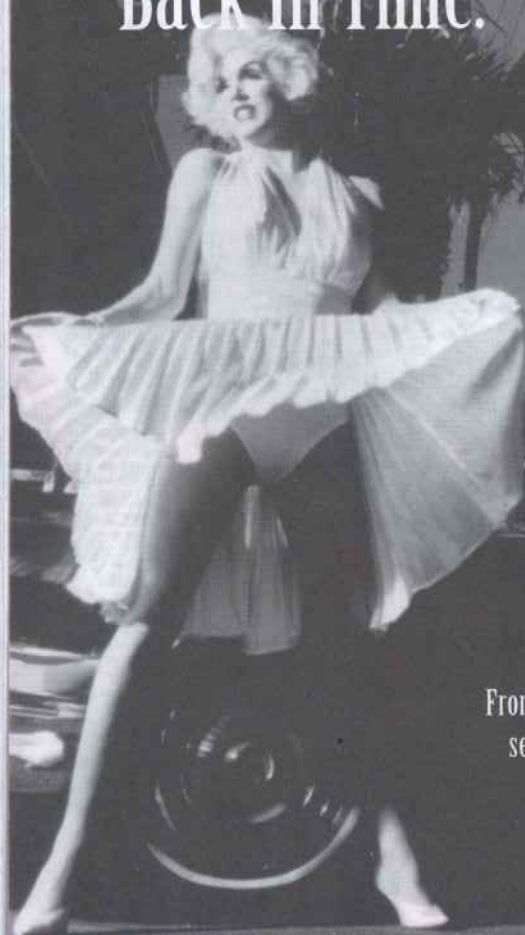

Jim Thurman probably didn't imagine what he was getting himself into when he started the newsletter "Positive Threads" in May 1994.

"I had been HIV-positive myself since 1984," he explained. "But I'm still very healthy. I used to make copies of things that I read about HIV and AIDS, for my own information and for anybody else who might be interested. Then one day I was sitting in the David Powell Clinic in Austin, and I saw this woman come in with her kids. I saw that look in her face...of people who think like they're going to die tomorrow from this disease. Something about her motivated me to put this together. I basically started it because I wanted to share some of the information I was getting, and let others with AIDS and HIV know they're not alone and there's a lot they can do to keep themselves healthier."

Thus began "Positive Threads," a newsletter for people living with HIV/AIDS dedicated to empowering them with information on surviving with the disease. It started out as an eight-pager, with 700 copies circulating in the Austin area. Within a year, both AIDS Services of Austin and the HIV Wellness Center were mailing copies to their clients, and Thurman was up to printing 3,000 copies a month at 12 pages each.

For November-December 1995, "Positive Threads" has its largest issue yet, a 16-pager that is now out at the bookstores, bars and other sites where it's available to anyone. It's also a combined issue, as Thurman is finally heeding his doctor's advice to take a little time off from the project to care for himself a little more. He's also using the end-of-the-year issue to make a public request for additional funding.

"Positive Threads" is still soliciting from individuals and public corporations for money to continue our operations; \$20,000

is needed to maintain our operations for the next six months," Thurman noted. "Each month we get about 40 subscription requests, and we mail out free to those who need it and really can't afford it. But a lot of people out there could afford the \$25 for a year's subscription and still are getting it free; that's making it difficult to continue for everyone.

"We're officially a nonprofit corporation; we got our 501(c)(3) status in August. A couple of times I thought of quitting this; I'd feel like, 'What's the point?' Don't get me wrong, I love this, but sometimes the work and the financial struggling gets me down. But then I'd get a letter from somebody with AIDS, or HIV-infected, and they'd tell me how I've helped them, how I gave them advice or information or pointed out where to go for help. And I'd get right back up there on my rocket."

"Positive Threads" avoids being issue-related, or targeted to any particular part of

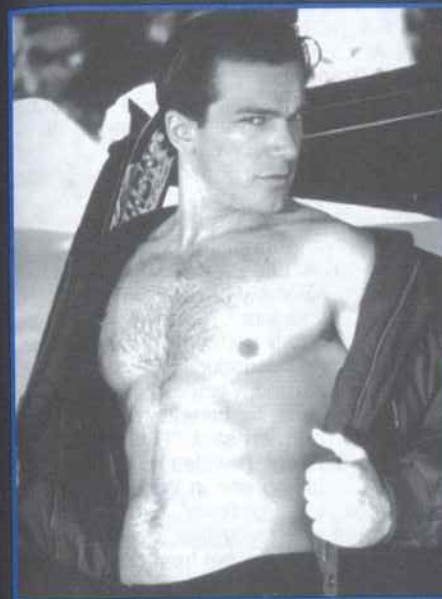

made the decision then and there to make it a community thing, and not focus so much on just gay-related stuff or straight-related stuff," Thurman said. I make sure the articles reach out for everyone. The information my people write about is for everybody; I leave the politics or issues out."

Thurman must be doing something right and necessary; his confidential mailing list includes addresses all over, from big cities like San Antonio, Dallas, Houston, Amarillo, Waco and El Paso to small towns like Tyler, Grapevine, Kerrville, Hewett, Cleburne and Palestine. He even has subscribers in Oklahoma, and about 30 in Shreveport, Louisiana.

For the November-December 1995 issue, Amy's Ice Cream and Lammes Candies donated over 500 gift certificates for "Positive Threads" clients at ASA or Informe-SIDA. Life Partners, Inc. and Medical Escrow Society have also been big financial supporters; Thurman is hopeful more supporters will come forward, since donations are tax-deductible.

"When I started, I wanted the people of the Austin area to benefit from 'Positive Threads', Thurman said. "There are probably 20 different newsletters around the country, including one in Wichita Falls, for pediatrics and 'Positively' in Houston; but there's nothing really like it around here. The information you get from doctors is not always complete or up-to-date.

"It makes me happy to know others are benefiting from my work. It's truly a labor of love."

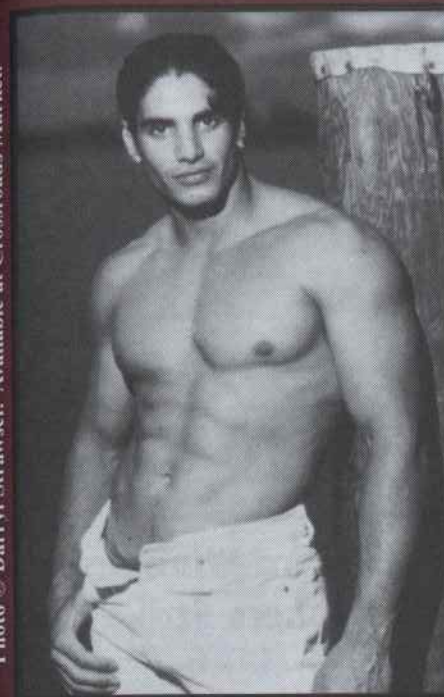

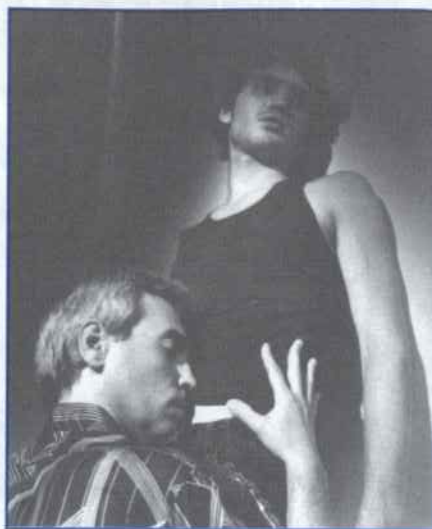

**Award-Winning
Filmmakers Strike Out
With**

POSTCARDS FROM AMERICA

The Rice Media Center, on the campus of Houston's Rice University, is well known locally for offering alternative films for audiences on a broad variety of topics and themes. Next weekend's presentation certainly fits in; *Postcards from America*, a bleak, angry cry about growing up gay in a hostile society.

Inspired by the poetry and autobiographical writings of David Wojnarowicz, who died of AIDS in 1992, the work weaves together three fictional stories from the life of a young gay outsider. It begins with an adult David letting out a gut-wrenching scream in the open desert, and flashes back to childhood and scenes of adolescence. In the opening vignette, he describes himself as "the visual equivalent of a scream."

A violent suburban childhood spent with an abusive father in New Jersey in the early 1960s is seen from the homosexual child's perspective. Grim remembrances of parental fights, violence in the neighborhood and sexual exploitation by older men are recalled by the withdrawn ten-year-old. The unhealthy environment of David's childhood leads to his years as a teenage hustler on the streets of New York, where he teams up with another street urchin of similar background. The two find shelter in the lower Eastside apartment of a rough-around-the-edges drag queen and serve as her "men." The path eventually leads to David's fascination with anonymous sex, the American desert and the open road.

Parts of *Postcards from America* are narrated by David's blue-collar father, who

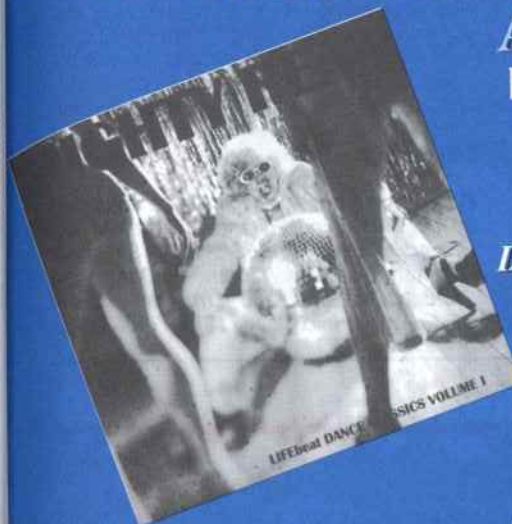

worked in the boiler room of commercial ships in the '60s. As the drunken, abusive head of a household, Michael Ringer provides the best acting and subsequent convincing drama of this film. His scenes with Maggie Low, who plays David's battered mother, are no less than disturbing.

Every possible art film cliché is painfully evident in this choppy, crudely edited film, from the overdramatic performances of its ensemble cast to the dimly lit sets in all the vignettes. The exceptional costuming does, however, provide a realistic sixties feel.

One obvious flaw is the casting for the disturbed gay man in his teen and adult years. The adult David, played by Jim Lyons, appears to be the same age as the teen David, portrayed by Michael Tighe, making the hodgepodge of scenes even more confusing, as they look like different characters.

Director and writer Steve McLean has plenty of opportunity to at least convey eroticism in this uneven stream-of-consciousness series of recollections. There's plenty of sex in the street hustler scenes,

but none of the scenarios is even slightly stimulating. This could, however, be McLean's attempt to show the cold, unemotional world of prostitution.

It is mind-boggling that *Postcards from America* could be so bad when it boasts exceptionally talented filmmakers with proven track records in "new queer cinema." Producer Christine Vachon's credits include *Poison*, which was awarded the Grand Jury Prize at the 1991 Sundance Film Festival, and the more recent lesbian hit *Go Fish*. Cinematographer Ellen Kuras was also honored at Sundance for her work on the critically acclaimed *Swoon*.

If the goal of this film was to perturb viewers, McLean certainly succeeds. Unfortunately, it's the substandard production values instead of the script's subject matter that make this piece so disturbing.

Postcards from America will be screened by the Rice Media Center (Entrance #8, University Blvd. and Stockton St.) next Saturday, Dec. 2 at 7:30 and 9:30 p.m. and Sunday, Dec. 3 at 7:30 p.m. Admission is \$5. For more info, call (713)527-4853. **W**

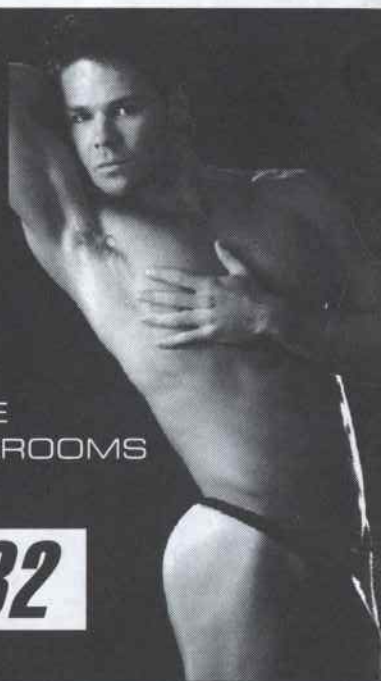

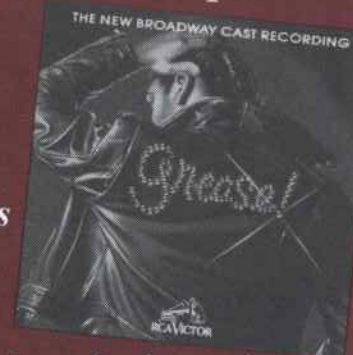

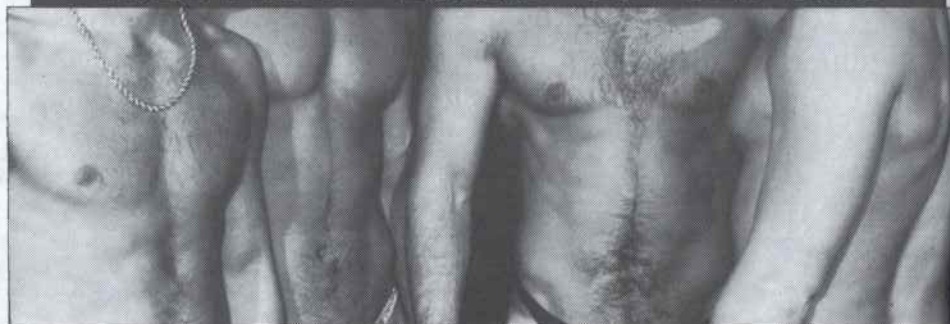

Over the past year, I've been very fortunate to be able to meet, interview and party with many, many names in the dance music industry. And you know what? For the most part, the majority of these artists are ordinary people just like you and me, just trying to make it through. The only difference is that more people know them. One of the most down-to-earth people I've met all year has to be Brenda K. Starr. What a delightful human being!

Brenda started out at an early age when her mother took her into a Manhattan studio where she cut her first demo, her own version of "Love On A Two-Way Street." She looks back laughingly, "They used to play it at the local roller rink."

After taking a bit of time off to devote to her children, *Tori Alexis* (two) and *Kayla Faith* (five), Brenda is back on the scene again with a fierce new single, "Thank You," and she's busy writing material for her new album, which should be out early next year on her own label, Substance Records.

TWT: How did you get started at such an early age?

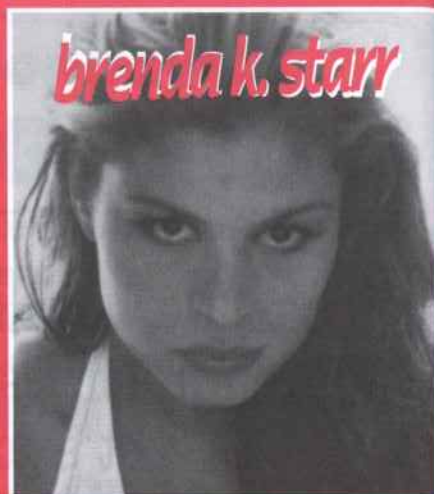
BKS: I don't even remember when I started wanting to sing. I've always wanted it. I always wanted to be in choruses and, like, in front of the mirror with a brush, mimicking singers. I made my first demo when I was 12 and then my first record was "Pick Up the Pieces" when I was 14.

TWT: Who discovered you?

BKS: I used to break dance in this group called The Dynamic Dolls and we did a big contest for Harry Belafonte, who was going to do this movie called *Beat Street*. I sang the theme song on a TV special and some guy named Malcolm Cruz liked the way I sang and knew what club I used to break dance in, so he found me and asked me to talk to Jerry Greenburg at Mirage Records. A week later, I was signed. I had a single and one album on the label, but then the label folded.

TWT: So then you went to MCR?

BKS: Yes, after Mirage I went there and did one album and



four singles.

TWT: Someone told me you were working on a Latin project.

BKS: Actually, yesterday I had an audition with Sergio George, who does, like, India and Marc Anthony. I think I did pretty good, but I was so nervous. But yes, I would like to branch out and do some more Latin things.

TWT: I love the way your voice has matured — not that there was anything wrong with it before.

BKS: Oh, thank you! You know, when I was younger the songs that were picked for me were sort of poppy, young, kind of innocent. But the songs that I'm doing now are definitely me because I write them. I've always loved urban music, which is black music which crosses over to Top 40. And the ballads are definitely in the league with Whitney Houston, Regina Belle, and those are my idols, the ones that I think are incredible.

TWT: And you can always rework a ballad for the dance floor.

BKS: That's right, honey, I'm

gonna do one of Angela Bofill's songs. I ain't gonna say, but I'm tearin' it up. You know, she was my teaching singer when I was very young.

TWT: When can we expect a new album?

BKS: Around January–February...I'm doing some club music, but I'm also doing some urban contemporary vibe, too. The first single will be "Feels So Good," which will also have a cool club mix done. And I wrote this ballad, "Keep It A Secret," which is lovely, the words are so deep. It's gonna be fierce.

TWT: What are your plans with the label? Are you going to develop other artists as well?

BKS: I'm basically focusing on myself right now. We're gonna make some noise and get it going. We may develop other artists later, but for now the focus will be on me.

TWT: How do you feel about gay people. You know TWT is a gay publication?

BKS: That's okay, honey, because you know what? About 85–90% of my fans are gay. The clubs I play at for the most part are gay clubs. I do tons of benefits for AIDS, and just did an AIDS song that is a duet that we are trying to get put out, and all the proceeds will go to Lifebeat. And I just wrote another up-tempo song called "A Better Day." It's a song I wrote for people that are fighting AIDS. It's an incredible house record and it's under construction right now. But all the money from that is going to AIDS research as well. We don't want any money from this.

TWT: What is your basic philosophy about life and success?

BKS: In order to be successful, you have to believe in yourself. Don't let anyone say you cannot do it. And if it's not worth the struggle, then it's not worth having. In every aspect...that deals with your relationship, your career, your family and your financial status, everything in life.

TWT's Jimmy Smith wanted to share with readers just how flawless Brenda K. Starr is. Carlos Jimenez (the female impersonator Brenda K. Starr and San Antonio bartender) hasn't been doing so well in the health department lately, and there was a huge benefit show for him recently. Get this...the real Brenda K. Starr took time out of her busy schedule just to call the day of the show and extend to the drag Brenda, who was convalescing at home, a get-well wish. What a gal. Gotta love her! Be on the lookout for her album soon, and for booking info you can call Jimmy at TWT. We'll be glad to hook you up.

Miss Houston 1995 NICOLE TURPEAU

Brings A Personal Perspective
To Her Dedication As An
AIDS Activist

The Fifth Annual HIV Service Providers, Inc. Membership Breakfast award winners and attendees had a surprise in store for them at the Wyndham Warwick on Oct. 26 as AIDS activist Nicole Turpeau, Miss Houston 1995, addressed a captivated crowd that included members of that professional association. It seemed as if the young, outspoken 20-year-old beauty queen had as much experience and knowledge in dealing with the deadly disease as the roomful of HIV service provider professionals.

Inspired by the death of her beloved older brother Brian from AIDS complications, Turpeau founded S.A.L.U.T.E. [Stop AIDS Let's Unite to Educate] an outreach organization dedicated to informing young people on the threat of HIV/AIDS, other sexually transmitted diseases, teenage pregnancy, and the psychological repercussions of premarital sex. Her community service "platform," now a requirement of the Miss America Scholarship Pageant, has won the award for outstanding program at the state level for the past three years at the Miss Texas Pageant and was recognized nationally in the top three programs of all the thousands of contestants in preliminaries to the renowned Atlantic City tradition. During the past year, the activist has devoted over 400 hours of community services to AIDS education.

The most empowering moment in her life, Turpeau says, occurred as a high school sophomore when her parents conveyed the news of her brother's HIV-positive status in 1990. "It was a time when people still considered it a bad word. By the time I was a senior, I was fed up with jokes of promiscuity. My peers had no clue



what it was like living with and knowing someone who was positive HIV. With Brian's blessing, I founded S.A.L.U.T.E." Originally conceived as a program for junior and high school students, with the motto of "Celebrate Life by preserving it through wise decisions," the project's scope has expanded through Turpeau's efforts to meet the needs of college students.

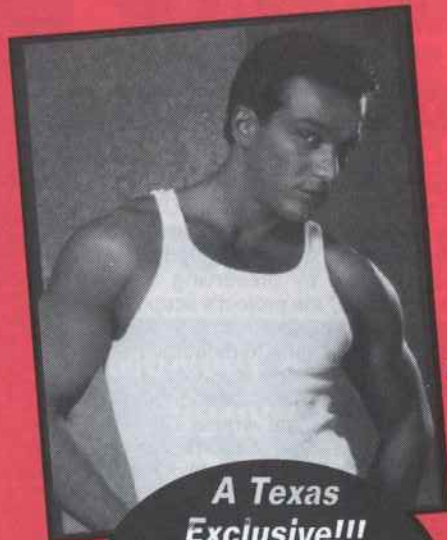
City Councilman Felix Fraga, whose District H is home to the Thomas Street Clinic, a public HIV treatment facility of the Harris County Hospital District system, praised the efforts of Turpeau. "We've practically adopted her at City Hall," laughed Fraga. "Mayor [Bob] Lanier is her favorite fan, especially when she plays the saxophone." It's through the woodwind jazz instrument that Turpeau feels most connected to her brother. When the teenage girl was selecting an instrument to play in the school band, her mother showed little enthusiasm at the prospect of purchasing another musical instrument for the less-than-focused adolescent, who had already received expensive piano and harp lessons. Brian, ten years her senior, agreed to let her use the melodic device he had played a decade earlier; thus began her love affair with the sax.

Ray Highfield, Chaplain of Twelve Oaks Hospital, joyfully reported in his introduction of keynote speaker Turpeau that the talented musician frequently soothes AIDS patients with performances in the hospital. She radiated an angelic quality as she shared with the tearful group her melodic

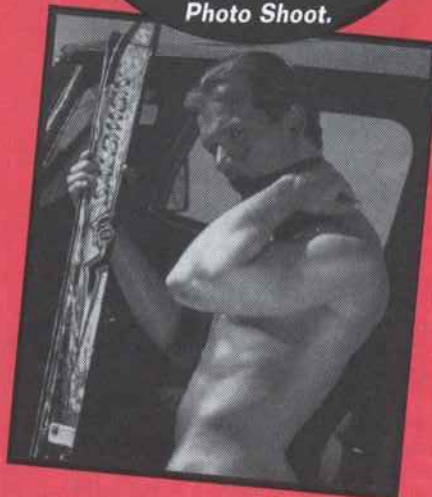

rendition of Kenny G's "Silhouettes," which
 she played for her brother on his death
 bed. "Gracefully and bravely he faced the
 end on Dec. 5, 1994 after an 11-year bat-
 tle with HIV/AIDS," recalls Turpeau.

In addition to honoring Turpeau, who
 was accompanied by her parents and Dr.
 James McFadden, president of St. Thomas
 University (where she is a junior communi-
 cations and philosophy double major), HIV
 Service Providers presented awards to the
 individual and agency of the year for out-
 standing service. The Diocesan AIDS Min-
 istry received top agency honors for its
 assistance of AIDS patients, while Carla
 Randle, of Option Care, a home infusion
 company, earned accolades for individual
 contributions to the AIDS community.

Toby Newman, a popular therapist in the
 AIDS counseling community and president
 of the five-year old HIV Service Providers,
 invited Turpeau to enlighten the group's
 members. "The objective of our organiza-
 tion is to help us talk to one another to
 coordinate services for people with AIDS.
 The membership includes nonprofit, for-
 profit, community agencies and individuals
 who wish to meet with one another to en-
 hance services." In addition to important
 communication among competitors, New-
 man feels the organization's greatest ac-
 complishments include the coordination of
 the annual AIDS candlelight memorial
 service on the steps of City Hall as well as
 citywide World AIDS Day activities. The
 group is dependent upon the generosity of
 its members to fund its community efforts.

Perhaps the alarming statistics cited by
 Newman most effectively emphasize the
 importance of organizations like hers.
 "When we were formed in 1990, Houston
 had about 4,500 diagnosed cases of AIDS.
 Now the numbers are over 12,000 and still
 climbing. As the problems continue, the
 issues become more complex. It becomes
 more important for us to meet and to
 renew and refresh ourselves to serve the
 needs of our HIV clients."

TEXANS JOIN IN WORLD AIDS DAY NEXT WEEK

Observances Keyed to Theme of Shared Rights and Responsibilities.

TEXAS — This is the eighth year for observances of World AIDS Day, which is celebrated annually around the globe on Dec. 1. Activities are coordinated by the American Association for World Health in conjunction with the World Health Organization, which estimates that, as of June 1995, 20 million men, women and children worldwide had been infected with HIV and that approximately 4.5 million of them had developed AIDS, a 20% increase over the previous year.

The theme of this year's observances, "Shared Rights, Shared Responsibilities," emphasizes the importance of equality and solidarity in the worldwide, national and local response to HIV/AIDS. In Washington, DC, the White House will dim its lights from 7:45–8 p.m. On a more local level, a partial list of World AIDS Day events scheduled around the state follows:

▼ In **Austin**, "Texas Remembers, Texas Responds," a ceremony of remembrance hosted by the Texas AIDS Network, will be held on Friday, Dec. 1, with opening remarks by state Rep. Glen Maxey at 4:30 p.m. on the south steps of the state Capitol bldg, 11th St. and Congress Ave., followed by a reading by author Marion Winik at 4:45. At 5, 220 white balloons bearing red ribbons, representing the 220 Texas counties where AIDS has been reported, will be released along with hundreds more balloons inscribed with the names of family members and friends lost to HIV.

At 5:30 p.m., a reception at the Texas Medical Association's Thompson Auditorium, 401 W. 15th St., will open with a performance by the Davis Elementary School Choir. At 6 p.m., David Ward, R.N., vice-president for hospital operations at John Peter Smith Hospital in Fort Worth and chair of the Texas AIDS Network, will deliver welcoming remarks, followed by a keynote address by Joseph Gathe Jr., M.D., co-director of the special diseases unit at Park Plaza Hospital in Houston.

▼ In **Beaumont**, a memorial service will be held Nov. 30 at 7 p.m. at Holy Family Retreat Center, 9920 N. Major Dr., with prayers being offered for those lost to HIV

as well as those living with the disease. Rabbi Peter Hyman of Temple Emmanuel will speak, and all friends and families of those affected by HIV/AIDS are invited to attend.

On Dec. 1, the Triangle AIDS Network will coordinate a candlelight vigil at 6 p.m. in Rogers Park.

Quilt viewing hours are 7–10 p.m. Friday; 9 a.m.–9 p.m. on Saturday, Dec. 2; and 9 a.m.–4 p.m. on Sunday, Dec. 3. Closing ceremonies are slated to begin at 4 p.m. Sunday.

Throughout the weekend display, some 31 area AIDS agencies will have booths set up to enable visitors to pick up information about AIDS awareness and the more than 107 AIDS services available in Dallas. Also, during the course of the weekend, the names of those who have fallen to the disease will be read out loud during quilt display hours.

LIFE SENTENCE GIVEN IN AUSTIN SLAYING OF GAY MAN

Trial of Fourth Man Charged in Death of Ernest Saldana Pending.

AUSTIN — A 20-year-old man was sentenced to life in prison last Friday for the

brutal beating death a year ago of Ernest Saldana in Austin.

A Travis County jury took less than four hours to convict Joseph Queen of capital murder, aggravated robbery and organized criminal activity. The capital murder conviction carries a life sentence to be served concurrently with two 50-year sentences.

Queen was one of three men sentenced for the Nov. 3, 1994 murder of Saldana, who was targeted because he was gay. The trial of a fourth man charged in the slaying is pending.

According to statements taken by the police, Saldana's attackers yelled "faggot" and "gay boy" in English and Spanish during the deadly assault.

Saldana's parents, Rebecca and Daniel Saldana, said they felt justice had been served by the life sentence.

"My son wasn't the first gay to be killed and he won't be the last," Daniel Saldana said Friday. "But at least these guys won't be around to hurt other people."

"This has all been very sad for my family," added Rebecca Saldana, "but at the same time, there's relief because this trial is over."

Dianne Hardy-Garcia, executive director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, said she admired the Saldanas' courage in speaking out about hated-related violence. They testified about their son's death before a Senate hearing earlier this year.

"They made a commitment to do something to help others despite their tragic personal loss," Hardy-Garcia said. "I'm very proud of their strength and courage."

Daniel Saldana said he owes it to his son's memory to continue educating others about hate-inspired violence.

"There is a lot of hatred for lesbians and gays, but everyone deserves the right to live without being harmed," he said. "We're going to continue to speak out."

DALLAS DOCTOR DECIDES TO RETIRE

*Richard M. Olson Was One of
First In City to Treat AIDS.*

DALLAS — Richard M. Olson, one of the first physicians in the city of Dallas to treat HIV-infected persons, is retiring due to health reasons.

Olson was diagnosed with advanced cancer of the prostate in the summer of

1992. Initially given six months to a year to live, he has been undergoing experimental chemotherapy in Houston and has been in remission for several years. To compound his illness, he caught a severe gastrointestinal flu which resulted in even more discomfort and led to his decision to retire.

Starting out in general practice at the Grove Medical Center in 1970, Olson focused his practice on obstetrics, delivering close to 3,000 babies in his career. In 1970, he met Howie Daire, who became a patient of his. The following year, Daire founded the Oak Lawn Counseling Center, which would in time become what is now known as Oak Lawn Community Services, one of the preeminent AIDS service agencies in the state of Texas. Daire persuaded Olson to become the center's first doctor, addressing the unique problems faced by gay men and lesbians. Olson opened a second, smaller office down the hall from OLCC in 1982 and watched his practice balloon when HIV became a reality. His patient load was so great and his desire to treat those affected so deep that he closed what had been his primary office in 1986 to concentrate on HIV and the fight against AIDS.

Immersing himself in the treatment of the new disease, Olson became the first physician in Dallas to offer inhaled pentamidine treatments for the prevention of pneumocystis carinii pneumonia, commonly known as PCP. In 1988, Olson began the first HIV drug studies in Dallas. The original ddC studies begun in 1989 at the center had the largest enrollment in the nation, and Olson worked closely with the drug company Roche to launch ddC to the public. He continued numerous other drug studies and was instrumental in testing drugs which were eventually approved by the FDA.

His groundbreaking studies in new treatments for HIV led him to be asked to become a member of the Hoffmann-LaRoche International AIDS Advisory Board, a post he held for six years, working with European counterparts in the study and treatment of AIDS.

He was also honored by *D Magazine*, which selected him as one of the best doctors in Dallas in July 1992.

Olson also served as a Clinical Associate Professor at the University of North Texas Science Center for many years, training students in the treatment of HIV and AIDS.

CITIZENS COUNCIL AT HOUSTON CLINIC SEEKS NEW MEMBERS

*Potential Advocates for Clients
Of Thomas Street Facility Sought.*

HOUSTON — A council that advocates for patients at a county AIDS treatment facility is seeking new members, who will be appointed at the group's next meeting in January.

More than 4,000 Harris County residents receive medical services for HIV and AIDS at the Harris County Hospital District's Thomas St. Health Center. The Thomas St. Health Center Citizens Council has its origins back in the fall of 1991, when a group of AIDS activists and advocates, frustrated with what they considered adverse conditions at the facility, formed an ad-hoc advisory committee whose purpose was to seek a dialogue with the hospital district concerning the treatment of patients with the disease.

TSHCC meets the second Wednesday of every month at 2 p.m. (There is no December meeting.) At the January meeting, the presiding council will appoint new members to serve out the terms of those who have resigned or passed away. Council seats fall into two categories: Consumers, i.e., those persons infected with HIV who would be eligible for services at the health center, whether they use such services or not; and Non-Consumers, those persons not considered eligible for hospital district services, regardless of HIV status.

Other council membership requirements include being at least 18 years of age, residing or working in Harris County, not being employed by the hospital district and Locklin said, "willingness to actually put the time in on meeting, listening to patient concerns and then taking action." Extensive community experience is not required.

Those interested should be prepared to devote about six hours a month, including attendance at a monthly formal board meeting and assorted informal committee meetings, as well as making phone calls and sending faxes.

Persons interested in addressing the TSHCC board or in serving as council members and patient group representatives should attend the January 1996 meeting, to be held at Thomas St. Health

Bob Hodge died on Nov. 16, 1995 due to complications from brain cancer at The Hospice in the Medical Center, Houston. A memorial service is planned for Sunday, Dec. 3 from 4-6 p.m. at the Chapel on the Central Campus of the University of Houston (off Cullen Blvd. at Entrance #13).

Bob graduated from Cal State University at Dominguez Hills with a B.A. in 1979 and obtained his master's degree from the University of Houston, Graduate School of Social Work in May 1989. His employment at the Montrose Counseling Center continued his work with the substance abuse community and in 1984 he was named coordinator of the MORE alcohol and drug treatment program. This enabled him to expand and further develop services to lesbian and gay clients with substance abuse issues. Additionally, he became Acting Executive Director of the Montrose Counseling Center after the death of Ken Vance in 1988. He later was instrumental in the planning and opening of ADVANCE Treatment Center, a nonprofit methadone treatment facility in Houston. His work also included various published articles and, most recently, he co-authored a chapter in *Changing Face of AIDS* (1993), as well as co-authoring a National Association of Social Work project on *Substance Abuse and Gay and Lesbian Persons*.

He was a member of the National Honor Society of Psychology Students in 1979. He also received the Award of Merit and Recognition from the Texas Association of Counseling and Drug Abuse in 1988 and the Director's Award from the Montrose Counseling Center in 1986, in addition to many other honors and acknowledgements during his career. Bob is remembered for his dedicated service to both the recovery and the HIV communities. His dedication within these areas and his activism for the lesbian and gay community will be greatly missed.

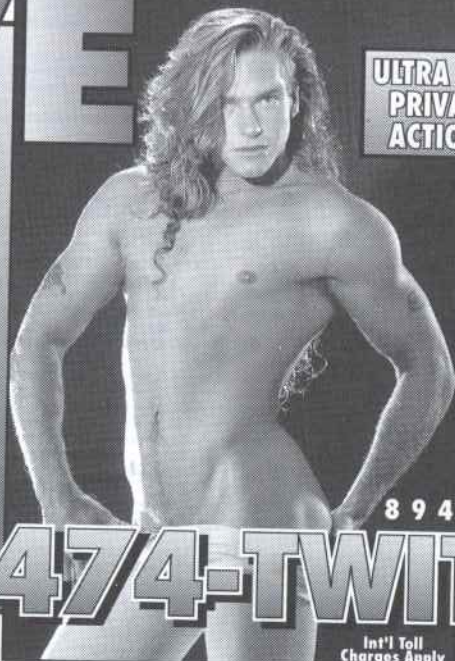
