DAY WITHOUT ART

**TEXANS TO JOIN  
WORLD IN OBSERVANCE  
OF AIDS DAY  
THIS SUNDAY**

*'Sharing the Challenge' Theme of  
Third Annual Commemoration.*

TEXAS — People all over earth observe World AIDS Day this Sunday, December 1. Groups in major cities across Texas are planning events to recognize and mourn the toll AIDS has exacted on all of us.

Originally conceived in 1988 and first instituted the next year, Day Without Art, which is now a part of World AIDS Day, was designed to serve as a protest against AIDS by the art world. Last year, more than 3,000 institutions around the world participated in closing their doors, darkening their stages, shrouding their art and offering programming created specifically to address the issues surrounding AIDS.

The goals of World AIDS Day are to increase awareness about AIDS and the pressing social issues surrounding it through the arts, and to promote action to end AIDS. The event is staged by volunteers who choose to participate.

• The city of **Austin** will honor World AIDS Day by encouraging businesses and the visual arts community (ranging from museums and galleries to bakeries and restaurants) to shroud the art in their establishments with black cloths and display Day Without Art posters over the cloths.



At 7:45 p.m. on Sunday, Austin will observe "Night Without Light" for 15 minutes to dramatize the despair felt over the magnitude of the disease. Citizens and businesses are being urged to take part and observe this period of darkness, and both the state Capitol building and the University of Texas Tower will be darkened for the event.

During the blackout, rows of people will lie silently side by side in a body-count performance piece, symbolizing the bodies of those who have died of AIDS. At the time of the blackout, each "body" will illuminate its face with a flashlight as a statement that those faces lost to AIDS will not be forgotten.

Afterwards, community choirs and dancers will give performances to offer hope and encouragement.

At 10 p.m., there will be a moment of silence to commemorate the voices silenced by AIDS. All bars, performing arts venues, classes and meetings are asked to make the significant contribution of one minute of silence.

• In **Dallas**, World AIDS Day observances begin with a benefit concert tomorrow, Saturday, November 30. **RED HOT! AGAIN** starts at 8 p.m. at the Majestic Theater. Ann Armstrong, Two Nice Girls, Julie Burrell, Corporate Jesters, News Arts 6, the Anointing, Josh Allen, Jackopierce and Boy George will be performing to raise funds for Dallas-area nonprofit HIV/AIDS support agencies serving men and women. Call (214)324-1597 for more information.

The Episcopal Church of the Ascension in Dallas and St. Luke's Catholic Church in Irving are both displaying portions of the NAMES Project AIDS Memorial quilt on Sunday morning, December 1.

The Oak Lawn Community Services is sponsoring a Quarterly AIDS Health Fair at 1 p.m. Sunday at Reverchon Community Center, 3505 Maple Avenue. Representatives of area AIDS service provider organ-



taken a risk to improve the quality of life for the community, Stone explained.

The Dru Howlett Memorial Award went to Scott Abraham, a member of OLCS's Buddy Project for over four years. Abraham also organized the education committee for the Buddy training program.

"Scott has been there everytime we have moved, to make sure we have telephones the next day," Stone added. "After working all day at his regular job, he would come here and work all night to install our telephone service.

"He has also done volunteer work throughout the community for years, and we feel that it is important to recognize him," Stone said.

Stone said he was excited about plans for 1992, which include the development of a stronger volunteer base and program. He also said that women currently on the staff will form a board committee with other women to work on programs especially for them.

"We realize that women's issues need to be addressed, and we will be working on that in 1992," Stone said.

Sandra Kaye provided the evening's entertainment, as she sang during the buffet and cocktail time. Mardi Coleman of Autobahn Records and the Ripcord spun the dance records after awards were handed out.

"We had a really great crowd," Stone said, "and a lot of people got to see our new location for the first time. It was really a special time to celebrate 10 years of service to the community, and we were glad to have everyone there."

He said that the agency has grown from two people in 1981, to a staff of 24 people, including therapists, educators, drivers and support personnel. Being in the forefront of AIDS-related services offered in the metroplex since 1983, the OLCS offers the AIDS Hotline, the Adult Day Care program, counseling, transportation and education for persons diagnosed with HIV.

The center also provides a variety of mental health counseling services to all area residents regardless of sexual orien-

tion. These include help with drug dependency, incest and developing healthier relationships. Funding for OLCS is provided by private donations, client fees and government and private foundation grants.

## AIDS SERVICES OF AUSTIN DIRECT MAIL BRINGS IN \$20,000

*Agency Gains Use of Mailing List Donated by Anonymous Source.*

AUSTIN — AIDS Services of Austin has held several direct mail fund-raisers in the past couple of months that have brought in a total of over \$20,000 and enabled the agency to reach new people in the community.

The funds raised will go to the ASA Food Bank and other areas of ASA which are in need of funds.

ASA client and food bank volunteer Leon Bonnet shared some of his experiences in a letter that was sent out to people on ASA's mailing list. This fund-raising effort alone brought in \$13,000 for the food bank.

Last spring ASA had an opportunity to reach new people when an anonymous source donated a large mailing list for the agency to use. Half of the people on the list received a letter from board member Lew Aldridge, and the other half were sent letter by ASA client Michael Mathews. This campaign brought in over \$7,000 and 132 new supporters.

The recent fund-raising campaigns have been helpful not merely for the money they have brought in, but also for the way they have spread ASA's message. Development Assistant Loretta Holland told TWT NEWS, "While the amount alone is reason to celebrate, the real victory is in reaching a new segment of our community."

AIDS Services of Austin is always looking for ways to encourage people to in the fight against AIDS. ## DGA SURVEYING SAFE SEX COMPLIANCE IN DALLAS AREA

*Clinic Adds to Testing Hours in  
Wake of Increased Demand.*

DALLAS — If you haven't checked your mailbox lately, or if a stack of bills is covering your desk and the rest of your correspondence, maybe you should look more carefully. If you are on the mailing list for the Dallas Gay Alliance, as are about 2,000 people, then you should have received a special survey in the November newsletter.

"What we want to discover is the incidence of 'backsliding,' that is, how many people there are who are not now practicing safer sex, and why," John Thomas told Michael McKinney of TWT NEWS.

"We are trying to update our information on gay and bisexual men and their behavior. "The questions are very blunt and to the point, and we hope that the people who respond will be just as candid and direct."

The survey is completely anonymous, and is designed to provide DGA with the kind of information it needs to improve the quality of services and education it provides to the community, Thomas explained.

A recent survey among the lesbian population has prompted the development of programs like the Women's Clinic, safe sex workshops for women and the Women's Health Project.

Thomas said the announcement that NBA player Magic Johnson had tested HIV-positive has greatly increased the number of people who want to be tested.

"The AIDS Resource Center has had to add an extra day of testing because the other appointments were filling up so fast. The city didn't add any more testing days, so we had to," he said.

He added that the extra day may only be temporary, depending on whether the demand for testing remains high.

Thomas also said the Center was looking for dental hygienists and assistants for part-time employment and volunteer work as part of the Nelson-Tebedo Clinic's dental program. "The city has cut back on their dental program, so there is an obvious need we have to fill."

The AIDS Resource Center and the Gay and Lesbian Film Festival will be the beneficiaries of a special screening of the new gay film *Young Soul Rebels*. The benefit

showing at the Inwood Theater on Wednesday, December 4, will be followed by a party at the Fridge nightclub in Deep Ellum.

## MARION PANTZER FUND GIVES \$1,000 TO 100 CLUB OF HOUSTON

*Recognizes Work of HPD Homicide  
Division in Broussard, Smith Cases.*

HOUSTON — In a press conference held last Thursday, club owner Charles Armstrong, representing the Marion Pantzer Memorial Reward fund, presented a check for \$1,000 to 100 Club Director George Bolin.

Armstrong stated that the \$1,000 was being given to honor the Homicide Division of the Houston Police Department, and two officers in particular, Sgt. Kenneth Vachris and Sgt. Billy Belk.

The two policemen were instrumental in the investigation of the murder of Paul Broussard and assaults on two of his friends earlier this summer, and the recent shooting death of Phillip Smith.

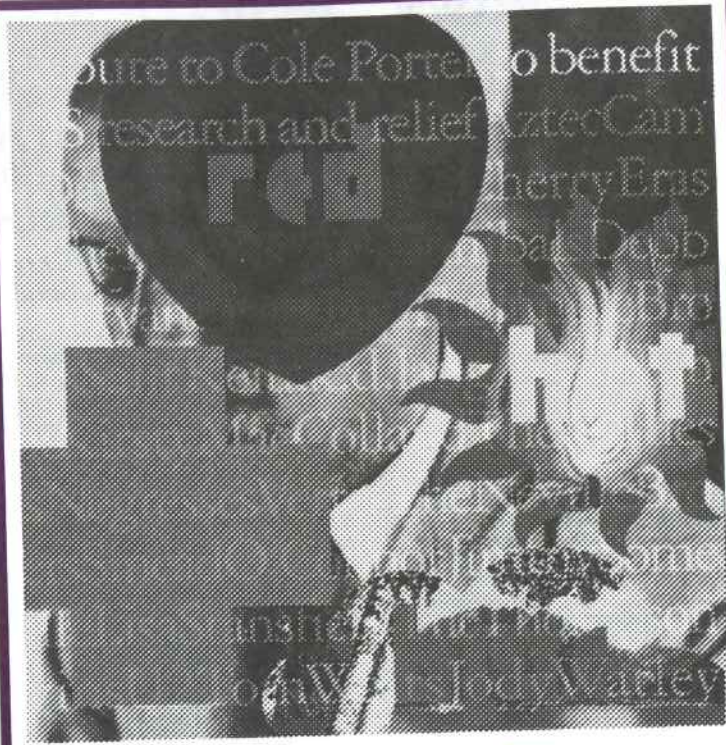

## COMMENT

### Get Tested Anonymously

Dear TWT:

The AIDS Legal Resource Project [ALRP] of the Texas Human Rights Foundation recognizes that in light of Magic Johnson's revelation of his HIV status, more people are realizing that this could happen to them and are making the difficult decision to evaluate their past behavior and whether to be tested. I applaud that decision-making process and encourage persons who have engaged in risky behavior to be tested.

However, I recommend that those of you who make the decision to be tested go to an anonymous testing facility which offers pre-/post-test counseling or, if you are using a private physician, that you request the testing information not be placed in your files if you are negative.

Why an anonymous testing facility? If you are tested at a confidential testing site, even if the test results are negative, disclosure of the information that you took the test will lead to future discrimination in insurance coverage.

The test disclosure concern is a valid one. If you use a confidential testing site, your name is likely to be entered into a medical database, along with your results, whether they are positive or negative. When applying for new insurance, that information would be available to anyone accessing that data base.

Imagine the scenario: Because of Magic's announcement, you take the test and you are negative. Next year you apply for new insurance or your employer changes insurance companies. Information about your test would be available to that prospective insurer. The insurer would use this information that you were at risk for HIV exposure to evaluate whether or not they should insure you or your group, and would either reject coverage or raise premiums to a prohibitive rate.

It can and does happen. The ALRP receives at least three to four telephone calls per week from around the state

dealing with questions on this very issue. Unfortunately, the denial or loss of coverage has already occurred and the person most in need of health or life insurance coverage will not be able to obtain it. That person will be you.

The AIDS Legal Resource Project of the Texas Human Rights Foundation provides indigent Texans access to legal counseling and attorney referrals. As Legal Coordinator, I reiterate the importance of making known this information regarding HIV testing. I'm thankful that Magic Johnson's announcement will lead to an increase in testing. I just want to make sure that people know the difference between anonymous and confidential, and the ramifications of utilizing a confidential testing site.

## Fight to See Gay Crime Victims Treated Equally

Dear TWT:

On October 26, my lover Tom and I were gay-bashed. Tom was murdered; somehow I survived. From my hospital bed I write this to you. My heart goes out to the loved ones of Phillip W. Smith, who I have read in this week's TWT was gunned down for smiling at a man.

Is this "sport" of murder and mauling rapidly gaining popularity far above past levels of insanity? Yes. And aren't Paul, Tom and Phillip the beginnings of many more trophies to be taken? Yes.

Phil Johnson made some excellent points in his "Taking Responsibility" article [VIEWPOINT, Vol. 17, No. 36], and I couldn't agree with his views more, especially now.

All of us read with horror about the hate crimes committed against our people, and we feel pain at the senselessness of it and the harm done to our brothers and sisters. Often the victims knew, as in my case, that they were in a bad place at a bad time, but they rationalized it, thinking, "not me and I'll be here in a short time," or "the odds are with me as I don't do this often."

Some people will self-righteously say that those who were harmed deserved to be harmed: "They deserve what they got for being there." The same could be said nowadays for anyone, anywhere, after dark

and in some cases and some places during daylight hours.

If you were hurt going to or from any gay business at whatever time, what do you think a lot of people would say? And a lot of those people have taken risks they shouldn't have. Who has not driven too fast, taken home a stranger, had unprotected sex, left the bar at 2 a.m., been in a dangerous place at night, taken an unwise risk?

To place blame on the victim for being unwise partly mitigates and lends some legitimacy to what the criminal has done. We all need to work at protecting ourselves, but after something has happened, "should have" is water under the bridge. All the blame belongs on the criminal, and if the victim was in a bad place at a bad time, he or she will suffer that knowledge without the help of any mindless people reminding him or her of it.

In my case, I objected to going to the park because I knew of the danger, yet I weakly gave in to the idea of just eating our hamburgers and then leaving. The guilt I have is forever burned into my heart and I wish I had Tom back, but I never will in this life.

Not a day or night has passed that the nightmare of October 26 and thoughts of him have not replayed themselves hundreds of time.

Tonight, in a telephone conversation I had with Phil Johnson, we came to the conclusion that hate crimes are definitely on the rise and that no one, gay or straight, feels safe anywhere anymore from crime in general. Criminals are overwhelming our nation and literally waging war on all of us. The gay community must fight to see to it that gay crime victims are treated the same as other victims and that the system does not encourage our victimization.

Phil and I also agreed strongly on one other thing: that there is only one sure way of significantly reducing violent crime: Develop a better system for sure, consistent, swift justice that reduces the numbers of violent criminals, one at a time, finally and for all—the death sentence. More crimes need to be capital offenses, e.g., possession of narcotics for distribution.

I am composing 100 suggestions for legislators, and I will become a familiar face at City Hall, the courthouse and to Corey Burley, the lowlife who murdered

## Questioning Avondale Petitions

Dear TWT:

Many property owners in the Avondale area have received petitions sent out by people who want to create a Public Improvement District (PID) and a Tax Increment Financing (TIF). As the owner of a modest home in the Avondale/Montrose area, I am concerned that these petitions do not address certain important issues and that they may be an inappropriate method to address the real problems that are plaguing the neighborhood.

Although the goals of the Avondale Association are well-founded, the process by which this group seeks to achieve these goals leaves much to be desired. No one disputes that reducing crime and making the area a better place to live, work and visit are important goals for the overall improvement of the Avondale area. However, the creation of a PID and a TIF may prove to have consequences that many residents in the neighborhood will come to regret.

First, in order for a PID or a TIF to be created, the owners of 50% of the total appraised property value comprising the district need to sign the petition. Thus, a PID and a TIF can be created with the signatures of only a few wealthy property owners who together comprise 50% of the total value of the property in the district.

Once the 50% group [wealthy property owners] sign the petition, City Council appoints a board. Any resident or property owner in the area would be eligible to be appointed to the board. The City Council would be hard pressed not to appoint someone who owned a property that constituted a greater percent of the appraised value of properties in the district.

The board would be an advisory board which would make recommendations to City Council. These recommendations include a tax assessment for the district to create a private security force, to close off

streets and to zone the neighborhood. Only if 67% of the property owners sign a protest petition within 20 days after city council adopts the board's recommendations would the improvements not be made.

This board would have a great deal of power and influence, since as a result of the term-limitation measure approved by voters in the recent city elections, City Council members will now be limited in how long they may hold office. City Council would in all probability defer to this board on many important decisions that directly affect the neighborhood.

The state law that allows the creation of a PID specifically states that city councils may appoint an advisory board with the responsibility of developing and recommending an improvement plan. State law does not prevent City Council from holding a special election to elect an advisory board by either the residents or the property owners. Elections are the only way that a board would represent the people in the district.

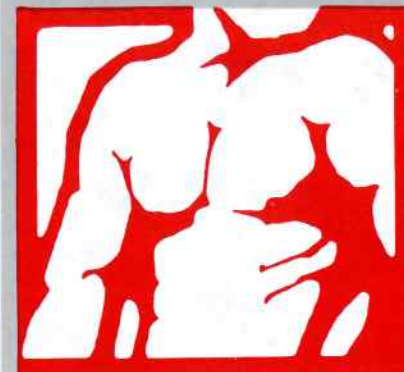
The board could consist of members representing small property owners, wealthier property owners, non-property owner residents and even non-resident property owners. An elected board would have a greater impact on City Council and have more legitimacy than an appointed one. City Council would be advised by the people through their duly elected representatives.

The board would not be appointed by the city politicians whose campaign contributions come from other areas of the city. People who represent special interest groups would not be appointed. The people of the Avondale district would have a real voice in deciding the future of their neighborhood.

The Avondale district is a very cosmopolitan area of Houston. Rich, poor, land owners, land renters, residential, businesses, families and single persons [gay and non-gay] all blend together to form this community with its charming and unique characteristics. Let us work together to make this area a better and safer place to live, work and visit. We must all work together by being a part of the process of improvement. Only if we all work together will real change happen.





# ZILA!

having been imprisoned in stockades. A time when thousands of government employees were fired because, as gays, they were supposedly either communists or, if not that, at least security risks. It was a time when gay Texans could be sent to prison for 15 years. A time when police routinely raided private parties and bloodied gay heads.

But the Dallas police seldom raided gay bars. They had no need to. They had merely to walk into one and the clientele would quietly leave. If they did this often enough, the bar went out of business. That never happened to Zila's bars. Even the police were charmed by this woman.

My story begins in the fall of 1950 when Zila's husband opened the Holiday Bar in the Adolphus Hotel. It was clean, it was plush and it was for straights. Zila heard the anguished cries of five gay men that, although there were a couple of gay bars in town, none were as nice as the Holiday and no one as caring as Zila. Over the objections of her husband, she made the Holiday a gay bar. It became the focal point of the tiny, emerging gay community—a safe place where one could meet others without fear of police harassment.

The Holiday was "homey" because Zila knew all her customers by their first names and insisted that her bartenders do likewise. Her motto was, "No one's a stranger in this bar." Timid newcomers were introduced to others. Lost a lover? Her shoulder was made to cry on. Her advice:

**F**or those not yet born when Zila's Band Box was the place to be on a Saturday night in Dallas, come sit by my side and I'll tell you a story.

If there's one name that's carved deeply into the hearts of gay men and women of the early 1950s, it's Zila's. Her last name? She didn't have one. To her friends, she was always just "Zila." And now she's gone, a friend when we had few.

If, when she was a young bride, someone had foretold that someday she would own Dallas' biggest, splashiest gay bar, she would have said, "A gay bar? Me? You're crazy." Yet she was soon to discover that the happiest days of her life were those in which she helped brighten the gloomy days of the McCarthy era.

It was a time of witch hunts. A time when gay servicemen and women, who had served their country well in World War II, were hounded out of the military and given dishonorable discharges, sometimes after

"The best way to get over a lost love is to meet a new one." Where but in Zila's could one find so many potentials? She was a subtle Dolly Levi, a matchmaker.

And so it was inevitable that the Holiday very quickly became so successful that she had to open a larger, even more plush bar, "Zila's Band Box." The date was November 5, 1952, and the place was packed. In time, "Let's meet at Zila's" became a routine invitation. Everyone went to the Band Box knowing that eventually they'd literally bump into everyone else. A Saturday night at Zila's was kind of like today's Halloween at the Crossroads.

# PHIL JOHNSON

Phil Johnson wanted to be a dancer, glamorous and famous. God wanted Phil to write and collect homosexual history. Their compromise is a story that takes all day to tell, occupies two computers, an office and an archival library in Dallas.

When he was about four years old, Phil knew he loved men. He used to go to church and stand up in the pew to watch the males strut down the aisles in their prettiest clothes. It was almost like a fashion show, every Sunday. His mommy was so proud of her church-loving baby.

When he was 13 he read about himself ("homosexual") in a home medical encyclopedia. Despite the tragic, judgmental tone of the diagnosis, he was elated because he believed that since he had read it there, it meant that "other people have it, too!"

Phil became a regular patron at the Dallas Public Library, devouring every sliver of literature about himself in existence. He understood that the most promising treatment for his situation was psychoanalysis, but without that opportunity, he did the best he could. He "passed."

Overachieving in every endeavor, he graduated high school and was drafted into the Army during World War II. Worse than his fear of combat was his fear of being exposed as "queer." So apprehensive and defensive about his status was he that when his commanding officer assigned him to the typing pool, Phil hoisted his rifle defiantly. Embarrassed, he relinquished it and headed for the "girls'" office, the one with the lavender curtains flapping in the breeze.

Phil Johnson had never heard the word "gay" before. "But we were," he says, "We camped and laughed until we screamed! It was all we could do; we were in the Army, it was war time, troops were being sent overseas every day and we were in this office, typing! We had reason to be gay!"

He remembers the camaraderie. Without identified meeting places or networks, men from across rural America were assembled in close quarters and many were surprised that "other people have it, too!"

Phil did get to dance. He says he was in two shows off Broadway that bombed. Disappointed, but still ambitious, he was productively engaged in his own activities when in 1964 God insisted that he record gay history.

## IN PERSON

"There is no history! Our history is lost to us!"

God was adamant.

Phil started collecting articles from a San Francisco periodical that sometimes discussed homosexuality, and he subscribed to *One*, the first known gay publication in this country, from 1952. He even threw in a couple of *Strength and Health* magazines, since they often featured muscle men's physiques. But there was no real gay past to be archived.

A year later he was waiting on a tip from God to direct his efforts and reminding Him that there still existed no chronicle of homosexuality, no gay history, when God spoke again: "Then make it!"

*Our Community* was born on January 1, 1965 to Phil and four of his friends on his kitchen table. It was a monthly magazine of gay record, dedicated to those "in the life." It lasted for 11 issues.

Today Phil is a born-again, evangelical, archiving, alphabetizing, cross-referencing Gay Historian. He has publications, souvenirs, programs, theatre stubs and parking tickets from every event, splash or promise of the gay community in Dallas and the world. He has every issue of TWT ever published and many complete and incomplete series of other, related magazines and newspapers, including *Strength and Health*.

Mr. Johnson led the first Gay Pride Parade in Texas in 1972. He patronized the first gay bar, and if he was not the first Texan to rail angrily against Anita Bryant, he sure wishes he had been! He won six gold medals at Gay Games I and five at Gay Games III. He was awarded a plaque recognizing his service to the community at the 1991 Alan Ross Freedom Parade.

# CAPITAL REPORT

Another in A Continuing Series of Reports  
From Austin on Legislative Issues  
Affecting Gays and Lesbians in Texas

On November 9-11, the National Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby Policy Institute hosted the annual Creating Change Conference in Alexandria, Virginia. Over 100 people attended this year's conference, making it the largest in the conference's four-year history.

Workshops addressed topics such as gay/lesbian healthcare, AIDS organizing, racism within the gay and lesbian community, hate crimes and domestic partnership. The conference gave activists from all over the country the opportunity to network and discuss political strategies.

Organizations from around the state of Texas sent representatives to this gathering, including Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, Informe SIDA [Austin Lesbian/Gay Latina/Latino Organization], the Lesbian/Gay Student Coalition, the Texas Human Rights Foundation, the San Antonio Lesbian/Gay Alliance, Dallas Gay Alliance and others.

One of the central issues at this year's conference was the role of the new Federalism. Under the Reagan and Bush administrations, the federal government has been relinquishing more policy making powers to the state governments. As state governments play a more prominent role in people's lives, national gay and lesbian

rights activists are finding that more and more battles are being fought at the state level.

Unfortunately, few state and local activists are ready for the fight. As Texans, we should be very proud that our gay and lesbian community has seen the necessity for a full-time lobby at the state Capitol. Only three other states, California, Wisconsin and New York, have organizations similar to LGRL.

Another important issue at this year's conference was basketball superstar Magic Johnson's recent public acknowledgment of his HIV status. AIDS activists and educators at the conference had mixed feelings about Johnson's new role as an AIDS educator.

On the more positive side, Johnson's announcement will raise public awareness about HIV and AIDS. This heightened awareness will be extremely significant, particularly to the African-American community. His announcement helps AIDS activists to emphasize that AIDS is an epidemic that can potentially affect everyone.

But as AIDS educator Sandra Johnson [no relation] pointed out, before Magic Johnson becomes an AIDS educator, he himself must first be educated. Johnson repeatedly reminds the public of his heterosexuality and says that, if it can happen

to him, it can happen to anyone. The implicit message here is that as long as the disease is affecting gay people, the public as a whole should not be concerned over the epidemic. But now that straight people are being affected, the public should care about AIDS.

There is also an implied moral judgment in Johnson's insistence on his heterosexuality. In effect, he is telling us that he became infected through "acceptable" heterosexual intercourse, not through "unacceptable" activities like IV drug use or gay sex.

Finally, for all of us who have lost loved ones to the AIDS epidemic, it is difficult for us to witness this outpouring of public support for Magic Johnson. As gay people affected by HIV or AIDS, we often live our lives as pariahs. Public support for Magic Johnson has, in some ways, emphasized the homophobia that is always present in the fight against AIDS.

It seems that we, as a society, are still not treating AIDS as a disease that must be fought and cured, but instead as a moral issue that must be ignored unless and until it affects straight people.

# GLAAD Tidings

For Navy women who say "no" to sexual advances from a man—perhaps their commanding officer—all he has to do is yell "dyke!" and they're out of there.

This is not a new story. A year ago, the Commander of the U.S. Navy's Atlantic fleet sent a memo to all commanding officers, urging them to seek out and eliminate gay women from Naval ranks. It's worth quoting again from the Admiral's directive: "The stereotypical female homosexual in the Navy is hard-working, career-oriented, willing to put in long hours on the job..." But none of that matters. If you're accused of being gay, you don't get a trial, and hearsay is admissible as evidence at your hearing. What has ensued in the year since that directive was issued is a witch hunt against women in the Navy.

Connie Chung did a segment on this important topic on a recent installment of her investigative show *Face to Face with Connie Chung*. The segment was about how lesbian-baiting is being used to intimidate and control *all* women in the Navy. A possible solution to this homophobic use of sexual harassment was put forward by one of the three former Navy women Chung interviewed: eliminate the Defense Department policy which states that "homosexuality is incompatible with military service."

Every year, an average of three times as many women as men are thrown out of the Armed Forces because they are, or are thought to be, lesbians. The women who do stay in function with a powerful control hanging over the heads: put out or we'll get you out. A recent Pentagon study reports that two out of three military women say they've been sexually harassed while in the service.

Media coverage of the various aspects of the discriminatory practices of the U.S. military is vital to the process of

According to a recent report in *TV Guide*, NBC has quietly quashed plans to introduce a lesbian character on its new series, "Sisters." The co-executive producer of the show said in *TV Guide* that "We wanted Alex's daughter Reed (played by Ashely Judd, who is related to the singing Judds) to come back from six months abroad and tell her mother she thinks she may be a lesbian. But NBC said forget it."

An NBC spokesperson insisted that the reason for doing away with this episode's concept involved creative criteria: "Given that the show is so new, the focus should remain on the central characters." However, the producer said that NBC had not ruled out the possibility of bringing in a gay character at a later date.

AI on TV? Those A-OK *Designing Women* strike again! On a recent installment of the high-rated CBS show, divorced designing woman Mary Jo wants to have a baby. With no husband and no boyfriend, she makes the decision to take matters into her own hands and exercise her reproductive freedom by buying sperm from a local sperm bank.

When she gets cold feet after immediately getting pregnant, her boss and pal Julia comes over late one night, and in a really tender scene, tells Mary Jo not to let fear keep her from mothering a child. As Julia strokes her hair, Mary Jo tells her she's going to need her there every step of the way—and Julia says, "You've got me."

It looked a lot like these women were about to have a child together. Though no references were made to the "lesbian baby boom," and even though by the end of the episode Mary Jo had had a miscarriage (although she did say she'd try again), this show will certainly help more people understand alternative insemination.

This issue is of great concern not only to designing-women types, but to many lesbians as well. Tell the producers of *Designing Women* how much you appreciate their graceful handling of this topic. Marty Kosarik**

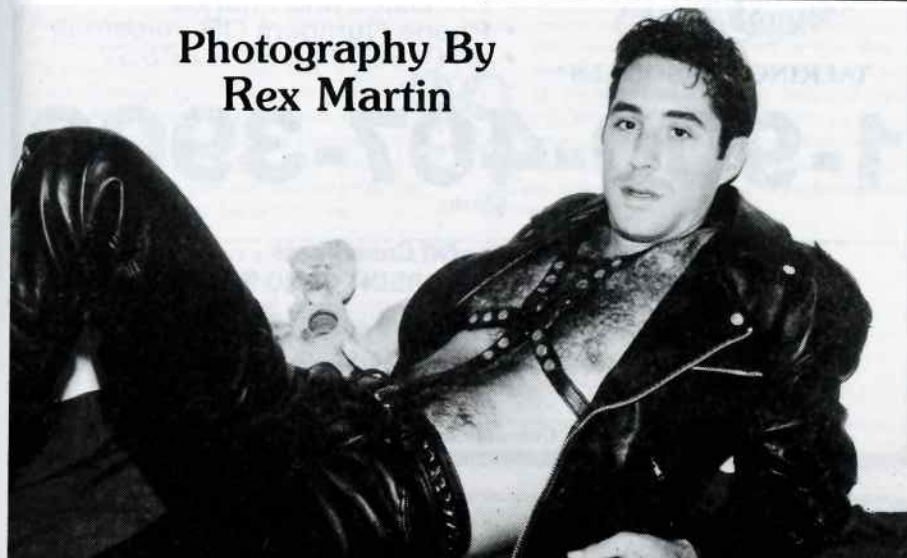

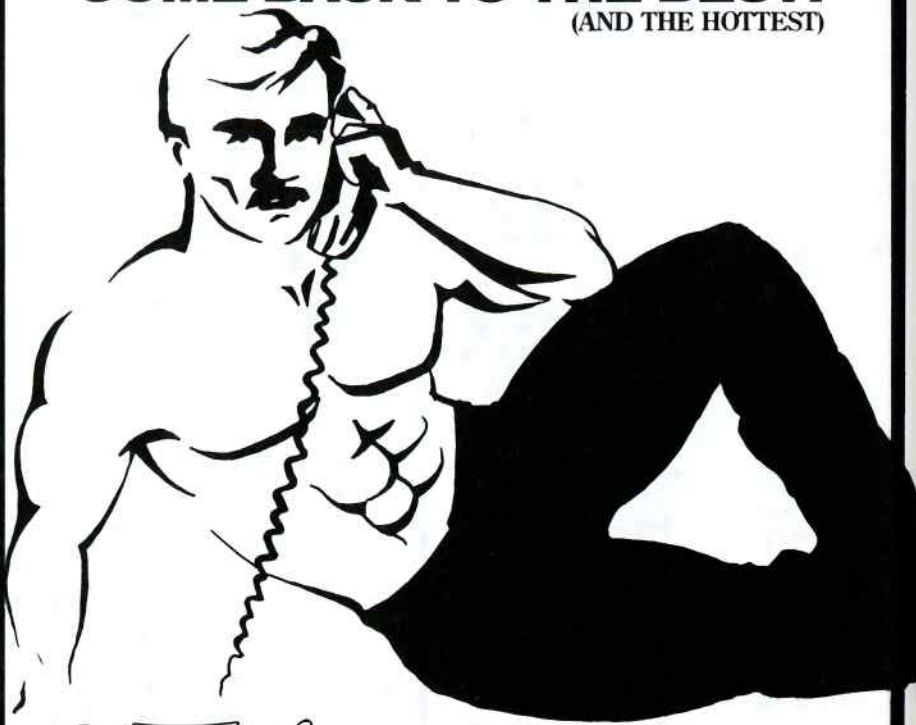

Nearly 100 politicians and activists from around the U.S. and Canada, a few veterans and many new faces, gathered in Houston last weekend to address the challenges facing the gay and lesbian community and its elected and appointed representatives in particular.

The International Conference of Openly Gay & Lesbian Elected and Appointed Officials began on Friday with registration and a reception. Saturday morning, several speakers recounted experiences, both poignant and humorous, they had shared with the late activist Brian Coyle, to whom this year's ICOGLEAO was dedicated.

In her opening remarks opening the conference, San Francisco County Supervisor Roberta Achtenberg gave an overview of the challenges facing the United States in the 90's.



Among those in attendance at ICOGLEAO in Houston were [l-r] Tom Duane, who recently won election to New York City Council; recent Houston City Council candidate Annise Parker; Texas State Rep. Glen Maxey; Sherry Harris, elected to Seattle City Council; and San Francisco County Supervisors Roberta Achtenberg and Carole Migden.

Conference participants then assembled in caucuses according to their particular field of interest.

After a break for lunch and an address by Texas State Rep. Glen Maxey, participants had the chance to attend workshops addressing issues like AIDS and the law, and gay and lesbian politics in Texas.

The latter workshop was moderated by LGRL lobbyist Laurie Eiserloh, who described some of the challenges involved in using the legislative process to further gay and lesbian goals. Houston activist Ray Hill spoke of politics as a numbers game, citing his own prior experience as a candidate, while HGLPC vice president Rob Bridges dealt with the federal Voting Rights Act and redistricting.

This was the first year of attendance for William Waybourn, Executive Director of the Victory Fund, which was formed earlier in the year to fund gays and lesbians run-

ning for office. "We're here to try and pick up some insights on how to help gay and lesbian candidates get elected," he said.

Waybourn also proudly noted the Fund's contributions to the campaign of Sherry Harris, who ran as an openly-lesbian candidate and earlier this month defeated a 24-year incumbent to win a seat on Seattle's City Council. Harris received over \$10,000 from Fund members.

In the general business session held Sunday morning, members decided to hold next year's ICOGLEAO meeting in Chapel Hill, North Carolina.

The highlight of the ICOGLEAO Conference was HGLPC's Sixteenth Anniversary Awards Banquet, held last Saturday at the Stouffer Presidente.

Guests wore formal and semiformal dress for the occasion, and shared a bountiful dinner and the insights of some of the community's luminaries.

HGLPC Board Chair Christopher Bacon gave the welcoming address and introduced keynote speaker William (Bill) Scott, C.S.W., A.C.P., who was appointed earlier this year to the Texas Board of Health by Gov. Ann Richards.

Scott is the founder of the Montrose Counseling Center and Body Positive. In his address he referred to his own experience as a longtime survivor of HIV infection, and said he considers health care to be the most important civil rights issue for the lesbian/gay community.

HGLPC President Toni Knight presented this year's Service Awards, which are given to those organizations, businesses and individuals that are judged to have contributed to the gay and lesbian community of Houston in exceptional ways. Honored with Service Awards were Harris County Constable Jack Abercia, Queer Nation and DiverseWorks, Capt. Adamson and Lieutenant Buenik of HPD Central Patrol, and Lesbians in Business.

LGRL lobbyist Laurie Eiserloh presented the Harvey Milk Award, awarded each year to the public official who shows courage on behalf of gay men and lesbians, to Lt. Gov. Bob Bullock. Accepting for Bullock was Annise Parker.

The Bayard Rustin Civil Rights Award was won by City Council member Beverley Clark, and the HGLPC Newcomer Award went to Duncan Allen.

The Barbara Cigainero Volunteer of the Year Award was presented to Kevin Davidson, and Pat Hall received the Don Hrachovy Life Achievement Award.

Bill Scott was honored with the Humanitarian Award, which is given to the person whose deeds and life work demonstrate concern for human dignity and equality.

Also honored were *Houston Post* columnist Juan Palomo, as well as event co-chairs Christopher Bacon and Liz Schuler.
