Rethinking 'Queer'

Ordinarily, I would have sided in any argument regarding the use of this label with those who believed that the label "Queer Nation" is derogatory and only helps to destroy those few gains we've made in dignity, respect and rights over the years.

But somewhere in the back of my mind and heart, I sensed that there is an appropriateness to taking this label onto ourselves and turning it against those who would try to denigrate us with names such as faggot, fairy, queen, dyke, lesbo, homo and that age-old favorite—queer.

And then one night it dawned on me what the answer to my puzzle might be. During World War II, when the Nazis stuck that pink triangle on our people to mark them, to separate them, to humiliate them and to kill them, those of our people who were so labeled abhorred that triangular piece of cloth and even came to hate it.

The queers did anything they could to keep from being "discovered" and publicly identified with those repugnant pink labels. This fear of the pink triangle gave power to those whose place it was to label—and took power away from those whose unfortunate place it was to be labeled.

Today, for the most part, that same pink triangle, in all its manifest designer forms,

brings pride to our hearts and tears to our eyes at public displays and gatherings of our kind.

We've taken the symbol of power away from those who would oppress us and we've empowered ourselves. And so too with the symbol, the word "Queer"—if we take it away from the oppressors by taking it onto ourselves, what power has that oppressor remaining to use it against us?

This is only my opinion—and there are many in this world.

More on United Way

Dear TWT:

I would like to respond to a recent letter to TWT concerning United Way funding of AIDS and lesbian/gay organizations ["No to United Way This Year," Vol. 17, No. 33]. In Houston, things are not always as open and accepting as we would like them to be, but we are making some progress. Montrose Counseling Center has been admitted as a United Way agency. We did so as an openly gay/lesbian organization that serves this community. The United Way admissions staff and volunteers acknowledged this and applauded us for providing services for important issues. Montrose Clinic was admitted last year as an HIV/AIDS service provider.

We have a long way to go to convince the United Way campaign staff that we do want to be openly gay/lesbian in all their literature and that providing condoms does not always mean we're promoting birth control. The United Way President has listened to our concerns and has agreed to work with us on educating this staff and the community. We felt the best thing for our agency and our clients was to work from the inside to effect change and bring some of these United Way dollars into the gay/lesbian community.

We encourage other United Way organizations to follow the lead that Houston has set, and we encourage the community to continue to exert pressure on United Way to include the entire community in their planning and allocation of community funds.

HIGHLIGHT

VETERANS AFFAIRS MEDICAL CENTER HOUSTON, TEXAS

The Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Houston ("the VA Hospital" to locals) is the largest in-patient facility for United States veterans in the Southwest. Dedicated to President Abraham Lincoln's call to "care for him who shall have borne the battle," this institution strives to provide the best possible medical care to America's military service veterans.

This Houston landmark was commissioned in 1946 as a 1,000-bed Naval hospital. Presently there are 986 medical beds and 103 spaces for patients receiving nursing home care. The hospital is affiliated with Baylor College of Medicine for the purpose of educating and training medical students and to insure quality care for its patients.

traocular lens implantation and AIDS. The Center treats about 350,000 outpatients every year.

The Veterans Affairs Medical Center consists of 60 buildings on 118 acres one mile from the Texas Medical Center. The center also serves East Texas with outpatient clinics in Beaumont and Lufkin. The hospital is fully accredited by independent agencies and the care given to patients is regularly reviewed by members of the Deans Committee, a group composed of representatives of Baylor College of Medicine, the hospital director, Chief of Staff, Chief of Nursing Service and a representative of the Veterans Service Organization.

Construction is nearing completion on the \$300 million state-of-the-art replacement Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Houston. Single and double rooms are replacing the previous open-ward system. The heating, cooling and ventilation systems are designed to minimize the spread of germs and diseases. Laundry, food service and other ways of meeting patients' needs are all being updated and upgraded.

Veterans are eligible for hospitalization benefits if they have suffered a service-connected disability, if they are former prisoners of war, if they were exposed to a toxic substance or radiation, if they are veterans of the Spanish-American War, the Mexican Border Period or World War I, or if they served as Merchant Marines on a U.S. flagged merchant ship between December 7, 1941 and August 15, 1945. Different qualifications apply to patients seeking outpatient care.

SPECIAL REPORT

Texas Human Rights Foundation: Growing and Changing by Suzy Wagers Director of Development

In Vol. 17, No. 25, TWT ran an article entitled "THRF: What's in a Name?," which gave an overview of the Texas Human Rights Foundation, its history and projects. It was the first in a series of articles that TWT will be running concerning THRF and the work it does.

In this, the second in the series, I am going to give an update on what has been going on with THRF. From this point on, the articles will be dealing with legal issues affecting gay men, lesbians and those who have AIDS or who are HIV-positive. These columns will be written by THRF litigator Pamela Oglesby when they concern gay/lesbian issues, and our new AIDS Legal Resource Project Coordinator, Patricia Presley, will be addressing HIV legal issues.

Oglesby began working for THRF on October 1. The importance of this development (employing a full-time litigator) cannot be stressed enough. In the past, we have been almost exclusively an attorney referral service. Due to lack of funds, our litigation activity has been limited to our lawsuit challenging Section 21.06 of the Texas Penal Code.

Of course, getting 21.06 off the books has been the primary focus of THRF since its inception 15 years ago, and we believe we are on the way to removing it once and for all. However, now we are in a position to expand our scope of service and address a number of issues affecting our community.

Hiring Oglesby resulted from an expansion of THRF's AIDS Legal Resource Project [ALRP], which, for the past three years, was headed by Margaret Tucker. On Sep-

tember 30, Patricia Presley, an Austin attorney, replaced Tucker as THRF Legal Coordinator, and will thus be overseeing the Project.

Under the guidelines of the grant which funds the ALRP, Oglesby will be able to litigate cases involving indigent HIV-positive Texans. Consequently, we must raise funds for any litigation that is not AIDS-related or which involves HIV-persons who are non-indigent.

At the recent THRF board retreat, the Legal Committee met and outlined priority areas for litigation. These include employment discrimination, housing discrimination, health care and insurance coverage, partnership rights, testing of health care workers and criminal penalties for HIV transmission, and equal rights such as access to public accommodations and voter representation.

In addition, the committee projected that THRF will litigate both AIDS and HIV-related cases and also cases that are strictly gay/lesbian. The anticipated breakdown of cases is 75% to 25%. Again, all the funds for the gay and lesbian lawsuits must be raised.

In her first official act as THRF litigator, Oglesby filed a motion in Federal Court on behalf of Annise Parker to intervene in the suit against the City of Houston to stop the illegal last-minute redistricting plan drawn up by City Council. Parker is the only openly-gay individual running for a City Council seat.

If the court allows the October 11 redistricting plan to be used in the November 5 city elections, Parker will be ousted from her current district and will face a

totally different opponent. Not only would Parker's campaign be virtually destroyed, but the only real voting block of gays and lesbians in Houston, residents of the Montrose area, would be divided among other districts, thus losing their capacity to wield any real political power. [Houston city elections were held November 5 under a plan, earlier rejected by the Justice Department, which left Montrose in District C.—Editor]

THRF is now in a position to expand its scope of service and address a number of issues affecting the gay and lesbian community.

Commenting on Parker's case, Oglesby observed, "The entire situation is totally confusing, especially for the average voter trying to determine who they should vote for. Absentee voting has already begun, and it is still unknown at this time whether anyone elected under the current system can legally hold their office.

"The entire episode has severely damaged Annise's campaign drive because many supporters are unsure if she is still in the running and are hesitant to dedicate their time and money to her efforts. However, Annise is continuing to run under the 'June' plan and making every effort to win a voice for gays and lesbians at City Hall. THRF is dedicated to protecting individuals like her who refuse to be victimized by a system that is interested only in maintaining the current power structure."

THRF will be keeping readers informed of all developments on this case as well as the AIDS Legal Resource Project and other issues.

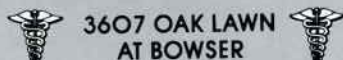



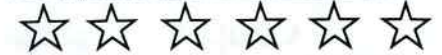

COMING OUT

AN ACT OF LOVE

by Rob Eichberg, Ph.D.

Coming Out by Rob Eichberg; 281 pp.; Penguin Books USA, Inc., 375 Hudson Street, New York, NY 10014; softcover \$10.95.

Although Dr. Rob Eichberg, co-founder of National Coming Out Day and "The Experience" workshops, wrote this book for us, the gay and lesbian citizens of the world, his message of love and self-esteem is applicable to everyone.

It is undisputed that most homosexuals are "passing" on a daily basis as straight. It is not argued that this is perceived to be the "safest" route. *Coming Out*, however, demonstrates that while our ability to "pass" may be seen as an advantage, it is in actuality our greatest collective and personal liability. Culturally, despicable stereotypes about us persist, nourishing unfounded fear and loathing of lesbian and gay people. Individually, coming out is a matter of honesty, self-acceptance and self-love.

Recognizing the cataclysmic (and superlative) consequences of becoming out, and recognizing that coming out is more of a process than a one-time declaration, Eichberg makes a powerful case for the personal freedom and integrity of being

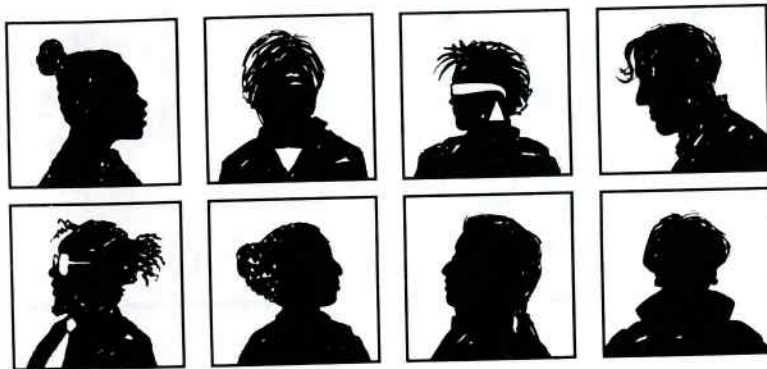
out and offers his own and others' testimony as evidence that it is worthwhile.

Using quotes and letters written by participants in his workshops, the author shares different modes and degrees of communicating with (mostly) family members about one's homosexuality. Coming from a new position of strength, but never aggression, empowered by knowing and speaking the truth of ourselves, Eichberg makes coming out not only a heady relief, but necessary to the ambitiously self-actualized individual.

He points out that heterosexual people are as vulnerable to "passing" as the gays and lesbians they love when they tolerate fag-bashing, offensive jokes and especially when they fail to acknowledge that their sister "is one" or that their brother died of AIDS.

Because not coming out is virtually always based on a fundamental belief that it is not all right to be homosexual, and because it is impossible to gain power over your own life without taking risks, and because silence does equal death, I fervently wish this book had been available years ago. I am grateful to have it now, and I heartily endorse it to you, as a friend.

An Open Letter to the Citizens of Dallas:

A recent letter from the Lesbian / Gay Political Action Committee [LG-PAC] in support of Lori Palmer shows that our supposed political watchdogs have been completely bamboozled by Lori's highhanded gay bashing — or worse, that the LG-PAC is willing to overlook her anti-gay discrimination now because she supported some of our goals in the past. Lori has come out against our community with her ordinance proposal directed against gay bars and gay social service institutions, and LG-PAC is too timid to stand up to Lori.

Let's look at the facts. Lori and her pet group (20 people who call themselves the Oak Lawn Committee) secretly concocted new ordinance requirements specifically targeted against gay dance bars (as well as the AIDS Resource Center, etc.). The proposal would have created a Catch-22 — requiring more parking in areas where zoning rules prohibit use of property for parking lots.

Even worse, the proposal would require a Specific Use Permit — that is, the City's permission to continue to operate. This effectively gives the City the power to *shut us down*. Are we being paranoid? The example of the Metropolitan Community Church shows that we are not — it was denied permission to use its own property for parking, and was run out of Oak Lawn on exactly this pretext.

Thousands of gay people in our community have sent cards, signed petitions and appeared at City Hall to let our elected leaders know that we will not silently be chased out of town. This targeting of gay institutions is targeting gay people, and the response of the community has shown the outrage against Lori's proposal that is appropriate to gay bashing.

This makes the LG-PAC's continued support for Lori absolutely puzzling. The LG-PAC's letter blames the ruckus on the bar owners — who were kept in the dark about Lori's secret proposal until the last minute. When we found out what she was doing, and forced her and her allies to talk to us, they would not even discuss the most threatening weapon they want to create — the SUP requirement. Lori's process has been undemocratic, and her goal is for the City to get the power to shut down our gay gathering places in just two years.

It's outrageous. The Tavern Guild opposes it; the DGA opposes it; the AIDS Resource Center opposes it; the MGC opposes it; and the gay people of Dallas — by the thousands — oppose it. The LG-PAC is out of step, and seems to be out of its mind.

The fight has just begun. We stopped Lori on October 23, when gay citizens by the hundreds came to the City Council meeting to show their opposition. She's going to try again on November 13, and we're going to stop her again. Please show your support by attending that meeting. Buses leave from your favorite bar at 11:30 a.m.

TWT ELECTION REPORT

Bartlett Elected Mayor in Dallas; Lanier, Turner in Houston Runoff

Gay Endorsements Score Hits, Misses & Draws

The mayoral and City Council elections in DALLAS were the first held under the terms of the 14-1 redistricting plan, which created 14 single member council districts.

Gay-endorsed candidates won three races, lost two and, in one case, made it into the runoff.

In the mayor's race, Steve Bartlett was elected with 54% of the vote, defeating Kathryn Cain, who garnered 26% and Forrest Smith, who took 13%. Both Cain and Smith had screened with the Lesbian/Gay Political Coalition, which gave its endorsement to Cain.

In the races for the newly-reconfigured City Council, Lori Palmer, who was endorsed by LGPC, won overwhelmingly in District 14, which includes Oak Lawn, with 75% of the vote. Palmer had served three terms as representative of District 2 under the old City Council, and was the only incumbent to get LGPC's endorsement.

In other LGPC-endorsed City Council races, Domingo Garcia won District 1 with 66% to Rafael Rodriguez' 34%; Richard Medrano got 37% and won a spot in a runoff for District 2 with Chris Luna, who took 43%; Don Hicks easily won District 5 with 63% to 21% for closest challenger John Evans; and Jim Ball was overwhelmed by incumbent Max Wells, taking only 20% to Wells' 80%.

In HOUSTON, the mayor's race drew a disproportionate share of attention, with an incumbent and two strong challengers fighting it out in a tough campaign.

Final results on election day put former Metro head Bob Lanier and State Rep. Sylvester Turner in a runoff, with Lanier taking 44% of the vote to Turner's 35%.

Incumbent Kathy Whitmire, who was endorsed by the Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus, lost a chance for another term, getting only 20%.

In the other race that attracted a great deal of attention among gay and lesbian voters, that for City Council District C, Anise Parker lost her run against incumbent Vince Ryan, getting 23% to Ryan's 77%. Parker, a longtime activist and community leader, was the only openly gay or lesbian candidate running in Houston city elections this year and was endorsed by the GLPC.

In City Council district races in which GLPC made endorsements, GLPC-endorsed incumbent Ernest McGowen won handily with 70% of the vote to nearest challenger Albert E. Coleman's 20%; gay-endorsed May Walker lost her bid to unseat Al Calloway in District D, getting only 11% of the vote to 46% for Calloway, who will be in a runoff with Elizabeth Spates; and District I incumbent Ben Reyes, who got the GLPC nod, won 65%, triumphing over challenger William R. Morris.

In City Council at-large races in which GLPC issued endorsements, incumbent Beverley Clark won 41% of the vote for Position 1, and will be in a runoff with challenger Gracie Saenz, who garnered 19%; Eleanor Tinsley easily won reelection to Position 2 with 65%; incumbent Jim Greenwood was reelected to Position 3 with 78%; and incumbent Sheila Jackson Lee beat off challengers for Position 4 with 63%. But GLPC-endorsed Glenda Joe won only 8% of the vote in her challenge to Judson W. Robinson, who won 38% and will face runner-up Lloyd Kelly, who got 22%, in a runoff.

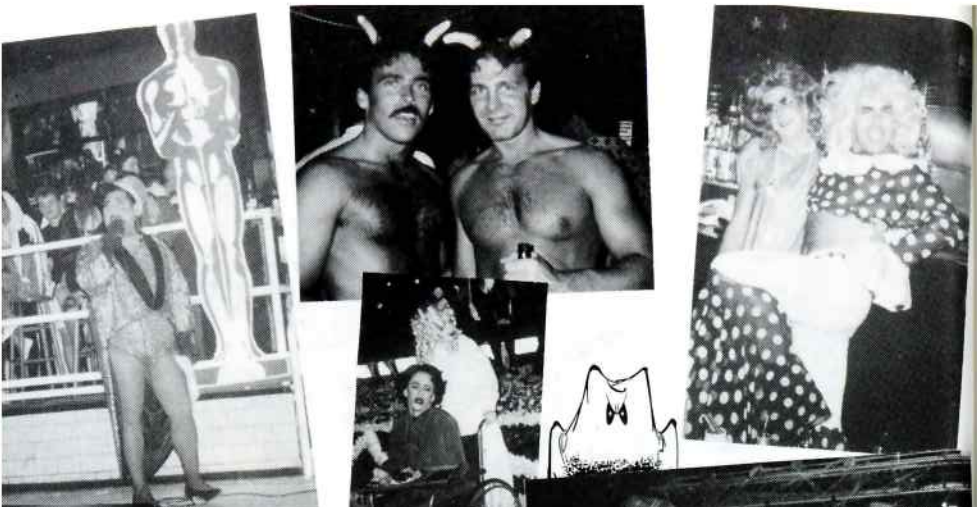
