LIFEWALK 1993 PART II

Upcoming AIDS Walk Provides
Funding For Emotional and
Educational Programs For
Persons Challenged by AIDS

Dallas' LifeWalk, one of the top ten AIDS walks in the United States, has, in just three short years, raised over \$350,000 for the AIDS service programs of Oak Lawn Community Services. Much of that money, as reported in last week's SPECIAL REPORT, is earmarked for direct care programs targeted specifically toward people with AIDS—the Daire Center, Care-A-Van, prescription services and the Buddy Project.

But there is so much more that must be done to combat the specter of AIDS. For one, the disease affects the emotional well-being of those infected in ways that are more complex than many other life-threatening diseases, particularly because of the social stigma associated with AIDS. Additionally, because there is so much misinformation about the disease, education about AIDS must be a part of any viable program to effectively combat the disease.

Program developers at OLCS recognized the added challenges facing those with AIDS, and through the years have developed a comprehensive program designed to offer those infected with HIV with the emotional support they need to cope with the disease, and to provide uninfected individuals with the information necessary to understand HIV and safeguard themselves against possible infection.

Emotional support for PWAs is offered primarily through the Counseling Department at Oak Lawn Community Services. Through individual and group counseling, HIV-infected and affected persons are given the opportunity to develop coping mechanisms. In fact, in the words of Jay Newberry, CSW, an OLCS staff counselor, "counseling is an important part of holistic health for the HIV-impacted."

Newberry continues, "The physical changes and medical demands of coping with HIV require time and energy. Unfor-

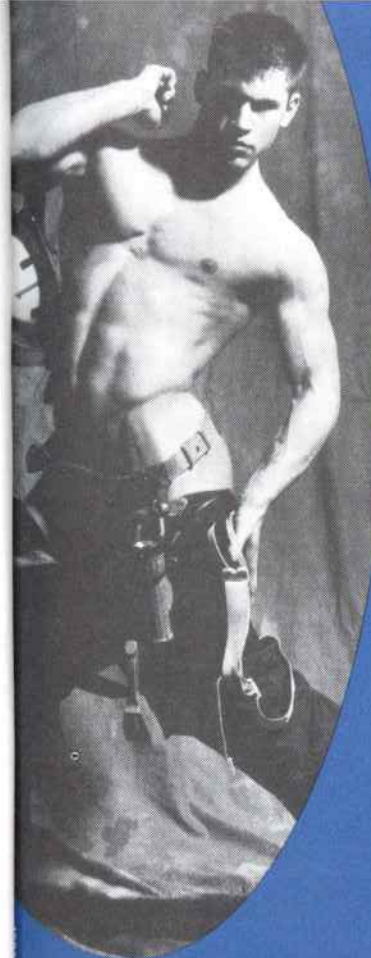
tunately, coping with these changes—such as the loss of physical stamina, having 'good days' and 'bad days,' or changes in physical appearance—are not the only stresses that people face. HIV affects us psychologically and socially as well."

"For example, the stresses on friend, family and lover relationships, and coping with prejudice both from inside and outside the lesbian and gay community, are things that each person living with HIV must face. People often struggle with how much to tell friends and family, afraid that they will be whining, and many people are ashamed to go out in the gay community once they think they are starting to look sick. One does not have to be 'crazy' to be able to benefit from counseling."

According to Newberry, "seeking professional and peer feedback and support are helpful for those coping with HIV disease: people can find a safe place to ventilate feelings that a loved one might be too upset to deal with when the person needs support. The support and focus that counseling can bring people facing the many changes and pressures of HIV can greatly reduce their stress level, and free up more energy to deal with their medical and personal needs."

"Groups can be helpful not only for those with HIV disease, but for friends, family and significant others as well. Dealing with HIV, personally or as a loved one, when one has other infected friends (living or dead), is just as important as the people who are dealing with HIV for the first time. Groups allow these people to gain support and information from one another. Often people who have been coping with HIV for some time can not only give support and advice to those who are less familiar, but they can gain a sense of power from providing that support that can help sustain themselves."

The Counseling Department at OLCS offers seven support groups each week, in

addition to individual counseling sessions, to people with AIDS and their significant others.

One other area in which individuals can benefit from the counseling services at OLCS is through the department's Oasis Daytime Wellness Program, which is specifically designed to provide accessible substance abuse treatment in a safe environment to people diagnosed with symptomatic HIV infection.

Outpatient treatment through the program consists of two phases. In Phase I, the client attends two program meetings per week, in addition to group sessions, educational lectures and discussions regarding wellness, HIV/AIDS and chemical dependency. In Phase II, the client attends group therapy once a week for 12 weeks.

The programs at OLCS are an essential part of the emotional and physical well-being of the community, even in the absence of an HIV-positive diagnosis. The first defense against the spread of HIV has always been an effective education program, so Oak Lawn Community Services has always placed a high priority on preventing people from getting infected in the first place.

Twelve years into the epidemic, there is still a prevailing "us" versus "them" attitude, with a large portion of the general public still considering AIDS as something that only affects "those people." What OLCS tries to do is to educate the community, making people aware that "it's not who you are, but rather what you do that puts you at risk of infection."

OLCS educators carry this message through a wide range of presentations dealing with HIV/AIDS. These presentations are free of charge to interested parties, and can be fine-tuned to meet the needs of a particular group. Some of these presentations have included discussions of AIDS in the workplace, psychosocial issues of HIV, and AIDS as it relates to the Americans with Disabilities Act.

Perhaps the most important informational and educational tool that OLCS provides is the AIDS Information Hotline, co-sponsored with the Dallas County Health Department. The service provides the entire community with a source for the most up-to-date information about the disease, as well as available resources for those who are infected, or believe that they are at risk of being infected.

One of the most important aspects— and benefits—of the Hotline is that it is accessible to people who may not normally

be tapped into the AIDS service network. People like the one Kim Batchelor, Director of the AIDS Information Hotline at OLCS, describes.

"The young man was 19 and convinced that his days were numbered. Only a few months before, he'd had his first sexual experience and for the past few weeks had been feeling symptoms of fatigue, nausea and loss of appetite. The holidays were approaching and he was convinced that he would be looking across the dinner table at his parents, unaware they'd soon be losing their son to AIDS.

"He called the AIDS Information Hotline and talked with an 'information specialist' who offered more than just facts that put him at ease, but an understanding ear. At the end of the conversation, the caller commented that it was as if 'a weight was lifted' off of his shoulders."

In addition to young callers, the Hotline has been receiving an increasing number of calls from women who have been infected. One woman in particular, continues Batchelor, "reached a specialist on a weekend, in agony from shingles and frustrated over her difficulty in accessing services. Although the Hotline specialist couldn't ease her pain directly, she did help her to organize a plan of action for contacting agencies to fill her specific needs."

The AIDS Information Hotline is staffed six days a week, and provides pre-recorded tapes 24 hours a day. The service is not meant to be a crisis line, but can provide information that will comfort the caller until further services can be obtained. Just recently, the Hotline began offering information about other sexually transmitted diseases, since those persons who contract an STD are more likely to be at risk for HIV infection.

While there appears to be no immediate end in sight to the AIDS crisis, there are effective methods for coping with the disease and for educating the community in proven methods to prevent its spread. Oak Lawn Community Services has a proven track record in providing direct care, educational and emotional support services to the community that can be beneficial in managing this devastating health crisis.

Community support is essential to the continuation of programs at OLCS. Participation in LifeWalk '93 is one way to show that support. Those interested can still volunteer by calling LifeWalk at (214)443-WALK.

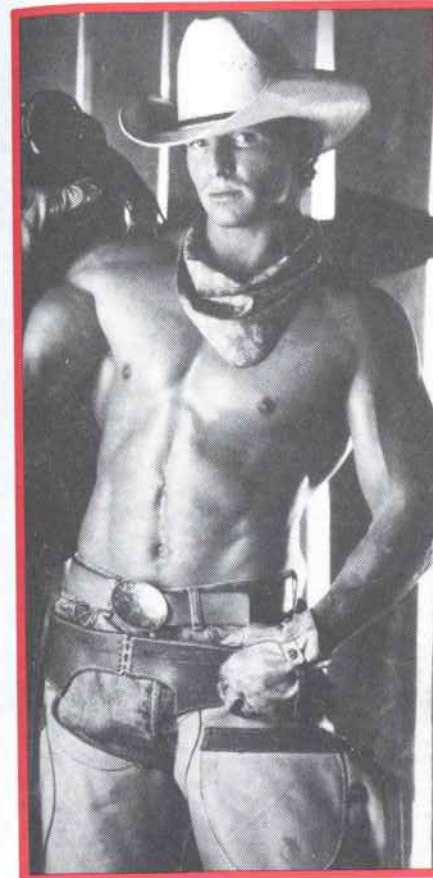

Questions & Answers on HIV

Because of my HIV infection, I am finding myself having a harder time keeping up with my work. I am afraid of losing my job because of repeated absences. Should I consider claiming disability?

Claiming disability is a very personal matter. The decision to do so should be well thought out and involve careful planning. The stress level of your job must be weighed against the loss of personal satisfaction that you receive from working. Of course, if you are physically or emotionally unable to keep up with the demands of your job, you should claim disability. But often this can be a gray area. There are times when people will continue to push themselves to keep up the same work pace despite increasing difficulty in doing so. This may lead to decreased work performance and consequent penalties or even termination by one's employer. If you have not made your illness known to your employer, you may not be protected by the Americans With Disabilities Act.

Depending on the employer, you may be able to sit down and discuss your situation. Your employer may be able to make allowances for your decreased stamina, such as reduced hours or a less demanding position. If this cannot be done, then claiming disability may be the best alternative. Before embarking on this route, you will need to carefully analyze your disability benefits. Some employers provide short-term disability coverage. This can provide income for a limited period of time and should be considered in case of an acute illness from which you may recover entirely. If it is unlikely you will recover sufficiently to return to work, then you should consider claiming long-term disability.

Before taking any such action, you should consult with your physician. He or

she can give you the best idea of your overall condition and what can be expected for the future. The decision to claim disability is yours, but the decision to grant a disability claim usually lies with the disability insurance carrier, whether such insurance is provided by your employer or you have your own personal policy. The carrier will base the decision on your degree of disability, which usually must be supported by objective evidence found in your medical records.

As part of your planning, you will need to analyze the amount of income you will receive from the disability policy. You may need to alter your budget to fit a lower income. You also need to consider any waiting period that may exist before benefit payments start. Once your disability benefits have started, periodic review of your condition will be required by the insurance carrier.

Whether or not you have disability insurance coverage, generally you should also apply for disability status with the Social Security Administration. If you have no insurance coverage, Social Security may provide your only source of income. If you do have coverage, the amount of benefit from your policy may be reduced by the amount paid by Social Security. Once your disability status starts, your medical insurance will generally change to what is known as COBRA coverage. Most employers must provide this medical coverage for 29 months, although you may be required to pay the premiums. After the 29 months of disability, your COBRA coverage will end and you will be eligible for coverage by Medicare. The 29-month waiting period for Medicare coverage starts at the time you are given disability status by the Social Security Administration. Hence, it is important that you apply for that status

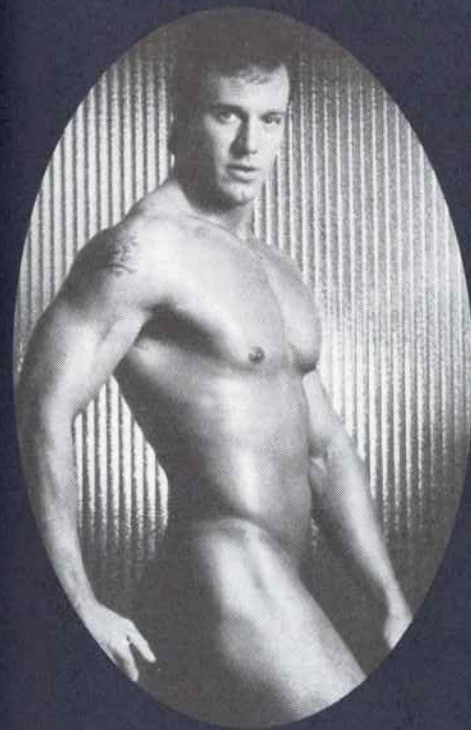

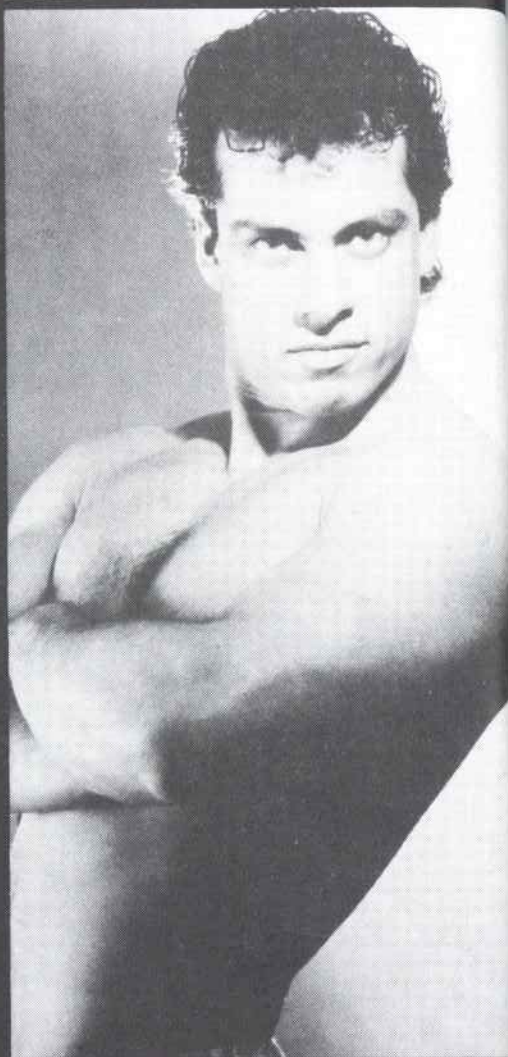

at the same time you claim disability with your employer.

Obviously, claiming disability from work is a complex matter. Once you have decided that it is in your best interest to do so, proceed cautiously so as to protect all of your rights and benefits. There are agencies in most cities that can provide social workers to assist you. If you anticipate or incur problems, you may want to seek the assistance of an attorney.


My new roommate has a pet cat. Should people with HIV infection be worried about caring for pets?

Pets can be a source of comfort and companionship to anyone, and people with HIV infection are no exception. Indeed, some feel that caring for and being cared for by a pet during an illness can be therapeutic. There are some guidelines which need to be followed. Certain animals harbor infections that are transmittable to humans. These infections can be particularly dangerous to someone with a compromised immune system.

Certain birds may harbor fungal organisms or infections that cause pneumonia in humans, so contact with birds and bird cages generally should be avoided. Tropical fish tanks may be contaminated with mycobacterial organisms. Gloves should be worn when cleaning fish tanks or handling fish, and hands should be washed thoroughly afterwards.

Cat litter boxes may be contaminated with Toxoplasma organisms. Cleaning of litter boxes should be done daily by a non-HIV-infected person. If that option does not exist, gloves should be used and hands washed thoroughly afterwards. Avoid inhaling dust from the litter box.

In general, keep your pet healthy and clean. Avoid feeding your pet uncooked meats, unpasteurized milk or food that may be spoiled. Wash your hands after handling your pet. Do not adopt sickly or stray animals. If your pet develops diarrhea or other signs of illness, handle it carefully and have it treated promptly by a veterinarian. If you are scratched or bitten, wash the wound promptly with plenty of soap and water and notify your physician.

There's something we need to talk about, something that you may have suspected about me but never have been able to confirm.

I am a coupon queen. More Sunday mornings than not find me sitting cross-legged on my living room floor, sipping designer coffee, the blades of my scissors gleaming with the morning sun as they fly through slick national coupon circulars. The more coffee, the more the scissors fly, the more I save.

Everybody needs a hobby.

A little ritual that I employ prior to going grocery shopping saves me more money than one might suspect. Times being what they are, I feel the need to pass this information on to you. After snipping them, I divide my coupons into three stacks: one stack for items I *desperately* need and want and must buy, another stack for items I *somewhat* need and want so will buy, and a third stack for items I don't need or want and for that reason *shouldn't* buy, but *what-the-heck-I've-got-a-coupon*.

Recently, because *what-the-heck-I-had-a-coupon*, I purchased a magazine the genre of which does not normally grace my coffee table. This particular magazine had

a picture of tulips on the cover, no spicy personals in the classifieds and no interviews with anyone wearing snakeskin. This magazine's table of contents listed articles about poaching fish, how it feels to become a grandmother and a recipe for dog biscuits.

What the heck, I had a coupon.

Among these articles was a well-placed list boldly entitled "80 Skills Kids Should Have Before They Start Kindergarten." Based on the expectations of this list, Danny Bonaduce may be right: children today *do* live in a different world than we did at their age. I seriously question whether that many of us possessed these 80 skills by the time we graduated from high school, let alone kindergarten, unless we count "knowing the alphabet" as 26 individual units.

The list in question was compiled by researchers for World Books, Inc. on the basis of a survey of 4,500 kindergarten teachers' assessments of the physical and mental capabilities they expected of their pupils.

As I scanned the criteria, it became excruciatingly clear that the difference between those who *are* five years old and

It became even more clear that sitting accordion-style in those little molded plastic chairs has had a tendency to make kindergarten teachers unreasonably demanding, or at least 4,500 of them. If you doubt this, run yourself and a handful of your contemporaries through the repertoire below.

According to current educational standards, Joe or Jonetta Kindergarten should be able to:

- repeat a 6-to-8 word sentence. The words "nail tips," "girlfriend" and "RuPaul" don't count;

Hey, wait a minute. I think I have a two-for-one coupon here somewhere.

Twins it is.

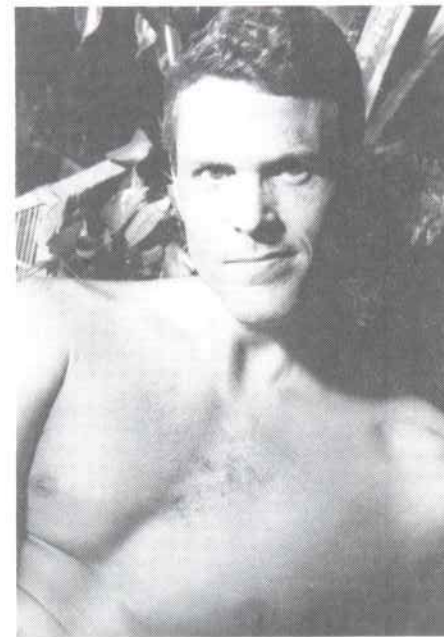

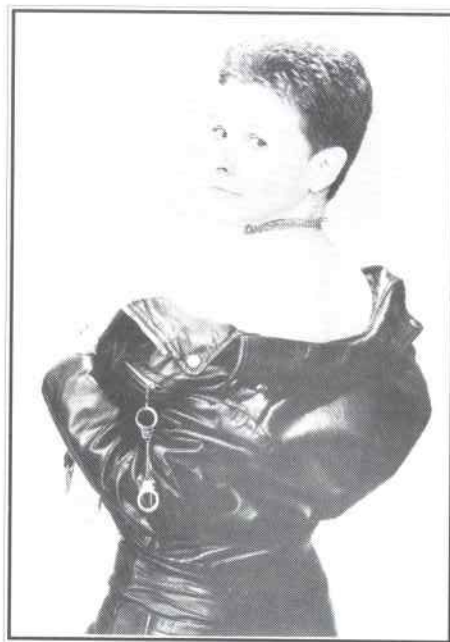

MCC AUSTIN: CELEBRATING 15 YEARS OF SPIRITUAL GROWTH AND EMPOWERMENT



Metropolitan Community Church of Austin [MCCA], a place where individuals and families can fulfill their spiritual, community and educational needs in a healthy and loving environment, celebrates its fifteenth year of growth next weekend.

Originally established in 1975 as the Austin Community Church, the congregation in 1978 became a chartered member of the Universal Fellowship of Metropolitan Community Churches, founded in 1968 by the Rev. Troy Perry. At first, services were held in the living rooms of various members as well in rented spaces. For the past year and a half, the church has been worshipping at a more permanent location across from the campus of St. Edwards University, and hopes to build a new 500-seat sanctuary in the near future.

MCCA members like to say that the people are the church and each member is a Christian minister. They believe in what they describe as magnifying God's will, cherishing God's people, celebrating God's love and advancing God's dominion. Goals are fulfilled on a daily basis through the church's many educational, worship, pastoral care and social action programs.

MCCA's Center for Spiritual Growth has proven popular with members and non-members alike. Through the Center, the church offers an educational format of four annual quarters that provides opportunities for personal growth and maturity.

Courses are offered in three major categories, each emphasizing a particular area of growth. "Being" focuses on helping to explore one's self, individually and in a relationship. "Knowing" is designed to assist participants in learning more about their faith biblically, historically and in terms of current issues. "Ministering"

consists of practical courses designed to increase skills in one's chosen areas of ministry. Courses offered range from membership and theology classes to an AIDS Ministry Workshop. Two of the most popular are "Homosexuality and the Bible" and "Being an Inclusive Community."

On May 16 of this year, the first male/female co-pastorate in the 25-year history of the UFMCC was established at Metropolitan Community Church of Austin. The MCCA congregation unanimously voted to appoint the Rev. Wendy J. Foxworth and the Rev. Kenneth T. Martin Senior Co-Pastors of the church.

Rev. Foxworth has served as Senior Pastor of MCCA since 1990. Within that time, the church has experienced remarkable growth, both spiritually and physically. At the end of Rev. Foxworth's first year as Pastor, the congregation had an average of 83 people attending its weekly worship service and a total membership of 98. During her tenure as Senior Pastor, the church has grown to an average Sunday worship service attendance of 250 people and 171 members. Rev. Foxworth has also received the respect and admiration of the gay and lesbian community in Austin.

Rev. Martin comes to Austin from Los Angeles, where he most recently worked as a counselor and medical case manager for the Healthcare Center, the world's largest HIV early intervention treatment facility. Previously, he served as Senior Pastor of MCC in the Valley in North Hollywood from 1982 to 1989.

Foxworth and Martin have worked together in the past, so teamwork is not a unfamiliar concept to either of them. In a recent joint statement, they said, "We share a vision of a theologically progressive, culturally and racially diverse Christian

The 15th anniversary celebration begins next Saturday, October 2 at the Omni Hotel, with an evening of dinner, dancing and entertainment. Highlight of the banquet will be the presentation of awards to church members and others. The celebration continues on Sunday, October 3 when both Pastors will present a dialogue sermon entitled "It's Time to Dream Again."

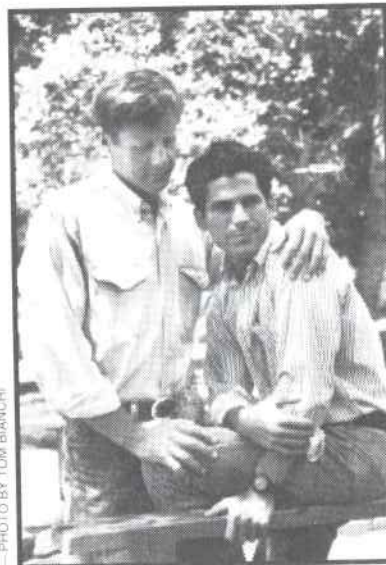

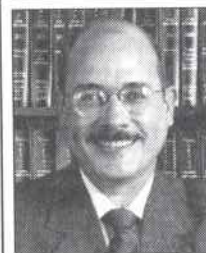

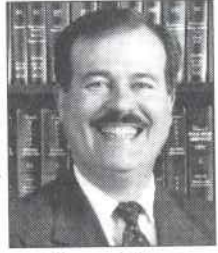

Why Host a House Party?

Dear TWT:

Last week, I was counseling at the Montrose Clinic and had to give a positive HIV test result to a young gay high school student. Not expecting this pronouncement, he was stunned. This young man had rarely practiced safer sex and felt that, although very sexually active, he was not at risk. He thought he had never had sex with an HIV-positive man. After all, the only guys he slept with were young and "straight" (i.e., they had girlfriends). When asked when was the last time he had unprotected sex, he replied, "last night."

Unfortunately, this is a fairly typical scenario for many young men in our community. They are often naive and ignorant about the risks. But what they don't know *can* hurt them. I wish this

situation was the exception rather than the rule. Unfortunately, the same excuses that place our gay teens at risk are prevalent in all areas of the gay male community.

Some are in deep denial while others have not yet been directly touched by AIDS, so they cannot see themselves at any "real" risk. Everyone has their own reasons for having unsafe sex. But let's face facts: the gay male community still maintains the highest percentage of new HIV infection cases. What can our community do to stop this genocide?

I also want to encourage everyone to get tested if you are at risk. Never before have we had so many choices in living with HIV. Knowing your HIV status can help you make informed decisions and take control of your life. You risk your life by refusing to get tested. There is no such things as "living as if" you were positive without getting tested. Being HIV-positive is not the end of your world, but you can't even begin to deal with this issue unless you know where you stand. You can have time to explore your options, learn to take control against this disease and get on with living!

Changing and/or maintaining sexual behaviors is never easy. As human beings, we all make occasional mistakes. This is why AIDS Foundation Houston [AFH] offers safer sex workshops and personal house parties. They are an entertaining and painless way to talk about the issues relevant to your sex life. It's much more than condom talk. We clear up the mysteries of oral sex, play out safer sex scenarios and explore hot, erotic options for improving your sex life (while keeping it safer). No matter what your HIV status, attending a safer sex house party can be the most important step you can take in the fight against HIV disease. AFH offers the walk-in type house parties on the third and fourth Tuesdays of each month from 7-9 p.m. Or you could host a group of your friends to your own private "rubberware"

party in the comfort of your own home, reaching people that we could not.

HIV infection is easily preventable, but we must work together to stop its spread in our community. We all have a duty to confront the myths that may place our lives in danger. The AFH "Wellness Program" promotes the various free workshops and classes offering direction for people living with HIV. Similar programs are offered in other cities around the state, so check with your local AIDS service agencies.

Montrose Counseling Center is a full-service outpatient mental health center, while Montrose Clinic, just a few doors down, is a respected and busy medical testing and treatment center for those with HIV and other sexually transmitted diseases. Both are an integral part of the services for the HIV community of Houston.

While Montrose Clinic is primarily associated with HIV and STD services, when it comes to mental health, Montrose Counseling Center has many services beyond HIV counseling.

This year, Montrose Counseling Center celebrates its fifteenth anniversary of service to the gay, lesbian and bisexual community. Formed in 1978, we have grown to be one of the largest nonprofit gay mental health agencies in the United States, currently serving over 500 people a week, and the very first (and only) openly gay United Way agency in the South.

We are dedicated to the entire spectrum of needs facing the gay, lesbian and bisexual community of Houston. We currently have groups for sexual abuse treatment, chemical dependency, women only, men only, mixed HIV-antibody couples, HIV-positive couples, HIV negative men, dream interpretation, victims of battering and the list goes on.

Most come for individual psychotherapy, and we are open to all individuals regardless of sexual orientation (straight people are coming here too!). We even provide training for Houston businesses and organizations to help them deal more positively and compassionately with lesbian, gay and bisexual people. We also participate locally, statewide and nationally in projects to improve the mental health and perception of lesbian, gay and bisexual people everywhere.

We are proud of our work with the HIV community; the recovery community; the lesbian, gay and bisexual community; and the Houston community in general. We want you to know, when you need us, that we are there for you. When you aren't coming here for services, we are in the community working for you. And, most of all, we care about you.

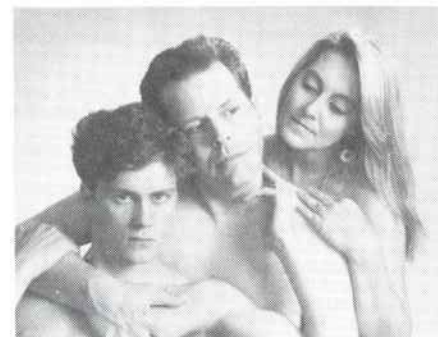

CITY COUNCIL RACES IN HOUSTON DRAW FIVE GAY CANDIDATES

*Hopefuls Represent Wide Range of
Backgrounds and Experience.*

HOUSTON — Houston City Hall was overwhelmed last Monday by potential office-seekers rushing to beat the 5 p.m. filing deadline, and when the dust had begun to settle, over 100 candidates had gotten on the ballot, including an unprecedented five openly gay Houstonians running for City Council seats.

Activist Ray Hill held a press conference earlier in the day Monday to announce his decision to run for at-large Position 2, which has been by Eleanor Tinsley for the last 14 years. The effort marks Hill's second bid for a spot on Council. In 1987, he ran against former Council member Jim Westmoreland, coming in second in a field of three.

While noting that he has supported Tinsley in every election since her first successful bid for City Council in 1979, Hill said he believed that she has been in office too long. He indicated that government regulation and interference in citizens' lives would be a major theme in his campaign.

"I believe that the best government is that which governs least. I do not think the government needs to tell its citizens how to run their lives."

Four other openly gay hopefuls made the filing deadline. Gary Van Ooteghem, a businessman who was instrumental in founding the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus, filed for at-large Position 1, currently held by Gracie Saenz. Rob Bridges, an orchestra musician and owner of a music publishing business, is running for at-large Position 3, which was left vacant when incumbent Jim Greenwood was forced to step down by term-limit provisions passed by voters in 1991.

Gene Harrington, a professor at TSU's Thurgood Marshall School of Law and a community activist, filed for District D, which is currently held by Al Calloway. Brian Bradley, one of the city's most vocal gay rights and AIDS activists, is running for at-large Position 4, now held by Sheila Jackson Lee.

The five were scheduled to meet on Wednesday to discuss the possibility of

coordinating campaign strategies.

Harrington seemed to sum up the feelings of many when he told TWT NEWS why he had decided to run.

"We have... endorsed, we have worked for, we have sent money to many people who have expressed our cause as [being] on the agenda, and what we have to show for it is the fact that we're still criminals in our own state; we still have no local anti-discrimination protection in our city; we have no anti-AIDS discrimination protection; we have no domestic partnership benefits; and to add insult to injury, they carved us [Montrose] out of the only district from which we had a chance of electing a gay or lesbian candidate and transferred us to a district whose Council member has shown absolutely no interest in our issues."

Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus president Terri Richardson was excited about the gay candidates.

"[Monday] was an incredible day for the lesbian and gay community. I'm very proud, and the community should be proud, of the people who went down and filed to run for City Council... We're taking responsibility for ourselves now... We're empowering our community."

According to the provisions of the term-limit law approved by voters 1991, elected city officials who have been in office for three consecutive terms must step down. But a separate ordinance also passed that year allows three-term incumbents to run again if they submit petitions signed by a certain number of voters—20,000 in at-large races and a fixed percentage of the number of votes cast in the previous election in the case of district races.

The first to fall to the term-limit provisions were City Council members Jim Greenwood and Ernest McGowen, who failed to submit enough signatures. Then petitions turned in by City Controller George Greanias and four other City Coun-

cil incumbents—Tinsley, John Goodner, Christin Hartung and Frank Mancuso—were called into question on technical grounds. Greanias and the four Council incumbents got a reprieve when Mayor Bob Lanier decided on Monday that technical errors in their petitions should not keep them off the ballot.

Lanier and Council members Calloway, Sheila Jackson Lee, Judson Robinson III, Gracie Saenz and Helen Huey are not affected by term-limit provisions this year.

The five City Council hopefuls join two other gay Houstonians, Brian Bowen and James Partsch-Galvan, who have both entered the race for mayor.

THOUSANDS TURN OUT FOR PRIDE FESTIVITIES IN DALLAS

*Speeches by City Council Members
And HCRF Director Tim McFeeley,
Performances by The Flirtations
And Tandi Andrews
Highlight Lee Park Celebration.*

DALLAS — Dallas' gay and lesbian community joined visitors from across Texas last weekend for the 1993 Alan Ross Texas Freedom Parade, the city's 10th annual celebration of gay pride and achievement. With over 10,000 spectators and participants lining Cedar Springs from Wycliff to Oak Lawn, organizers are pleased to admit that they believe this



year's event was by the largest, and some say the most spectacular, in its ten-year history.

Nearly 90 entries, representing businesses and organizations from throughout the state, participated in the two-hour-long procession through Oak Lawn, the heart of Dallas' gay and lesbian community. Longtime and successful couple and businesswomen Wendi Phoenix and Trudi Stinson carried the banner which signified the beginning of the parade with Grand Marshals Deb Elder and Tom Davis and Special Grand Marshal Sheri Powers following in a show of spirit, dignity and unity. Colorful floats, marching bands, brightly decorated cars and trucks and hundreds of walkers formed a representation of Dallas' diverse gay and lesbian community which proceeded down a street lined with scores of festive and cheering observers.

Closing ceremonies for this year's Pride Week celebrations were held, once again, at Arlington Hall in Lee Park, where the Dallas Tavern Guild has created and maintains the Living Tribute to the city's AIDS community. Over 3,000 people followed the parade to the park to hear speeches by Dallas City Council members Chris Luna and Craig McDaniels and by Tim McFeeley of the Human Rights Campaign Fund.

A special presentation was made to Bruce Monroe, who received an award honoring Bill Hunt, the AIDS activist who died this year after a courageous battle with cancer and in whose name the parade was dedicated. Also receiving an award was Rick Barton, the brother of David Barton—co-owner of Hunkey's Restaurant—in whose name the Celebration in Lee Park was dedicated. Barton also succumbed to complications from AIDS this year.

Also recognized for community achievement in the ceremony at Lee Park were Mary Franklin of the AIDS Resource Cen-

ter Food Pantry, for Community Service; the Turtle Creek Chorale, for achievement in Fund-raising; and Dick Peeples, who received the Masterpiece Award. Jeffery Campbell received this year's Lambda Scholarship Award.

Trophies for the best parade entries—as judged by Jack Evans, George Harris, Kay Vinson and Omar Angeles—were awarded to Caven Enterprises, which received the Dallas Trophy for Best Business Presentation; the Turtle Creek Chorale, which was honored with the President's Trophy for Best Organizational Presentation; Bamboleo's of Dallas, which received the Commemorative Trophy for Most Original Entry; the Krewe of Olympus, honored with the Pride Trophy for Best Out-of-Town Presentation; the Hideaway, which received the Unity Trophy for Best Non-professional Float; Bamboleo's of San Antonio, which was awarded the Texas Trophy for Best Interpretation of the theme "Family of Pride"; and Oak Lawn Community Services, presented with the Grand Marshal's Trophy for Best Interpretation of the Theme "Family of Pride" by an Organization.

Two of the highlights of the Celebration in Lee Park were performances by The Flirtations and by Texas Entertainer of the Year Tandi Andrews. According to Alan Ross, organizer of both the parade and the Lee Park event, "Usually when you have performances at the Celebration, people continue to talk. But when Tandi and The Flirtations performed, everyone stopped talking and listened. And Tandi was pantomiming!"

HOUSTONIANS MARCH TO PROTEST LATEST ANTI-GAY ASSAULTS, OFFICIAL APATHY

*Nearly 200 Take Part in Action
Organized by OUTrage.*

HOUSTON — Nearly two hundred activists and others rallied last Friday evening and marched through the heavily gay Montrose area of Houston to call attention to the continuing threat of anti-gay violence and denounce official indifference toward the problem. The event, billed as "Take Back the Streets III," was organized by members of the recently formed direct-action group OUTrage.

The crowd which assembled for last Friday's action was much smaller than at previous such events, but apparently no less passionate. After gathering at the intersection of Waughcrest and California, near the site of a recent assault on activist Rob Cavanaugh, the marchers, led by a flag-bearing contingent of drummers from the Women's Action Coalition and accompanied by members of the Q Patrol, proceeded across Montrose Blvd. and down Pacific Street, then across Westheimer to Lovett, where they reassembled to hear speeches.

Mayor Bob Lanier and other city officials were repeatedly denounced for their failure to address the issue of hate crimes in Houston, and several speakers called attention to the fact that there were no elected officials at the rally. Crawford stressed that hate-motivated crime is a threat not just to gay and lesbian people, but to women and members of other minority groups.

Lewis and Crawford recently formed OUTrage to fill the gap left by the breakup of Queer Nation earlier this year. Last Friday's protest march was the group's first action, with organizers promising more to come.

Christopher Dunning was stabbed on September 1 by two men who called him "fag," while several days later, Cavanaugh was attacked and beaten as he walked home from a convenience store, suffering a broken jaw and head injuries.

GAY MAN SHOT IN DALLAS' OAK LAWN *DGLA Investigating Complaints Of Verbal Harassment of Gays, Lesbians Last Sunday.*

DALLAS — After a beautiful day of celebrating gay pride with the thousands of other participants in this year's Alan Ross Texas Freedom Parade, 19-year-old aspiring musician James "Kevin" Davenport and his lifemate Johnny Kealy wanted nothing more than to return home and go to bed. But someone had other ideas for the young man, because at 2:15 a.m. Monday morning, Davenport was reportedly approached by a young Hispanic male and shot just steps from the apartment he and Kealy share. At press time, Davenport remained unconscious in intensive care at Parkland Memorial Hospital.

While there are conflicting reports about the incident, what is known is the following. At approximately 2:15 a.m., Davenport and Kealy approached the intersection of Reagan and Hall in the Oak Lawn area of Dallas when a car, possibly a 1981 blue Monte Carlo, pulled up to the curb. The occupants of the vehicle were four Hispanic youths in their early teens. Two of the youths got out of the car and approached the gay man. One of the youths said, "I have a gun."

Davenport and Kealy turned to face the young men, and then began to run towards their apartment building. The youth holding the gun opened fire on the men, with one bullet striking Davenport in the back of the head and, possibly, a second bullet striking him in the collarbone. He was taken to Parkland Memorial Hospital, where he underwent emergency surgery.

Just prior to the attack, the suspects were observed in the parking lot of a nearby strip shopping center by a security guard there. Two of the four youths were seen roaming through the parking lot, while the other two remained in the car. When they realized that they were being observed, they left the lot and headed down Reagan Street towards the intersection with Hall where the shooting occurred.

While there is a chance the crime was part of a gang initiation process previously detailed by a Dallas radio station, Dallas police were not willing to confirm or deny that fact until they had had a chance to speak directly with Davenport.

According to Dallas Police Department Officer Lynn Albright, who serves as the liaison between the gay and lesbian community and the DPD, "Our problem right now is that we do not know if Davenport knew his assailants. There are conflicting reports that indicate that the assailant called his victim by name. The police are investigating, and they have some good leads on the car in question, but we're hoping to obtain a statement from Davenport when and if he regains consciousness."

Gary Bellomy, Chairman of the Dallas Gay and Lesbian Alliance's Social Justice Committee, is looking into a number of complaints of verbal harassment of gays and lesbians who had gathered to watch the Texas Freedom Parade by Hispanic youths, and is investigating Davenport's shooting. 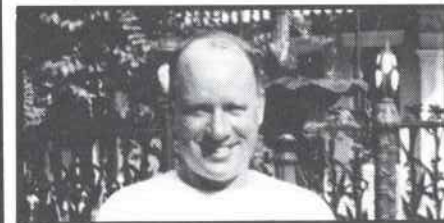


Ronald Kent Yung (above)
