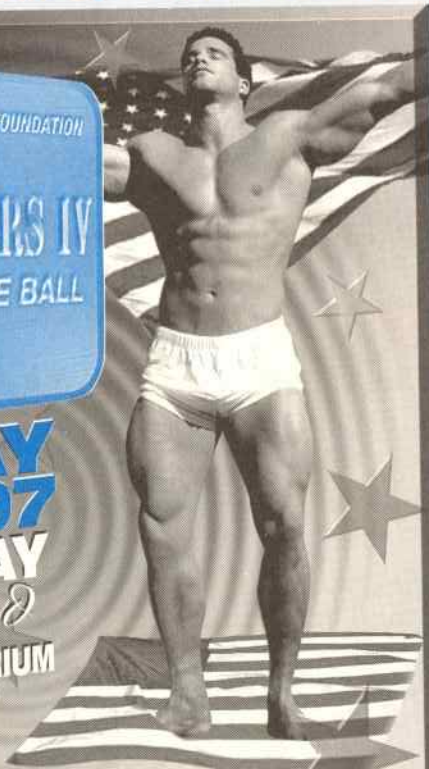

Hungry, poor, ordinary folk, traveling far and wide in search of work and a decent living. Reviled and resented by the more well-to-do. Finding a small bit of peace in community, in sharing and in helping one another, and in making music.

Sound awfully familiar? Yet this isn't the America of the '90s, with its snobberies and deep socioeconomic divisions. Turns out we've trod this road before, many times, in fact. In the America of the 1930s and '40s, the Dust Bowl plague of Oklahoma and the Great Plains uprooted thousands of people, sending them primarily west in search of a new start and a better living.

Woody Guthrie was one of those work-hungry free spirits. He roamed from Oklahoma to California to New York and back again, surviving on various temporary jobs. His best talent was his writing, especially his knack for capturing the spirits and emotions of the people around him and conveying their lives, struggles and hopes through words and music. He became renowned — though definitely not rich, or even comfortable — as a folk singer and balladeer. Guthrie died in 1967, but through his music, his obvious empathy and his championing of fairness for his fellow average man and woman, he became immortal.

The spirit and energy of the balladeer is captured in *Woody Guthrie's American Song*, now being performed in Austin at the Live Oak Theatre at the State. Conceived and adapted by Peter Glazer, the play weaves Guthrie's music into a narrative about the America of his life and times, creating a strong, moving picture of struggle, pain and the basic indomitability of the American spirit. Guthrie's music and his story still strike a sympathetic chord today, and the talented cast of actors/singers/musicians at Live Oak easily won support and

standing ovations from the opening-night Austin audience. The message of spirit, of chin-up togetherness against the oppressions of nature and man, strikes a timeless chord of unity and determination.

Allan Robertson, whose name will be familiar from numerous other successful musical plays in Austin, does double duty on *American Song* as director and musical director. Once again, Robertson has put together a magnificent hit; he lets the story and music sell themselves and capture the audience, keeping things basically flowing so smoothly that by the time the two-hour show is over, it seems you've barely just sat down. Robertson is a consummate musician; with his ear, touch, timing and instinct, he could be working magic with stage musicals anywhere in the country. Austin is lucky to have him.

A superb cast smoothly displays its multiple individual and group talents, while keeping the focus and attention clearly on Guthrie and his music. William Walden, Billy Henry and Steven Fromholz take turns narrating Guthrie's tale at different stages of the balladeer's life, and the three men plus Boni Hester and Gretchen Kingsley do an excellent job of weaving through multiple roles to stitch together the major

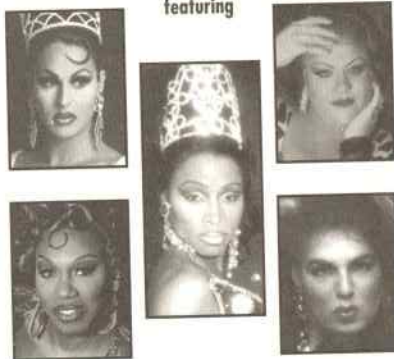

events and fabrics of Guthrie's life — from growing up in an Oklahoma "boomer shack" to hitchhiking and riding the rails west to life in migrant and hobo camps to street-corner adventures in New York City's Bowery and Skid Row.

The five actors also more than capably play a number of musical instruments. They're strongly supported by the show's three-person band — Caryl P. Weiss on banjo and mandolin, Jane Gillman on guitar and harmonica and Brad Shelton on bass — which spends the show off to the side of the stage, but is always at the center of the performance.

The magnificence of *Woody Guthrie's American Song* extends to the technical efforts, including set designer Joe York's slanting, multilevel stage with slides flashing on the back wall that illustrate Guthrie's life; the clear and strong sound designed by Lou Rigler and John Stinson; and the lighting, by Robert Whyburn. Costume designer Buffy Manners' creations perfectly capture the feel and spirit of lower-middle-working-class America of the first half of this century.

The real star of the play, of course, are the images of Guthrie's time that he conveys his words and music. Over a dozen songs are woven into the story, including familiar hits such as "This Land Is Your Land," "So Long, It's Been Good t' Know Ya," "Long Dusty Road" and "Bound for Glory (This Train)." The songs are so honest, so strong, so real; it takes a cold, hard-hearted soul not to be moved by a story-song like "Deportee."

"I write what I see; I write what I have seen; I write what I hope to see further on," Guthrie says through one of his characters near the end. His folk songs, definitely people songs, were aimed at helping folks take pride in themselves and their work. *Woody Guthrie's American Song* effectively passes on that spirit and can-do attitude. We can leave boosted a bit by the hopes conveyed in the music, and a bit more convinced that there really is a "Better World A'Comin'."

Woody Guthrie's American Song plays through April 20 at the Live Oak Theatre at the State, 719 Congress Ave. in Austin. Performances are at 8 p.m. Wednesdays-Saturdays and 6 p.m. Sundays. 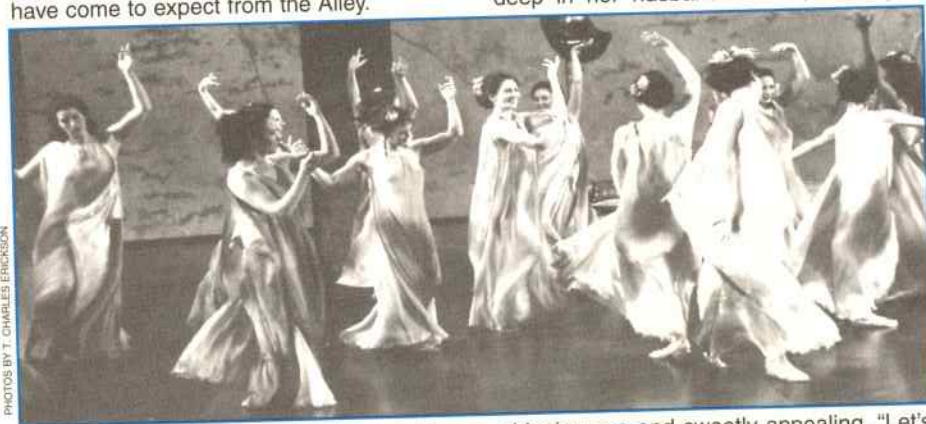

**Sumptuous Production
and a Light, Quirky
Approach to the
Classics Make
THE GREEKS an
Olympian Experience
at Houston's Alley**

The *Greeks*, currently playing at the Alley Theatre in Houston, is a two-part, six-hour adaptation of the works of Aeschylus, Euripides, Sophocles and Homer. There. Now you know. I've said it and I'm glad. But before you grab your popcorn and head screaming for the aisle, there's something else you should know. A funny thing happened on the way to the Acropolis.

Alley Artistic Director Gregory Boyd first got his hands on the material, adapted from an original translation by John Barton and Kenneth Cavander, in 1981, shortly after it had been presented in London by the Royal Shakespeare Company, and it became his ambition to mount his own production. Now, nearly 15 years later, he has done it, and has given Houston yet another in a series of theatre masterpieces that we have come to expect from the Alley.

Okay, that's how it got here. Now, what in the name of Eleonora Duse is it? That's almost impossible to answer without lapsing into a bad imitation of Cecil B. DeMille

in a trailer for *Samson and Delilah*. Words like "stupendous" and "supercolossal" come to mind. What it is, simply, is all the blood and guts and love and hate and passion and sex that made up Greek theatre and, incidentally, continue to make up ours. From Lincoln Center to the multiplex, from TV soaps to grand opera, it's all there, and not nearly so greatly changed as we might like to think. These plays are nearly 3,000 years old, but anybody who has ever seen a single episode of *Melrose Place* will have no trouble understanding what's going on.

"These people invented the play, and they got it right," says Boyd. "Broadway musicals still follow the form." One of Boyd's main concerns was to get away from the idea of Greek tragedy as ponderous and stogy. "Tragedy in the Greek sense is not negative; it's the experience that's intense. It should be approached coolly and rationally, understated. Above all, we should laugh. Humor is an integral part of these pieces."

Well, I'm not so sure about "understated," but he got the humor right. In fact, that's what seems to throw the patrons who show up for an evening of "tragedy." A great deal of it is thigh-slappingly funny, much of it in that furtive, "Oh-we-shouldn't-laugh-at-that" fashion, the way children get the giggles at funerals (remember that famous scene with Mary Richards at Chuckles the Clown's wake?) Let's face it, the sight of a lovely woman (Elizabeth Heflin, as Clytemnestra) standing knee-deep in her husband's blood, holding a

dripping axe and sweetly appealing, "Let's have no more violence," is a scream. This is just one moment of many in both parts of the play. Heflin again, as Clytemnestra's

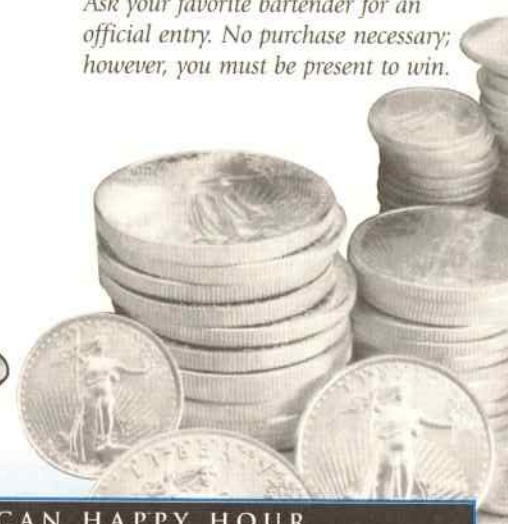

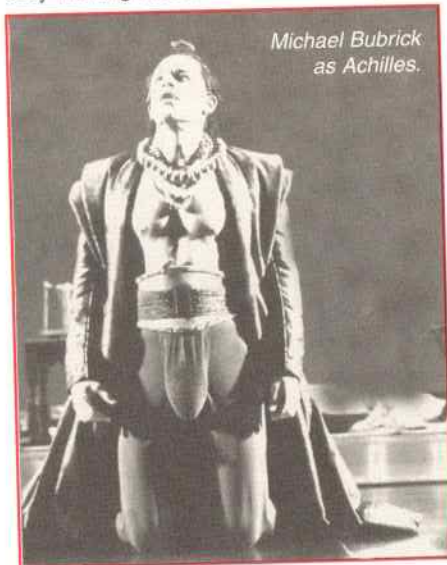

twin sister, Helen of Troy, dressed in '60s loungewear with six-inch Lexan platforms; John Felch, walking and talking like an Egyptian; Bettye Fitzpatrick as the portress to his palace, dressed in something that

What The Greeks is, simply, is all the blood and guts and love and hate and passion and sex that made up Greek theatre and, incidentally, continues to make up ours.

looks as though it were designed for Carol Burnett; James Black's Agamemnon played as a street tough; even Boyd's own portrayal of Apollo as a bullying CEO — all these touches contribute to the presentation of tragedy with a light hand.

If I had to describe *The Greeks* with one word — and by now some of you are probably wishing I would — that word might be

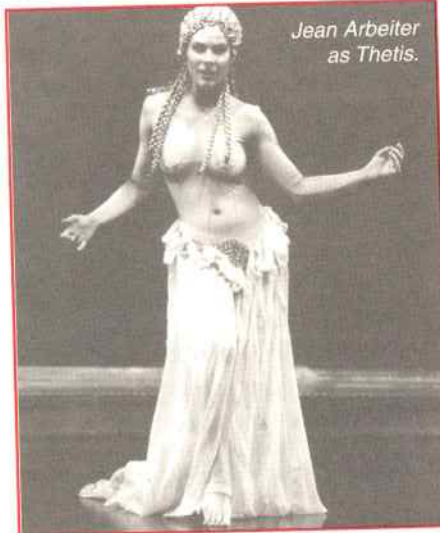

"rich." The sets by Kevin Rigdon are unbelievably sumptuous, the original sound score by John Gromada astounding, the choreography by Sara Rudner exquisite.

The costumes, designed by Susan Tsu, will give you enough drag material for three Mardi Gras. They are indescribable. You might think *Priscilla*.

The Alley company, augmented by what seems a cast of thousands, does *The Greeks* proud. In addition to the aforementioned, Shelley Williams, as Andromache, gives us another in a series of luminous and life-affirming performances (she was also in *Angels in America* and *The Heiress*). If we were to ask everyone who frequents venues where dancing takes place to make a list of their ten favorite records of the past 12 months, one song that's certain to come in near the top of everyone's list would be "Make the World Go 'Round" by **Sandy B.** Having recently been awarded Billboard's Song of the Year honors for 1996, this one has been igniting a mad frenzy on dance floors the world over since its release in late '95. Now, thanks to the mad efforts of Champion's promotional guru, Peter Albertelli, "Make the World Go Round" is beginning an entirely new life sparked by what's looking like it's going to be huge radio support. Although it took just a minute, radio finally came around. We often talk about dance music making it to the next level, and how we just need some good dance artists to crack the shell of that mainstream egg; Miss Sandy B. is cracking away! We caught up with her last week, and she gave us all the dish....

TWT: Tell us about yourself.

Sandy B.: Well, I was born in Harlem, grew up in New Jersey, and all I've ever known is singing. I sang for everything in school; made my first record when I was 16, a song called "Let Me Down Easy," for a private label, Cheri Records. Then, from



there, things started to just take off. I started to do more sessions. I actually thought that I was going to do a lot of background work and my feelings were hurt that people weren't calling me. I said,

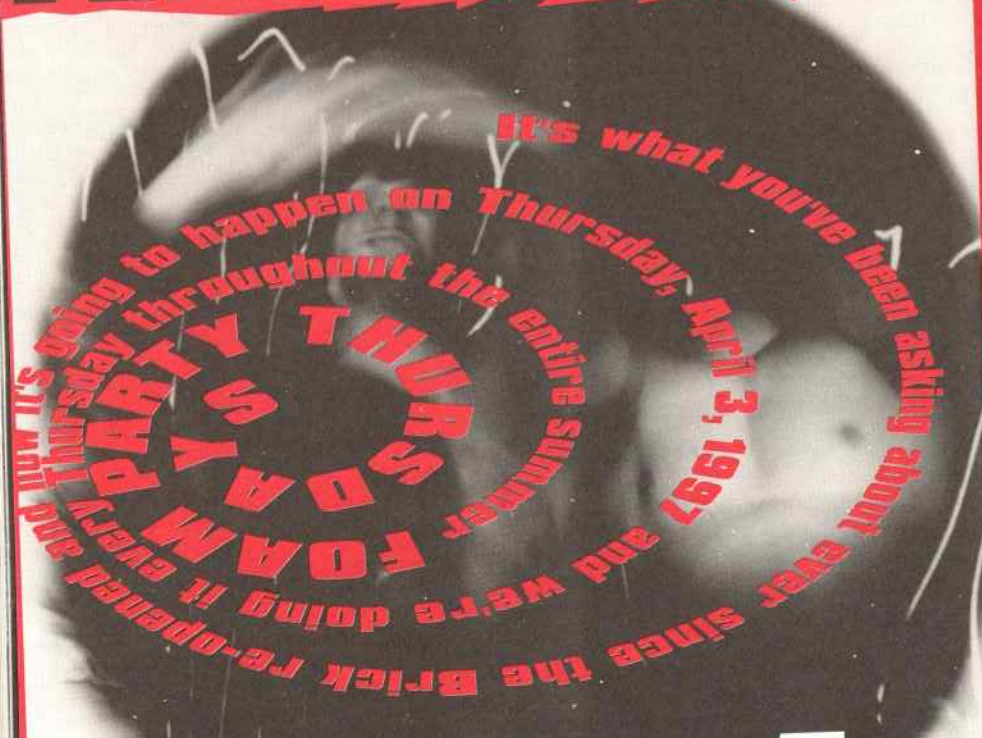


"Well, I think I can sing, so why aren't these people callin' me for these gigs? I wanna do tours, I wanna do this." And people were like, "Excuse me, Miss Thing, you ain't no background singer." And I couldn't understand that. You know, it was like I wanted to work!

And from there?

So I got to go out on a couple of things because I went out with...Remember Frankie Goes to Hollywood? Well, there was an opening act that they had called Blue Soul and I mean it was fun. We were doin' rock 'n' roll, honey! I went out with Evelyn "Champagne" King and Colonel Abrams, did some Russian music in some Russian clubs; got some touring under my belt. But from there I started doing a lot of demos [for producers]. So I managed to survive in the music business, not always doing what I wanted to do, 'cause I wanted to have hit records, I wanted to go out and perform. But we don't get to pick what we do. [laughs] Sometimes you have to do things in the music business that you never dreamed of doing, but you do them because that's what comes along. But I eventually got hooked up with Brinsley Evans to do some demo work, and when he shopped the song they told him that they wanted to sign me. And at first I didn't know whether I wanted to do dance music. I was wanting to do R&B; if not, then I wanted to follow Tina Turner, you know, do her thing. That's where the energy is. But dance turns out to be just as energetic as the rock 'n' roll, so I love it!

How did you feel to have *Billboard's* #1 song of the year and yet have no radio support?

Because it wasn't getting airplay, I couldn't feel the reality of having a hit record. So many people don't think that dance tracks mean anything. And I was like, "How can you not recognize a form of music? It's still creativity, it's still expression, it's alive." You know, it's the same music that disco was, the same people, and now you're telling me that it's unacceptable? So I was feeling like, well, they're not gonna get it. Mainstream is just gonna keep me down. But eventually, with a lot of hard work on Peter Albertelli's part, it started happening. And now we have remixes of "Make the World Go 'Round" by Deep Dish and Malcolm Duffy, and girl, I think they're slammin'!

Didn't you have another #1 back in '93? Yes, that was with the BOP boys out of Newark. It was called "I Feel Like Singin'" and it was on *Nervous*.

Do you do any songwriting yourself?

As a matter of fact, I do. I have a little sister, Halona, who goes by the name Deja, and she has a record that came out on *Strictly Rhythm* in March called "Whenever You Need Somebody" that I wrote for her.

Is there anybody that you would like to work with in the future?

I want to do a duet with Will Downing; I love his voice! And I really want to meet Tina Turner, to be on stage with her. And Janice Roberson [formerly of *Livin' Joy*] and I just may be working on something together real soon. She mentioned that she wanted me to be a guest on her LP, so I think we're gonna have a little project.

And you have a new single due out soon as well?

Right. We just got the mixes from Deep Dish this week as well. It's another track that Brinsley [Evans] wrote entitled "No Need to Hide." I'm very happy with the way it came out.

What goals do you want to achieve?

I want to entertain. I want to share love, spread love, give me, myself. And that can cover all the boundaries. I really enjoy what I'm doing. I couldn't ask for a better career. I think that if people can do what they feel in their heart, and what they enjoy — what makes them happy — we'd all be a lot happier as a people. But because we have to strive in day-to-day rituals and routines, doin' what we hate — the monotony — we can be some messed-up people. [laughs] So I feel like I'm truly privileged.

The NAMES Project AIDS Memorial Quilt was founded in 1987. Today, 9 years later, the Quilt is a powerful visual reminder of the AIDS pandemic. Almost 40,000 individual 3 x 6 foot memorial panels, each panel commemorating the life of someone who has died from the complications related to AIDS, have been sewn together by friends, lovers and family members.

The NAMES Project Foundation coordinates displays of portions of the Quilt worldwide. There are 41 NAMES Project Chapters worldwide and 32 independent Quilt initiatives from around the world. Since 1987, over 7 million people have visited the Quilt in thousands of displays worldwide. Through such displays, the NAMES Project Foundation has raised significant amounts of money, which has been donated to AIDS service organizations throughout North America.

Nominated for a Nobel Peace Prize in 1989, the Quilt has become a critical symbol of the hope for a better future without AIDS and the commitment not to forget those who have died of the disease.

In Houston, the NAMES Project Houston was founded in September 1988 and is a 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization who is responsible for the displays of the Quilt, as well as facilitating the creation of new quilts to all of those whom want to leave an enduring memory of a loved one that has died of AIDS. The NAMES Project of Houston is well deserving of the honor of the Ninth Community Annual Humanitarian Award.

**MARCH TO THE CAPITOL
 IT'S TIME FOR JUSTICE**

THOUSANDS MARCH ON CAPITOL IN PUSH FOR HATE CRIME LAW

Speakers Exhort Festive Crowd From All Across State.

AUSTIN — An estimated 5,000 or more marchers walked through downtown Austin to the state Capitol last Sunday, carrying signs and banners and chanting to make the case that Texas needs strong and enforceable laws and penalties to deter hate crimes.

The following day, up to 300 proponents stayed on to participate in Lobby Day, visiting their senators and representatives and other lawmakers to stress the importance of the proposed Texas Hate Crime Bill, which would increase penalties for hate crimes motivated by prejudice or bias based on race, ethnicity, religion, disability or sexual orientation.



A huge crowd from all over the state converged on the Capitol Sunday to push for stronger hate crimes laws.

"I'm so pleased," said Dianne Hardy-Garcia, Executive Director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, which organized "The March in March," also known as "It's Time for Justice." "Our message was clear on how hate crimes are bad and hurt so many people, and I'm pleased the media made the connections. They covered it not as a gay-only issue, although of course hate crimes do affect us strongly.

"We had such good speakers (afterwards on the Capitol steps)," Garcia continued. "It was a little long again, but a lot of people helped and had some important things to say. I was proud of the spirit of the march. I felt good about the way everybody came together; I feel they were really into it, and showed the cross-section of people

that this issue is important to."

The hour-long march included people with banners and signs from such places as San Antonio, Denton County, Waco, the Brazos Valley, Dallas, Southwest Texas State University and more. Groups participating ranged from Metropolitan Community Church of Austin to Atheists for Justice to the Log Cabin Republicans of Texas and the National Organization of Women/Texas.

Rep. Garnet Coleman, from Dist. 147 in the Houston area, told the crowd, "It's [the U.S.] a country based on freedom. But some people want to tell us what that freedom means. I want it to be freedom from violence....Even if this bill doesn't pass, we're going to hold our heads up high. We know we are good people; we are part of what makes this country great. Because we don't offer hate. We offer love....And I will remind my colleagues that they have an obligation to represent all Texans. This is not an urban issue. It's an issue of all the people."

Gary Bledsoe, President of the Texas NAACP, chimed in, "This fight involving hate crimes involves all good people of good will. When you sit by idly and do not do a thing, you are just as responsible for the hate. We must stand up wherever we are and speak up, or we become part of the problem."

About an hour before the march, two dozen or so protesters held their own parade down Congress Ave., carrying anti-gay signs. They continued their protest at the gates to the Capitol complex as March in March participants concluded their walk, but state law officers made sure that nothing more than words were exchanged by members of the two groups.

Lobby Day participants carried just as crucial a task as Sunday's sheer numbers did in promoting the Hate Crime Bill, currently Senate Bill 80 and House Bill 116. Participants were oriented and prepared in the morning by Hardy-Garcia, then spent the rest of Monday making their case to legislators and their aides.

Dale Carpenter, state President of Log Cabin Republicans of Texas, said Tuesday his group had confirmed the support of three GOP state senators for the hate crimes proposal, apparently enough to pass the legislation if Democratic senators vote for it as well. The three are Jeff Wentworth of San Antonio and Mike Galloway and Jerry Patterson of Houston.

Carol Claverie, from the graduate school

of social work at the University of Houston, said it was her first time to lobby for any cause. "I came because the hate crimes bill is important to me," she explained. "I've had things thrown at me out of trucks, and I've had male friends who've been threatened. It's very important to me that we do as much as we can to stop the hate."

FINAL FIGURES IN FOR DIFFA DALLAS JACKET AUCTION

Over \$200,000 Raised Will Go to Local AIDS Charities.

DALLAS — The final tallies are in for the DIFFA Jacket Auction, held on March 8 at the International Apparel Mart, and the \$215,000 raised makes it the most successful auction in the event's history.

"I'm very pleased with the way things turned out. Everything went very smoothly," said Al James, Executive Director of the Dallas chapter of the Design Industries Foundation Fighting AIDS.

The two jackets which earned the highest bids were both created by local designers. The highest price went to the exaggerated Russian sable fur-trimmed jacket designed by Michael Faircloth of Lilly Dodson. It went for \$5,250. "I'm very proud. I've designed over eight jackets for this over the years, and this is the highest amount



paid," Faircloth said. "I'm always excited and willing to help with anything concerning AIDS."

First-time designer Fred Alan of Salons in the Park/Centrum Building had worked on the jacket he entered off and on for about eight years. Filled with memorabilia from a lifetime, his jacket brought in \$5,200. "It was exciting. I actually beat out huge designers like Versace. It was a huge rush," Alan said.

During the event, which both Alan and Faircloth described as "very theatrical and entertaining," 106 jackets were modeled and bid on. The auction is one of DIFFA-Dallas' biggest fund-raisers, according to Al James.

"We're also very excited because on July 1, we will announce our first grant cycle. At that point, we will push past the one million dollar mark for money we've raised to help the community," James said. "We're really looking forward to next year's auction."

HOUSTON TV STATION DECLINES HRC AD TO RUN DURING ELLEN 'COMING-OUT' EPISODE

ABC Affiliates in Austin, Dallas And San Antonio Say They Will Air Spot on Job Discrimination.

TEXAS — A new television ad designed to raise awareness that job discrimination based on sexual orientation remains legal in 41 states will air during the April 30 "coming-out" episode of the ABC sitcom *Ellen*. But at least one station in Texas has already said it will not be showing the ad.

During that much-anticipated installment, the show's lead character, Ellen Morgan (played by Ellen DeGeneres), is scheduled to come out of the closet and acknowledge that she is lesbian.

The Human Rights Campaign, which commissioned the spot, said in a statement last week that it planned to place the ad in 29 markets across the country. HRC said the American Broadcasting Company, home network of *Ellen*, had turned down the organization's request to make a single nationwide purchase of air time, citing its policy against "controversial issue advertising."

However, David M. Smith, Communications Director of HRC, said ABC and its parent company still deserved some credit for their own employment policies and for airing the *Ellen* episode in the first place.

"ABC and Disney are model corporate citizens when it comes to treating their lesbian and gay employees fairly and equally in their personnel policies," Smith said. "It is unfortunate that ABC declined a national ad buy that would have maximized our limited resources, but both companies deserve enormous credit for this historic episode of *Ellen* in the face of pressure from religious political extremists opposed to any fair and accurate portrayals of lesbian and gay Americans on television."

Texas stations that have indicated they will broadcast the job discrimination ad include KVUE Channel 24 in Austin, WFAA Channel 8 in Dallas and KSAT Channel 12 in San Antonio.

But KTRK Channel 13 in Houston was on a list of seven stations that have so far declined to run the HRC ad (along with outlets in Chicago, Knoxville and Nashville, Tennessee; New York; Philadelphia; and Wilmington, North Carolina).

When contacted by TWT NEWS earlier this week, sales executives at KTRK refused to comment on the matter.

The ad in question, entitled "Shoes," features a woman who has just been fired from her job because of her sexual orientation. A conversation among her co-workers reveals that the firing, while unfair, is not against the law — a fact that, like most Americans questioned in recent public opinion polls, one of the woman's colleagues is surprised to learn. The ad then offers a phone number for the Human Rights Campaign that viewers can call to get more information.

Placement of the spot — which was created by the Semans Co., based in Alexandria, Virginia — was being made possible by a contribution from Jessica Stevens, Chief Executive Officer of Telegen, a high-tech firm in Redwood City, California.

HRC said news conferences to unveil the ad would be held in each of the markets in which it has been placed, as well as in those that have rejected it, a week before its air date.

OSCAR PARTY KICKS OFF AUSTIN GAY FILM FEST'S TENTH YEAR

*aGLIFF Set for Aug. 22–Sept. 4
At Dobie Theater.*

AUSTIN — The Austin Gay & Lesbian Film Festival will be celebrating its tenth birthday when it is held Aug. 22–Sept. 4, primarily at the Dobie Theater. To kick things off in a festive way, aGLIFF held its first-ever Academy Awards-night party, "Martinis & Oscars," last Monday. The evening attracted about 100 enthusiasts, who viewed the proceedings both on small monitors and on a large screen in one of the Dobie's four theatres.

"Scott (Dinger, aGLIFF Artistic Director) has done this Oscar party every year, and it's gotten so big that he decided to give it away to a nonprofit organization this year," noted Sandra Martinez, new President of aGLIFF's board. "Of course, his first thought was to give it to us. This is unusual, for us to do a fund-raiser so early, but it's a fantastic evening and a fantastic party and we're glad to be part of it."

"We're still trying to put our identity together for our tenth anniversary," Martinez continued. "Last year was way up, both in attendance and number of films that expressed interest in us. There were a lot more sellouts than ever before. Since this is our tenth year, we hope to really capitalize on that and make this year very special."

Dinger is doing most of the programming and selection of films. Anyone who wishes to enter, especially in the regional filmmaking competition, should contact him or aGLIFF officials at (512)476-2454.

"This year we're talking about the theme possibly being 'Into Focus,' since last year was 'Between the Frames,' board Vice President and print adviser Ron Bowdoin said. "Not only (gay) films, but the festival itself after a decade is getting more in focus on what its identity is. San Francisco just celebrated its 20th (anniversary) last year; I think at ten we're doing very good. We're probably right up there at about No.

4, behind San Francisco, New York, Los Angeles and maybe Denver or Toronto."

'IN THE LIFE' LOOKS AT RURAL GAYS, CORPORATE POLICIES

*April/May Episode to Air
In Austin, Dallas and Houston.*

U.S. — The participation of gay men and lesbians in places that typically define the American experience is the major theme of the latest episode of *In the Life*, the national gay and lesbian newsmagazine that runs on public TV stations. Hal German and Los Angeles correspondent Bill Britt join host Katherine Linton for the April/May installment.

The lead story examines the heated dispute between the Chrysler Corporation and gay employees, who are demanding that sexual orientation be included as a protected area in new contracts. Interviews with Chrysler employees, company representatives and union officials are used to explore the current debate about the significance of corporate nondiscrimination policies in the workplace.

In the Life also takes a look at another American corporate giant — the Walt Disney Company. From vice-presidents to animators, lesbians and gay men have always played a large role in the success of the Disney empire. Included in this segment is an interview with William Lauch, partner of the late Howard Ashman, producer and lyricist of *The Little Mermaid* and *Beauty and the Beast*.

The show then heads to Wisconsin farm country to visit with gay men and lesbians who grew up in rural areas. Will Fellows, the author of *Farm Boys*, talks about the lack of information concerning rural gay people and how gay identity and rural heritage intersect. *In the Life* also looks at the historical participation of lesbians and gay men in the circus and circus sideshows.

The work and legacy of Andy Warhol as they reflect his attitudes toward gender and sexuality are highlighted by a tour of the Andy Warhol Museum in Pittsburgh, the largest museum in the U.S. devoted to a single artist, and a discussion with gay curator Tom Sokolovsky.

Rounding out this episode of *In the Life* is the regular story feature "A Day in the

Life," which follows Sabrina Sojourner, the first openly lesbian African-American elected official working in the House of Representatives.

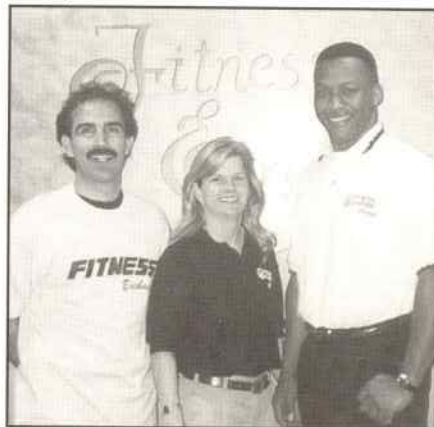
