"BEAT THE HEAT"

Anyone who lives in a part of the world that is always warm, knows there are difficulties to exercising outdoors. The early morning humidity, sweltering noontime heat, and the afternoon thunderstorms represent challenges to us athletes while exercising. If you are considering a physical fitness program or any type of physical activity during peak heat times, be very careful! You will need to be armed with the proper information and take the necessary precautions so you can exercise in a healthy, efficient manner. You can perform physical activity outside during the summer months, or on vacation in a tropical climate, and beat the heat, if you follow a few simple guidelines and make them part of your workout routine, here's how.

Your body's adaptation to the demands of hot weather is called acclimatization. Because your body needs to learn how to cool itself when stressed, experts suggest easing into exercise until you learn how to shed the extra heat efficiently. Your body will go into a state of shock if you immediately try to exercise in very hot weather without first getting use to any extreme temperature (like ours). The body has two main ways of adapting to heat. One way is through dilation. The body will actually dilate the blood vessels near the skin. During exercise, this dilation of vessels allows the blood that is heated at the core of the body to be radiated through the skin into the air. Dilated blood vessels bring more blood to the skin. The other method

of removing heat from the body is by sweat production. This method acts like an automobile air-conditioning. After sweat glands, near the surface of the skin, produce the salty substance, it can be evaporated from the skin. Evaporation has a cooling effect. When sweat from the skin is evaporated, it gives up heat, thus cooling the skin.

If you exercise outdoors the easiest method of adaptation may be to change the time you train to early mornings or very late in the afternoon. These times provide you with the best window of opportunity since the sun is not so hot. Depending on your work schedule, this may not be practical for everyone, so here are some other

tips that should help.

The most important tool needed for any warm weather athlete is proper hydration. Remember the ways your body cools you? Both processes need water to make them work. Stay away from caffeinated beverages such as coffee or sodas (they can actually limit your body's ability to cool itself). Sweat is what keeps the body from overheating. In warm weather you should always drink at least 2 glasses of water right before and then right after exercise. If the activity requires you to perform more than 30 minutes, then you will need to drink during, also. If you are going to be running in the heat then your body may even need more fluids. The American College of Sports Medicine has recommended these tips: You should drink enough fluids to make your urine run clear, like lemonade in color, not amber like apple juice. Drink about a pint of fluid two hours before an event. Drink enough fluids during exercise to replace what you have lost. Drink before getting thirsty. Like I've said before, if you're thirsty, you are dehydrated. Remember that a loss of as little as 1.8 percent of body weight is equal to a pint of water. This loss can impair your performance in a big way.

Eat properly the night before an event. Carbo-loading is a good idea if you are running a marathon, otherwise, eat a normally balanced meal. Before an activity, it is recommended that you should eat small portions of easily digestible, high carbohydrate foods. Stay away from high fat foods before you exercise. They take longer to digest and may cause cramping while you workout. The same thing can happen if your caloric intake is too high, even with carbohydrates. Remember small food portions before an activity. Foods high in carbohydrates, that are easily digestible are as follows: Banana or apple slices, fruit and non-fat yogurt, raisins and dates,

bagel or toast with a slight smear of cream cheese, cereal with low-fat milk or an energy bar. Now remember, these are not meal replacements. You still must eat proper meals regardless of your physical activity. These food ideas are for a pre-physical event.

Another good idea to implement to beat the heat is to wear lightweight, loose-fitting clothing. This will allow the sweat to evaporate freely from the skin. Wear a hat or doo-rag to protect your face and head from the scorching sun and don't forget the sunscreen. Also, you may want to avoid asphalt or paved surfaces because they tend to radiate heat. Stay out of high volume traffic areas. Carbon monoxide produced from the exhaust of automobiles can be more dangerous if inhaled, in hot weather. If all else fails, then take the physical activities indoors into an air-conditioned environment. Maybe find a pool and do some laps. Take the time to prepare yourself for the difficulties of working out in the heat. Be aware of your body's needs. Eat right and drink right. If you are thirsty after a workout, then it is

already too late. Your body has told you that you are not hydrated properly. If you become nauseous and dizzy, or feel as though you are going to pass out, you could develop heat stroke or heat exhaustion. Get into a cool area immediately and replenish the fluids you have lost. If you follow these guidelines, then you are ready to get out there and exercise no matter what the weather looks like. You can "Beat the heat" and keep it going no matter when and where you exercise!

WEST HOLLYWOOD, CALIFORNIA-The front gates of Paramount Studio was the latest site for a "Stop Dr. Laura" protest conducted by approximately 300 gay rights activists in Hollywood on March 21. The protest was against the distribution, as well as the production, of the Dr. Laura Schlessinger television show scheduled to air this fall. The protesters claim that while Schlessinger, a popular radio talk show hostess, has the right to say that gays are "biological errors," she doesn't have a "right" to a syndicated talk show.

On hand at the protest against Paramount's planned scheduling of her television show, were noted celebrities Robin Tyler, West Coast co-founder of the "Stop Dr. Laura" web site; Joan Gary, executive director of the Gay & Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation (GLAAD); Reverend Troy Perry, founder of the Universal Fellowship of Metropolitan Community Churches; and David Lee, a writer, producer and the co-creator of numerous Paramount successes, including the award-winning "Cheers," "Wings" and "Frasier."

The Neilson Rating System has urged postponing the start of the fall season due to the airing of the Summer Olympic Games and the fall schedule will have an estimated beginning air date of October 10. The delay should provide enough time for numerous protests.

**PROM SEASON =
ACTION FOR EQUALITY
ACLU Asks "Who Are You
Taking To The Prom?"**

NEW YORK-The American Civil Liberties Union released Who Are You Taking to the Prom?, a resource guide to help young people combat dis-

crimination in all school related activities. Whether or not high school students should be allowed to bring same-sex dates to school-sponsored proms has heated up recently after decades of debate. This resource guide is new this year and is available nationwide just in time for prom season.

Schools justify their restriction of student's choices in dates for various reasons, including fear of liability, student safety and protests from teachers and parents. Discrimination on these grounds is unconstitutional. The safety of all students must be insured at Proms. Who Are You Taking to the Prom This Year? includes text from U.S. District Judge Raymond J. Pettine, who ruled in the 1980 landmark case Aaron Fricke v. Cumberland High School Principal Richard B. Lynch, concerning a prom date of the same sex. The court ruled that Fricke's First Amendment rights were violated. The school refused to allow him to take another male to the prom. The Court found that the school was required to ensure Fricke's safety at the prom, too. The American Civil Liberties Union's Gay and Lesbian Right Project is seeking to intervene on behalf of students who are being discriminated against at their school, when they are not permitted to have a date of the same sex. Some schools are holding elections to allow the students themselves to decide whether or not to allow same-sex dates at their proms. Following an appeal by the ACLU, a Roanoke, Virginia, school will be allowing a 17-year-old female student to take her girlfriend to her Junior Prom later this month.

**FIRST NATIONAL HIV+
PARTY ON MAY 5TH
1,000+ Expected at
"Positively 2000"**

DALLAS, TX - With advance ticket sales moving faster than anticipated, organizers of the first national dance party for people with HIV are encouraging travelers to make plans early. Positively 2000 - Enter the Garden of Good & Evil, hosted by the AIDS Resource Center of Dallas, expects more than 1,000 HIV-positive men, women, their partners and friends to take over the historic seven-acre Dallas Horticultural Center in Fair Park. Already sales for the event have been brisk, according to producer Keith Willard.

While guest may still purchase tickets by phone and at various businesses across Texas, Willard said his greatest concern is getting word to those who live outside the state. "Right now, we're trying to focus on people who'll be traveling here," said

Willard, noting that confirmations include guests from as far away as Germany. "But if people don't make their travel plans soon, they'll be stuck with higher prices, something we wouldn't want to deter them from coming to this one-of-a-kind event."

Hype about the event has locals grabbing tickets as soon as their put out along the strip, and many people have already marked their calendars to be at the Friday, May 5 party, Willard said. Plus, new corporations are looking to cast support weekly. Already aboard are more than a dozen pharmaceutical, liquor and entertainment companies. "An impressive corporate sponsorship list has formed with a lot of mainstream companies, which shows the growing trend to be much more open to HIV," said Willard, mentioning companies, like Atlantic Records, Ocean Spray and Seagram. "We have really hit a nerve with this event."

Willard believes such an event is past due as HIV - which fewer than ten years ago meant an almost-certain death sentence - is more manageable with the medicinal advancements. "This is the time for people to start celebrating life," Willard said. "It is no longer a matter of living day to day, but of living year to year, and even decade to decade."

For the first time, there is going to be a large-scale dance event that approaches HIV and AIDS from a different angle, Positively 2000 spokesman Chris Leeds said. "Many people have attended huge parties where money is raised in the name of this disease, but this event is much different," he said. "This isn't about raising money for HIV and AIDS. This about raising hope for those newly diagnosed and building new friendships among those who've been positive for years."

According to Willard, Positively 2000 is an innovative way for attendees to approach a typically sensitive issue - revealing one's HIV status. By hosting the event, organizers believe it might create an opportunity for people to bring up their status. On the other hand, many people will use the event to privately celebrate their health struggles while keeping silent their positive status. "There are so many people who go to the bars that are HIV positive but don't want to have to come out to go to this," said Willard, pointing out, however, that presence at the event isn't a statement of one's status. "That's the neat thing about this event."

Leeds and Willard hope that people recognize this as a public call for acceptance of those who are HIV positive. While coordinators are not referring to the event as a circuit party, renowned DJ Buc of Atlanta, originally from Dallas, will helm the turntables for the six-hour dance. Lighting guru Jim

Jenkins, whose history includes stints with Club ONE, Seven and Jungle Gym, and noted event designer Roger Spruill will be working with Tom Mahan and JChris Leeds to create a spectacular night. Other famous AIDS activists, artist and celebrities have been inquiring about attending and performing. Plus, organizers welcome those interested in volunteering or who can assist in other ways.

Positively 2000 begins at 8 p.m. as a social event with cocktails in the elaborately decorated foyer, and at 9 p.m. dance troupe Dark Reflections will kick off the dance event. Guests will be treated to a midnight show by one of Dallas' well-known choreographers, ChaChi. Related events will take place, giving tourist a weekend of activities. Early arrivals will be greeted to a pre-event welcome party on Thursday, May 4, at the Dallas Eagle. The night following the main event, Saturday, May 6, partygoers can use their ticket stubs from Positively 2000 for half-price cover at the Village Station, voted one of Dallas' best dance clubs.

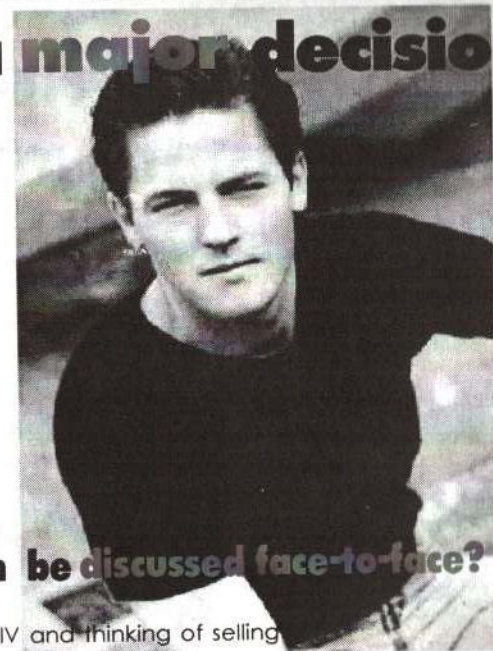

25 YEARS AGO IN THE LONE STAR STATE

Twenty-five years ago This Week In Texas featured on its cover a young and vivacious "Mr. Candy Delight." She appeared regularly at the Hi-Kamp in Houston and traveled extensively across the state every week. When we met her, we couldn't believe that she was a male! Widely known and universally loved, Kandi (she had dropped the Mr. and started spelling her name with a "K") was, as far as we know, Texas' first transsexual entertainer. Her measurement on top was 44" and she was very proud to show them in public. You'll also see a photo of Kandi (circa 1995) taken shortly before her untimely death. She was truly a trail-blazer. We need to clarify an unintentional error we reported in this column last week by stating that "Lana" was the first Miss Gay Texas. We were incorrect. The first MGT titleholder was Jodi Lane who won in 1974 and crowned Lana the following year.

In Fort Worth, \$10 would pay for your registration for the Texas Gay Conference II. While \$1 would not only allow you to enter El Paso's Apart-

ment Lounge, it would also get you into the disco and allow you to watch their variety show. In Galveston, the Mr. Kon Tiki contest was scheduled, promising the winner \$75 and a trophy. Terry Thomas was made "Texas Imperial Mother" of all FROGS, appropriately cho-

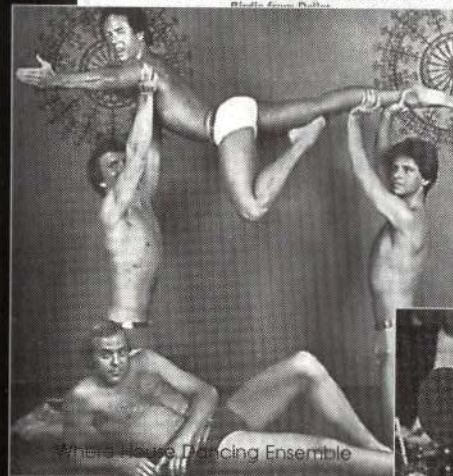

sen at Frogs in Galveston. Meanwhile, The Other End in Waco, was about to crown "Miss Firecracker Queen."

Members could enjoy a free buffet during registration for the Wrangler's Stampede III to be held at Sundance Kid's in Dallas. Chuck's on North Haskell, had party night every Thursday. Both "Girls and Guys were

welcome" at Dallas' Highland Lounge on Monticello. That same philosophy "boys and girls" was shared by the management of The Olive Branch. Nearby, at The Coronet Theatre on North Fitzhugh, they offered, in addition to the movies being shown, free concessions. Membership was \$1 per year. Big D's Bayou Landing had a free buffet, beer bust and show every Sunday, half price drinks on Wednesday, 25¢ beer and much more, according to manager Harold Peck. Another hot spot of its day was the Ramrod (across the street from today's Crews Inn) had a strictly enforced leather/levi/military dress code.

Customers of Marc I Salon on Westheimer in Houston could save \$1 off each "blow job." All they had to do was mention TWT. Studz News had "almost cornered the market" on Locker Room, a "room odorizer" quite popular on dance floors across the state. The French Quarter asked customers did they "dig the porno scene?" stating "you'll love the difference in our lounge area, now air conditioned and darker than ever." Ric and Jerry welcomed us all to the Briar Patch, "known for the class we keep." Carmelita of The Farmhouse captured TWT's Entertainer of the Year Award, Ernestine got Best Comedy Performance, while Donna Day of Bayou Landing was named Best Serious Perform-

ance. Houston was gearing up for The Locker's famous Slave Auction. Even though the event was over a month away, the owners were "sure the wait will be worth it." The late yet legendary Texas club owner Gene Howle proclaimed his Farmhouse as "Houston's number one super bar."



The Gay Century

1996

Fearing that Hawaii might legalize same-sex marriages, states across the nation rushed to pass Defense of Marriage" acts. Marriage was defined as a bond between a man and woman.

January 4

"We cut up this fag real bad," the two murderers, members of a neo-Nazi group, bragged when arrested for the murder of Fred Mangione and for injuring his spouse of 17 years. Mangione had been stabbed at least 35 times in a van outside a Katy (near Houston) bar. In September, 19-year old Daniel Christopher Bean was sentenced to life in prison.

January

CBS Sports dropped Commentator Ben Wright for saying that lesbians hurt women's golf and that women golfers "are handicapped by having boobs." Wright later apologized for his offensive remarks.

February 14

The Turtle Creek Chorale presented Harvey Fierstein & Friends in a "fabulous evening of music and hilarity" at the Meyerson Symphony Hall.

April 3

Keith Meinhold, the sailor who came out on national TV in 1992, announced his retirement. After his public declaration, despite 12 years of exemplary service, he was discharged from the Navy under the old military regulations. But the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals ordered the Navy to reinstate him which led to the current "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" policy. Reinstated, the sailor served an additional three more years honorably.

But can the nation afford to sacrifice some of its best service men and women

to bigotry? Earlier in the year the Pentagon reveal that Clinton's "Don't ask, don't tell" policy wasn't working as discharges of gay troops rose by 17%.

May 20

The U.S. Supreme Court struck down Colorado's Amendment 2 that was enacted to prevent gays and lesbians from obtaining "special rights." By "special rights," gay opponents meant the same civil rights that were readily available to heterosexual citizens. Legal observers saw the ruling as a profound shift in the court's thinking that could change the landscape for many laws.

In a dissenting opinion Justice Antonin Scalia wrote, "Amendment 2 is...a modest attempt by seemingly tolerant Coloradans to preserve traditional sexual mores against the efforts of a politically powerful minority to revise those mores through the use of laws."

June 1

Gay and lesbian Texans gathered on Austin's Town Lake north shore to celebrate the city's "first Texas Pride Festival." (For the record, Austin had a Gay Pride Parade in the summer of 1975.) This central deep-in-the-heart-of-you-know-what location served as a convenient outlet for rural Texans who don't have pride events in their own hometowns. One observer noted that it resembled a friendly old-time country fair. There were all the usual booths, kissing, tee shirts, buttons, voter registration etc. Unique was a splendid archival display of the Gay History in Texas and the opportunity to meet upfront Representative Glen Maxey.

That evening about 500 marchers snaked their way through central Austin in a "Jammin' for Justice" march. Leading the

parade were drag queens who stepped to the beat of a different drummer, the cadence set by several Lesbian Avengers beating the hell out of drums.

July 08

MCC unveiled Philip Johnson's design for the new Cathedral of Hope which promises to be the "most exciting sanctuary in Christendom."

July 12

At the XI International Aids Conference, research scientists announced a possible breakthrough in the search for an AIDS cure. "In all, nine AIDS drugs are on the U.S. Market, five them introduced this year." But researchers cautioned against unrealistic expectations and noted that a recent study showed that young gay men were not protecting themselves.

August 20

U.S. Representative Jim Kolbe, faced with the threat of being outed by The Advocate, publicly announced his homosexuality. The Advocate's editors were angered by the Republican's vote favoring the anti-gay Defense of Marriage Act. Kolbe said that his sexual orientation would not be a determining factor in how he votes. "I'm certainly not a poster boy for gay issues," he said.

Conservative Republicans had introduced the Defense of Marriage act in congress earlier in the year to circumvent an expected ruling from the Hawaii State Supreme Court recognizing same-sex marriages.

September

To no one's complete surprise, the National Log Cabin Republicans voted by nearly 3-1 to endorse presidential candidate Bob Dole. Some Log Cabin officials touted the endorsement as a sign of progress and an opportunity to educate people within the Republican Party.

But Dale Carpenter of Houston, president of LCR of Texas disagreed. As did David Smith of the Human Rights Campaign who applauded the work of LCR members. "They have done a tremendous job of educating people within the Republican Party. But we believe they made a huge mistake in endorsing Dole."

A Florida court placed a child in the cus-

tody of a man who murdered his wife rather than the lesbian mother. An appeals court ruled that the child was being harmed by "the conduct she was exposed to in her mother's home."

Three years after Brenda and Wanda Henson moved to Overt, Mississippi, things had gotten better. The women of Camp Sister Spirit became part of the community that once tried to force them out. Said one, "We now have more than 70 local people, that's local people, who are part of our food program. And we've worked on several projects with some of the local churches and social service organizations. Little by little, we've chopped away at the hatred."

October

In a 15-state, \$1 million radio campaign, the Republican presidential contender assailed the country's "moral crisis" and pointed to rising drug use, crime, poor economics, gays in the military, "ninth month" abortions and "condoms for kids."

But President Clinton angered gays for his support of the "Defense of Marriage" bill, a bill that he had previously denounced as a Republican-sponsored wedge issue that serve no purpose but gay baiting.

November 13

Although the episode was never broadcast, Johnathan Schmitz was convicted of the March 1995 shotgun slaying of Scott Amedure, a gay man who had professed his attraction to Schmitz during a taping of the Jenny Jones show.

Schmitz attorneys, using a history of mental disturbance, were able to convince the jury to hand down a second degree murder conviction.

November

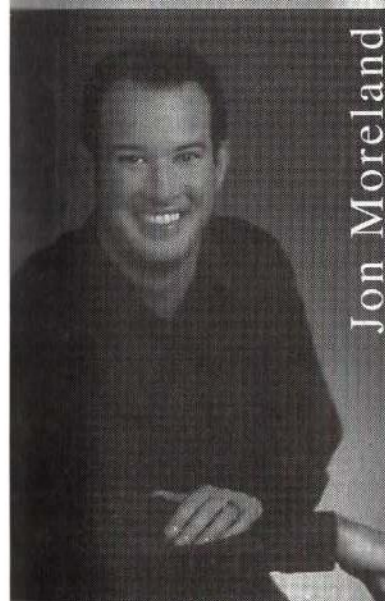
In Hawaii, voters removed from office several legislators who favored same sex-marriages. In doing so, they were able to put the issue on the 1998 election ballot knowing that several polls indicated that about 70% of Hawaii residents oppose same-sex marriages.

Here's a fascinating story: Back in the early to mid-1930's several Ivy League colleges, including some of the big ones, began putting their entering freshman students through a bizarre ritual. They were required to report, both male and female, to a facility set up on the campus, usually the gym. There they were ushered into a makeshift photographic studio, told to strip, and photographed in a triptych of poses - front, back and profile - for what were called "posture studies". Although some of the students were understandably reluctant, no exceptions were made. These "studies" were later used to bolster a bogus psychological theory proposed by a psychologist named William Sheldon. Sheldon theorized that three basic body types - which he labeled "ectomorph", "endomorph" and "mesomorph" - could be linked to specific personality profiles. This practice continued into the 1950's, when students finally rebelled and the study ceased.

Playwright Richard Willett has made this strange occurrence the basis for a play, *TRIP-TYCH*, now playing at Houston's THE LITTLE ROOM DOWNSTAIRS. Willett follows two of the students, a man and a woman, their children and grandchildren, from the '30's to the present, examining the consequences of their ordeal. In Willett's version, a set of the original photographs were stolen from the photo lab as a prank and distributed on campus. When "Helen" (Monica Rial), already traumatized by the experience, discovers this, she breaks down, and never really recovers. Although she eventually marries another of the study's subjects, "Chester" (played as a young man by Daniel Womack and four decades later by Vaughn C. Johnson), she commits suicide shortly after giving birth to a daughter, "Heather" (played as an adult by Catherine Douglas). As you can see, this play is complicated in subject matter and complex in execution, darting back and forth between generations and decades. It'll keep you on your toes.

The play opens with "Carey" (Christopher Patton), Chester and Helen's grandson, going hot

and heavy in bed with lover "Bernard" (Jonathan McVay). Although the sex couldn't be better, Chester has decided he's "bi". Bernard is understandably perplexed, and they go their separate ways. Carey has his fling with buxom, blonde "Rosemary" (Heather Bryson), and while everything seems to work O.K., something is missing, and I think we all know what that is. Meanwhile, Bernard meets "Dennis" (Steven Knott), a decidedly bent swinger, who talks Bernard into a suburban "marriage" and a series of fifties cocktail dresses a la June Cleaver meets Elizabeth Taylor, with just a touch of Mary Tyler Moore.

In another story line - and I'm not being strictly chronological here - Helen's daughter, Heather, married to loser "Amie" (Paul Sidello) is coping with the death of her older son. Nine-year-old "Young Carey" (Peter Gehring) tries to keep her together, but ultimately fails, and Heather leaves home. Chester, now a grandfather, is afflicted with what seems to be a variant of Tourette's Syndrome, the involuntary shouting out of obscenities, although all his rantings deal with the subject of nudity.

As these plot lines weave in and out of time and

place, the common thread remains the same - the "posture studies". Carey discovers their existence while doing research, and ultimately makes the connections, but it is for his mother Heather to supply us with the last piece of the puzzle. Playwright Willett's writing is literate and ironic, with some brilliant comic touches. He has been the recipient of both an Edward Albee Foundation Fellowship and a Tennessee Williams Scholarship, and the influence of both writers is obvious.

The cast, under the always-able direction of Richard Laub, does a fine job with a difficult play. Christopher Patton is steady and reliable as the confused but persevering Carey, and his is the engine that carries us through. McVay will have your motor racing as sexpot Bernard, but his turn as Dennis' "Little Woman", in a wardrobe largely borrowed from Joel Sandel - don't ask - is a scream. Steven Knott as the twisted "Dennis" is perfectly smarmy. Monica Rial is heartbreakingly touching as the traumatized Helen, the original subject of the posture studies. I once described Ms. Rial in another production as being "too young for the role". Here she's perfect, and her performance was, for me, especially effective. Catherine Douglas' "Heather" is played with pathos, but she also gives us some of the play's funniest lines - yes, there's a great deal of humor in the writing. My personal favorite comes in a bedroom scene with husband Amie, who has just "performed" and rolled over. Heather sits up in bed, a middle-aged wife in the middle of the century, and takes a look at her life. "Amie", she says, "Now they're telling us that what we just did is an art. And Amie, I just want you to know - you haven't been honing your craft." The rest of the cast is strong and credible - Heather Bryson as "Rosemary" the girl Carey tries to go straight with, is both energetic and resigned, Paul Sidello as "Amie" is nicely defeated as a husband and a father. Ninth-grader Peter Gehring, as "Young Carey" is direct and sympathetic, without a trace of cute - that's my supreme compliment for any actor under the age of 16 - Daniel Womack as "Young Chester" and Marie Hennebery as Helen's sister "Debbie" support ably, and Vaughn C. Johnson handles Chester's verbal tendencies well.

Taken all in all, *TRIPTYCH* is a multilayered effort, and it requires an effort to keep up, but the payoff is well worth it, so go see it and stretch your mental muscles.
