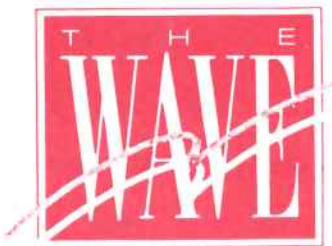

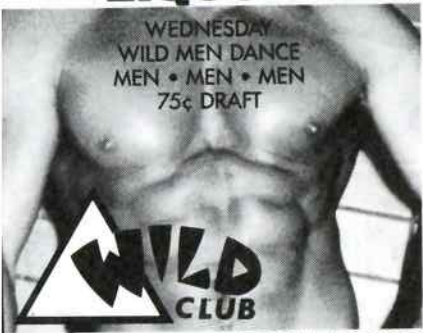

DIFFA DALLAS GIVES OUT OVER \$93,000

*Eight Agencies Share in Grant
Funds Raised Over Past Year.*

DALLAS — The Dallas Chapter of the Design Industries Foundation for AIDS (DIFFA) has raised funds for AIDS organizations and quietly distributed the money for years. But the organization has sometimes been criticized for appearing slow to disperse the money. So this year, the Dallas chapter decided to hold a luncheon to publicly present over \$93,000 in grant funds.

DIFFA holds fundraising events throughout the year, including the Dallas Collection, the Levi denim jacket auction held in the spring. This year's event raised \$156,000.

"We take applications for grant funds two times a year," Steve Burrus told Michael McKinney of TWT. "Then the applications must be reviewed, and hearings must be held to determine if they fall within the guidelines of what we expect the grants to be used for." He added that the next round of grant requests would be accepted some time next spring, and the funds be dispersed by next June 1.

The eight agencies receiving grant funds at the DIFFA luncheon were the AIDS ARMS Network, Bryan's House, the Metropolitan Community Church, Oak Lawn Community Services [OLCS], the Visiting Nurse Assn. of North Texas, the AIDS Interfaith Network, the AIDS Resource Center and AIDS Services of Dallas. OLCS was also presented with a new van for their Care-a-Van services valued at almost \$18,000.

Burrus explained that DIFFA funds are granted on a specific basis, and noted that different organizations receive differing amounts depending upon their needs.

"We try to fund projects that don't fall within regular foundation giving. For instance, the \$15,000 that went to the AIDS Resource Center will be used to help remodel the kitchen for the Food Pantry to use."

Also honored at the DIFFA luncheon were three people and organizations cited as "Unsung Heroes." Jan Strimple was recognized because she is "always there," helping model clothes or take part in fund-raisers.

Burrus said NUVO has been a corporate sponsor for several years, and always opens their doors for special functions. The third recipient was Mara Christian, a volunteer who will be in charge of graphic design for this year's "Heartstrings" production.

DIFFA/Dallas has donated \$427,000 to AIDS organizations since its inception.

NUMBER OF CLIENTS FOR ASA FOOD BANK KEEPS GROWING

*Pantry Seeking Additional
Assistance from Austin,
Other Area Communities.*

AUSTIN — With the AIDS Services of Austin's food bank clientele list growing each week the need for nonperishable food items and toiletries is in high demand.

Sharon Lilly, ASA Food Bank Coordinator, told TWT NEWS "We served over 130 clients the week beginning November 11, and the number of clients seems to be growing each week. After we serve that many clients, the shelves have very little food and other items left on them."

The food bank, which is stocked mostly through donations received from individuals and community groups as well as

ough food drives, is asking for assistance from the Austin community and neighbors in the surrounding area. Items needed the most are chunky soups, ravioli, Progresso soups, canned meats, tuna, boxed cereals, Carnation Instant Breakfasts, boxed pasta meals and I-O mixes. Also needed are nonfood items such as bath soap (antibacterial), shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste, toilet paper, paper towels, shaving cream, razors and feminine hygiene products.

Cash donations are also accepted and used to buy such items as meat, milk, cheeses and other dairy products. Also purchased with cash donations are cleaning supplies and other paper goods. ASA makes up for shortfalls in funding by drawing on a Ryan White grant and from the agency's general fund.

"Since the number of clients is growing we will gladly accept any donations that you may want to contribute," Lilly said. We ask that you also be very careful to check the expiration dates on the food products. Foods past the expiration date or open products are of no use to us."

URVASHI VAID COMING TO HOUSTON IN JANUARY

NGLTF Director to Attend Body Positive Fund-Raiser.

HOUSTON — This city will get a chance to meet one of the most visible and dynamic leaders of the nation's gay and lesbian community when Urvashi Vaid, Executive Director of the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force, visits Houston the weekend of January 18-20.

The roster of events for Vaid's visit is still being finalized, but tentative plans have her addressing women's groups and taking part in a fund-raiser for Body Positive.

Vaid has been NGLTF Executive Director since August of 1989. Prior to that she served for three years as the group's Public Information Director. She has been involved in the feminist and gay/lesbian civil rights movements for more than a decade.

Vaid, an attorney, has written and worked extensively on prisoners' rights and the

rights of prisoners with HIV and AIDS.

She was born in New Delhi, India, and grew up in upstate New York. She is a graduate of Vassar College and Northeastern University School of Law.

NGLTF works to advance lesbian and gay civil rights and other issues through nationwide and grassroots lobbying ef-

orts. The group changed its structure this past year, creating a new organization, the NGLTF Policy Institute, which encompasses the organization's educational, research and grassroots organizing programs.

Vaid serves on the Advisory Board of *Outlook* magazine. She was named *Advocate* magazine's Woman of the Year for 1990.

PROJECT TRANSITIONS HOLDS HOLIDAY GALA TONIGHT

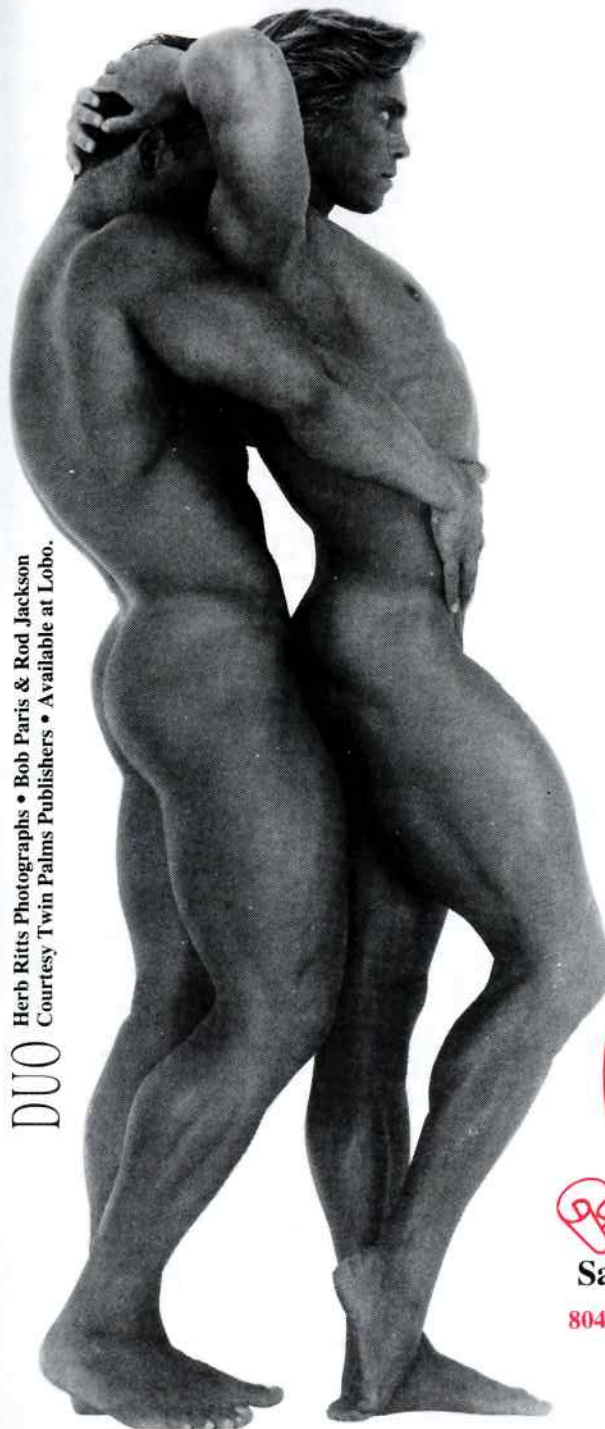
Proceeds from Austin and Donations Will Benefit Hospice.

COURT OKAYS CUTS IN AIDS BENEFITS BY SELF-INSURED FIRMS

*Decision in Case of Houston Man
Who Sued Employer Is Binding
In Texas, Two Other States;
May Be Cited By Judges Elsewhere.*

TEXAS — In a decision that is legally binding in the states of Texas, Louisiana and Mississippi, the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit in New Orleans recently ruled that self-insured employers may alter their insurance policies and reduce coverage for workers who contract AIDS and other diseases for which treatment is expensive.

The ruling is likely to be cited by courts deciding similar cases in other parts of the country, and could have nationwide impact on the way people with AIDS are dealt with by their employers.

The case involved the late John McGann of Houston, who filed suit against his former employer, H&H Music Company, when it dropped its group health insurance and instituted a self-insurance plan. In the process, the company cut the maximum benefit for AIDS-related claims from \$1,000,000 to \$5,000. McGann had already begun filing AIDS-related claims before the cut in benefits.

The company claimed that it was not discriminating against McGann because he was gay or because he had AIDS, although it placed no limitations in its policy on any catastrophic illness other than AIDS.

Although H&H Music cut benefits on AIDS claims as part of its change from conventional health insurance to a self-insurance plan, the decision in the McGann case will likely allow companies that are already self-insured to cut benefits in their existing coverage.

For the most part, the coverage that self-insured companies provide their employ-

ees is not subject to the state regulations which govern private health insurers. In its ruling on the McGann case, the court said that federal law gives self-insured companies great freedom to modify the benefits and terms of the coverage they provide their employees.

McGann was represented in his case by Tom Stoddard, Executive Director of the Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund. Stoddard has said that the decision means self-insured employers will be able to discriminate at will against their workers by excluding specific illnesses from coverage.

McGann died in June of this year. A spokesperson for Lambda told TWT NEWS that no decision has yet been reached on whether to appeal the Fifth Circuit Court's decision to the Supreme Court.

CAPITAL CITY MEN'S CHORUS CHRISTMAS CONCERT

To Next Year's Gala Conference.*

AUSTIN — The Capital City Men's Chorus performs a Christmas concert this Sunday, December 8, one of a series of fund-raising performances the chorus will be giving over the next several months to help pay its way to GALA Festival IV next year.

Festival IV, which will be held in Denver June 28-July 4, is an international conference of choruses sponsored by GALA, an organization with a membership of over 100 women's, men's and mixed choruses from around the United States and the world. The Austin chorus has shown phenomenal growth over the past three years, and is regarded by many as the "new kid" to watch at the conference.

The Capital City Men's Chorus is 60 members strong, making the singing group the largest all-male, all-volunteer chorus in Austin. Special appearances have included Gov. Ann Richards' Inauguration and a Travis County Republican Convention, as well as benefits for AIDS Services of Austin and Project Transitions.

Turner Better Candidate

Dear TWT:

On Thursday, November 7, I had the good fortune to see a press conference with Sylvester Turner, live and unedited. He was talking about the issue of crime, and as a centerpiece he cited the murder of Phillip Smith in the Montrose area. He said that he would *not* tolerate violence against any person because of sexual preference or religious beliefs. This was an unsolicited remark, addressed to the general public.

Sylvester Turner has been a state representative from the Garden Oaks and Acres Homes areas for about four years. He added a hate crimes amendment to a bill passed by the Legislature. It does include sexual orientation as one item in the definition of hate crime. He also sponsored a law to prohibit morticians from discriminating against persons with AIDS.

He has said that he would overhaul the City Health Department using recommendations from the CRESAP report, a study that was made on how to reform this department. He also would have the department work closely with the Texas Medical Center.

I am told that he has been learning much about city government. I myself have seen him develop as a speaker. This capacity to learn is one of his greatest assets.

Our community is fortunate in that all three major candidates for mayor sought the endorsement of the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus. Of the two candidates in the runoff, Rep. Turner has a greater public record, and in his screening he showed more evidence of having thought our issues through.

The one essential thing is that we get out and actually vote. Not only can you vote, but you can talk up voting to your friends. Our voter turnout is what makes our community count in government!

Wednesday, November 13 came and went, and so did the Oak Lawn zoning issue. After a long debate, the City Council voted to pass the ordinance. Council representatives Bartos, Buerger, Lipscomb and Tandy were the only members to vote against it. The results were not surprising; however, the candor and issues used *against* our community were.

Leading the charge was Council member Lori Palmer's statement to the audience, "Where were you when AIDS funding was the issue?" What AIDS funding? The AIDS budget this year was cut from \$500,000 to \$118,000 and *our community* had to fight just to get that amount. Almost every leader in the community and all the AIDS service organizations were present and spoke to the council to prevent further cuts. Council member Palmer also forgot that we had less advance notice of that meeting than for the one on the 13th. What more could we have done? Once again, it is easier to bash the victim.

In response to Palmer's question, I ask "Where was *she*?" I have been to many of the zoning meetings, and it is very clear that Ms. Palmer is a very capable and astute politician. She is quite capable of pulling together the votes she needs. Why did she not fight as hard for AIDS funding as she did for the zoning issue?

Palmer also used the term "fair" 42 times when describing the zoning process. Was it fair that our community was excluded since the beginning of the process? Was it fair how she purposely divided our community to gain power at the bargaining table?

The community has learned several important and hard lessons. The most important is that if we are not a part of the process, especially when it is directly aimed at our community or a part of it, then the process is *wrong, period*. Any

attempts to blame *us* for not being at the table, when we are not allowed at the table, are equally *wrong!*

Finally, we have learned we must be pro-active instead of reactive. We are now beginning to work closer together on zoning issues with the newly formed group, Oak Lawn Concerned Citizens Coalition. Let's hope that we remember the lessons we have learned.

Oak Lawn Plan Harbinger?

As a resident of Houston, I actually had to ask myself if I was reading fiction in the past several issues of TWT about a plan being proposed in Dallas that would close most of the gay bars in the Oak Lawn area due to strategic maneuvering by the Oak Lawn Forum and Oak Lawn Committee. The brouhaha is over the limited number of parking spaces the bars provide and the fact that adjacent streets must take up the spillover.

Allegedly, the Oak Lawn Forum has been working on this plan for the past two and a half years, minus the bar owners' knowledge and participation! Lori Palmer, Dallas City Council member for the district, is being the consummate politician, massaging both sides with one hand each; insuring all parties concerned that she hears, understands and is worthy of their vote on Tuesday, November 5.

In this time, when gay issues, good and bad, are being reported in mainstream media, this particular story floored me. Isn't it enough that AIDS hospices have to fight community resistance, legal and ordinance red tape and lack of funding? Now the bars, which have become a staple in our communities, can be dismantled by the wave of a pious wand that attacks that which is vulnerable.

As gay people, we need to educate straight people about our lifestyle and ask them to support us in that. The bars have traditionally been a place to gather, meet, disseminate information, offer employment, etc. in a world that offers few if any outlets or forums for gay people.

The bars have been a theatre for gay talent: dancers, female impersonators, singers, instrumentalists and myriad types of contests. These bars have served as showplaces for national recording acts who love to perform for gay people.

The bottom line is: You don't take away the hub of a race of people without some dire consequences. Unfortunately, throughout history, and still today, gays have been blamed for the deterioration and decline of morals, peoples, communities, even nations, while homophobia gets away scot-free in attempting to stigmatize who we are.

Every institution, from family to church, from court to Supreme Court, has left us on our own to sink or swim. Too many times we've seen and felt the attitude that nothing substantive is missing when the homosexual and his lifestyle are not allowed to exist.

When will it all stop? When will we all learn? What is the use in teaching history if we do not apply its lessons to the present?

Now that the elections are past, Oak Lawn council member Lori Palmer fearlessly has fearlessly shown her true colors and voiced her approval of the Oak Lawn Plan. Thus it was easier for other council members to follow suit when the

district's own representative stood firmly behind this new ordinance.

Think about it: How is it that we allow other people, and detractors at that, to come into our businesses, our love, our bedrooms, our emotions and dictate to us what we can and cannot do?

Wake up Montrose and Houston, wake up gay communities across America. Does the zealous, shrewd political ax chop just once after its grip has been endowed with legality and imbued with agreement?

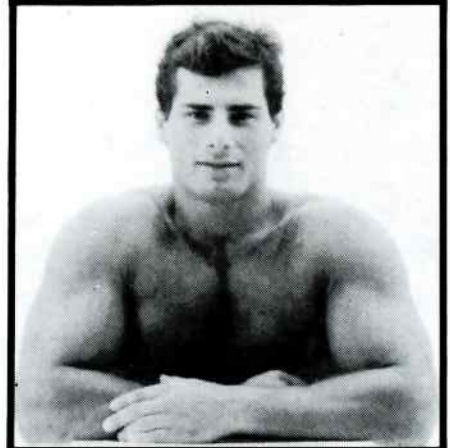

Young people speak of the days they never knew. Surely, those were the "good ol' days when life was simple." Those of us who lived through them can only smile. For how can the young be expected to know that life is never simple and earlier times weren't all that good?

For instance, to look at the movies of the 1930s, one would never guess the nation's people were struggling just to exist. Ginger Rogers and Fred Astaire gaily danced and flew down to Rio; Jeanette MacDonald sang to Canadian Mountie Nelson Eddy; and everybody's darling, Shirley Temple, starred in *Poor Little Rich Girl*. Poor baby.

Yes, there was one movie, *only one*, that portrayed life as it actually existed—*The Grapes of Wrath*. While this movie captured the gritty reality of the Great Depression in stark black and white, most Americans preferred to join Judy Garland in a world of vivid technicolor "Somewhere Over the Rainbow." We called our movies and popular songs "escapism." Considering the reality of those "good ol' days," escapism was justified.

With failed banks, dust bowls, Bonnie and Clyde, children carrying cold-biscuits-and-lard sandwiches to school—some even went without lunch—long soup lines forming down the main streets of our big cities and entire families living under bridges—with brutal poverty constantly pounding us down, we needed a few moments to escape.

We sure as hell didn't need to take on the problems of Europe and Asia. Turning

our backs on trouble, we sang "Who's Afraid of the Big Bad Wolf?" and "Three Little Fishes in an Itty Bitty Pool." As we did so, Germany was busy arming herself and threatening her neighbors. In Italy, thousands of blackshirted crowds greeted Mussolini with cries of Duce! Duce! Japan bombed and machine-gunned the hell out of the poor Chinese. Children were dying of starvation in Africa. It was too much! Drowning in our own problems, how could we save people on the other side of the world?

A Way Out For Some

As always, it was the old, the ill, the women and children who suffered most from the depression. If one was young, healthy and male, there was a way out. In front of every post office across the land were red, white and blue signs beckoning young men to "Join the Navy and See the World." Thousands did. In addition to goodlooking, tight-fitting uniforms, the young man was assured of shelter, food, a chance to travel and—we're talking big money here—\$21 a month. Well, it sure beat the hell out of the grinding poverty most young men knew.

When Germany invaded Poland on September 1, 1939, we didn't know that our days of innocence were ending. We said, "This is not Uncle Sam's fight. This time let Europe fight her own wars." The nation joined Kate Smith in singing "God Bless America." Our beloved land, with all her problems, was, thank God, at least at peace.

Even as a small child David knew that someday he would be a sailor. Someday he would see what lay beyond the city limits of Waco. So immediately after graduating from high school, he joined the Navy. As soon as they were issued, he eagerly slid into his dress blues with the 13 alluring buttons framing his basket. It was the spring of 1940 and the springtime of his life. As the train pulled out of the depot, little did he know what lay ahead. "Pardon me boy, is that the Chattanooga Choo-Choo?"

After boot camp he was assigned to the aircraft carrier *U.S.S. Lexington*. Life was comfortable. He was where he wanted to be, at sea and in the Navy. His hammock was his home, his shipmates were family. Wearing "bell-bottom trousers, shirts of navy blue," he enjoyed liberty in many ports on three continents and had no trouble making out with military personnel or civilians. His best shore-leave buddy had the shoulders and biceps of a linebacker. He was also well hung. In port, while most "salts" were trying to give it away, this muscled marvel serviced both men and women for a fee.

In Europe, things were not so comfortable. In 1940, the Germans marched into Paris; Churchill gave his "blood, toil, tears and sweat" speech; Japan, Germany and Italy signed a military and economic pact forming the Axis alliance. And staggering gobs, happily returning from shore leave and still thinking they were free of other people's problems, sang "You Are My Sunshine."

The Pearl

Alarmed by Japan's expansionism, the Navy moved its command post from Long Beach to Hawaii. By 1941, Pearl Harbor had become the home port for the entire Pacific fleet, including the *Lady Lex*, as the crew affectionately called their ship. Shore leave on a tropical island with good buddies—all of them wearing snug-around-the-ass "tight white" uniforms—was paradise.

And yet...there were ominous signs. It's been said that coming events cast their shadows before them. On several occasions David and his shipmates saw the *China Clipper* land and take off with Japanese envoys bound for peace talks in Washington, DC. But when you're young and healthy, you don't dwell on ominous shadows.

There were 2,951 horny young men aboard the *Lady Lex*, and little room for privacy. But if two buddies were damn careful, sex could be had in a number of places: the sewing room below deck, the uptake shaft of the ventilation system, the flag bag compartment and the area where torpedo heads were stored. Almost every man—gay or straight, married or single—could be had given the no-women-available circumstances. The boys called it "having a little fun, just messing around." Radios played, "It's a Big, Wide, Wonderful World We Live In." So it seemed.

The Japanese sneak attack was not the complete surprise the media made it out to be. U.S. intelligence had broken the Japanese military code and Joseph C. Grew, our ambassador to Japan, warned President Roosevelt of a possible attack. Thinking it might be aimed at Midway Island, the *Lady Lex* set out with her decks loaded with Marine fighter planes, and was thus saved.

December 7

"...a date which will live in infamy!"

Aboard the *Lexington*, a radio operator picked up the report: "Air raid—Pearl Harbor—This is no drill." The *Lex's* fighter planes quickly took off for the home port, the aircraft carrier following behind.

Arriving at "the Pearl" a week later, the crew stood on deck in unreal silence to survey the destruction: six battleships sunk, 164 planes destroyed, 2,008 sailors, 218 soldiers, 109 marines and 68 civilians killed. More than 1,178 other men were wounded. The officers and crew were unable, indeed, didn't even try, to choke back the tears.

Now the nation became serious. No more itty bitty fishes. We sang, "Praise the Lord and Pass the Ammunition" as thousands of young men and women rushed to post offices to enlist in the services. Civilians offered to work in defense plants around the clock. Our women left their typewriters and kitchens to roll up their sleeves and become "Rosie the Riveter." Defense plants suddenly became war plants and went into fast speed forward, furiously spitting out tanks, planes, ships, jeeps and guns. Never before in the history of our nation had the people become so solidly united. A tune maker dashed off, "We Did It Before and We Can Do It Again." And by God, we would. Those dirty bastards would pay!

But not before Guam fell, and then

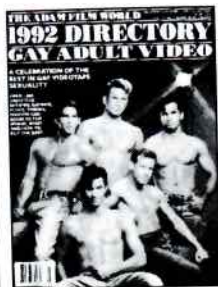

Wake. We lost the Philippines and Bataan. The Japanese, flush with victories, waited for the soft Americans to beg for a reasonable peace. When we did not and they found conquest tasty, they set out to annihilate the remaining U.S. fleet.

The Battle of the Coral Sea

Outnumbered and outgunned, Admiral Nimitz knew he had to take a stand or lose the Midway Islands. The Lexington was in the thick of the Coral Sea battle. She took three 500-pound bombs in the very center of her top deck; two plane-launched torpedoes ripped into her side.

But the Lady refused to go down. Even as gasoline vapors ignited between decks and her own torpedoes were exploding, the crew fought furiously to save her. Somehow they managed to keep her afloat. But that evening, reluctantly taking the advice of an Admiral and Chief of Staff, the Captain ordered David to run up the heart-wrenching signal flags ordering "Abandon Ship!" Although there was little panic, many men were forced to jump overboard or slide down ropes into the sea. David, carrying secret code books and the ship's logs, transferred to a destroyer without even getting his feet wet. The Captain, in the best naval tradition, was the last to leave his ship.

That night, our own destroyer fired a torpedo into the carrier. As the Lady Lex went down, her survivors openly wept. Lost were 216 men, mostly injured seamen and medical personnel where the sick bay had taken a direct hit. The crew's only consolation was the knowledge that all the

planes that had attacked the Lady had been gunned down.

That memory was etched in the crew's hearts forever. The day was April 8, 1942.

Of war and men, history has observed that before battle, men might be good buddies. But by fighting side by side, by sharing fear, blood and heartbreak, good buddies become even closer. They discover that they love each other. But being men, they're afraid to say so.

Victory

Although the end of the war was still three years away, with the Battle of the Coral Sea, our Marines, sailors and soldiers slowly began taking the war to Japan. At the same time, the Allies began rolling back Hitler's forces. Victory in Europe (V-E Day) came on May 8, and Japan was atom-bombed into unconditional surrender by August 14, 1945 (V-J Day). The war was over! "The Lights Came on Again All Over the World," and eventually "There Were Bluebirds Over the White Cliffs of Dover."

Fifty years after Pearl Harbor, the number of war dead is still unknown. It's been estimated at 35 million. In addition, there were about 10 million Jews, Slavs, political prisoners and gays who died in Hitler's concentration camps.

After 20 years of dedicated service, mostly teaching communications, David left the Navy. He had served admirably. The Navy never knew—or perhaps they did, but looked the other way—that he was a gay sailor and a damn good one. He received an honorable discharge and now lives in quiet seclusion just outside Dallas.
