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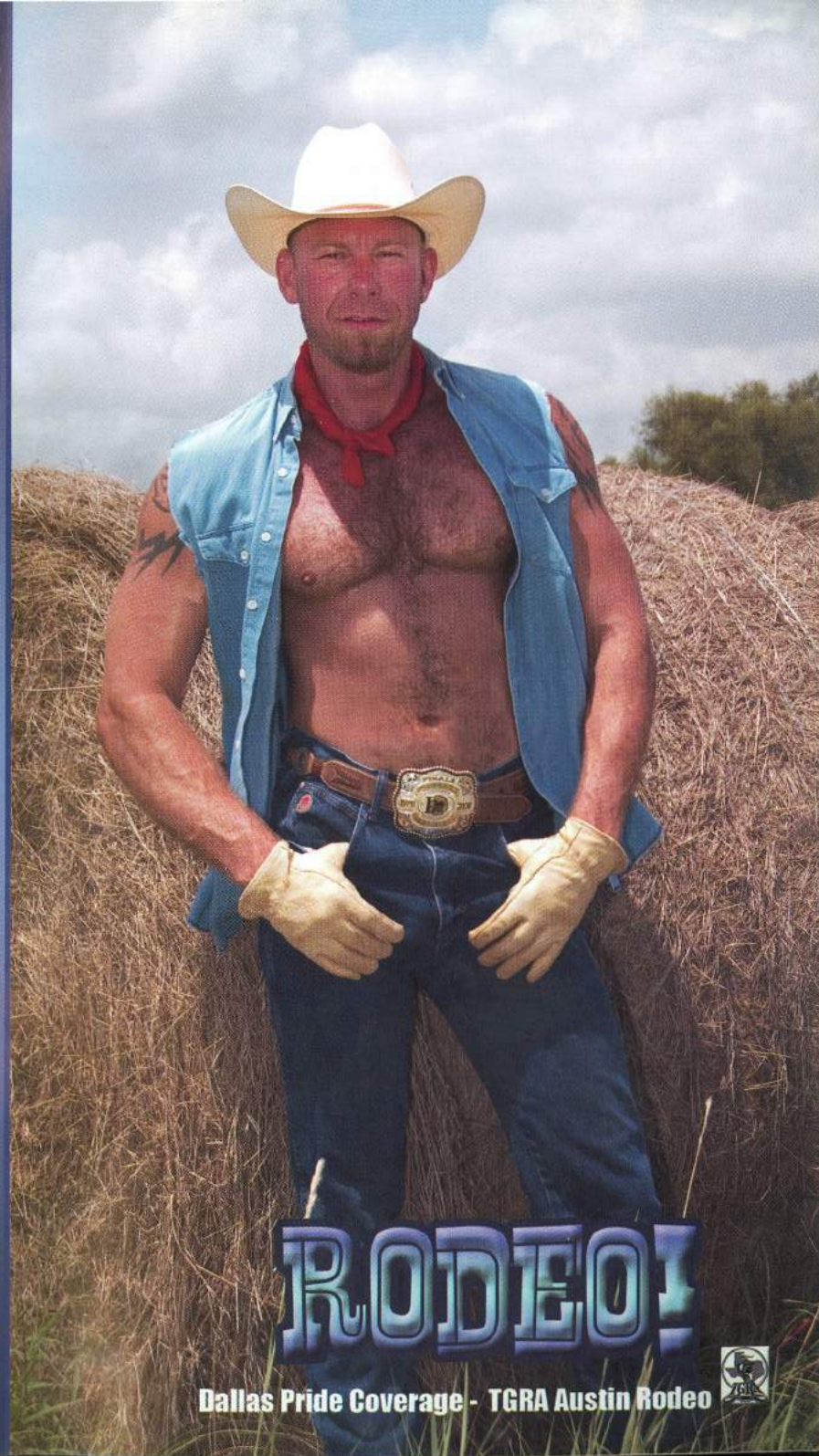

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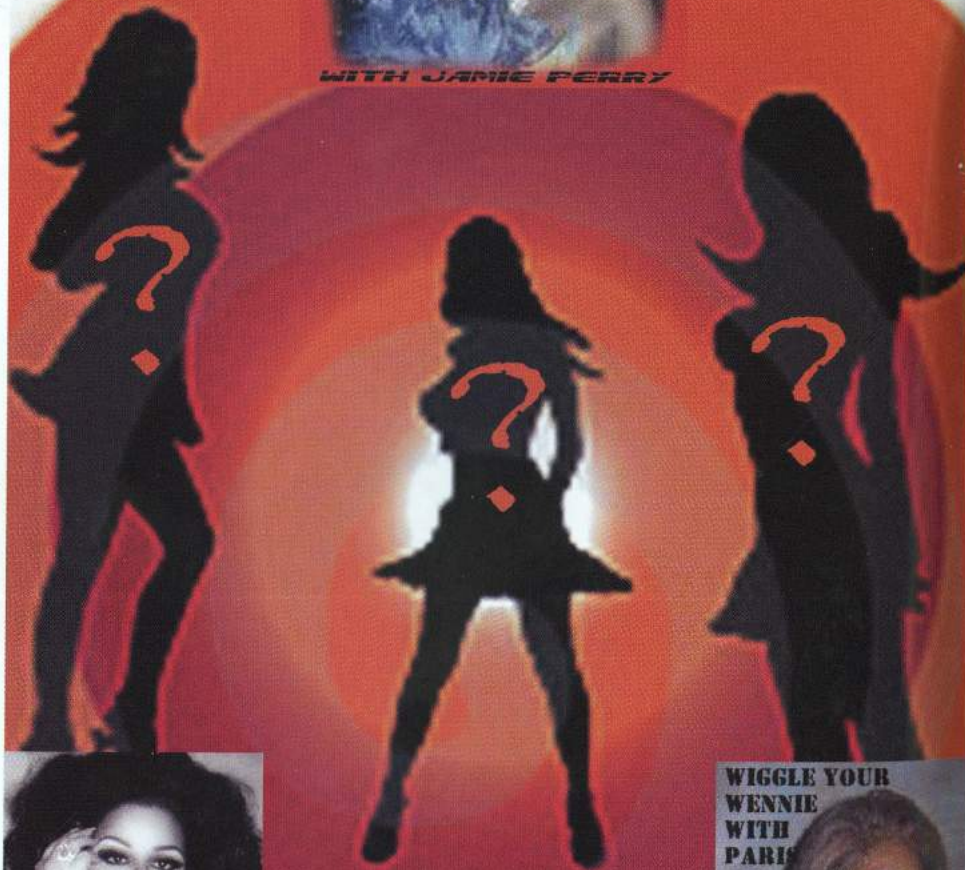

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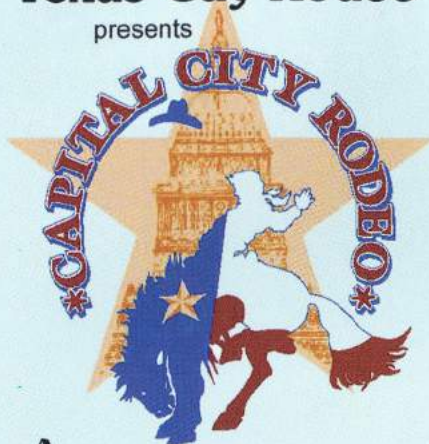

glorious ALBUMS

Singer/songwriter Vanessa Carlton's much anticipated third studio album, *Heroes and Thieves*, will be released on October 9th through Irving "Gotti" Lorenzo's The Inc. Records, a division of Universal Motown Records. The singer's entry into The Inc. fold demonstrates how Gotti and The Inc. continue to breakdown musical barriers. The album, written by Carlton in her New York City Nolita neighborhood and recorded in San Francisco and Los Angeles, was produced by Third Eye Blind front man, Stephan Jenkins, singer/songwriter Linda Perry and Carlton, and was executive produced by Gotti.

"Nolita Fairytale", the first single off *Heroes and Thieves*, sets the tone for the album with a unique evolved sound displaying Carlton's trademark soaring vocals and intricate piano melodies.

"I have been blessed with an incredible singer/songwriter who amazes me every time she sits down at her piano and plays and sings. Our belief in each other is something that I will cherish! And I will fight to the end for my V." Ganesh! States Mr. Lorenzo, CEO of The Inc.

"The magical combination of Vanessa and Irv is forcing people to put their preconceived notions aside and think outside the box," "Vanessa's new album is a breakthrough achievement on all sides; For Universal Motown, for The Inc. and their great team, and for music fans around the world hungering for the kind of light and passion that only Vanessa Carlton can bring." Vanessa Carlton burst on to the music scene in 2002 with her album *Be Not Nobody*, unleashing the piano-tinged smash single "A Thousand Miles," which reached the Top 5 of the Billboard Hot 100 Singles chart, garnering prestigious Grammy nominations for both Song Of The Year and Record Of The Year, followed by the hit "Ordinary Day." Carlton followed up her platinum-plus debut album with 2004's acclaimed *Harmonium*.

GRAMMY® Award-winning singer/songwriter LeAnn Rimes will release her deeply personal new album, *FAMILY*, on October 9th on Curb Records. Executive produced with Dan Huff (Faith Hill, Keith Urban,



Rascal Flatts), LeAnn for the first time wrote or co-wrote every song on the album, which she says "is my most personal yet."

The album is led by the rousing, infectious first single "Nothin' Better to Do," which is currently climbing up Billboard's Hot Country Songs chart. LeAnn says of the song, which she co-wrote with her husband Dean Sheremet and Darrell Brown, "I was born in Mississippi and grew up for the first few years of my life in a tiny town called Pelahatchie. We wrote this song as if from my alter ego, a girl who never got out of that small town. Now, all that's left to do is cause a little trouble and have some fun!"

The accompanying video, co-directed by Rimes and David McClister, portrays the story of a young woman done wrong. The video is set in a women's prison in the south in the 1930s and was filmed at the Old Tennessee State Penitentiary, a real prison in Nashville which also provided the backdrop for Tom Hanks' "The Green Mile" and the Robert Redford, James Gandolfini starrer "The Last Castle." The beautifully artistic video, which has been a staple on CMT since its debut in late May, features scenes filmed on a vintage hand-cranked movie camera that creates an added period feel and a Chicago-esque dance sequence with LeAnn, choreographed by her husband Dean.



Of the new album, LeAnn believes, "It's a true reflection of my inner, most honest thoughts. I've really opened my heart and soul on this album and it captures the woman I've become. I literally grew up in the spotlight over the last 12 years and in that time, all of my fans and gracious supporters have become like my family. This album is a thank you to everyone, as none of this would be possible without them."

Whether it's the folksy, southern rock duet "Nothin' Wrong," with the incomparable, soulful Louisiana native Marc Broussard, the achingly vulnerable ballad "What I Cannot Change," the touching tribute to mothers everywhere "Pretty Things," the bluesy Janis Joplin-like torcher "One Day Too Long," the quintessential anthem for women "Good Friend and a Glass of Wine," the highly relatable power ballad ode to relationship strength "Fight," or the startlingly confessional lyrics of the title track "Family," LeAnn says, "these are not songs that just touch on the surface of topics, but are real life lessons that people everywhere will be able to relate to."

Grammy® nominee KT TUNSTALL became one of the most acclaimed singer-songwriters in the world



in one giant step, with the amazing two-year global journey of her multi-million selling debut album, *Eye To the Telescope*. In September 18, 2007, Virgin Records will release Tunstall's second album, "DRASTIC FANTASTIC".

For "DRASTIC FANTASTIC" KT again tapped Telescope producer Steve Osbourne (U2, New Order, Happy Mondays). The album was mixed by Michael H. Brauer (Coldplay, The Rolling Stones, My Morning Jacket). Tunstall recently told a British interviewer that her acquisition of two "very sexy" guitars had inspired her to crank them for the new album, providing a clue to the sound of her new work.

The album's September release will follow a busy summer of high-profile live appearances for KT, including the worldwide seven-concert Live Earth event July 7th, where Tunstall will perform alongside The Police, Smashing Pumpkins, Kanye West, Dave Matthews Band and many others at the Giants Stadium, New Jersey stage. KT is also scheduled for a July 13th spot on the popular summer live music series performed outdoors in New York's Rockefeller Center, and telecast on NBC's Today morning show. Nearly a year and half after Telescope's U.S. release, the album's third single "Other Side of the World" continues to climb the Hot AC radio airplay chart and both "Black Horse and the Cherry Tree" and "Suddenly I See" are still among the top 15 most-played songs on AC radio.

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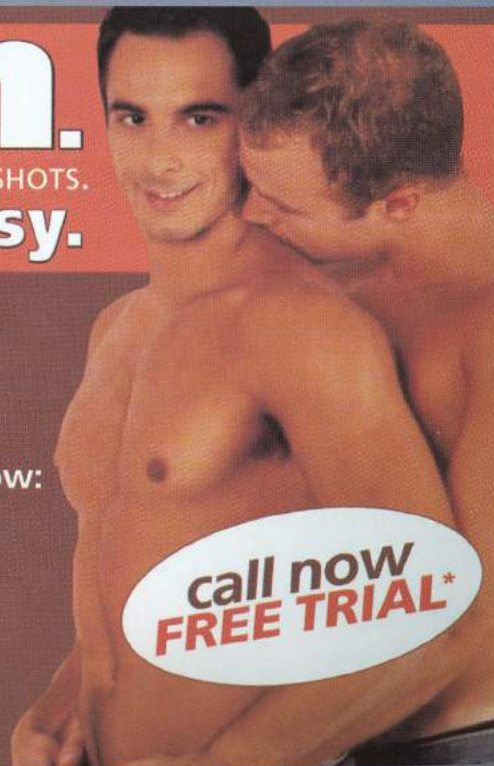

Arts On Real Theater and Naughty Austin Productions, one of Austin's most popular theater-producing teams, continues its eleventh year of successful Austin shows with a complete revision of John C. Wahl's 1984 gay prison comedy *Boys of Cellblock Q*, rewritten and directed by Blake Yelavich, and starring adult video superstars Matthew Rush and Parker Williams. The Sunnyvale Young Men's Juvenile Correctional Facility was once a popular treatment option for civic deviants and things outside societal norms, but the CELLBLOQ (Cell Block Q) is now home to five miscreants whose crimes range from internet spamming to "Conduct Unbecoming A Marine." Everything is turned upside down when the cell-block receives its newest inmate, Donnie Roundbottom, a blonde-haired, blue-eyed twink who topples the once firmly-established hierarchy of the block. Cellblock runs Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays through October 27; tickets are \$25-35 and are available online at artonreal.com/tickets or by calling 512-472-2787.

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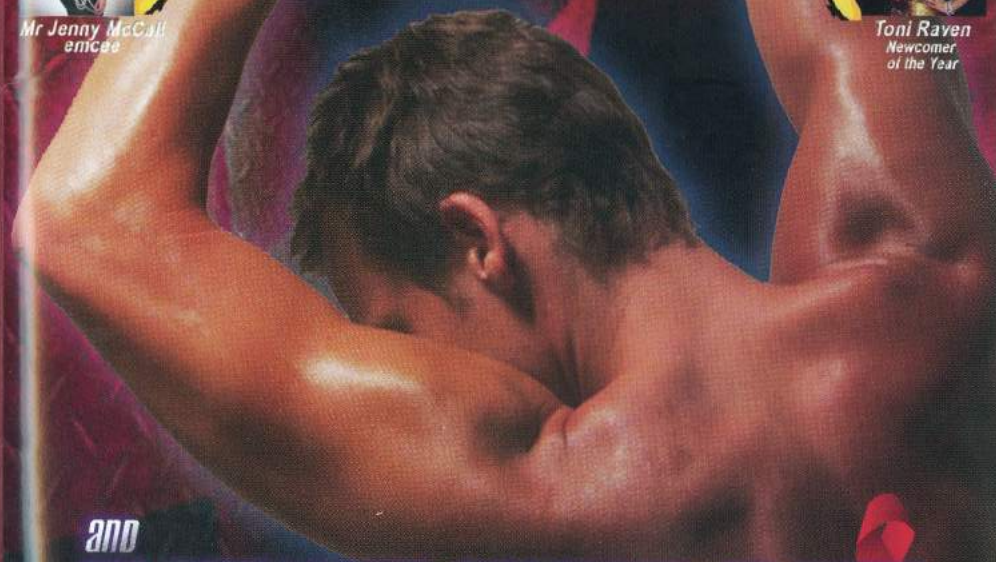
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Dear Diva:
